

# Jesuit Wins Robotics Championship

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)**- Jesuit High School students this summer took top honors at an international collegiate-level robotics competition in Longmont, Colorado.

For a third consecutive year, the all-boys Catholic school team 'Rovotics' dominated the high-tech competition's Explorer class. At the same time, teen engineers from sister high school St. Francis (Sacramento) topped the event's Ranger division.

The 2023 Marine Advanced Technology Education (MATE) championship included underwater designs entered by student teams from 12 countries. The event aims

to further climate change understanding, implementing solutions through science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM).

The Jesuit boys worked to develop 'Tardigrade,' a Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV) that executed specific underwater tasks following the mission specs sent out by MATE. Evaluated in an Olympic-sized pool beside other teams, their robot scored highest overall points.

Rovotics CEO Timothy Monroe attributed the triumph to team organization. "It's rare that you find a group of people that work together as well as we do," he considered. "Combined with expertise and the help of our coaches, we were able to perform exceptionally well."

"This year, Jesuit's approach was to focus on sharing knowledge and lessons learned over the years with the broader robotics community," he added.

Jesuit's participation in the competition serves to inspire younger students not only towards high-tech career fields but also provides them an opportunity to market their ideas in the fast-paced world of commerce.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Four opportunities to ride with a Bike Patroller have been announced by the American River Bike Patrol. The get-acquainted rides are part of the patrol's current membership drive and are open to cyclists 18 and over.

Ride-alongs, led by bike patrollers, will take place on Aug. 5, 12, 19 and Sept. 9, starting at 9 a.m. "If you like helping others and can ride a bike, these get-acquainted rides provide opportunities to hear, see and experience what bike patrollers do," said Recruiting Adviser Tim Viall.

"We're doing this now, as our final first aid class of the year occurs on Sept. 30 in Sacramento. That will be the last chance to become a bike patroller, this year." said Viall.

The Bike Patrol is an all-volunteer unit that provides safety patrols on over 69 miles of bike trails beside the American River and on the El Dorado Trail. "We help trail users stay safe and provide emergency bike repairs and first aid," said Viall.

The Aug. 5 ride-along will start from El Manto Access park on the American River Parkway in Rancho Cordova. The Aug. 12 and 19 ride-alongs will start from the Streng Volunteer Center at William Pond Recreation Area in Carmichael. And, the Sept. 9 ride-along will start from Black Miner's Bar at Folsom Lake State Recreation Area in Folsom.


# Bags of Swag at Midas Giveaway

# Unsecured Property Taxes Due August 31

Sacramento County News Release

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Annual bills for the Sacramento County unsecured personal property taxes for fiscal year 2023-2024 will be mailed July 25, 2023, and are due no later than Aug. 31, 2023, to avoid penalties for delinquency.

If you owned a watercraft or an aircraft, owned a business with assessable fixtures and/or equipment, or leased equipment on January 1 of this year and you do not receive a tax bill by August 10, 2023, please contact the Unsecured Property Tax Unit at 916-874-7833; available between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.

Failure to receive a tax bill does not excuse delinquency nor allow the tax collector to cancel penalties or collection


Payments may be made by mail or in person at the County Tax Collector's Office

located at 700 H Street, Room 1710, Sacramento, CA 95814; open between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.

Property taxes may also be paid online by e-check or credit card with the Sacramento County Property Tax Bill Information System website.

Unsecured tax bills issued in July of a given year are due by August 31 of that year. Payments remitted by mail must be postmarked by the due date to avoid penalty. Any payment submitted after the due date is considered delinquent and subject to additional fees.

Upon delinquency, a 10% penalty and collection cost will be added. DMV registration may be withheld on watercraft when delinquent unsecured property taxes are reported. If a tax bill remains unpaid after October 3, 2023, additional collection costs and monthly penalties at the rate of 1.5% will be added to the base tax.



# Two Fatal, Fentanyl Related Overdoses Reported in North Sacramento

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Friday, July 21, 2023, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office responded to two assist calls for service with the Sacramento Metro Fire Department in the northern part of Sacramento County. The first incident occurred at approximately 9:10 AM, where Sheriff's North Patrol Deputies responded near the 3600 block of Elkhorn Boulevard to assist with a 46-year-old male lying unresponsive behind a business. Fire personnel arrived on scene and conducted life-saving measures; unfortunately, he was

pronounced deceased on scene.

The second incident occurred at approximately 1:15 PM, where Deputies responded to a location near the 7400 block of Watt Avenue to assist with a 16-year-old male juvenile lying unresponsive behind a dumpster. Fire personnel arrived on scene and again conducted life-saving measures; unfortunately, he was also pronounced deceased on scene.

Both cases appear to be fentanyl overdoses. The Sacramento County Coroner's Office will determine the cause of death in both incidents and forward its findings as prescribed by law. They will also release the names of the deceased after notification has been made to his next of kin.

# Mailman Attacked by Dog

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Friday, July 21, 2023, at approximately 1:14 PM, a 73-year-old male who was employed as a mail carrier for the United States Postal Service was carrying out his duties by delivering mail to the residences on the 4400 block of Brandt Way in North Highlands. While he was at a nearby house, a pit bull attacked him. The owner of the dog intervened and

After witnessing the incident, a passerby promptly called 911 and tried to help the mailman. The passerby

attempted to halt the attack.

successfully brought the mail carrier to safety before the arrival of Deputies, Sacramento Metro Fire, and Medics personnel.

During the incident with the dog, the mail carrier suffered injuries to his face, feet, and arms. He was then taken to the hospital by Sacramento Fire Medics. The dog's owner was also assessed for injuries resulting from the incident. Fortunately, no one else was harmed during the incident.

According to the hospital's medical team, the injuries sustained by the mailman did not necessitate surgery. Animal control later arrived on the scene and took custody of the dog.

# California's 63-Year-Old Higher Education Plan Could Use A Reality Check

As California's population exploded in the 1950s and 1960s - surpassing New York to become the nation's most populous state in 1962 its political leaders responded with sweeping plans to satisfy burgeoning demands for public services.

New freeway routes were plotted to carry millions of additional cars. State and local bond issues were drafted to build schools for the baby boom. New dams and canals were designed to increase water supplies. And, a master plan was written to unify California's colleges and universities.

Six decades later, California's population is nearly three times larger, but stalled at just under 40 million and has been declining slowly.

Many of those onceplanned freeways never got past the planning stage, public school enrollment is declining, the California Water Plan has mostly been built (but still has a bottleneck in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta), and the muchvaunted Master Plan for Higher Education remains on the books but never achieved the seamless pathway to lowcost, universal student access it envisioned

While the demand for higher education is huge, and while the state's

a highly trained and educated workforce, the state's three collegiate systems – the University of California, California State University and more than 100 locally managed community colleges - remain more competitive than cooperative.

If anything, friction among the systems has been increasing as they squabble over academic turf and compete for financing in a state budget that struggles to pay for all of its spending.

The 1960-vintage master plan, whose two political fathers were UC's legendary president, Clark Kerr, and then-Gov. Pat Brown, delineated the roles that all three would play.

UC would be the state's premier research institution while providing high-intensity undergraduate and graduate educations, with degrees up to doctorates. CSU would educate teachers, engineers and other professionals and offer both baccalaureate and master's degrees. Community colleges would provide two-year associate degrees, prepare students for transfer to fouryear schools and also offer job-oriented, sub-professional training.

Demands from students that outstripped supply and budgetary pressures have eroded the demarcation lines. Community colleges have begun offering some limited baccalaureate degrees, encountering stiff opposition from the state university system, while state universities have sought, with some success, to award doctorates, thereby encroaching on UC's journalist for more than 60 jealously guarded turf.

economy rests on having least one conflict over competing ambitions of the three levels. One current measure, Assembly Bill 656, which has passed the Assembly and is pending in the Senate, would give CSU broad new authority to award doctorates.

Although there's an official goal of boosting the number of community college students transferring to fouryear schools from 89,000 to more than 120,000 by 2022, a year later fewer than 100,000 were making the transition, CalMatters recently reported.

"Of the students enrolled in a community college in California who said they wanted to transfer to a fouryear university, an average of 9.9% went on to enroll at a four-year institution in 2021, the most recent data available," reporters Adam Echelman and Erica Yee

#### Pentagon Approves Hazard Pay for U.S. Troops in Ukraine, Paving Way for Possible Expanded Presence

28 July 2023 | There's been more confirmation to emerge concerning the American military presence in Ukraine, and its expanding role in the conflict, bringing NATO dangerously closer into a potential hot war with Russia. "The Pentagon has authorized additional hazard pay for U.S. troops serving in Ukraine, a defense official confirmed Thursday," according to the publication Military Times. "The bonus, known as imminent danger pay, is offered to troops who serve in areas where they could be harmed by hostile fire or mines, insurrection, civil war or terrorism." The statement also interestingly said that qualifying troops in Ukraine will be authorized back pay as far back as April 24, 2022--which strongly suggests a significant U.S. presence inside the war-ravaged country since then, or from the opening months of the conflict.

#### Biden Cut a Massive Check to Ukraine After Forcing a Family to Pay \$60,000 to Move Soldier's Remains

27 July 2023 | In the latest tactic of President [sic] Joe Biden's "put America last" agenda, the administration cut another massive check to Ukraine while families of lost soldiers are being forgotten. This week, the Biden administration approved another 400 million in additional military aid for Ukraine, making it the 43rd time the U.S. has sent weapons from its supply to the foreign country... The aid package includes air defense missiles, armored vehicles, and small drones. It was approved through Presidential Drawdown Authority (PDA), which allows the president to transfer articles and services from U.S. stocks without congressional approval in emergencies. However, several critics question whether the Russia-Ukraine war should still be considered an emergency... This comes as reports reveal a family who lost their daughter in Afghanistan while serving the U.S. was billed \$60,000 to move her remains to her final resting place.

#### Democratic presidential candidate RFK Jr. denied Secret Service protection by Biden administration

28 July 2023 | Robert F. Kennedy Jr. said Friday the Biden administration has denied him as a 2024 presidential candidate Secret Service protection. Since the assassination of my father in 1968, candidates for president are provided Secret Service protection. "But not me," tweeted Kennedy, in a long-shot bid to beat President [sic] Biden in the Democratic primary. "Typical turnaround time for pro forma protection requests from presidential candidates is 14-days," he also said. "After 88-days of no response and after several follow-ups by our campaign, the Biden Administration just denied our request." According to the Secret Service website: federal law authorizes the agency to "provide protection for major presidential and vice presidential candidates."

#### FBI Told Delaware U.S. Attorney It Had Already Partially Corroborated Biden Bribery Claims, Source Says

24 July 2023 | When the Pittsburgh FBI office briefed the Delaware U.S. attorney's office on evidence implicating Hunter and Joe Biden in a bribery scheme, the agents also told the Delaware team they had already corroborated several aspects of the confidential human source's claims, an individual familiar with the briefing told The Federalist. On Thursday, Sen. Chuck Grassley, R-Iowa, released the FD-1023 summary of a confidential human source's reporting that the Ukrainian oil and gas company Burisma paid Hunter and Joe Biden each 5 million in bribes so the then-Vice President would "protect" Burisma "from all kinds of problems." Those bribes were in addition to the more than 4 million in total paid to Hunter Biden and his business partner Devon Archer for sitting on Burisma's board of directors.

#### New Zealand's former COVID tyrant Jacinda Ardern appointed to censorship role at Harvard

25 July 2023 | Former Prime Minister of New Zealand Jacinda Ardern has been rewarded with a prestigious fellowship at Harvard University. As the Berkman Klein Center (the Center) at Harvard reports, "The Berkman Klein Center for Internet & Society at Harvard University is thrilled to announce Jacinda Ardern as its first Knight Tech Governance Leadership Fellow." Ardern herself claims she will "address online harms... and violent extremism online..." According to the Center, whose past scholars have worked with Matt Taibbi on The Twitter Files, Ardern will be at the forefront of the fight against a new threat -- "algorithmic harms."

#### mRNA COVID Vaccines May Be Triggering 'Turbo **Cancers' in Young People - Experts**

28 July 2023 | Experts are seeing a puzzling rise in cancer in people under 50 that appears biologically different from late-onset cancers. While some claim cancer rates have been rising for decades and attribute the increase to sugary drinks, lifestyle, and sleep disruptions, others say mRNA COVID-19 vaccines have caused an emergence of "turbo cancers"--and U.S. regulatory agencies have not addressed the ever-growing problem. Although there is no official medical definition for what doctors are calling "turbo cancers," the term is commonly used to define aggressive, rapid-onset cancers resistant to treatment--primarily in young, healthy individuals following COVID-19 vaccination. These cases often present in a late stage with metastasis and quickly turn fatal. "What's happening is these cancers we're used to seeing, their growth patterns and their behavior are completely out of character...So 'turbo cancer' is something that wasn't there and, all of a sudden, it's everywhere," Dr. Ryan Cole, a pathologist and CEO of Cole Diagnostics, said in an interview on EpochTV's American Thought Leaders.

# **Social Security Matters** When Should My Wife Claim Her Social Security Benefits?

**Dear Rusty:** My wife turns 65 in November of 2023. She was born on 11/21/1958. I am a year younger with an 8/1/1959 birthdate. I know my wife is not at full retirement age, but the difference in her SS payment is not much and collecting 3 years of the lower amount far exceeds her waiting until age 68. My question is: because half of my SS is more than her SS, if she retires this year, will she still get 50% of my SS when I retire? Signed: Planning Our Future

Dear Planning: Spouse benefits are one of Social Security's trickiest areas, so you're wise to get answers before either of you claim benefits. The short answer is, "No" - if your wife claims her own benefit this year, she will not get 50% of your benefit when you later claim. Here's how it

Born in November 1958, your wife's full retirement age (FRA) is 66 years plus 8 months, which she will attain in July 2025. Born in August 1959, your FRA is 66 years plus 10 months, which you will reach in June 2026.

Your wife will get a "spousal boost" to her personal SS benefit if her FRA entitlement is less than 50% of your FRA

entitlement but, if she claims before reaching her FRA, her monthly payment when you claim will be less than 50% of your FRA entitlement (taking her own benefit early affects her total payment amount as your spouse). If, instead, your wife waits until her own FRA to claim her SS retirement benefit, her payment when you later claim will be increased to equal 50% of your FRA entitlement.

I assume your reference to your wife "waiting until age 68" refers to her age when you claim at your FRA, but there is no reason for your wife to wait past her own FRA to claim benefits because her spousal benefit will not be more if she waits longer. So, the question is whether your wife should claim this year and get a reduced payment when you later claim or, instead, wait until her FRA to claim her own benefit and get her maximum benefit later. And that depends on 1) whether your wife is working, and 2) what her life expectancy is:

1. If your wife is working and claims early SS benefits, she will be subject to Social Security's "earnings test" which limits how much she can earn before some benefits are taken away. The earnings limit for 2023 is \$21,240 and, if that is exceeded, SS will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 she is over the limit. The earnings limit lasts until she reaches her full retirement age.

2. If your wife's life expectancy is long (average for a woman your wife's current age is about 87), then maximizing her monthly benefit by waiting until her FRA to claim is likely her smartest choice.

If your wife's FRA

entitlement is less than 50% of your FRA entitlement, waiting until her FRA to claim will result in getting her full personal amount first and then later her maximum entitlement (including her spousal boost). If she claims now, her later payment (which includes her spousal boost) will be less than half of your FRA amount. If your wife's life expectancy is at least average, waiting until her FRA to claim will likely yield the highest cumulative lifetime benefits.

But if your wife isn't working full time, by claiming now (vs. at her FRA) she would get her reduced personal benefit for an extra 2 years. If you divide the amount your wife would collect over those two years by the difference between her current benefit amount and her maximum spousal amount (half of your FRA entitlement), you will see how long it would take for your wife to recover those 2 years of benefits. And if her life expectancy is less than that length of time, then claiming earlier is likely the right move.

# Former Correctional Sergeant Found Guilty of Perjury in Cover-Up of Assault of an Inmate

U.S. Department of Justice News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On July 17, 2023, a jury found a former California state correctional officer guilty of perjury in connection with a federal grand jury investigation into a conspiracy to cover up an assault of an inmate, U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced. Following a three-day trial, Brenda Villa, 32, of North Highlands, was found guilty of one count of perjury.

According to the court records and evidence presented at trial, Villa was a correctional sergeant supervising other officers at California State Prison - Sacramento (also known as New Folsom State Prison or CSP-Sacramento) when correctional officer Arturo Pacheco unlawfully assaulted an inmate under color of law. Following the assault and the inmate's death, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) initiated an internal investigation. As the CDCR internal investigation proceeded, a federal grand jury began investigating federal criminal charges in conjunction with the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the U.S.

Attorney's Office.

Villa was called to testify in front of the grand jury about her role and the actions of her fellow officers in covering up the unlawful assault. Villa lied under oath to the federal grand jury investigating the incident.

This case is the product of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation with assistance from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Michael D. Anderson and Rosanne L. Rust are prosecuting the case.

Former correctional officers Arturo Pacheco and Ashley Aurich pleaded guilty and were sentenced to 12½ years and 21 months in prison, respectively.

Villa's sentencing will be scheduled in front of U.S. District Judge William B. Shubb at a future court hearing. The next hearing in the case is on Monday, July 24, 2023. Villa faces a maximum statutory penalty of five years in prison for perjury and a \$250,000 fine. The actual sentence, however, will be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of





# **Bankruptcy Filings Rise 10 Percent**

#### Report from U.S. Courts.com

Personal and business bankruptcy filings rose 10 percent in the twelve-month period ending June 30, 2023, compared with the previous year.

According to statistics released by the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts, annual bankruptcy filings totaled 418,724 in the year ending June 2023, compared with 380,634 cases in the previous year.

Business filings rose 23.3 percent, from 12,748 to 15,724 in the year ending

June 30, 2023. Non-business bankruptcy filings rose 9.5 percent to 403,000, compared with 367,886 in the previous year.

Bankruptcy totals for the previous 12 months are reported four times annually. Filings over any 12-month period have increased only rarely since filings peaked in 2010. Bankruptcies fell sharply after the pandemic began in early 2020, despite some early COVID-related disruptions to the economy.
