Hunger Spike Coming

Impending loss of pandemic CalFresh support

Food banks across California are bracing for a feared spike in hunger amid inflated prices after a pandemic-era boost in food aid ends in April.

March is the last month CalFresh recipients will get the additional benefits, as the federal government cuts off the "emergency allotments" that have kept food stamp allowances higher than usual for nearly three years now. could drop from \$281 a month in food aid to as low as \$23 in April.

U.S. Department of Agriculture documents show that since November, the pandemic boosts have amounted to more than \$500 million a month in additional food stamps coming into low-income Californians' budgets.

"There's no way to overstate how

based on the nationwide cost of living as well as recipients' household size and income.

In March 2020, Congress allowed the USDA to give states funding to boost all recipients' aid to the maximum allowable benefits for their household size, or add \$95 on top for those already receiving the maximum. The recent Congressional spending bill passed in December cuts that off this spring in exchange for funding for extra food aid for school children during the summer months. More than 2.9 million California households receive food assistance through CalFresh, a number that has risen steadily throughout *Continued on page 5*

County Seeks Proposals to Support Local Organizations

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County is soliciting proposals from lead organizations to help strengthen and build capacity of local non-profit community-based organizations (CBOs) that are focused on providing services to a variety of underserved populations, including: Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) who experience disproportionately negative health and social outcomes, unhoused individuals and families, individuals with behavioral health needs, individuals with involvement in the child welfare or criminal justice system, refugees/immigrants, and other marginalized communities which were disproportionately

impacted by the pandemic. Throughout the County, CBOs improve the quality of life in communities by providing educational, health, and social services to citizens in need of support, beyond the services generally provided by local governments. Through their unique connectivity to the communities they serve, CBOs can impact hard-to-reach and traditionally underserved populations in a culturally responsive and equitable manner. The County recognizes the value of partnering with CBOs to support local citizens and foster an environment in which the community can thrive and recover from the health, economic, and other negative impacts suffered as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. The primary focus of this funding is to help CBOs develop core infrastructure to: 1. Effectively expand services and deepen their impact for underserved communities; 2. Build and strengthen the capacity for CBOs to more easily access and better manage government funds and contracts; 3. Support the integration and elevation of BIPOCcentered and serving CBOs; 4. Evaluate services and programs and improve equitable access and outcomes to underserved populations; and 5. Enhance the cultural responsiveness of service provision to traditionally underserved populations. In 2020, the County declared racism as a public health crisis and since that time has begun to strategically invest in a focus on diversity, equity and inclusion. 

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (**MPG**) - Spice levels aside, a Carmichael-based musician has turned a Thai restaurant into one of the hottest jazz spot in Sacramento.

Mentor to scores of Sacramento students, Doctor Joe Gilman will mark one-year of culinary experience next month with a weekend of live performances at his Thai food eaterie.

Hundreds of fans already applaud top singers and instrumentalists at the unexpected Folsom Boulevard venue. Gilman also hosts poetry readings and gives young talent a bash with regular 'emerging artist' sessions at Twin Lotus Thai.

Variety is the spice. "We just had a quartet do the music of (saxophonist) John Coltrane," reports Gilman. "Their two shows completely sold out. Considering most people's taste, you'd hardly think it

could happen at a Folsom Boulevard Thai Restaurant. But it did."

Voluntary donations for artists in lieu of cover charges is a crowd draw. And if Thai cuisine was new to fans, regulars now down curries like those born in Bangkok. "They've come to enjoy new flavors," approves the owner. "Some are even ramping up their spice levels."

The restaurant's East-Meets-West fusion hatched from Gilman's marriage to Surinipha (Kai) Manosan. The couple met and married in Thailand and their children are now part of Twin Lotus Thai's 10-strong staff.

Board Affirms Development Process Improvements

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The County's development process is one step closer to undergoing comprehensive systematic and customer service improvements, as the Board of Supervisors voted unanimously on Tuesday, February 7, to support the direction and goals of the process.

The plan includes improving the timeliness of review, ensuring a predictable and consistent process, and a concerted focus on providing outstanding customer service.

"Simply put, we want Sacramento County to be the best place to build in the region for all of our customers," said Dave Defanti, Deputy County Executive. Community Services. "We're grateful for the Board's feedback about the Development Review Process improvements and for its support in implementing changes that will make the process more efficient and easier to navigate.

"These changes will help us to meet our goals of attracting, planning and fostering housing production and other beneficial uses in existing and new communities, and serving our customers even better than before."

Goals include an increase in affordable housing units, helping achieve state and local goals and regulations to address climate change and air quality, providing for unparalleled environmental protection and encouraging public participation.

Defanti provided the Board with an update on improvements recently implemented/positive outcomes:

Focus on building a collaborative, positive culture and supporting staff; Sacramento County earning the state's Pro-Housing Designation, a recognition of its commitment to policies that increase housing supply; The formation of an Industry Working Group with representatives from the building industry that will vet new process improvements moving forward; Addition of two Development Process Managers, who will facilitate key projects through the County's processes; Training and review of the Accela Government Software system - the system of record for the development process - to review what's working and what can be improved; Providing customers with easyto-follow manuals for how to do business with the County, including when and how to seek permits for construction activity.

Additional improvements in the coming months will lead to processes that:

Are timely, efficient, and carried out in a manner that recognizes "time is money" for our customers; Reduce complexity and eliminate superfluous requirements; Are consistent with industry best practices and comparable agencies' processes viewed by customers as exemplary; Include customers in problem-solving and decision-making; Ensure the level of detail requested is appropriate for any stage of development; Offer clear timelines and transparency for customers regarding the status of their permit or application; Provide routine opportunities to solicit and receive customer feedback; Empower staff to be innovative and creative to help solve problems and facilitate desirable development.

"Sacramento County is facing an unprecedented housing supply and affordability crisis, and we believe these improvements will positively affect new housing production to address these crises," said Defanti. "This is an exciting time for the County, and we look forward to updating County residents and the Board about our progress to affect real change."

Continued from page 1 Sacramento. Career crescendos include winning the Great American Jazz Piano Competition and the Dave Brubeck Award. He has toured the world as a Kennedy Center soloist.

In 1997, Gilman founded the non-profit Capital Jazz Project in Sacramento. "I've always had an entrepreneurial streak," he says. "My wife and I often talked about starting a family business."

Kai is an experienced retailer whose Phuket boutique was wiped out by the 2004 tsunami before she wed Gilman. The mom of two is passionate about her native cuisine. "I'm happy when I see people eating what I've cooked for them," she says. "I love to share my country's food."

The couple last year took over an established Thai food destination near Rancho Cordova. Adding jazz to the menu was inevitable; Gilman knew every gigging musician in Sacramento – and most of their supporters. "As an artist, I know music adds enjoyment to eating," he says. "As an entrepreneur,

I'll explore any element that makes our business special.

"At first, weekend business was light, I invited a vocalist to share tunes with me on a Saturday night. I was elated when 80 people turned up to hear us." Gilman's weekend music program soon kicked into high gear, with top jazzers eagerly in line to perform.

Recent shows include husband and wife team Steve and Ann Roach, a French-style café band and a Brazilian combo. Carmichael's Todd Morgan was a February hit. "He's among the most impressive, multi-talented individuals I've encountered," notes Gilman. "Todd's equally impressive as a pianist, a guitarist, a singer and a songwriter. He can play anything from rock to jazz.

"We're morphing gradually away from all-jazz. As long as music's good and people want to hear it, I won't stand in anyone's way."

Sold out shows are a near twice-weekly event at Twin Lotus. The pragmatic

me connect with customers and staff," says Gilman. "There's no task I won't do. I'd wash dishes if the staff would let me. My mind is operating in new ways, and I'm loving it. I listen to suggestions. In the past year, I've learned how important the happiness of customers is to running a business."

For Twin Lotus's oneyear anniversary, more than 20 top Sacramento singers and instrumentalists will perform. Four sets will span the evenings of Saturday, March 4 and Sunday, March 5. In gratitude for entrepreneurism that helped musicians through thin post-COVID times, artists will donate anniversary performances. "The music community is grateful for what Joe has done," explains a singer. "He's added new opportunities for us. If his enterprise prospers, musicians have a chance to prosper, too."

The food industry is hard work with thin profit margins. While music satisfies Gilman's artistic side, it also keeps accounts in the black. "Our first year has been a wonderful and surprising time," he says. "Having diners and musicians supporting our small business is exciting for our entire Twin Lotus family."

Financial Resilience During a Disaster

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -Sacramento County faces regional hazards throughout the year including severe weather, floods and fires. If a disaster or other emergency strikes, you may only have seconds or minutes to react. In those critical moments, your focus will be on your family's safety.

Once the immediate danger has passed, having an Emergency Financial First Aid Kit (EFFAK) ready can provide you with peace of mind and will help you recover faster.

Remember these four steps to help you organize critical financial, medical and household information before a disaster or emergency strikes.

Assess & Compile: Gather your important financial documents and contacts; Review: Review your insurance policies and financial paperwork to be sure that they are still accurate and current; Safeguard: Store paper and electronic copies of all files in safe locations; Update: Revisit and update your Emergency Financial First Aid Kit regularly. Updates are especially important when significant changes in your life occur.

Items in this kit should be kept in a secure location and can include original paper and electronic copies of your:

Homeowners, renters, auto, flood, and health insurance policies; Bank account information, and other financial records; Rental lease agreement; Will or living will.

Chris and Laura have dedicated themselves to raising awareness of the dangers of fentanyl in the hopes of saving the lives of students like Zach. ★

COVID-19 Effects on California Hunger Spike Coming Will Linger for Years "nowhere near approach-

Gov. Gavin Newsom says California's COVID-19 state of emergency will end on Feb. 28, just four days shy of three years since he issued the first of countless orders he said were necessary to cope with the pandemic.

"Throughout the pandemic, we've been guided by the science and data - moving quickly and strategically to save lives," Newsom said in October announcing the February end date. "The state of emergency was an effective and necessary tool that we utilized to protect our state, and we wouldn't have gotten to this point without it."

The efficacy of Newsom's pandemic orders will be debated for years, particularly the shutdowns of schools and businesses and the billions of dollars in no-bid contracts his administration issued.

What cannot be debated, however, is that their impacts on millions of Californians will linger for years, decades or perhaps even generations.

Nearly 3 million Californians lost their jobs due to the shutdown orders. While the state has, on paper, recovered all of the jobs it lost, countless small businesses that shut their doors have not reopened.

An analysis by The Associated Press, Stanford University's Big Local News project and Stanford education professor Thomas Dee determined that 234,000 students in 21 states vanished from public school enrollment rolls during the pandemic. More than half of them were in California.

and other businesses depen- most of the decline could be explained by enrollments in private schools, movements to other states or shifts to at-home instruction. Of the remaining 234,000 absences for which there was no explanation, researchers said, 152,000 were in California.

> The Public Policy Institute of California crunched the numbers and discovered that not only did COVID-19 kill about 100,000 Californians but that the state's life expectancy, which had been tied for the nation's highest with Hawaii at 80.9 years, has dropped by two years - the first such decline since World War II.

> PPIC found that the higher death rate has disproportionately affected non-white Californians, particularly "Between 2019 and 2021, the death rate (deaths per 1,000 residents) increased 51% among Latinos, 31% among Blacks, 26% among Asian-Americans, and 17% among whites," the PPIC reported.

Finally, a new study UCLA Center for Health Policy Research found that Newsom's stay-at-home orders, affecting businesses, child care centers and school, created financial hardships that led to psychological distress and a sharp increase in turmoil and conflict, including domestic violence.

Some COVID-19 victims are experiencing long COVID, with lasting debilitative effects. California suffers from lingering effects as well.

The state social services department attributes the increase partially to a more flexible application process during the pandemic, while advocates like Silva also suggest the boost in aid made going through an application more worthwhile for eligible residents.

The loss of emergency allotments will be felt particularly hard by older and disabled people, many of whom have already seen their food aid eligibility reduced after a historic inflationary bump in Social Security checks in January. In addition to wages, Social Security, unemployment benefits and disability payments all count as income for the person receiving food aid.

Tom McSpedden, a 69-year-old Citrus Heights resident with Type II diabetes, saw a nearly \$60 decrease in his normal CalFresh allowance last month after getting a \$109 increase in his monthly Social Security checks.

But he continued to get the pandemic CalFresh boosts, which kept the total food stamps on his benefits card at \$281 that month – the maximum allowable aid for a single-person household.

In April, McSpedden's monthly CalFresh benefits check goes toward renting a room; the rest is meticulously budgeted for his phone, car insurance, gas, the portion of insulin and medications that Medicare doesn't cover and bankruptcy payments. "I don't have the \$230 left over each month to compensate" for the

drop in aid, he said. "I'm just not going to be able to afford food. It's that simple."

The food banks association and other anti-poverty organizations have proposed that the state spend more than \$2 billion providing a "ramp-down" of the extra benefits for five months after the federal boosts end.

But it's unclear whether the Legislature and Gov. Gavin Newsom's administration would agree on new spending as they seek to close a \$23 billion budget deficit.

Advocates are also calling for the state to add its own funds to the regular food stamps program, to boost the minimum food aid grant from \$23 to \$50 with corresponding inflationary increases. Other ideas include expanding special CalFresh programs that provide extra dollars for those purchasing California-grown produce, or for certain

ing the \$500 million a month that will be absent from people's budgets, dinner tables and California retailers as well," said Jared Call, senior advocate at the food policy organization Nourish California. "But our approach is, no tool in the toolbox should be unused."

The California Department of Social Services says it's warning households of the upcoming decline in aid and directing CalFresh recipients to food banks, which have received additional funding from both the state and federal governments in recent years.

The state's network of food banks continues to serve on average 1.5 times the number of clients as before the pandemic, Silva said.

The Sacramento Food Bank and Family Services, which provides food in the county McSpedden lives, averaged 150,000 clients a month before the pandemic, said community resource manager Lorena Carranza. In recent months, that number has been about 275,000.

But food distributions can't replace the flexibility of food stamps that many residents rely on.

With a special diet to manage his diabetes, McSpedden said food distribution boxes usually only contain a few items he can eat. He's loath to take a full box when others could use it, he said.

McSpedden worked for nearly three decades as a long-haul trucker until about 15 years ago, when a series of heart attacks ended that career and landed him in a hospital stay that wiped out his savings and retirement accounts.



Legislation to Prohibit Homeless **Encampments near Schools and Parks**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -On January 23, 2023, Assemblyman Josh Hoover (R-Folsom) announced the introduction of Assembly Bill 257, which would prohibit homeless encampments within

500 feet of schools, daycare centers, parks, and libraries.

"As our local communities work toward mental health and housing solutions on homelessness, it is critical that the Legislature act to ensure our most sensitive public spaces are kept safe," said Assemblyman Hoover. "No parent should be afraid to let their kids walk to school or worry about finding needles in the park where their children play, but that is the current experience for far too many families across our state. This legislation would change that."

Last year several cities in California, including Sacramento and Los Angeles, voted for similar measures at the local level. Since 2019 homelessness in Sacramento County has grown by 67%, recently surpassing San Francisco for the first time.

As a new member of the Joint Legislative Audit Committee, Assemblyman Hoover also plans to propose an audit of statewide homelessness spending in the near future to provide more accountability and determine which programs are effective at reducing homelessness.

Disabled Person Parking Permits Must Be Renewed

DMV News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Department of Motor Vehicles highlighted new laws that started in 2023 and one of those require drivers 70 and older to renew their license in person at a DMV office.


In October 2020, Governor Gavin Newsom temporarily waived the California law requiring senior drivers to renew their licenses at a DMV field office and signed AB 174 in September 2021 to allow online or by mail renewals through the end of 2022.

The DMV is sending notices to Californians who have had their permanent Disabled Person Parking Placard for at least six years and asking them to confirm that they are still in need of one.

The DMV will not renew placards for people who do not respond. This renewal requirement is one provision of prior legislation, SB 611, enacted in 2017 to curb fraud and abuse of Disabled Person Parking Placards.

Drivers are now required to change into another available lane, when possible, to pass cyclists, building on the current requirement for drivers to give cyclists at least three feet of space when passing. The law also permits Class 3 e-bike riders to use approved bicycle paths and trails, bikeways, and bicycle lanes. In addition, starting on January 1, 2024, the law allows cyclists to cross an intersection when a walk sign is on.

This law exempts vehicles registered to veterans displaying specialized license plates from paying tolls on roads, bridges, highways, vehicular crossings, or other toll facilities. The exemption applies only to vehicles with license plates that are issued

to a disabled veteran, Pearl Harbor survivor, prisoner of war, or to veterans who have received distinctions such as the Purple Heart or the Congressional Medal of Honor.

California state courts will stop sending notices to the DMV for license suspensions for failure to appear starting on January 1, 2023, while requiring the DMV to stop suspending licenses for failing to appear starting on January 1, 2027, to allow time to make computer programming changes. \star





Financial Literacy Needs to be Taught in California Schools

With more and more of our children failing to meet basic math skills, it's unfortunate but not surprising that so many adults struggle with achieving financial freedom.

Late last year, California released statewide test scores that revealed only 33 percent of students were able to meet the state's math standards – a drop of seven percent from 2019. Some of those results are undoubtedly due to challenges associated with the pandemic. But the statistic on its own is cause for concern and action.

Adding financial literacy to the state's education curriculum could help improve those numbers as well as prepare our youth for the financial realities of adulthood.

Financial literacy is an individual's ability to understand and make informed decisions regarding their finances. This includes knowledge of basic financial concepts such as budgeting, saving, investing, and managing debt. In today's world, financial literacy is more important than ever. Here are a few reasons why California students would benefit from a

financial literacy course: Better Money Management: Financial literacy empowers individuals to manage their money effectively, enabling them to make informed decisions on spending, saving, and investing. It helps people understand the true cost of credit, set financial goals, and plan for future expenses.

• Avoid Financial Scams: Financial scams have become increasingly common. Research suggests that people who are financially literate are less likely to fall victim to them. Understanding basic financial concepts and being aware of common scams help individuals protect their money and avoid costly mistakes.

• Improved Credit Scores: Understanding the financial landscape can also have a positive impact on an individual's credit score, a metric used to determine one's ability to obtain credit. Understanding credit scores, how they are calculated, and how to maintain a good credit history can improve a person's chances of getting approved for loans, credit cards, and other financial products.

Two years ago I was hopeful when legislation was introduced to authorize a school district or charter school to incorporate a financial literacy program into an economics course offered by the local school districts. Sadly, the bill never even received a committee hearing.


This lack of basic skills not being taught in our schools is having serious consequences, particularly for younger generations who don't have the knowledge and skills needed to manage their finances effectively.

We must support legislation at the national, state, and local level to teach financial literacy and encourage individuals to take an active interest in their finances.

Financial literacy is crucial for individuals to achieve financial stability and independence. It enables individuals to make informed decisions about their finances, protect themselves from financial scams, and plan for their future. Making financial literacy a priority will help ensure that individuals have the knowledge and skills they need to manage their finances effectively, and to achieve their financial goals, leading to a sense of financial freedom.
