CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Bill Malkasian had 101 reasons to kick up his heels last week.

His century-plus-one celebration included a family reunion at Del Paso Country Club and a special birthday luncheon at his Oakmont of Carmichael home. Icing on the cake was a visit from the US Marines, whose officers presented a commendation for his military service.

"I had no idea they were coming," enthused Malkasian. "In my day, I had little to do with top ranking officers. These guys were top brass. I was just a sergeant. I felt great

when they saluted me."

The son of Armenian

refugees, bilingual Malkasian grew up in Boston, MA. His high school years were distinguished with good academic grades and sporting excellence.

WWII loomed as he started college and the teenager enlisted with the US Marines. He served as a drill sergeant and combat trainer but – ever a jock – Private Malkasian was in greater demand for playing baseball and football in Marine Corp and Navy teams.

His had a minor role in history when, in 1945, his platoon met President Franklin Roosevelt's coffin at Washington DC railway station. He and brother Marines escorted the casket to lie in state

Failed Silicon Valley Bank, the Newsoms, and Connected Friends

The Silicon Valley Bank failure and shutdown is because of "idiot bank management under an incompetent board," according to Shark Tank star Kevin O'Leary.

"O'Leary joined Fox News hosts Bill Hemmer and Dana Perino on Tuesday to discuss the Silicon Valley Bank failure and the announcement that deposits would be protected," Mediaite reported. "President Joe Biden announced this week that people's 'deposits are safe."

"O'Leary blasted the plan, arguing it will simply provide a safety net for mismanagement. The Shark Tank star argued Silicon Valley Bank collapsed because of 'idiot management,' as opposed to a regulatory issue. 'Idiot' managers, he said, are now free to behave more irresponsibly."

Resources Available for Parents

Sacramento County Special Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Whether you are becoming a parent for the first time or you are welcoming another child into your family this year, there are several resources that can help you in Sacramento County. If you are pregnant and live in Sacramento County, Maternal Child Adolescent Health (MCAH) has a program for you. MCAH has information and education on how to have the best pregnancy outcome possible, information on child health and development, and can assist parents in obtaining an OB provider or pediatrician.

The goals of MCAH programs are to make sure babies are born healthy and that their mothers are healthy too. The programs aim to provide a safe environment for children and parents of all backgrounds. Those with MCAH also work to make sure all women, children, and their families have equal access to appropriate care.

Because each family is unique, the County has several resources in place to help serve parents and children. Some of the programs available in the County include African American Perinatal Health, Black Infant Health, Nurse-Family Partnership, and Women, Infants, & Children (WIC). Anyone who is pregnant and lives in Sacramento County and is income eligible can enroll in these programs. If you are not sure which resource is best for you, do not worry. The County has workers who will match you to the program or programs you are eligible for.

The process is streamlined to make it easy for parents to reach out. To get help, call (916) 875-BABY. You will need to state that you are pregnant and in need of assistance. That one call is all you need to make. The County will then match you to resources. You can also complete a referral form and email it to DHSMCAH@saccounty.net. Click here for the referral form.

Many who have benefited from MCAH programs say the services have made a positive impact on their lives. A mother who is currently in the Black Infant Health program said having the extra support had a big impact on her.

"Knowing this program existed was amazing and the fact that it focused on Black moms was even better. It was great having support whenever I needed it and being in such a comfortable, safe space," the mother

Other MCAH programs have also had successful outcomes. 96% of Nurse-Family Partnership clients who chose to breastfeed were able to successfully do so at birth, which is higher than the national rate. The premature birth rate for Nurse-Family Partnership clients is 6.4%, which is lower that the state and national average. The programs also help mothers focus on their mental health. 100% of African American Perinatal Health clients who screened positive for Perinatal or postpartum mood and anxiety disorders were referred to mental health services.

at the White House. "I was one of the Marines who stood guard over him at the Rotunda," recalls Malkasian. "It was one of the great honors of my life. He was a great man."

Post war, he signed a baseball contract with the Chicago White Sox and played catcher and outfielder in minor league games. He was not disappointed when this career was cut short by injury; Malkasian happily resumed the education interrupted by war. His Bachelor's in education came from the University of Western Illinois; his Master's was from Boston University. Armed for a teaching career, he headed to Sacramento in 1950. Teaching history for Grant School District was inevitably spelled by football and baseball coaching.

He and his first wife, concert pianist Leanore, raised a daughter and two sons.

In the 1960s, the teacher became Principal at Del Paso Junior High. His final job was Principal of Grant High school, from which he retired in 1983. He remarried after Leanore's death in 1995; he and second wife Marilyn have lived at Oakmont for three years.

Thoughts on turning 101: "It's not much different from being 91," Bill Malkasian considers. "I love people. I love my wife and my kids and grandkids. My birthday was great. I was surprised and happy when the Marines showed up. They're my guys and we always stick together. I still have my uniform somewhere. It wouldn't fit now, but as they say, once a Marine, always a Marine."

innovation ecosystem that has served as a tent pole for our economy."

The Intercept just reported Tuesday Gov. Gavin Newsom failed to mention that President Biden's announcement also protected his own businesses in Silicon Valley Bank."CADE, Odette, and PlumpJack, three wineries owned by Newsom, are listed as clients of SVB on the bank's website. Newsom also maintained personal accounts at SVB for years, according to a longtime former employee of Newsom's who handled his finances, and who requested anonymity to avoid professional reprisal."

Newsom also neglected to say that he

and the First Partner have even deeper ties with Silicon Valley Bank – Silicon Valley Bank President of Capital John China gave \$100,000 "Behested" gift to the Newsom's nonprofit, California Partners Project, Open the Books discovered, the Globe reported.

Notably, a 2019 IRS Form 990 for Newsom's California Partner Project reports only \$50k in total gross receipts. This seems inaccurate given the new information of Newsom's behested payments. The Globe did not find any record of 2020-2021 IRS Form 990 filings on the IRS website, but did find IRS Form 990 filings with the California Office of the Attorney General Charities registry.

Is Silicon Valley Bank's Failure **An Omen For California?**

It would be difficult to overstate Silicon Valley's financial importance to California.

The San Jose-centered high technology industry exploded four decades ago as California's manufacturing sector, which had boomed during and after World War II, was shrinking.

It became the state's single most powerful economic engine, creating products and services that transformed California and had immense global impact. A few days ago, Gov. Gavin Newsom described it the "tent pole for our economy" and for once he wasn't exaggerating.

As other economic sectors and other regions stagnated, Silicon Valley boomed. Without it, California could not have become the fifth and very possibly the fourth most powerful economy in the world.

Silicon Valley's mega-corporations, such as Apple, Google and Twitter, sucked in immense amounts of money from every corner of the globe - not only making investors very rich, but creating countless jobs and pumping hundreds of billions of dollars into the state treasury as high income tax rates tapped into the new wealth.

Valley has reached its peak.

In recent months, Silicon Valley's corporations have been laying off workers and venture capital activity has slowed. A few weeks ago, a local industry organization, Joint Venture Silicon Valley, issued its annual report on the region's economy, stressing a transition from a cauldron of start-up companies to dominance by a few giants.

"Tech is going through a painful period," Russell Hancock, president of the organization said, adding hopefully that "there is no way to construe what is happening as a crisis" for the tech sector.

That was happening before Silicon Valley Bank, which was founded in 1983 as the region began to boom and rode the wave into becoming one of the nation's largest financial houses, suddenly collapsed last week.

The bank experienced a run from depositors and could not raise enough cash to meet demand. State and federal financial regulators quickly stepped in, shuttered the bank and began seeking a buyer. Its failure sent shockwaves through Silicon Valley because of the bank's prominent role in financing start-up companies and providing cash for payrolls and other expenses.

Relatively small depositors were covered by insurance, but hundreds of corporate customers had deposits over the \$250,000 insurance limit and suddenly were unable to make withdrawals.

The immediate crisis was newspapers.

However, there's reason averted on Sunday when to wonder whether Silicon federal authorities arranged for Federal Reserve loans that would allow depositors to make full withdrawals.

They also made money available to shore up other specialty banks that might be vulnerable to depositor Despite the emergency

action, however, Silicon Valley Bank's failure is a serious blow to the tech industry because of its pivotal role in financing innovation as a direct lender, as a financial service provider and as a midwife for attracting venture capital.

Federal authorities are looking for a buyer to absorb Silicon Valley Bank, quite possibly one of the nation's larger banks. Even if a buyer emerges, however, the new owner would not have an intimate relationship to the region's yeasty culture of aggressive innovation.

The bank's owners prospered by deeply immersing themselves into that culture but that narrow focus made it vulnerable to outside economic factors. When the Federal Reserve System began raising interest rates to battle inflation, the bank's portfolio of bonds lost value. When the bank was forced to sell those devalued bonds to meet withdrawal demands from depositors, it went into a death spiral.

The question is whether the bank's failure is a harbinger of Silicon Valley's decline.

Social Security Matters

How Do I Withdraw My Application for Social Security?

Dear Rusty: I will be 67 next month and reached my full retirement age in July 2022. My wife and I are discussing whether we should take Social Security now or wait until we are age 70 to get a higher benefit. I remember reading that you can start Social Security and, if not needed, pay it back within a year and then "reset" to get a higher benefit by waiting longer. Please describe the steps of this process to take now and repay the year's benefits if we do not need them. Signed: Uncertain

Dear Uncertain: Well, to exercise the so-called "do over option" (which is essentially withdrawing your application for benefits), you need to contact Social Security (1.800.772.1213 or your local SS field office) and request that your application for benefits be withdrawn. You can also download and complete form SSA-521 and deliver the same to your local Social Security office. You can get that form at this link: www.

ssa.gov/forms/ssa-521.

This "do-over option" is only available within 12 months of the date you submit your application and can only be done once in your lifetime. If you use it, you will be required to repay Social Security for all payments made on your behalf, including not only your monthly payments but also any income taxes you had withheld, and any Medicare premiums which were withheld from your monthly payments (Social Security will inform you how much you must repay). Once the repayment is made, it will be as though you never applied for benefits, meaning your benefit amount will be higher when you later re-apply (which would also be the case if you simply didn't apply your benefit entitlement continues to grow until you claim, up to age 70 when your maximum SS benefit is attained). This process would be the same for both you and

your wife. However, I suggest you consider whether you really need to withdraw your application. Be aware that since you've already reached your full retirement age (FRA) you can claim now and, if you later decide you don't need the monthly SS money, you can simply temporarily suspend your benefit payments to avoid repaying Social Security everything they've already paid to you and on your behalf (you don't need to formally withdraw your application). By simply suspending (and not withdrawing), your benefit amount will start growing again with each month your benefits are suspended (about .67% more for each month you do not get benefits) and you can keep everything you've already received to the point you suspend your payments. To suspend your payments just call Social Security at the number provided above and tell them you wish to suspend your benefits and grow your payment amount. While you can only use the withdrawal process once in your lifetime, you can temporarily suspend your benefit payments multiple times if necessary.

Mother Seeks Justice For Son



On June 20, 2022, my son, Robert Jenson, was left for dead at the corner of Fair Oaks Blvd. & El Camino Ave. after being struck by a hit-and-run driver around 9:10 p.m.

Numerous fliers were placed around the area, as well as monuments on poles and on a fence where he was killed, but someone kept taking them down. So, I decided to put a billboard up for all to see, hoping to find my only child's killer.



I'm sorry you're going through this, but I hope it will teach you and your folks a valuable lesson going forward. There's nothing wrong with giving money in a situation like this, as long as you're not enabling bad behavior by doing so. But a loan between friends or family is something I never recommend.

If they choose to hold a grudge there's really not a lot you can do, especially if you took longer than agreed upon to pay them back. It just takes more time with some people—and in some cases even parents-for those kinds of things to heal. You have to remember, in their minds there's an element of responsibility and trust involved here. But considering it's your mom and dad we're talking about, I'd say they'll lighten up and

become a little easier to be

around with time.

Until that happens, though, maybe you could look for chances to mention your new approach to finances during conversations with them. Even something as simple as an off-hand remark about how much you were able to put into savings from your recent paychecks may encourage them to see things in a different light. Letting them know you're actively working to change your ways and gain control of your finances could mean a lot to them. Give it a try!





FBI, Sacramento PD Investigate Theft of Aircraft at Sac Airport



SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Sacramento Field Office and Sacramento Police department are investigating the theft of an aircraft at Sacramento Executive Airport that caused damage to multiple aircraft at Sacramento Executive Airport on March 16, 2023. The FBI Evidence Response Team from the Sacramento Field Office are currently on scene collecting evidence.





Minnesota Nuclear Power Plant Leaked 400,000 **Gallons of Radioactive Water in November** and Only Now Reveals it to the Public

17 March 2023 | Americans are in an uproar after learning Thursday about radioactive water leak at a Minnesota nuclear power plant that happened in November 2022. At least 400,000 gallons of radioactive water spilled from Xcel Energy's Monticello facility on November 22, which came from a pipe between two buildings. The public is outraged by the silence on the matter, as it occurred months before the devastating East Palestine train derailment that released 1.6 million pounds of hazardous chemicals in Ohio. Regulators said Thursday they are monitoring clean up and there is no danger to the public. [Yeah, right!] The water contained tritium, which is a rare and radioactive isotope of hydrogen with half-life about 12 years.

CDC Bought Phone Data to Monitor Americans' Compliance With Lockdowns, Contracts Show

16 March 2023 | The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) purchased data from tracking companies to monitor compliance with lockdowns, according to contracts with the firms. The CDC paid one firm 420,000 and another 208,000. That bought access to location data from at least 55 million cellphone users. The contracts, approved under emergency review due to the COVID-19 pandemic, were aimed at providing the CDC "with the necessary data to continue critical emergency response functions related to evaluating the impact of visits to key points of interest, stay at home orders, closures, re-openings and other public heath communications related to mask mandate, and other merging research areas on community transmission of SARS-CoV-2," the contracts, obtained by The Epoch Times, state.

He Has the Proof: DC Gulag Political Prisoner and **Decorated Army Special Forces Soldier Jeffrey McKellop Reveals Extent of Government Agents** at J6 Capitol Protest - It Was a Complete Set-Up

EPA Orders States to Accept Waste from Ohio Train Derailment Site

17 March 2023 | The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency ordered states with approved and available toxic waste facilities to accept materials transported from the train derailment in East Palestine, Ohio. The move, announced by EPA director Michael Regan at a news conference Friday morning, comes after governors in Oklahoma, Michigan and other states have recently turned away shipments. The EPA also ordered Norfolk Southern to move faster to get the toxic waste out of the area. The two new EPA orders requires Norfolk Southern to speed up the removal process and requires contractors to take legal action against EPA-licensed disposal facilities that refuse to honor their contracts. Every state has been notified that states cannot stop shipments of out-of-state waste from East Palestine, Regan said.

FDA Approves COVID Boosters for 6-Month-Olds, Citing **Trial with just 24 Patients**

17 March 2023 | The U.S. Food & Drug Administration (FDA) is approving booster doses of Pfizer's COVID-19 shot for children as young as six months based on a trial of just 24 patients. The FDA announced March 14 that it is amending its emergency use authorization (EUA) for the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine. Bivalent, to allow a single booster dose for children between six months and four years, at least two months after being initially vaccinated... Buried in the press release, however, was the revelation that "among individuals 6 months of age and older, safety was assessed in participants in two clinical studies," and that for the 6-23 months age group there were only 24 participants. The 2-4 year age group had 36. Medical freedom attorney and COVID vaccine critic Aaron Siri called it a "new low" for the FDA to make its decision based on such limited data.

DOD Spends Nearly \$50 million a Year 'To Do Nothing' with Trump's Border Wall Materials, Drawing GOP Backlash

16 March 2023 | The Biden administration spends about 130,000 per day to store and maintain unused border wall panels at the southern border, and Senate Republicans are demanding answers. Republican members of the Senate Armed Forces Committee -- using details provided to them in a request for information to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) -- sent a letter Wednesday evening to the Defense Department asking why nearly 50 million is being spent each year to store the Trump-era border materials. Led by ranking member Sen. Roger Wicker, R-Miss., and signed by Texas Sens. Ted Cruz and John Cornyn, along with nearly every other Republican on the committee, the senators wrote that they "are disturbed to learn the Department of Defense is paying private landowners to store border wall materials procured under the Trump Administration instead of fortifying the southern border with those materials."

Federal Reserve to Raise Interest Rates 25 Basis Points Amid Banking Crisis

17 March 2023 | The Federal Reserve is expected to raise interest rates another 25 basis points - or 0.25% next week amid the banking crisis. Two U.S. banks failed in the last week after they were unable to produce enough cash for depositors. Silicon Valley Bank and Signature Bank collapsed within the last week. Moody's cut the outlook for the entire U.S. banking sector after the banks failed. The banking crisis stems from the Federal Reserve's decision to hike interest rates seven times in 2022.

Stanford Law School Descends into Orwellian Nightmare as Woke Students Dressed in Black Masks Line Halls **Demanding Their 'Counter Speech' be Protected After** Dean Apologized to Conservative Judge for being Heckled

On Monday, the dean found her classroom whiteboard covered in fliers saying 'Where was his apology?' and she was herself confronted by masked students 14 March 2023 | Stanford Law School's dean had her classroom whiteboard pasted over with protest posters and found herself confronted by silent masked students on Monday, after she apologized to a conservative judge who was invited to speak at the university, and then heckled into silence. Jenny Martinez, the dean, apologized to Judge Kyle Duncan for the March 9 incident on campus. Duncan, appointed by Donald Trump, demanded an apology after he was invited to speak, only to be berated by a pious dean while students shouted abuse at him. On Monday, students made their displeasure at her apology clear, papering over her whiteboard with printed signs that read: "We have free speech rights too," "Where is our apology?" and "Counter-speech is free speech." At the end of the class, Martinez left the room to be confronted with a corridor lined with law students wearing black masks that read: "Counter-speech is free speech."

So, on my POPPOFF Radio Show, I asked Kathy to give us some tips on how to get started out of curiosity, or perhaps write a family book on your own heritage for publication or just sharing with your family.


- 1. Decide which person or family line you want to check out. Determine what you want to know about them. For example: Who was my great-grandfather? What did he do for a living? Did he fight in WW I? Was he an ironworker like me? Where in Italy was my great-grandmother born
- 2. Using a free digital resource like FamilySearch.org or a for-fee genealogy company, build a family tree and Include birth, death, and marriage dates and places for yourself, your spouse/partner, children, parents, grandparents etc.
- **3.** Do a google search to find more information about the selected person of family line, such as probate records, land records, and newspaper articles. Chronicling-America is a free source

for historical information.

- 4. Organize the research documents you gathered in binders or computer folders by person.
- **5. Interview your relatives** for family stories and more facts.
- 6. DNA test several relatives in the selected family line. You'll receive thousands of names of people who share common ancestors with your family. In addition, DNA testing will estimate where in the world your ancestors came from Kathy's "Family Harambee" How to discuss challenging Discoveries in your family tree and her "Finding Otho" books present critical information about this DNA topic.
- 7. Create a document on your computer for the manuscript if that's what your goal is. Format the pages to look like an outline of the book, e.g. title pages, table of contents, Chapter One etc.
- 8. Write your story or get someone to help you put it all together. If you want to publish it, you can always get a ghost writer to help you.
- **9.** If you go the book route, get an editor and book cover creator. Your former high school English teacher is not necessarily a professional editor.
- 10. Print your manuscript, but remember you can self-publish it as a book or for a family keepsake for members of your immediate family.


