CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Having barely wiped dust from their boots after July 4, Carmichael Elks organizers are already seeking a 2024 parade Grand Marshal.

"He or she is an important part of the parade," explains Jim Warrick, whose family has run 63 Independence Day pageants. "Our marshal's got to be a figure really connected to the community - someone that people know is out there, serving."

2023's Grand Marshal was Izzy DeLancey. Riding in a red 1966 Mustang convertible, the realtor and civic volunteer smiled till her teeth ached. "I was elated to

PRIDE Industries Holds "Hire A Veteran Day"

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - National "Hire a Veteran Day" will be observed on Tuesday, July 25, 2023. And if you're a recent military veteran in the Sacramento area, ready to take the next step in your career, then register now for a special veterans' hiring event at the PRIDE Industries Career Hub at 7011 Sylvan Road on Tuesday, July 25th in Citrus Heights from 10 am to 2 pm.

"It's our first time locally hosting this event in Citrus Heights," said Charles Smith, PRIDE Industries (PRIDE) recruitment manager/talent acquisition in a telephone interview from his Texas office. "It's a corporate event for us and we're eager to spread the word about this special event."

Since 1966, PRIDE Industries has provided employment recruiting services to the military, serving 17 major bases across the country. The company also counts hundreds of veterans of all ranks among its management team and on its board of directors.

PRIDE Industries also partners with multiple government and private organizations including the Department of Veterans Affairs, and the State of California Employment Development Department (EDD) to support the professional development of active and former service members who are ready to build or transition into rewarding civilian careers.

The national "Hire A Veteran Day" aims to inspire employers to recruit and hire veterans by recognizing the unique skills and values that former soldiers, sailors, airmen, Marines and Coast Guardsmen bring to the workforce. Roughly 200,000 military members retire or separate from the armed services every year, according to the Department of Labor.

"PRIDE is dedicated to helping our military veterans of all abilities find sustainable employment," Smith said. Through its contractual relationship with the U.S. Army, PRIDE is looking to fill between 300 to 400 positions in the greater Sacramento area at its upcoming July event.

Through its veterans employment advantage program, run by a team of fellow veterans, PRIDE is eager to help connect vets to needed job support services, job coaching, and employment to get them quickly on a path towards success in the civilian workforce.

Specific support includes an intake session

Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Welcomes New Volunteers

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On June 22, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office announced they are looking for additional volunteers to round out the variety of programs they offer the community. Despite the fact many living within county lines are unaware volunteer tasks even exist, residents should know that the tasks available often coincide with

duties of trained law enforcement. Many of the county's volunteers have experience working as a police officer or in emergency services, however, anyone who is of applicable age and meets the requirements is welcome to give their time.

According to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, there are currently five different divisions volunteers are welcome to apply to: The Sheriff's Amateur Radio

Program (SHARP), Volunteer Reserve Officer, Volunteers in Partnership with the Sheriff (VIPS), Search & Rescue, and a youth program called the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Explorer Program.

SHARP was created in 1977 after an increase in theft crimes hit the region. It was further inspired by the level of participation from the community that came about when the Police were working to apprehend the East

Area Rapist. It became clear that year how valuable citizens were when it came to operating radio and helping to relay emergency information. All volunteers are licensed by the FCC, and, according to their website, "have the responsibility of assisting the Sacramento County Emergency Operations Center with any emergency requiring auxiliary communication."

Walking Through Every Open Door

Advice and Insights from Diplomatic Consultant W. Bruce Lee



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - W. Bruce Lee is a man of experience and humility, and he said he attributes his success to always saying yes to the next challenge — accepting the next invitation, undertaking the next assignment, choosing to “always walk through doors that are open for me.”

Lee’s work spans the industries of government, business, and education. He has taught at the University of Phoenix and William Jessup University, worked in the Governor’s Finance Department for the State of California, and worked as a business coach for various national corporations. Lee has served in the halls of government most of his life — running statewide initiatives, twice elected as Mayor of Loomis, and elected as Director of the Placer County Water Agency, among other offices. Currently, he serves as the executive officer of the Phoenix Correspondence Commission, a nonpartisan governmental entity (established by all 50 states) that works to balance State and Federal authority.

In recent years, Lee has turned his skills toward diplomatic consulting—helping communities, businesses, and governments around the world find pathways to success as well as hope for the future.

Born and raised in the Sacramento Region, Lee has traveled the world, advising organizations in places such as Nepal, Singapore, and China. He has worked in South America,

In all nations — regardless of differing systems of government, economy, and cultural standards — the same basic needs exist. And people always seek to overcome challenges, achieve their goals, and better their lives. But Lee has also seen that “there is a human tendency toward selfishness, and selfishness creates greed, which in government will lead to short-term benefits in one’s own self-interest, but does

not create any long-term sustainability.” Lee, “and look not at what is right for themselves, but what is right for their constituents, and for their society as a whole.” Practical solu-

tions are needed, so that is where Lee comes in, offering guidance on how governments can provide opportunities that better serve their people, creating stronger communities that support a stronger nation. In business settings, the advice is similarly applied: better products and services create a more satisfied customer base, better employee morale, and a stronger company for the long term.

Whether in a classroom, boardroom, or the legislature of foreign governments, Lee said the core of his work is about “equipping people” and showing them that there are practical solutions to every challenge. He often sees “a lot of activity, with plenty of energy and money to make things happen — but a lack of results.”


While people often want an easy answer, Lee cautions that there is “no one right answer, no magic bullet.” Change takes effort and discipline. There are answers, and while they won’t come overnight, there is always hope for

improving the situation — and Lee strives to help everyone find that hope. “We need to exercise sound critical thinking and wisdom in how we approach our problem solving,” said Lee. “We have to take responsibility for ourselves and for our society.”

In his life, Lee spends his time and money investing not in himself, but in others, wherever he sees a need: “Wherever I am able to be of benefit, it is my honor and privilege to be of service,” said Lee. “I can offer what I have.”

As a deeply religious man, Lee credits God for his many accomplishments. “God has been good to me,” said Lee. “I live in a country where I’ve been able to get a good education and develop useful skills. God has treated me much better than I deserve. And it’s easy to take these things for granted, but it’s essential that we do not.”

Seeing the struggles of communities around the world has broadened Lee’s perspective. He believes that many Americans don’t realize how fortunate they are. “Our social, economic, and political freedoms are hard-won,” said Lee. “Diligence is necessary in their protection, otherwise they may easily slip away.” For many around the world, America is “still the light on the hill,” said Lee. “They see we’re doing things differently, and we need to protect that.”

Australia, New Zealand, Europe and Eastern Europe, the Middle East, and various African countries —including Cameroon, Rwanda, Ethiopia, Zimbabwe, Tunisia, Uganda, Nigeria, and South Sudan.


Lee has found that all societies are built upon three main systems: economic, government, and culture. And every society is unique in the way these features integrate and reinforce each other. But Lee cautioned that different cultures don’t always support the same economic or governmental systems. So, as an outsider in these countries, Lee said, “I don’t assume.” His first and most important step is to listen: “You tell me what you need, and then I can help to achieve those results.”

Lee cautioned that many people here live lives of privilege and feel no sense of responsibility toward others. But Lee said, “We have a massive responsibility to our community.”

Whatever skills each of us have, Lee believes we are called to use them for the good of others, whether that is in construction, farming, teaching, etc. “If it benefits people in a tangible way, inspires them, gives them hope—that’s a blessing,” said Lee.

His advice can be boiled down to a simple message: “Let’s love our neighbors. Let’s not take things for granted. Let us be of good hope, because whatever challenges we may see around us, they are resolvable if we work together in a civilized way, not marred by violence in word or action. ... Let us seek to honor each other and learn from each other. All of that takes commitment and humility.”

Jehovah's Witness Conventions Returning to Downtown Sacramento

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - After a three-year pandemic pause, one of the largest convention organizations in the world has chosen downtown Sacramento to host its global three-day event, the 2023 "Exercise Patience"! Convention.

The return happens just in time to use the newly renovated SAFE Credit Union Convention Center, and will draw an estimated 28,000 attendees to the downtown area during a time when most locals are away for the summer.

Prior to 2020, summers in Sacramento drew Jehovah's Witnesses from all over Northern California who filled hotels and restaurants as they attended their annual conventions at the Sleep Train Arena. In 2020, the pandemic interrupted that tradition when the Witnesses canceled their in-person events throughout the world and held their convention programs as virtual events in more than 500 languages. Starting in late June of this year, the Witnesses will bring back the tradition to Sacramento, hosting conventions exclusively downtown at the SAFE Credit Union Convention Center. Conventions will be held over seven weekends this summer starting June 30, 2023, and ending Aug 13, 2023. The conventions will be held in English for five weekends and two

(July 14-16, July 21-23) in Spanish.

"After three years without in-person conventions, we can't wait to gather together again for these special annual events," said Adrian Barnes, local spokesman for Jehovah's Witnesses. "It's particularly exciting that we are returning to support beautiful downtown Sacramento, where the local restaurants, businesses and residents have always been welcoming."

Some 6,000 conventions will be held worldwide as part of the 2023 "Exercise Patience"! Convention series. In the United States alone, more than 700 conventions will be held in 144 host cities. From Friday through Sunday, six convention sessions will explore the quality of patience, highlighting its modern-day relevance through Scriptural examples. A live baptism will be performed following the Saturday morning session and a prerecorded drama will be featured in two parts during the Saturday and Sunday afternoon sessions.

"Given the challenges

we face today as individuals and communities, the theme of our convention, "Exercise Patience"!, is particularly timely," said Barnes. "The three-day program will share practical ways attendees can cultivate and display patience, which in turn contributes to stronger relationships and more compassionate communities, including right here in Sacramento."

Jehovah's Witnesses have been holding public conventions in stadiums, arenas, convention centers, and theaters around the world for more than 100 years. After resuming smaller in-person meetings and their public ministry during 2022, the summer of 2023 marks the first time they will gather at much larger regional events around the world since the lifting of pandemic restrictions.

Governor Signs Bill to Strengthen Domestic Violence Restraining Orders

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Governor Gavin Newsom recently signed into law Assembly Bill (AB) 467, a bipartisan measure authored by Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel (D - Encino) that will strengthen the ability of judges to grant and modify domestic violence protective orders.

"At a time in which violence against women and domestic abuse have increased to record levels around the world, it is crucial that we ensure domestic violence restraining orders are offering the fullest possible protection," said Assemblymember Gabriel. "This legislation will clarify a judge's authority over these orders, and extend the amount of time a court can modify the orders to ensure that we are providing ample protection to victims of domestic abuse."

Santa Clara County District Attorney Jeff Rosen, sponsor of the bill, hailed the new law as crucial to make sure that victims of crime can petition the court to change the terms of restraining orders during the 10-year lifetime of those orders. In some instances, victims will need more protections from the court, and in others fewer. District Attorney Rosen said, "Giving judges the ability to modify

their own court orders will help victims of domestic violence manage the protections to keep them safe. We are so grateful to Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel for championing this important new law."

Ambiguity in current law has left some courts confused as to when and for how long they have authority over domestic violence restraining orders and when they can modify provisions related to contact between the restrained person and the protected person, which can either be a "peaceful contact order" (PCO) or a no contact order (NCO). Victims often seek to modify the order from PCO to NCO or vice versa.

Some courts have determined that if the defendant is no longer serving a sentence and is not on probation, they do not have the jurisdiction to modify the order, even if both the victim and defendant request it. This confusion in current law is detrimental to both victims and defendants. AB 467 gives sentencing courts the authority to modify the terms of a peaceful contact order or no contact order and make modifications to the order throughout the duration of the domestic violence protective order.

Jesse Gabriel proudly represents the San Fernando Valley in the California State Legislature. ★

Poor Choices Behind The Wheel Result in Tragedies

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The results of the California Highway Patrol's (CHP) recent Independence Day Maximum Enforcement Period (MEP) are a sobering reminder of the consequences resulting from unsafe driving behaviors.

Sixty-eight people were killed in crashes throughout the state during the Independence Day MEP, which began at 6:01 p.m. on Friday, June 30, and concluded at 11:59 p.m. on Tuesday, July 4. Tragically, nearly half of the total number of vehicle occupants who died within CHP jurisdiction were not wearing a seat belt.

With unsafe speed being the number one contributor to crashes in California, the CHP placed a special emphasis on its enforcement during the recent MEP. CHP officers issued more than 9,700 speed citations throughout the long Independence Day weekend.

Additionally, impaired drivers were removed from California's roadways at an alarming rate during the holiday enforcement effort. CHP officers made 1,224 arrests for driving under the influence, which is an average of one DUI arrest every five minutes.

"The results of this MEP are concerning and reinforce the need for responsible behavior behind the wheel," said CHP Commissioner Sean Duryee. "All of these deaths were preventable, and the loved ones they leave behind will be forever impacted. Traffic safety is everyone's responsibility, and these statistics show us how much work there is still to be done. The CHP is committed to making California's roadways safer for all who use them."

To help protect those who are traveling on California's roadways during the holidays, the CHP implements six MEPs per year. The next MEP is scheduled for Labor Day weekend. Throughout the holiday weekend, all available uniformed members of the Department will be on patrol to enhance public safety, deter unsafe driving behavior, and, when necessary, take appropriate enforcement action.

Keep yourself and others who are on the road safe by buckling up, driving at a speed safe for conditions, avoid distractions behind the wheel, and always designating a sober driver.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★



mortgage to pay for the work?

Dear Natalie,

For starters, I'd suggest cutting expenses any way you can, living on a strict budget and saving as much cash as possible. But taking out a second mortgage? No! You don't want that hanging over your heads.

You might want to get another opinion on the kitchen remodel, too. Sure, a new kitchen would be nice, but would it be a make-or-break kind of thing if you decide to sell your home? Probably not, unless it's in really terrible shape right now. Regardless, there's no way I'd go into debt to make this happen. I mean, your house isn't even on the market yet. There's no reason to fix up a house that's not for sale, especially

when you've got just \$4,000 to your names.

My advice is to wait and see how the whole job situation plays out before making any big decisions. Then if you end up selling the house and moving, you might take \$500 or so from savings to freshen up the kitchen a little bit.

Annual Crime Report Shows Californians' Fear Of Increasing Crime Is Justified

Political officeholders at all levels and of all ideological stripes habitually pursue a time-dishonored practice when releasing data.

If its positive, politicians try to maximize its importance with lavish news conferences and self-congratulatory declarations.

If, on the other hand, the data have a negative cast, they will be released quietly, often late on a Friday afternoon, to minimize media coverage.

California's annual report on crime was released this year on the Friday before what for many would be a four-day, Fourth of July holiday weekend. That's a tipoff that it would not be good news – and, in fact, it received minimal media attention.

The 2022 report revealed that the state's violent crime rate increased by 6.1% since 2021, and property crime was up 6.2%. Homicides dipped very slightly, but robberies jumped by 10.2%.

Attorney General Rob Bonta issued a low-key statement with the data release, saying, "While crime rates remain significantly below their historical highs, property and violent crimes continue to have devastating consequences for communities across the state, and gun violence remains a major

threat to public safety."

One can be certain that had California seen a drop in crime in 2022, Bonta would have trumpeted it as loudly as possible.

Let's be clear: Neither Bonta nor any other attorney general can have more than a marginal effect on crime rates. Nevertheless, their campaigns often depict themselves as the state's top cop and imply that they do have such authority.

Why crime rates ebb and flow is the subject of never-ending academic and political debate – and is colored by equally erratic public concerns about being victimized.

At the moment, Californians' worries about crime appear to be on the upswing, as indicated by one of the Public Policy Institute of California's periodic polls, conducted just before last fall's election.

"Californians' perception of crime spiked during the pandemic – as did certain types of crime," PPIC found, adding, "nearly two in three Californians call violence and street crime in their local community a problem. This includes 31% who call them a big problem, a noticeable increase from February 2020 (24%)."

The poll found that among racial and ethnic groups, Black Californians expressed the highest level of concern about crime, women were more concerned than men, and Republicans more than Democrats or independent voters.

The data released on June 30 imply that those concerns are rooted in fact. Crime did increase sharply last year, particularly robberies, and it has not gone

unnoticed in the media.

The proliferation of cameras in stores and in the hands of cellphone owners has produced a never-ending supply of crime video snippets, such as smash-and-grab invasions of stores, for television newscasts, which then reverberate on YouTube and other online outlets.

Just a few days after the crime report release, for example, a San Francisco TV station aired video of criminals breaking into a Bay Area visitor's rental car in broad daylight, stealing the contents and driving away.

Bonta and the man who appointed him attorney general before he won reelection in November, Gov. Gavin Newsom, have pursued somewhat ambivalent postures about crime. They lament its effects on victims and take some public crime-fighting steps while championing criminal justice reform to reduce traditional punishment of those caught breaking the law.

A day before the crime data were released, Newsom dispatched more California Highway Patrol officers to battle open air drug dealing in San Francisco, a city he once governed as mayor.

In decades past, spikes in crime have had major impacts on California's political atmosphere – helping Republicans become dominant in the 1980s, for example.

Were crime to continue its currently upward path, it could once again become a game-changing political factor.

CSLB Sting Uncovers Unlicensed Contractors in Rancho Cordova

CSLB News Release

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) recently partnered with the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office to conduct a highly successful undercover operation aimed at targeting unlicensed contractors. This operation took place in Rancho Cordova on June 7 and 8, 2023, and resulted in the identification of multiple individuals engaged in illegal contracting practices.

During the operation, CSLB cited 10 individuals for allegedly conducting contracting activities without the required license. These offenders have been issued Notices to Appear in criminal court, where they could face legal consequences, including fines up to \$15,000 and/or jail time. Engaging in contracting work without a contractor's license is a misdemeanor offense in California.

The individuals targeted during this operation submitted bids ranging from \$1,500 for bathroom improvements to more than \$10,000 for concrete work. A California contractor's license is required to bid or contract for construction work exceeding

\$500 in value, including materials and labor. CSLB remains steadfast in its mission to enforce contracting laws and protect consumers from unscrupulous individuals involved in unlicensed contracting activities.

Unlicensed contractors apprehended in this operation may also face additional charges for advertising their construction services without the necessary license. It is illegal under California law for anyone to advertise construction or home improvement work without a valid license in the advertised classification. If unlicensed individuals advertise contracting services, they must explicitly disclose their lack of licensure and cannot bid or contract for work valued at more than \$500.

"CSLB is unwavering in our dedication to protect homeowners from the risks posed by unlicensed contractors," emphasized CSLB Registrar David Fogt. "Our commitment includes providing continuous consumer education on the critical significance of hiring licensed contractors. We urge homeowners to verify a contractor's license before embarking on any construction project in California."

During the operation, it

was discovered that some individuals demanded excessive down payments before commencing work. California law strictly limits contractors to requesting no more than 10% of the project cost or \$1,000, whichever is less. Violating this provision constitutes a misdemeanor offense, punishable by substantial fines of up to \$5,000 or a potential one-year county jail sentence, or both.

CSLB, in collaboration with the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office and other agencies across the state, will continue to work to combat unlicensed contracting activities. Together, they will enforce the law, promote consumer protection, and uphold the integrity of the construction industry.







SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - It has been less than a year since the County Department of Transportation (SacDOT) finished work on the final portion of the Hazel Avenue Improvement Project. It was a project designed to reduce congestion along Hazel Avenue and improve mobility for bicyclists and pedestrians, and that work recently earned SacDOT a statewide transportation award.

The \$60 million project caught the eye of the California Transportation Foundation, which presented SacDOT with its 2023 Local Street Project of the Year award on June 6. For more than 30 years, the non-profit organization has recognized transportation achievements, innovations, and excellence throughout the state.

This year's award-winning project was the final phase of a fifteen-year effort to beautify Hazel Avenue from Highway 50 to Madison Avenue. The project widened Hazel

Avenue from 4 to 6 lanes to reduce congestion while increasing safety and mobility for all modes of transportation.

Other significant improvements along Hazel Avenue included:

Bikeways and ADA-compliant pedestrian facilities. These new bicycle and pedestrian facilities provide safe connections to the American River Parkway and the trail system adjacent to the Hazel Avenue Bridge and Lake Natoma; Public transit enhancements with new turn-out lanes for buses so the traffic can keep moving; The turn-out lanes also allow bus riders to board safely.

SacDOT Chief Civil Engineer, Steve White, accepted the award on behalf of the County. White praised Principal Civil Engineer, Melissa Wright, and her in-house design team, led by Project Manager, Tim Stevens and Project Engineer, James Eslabon, for designing and developing the final phase of the Hazel Avenue Improvement Project. Teichert Construction,

Pacific Excavation, RNR Construction Inc., TRC Companies Inc., County Construction Management Inspection Division, and County Real Estate Division were also acknowledged as integral members for helping build the project.

White also pointed out that completion of the Hazel Avenue work would not have been possible without the continuing support of the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors and our partnerships with local funding partners Fair Oaks Water District and Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD). SMUD removed overhead powerlines and placed them underground, while the water district used the project to upgrade its water system for residents and businesses.

The California Transportation Foundation's annual awards program was held in Sacramento at the Grand Sheraton where SacDOT beat out other local street project finalists from Truckee, Live Oak, and Caltrans. ★
