CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - At the ripe old age of 47, desert tortoise Einstein finally has a place of his own.

Hatched and acquired as a pet in 1975, the reptile is one of many threatened and protected species. He had a series of owners before finding forever family among Effie Yeaw Nature Center supporters. Thanks to volunteer efforts by Carmichael and Arcade Rotary Clubs and Boy Scout Troop 328, the newcomer now has his own outdoor habitat at the center.

Einstein's 120 square foot enclosure was dedicated last weekend and declared an immediate success. "We put him inside and he checked out every inch," confirmed Effie Yeaw animal handler Renee Covey. "We'll still bring him inside at night, but it's great that he now has his own daytime

retreat. He loves it."

The habitat is planted with clumps of native grasses and has a small water pond. Weighing a healthy 17 pounds, the slow-moving occupant enjoys a vegetable diet, favoring dandelion greens and an occasional banana. Along with his new digs, his new job is animal ambassador for the non-profit. "He likes people," says handler Covey. "He sits on laps. If you're doing desk work, he wanders over and lays his head on your foot."

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Effective September 5th, Rachael Greve will begin her tenure as the Effie Yeaw Nature Center's Executive Director. Rachael comes to the Nature Center with a remarkable career in museum management. She holds a bachelor's degree in social science/anthropology from Troy University and has a rich background in non-profit management.

"Rachael brings more than 20 years of experience in developing educational programs, exhibitions, as well as successful outcomes in arenas such as fiscal accountability, partnership building and strategic planning to our organization" says Laurie Weir, President of the American River Natural History Association. "We're delighted to welcome her as our new Executive Director."

Greve's leadership path includes achievements in various museums across the United States from Alabama and Texas to California. During her six-year tenure as Director of the Sierra College Natural History Museum (SCNHM), Rachael made significant contributions. She initiated a digital newsletter, revamped the museum's mission

statement, and designed innovative community outreach programs, such as "Free First Saturdays at the Museum," a family-friendly science celebration, that drew in more than 16,000 visitors. Additionally, she launched the engaging podcast "Three Scientists Break Into A Lab," spotlighting Sierra College scientists and underrepresented historical figures in science.

When the global Covid-19 pandemic hit, Rachael adeptly transitioned SCNHM's programming and tours online. She introduced virtual museum tours and "S.T.E.A.M. Storytime" videos, benefiting local schools and science enthusiasts. Her marketing prowess earned multiple regional and

Dr. Jan Cooper Wants to Know Your Name

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - In today's busy world where people sometimes feel isolated and alone, Dr. Jan Cooper has set out to ensure people feel seen.

"I prayed one day," he said, "'Lord give me something I can do in five minutes that will make other people happy and will make me happy.'"

The quick happiness solution ended up being quite simple - he learns people's names and draws them. The name might turn into a dog, cat, or alligator. He allows himself to be inspired by the individual sitting in front of him, and the pen does the rest.

Cooper, who has two upcoming book signing events this fall, is a local author that has dedicated his life to learning and sharing his gifts and his faith.

"I just kept writing. It just kept coming out," he shared, "The reason I know it's from the Holy Spirit is because I know I'm not smart enough to write things like that. I flunked English twice in high school and college."

And continuing to write he has. He is currently the author of ten books, including one translated into Spanish and a coloring book. He is also a former teacher. His career started by teaching inner city youth on an

Indian reservation in North Dakota. He made \$4800 for the entire year. In 1967, he went to Sacramento and got job offers right away as a teacher in the Grant Union School District but had to "teach

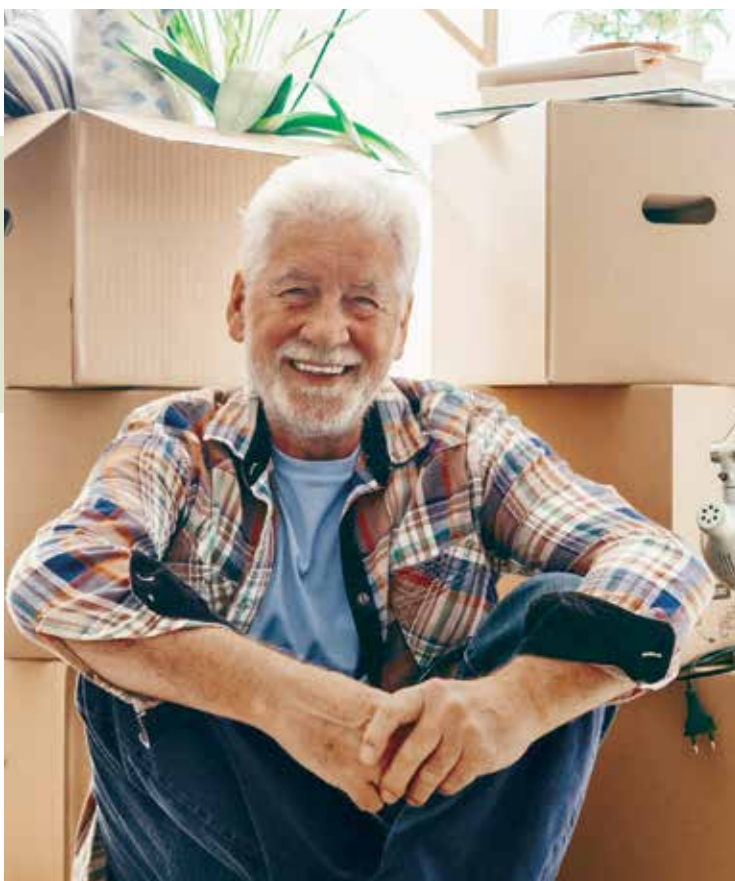

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Monday, August 21, 2023, Sacramento County's first Safe Stay Community welcomed its first guests. The sleeping cabin-style shelter campus has a capacity of 125 - 75 single cabins and 25 double occupancy cabins and was approved by the Board of Supervisors in June 2022. The first two guests are a couple that will use one of the double occupancy cabins.

What Can Guests Expect?

On-premise guests can use the bathroom and shower trailers, laundry services and eat three meals a day in the common area. The campus also has a gated pet relief area, a computer lab, an entertainment space, employment development and housing-focused case management. Guests will also be connected with transportation resources for off-site needs such as medical appointments or jobs.

Each cabin is outfitted with a bed that folds down from the wall, two storage containers, basic toiletry supplies, a desk and chair, overhead light, HVAC, power outlets, smoke alarm and fire extinguisher and a locking door. Cabins also have enough space to accommodate a dog bed or pet crate. The campus has storage containers for possessions that do not fit in the sleeping cabins.

The Florin Road Safe Stay community is operated by City Net. City Net has more than 25 employees dedicated to managing the campus, as well as meeting client's basic needs. Employees also provide case management and housing navigation.

How Are Guests Referred?

The Florin Road Safe Stay Community is currently a closed referral process, through homeless services providers engaging with people living outside near the shelter. Existing street outreach providers, both within the City of Sacramento and in the unincorporated area of Sacramento County, will engage with people living outside to evaluate what services and shelter programs they are eligible for and that will best meet their needs.

People experiencing homelessness and looking for shelter resources should contact the Housing Crisis Line by calling 2-1-1 and pressing 8 or the toll-free number at 1-844-546-1464.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - A standing ovation and legislative commendations honored John Mohamed as the Park Ranger was feted by Carmichael community last week.

The hero of a Madison Avenue fire, Mohamed recently received a Medal of Valor from the National Park Rangers Association. Employed by Fulton El Camino Park Police and serving other park districts, the officer is equally popular for the professionalism of his service as for his dancing during rock concerts.

Mohamed stepped from park duty and into real danger when he noticed a shuttered restaurant ablaze in May of 2022. First reporting the conflagration, he climbed through a fence to check for occupants. He quickly removed a transient from the fully engulfed building. Leaving the man in a Sheriff's care, Mohamed reentered the fire to seek other occupants. The roof was collapsing as he struggled to exit.

"My chest was heavy, my throat hurt," he recalls of his escape. "My first lungful of outside air felt

good. I was thankful to have made it out." The hero was hospitalized and treated for throat and lung damage. More than a year later he still has a persistent cough.

His actions resulted in decoration and community gratitude. "He's a hero," considers Carmichael Chamber of Commerce Board Chair Izzy De Lancey. "He didn't think about his own life; he immediately set out to save somebody else. Officer Mohamed demonstrates how the skills of one highly trained professional can make our community a safer place."

Attending the Chamber luncheon with his fiancée Denise Ulm, the Ranger accepted congratulations and framed commendations. "I grew up in this area and I've always loved working here," he told Chamber of Commerce members.

"I don't think of myself as a hero. All these honors have surprised and humbled me. I just did my job to the best of my ability. The reason I was able to respond to this situation as I did was because of years of training from other officers. I'm grateful to them. And I'm glad there was no loss of life, and that no one was left behind." ★

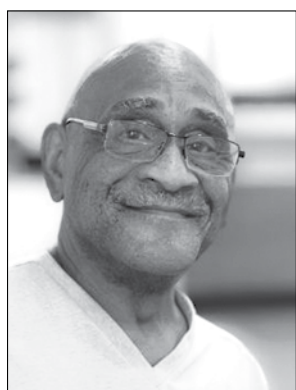

Nottoli Place: A Safe Haven for Older Adults in Need

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Kimberley Hayes opens her door to show off her bedroom. It has a TV, a dresser, and a bed. There's a window providing natural light. She can also lock the door – giving herself plenty of privacy. Just outside her room, there's a common area with two couches and a couple of chairs. She sits next to Hershel Walthall. He's content and relaxed in the common area. They chat like old friends. Even though they now sit next to each other and talk, the two have very different personalities.

Kimberley loves to bake. She also loves cats. She's outgoing and enjoys sharing funny stories. Hershel used to drive school buses. He's soft-spoken but opens up when you talk to him for a while. These two very different people have one big thing in common that brought them together: they are both older adults who were referred by Adult Protective Services to Nottoli Place when they became unhoused.

Nottoli Place is a safe and supportive facility for older adults in need of temporary housing. The facility is named after retired Sacramento County Supervisor Don Nottoli. With the goal of preventing homelessness and providing essential services, Nottoli Place has become a beacon of hope for older adults facing challenging circumstances. Since its grand opening in February of this year, the facility has already made a positive impact on the lives of its residents. The first client, an 86-year-old, moved into Nottoli Place in March. Nottoli Place has serviced 26 clients in just a few short months. The facility has 15 beds so it can house several clients at once.

Those staying at Nottoli Place are all vulnerable seniors who are at risk of abuse and neglect and referred to the facility by Sacramento County's Adult Protective Services. Social workers help connect clients with Nottoli Place and make sure they have a way to get to the facility. Once they arrive, they are greeted by Volunteers of America workers who staff Nottoli Place.

For Kimberley, moving into Nottoli Place took a huge burden off her shoulders. She has experienced homelessness before – years ago when she lived in San Francisco. At 63 years old, she feared she wouldn't be able to face it again. At first, she was concerned that Nottoli Place would be filled with rules and regulations, but that is not the case. While there are a few guidelines, Nottoli Place promotes independence and respects the privacy of everyone staying there. The residents are also permitted to leave. Kimberley says when she has time, she takes the bus to run errands or to catch a movie. She has a sense of relief knowing she can leave behind her belongings without having to worry.

"You've got your dignity and you've got your privacy. You can stay put and know your property and stuff is going to be safe," says Kimberley.

Kimberley expresses immense gratitude toward her Sacramento County social worker who helped get her to Nottoli Place. She says her social worker has continued to provide her with much-needed support. Hershell, who is 74 years old, also praised his Adult Protective Services social worker for being quick to help him get into Nottoli Place. Hershell also thanks the Nottoli Place staff for all their support.

"You got good staff here that's really engaged and that really helps," Hershell says.

Nottoli Place not only provides a safe space, but it also offers a supportive community. Clients must be 60 or older to stay in one of the rooms. Kimberley says being in the same age group allows for easy camaraderie, understanding, and shared experiences.

"We all come from the same generation, so we all get each other. We have the same sense of humor and so all our jokes, the others still laugh at them," says Kimberley.

While everyone at Nottoli Place can relax and make new friends, they are also putting in hard work during their stay to secure permanent housing. Residents have the opportunity to participate in classes covering various topics such as renting, job applications, credit scores, and more.

Regular follow-ups by Adult Protective Services and Volunteers of America staff contribute to the success and well-being of the residents. The staff is dedicated to individualized care, and they get to know the clients so each of their individual needs are met, offering personalized assistance when necessary. As residents of Nottoli Place continue their journey toward permanent housing, they emphasize the importance of taking an active role in their own progress.

"It's a team effort. You put in the time and you can see the results. It pays off if you really put in the time because the program here really helps you out and it works," says Hershell.

Both Kimberley and Hershell have applied on housing waiting lists and regularly checked in to see if they are approved. They are both happy to share they are on their way to finding permanent housing. Hershell was living at Nottoli Place when he was interviewed for this story. He moved into his own apartment in Natomas at the end of July.

"It feels real good. I'm on the road to success. I've been looking for some housing and I found some, and I'm ready to move on to that next transitional part, and they're getting ready to help me transition to that next part, which I love that," Hershell says.

Hershell and Kimberley credit the staff, their own dedication, and the resources provided by the County for their progress. Kimberley explains that on top of the Volunteers of America staff keeping an eye on her, her social worker still checks in – sometimes just to see how she's doing.

"Adult Protective Services still comes and does the follow-up. They ask me how I'm doing. Where are you at on this? So, it's really good that you've got that coming from both sides. They're taking you into consideration and there's compassion," Kimberley says.

Nottoli Place has proven to be a lifeline for older adults like Kimberley and Hershell. By offering a safe environment, Nottoli Place serves as a place of refuge for older adults, helping them regain stability, hope, and a path to long-term housing solutions. The gratitude expressed by Kimberley and Hershell toward their social workers and the Nottoli Place staff highlights the effectiveness and impact of the collaborative efforts in supporting older adults in need.

himself English by teaching English." He retired in 2004 but continued to pour into local young people by substitute teaching for another 17 years. He has also taught art – specifically painting and drawing – for over 20 years to both children and adults.

With a teaching career that led him to interact with inner city youth often, he did not shy away.

"Some considered them dangerous, some considered they just didn't care," he said. "But I loved the students, and they knew that."

His love of young people also carries into his love of his country. His books clearly have a conservative tone, and he has a passion to see faith and rationality become part of the political landscape again.

"America has fallen asleep into a state of name calling, bickering, and fighting. Our leaders are supposed to be setting the best example for our youth. All my folks did was yell, scream, holler and fight. I don't want that in our country because I can see how it can affect our youth."

Now, Cooper is continuing his mission to share his faith, and his political concerns. He is of the camp that believes socialism is a threat to our nation, and he isn't shy about saying so.

"My main concern when the pandemic hit was I had so many good ideas, bad ideas, wrong ideas about what was happening in our country," he said. "I was raised in the military – I went to high school in Japan. I saw what was going on in different parts of the world."

Being a writer is also healing for himself as well. Recently, he has dealt with chronic pain, and he finds relief when he is artistic.

"When I do what I know God wants me to be doing, the pain goes away," he said.

You can meet Dr. Jan Cooper in person at two upcoming book signing events. He will be at the Citrus Heights Barnes & Noble on October 28 from 11am-2pm, and at the Arden Barnes & Noble on November 4 from 11am-2pm. At his book signing events, he will have his drawing pad. For everyone who buys a book – and maybe even for those who do not – he will be ready to draw their name. ★

Final Recommended Budget Hearings Begin Sept. 6

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors will begin Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-24 Revised Recommended Budget hearings on Wednesday, Sept. 6, at 9:30 a.m. in Board Chambers in the Sacramento County Administration Building, located at 700 H Street, Sacramento, 95814. If necessary, hearings will continue on Sept. 7 and 8 at the same time and location.

The hearing schedule, in order (may be subject to change):

IHSS Public Authority Budget Deliberation and Approval; Introduction by the County Executive to the FY 2023-24 Revised Recommended Budget; Public Comment; Board Deliberation and Approval to Revisions of the Approved Recommended Budget.

The numbers in the recommended budget change between June and September when the County receives new information, including the impact of the State Budget and updated revenue totals. Because of that new information, the Revised Recommended Budget comes back to the Board for review and adoption in September.

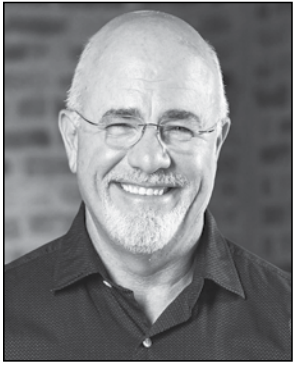
The Board of Supervisors approved the FY 2023-24 Recommended Budget on June 7. The \$8.4 billion spending plan recognized new and enhanced areas of growth based on the Board's priorities and a survey of Sacramento residents. The budget included annual commitments of \$35 million to fund new or enhanced programs aligned with the County's jail population reduction plans to comply with the Mays Consent Decree; \$10 million in the Sheriff and Correctional Health budgets to fund continued efforts for additional staffing and services in the Mays Consent Decree Remedial Plan; \$12 million to fund new programs and services addressing homelessness; \$84 million of growth in Health Services; \$17 million in additional funding for Child, Family and Adult Services; and \$5 million to address road repairs and improvements in the unincorporated County, among others.

Members of the public may attend the hearings and be heard on any item in the budget, either publicly, over the phone or through written comments. The budget hearings will also be telecast live on Metro Cable 14 and at sccob.saccounty.gov/Pages/BOSPublicMeetings.aspx. ★

as possible, learn how to work, and choose an inexpensive school if they want to continue their education.

As a parent, one of your biggest jobs is to give your kids a moral compass and the tools they'll need to succeed in the real world. And one of the keys to being a successful adult is engaging in a lifetime of learning. If the last time you read a book was when you were in high school or college, and you've never done training of any other kind since, you're probably not very successful. Never. Stop. Learning. If I'd stopped learning after getting my bachelor's degree, do you think I would've been able to build Ramsey Solutions? Absolutely not!

Do you see where I'm going with this, Thomas? As an adult, learning is your job. An entire lifetime of learning is your job. And if you can encourage that in your kids with some level of help, financial or otherwise, then it's your obligation to help them. You can't expect a 17-year-old to figure it all out. They don't have the

tools yet.

The point is this: You don't have a moral responsibility to pay for your kids' college education. You do, however, have a moral responsibility to highlight the importance of knowledge, share what you have, and show them how to get more. If you can't afford to help with money, do everything else you can. There are plenty of more important things than cash. If you want to help financially, that's fine too.

Just don't use debt to make it happen!

Continued from page 1 native territory, Einstein cannot be released to the wild. "After being in captivity for so long, he would not do well," explains Covey. "And he might carry disease or parasites that could put other creatures at risk."

Before the \$10,000 habitat project came to his rescue, he lived at the homes of Nature

Center staffers. But the boarder needed his own turf. "It's recommended an adult male of his species should have a large outdoor space for himself, explains Covey.

Long-time Nature Center supporters, Arcade and Carmichael Rotary Clubs funded the project with cash and in-kind donations. The volunteers consulted Effie

Yeaw staffers on design; they milled redwood planks and commissioned metal gratings. For Einstein's well-being, interior surfaces are unpainted and chemical free. The enclosure's see-through cover allows visitor viewing. Sunshine and shade are plentiful, and the desert native will soon get a "hide" where he can retreat for naps. As he might

live well beyond his 100th birthday, all habitat materials were chosen for enduring service.

"He will be a great animal ambassador", considers Covey. "He's personable; he's interested in children and adults. If he decides he likes you, he'll come up and greet you with a bob of his head. He's used to being handled and does well with travel.

We'll be able to take Einstein to events, where he'll help teach the public about the effect humans have on our eco system. A desert tortoise is a good example of a species that needs protection."

Footnote: due to the threatened status of desert tortoises, it is illegal to acquire or keep the reptiles as pets without registration from Wildlife agencies. ★

Bay Area Is Beginning To Resemble Chaotic and Politically Divided Southern California

A prominent aspect of California's evolution in the late 20th century and early 21st has been the economic and political dominance of the San Francisco Bay Area over more populous Southern California.

From rough parity in the 1970s, the state's two major regions diverted sharply.

The Bay Area evolved into the global capital of high technology, creating immense wealth that propped up the state's entire economy and provided enormous bounties of state tax revenue.

Meanwhile, Southern California – particularly Los Angeles County – struggled to absorb millions of immigrants and fold them into an economy that sputtered when its aerospace industry virtually collapsed after the Cold War ended.

The reasons for the regional disconnect are many, including factors beyond the ability of civic and political leaders to affect, such as the Cold War's sudden conclusion.

However, much of the dissonance is due to mega-policy decisions, such as SoCal's betting on logistics as its growth industry while the Bay Area opted for technology.

Another factor is the structural difference.

Over the last five decades,

the Bay Area developed strong regional organizations, both political and civic, to promote a consensus vision. Despite the Bay Area's ultra-liberal political image, its leaders shared a pragmatic mindset and didn't let cultural differences interfere with the job.

Southern California, meanwhile, wallowed in internecine political, ethnic and cultural power struggles – more a collection of jealously competitive villages than a united region. The infamous scandal that erupted in the Los Angeles City Council last year, when secret recordings revealed bitter racial animosity over political power, typifies the region's us-vs.-them attitudes – not to mention a wave of outright corruption that ensnared many political figures.

The arc of history may be changing because the Bay Area has hit a bad patch.

Its technology industry is retrenching, with layoffs affecting thousands, and other regions – such as Austin – have become powerful competitors for investment, thanks in part to their much lower operational and living costs.

San Francisco's once thriving commercial and financial core has been hollowed out by the residual effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, smash-and-grab crime, a horrendous drug problem and squalid homeless encampments. Some observers believe it is in a "doom loop" that could be long-lasting or even permanent.

A new study argues that city government has become dysfunctional and needs a major overhaul.

"Many San Franciscans have come to believe their city is in crisis," the report

states. "To meet these profound challenges and maintain its world-class status, San Francisco desperately needs effective government. Many San Franciscans believe City Hall is failing this test."

Finally, and most ominously, the consensus-driven civic and political front that had been such a powerful factor in the Bay Area's rise to dominance may be fragmenting.

There are now pitched political battles over dealing with the doom-loop scenario, the wave of street crimes, homelessness, the drug crisis and housing development.

One indication of the new disunity is what happened when the Bay Area's all-important mass transit system, BART, experienced sharp decreases of ridership, and therefore revenue, during the pandemic. It largely failed to recover as the work-from-home alternative to commuting has persisted.

A \$1.50 per vehicle increase in Bay Area bridge tolls was introduced in the Legislature to bail out BART, but it immediately caused a rupture within the region's political and civic leadership, with critics denouncing its shoddy service and union domination.

Last week, the toll increase was put on indefinite hold, unable to muster the united support needed for passage. The Bay Area is now adrift, unsure of how to cope with its economic and social woes and beginning to resemble Southern California's chaotic atmosphere.

Social Security Matters

What About All the Money Congress Stole from Social Security?

Dear Rusty: Is there any way that Congress will vote to pay back the Social Security funds they took for their stupid reasons, and left IOUs in place of the funds? Because of the funds they took going back many years, we didn't have any decent COLAs for a few years. In fact, there were I think 3-5 years that we didn't get any COLA. Please Rusty, can you find out if this is true or false? Help us seniors! **Signed: Resentful Senior**

Dear Resentful Senior: I can assure you that I've fully investigated the allegation that politicians have squandered Social Security's money and found that charge to be, simply speaking, a myth. I've gone back and looked at Social Security revenues and expenses since the government first started collecting FICA payroll taxes in 1937 and found that every dollar ever collected for Social Security has been used only for Social Security purposes. Over the years, various claims have been made that the money has been used for other things, but I've researched each of these charges and found them all to be false.

Where the misconception mostly originates is that any excess money collected from working Americans for Social

Security is invested in "special issue government bonds" which pay interest, as mandated by President Roosevelt when Social Security began. As with any investment, a financial obligation instrument is given in return for dollars received. Remember when we used to buy "U.S. Savings Bonds?" We'd use our money to buy those bonds, hold them, and later redeem them for a higher amount than we paid. That's exactly how Social Security contributions have always worked – excess money collected from working Americans is used to purchase special issue government bonds which are held in reserve, earning interest, for future Social Security needs. These special bonds reside in a Social Security Trust Fund and, as of the end of 2022, were worth about \$2.8 trillion. Are these bonds "worthless IOUs" as some would claim? Hardly, since they are redeemable as needed to pay Social Security benefits.

Considering that, since 2010, Social Security's income from payroll taxes on American workers has been less than needed to cover benefits paid out, redemption of bonds held in the Trust Fund is the only reason that Social Security has been able to continue paying full benefits to every beneficiary. The Trust Fund is a financial safety net which is now protecting all SS beneficiaries from having their benefits cut. Problem is, unless Congress acts soon to reform Social Security's financial picture, the Trust Fund will be fully depleted in about 2033 resulting in about a 23% cut in everyone's monthly Social Security benefit. I'm optimistic that will not happen

(it would be political suicide) and, hopefully, Congress will act soon to reform Social Security and restore it to financial solvency and *avoid a future cut in everyone's benefits.*

Regarding COLA (Cost of Living Adjustment) and the lack thereof for several past years, COLA is determined by the government's standard inflation measure – the Consumer Price Index (CPI). There were several years (2010, 2011, and 2016) in which the CPI showed no inflation so, therefore, no COLA increase was given. Last year, due to soaring inflation, everyone got an 8.7% increase in their Social Security benefit, but that doesn't happen every year. FYI, the average annual COLA increase over the last two decades has been about 2.6%, although COLA for each year can be wildly different depending on each year's inflation measure. In any case, the lack of a COLA increase in past years was not a result of any political chicanery, it was the result of low inflation during those years.

Two Defendants from Bay Area Convicted of First-Degree Murder

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Elijah Utsey and Joshua Berry were each convicted by a jury of the first-degree murder of Terrance Hanes. The jury also found true the allegation that both defendants personally discharged a firearm causing death.

On July 1, 2022, Elijah Utsey and the victim had an argument on social media. Shortly after the argument, Utsey posted "On everything I love I will leave you slumped" on his Instagram. On July 4th, the victim was found deceased with several gunshot wounds. An autopsy revealed the victim had been shot more than 10 times. Sheriff's detectives located 17 shell casings, which had been fired from two separate guns. The guns were never recovered. The investigation revealed that Utsey had communicated with the victim in the past. It was also discovered that on the day of the

murder, Utsey and Joshua Berry drove from Oakland directly to the victim's home in Berry's red Mitsubishi. Surveillance video showed the vehicle being parked and two people walking towards the victim's home. Moments later, several gun shots were heard and the two people ran back to the vehicle and left the area. After the murder, Utsey's social media showed he messaged friends telling them he had to switch out his gun and both defendants switched phones and cell phone numbers. Berry also stopped driving his red Mitsubishi.

An allegation that Utsey has a prior strike conviction for first-degree burglary will be determined at the sentencing hearing.

Utsey faces a maximum sentence of 75 years to life in prison. Berry faces a maximum sentence of 50 years to life. Sentencing is set for October 20, 2023, at 10:30 a.m. in Department 10 before the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle. ★

Together's "Operation Cross Country" Recovering Human Trafficking Victims and Arrests Exploiters

Sacramento County DA News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The FBI, working with its state and local partners, identified and located 200 victims of sex trafficking during a nationwide enforcement campaign, called "Operation Cross Country." Through targeted operations and collaborative efforts, Operation Cross Country achieved significant milestones in recovering victims, apprehending offenders, and raising public awareness about these heinous crimes during its 2-week operation in July.

The operation led to the location of 59 minor victims of child sex trafficking and child sexual exploitation offenses and located 59 actively missing children. It also resulted in the identification or arrest of 126 suspects of child sexual exploitation and human trafficking offenses and 68 suspects of trafficking were identified or arrested.

The Sacramento County District Attorney's Office along with its Sacramento Together Human Trafficking Task Force partners

participated in this nationwide operation, with the following results:

Number of Operations: 4, Juveniles Recovered: 2, Potential Adult Human Trafficking Victims Offered Services: 12+, Exploiters Arrested: 5, Other Exploiters Identified: 2, Other Arrests: 1 adult male for concealing a firearm

This nationwide operation, in partnership with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC), focused on identifying and locating victims of sex trafficking and investigating and arresting individuals and criminal enterprises involved in both child sex and human trafficking. Law enforcement agencies conducted targeted operations to identify and apprehend offenders, dismantling criminal networks and preventing further harm to victims. Those suspects identified will be subject to additional investigation for potential charges.

A multidisciplinary team (MDT), to include victim specialists, child/adolescent forensic interviewers, and other victim service personnel, in addition to special agents, ensures a victim-centered, culturally

responsive, trauma-informed investigative response. The FBI MDT works with state and local partners to make resources available to meet the unique needs of trafficking victims.

Victim specialists provide services based on the individual needs of human trafficking victims, to include crisis intervention, emergency food and clothing, transportation to receive emergency services, and locating shelter or housing. The victim specialists also serve as conduit between the victims and the investigative team to help ensure they are receiving case updates, as appropriate.

The Sacramento County District Attorney's Office and the Sacramento Together Human Trafficking Task Force remain committed to combating child exploitation and human trafficking. Operation Cross Country is just one of many efforts being made to protect the most vulnerable members of society and hold offenders accountable. Other efforts include raising awareness about how the public can help identify and recover victims and bring perpetrators to justice. ★

Carmichael Food Closet Celebrates 50 Years of Service with BBQ

Carmichael Presbyterian Church News Release

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Carmichael Presbyterian Church is inviting the community to a barbecue celebrating the Food Closet's 50th anniversary on Saturday, September 16. So come to the party and get ready for delicious hot dogs, chili, ice cream and sundaes, plus enjoy the live music of the Tom Carpenter Quartet at the church's 5645 Marconi Ave location from 3 to 5 PM.

The Carmichael Food Closet was founded in 1969 at the Carmichael Presbyterian Church. Its goal was to "Address the needs of those who experience hunger in our community".

Originally The Food Closet had literally operated out of a closet, and then it was moved to part of a Sunday school room. As the volume of calls increased, a request went out to other local churches for assistance. In 1993 over 130,000 meals were provided.

The Closet now operates four days a week, serving 150 families a week. It is staffed by 130 community volunteers.

In the past the Food Closet partnered with the Sacramento Food Closet Network and participated in the Senior Gleaners Program. When these two agencies merged to form Sacramento Food Bank, the Carmichael Food Closet joined their new program.

In 1986 CPC worked with the Sacramento Bee to publish a special supplement on "Hunger In Sacramento". In response to the

articles, CPC was contacted by Joyce Raley-Teel and a new program, "Raley's Food For Families" program was developed.

In the late 90's San Juan School District supported the Food Closet with Peanut Butter Patrols and Tuna Times. Channel 58 (KCRA) initiated a Kid's Can Program through the local schools. The Food Closet helped develop the concept and was the recipient of the first food drive from SJUSD schools. In 2019 seven tons of canned goods were collected from fifteen schools participating in the "Kid's Can Drive" in the SJUSD.

The Closet provides the following to every family served: peanut butter, soup, pasta, pasta sauce, canned fruit and vegetables, cereal, rice, beans, canned tuna or chicken, fresh fruits and vegetables, frozen meat, eggs, milk, other dairy items (yogurt, butter & cheese), bread and pastry products.

This year a new service was provided for homeless people without cooking and refrigeration facilities. Each person receives peanut butter, bread, soup, a canned pasta serving, canned tuna or chicken, canned and fresh fruit and vegetables, protein bars, nonperishable milk, a drink, and pastries. All the canned goods must be flip top cans for practical use. Included in the heavy-duty plastic bag is a roll of toilet paper, toiletries, utensils, and a garbage bag.

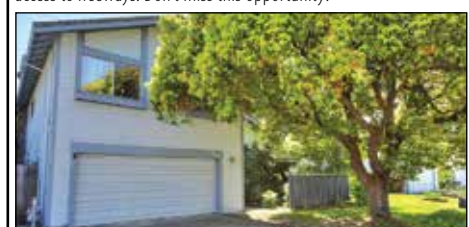

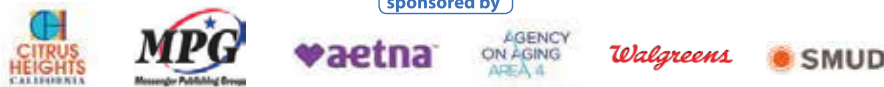
