SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Board of Supervisors, at its Nov. 15 meeting, voted to approve a resolution accepting a \$290,000 donation from Eppie's Wellness Foundation to support future Therapeutic Recreation Services (TRS) programming and the Gibson Ranch Sensory Playground Pathway to Play.

Of the \$290,000, \$140,000 will be placed in the Regional Parks' restricted funds to be used for future TRS program support over the next ten years.

These funds will be used for the development of new programs or special funding requests such as scholarships or uniforms for the Sacramento Chargers sports

The remaining \$150,000 will be used to complete construction of the Gibson Ranch Sensory Playground Pathway to Play project, which will create a play area specifically designed to be accessible and inclusive for all children, but especially for those who have been diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).

The Pathway to Play area includes various play equipment and is specifically designed for inclusive play,

providing access to a range of sensory experiences for children of different abilities. These pieces of equipment are spread out so that they can limit sensory overload.

Sacramento area restaurateur/entrepreneur Eppie G. Johnson was the founder of Eppie's Great Race, a Sacramento tradition that took place annually along the American River Parkway in collaboration with Sacramento County Parks. During his lifetime, he supported Regional Parks in numerous ways, including promoting the American River Parkway and bringing out park users to train and appreciate the jewel of

Sacramento, the American

"Eppie had a deep appreciation for the American River Parkway, and he was an avid supporter of Therapeutic Recreation Services (TRS), a recreation program offered through the Department, serving those with a variety of disabilities," said Liz Bellas, Director of Regional Parks. "We will be forever grateful to Eppie and his family, and the tremendous generosity they have shown Regional Parks over the years."

Eppie founded the event in 1974, holding the first triathlon on July 27, 1974. The race featured a

## \$647 Million to Cover **Overdue Utility Bills**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -Gov. Gavin Newsom on November 22 announced the release of \$647 million in funding to help over 1.4 million California households struggling to pay

their overdue energy bills.

The awarded funding will eliminate all past due energy debt accrued by residential customers between March 4, 2020 and December 31, 2021, providing real relief to households that have suffered the economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and increased energy debt.

Over the last year, California has distributed over \$1.6 billion in financial assistance for bill credits through the California Arrearage Payment Program (CAPP) to reduce or eliminate overdue electric and gas bills.

"California has made unprecedented commitments to help vulnerable households stay afloat as the cost-of-living increases," said Governor Newsom. "By providing utility relief that will eliminate over 1.4 million Californians' overdue energy bills, we're helping families who continue to struggle with higher costs."

Governor Newsom and the California Legislature established the 2022 California Arrearage Payment Program (2022 CAPP) to address 100 percent of past due energy bill balances incurred by residential customers during the program's COVID-19 pandemic bill relief period covering March 4, 2020 to December 31, 2021. Thirty-three energy utilities applied for 2022 CAPP funding on behalf of over 1.4 million eligible residential customers.

Participating state energy utilities are required to apply a 2022 CAPP bill credit to their customer accounts within 60 days of receiving funds.

"Once again, we are leading with our values by working to ensure that our neighbors economically impacted by the pandemic can keep their lights on," said California Health and Human Services Agency Secretary Dr. Mark Ghaly. "Many of us fell behind as the pandemic continued, and our commitment to further address energy debts is another way we are lifting up all Californians."

CAPP is administered by the Department of Community Services and Development (CSD). Under the first round of CAPP funding in 2021, over 1.5 million residential and commercial energy utility customers received

# Giving Machine: the Spirit of Christmas

ROSEVILLE, CA (MPG) - The Giving Machines, which are vending machines that disperse donations instead of snacks, have come to Westfield Galleria Mall in Roseville, the only place in California to have them.

Santa Claus was one of the first to donate, aided by Denise Hoffman, supervisor of the Tuesday volunteers.

"The Giving Machine is the same spirit of Christmas that Santa has," Santa said. "We give and not receive. That's what Christmas is all about. Always give and think of the love we share. Merry Christmas!"

Hoffman didn't say what Santa's choice was, but she said that her family's favorite donation is chickens.

"We've already bought some chickens, but I think (my husband) wants to buy a family toilet," she said. "You can get a family toilet for \$60."

Minimum purchase begins at \$10 and goes to a maximum of \$1,500. Volunteers are there every day to help patrons operate the vending machines.

Sponsored by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, the Giving Machines originated in 2017 and this year are in place during the holidays in 22 locations in the United States, and 6 international locations. At the Galleria, the machines offer donations to four local and three international nonprofit organizations. They will be in place from November 22 through January 2.

How does it work? Choose a machine – each machine offers a selection of items on behalf of global and local organizations that help those suffering from hardship and privation. Make your selection – you may add several items you'd like to donate using the touch screen "shopping cart," up to a total of \$1,500. Swipe your card – Giving Machines accept credit card and

mobile payments (Apple Pay, Google Pay, etc.). Collect your receipt – a card will drop down showing what you have donated.

"One of the things I've learned is," said Hoffman, "we're buying chickens for a family in an underdeveloped country – that will provide both food for them and income from selling eggs to others in the village. The charities must use that money donated for buying chickens, they can't use it for anything else. The organizers have oversights in place to assure that what is donated is what is given."

Anyone can donate, and often entire families come and let the children help choose what the family donates. Nancy Pinney of Granite Bay came with her grandchildren Luke, Jake, Chase, and Kai.

wanted to purchase . . . I think that the Giving Machine is just an inspired program. So many people are looking for ways to help other people. They don't know how to. They don't know where to turn, they don't know who to ask. And this Giving Machine is so easy to use and it's so available, it's right there in the middle of the Mall, and it gives you such a selection of things to choose from. I think it's just an amazing, amazing program."

While international donations may provide more exotic purchases, like chickens or outhouses, than donations for local charities, contributions to local concerns are needed to provide help to the people who live right around you. The local groups that are represented in this year's Sacramento area machines are Placer Food Bank, HART, Al-Misbaah, and Catholic Charities: Diocese of Sacramento.

Placer Food Bank covers Placer, El Dorado and Nevada Counties, an area of about 4,700 square miles. During the last fiscal year, the food bank distributed about 8.2 million pounds of food in the three counties.

"When we started learning about the concept of the Giving Machines, we thought it was really, really quite brilliant," said Lisa Heinrich, director of development and communications for Placer Food Bank, "and quite an interesting way to allow the community to come together in a gathering place and make a donation . . . What better way to continue our mission, to help feed people."

In the meantime, it's good to remember the real meaning of the Giving Machine.

"While we make a trip to the mall and choose what we'd like to donate," said Bruce Anderson, the director of the local effort.

"we can't forget that while we have fun and go back to a warm home and a good meal, there are others out there doing without the very basics of life – clean water, a bed to sleep in, enough food to keep them alive. What's important is that we do what we can."

The Giving Machines can be

found at Westfield Galleria Mall, 1151 Galleria Blvd., Roseville, CA, in front of Penny's and Santa's greeting place. Galleria hours are 10 a.m.-8 p.m. Monday-Thursday, 10 a.m.-9 p.m. Friday and Saturday, and 11 a.m.-7 p.m. on Sunday. ## **SMF Named WSJ's Top Airport**

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Sacramento International Airport (SMF) was named the top airport in the nation according to the Wall Street Journal's 2022 Airport rankings. Compared to the 50 other airports surveyed, SMF received the highest score overall.

The top 50 busiest airports were surveyed and then divided into two sizes - 20 large and 30 midsize. The airports were then measured on 19 categories including experience from on-time performance and security waits to customer-satisfaction scores and ticket prices. The categories ranked were further grouped into three broad categories – reliability, convenience, and value.

SMF ranked highest among all airports surveyed in the reliability category and also ranked high in arrival and departure times, low flight cancellations, quick taxi and security clearance times, and a max walking

distance of only 1,213 feet.

"The SMF team consistently provides our customers with a safe, comfortable and enjoyable travel experience," said Cindy Nichol, Director of the Sacramento County Department of Airports. "Living our values every day clearly makes a difference, as we make our customers our top priority. We see each day as an opportunity to improve and accomplish more together by collaborating; communicating and taking pride in what we do."

In 2019, SMF similarly won the top midsized airport award - the award was not issued in 2020 or 2021 due to the pandemic.

The Sacramento County Department of Airports is responsible for planning, developing, operating and maintaining the county's four airports: Sacramento International Airport, Executive Airport, Mather Airport and Franklin Field. For more information, visit sacramento.aero.

5.82-mile run, a 12.5-mile bike and a 6.10-mile paddle held along the scenic American River Parkway in Rancho Cordova and Sacramento. This event provided an opportunity to race for all ages and abilities. The final race was held in 2018.

The proceeds from the event raised more than \$1.5 Million dollars for causes within Sacramento, including over \$1 Million specifically for TRS. Eppie's Great Race

Foundation was incorporated by Eppie Johnson in 2004, and the Foundation was renamed by the Board of Directors to the Eppie's Wellness Foundation (EWF) in 2014.

The EWF Board of Directors decided to dissolve the foundation by the end of 2022, and in keeping with Eppie's historic support of Regional Parks and TRS, it decided to donate a majority of the remaining assets to Regional Parks. ★

# Presenting \$2.5 million to ARC Veterans Resource Center

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Assemblymembers Ken Cooley (D-Rancho Cordova) and Kevin McCarty (D-Sacramento) presented on October 10, American River College Veterans Resource Center with a \$2,500,000 check allocated from the 2022 California

State Budget.

"Veterans, by their military service, chose to give our nation their all. Supporting them - in life, education, and in their dreams - is always right," said Assemblyman Ken Cooley. "Creating spaces where veterans can gather for respite or to get useful help from the Veterans Resource Center lends to a more positive and successful education. The remodeling will make this space more pleasant with more natural lighting and other improvements, all done to enhance the Center. I am honored to be here to help ARC celebrate this moment."

"It's important we support our Veterans who have put their lives on the line fighting for the safety of everyone in this country," said Assemblymember Kevin McCarty. "The Veterans Center at American River College is a great resource for those who are transitioning from military to college. And as someone whose brother is currently serving in the military, it was a no-brainer on where to allocate the \$2.5 million to."

"ARC is honored to receive this significant state funding, which will make a direct impact on the lives of our student Veterans. This support comes at a very critical time for them" said ARC President Melanie Dixon. "We thank Assemblymembers McCarty and Cooley for their advocacy on behalf of our students."

The funds will be used to remodel the center to help improve the experience of the Veterans at American River College. The proposed remodel work includes the following: funding for design and permits for structural improvements; adding more windows on all exterior walls and skylights; upgrade doors to sliding doors; create access from the VRC to an enclosed outdoor patio area; reconfigure the reception entry area, and enhancement to the heating and cooling system.

## Using Lived Experience Hazel Avenue Completed for a Positive Change

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Nita Webb prints out an application for a housing voucher through Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency (SHRA). She has a client that qualifies for housing but has no way to fill out the application needed to get the process started. Providing these simple services for her clients is just part of the job Nita does as a Peer Counselor to help out people experiencing homelessness Sacramento County.

Nita understands that every small bit of help can lead to big changes in someone's life. She has been there - desperately in need of a helping hand to better her situation. Nita grew up in Sacramento with her father and sister. They were poor, but always had a roof over their head and enough food to eat. Nita remembers how her father always did what he could to give back to people who were less fortunate than them. "Never look down on anyone – never treat people like they are less than you, because they aren't," she recalls him saying. Perhaps that is where her love of helping others came from.

After having a baby at a young age and dropping out of high school, Nita found work at a group home for girls that both paid her bills and satisfied her deep desire to help others in need. In 2009, when the recession hit, she was laid off from her job. Unemployment benefits were delayed for months and the money Nita received from welfare was not enough money to pay her rent. As her eviction loomed closer, she desperately searched for accommodations that would be safe for her and her five-year-old daughter.

She was offered a space in a congregate shelter, but she was worried about her safety. However, she knew that if she was in a shelter with her daughter, they'd be prioritized for help faster than if she looked on her own. As she was being locked out of her apartment for the last time, she received a call from St. John's Shelter for Women and Children - they had a space for Nita and her daughter.

Living in a shelter with other homeless women and children provided her with a fresh view of her situation – all the women there had stories. Stories about domestic violence or a job loss or a major medical emergency that

drained their savings. They were all alike, all struggling. St. John's set her up with classes on parenting, women empowerment and job training. She earned her GED and started working at St. John's non-profit, Plates, which not only provided her with critical job training, but earned her a housing subsidy in a transitional living program for her and her daughter.

Having that rental subsidy allowed Nita to start taking college courses, while still working at Plates. But the pull to help others in her situation was strong. She got a job working for Volunteers of America (VOA) – a job that allowed her to work directly with persons experiencing homelessness. While with VOA, she worked with clients that were sheltering at the Capitol Motel on L Street. Mixed in among those that lived there, her clients had drastically different needs and barriers to exiting homelessness. but one thing remained the same – whether people were sheltering or paying rent, homeless or housed - everyone had a story, everyone had a life before they found themselves in their current circumstance.

respect and a helping hand. Nita got a job as a Housing Specialist with Next Move at Mather Community Campus, yet another connection directly to persons experiencing homelessness that allowed her to make a tangible difference. She saw herself in every client – she was just one blessing in front of literal homelessness. Even as she connected clients to housing, she knew that housing doesn't equal final

Everyone deserved love and

security when people need continued help and services to remain stabilized.

Today, Nita works

for the Sacramento County Department of Health Services as a Peer Counselor, a person with lived experience that can identify with clients. She is part of the new Homeless Encampment And Response Team (HEART) - teams that go directly into encampments and connect people living unsheltered with benefits, shelter connections, clinical evaluations and referrals. She carries prepaid phones with her to provide to clients to remain in direct contact with them. She knows that she cannot personally help people with everything they need - but she can help them with one thing at a time, one thing that might be exactly what they need to alter their life course, stabilize and exit homelessness for good. She explains to her clients the work that she can do, and the work they need to do to help themselves – a vital piece of the puzzle to ending their homelessness.

Nita and her daughter still go to therapy together to work through the trauma of their unhoused experience. Though stabilized now, the ease of slipping into homelessness is always on her mind. As is her father – who instilled in her the heart to help the homeless - a job he never got to see her do, but one she honors him through every day. Her clients are blessings to her, as she is to them a reminder that you can change your circumstances, you can accept help, and together - they can end one person's homelessness at a time.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - In 2008, Sacramento County Department of Transportation (SacDOT) began work on transforming Hazel Avenue. That's when the first phase kicked off at the Highway 50 interchange. The entire project would stretch from Highway 50 up to Madison Avenue. It was broken up into three separate phases, with Phase 1 running from the highway to Curragh Downs Drive. Constructing this project resulted in big changes to the look and feel of Hazel Avenue. The biggest change was widening the road from four to six lanes. Other upgrades include constructing new bicycle and pedestrian facilities, traffic signal modifications, and replacing the center turn lane with a raised/landscaped center median.

One of the biggest challenges in Phase 1 was adding extra lanes on the bridge over the American River. Before that could occur, engineers needed to complete the design, secure environmental permits, and acquire the land rights necessary for the project. The alignment for Phase 2 and Phase 3 of the project required the purchase and removal of over 40 houses, as well as relocation assistance for the impacted

A year after the design was completed and three years after the Board of Supervisors gave its 2006 greenlight for the project, construction crews started work. The first phase officially finished in 2011, with a ribbon cutting at the Nimbus Fish Hatchery.

The second phase kicked

off in 2010 with the important pre-construction work of design, environmental studies, and the acquisition of properties before construction began. The heavy lifting started in 2016, as construction began from Curragh Downs Drive to Sunset Avenue. This phase of the project included a partnership with the Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) and the telecom utilities to underground the overhead utility lines. SacDOT also partnered with the Fair Oaks Water District to replace their aging water distribution system within the project limits. Construction on Phase 2 was completed

With two phases down, SacDOT turned its sights onto the homestretch of Phase 3. SacDOT began that construction from Sunset Avenue to Madison Avenue in November 2020. As Phase 3 started, residents and commuters began to see how this facelift was helping to rejuvenate Hazel Avenue. After the end of Phase 3, the 2008 vision for new sidewalks and bike lanes came to fruition. These new amenities provided alternative modes of transportation for those wanting to get out of their cars. The construction

also brought new bus stops that allow traffic to flow while buses pull into a turnout giving passengers a safer way to board and exit.

Along with the road construction, the skyline along Hazel Avenue was decluttered. This occurred because SacDOT collaborated with SMUD and the telecom utility companies to remove overhead wires that crisscrossed the area. SMUD and the other utility companies removed nearly 100 utility poles and placed their lines underground. With the undergrounding of utilities and the installation of continuous sidewalks and bike lanes, the public can safely stroll or ride bikes from Madison to the Nimbus Fish Hatchery, and see birds instead of a power line overhead as they enjoy the outdoors.

It's been 16 years since the Board of Supervisors approved the \$70 million project, and as construction crews put the finishing touches to Hazel Avenue, SacDOT would like to thank everyone for their patience throughout the three phases of construction. Sacramento County hopes these improvements will benefit residents, businesses. and travelers for decades to come.





in her mind it was my loan in mom has a church car? I've never heard of such a thing. But hey, I'm going to talk to my wife about this. I knew I needed another car, I just didn't know I needed a church car. Oh, my goodness!

Ok, here's the deal. If you had an agreement with your mom, or promised at any time to pay back the Parent PLUS Loan when you were able, you should cover it. But that's not what you told me. It sounds like your mom has a good heart and was just trying to help, but she did it in a dumb way. From what you told me, she's done a lot of dumb things with money.

Under no circumstances do you take the loan back under your name. In fact, I'm not certain you can even do that with a Parent PLUS Loan. You need to get your debt cleaned up first before trying to help her. If you choose to be a bigger help after that, you need to start things by having a serious conversation with your mom. She needs to hear that she's being absolutely silly with her money. Let her know you're willing to help because the loan was for your benefit. But make sure she understands you won't pay it all, and you won't do it while she's making two luxury car payments-including one on a church car. That's ridiculous.

Offer to be her biggest cheerleader, and help her find a good financial coach—someone with the heart of a teacher. You might want to let her know you'll match whatever she pays toward the loan, so it'll feel like a team effort. But also make sure she understands if she pays nothing in any given month, you'll match that, too.

## The Yin and Yang of California's Job Picture

When California's monthly report on employment was issued last week telling us what the situation was in October — Gov. Gavin Newsom quickly issued a celebratory statement.

"California has now fully recovered all jobs that were lost to the pandemic-induced recession, but we know this isn't the finish line," Newsom said, making a plug for his economic programs to counter rising consumer costs and "to help create thousands of jobs and opportunities for Californians throughout the state."

Newsom claimed that "California has recovered 101.1% of the 2,758,900 jobs lost during the recession - the state is now 30,800 jobs above the pre-pandemic level total of February

2020." Data from the state **Employment Development** Department (EDD) tell a slightly different story. In February 2020, according to EDD's bulletin for that month, 18,756,900 Californians were employed. The bulletin for October 2022 pegged employment at 18,502,900, or 254,000

the state's jobless rate had soared from less that 4% of the labor force to more than 16%. Newsom had ordered widespread shutdowns of business to counter the spread of COVID-19, throwing nearly 3 million Californians out of work.

The financial pain to millions of California families was made immeasurably worse when EDD experienced a bureaucratic meltdown that prevented many jobless workers from collecting unemployment insurance payments, sometimes for months. Moreover, under pressure to clear the backlog, EDD workers then swung too far the other way, authorizing tens of billions of dollars in payments to fraudulent applicants.

Although the October report tells us that almost as many Californians were employed as prior to the COVID-19 recession, the state's overall job picture is more complex than those simple numbers.

For one thing, the reports for February 2020 and October 2022 reveal that the state's labor force the total of Californians either employed or looking mists tell us, a recession may for work — has shrunk by nearly a quarter-million persons. The numbers continue a long-term decline in what's called "labor force participation" — the percentage of working-age adults who have jobs or want to work. "It was a lot of fun," young Bryson said by phone. "I loved every minute of it, including the flight simulator."

The new major was also presented with the "Skull Courage Award" by the 416th Flight Test Squadron (whose insignia is a skeleton) for demonstrating courage through adversity.

After the ceremonies, Bridges said he was quite anxious to get out on the flight line to see the jets. His Air Force hosts made sure he got a bird's eye view of the Aerospace Valley Air show, enjoying a trip to the control tower during the air show practice of the U.S. Air Force Thunderbirds, and receiving their aerial achievement award for his piloting skills.







## California DAs to CDCR: Explain Early Release of Violent Criminals

CDAA News Release

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

The California District Attorneys Association (CDAA) wants the prison system (CDCR) to explain why it is releasing violent prisoners who haven't earned sufficient rehabilitation credits early from prison. In some cases, they have re-offended and committed even more serious crimes.

To qualify for release, prisoners are supposed to earn credits for good behavior under Prop 57, but that often does not appear to

be the case. In a series of reports, Julie Watts of CBS News revealed the process by which CDCR is releasing prisoners is hidden from the public, arbitrary, and dangerous.

"They're doing it in secret because they don't want to be called out," El Dorado County District Attorney Vern Pierson told CBS.

"The public has a right to know what these people are doing to rehabilitate themselves," said Yolo County District Attorney Jeff Reisig. Watts reported that Sacramento mass shooting suspect Smiley Martin had earlier been denied parole after a fight with a fellow inmate and other criminal activity while behind bars. Yet because his domestic violence conviction did not qualify as a violent crime, the CDCR deemed him qualified for early release. A year after he was denied parole, police said Smiley was caught on camera opening fire into a crowd of gang rivals near the state capitol.

"CDAA calls upon CDCR

officials to immediately explain the system for releasing violent criminals—especially those who have not fully engaged in rehabilitation programs." said Greg Totten, CDAA Chief Executive Officer. "It needs to stop now. This is not reform. This is an anti-transparent experiment that is gambling with public safety."

SB 1391, a separate piece of legislation related to Prop 57, also frees prisoners, specifically those who were juveniles convicted of crimes as adults.



is convicted murderer Daniel Marsh who said he got "an exhilarating feeling" after he stabbed an elderly Davis couple 120 times to death. He may now be eligible for early release, according to the Davis Enterprise.

Marsh was just days shy of his 16th birthday at the time of the double homicide. He was sentenced to 52 years to life in prison, but he could get out after only serving 10 years. The case is being heard by the Third District Court of Appeal in Sacramento.
