CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Rocking on despite break-ins, thefts, intrusion by the homeless and a vehicle busting its front window, a Fair Oaks Boulevard enterprise recently earned the Carmichael Property and Improvement District's Bright Star award

School of Rock owner Jason Kline thanked more than 100 PBID members and the community for support that has been "overwhelming" since his business took over the old Serritella's building nearly two years ago.

"We've felt that Carmichael has been cheering us on," said Kline. "I realized we could succeed here the day a car crashed through the front of our building. A lady I didn't know came up to me and gave me \$20. I thought: wow, this is a pretty awesome community."

Three break-in robberies and theft of costly musical instruments marred the school's first two years. But Kline and staff have been determined to keep the music playing. "We're now home to countless musical families," he said. "We'll be rocking and moving on – enriching kids' lives through performance-based music."

Klein has also established School of Rock franchises in Elk Grove, Roseville and recently launched a new school in Orangevale. His Carmichael studio – located at Fair Oaks and Palm Drive corner – remains his fastest growing school.

The Bright Star award recognizes property improvements that enhance the commercial district. "School of Rock owners took a vacant, rundown property and fully transformed it," said PBID chair Nick Bloise. "Their remodeling included painting the exterior, replacing its roof, new lighting, sidewalk planters and interior improvements that are visible from the street.

"The property was at one time subject to frequent (law enforcement) calls. Now it's a true Bright Star in the Carmichael Community."

Added PBID Executive Rebekah Evans: "Jason and his wife love this community. Their commitment is ongoing. They demonstrate that property owners and businesses are Continued on page 3

- Kids Helping Kids Sacramento hosted its Ninth Annual Signature Gala, with a concert headlined by the Grammy award winning rock band, Switchfoot. The night also included an opening act by Brendan James and former Sac's Got Talent winner, Kendra Dantes. Along with the benefit concert, the gala included silent auction bidding and a raffle for Taylor Swift concert tickets and a diamond bracelet. Proceeds raised by this event will go directly towards families with children who are battling pediatric cancer.

Kids Helping Kids is an entirely student-run, nonprofit organization made up of juniors and seniors from Del Campo High School. They put on their Signature Gala, along with several other events, to raise money for the populations they serve. They support children battling pediatric cancer and their families by providing financial resources during their medical treatment. Kids Helping Kids aids families in paying for expenses which are directly caused by the massive cost of treatment for their child. Each year, they raise \$50,000 to help 100 families battling pediatric cancer and this year they hope to generate even more so they can reach even more children.

On April 29th, Kids Helping Kids raised \$150,673 through their Signature Gala. By using the online platform of GiveSmart, the organization raised a majority of their money from their silent auction.

Sacramento County Hires New Shelter Operator

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA

(MPG) - Sacramento County has hired a new non-profit shelter operator to take over operations of the Full Service Rehousing Shelter (FSRS) program. FSRS provides low-barrier sheltering and re-housing services for highly vulnerable adults experiencing unsheltered homelessness that may not be served successfully by traditional sheltering programs. FSRS provides 24-hour interim housing, meals, case management, transportation, and support services. Currently, this program is being operated by Sacramento Self-Help Housing, Inc. (SSHH) through a scattered-site model using approximately 23 single-family homes. Due to ongoing finan-

cial concerns with SSHH,

the County will not pur-

sue a contract renewal with

SSHH for the Scattered Site Shelter program after the contract's end on June 30, 2023.

The County has entered into an agreement with City Net, a non-profit homeless services organization that has a history of collaborative success in several communities in California. City Net is an organization that provides street outreach, case management, housing navigation, bridge housing, shelter operations, census coordination, and more through coordination with local service partners and community-based organizations. For this contract, City Net will manage the day-to-day operations and provide wrap-around case management and supportive services for program participants. Additionally, City Net will lease sites for use in this program and manage landlord relationships. City Net held a hiring event this past

Saturday to identify staffing for the expansion of work in Sacramento.

"City Net is pleased to have been selected as the new Sacramento County scattered site project lead," said Brad Fieldhouse, President, and Executive Director for City Net. "We recognize and share the commitment by all parties involved to continue this important work, and our team is looking forward to jumping in and giving it a fresh start."

Many of the current property owners and landlords who have been leasing scattered site housing to SSHH are owed several months of unpaid rent. In anticipation of closing its doors no later than June 30, SSHH has been in communication with landlords to ramp down leases formally used for sheltering and to share the opportunity for potential continuation with a newly selected

provider. These units are vital to the long-term success of the FSRS program, and County staff have been working directly with landlords to identify the amount of arrears owed, repairs in need and continuing relationships for future collaborative opportunities.

To expedite the start date for City Net to begin work, the County has executed a short-term contract to ensure that City Net has a three-month overlap with Sacramento Self Help Housing before fully taking over the program for a multi-year term beginning July 1, 2023.

"We appreciate the County's diligence in finding an operator that can help transition the clients without risk of them losing shelter," said Sacramento Self Help Housing Board Chair Ethan Evans. "Our number one priority is the safety and security of this vulnerable

Saving Power and Paying More Ranger Adopts Pup



Charging you more because you earn more? What's next, higher prices on food, water and the air

California utility companies are working on a controversial pricing structure that would bill households a different fixed charge depending on their income — but the idea is catching heat from Republicans who argue it will hurt low-income families.

As you may have already noticed on your own bill, monthly electric bills come with a few fixed fees that are added on top of the charges proportional to your usage rate. These charges go toward operating costs for the state's electric grid, including maintenance.

Earlier in April, three companies — Pacific Gas & Electric, Southern California Edison and San Diego Gas & Electric — submitted a proposal to the California Public Utilities Commission that includes an income-based pricing system for these fixed charges, as called for in a 2022 state law. According to KTLA 5, the monthly charge would vary between the companies, and range from: Households making less than \$69,000 a year: \$20 to \$34; Households making \$69,000 to \$180,000 a year: \$51 to \$73; Households making more than \$180,000 a year: \$85

The companies say the rate of kilowatt-hour usage will also lower for all customers, but low-income households will benefit the most. PG&E and Southern California Edison estimate its lowest-income customers would, on average, save as much as a 21% on their bill.

But Republican legislators are skeptical that a plan from "a government sanctioned monopoly" will save customers money. On Friday, the Senate Republican caucus fired off a letter to the utilities commission arguing that the pricing proposal would "unfairly burden" low-income residents:

Senate GOP leader Brian Jones of El Cajon and other Republican senators, in the letter: "The goal of trying to stabilize the grid and lower electricity rates is something we support; however, the tactic of implementing a structured fixed-charge system that diminishes individual responsibility and usage in favor of an 'identity' subsidization is not, in our opinion, an answer. More fees are not a solution to already ridiculously high utility

The rising cost of natural gas has caused utility bills to surge, frustrating Californians across all economic levels. But lower-income residents end up paying a disproportionate share of utility expenses.

In the meantime, the first round of comments for the proposal will be due by June 2 and the Public Utilities Commission will be expected to make a final decision on the pricing structure by July 2024.

While being placed into custody, Rangers learned that the individual had a Rottweiler mix puppy that he rescued from an abusive owner. The individual told Rangers Matsui and Brennan that he wanted them to adopt the puppy because he wanted to make sure the puppy would have a good and loving home.

"Having an individual I'm taking into custody ask me to adopt his dog was a first for me," said Ranger Brennan. "This puppy stole my heart right away and I knew that I could give him a good home, but I also knew that I couldn't just take him home."

The Rangers took the puppy to Bradshaw Animal Shelter where he received a thorough evaluation. Once he was checked out and cleared, he was fostered out to Ranger Brennan, who ultimately adopted him. This puppy, now named Roman, lives with Ranger Brennan and his family.

"Ranger Matsui and I are pretty good friends," said

population, and we trust the County and management companies and plans to pay City Net will provide them with what they need to succeed."

The intent of this agreement is to bridge the ramp-down of this program with SSHH in regard to program participants, and the ramp-up of City Net as the operator moving forward. During this transition period, no new clients will be enrolled in the program; services under this contract are intended to minimize displacement due to the ramp-down of SSHH and to provide smooth transitions for those clients that will be receiving services from City Net. The County has already started to pay unpaid lease balances, utilities and

damages to property owners and property future rents for the months of May and June 2023, if the landlord is interested in remaining in the program.

"The County has been working tirelessly to ensure none of our clients go unsheltered during this transition," said Director of Sacramento County Homeless Services and Housing Emily Halcon. "This program has had a lot of success in the past, and we know that once it gets running again at full capacity, we'll see positive outcomes for our unhoused population."

determined to revitalize our area."

Started in 2016 at the instigation of Carmichael Corridor businesses, the PBID is one of 22 similar agencies established throughout the County in recent years. These groups aim to improve day-to-day merchant operations in their districts. The Carmichael fiefdom extends through three miles of Fair Oaks Boulevard and surrounding streets.

During its first seven years, the

agency has focused on weighty community issues. Funded by self-imposed assessments from property owners, its \$549,000 budget enables seven-dayper-week mobile security. This service counters trespassing, vandalism and homeless camping. The organization also removes trash from the business corridor and advocates for community interests.



When California Laws Go Too Far, The Courts Intervene

Early explorers believed California to be an island, and while its physical attachment to the rest of North America eventually became evident, it nevertheless has sought to forge an island-like cultural and political identity – a "nation-state" in Gov. Gavin Newsom's description.

There are, however, limits. Legally, California is still just one of 50 states and thus is subject to federal law, including the U.S. Constitution.

California politicians sometimes ignore that basic fact of civic life in their zeal to lead the parade. But when they cross the legal line, as defined in federal law, they get their comeuppance.

For instance, the federal appeals court that oversees California recently overturned an ordinance passed by city leaders in Berkeley, one of the state's more adventuresome jurisdictions, to ban natural gas service in newly constructed buildings.

The 2020 ordinance, cheered by environmentalists as a gesture to reduce greenhouse gases, was challenged by the California Restaurant Association for violating federal authority to set energy efficiency standards.

A federal trial judge upheld the ordinance but the 9th District Court of Appeals declared that federal law did,

Berkeley could not strike it out on its own.

California's governors and legislators are also prone to enacting new laws that run afoul of the U.S. Constitution, federal law or, in some cases, the state's own constitution.

Chris Micheli, a lobbyist who is also a student of legislative procedure and teaches at the University of the Pacific's McGeorge School of Law, has assembled a lengthy list of legislative decrees that later fared poorly in the courts.

They include such recent laws as those mandating female and members of "unrepresented communities" on corporate boards and prohibiting doctors from making politically incorrect statements about COVID-19.

One entire class of California laws, those imposing sometimes unique restrictions on private gun ownership, has fallen prey to constitutional challenges in recent months, thanks to the U.S. Supreme Court's expansive interpretations of the constitutional right to bear arms.

While gun organizations have been challenging California's array of gun control laws for years, the Supreme Court's landmark Bruen decision last year, invalidating New York's almost total ban on the carrying of personal weapons, opened the door. One by one, California's laws are being invalidated.

Just last month, for Southern California overturned the state's law prohibiting the sale of working for California handguns that don't meet newspapers.

indeed, preempt the issue so stringent – and technically unworkable - safety requirements, declaring that it runs afoul of the Bruen decision.

> Even before the Bruen decision, a San Diego federal judge, Roger Benitez, had tossed out California's ban on magazines holding more than 10 rounds, the state's ban on assault rifles, and a law requiring background checks for ammunition purchases.

> Another law that fell recently was one dreamed up by Newsom and the Legislature as a symbolic stunt – authorizing lawsuits against some gun manufacturers with conditions that made defense almost impossible. It was patterned after a Texas law making it easier to sue those who performed abortions, and Attorney General Rob Bonta didn't even try to defend it when the inevitable lawsuit challenged it.

Undeterred by the serial invalidation of California gun laws, Newsom and legislators are working on another measure that, they say, would fit within the constraints of the Bruen decision. Senate Bill 2 would create new standards for the issuance of concealed weapons permits and list a number of new places where carrying weapons would be prohibited, even by those having

Dear Dave.

As a small-business owner, should I work with multiple banks to avoid what happened with Silicon Valley Bank?

-Matt

Dear Matt,

You should work with multiple banks, but that has nothing to do with Silicon Valley Bank. SVB shouldn't be a business model anyone follows. It was a crash of high-tech, start-up and venture-capital players. It was a "players" bank. In other words, it was a bunch of Silicon Valley posers misbehaving under the heading of a bank – and it all came crashing down on their heads. But it didn't have anything to do with the kinds of banks you or I do business with.

Believe it or not, a bank is just another vendor. They are helping you, and

they are a supplier to you – whether it's a checking account, debit card or anything else. Anytime you're doing business, especially when it comes to key areas of your company, it's always good to have more than one vendor in that category. That way, you're not stuck if they decide to raise their prices or their quality of service declines.

Don't get me wrong: I'm not talking about jumping from vendor to vendor every time the wind blows. We have vendors we've worked with for 20 years at Ramsey Solutions. But I'm also not going to let myself or my business become a prisoner of one provider. Currently, we have three banking relationships. We have a primary bank, and we've been with them for 35 years. We also have two other minor banking relationships. Do you see what I'm saying, Matt? If you've only got one supplier for one of the key elements of your business and they suddenly go sideways, so do you! We deal with smaller, regional and local banks at my

company too. That way, we get to talk with actual human beings who make reasonable decisions. The big banks? No, thank you. Small businesses, especially, are just numbers to them. You get no respect, no mercy and no real help.

Develop banking relationships with people in your own town and area. I'm talking about the kind of folks you could sit down with, have a cup of coffee, and engage in a real discussion about your needs and what's going on in your business. A bank is a key vendor relationship for a small business, but make sure you protect yourself and diversify. Never have just one!

Construction Company Owner Sentenced to Prison

FBI News Release

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - A construction company owner in California was sentenced to 78 months' imprisonment and ordered to pay \$984,699

in restitution for his role in a bid-rigging and bribery scheme involving California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) improvement and repair contracts.

According to a guilty plea

entered on Nov. 14, 2022, in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of California in Sacramento. Bill R. Miller engaged in a conspiracy from April 2015 through as late as December 2019. As part of the conspiracy, Miller recruited others to submit sham

bids on Caltrans contracts. including co-conspirator William D. Opp, a former business partner who pleaded guilty in the case on Oct. 3, 2022.

In addition to pleading guilty to bid rigging, Miller also pleaded guilty to paying bribes to Choon Foo "Keith" Yong, the former Caltrans contract manager who managed the contracts involved on behalf of Caltrans, a California state agency that receives significant federal funding. On April 11, 2022, Yong pleaded guilty for his role in the bid-rigging and bribery scheme. According to Yong's plea agreement, Yong received the bribes in the form of cash payments, wine, furniture and

remodeling services on his home. The total value of the bribes that Miller paid to Yong was nearly \$1 million. Miller is the first defendant to be sentenced in the case.

"This sentence sends a strong message that criminals who corrupt the competitive bidding process will face stern consequences," said Assistant Attorney General Jonathan Kanter of the Justice Division. "Protecting infrastructure spending and taxpayer dollars remains a top priority for the Antitrust Division and our Procurement Collusion

Strike Force partners." "A lengthy investigation and a series of guilty pleas has led to the sentencing today for a bid-rigging and bribery conspiracy," said U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert for the Eastern District of California. "But our work is not done. Anticompetitive practices harm taxpayers and legitimate businesses alike. My office will continue to investigate and prosecute such conduct."

"Fair and free competition is essential to ensure taxpayer money is only obligated and spent on essential services and contracts," said Special Agent in Charge Sean Ragan of the FBI Sacramento Field Office. "The FBI is committed to working with our partners to investigate such allegations, and bringing to justice those who conspire to enrich themselves

by cheating the American public as a whole. We hope this sentence serves as ample warning to anyone contemplating a scheme to falsely influence a government bidding process for personal gain."

Today's sentencing is the result of a joint investigation that was conducted by the Antitrust Division's San Francisco office, the U.S. Attorney's Office Department's Antitrust for the Eastern District of California, and the FBI's Sacramento Division as part of the Justice Department's Procurement Collusion Strike Force (PCSF). Trial Attorneys Christopher J. Carlberg and Tai S. Milder and Assistant U.S. Attorney Lee S. Bickley prosecuted

SacRT Awarded \$45 Million by FTA for New Light Rail Vehicles

SacRT News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) was awarded on May 5, 2023, a \$45.1 million grant from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to support the purchase of 16 new light rail vehicles.

The grant through the FY22/23 Rail Vehicle Replacement Program, a new program created by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, will help SacRT towards the purchase of 16 new low-floor light rail vehicles from Siemens Mobility in south Sacramento. SacRT is one of six transit agencies nationwide and the only in FTA Region 9 to receive this grant. SacRT previously purchased 28 new low-floor light rail trains from Siemens Mobility and has a contract to order up to 76. Those vehicles are currently undergoing a testing process before they can be put into service early next year. With the order of an additional 16 new low-floor trains, SacRT will have 44 new lowfloor vehicles, which is close to two-thirds of all the vehicles needed to operate on our light rail system.

SacRT has secured more than \$350 million for our Light Rail Modernization Project, which includes the purchase of new low-floor trains, modifications to station platforms and adding a passing track to provide 15-minute service to Folsom area stations.

"The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law is delivering federal dollars across the nation and here in Sacramento our innovators at SacRT are ready to capitalize on its benefits for the community," said Congresswoman Doris Matsui (CA-07). "I was proud to fight for this infusion of federal funds that will replace 35-year-old light rail vehi-

cles with new modern trains

built right here in Sacramento by Siemens Mobility. This \$45 million grant is helping us build Sacramento's future and will enable us to continue leading the way on sustainable, clean, and equitable public transportation.'

"Sacramento Regional Transit is crucial for mobility in the Sacramento region, but the current light rail cars have reached the end of their useful life, said Congressman Ami Bera (CA-06). "I am proud to have helped secure funding through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law for a new fleet of low-floor cars that will enhance the rider experience and make light rail accessible to all, including those with mobility restrictions, parents with strollers, and cyclists."

"As we celebrate SacRT's 50 years of service to the regionwe can also look to the future," Senator Alex Padilla said. "I have been proud to support and see SacRT's efforts over the finish line to secure federal funding for new, modern light rail cars. Today's grant announcement is a major investment in regional mobility, making light rail cleaner, safer, and more accessible for everyone."

"I want to thank Senator Padilla and Representatives Matsui and Bera for championing the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law that created this new grant program, said SacRT Board Chair and Sacramento County Supervisor Patrick Kennedy. "This significant funding award will help accelerate SacRT's light rail modernization program and puts us one step closer to replacing our aging light rail fleet with entirely new and modern, low-floor vehicles that will improve accessibility for all riders. These new vehicles are being built by Siemens,

right here in Sacramento, so this is also a significant boost to the economic prosperity of the region."

"We are very grateful to the Federal Transit Administration, FTA Administrator Nuria Fernandez and FTA Region 9 Administrator Ray Tellis for their extraordinary leadership for recognizing how important it is to replace our aging fleet of light rail vehicles," said SacRT General Manager/CEO Henry Li. "We also owe our gratitude to Senator Alex Padilla, Representative Doris Matsui and Representative Ami Bera for supporting this grant opportunity and SacRT in general. We are a stronger community because of the work they do on our behalf, and we will be even better when these new, modern low-floor light rail trains are in service early next year."

This new FTA funding along with other grant funding from the Sacramento Area of Governments (SACOG) and the state is being used for the new purchase of 16 low-floor light rail trains.

At the end of April, the state of California awarded SacRT \$8.5 million in grant funding through the Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP) to help support improved train technology, including realtime train arrival, passenger announcement system and more. Furthermore, this week the SACOG Transportation Committee approved their 2023 Regional Funding recommendations which include nearly \$6.5 million for SacRT's Light Rail vehicles replacements and \$5 million for station conversions to accommodate the new vehicles. New low-floor light rail trains are expected to be in service on the Gold line by summer 2024. Learn more at sacrt.com/modernization.
