Scout Troop 55 Marks a Century

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Scouts of all ages offered three-finger salutes as Carmichael's Troop 55 marked its 100-year anniversary last weekend.

Chartered in 1923, boys of the troop first met in a lumber cabin beside the old Carmichael Presbyterian Church on Marconi Avenue. Over a century, activities continued at Carmichael Elementary School, the Clubhouse at Carmichael Park and in Jensen Botanical Gardens. Of late, they gather at Koobs Nature Area in summer and at Del Campo High School in winter. Almost 80 Scouts, former Scouts

and supporters reunited for memories, presentations, speeches and cupcakes at a Carmichael Park picnic. Dr Trent Saxton (73) made the journey from Idaho for the party. "My Scouting years happened all over the world, as my father was in the Air Force," he recalled. "Over the years, I've been a college trustee, a doctor. All these came about through what I learned from my experiences as a Scout."

Addressing the gathering, former Scout Master Andrew Campbell (54) honored the troop's endurance. "It's taken people who believe in Scouting enough to invest part of their lives for the movement," he said. "We are preparing youth to make ethical

choices. There are few other opportunities today for them to experience hands-on leadership.

"In Scouting, they help each other; they teach each other skills. It's what I call "Lord of the Flies" done right. Some kids today are so busy texting that they don't know how to have conversations. Conversations between kids and adults - happen in Scouting all the time. This is the glue that holds society together; it's incredibly important that it endures."

Pioneer Express District Executive Steve Croff praised troop leaders and parents for their contributions. "In 100 years, this troop has had 5000 members," he said. *Continued on page 2*

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Board of Supervisors at its June 6 meeting concurred with the County Executive's Appointment of Chad Rinde as Director of Finance, effective June 26, 2023.

Rinde has led Yolo County's budgetary process, been a key contributor to annexations with local cities to promote economic development and performed disaster and business relief efforts during COVID-19 while simultaneously fulfilling all the statutory responsibilities of the office.

In addition to his professional experience, Rinde graduated from Sacramento State with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration with an emphasis in Accountancy. Rinde is also a Certified Public Accountant for the State of California.

He has completed the California State Association of Counties (CSAC) Leadership Program, "So you want to be the CAO/CEO," and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA)

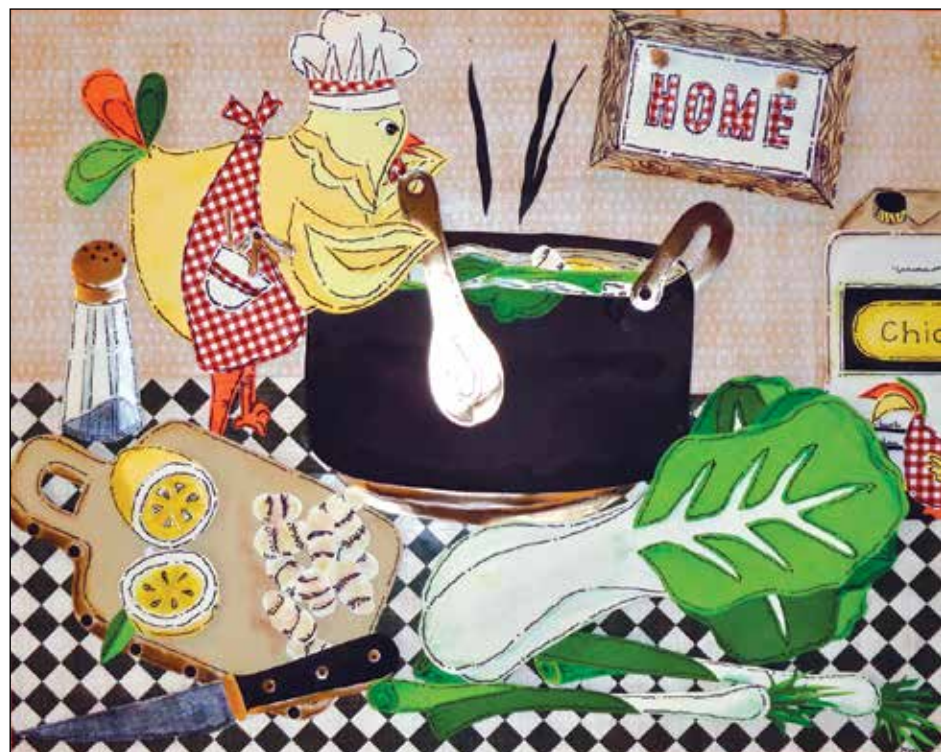

New 810 Billiards and Bowling to Open in Carmichael

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The first California location of 810 Billiards and Bowling, offering what the company describes as a “classic bowling experience with an upscale twist” is expected to open in early 2024 in the Crestview Village Shopping center on Manzanita Avenue in Carmichael.

Jaswinder (Jas) Singh, the franchisee, is planning to open in a former 37,000-square-foot empty former Ross Dress for Less site in the center.

Singh was unavailable for additional comment but told the Sacramento Business Journal in an earlier interview that his preliminary estimates for likely tenant improvements are between \$3 to 5 million. He is still narrowing down construction costs as he works through the permitting process in Sacramento County.

In addition to billiards tables and bowling lanes, other featured attractions may include an arcade, axe throwing, board games and miniature golf.

810 Billiards and Bowling, which is based in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, has four locations in its home state, and locations in Phoenix, Houston and Fort Smith, Arkansas. Each location offers guests a variety of amenities to choose from, including bowling, billiards, and arcade games.

Michael Siniscalchi, chief executive officer of 810 Billiards and Bowling, responding on behalf of the franchisee, described how the venture came together.

“Our franchisee Jas Singh is a long-time resident and business owner in the Sacramento area and identified the need for additional upscale entertainment venues in the market which led us to embark on this venture together,” he said.

We are excited to partner with

Jas to bring the Carmichael area a premier venue featuring bowling, billiards, miniature golf, sports simulators, axe throwing, arcade and a full-service kitchen and bar.

Crestview Village, located near the intersection of Manzanita Avenue and Winding Way in Carmichael, is anchored by Save Mart Supermarkets. The

center, owned by local real estate investor Ethan Conrad, recently underwent an approximately \$2 million renovation.

While the company is

interested in additional locations in the greater Sacramento area, its CEO said that as of now, “100 percent of its focus is on a successful opening at our Carmichael location.”

“As for the state of California in general, we also have a site search underway in the Corona area and hope to have a location secured there shortly,” he said.

Singh, a manager in the logistics industry, told the Journal he scouted a few locations when he decided to become an 810 franchisee. While he lives in Yuba City, his children play on basketball travel teams that often have games in the Sacramento area. He looked for entertainment options after games and felt something was missing.

Singh said his Carmichael location would also have a food and drink menu featuring pizza, wings, salads and a full bar. Hours would be 12 to 10 p.m., possibly staying open as late as midnight, he said.

“As a multi-faceted concept, our company, 810 Billiards and Bowling, offers extensive support and training to all our franchisees throughout the process,” said Michael Siniscalchi, company chief executive officer.

During the pre-opening phase, the company assists with site selection and lease negotiation, financing, design and development, construction management and equipment sourcing, Siniscalchi said.

“As construction nears completion, we assist in management hiring, training our new team at existing corporate locations and sending our opening team on-site to ensure a successful launch for our franchise operated venues,” he said.

Singh said he’s hoping the Carmichael location will be just his first. Once it’s open and operating well, Singh told the Business Journal he may be scouting for other California locations. ★

PG&E Wants to Help Customers Recognize Utility Scams and Avoid Falling Victim

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - With reports of scams targeting utility customers at an all-time high, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) shares tips with customers to help recognize the signs of a potential scam.

A typical sign of a scam targeting a utility customer includes a caller claiming to be from PG&E and threatening disconnection if immediate payment is not made via a prepaid debit card or money transfer service like Zelle. As a reminder, PG&E will never send a single notification to a customer within one hour of a service interruption, and we will never ask customers to make payments with a pre-paid debit card, gift card, any form of cryptocurrency, or third-party digital payment mobile applications.

"If you ever receive a call threatening utility disconnection if you do not make immediate payment, hang up the phone and either log into your account on PGE.com or call our customer service number to confirm your account details. Remember, PG&E will never ask for your financial information over the phone or via email, nor will we request payment via pre-paid debit cards or other payment services like Zelle. End the call, end the scam" said Matt Foley, lead customer scam investigator for PG&E.

Based on data collected so far in 2023, scammers are stepping up their efforts to defraud customers. In fact, there have been over 19,000 scam attempts reported by customers to PG&E, and customers have lost nearly \$342,000 in the first four months of 2023 alone. During 2022, PG&E received nearly 23,000 reports from customers who were targeted by scammers impersonating the company, and customers lost approximately \$946,000 in fraudulent payments.

Scammers can be convincing and often target those who are most vulnerable, including senior citizens and low-income communities. They also aim their scams at small business owners during busy customer service hours. Another recent emerging scam trend involves scammers targeting real estate agents via their listings, and threatening to shut off power if immediate payment is not made. However, with the right information, customers can learn to detect and report these predatory scams.

Signs Of A Potential Scam

Threat to disconnect: Scammers may

aggressively demand immediate payment for an alleged past due bill.

Request for immediate payment: Scammers may instruct the customer to purchase a prepaid card, then call them back supposedly to make a bill payment.

Request for prepaid card: When the customer calls back, the caller asks the customer for the prepaid card's number, which grants the scammer instant access to the card's funds.

Refund or rebate offers: Scammers may say that your utility company overbilled you and owes you a refund, or that you are entitled to a rebate, and ask you for your personal financial information.

Scammers Impersonating Trusted Phone Numbers: Scammers are now able to create authentic-looking 800 numbers which appear on your phone display. The numbers don't lead back to PG&E if called back, however, so if you have doubts, hang up and call PG&E at 1-833-500-SCAM. If customers ever feel that they are in physical danger, they should call 911.

How Customers Can Protect Themselves

Customers should never purchase a prepaid card to avoid service disconnection or shutoff. PG&E does not specify how customers should make a bill payment and offers a variety of ways to pay a bill, including accepting payments online, by phone, automatic bank draft, mail or in person.

If a scammer threatens immediate disconnection or shutoff of service without prior notification, customers should hang up the phone, delete the email, or shut the door. Customers with delinquent accounts receive an advance disconnection notification, typically by mail and included with their regular monthly bill.

Signing up for an online account at pge.com is another safeguard. Not only can customers log in to check their balance and payment history, they can also sign up for recurring payments, paperless billing and helpful alerts.

Customers who suspect that they have been victims of fraud, or who feel threatened during contact with one of these scammers, should contact local law enforcement. The Federal Trade Commission's website is also a good source of information about how to protect personal information.

Bill to Allow Amsterdam-Style Cannabis Cafes Passed by CA State Assembly

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Assemblymember Matt Haney's (D-San Francisco) bill to allow local California governments to license Amsterdam-style cannabis cafes passed out of the State Assembly with a broad bipartisan support receiving a 64 to 9 vote on June 1, 2023. While cannabis cafes in the Netherlands capitalize on the social experience of cannabis by offering coffee, food, and live music, all of those opportunities are currently illegal under California law. Haney's AB 374 will allow struggling cannabis businesses to diversify away from the marijuana-only "dispensary" model and bring much-needed tourist dollars into empty downtowns.

"Lots of people want to enjoy legal cannabis in the company of others," said Haney. "And many people want to do that while sipping coffee, eating a scone, or listening to music. There's absolutely no good reason from an economic, health, or safety standpoint that the state should make that illegal. If an authorized cannabis retail store wants to also sell a cup of coffee and a sandwich, we should allow cities to make that possible and stop holding back these small businesses."

California is known worldwide as the birthplace of cannabis culture with its early adoption of medical cannabis and its expertise in cultivation. But there's another location that competes with California for the title of the world capital of cannabis: Amsterdam. There are over 700 cannabis cafes that operate across the Netherlands, and over 1 billion dollars is

spent in the cafes every year.

California on the other hand, is still dealing with the unintended consequences of decades of medical marijuana-only policies. California's "dispensaries" have replaced the social aspect of the Amsterdam cannabis scene with pharmacy-like businesses that only allow customers to order cannabis at a counter, purchase nothing else, and then leave.

"California's small cannabis businesses are struggling," said Haney. "Issues like over-saturation, high taxes, and the thriving black market are hurting cannabis businesses who follow the rules and pay taxes." In 2020, California's legal cannabis sales reached \$4 billion, while the state's illicit market sales were projected to have exceeded \$8 billion.

While consuming cannabis on-site at cannabis retailers is technically legal in California, selling non-cannabis-infused products is not. AB 374 is simple because it allows cannabis retailers to diversify their business and move away from the struggling and limited dispensary model by selling non-cannabis-infused foods.

"To be clear, we're not saying that coffee shops should be allowed to sell cannabis," said Assemblymember Matt Haney. "We're saying that cannabis shops should be allowed to sell coffee. It shouldn't be illegal for an existing cannabis business to move away from only selling marijuana and instead have the opportunity to grow, thrive and create jobs by offering coffee or live jazz."

AB 374 will now move to the Senate for approval, before being sent to the governor's desk to be signed. ★

Detectives Seek Information on North Highlands Homicide Case

Sheriff's Homicide Detectives and Crime Scene Investigators responded to the call and are still interviewing witnesses and gathering evidence. The victim's information will be made available by the Sacramento County Coroner. No further information is available at this time.

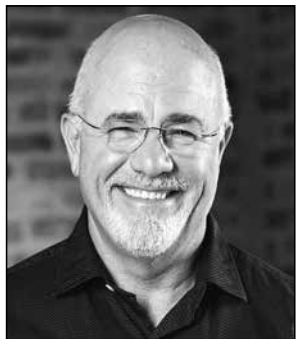

Don't Put All Your Eggs in One Basket

Dear Dave,

My employer offers an employee stock purchase plan at a 15% discount. I'm usually the kind of guy who buys stocks and holds on to them forever. But when it comes to an opportunity like this, should I buy it and wait for a year to sell it, or should I buy it and sell right away?

— John

Dear John,

Generally, I don't recommend buying single stocks at all. Single stocks are way too risky, and a 15% discount is nothing special in this kind of scenario. Virtually every single company out there that has an employee stock option plan offers a 15% discount.

In most situations like this, if you pull up a 52-week chart on the stock's performance, you'll

find a variance of as much as 15% in those 52 weeks. In other words, you could lose any or all of that discount in one move of the stock. Plus, it's not like 15% is a big discount to begin with. Fifteen percent off a single stock, considering how volatile they are, is no big deal. But hey, if you love your company that much, they have a great track record, and the stock has a good history, go ahead. Just don't allow single stocks as a category to make up more than 10% of your net worth.

The core issue here is a lack of diversification. When you put all your eggs in one basket, there's always some clown twirling the basket. The first time I ran into that was a long time ago with a lady who was 70 years old. She had worked for a large company for 40 years. On top of that, she invested all her 401(k), all her wealth—\$800,000 total—in that one company. Well, this company experienced a crisis. It lost nearly

half of its value, and her \$800,000 was suddenly worth about \$400,000. She left herself vulnerable with a high-risk play, John.

I'll say it again. Don't bet the farm on one horse, and don't have more than 10% of your net worth wrapped up in single stocks. Hundreds of research projects have been done that show individuals who buy individual stocks and think they know what they're doing actually lose money much more often than they make money.

California Water Rights At Risk As Three Legislative Proposals Advance

When California imposed its first-ever regulation on the extraction of water from underground aquifers in 2014, it gave environmental groups a landmark victory in their decades-long effort to overhaul water use laws.

It was also a political setback for farmers, who are California's major water users and have depended on wells to irrigate their crops as increasingly frequent droughts reduce surface water in rivers and reservoirs.

However, while groundwater regulation ended one front in California's never-ending political and legal battles over allocation of water, it merely set the stage for an even bigger conflict over surface water rights, particularly those pre-dating 1914, when the state first began controlling diversions.

Just months after the groundwater regulation's enactment, with drought still gripping the state, the water rights battle was joined when the state Water Resources Control Board attempted to curtail diversions by some pre-1914 rights holders.

The board accused a small water system on the southern edge of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, Byron-Bethany Irrigation District, of ignoring its curtailment order and

continuing to take water from the Delta for 13 days.

"We are a test case," Byron-Bethany's manager, Rick Gilmore, said at the time. "I think this has become a larger issue. I think the water board wants to use this as a precedent so they can start to gain more control over senior water right users."

An immediate confrontation was averted, but the underlying conflict continued and last year the state court of appeal declared that the board lacked emergency curtailment authority over senior rights holders.

Meanwhile, 2022 saw another clash involving another small water agency that ignored curtailment orders on the Shasta River a few miles south of the Oregon border. The Shasta River Water Association's farmers and ranchers continued to tap the river and later paid small fines.

The court decision and the Shasta River case fired up a long-standing drive by environmental groups to reduce diversions that damage wildlife habitat, contending that pre-1914 rights reflect exploitive and even racist 19th century attitudes incompatible with climate change and 21st century societal mores. Water rights reformers have pressed the board to aggressively invoke the "public trust doctrine" of California water law and the state constitution's declaration that water use must be reasonable.

Despite its clashes over curtailment orders, the water board has been reluctant to engage in a sweeping political and legal war. It did, however, underwrite research

by UC Berkeley's Center for Law, Energy and the Environment on the powers needed to curtail diversions during droughts.

The resulting report, issued in April, declared that "the state needs to implement curtailments on a regular basis, not only in times of extreme crisis. Routine curtailments already happen in other western states. California cannot afford to remain an outlier."

Not surprisingly, three bills have been introduced in the Legislature to give the water board the authority suggested in the UC Berkeley study, pitting water rights reformers against agricultural and municipal water agencies.

Although advocates contend that the bills would merely give the water board much-needed managerial tools, a coalition of water districts and agricultural groups see them as a prelude to the wholesale abrogation of their water rights. The board could gain the "potential to strip public agencies of water rights that have been used to sustain communities for decades," with decrees of "arbitrary outcomes," they wrote in an opposition letter.

All three measures, Assembly Bill 1337, Assembly Bill 460 and Senate Bill 389, survived initial floor votes but the political battle is just beginning. Their fate could rest in Gov. Gavin Newsom's hands as powerful interests clash over a bedrock issue—who prevails when there's not enough water to meet all demands.

Grant Opportunities Available for Wildfire Safety and Preparedness

"The Wildfire Safety and Preparedness Program is a partnership with PG&E that was created to address the increasing wildfire risk. Our collaboration over the last six years has played an important role in helping local communities mitigate their wildfire risks and enhance the public's safety."

"PG&E and the California Fire Foundation share the same goal of ensuring that our hometowns are doing

everything possible to prevent wildfires from starting. Local fire departments, agencies and community groups play such a key role in prioritizing and executing the projects that protect communities and in raising awareness about wildfire safety. We're grateful for our ongoing partnership with the CFF as it provides real-time benefits such as defensible space and fuel-reduction programs as well as crucial awareness to customers in underserved communities," said Mark Quinlan, PG&E's Senior Vice President of Wildfire & Emergency Operations.

Social Security Matters

How Will Working Affect My First Year's Benefits?

Dear Rusty: I retired from working in January of this year and have since claimed Social Security. I didn't work at all in February or March, but I began a part time job in April. I'm very confused about how Social Security counts earnings for the first year. I don't know if I need to keep each month's earnings under \$1,770 or if they average it. Some of the literature I've found says each month must remain under \$1,770 or NO benefit will be paid that month. Two people at the Social Security office told me that they'll just dock me \$1 for every \$2 I am over that, even in my first year. I also cannot find anything about when they count your income. Is it when it's earned or when it's paid? If I go over in a month because there are three pay periods, can they withhold the benefit for that month? I'm just so confused! **Signed: Part Time Worker**

Dear Part Time Worker: The Social Security earnings test during your first year collecting benefits before full retirement age is, indeed, somewhat confusing. The reason is because there are two methods which Social

Security may use during your first calendar year collecting early benefits, and they will use the one which results in the least financial impact to you. To elaborate:

If you claim benefits mid-year before your full retirement age, for the remainder of that first year (starting in the month benefits begin and ending in December) you'll be subject to a monthly earnings limit (\$1,770 for 2023). If you exceed the monthly limit in any remaining month of that first calendar year, you won't be entitled to benefits for that month, so Social Security would (eventually) take back that month's benefit. That is, unless using the annual limit (\$21,240 for 2023) instead will result in a smaller penalty. If your total earnings for your first year collecting are over the annual limit (e.g., \$21,240 for 2023), the penalty would be \$1 for every \$2 over the annual limit and, if that is less than the penalty from using the monthly limit, they will assess the smaller penalty. In other words, Social Security will use the method which is most beneficial to you when assessing a penalty for exceeding the earnings limit during your first calendar year collecting benefits. And just for clarity, the earnings limits are much higher and the penalty less during the year you attain full retirement age (FRA).

Something else to be aware of: if you know in advance you will exceed the annual limit it would be best to inform Social Security in order to avoid an Overpayment Notice next year. If you don't, Social

Security won't know about your 2023 earnings until you file your 2023 income taxes, so you'll get your 2023 monthly payments as usual. But when the IRS informs Social Security of your 2023 earnings later next year, Social Security will ask you to detail your monthly work earnings for 2023. If you have exceeded the limits, they will determine an overpayment amount and will ask you to either pay back what is owed in a lump sum or will withhold your benefits for enough months to recover what you owe for exceeding the 2023 earnings limit. Then, after you reach full retirement age (FRA), you'll get time credit for all months in which benefits were withheld, thus slightly increasing your monthly payment after your FRA.

Finally, it is when your income is earned that counts, not when it is paid. So, for example, if you worked in January 2023 and were paid for that work in February 2023, that is considered January income which wouldn't count toward the February earnings limit.

Award recipient Marilyn Lewis was recognized for her dedication to keeping her community safe. She serves as Neighborhood Watch Coordinator in her Old Foothill Farms neighborhood. She's helped coordinate the community watch efforts for more than 11 years. She also goes out of her way to make new neighbors feel welcome by sending them letters.

"Marilyn is reliable, trustworthy, honest, and extremely loyal to our neighborhood. Our safe community is a testament

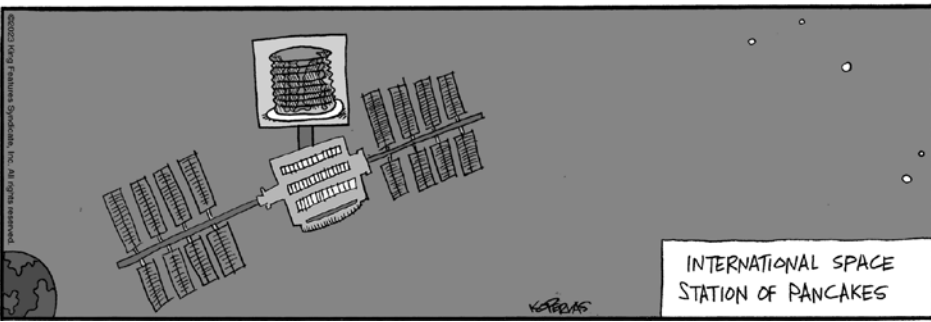

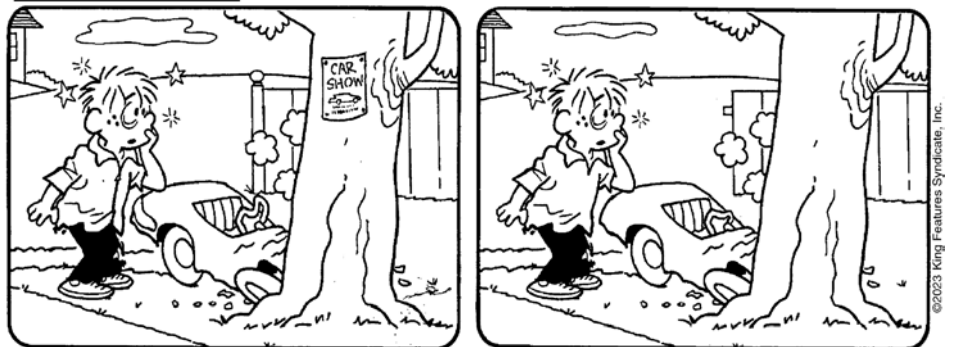

'Sanctuary State' Governor Upset Migrants Were Sent Here for Sanctuary

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California's sanctuary state Governor Gavin Newsom and Attorney General Rob Bonta were quick to blame Florida Governor Ron DeSantis for Friday's migrant flight into Sacramento, and then accused Florida of "state-sanctioned kidnaping" for transporting migrants from the Texas border to a Sacramento church.

However, when he was still Lieutenant Governor, Newsom proudly declared and reaffirmed California's sanctuary state status after the Trump Justice Department threatened to charge state or local officials who enforced sanctuary policies protecting illegal immigrants.

As California Lieutenant Governor, Newsom issued a warning to the Trump administration a Tweet. "Let me be clear, @realDonaldTrump: California is a sanctuary state. We believe in the power of diversity. We have defied and resisted the xenophobic, hateful policies of your administration at every turn. We will do it again."

And he posted a video on Facebook saying, "California will remain a sanctuary state, and your attempt to intimidate will not stop us."

So which is it Gov. Newsom - is California a Sanctuary State which welcomes illegal immigrants and releases them from custody? Or are you sending them back in disgust?

Is all of this bravado and bluster grandstanding for future Democrat voters? Newsom is clearly running for President, and Bonta has announced he wants to be the next California Governor.

As for the two flights into Sacramento, there still is uncertainty if Gov. Ron DeSantis is actually behind the flights. Thus far, all reports about the illegal immigrant planes appear to be speculation, and DeSantis is mum.

Governors DeSantis and Greg Abbott (Texas) have sent planes with illegal immigrants to sanctuary cities Chicago, New York, and Martha's Vineyard to share in the housing and care of the migrants they claim to want sanctuary for.

Democrat President Joe Biden has called this movement of mostly Latin American migrants "playing politics with people's lives" and said it is inhumane, especially in areas such as New York City, which have services brought to the brink already because of the migrant

influx, the Globe reported Monday.

However, officials from Texas and Florida, including DeSantis, have fired back that "every community in America should be sharing in the burdens."

The federal government has also sent secret flights full of illegal immigrants into Westchester, New York in the middle of the night,

stirring controversy of their own:

Leaked video shows migrants being transported on secret charter flights under the cover of night from southern border states to Westchester, New York.

"The government is betraying the American people," a federal contractor told a Westchester County police officer in

a conversation recorded on the officer's body camera on the tarmac of a Westchester airport on Aug. 13, 2021.

Westchester Police Sgt. Michael Hamborsky asked the contractor hired to transport migrants around the country why: "You know why. Because if this gets out, the government is betraying the American

people," the contractor said.

Gov. Newsom and Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg turned on the rhetoric claiming, 'Human trafficking is not only despicable; it's a felony. I urge authorities to investigate how 16 vulnerable people were lured from El Paso, to Sacramento.' "Is there anything more cruel than using scared human beings to score cheap political points?"


Both Steinberg and Newsom support open borders, and illegal immigration.

And it isn't human trafficking or kidnapping to take illegals from a non-sanctuary state to a sanctuary state that claims to welcome them.

Rich with irony, Gov. Newsom has been releasing dangerous felons from state prisons, most of whom reoffend or end up living on the streets, addicted to meth and/or heroin.

Perhaps the most ironic Tweet summed up their hypocrisy best: "Lol yes you are not worried about them coming across the desert and risking their lives but put them on a private jet and send them to your cities, now that's a travesty." ★
