Fall Feast of Nature

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Birds, reptiles and marsupials will be among educators during the Effie Yeaw Nature Center's NatureFest event. Postponed for two years by the pandemic, the fall tradition makes a comeback on Sunday, October 9.

Among visiting presenters will be Gabe Kerschner, who runs an animal sanctuary in Placer County. His rescued animals are stars of hundreds of school programs. They include an alligator, a lemur, a kangaroo and a kinkajou. NatureFest supporters will also view a more regional menagerie: this could include a skunk, a raccoon and an opossum.

Kerschner's commentary outlines heartbreaking animal rescues, like that of bald eagle Spirit, who lost a wing after being shot by an angler.

Save the Snakes, a nonprofit that champions one of nature's most misunderstood species, will offer a program to dispel myths. Gopher and king snakes will slither into the spotlight as ambassadors. Volunteers from Sacramento Splash will detail microscopic species found in wetlands. Palomacy - a pigeon and dove rescue agency - will offer advice on adopting unreleasable Columbiformes.

Resident Nature Center raptors - including a great-horned owl, a falcon, a Swainson's hawk and a kestrel - will also interact with

visitors. Deer and wild turkey sightings are likely on hosted walks through the center's 100-acre wildlife preserve.

The Nature Center is a hub for Native American studies. Demonstrations will include basketry and tule doll-making.

Kids' games will be offered, and snacks can be purchased from food trucks. Youth groups are welcome at the open day.

NatureFest runs from 10 a.m. to 3 pm in the Effie Yeaw Nature Center (Ancil Hoffman Park). General admission is \$7; \$3 for children 3 to 11. Parking is free. Pre-sale tickets are available online. Information www.sacnaturecenter.net/events/naturefest ★

CDPH Warns Schools of 'Rainbow Fentanyl'

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) this week warned school leaders about a new and concerning "rainbow fentanyl" drug that may interest youth. In a letter to superintendents and charter school administrators, CDPH Director and State Public Health Officer Tomás J. Aragón warned that "rainbow fentanyl" is a potentially fatal drug found in pills and powders in a variety of bright colors, shapes and sizes that could attract young people.

"Rainbow fentanyl can be found in many forms, including pills, powder, and blocks that can resemble sidewalk chalk or candy," said Dr. Aragón. "Any pill, regardless of its color, shape, or size, that does not come from a health care provider or pharmacist can contain fentanyl and can be deadly," he said.

In its letter, CDPH points to a recent warning from the United States Drug Enforcement Agency that notes the highly addictive and potentially deadly "rainbow fentanyl" has been found in at least 18 states.

Anyone who encounters fentanyl in any form should not handle it and should call 911 immediately.

Recognizing the signs of opioid overdose can save a life. Here are some things to look for:

Small, constricted "pinpoint pupils"; Falling asleep or losing consciousness; Slow, weak, or no breathing; Choking or gurgling sounds; Limp body; Cold and/or clammy skin; Discolored skin (especially in lips and nails).

It may be hard to tell if a person is high or experiencing an overdose. If you aren't sure, treat it like an overdose. Here are the steps that could save a life: 1) Call 911 immediately; 2) Administer naloxone, if available; 3) Try to keep the person awake and breathing; 4) Lay the person on their side to prevent choking; 5) Stay with the person

Bocce on a Roll in Park

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Because Carmichael Park's bocce ball courts opened during the pandemic, no dedication ceremony lauded their completion. Fans of the game now plan a celebration to make up for lost time.

Lessons, brunch and a tournament will "reopen" the park facility on Saturday, October 15. Anyone may attend festivities. Adjacent to the courts, the Italian Cultural Center will throw doors open to share food, music and folkloric dancing. At the courts, free Continental breakfast begins at 10 am; lessons and a friendly tournament kicks off at 11; free play continues all afternoon.

The event also honors facility benefactor, Shirley Pennington Simi. The Carmichael woman's dying wish was to see bocce courts in the park. Her 2018 estate bequest

of \$5000 got the ball rolling - Carmichael Park District, Carmichael Parks Foundation and community fundraising met the balance of costs.

A daughter of Tuscan immigrants, Shirley loved all things Italian. She died at the age of 75, having long lobbied for her favorite sport to be among community activities. Shirley's daughter Teri O'Sullivan, and her son, Todd Pennington,

spearheaded fundraising to augment their mother's gift. "Mom was so proud of her cultural heritage and bocce was part of that," explains her daughter.

Court construction began in 2020. The ADA-compliant amenity boasts synthetic surfaced lanes that allow all-weather play. "I wish mom could be here for the celebrations," says Teri O'Sullivan. "I know she'd be clapping her hands and saying 'bravo,

mia famiglia!'"

The event will be preceded with an October 14 on-court blessing by Our lady Of Assumption Priest Father Eduino Silveira.

Carmichael Park is located at 5750 Grant Avenue. The courts are located near the North Avenue park entrance. The Italian Cultural Center is located at 6821 Fair Oaks Boulevard. Learn more about CRPD amenities at www.carmichaelpark.com ★

are truly beautiful and wonderful creatures," she said. Skinner said she was honored to be recognized by the DAR for her work.

"It's an honor to give back to the community you love with the skills you have," Skinner said.

Karen Wilkes, for her work with "Days for Girls" in Rocklin, where she recruits recruiting volunteers, conducts fundraising, and teaches the necessary skills to sew, assemble, package, and prepare to mail

in areas where they are forced to miss school and help them continue their education.

Brad Wilkes, her spouse, was also recognized for his help to manage, store, transport and mail these much-needed packages to countries around the world.

Together, the Wilkes help provide sustainable, fabric menstruation products to girls and women in 120 countries across six continents. More than 2,000 women, men and youth in Northern

California and beyond have been involved with making the components of the "Days for Girls" kits with the Wilkses.

"It's also unified our community in an effort to come together to wash, iron, cut, sew, serge and assemble kits," Wilkes said. The pair expects to assemble and distribute over \$2,000 kits this year. They continue to reach out to support the needs of homeless women in south Sacramento, Los Angeles and in the Central Valley.

Almost 800 neighbors and visitors enjoyed the festival. A tradition for more than 60 years, Founder's Day began as a Chamber of Commerce promotion to recall Daniel Carmichael's 1909 real estate venture. Carmichael Recreation and Park District now presents the annual celebration in Carmichael Park.

Kids bobbed in bounce-houses; buccaneers blasted canons; merchants touted services and political parties registered voters. Cappuccino Cruisers Car Club filled much of the park with classic automobiles. The event also provided

a platform for volunteer proponents of Measure G – a ballot initiative for voter-approved park funding – to canvas support.

High-kicking among youth performers was Del Campo High School's 16-member Varsity Cheer Team. The Founder's Day appearance was useful practice for the state-wide USA Cheer competition that their school will host on November 12.

until emergency help arrives.

Get more facts about Fentanyl from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Some California schools have created naloxone policies in response to increases in opioid overdoses among youth. Naloxone is a life-saving medication used to reverse an opioid overdose.

CDPH encourages schools that are interested in developing these policies and receiving free naloxone to review relevant regulations and apply for a Statewide Standing Order for Naloxone.

The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) Naloxone Distribution Project offers free naloxone to qualified organizations, including schools and universities. ★

Republic FC's Open Cup Dream Ends with Heads Held High

ORLANDO, FL (MPG) - After the finality of it all began to dissipate, Sacramento Republic FC's players and staff collectively applauded the travelling fans in the upper reaches of Exploria Stadium, who responded in kind at the end of a dream that ended 15 minutes too soon.

The players and coaching staff then went to collect their finalist medals, where they were greeted by handshakes and commiserations from the dignitaries on hand led by USSF President Cindy Parlow Cone.

And then, in an uncommon turn, they returned to the catwalk placed on the field leading to the stage and surrounded it on either side, offering a guard of honor to the Orlando City SC players and staff that had just defeated them to claim the 2022 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup.

If there was a gesture that summed up Republic FC's historic run, and what the club is made of and stands for, its last act before departing the stage was the perfect illustration.

Glory in victory, honor in defeat.

"The guys did our club, our city, extremely proud," said Republic FC Head Coach Mark Briggs on September 7.

For more than an hour, Sacramento more than held its own against its Major League Soccer opponent. The Lions held more possession, and created shots, but none which threatened Republic FC goalkeeper Danny Vitiello. The

home supporters among a club record of 25,527 appeared to be getting restless.

It was, in fact, Republic FC that produced the first shot on target of the game. With 16 minutes to go, Douglas Martinez Jr.'s header off an angled cross from Rodrigo Lopez was claimed by Orlando goalkeeper Pedro Gallese.

It only took a minute, however, for everything to come undone. A misjudgment by Republic FC defender Dan Casey led to a turnover in the defensive end, and within seconds the ball was on the left

foot of Uruguayan international Facundo Torres. His strike from the top of the penalty area was perfectly placed, as was his penalty kick five minutes later that sealed the first trophy for the Lions since they claimed the 2013 USL Championship Final, a victory that arrived nine years prior to the day of Wednesday night's triumph.

"When you make mistakes like that, they punish you," Briggs said. "That's the level they play at. You make mistakes at this level, and you get punished. And that's what happened tonight."

As difficult as the ending proved, Sacramento's run brought pride and a sense of rejuvenation to both the club and the tournament. From the large – and loud – contingent of travelling support that made its presence felt throughout the night at Exploria Stadium to the thousands that attended the club's watch party back on the west coast, Republic FC not only burnished its reputation with its longtime fans but made new ones both locally and nationally.

"At the end of the day we have to be proud of ourselves,

you know?" said Lopez, whose four goals tied him for the tournament lead. "We made history. We did things that no-one thought we could do. Put ourselves in a situation to play a final. That's something that everyone should hold on to."

There is more to come for Republic FC, both this season and in the years to come. The club's attention will immediately turn to securing a place in the USL Championship Playoffs, where it currently sits fourth in the Western Conference, and pursuing a second USL Championship title in its history.

Then there's the promise of a new downtown stadium, an Academy program that continues to turn out talented professional prospects and youth internationals, and an ever-growing support base in its city.

"The guys gave a fantastic representation of themselves individually and as a group collectively," said Briggs. "[They] gave a great representation of the USL Championship. They should be proud of the performance they put out there and hopefully it highlights there are good players in the second division. There are good players that have the potential to move on and play on a stage like they played on tonight, if you take the time to look."

As it departed Wednesday night's stage, final handshakes complete, heads held high, Republic FC showed the country what a great club looks and feels like. ★

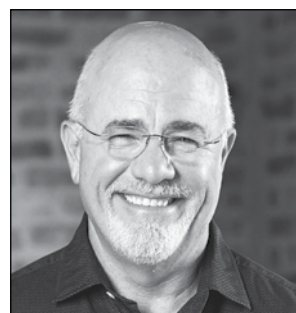

I get what you're saying about the truck. And I agree that transportation is a necessity. You guys might be in a bind if something happened and you lost a vehicle, but it's also a situation you could probably work around for a little while if you had no choice. My guess is you have friends or relatives who could loan you a car in a pinch, and public transportation is an option for some folks. So yeah, knock out the credit card first, then move on to the truck.

Do you understand my reasoning, Grant? Going this route serves two purposes: First, it will save you a little money. And second, I've got a feeling it will fire up your wife, and get her on board with

the idea of you two getting your finances in order even more than she already is.

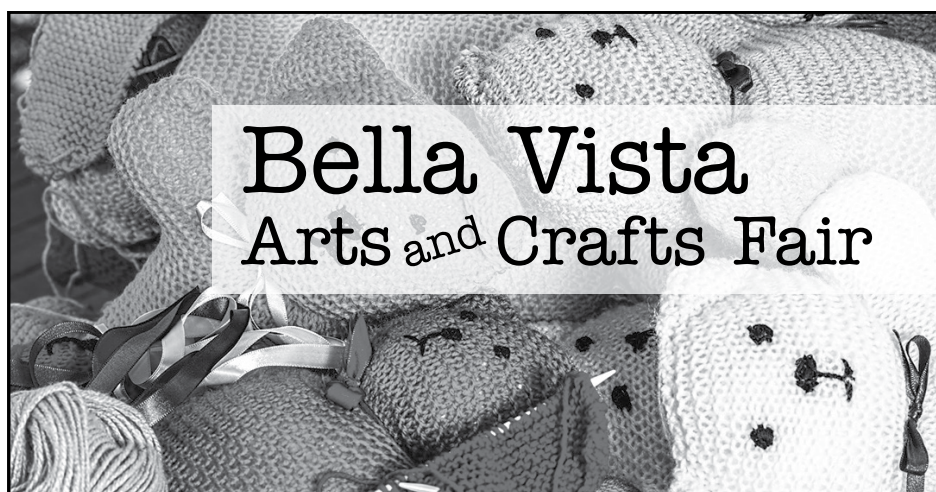
Dear Dave,

Energy Challenges to Continue Despite Newsom Signing Diablo Canyon Bill

Following Gavin Newsom's signing of a bill this weekend to allow Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant to operate for another 5 years, many are scrambling to seek final approvals for not only final hurdles to keep the plant open, but to get enough power plants up and running within that time to replace the power gap that would occur.

Senate Bill 846, authored by Senator Bill Dodd (D-Napa), invalidates the 2018 California Public Utilities Commission ruling that would have Diablo Canyon shut down between 2024 and 2025. New dates, if approved by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Agency, will be added in instead. Up to \$1.4 billion would then

be allocated to the Diablo Canyon Extension Fund to keep the plant running, with the overall goal of helping California reach the 2045 goal of having 100% green and carbon-free energy in the state.

Ever since Pacific Gas and Electric announced in 2016 that it would close Diablo Canyon in 2025 – to be replaced by newer zero carbon resources and reduced traditional electricity energy usage – many have called for an extension of the plant's life due to the critical energy role it plays in California.

In addition to being clean energy, Diablo Canyon currently powers 9% of the state, amounts to about 15% of all clean energy produced in the state, and would be a huge loss as California slowly transitions to being 100% renewable energy powered by 2045. While prior bills have failed in the past to extend the life of the plant, including AB 2898 in 2020, many state and federal officials have been pulling for California to keep the plant going. A November 2021 Stanford/MIT study that found that keeping the plant open until 2035 would

save billions and keep California on track to meet its emissions goals had the rare unifying effect in California of bringing many Democrats and Republicans together to keep the plant open. This has included California Republican leaders, notable Democrats such as Senator Dianne Feinstein, and Biden cabinet officials such as Energy Secretary Jennifer Granholm. Blackout and brownout worries due to the energy transition have also won many lawmakers over as well.

The push also affected Governor Newsom, who in April began seriously considering keeping the plant open for another 5-10 years. With energy and environmental concerns still at the forefront, and the state not wanting to leave a major gap in energy production open while the state strives to meet clean energy goals, Newsom backed the framework of SB 846. Specifically, Newsom proposed last month that PG&E would receive a \$1.4 billion from the state to cover operations and relicensing costs, as well as possible U.S. Department of Energy grants, with the

California Public Utilities Commission setting a new closure date of October 31, 2029 for one unit, and a date between October 31, 2030 and October 31, 2035 for the other. This led to the Governor signing SB 846 into law during the weekend.

Newsom signs SB 846, final agency approvals still needed

"The purpose of this letter is to express my intent in signing Senate Bill 846, which supports the option to extend the Diablo Canyon Power Plant (DCPP) by five years to meet the State's energy reliability needs," said Newsom in his approval letter.

"Climate change is causing unprecedented stress on California's energy system and I appreciate the Legislature's action to maintain energy reliability as the State accelerates the transition to clean energy. Senate Bill 846 facilitates the actions necessary to keep the option of the DCPP as a statewide reliability asset beyond the current 2024-2025 retirement dates of the plant's two units.

"The bill includes a rate component specific to the DCPP that does

not apply outside of the extended operation of the DCPP. The legislation provides that the rate component established in the bill is applied based on a customer's gross consumption of electricity."

However, the signing of SB 846 still leaves much to do. Multiple state agencies, as well as the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Committee, still need to give the OK to keep the plant going for another 5+ years. In addition, the state needs more solar, wind, hydro, and other non-carbon plants to help fill the huge gap to be filled by the eventual closing of Diablo Canyon, as well as future technology such as energy storage batteries and other things to help strengthen California's energy resources.

"Diablo Canyon staying open is a band-aid," LA-based energy expert Adam Klein told the Globe on Tuesday. "An expensive one and a needed one, but it only keeps California in an energy holding pattern until the end of the decade. The state has some big goals, but residents also, you know, need electricity. Beyond focusing on putting all the pieces in place for Diablo

Canyon, which again, isn't a sure thing yet, the state needs to approve more plants and look for anything to help inch up to meeting the demand. This includes giving tax breaks for home solar and even wind plants, replacing energy inefficient machinery and appliances, and utilizing new energy alternatives as they are created.

"The state should also hold off on ending the sale of gas-powered cars and should only do so once electrical issues are solved. The more electric cars on the road, the more the grid will strain, especially during heat waves. I mean, gas powered cars can be fueled at any time. In an energy event, you can't. We literally have seen California not allow electric cars to charge at peak energy times."

"The thing is, California is trying to do everything at once to reach all of these climate goals. While noble, they are also stretching themselves thin. Diablo Canyon helps, but the bigger problem still leaves a deep shadow."

Newsom has until the end of September to either sign or veto legislation. ★

Tax-the-Rich Dynamics are Different this Time

There's a ditty that captures Californians' attitudes about taxes: "Don't tax you, don't tax me, tax the fellow behind the tree."

It explains why California voters are usually willing to impose new taxes on the state's most affluent residents and why the state has, by far, the highest income tax rates of any state, topping out at 13.3%.

In this century, the syndrome has been evident in three elections, beginning in 2004 when Darrell Steinberg, then a state legislator and now mayor of Sacramento, and mental health advocacy groups proposed boosting the tax rate on incomes over \$1 million by one percentage point to expand services to the mentally ill.

Eight years later, in 2012, Gov. Jerry Brown sponsored a ballot measure that added four new tax rate brackets on incomes over \$250,000 for seven years, saying the proceeds, about \$6 billion a year, were needed to keep the state budget solvent.

Four years later, a coalition of public employee unions and program advocacy groups backed another measure to extend Brown's temporary increase until 2030.

All were successful, in part because the wealthy people who would pay the additional taxes didn't mount any opposition campaigns.

Once again, California voters are being asked to impose more taxes on high-income taxpayers, but this time, the dynamics are markedly different.

Proposition 30, primarily sponsored by the Lyft ride service company but with support from environmental and health groups, would raise the rate on incomes of \$2 million or more by 1.75 percentage points, pushing California's top rate to just over 15%. Proceeds would support climate change resistance efforts.

This time, however, wealthy Californians are donating heavily to a campaign against the measure. At least one reason might be that under a 2017 federal tax overhaul, they can no longer deduct state and local taxes (SALT) over \$10,000 on their federal tax returns.

In effect, that means that California's high-income taxpayers now feel the full brunt of state tax increases. The SALT cap also encourages some of the state's wealthy to leave California for low- or no-income tax states such as neighboring Nevada, Texas or Florida — electric car tycoon Elon Musk most spectacularly.

House Speaker Nancy Pelosi and other Democratic politicians have been trying to scrap the SALT deduction limit on behalf of California and other high-tax states, such as New York, but so far have failed.

This week saw another unusual wrinkle in the perpetual efforts to increase taxes on the wealthy: The campaign against Proposition 30 is broadcasting an ad in which Gov. Gavin Newsom denounces the measure, citing Lyft's sponsorship.

"Don't be fooled. Prop 30's been advertised as a climate initiative," Newsom says. "But in reality, it was devised by a single corporation to funnel state income taxes to benefit their company. Put simply, Prop 30 is a Trojan horse that puts corporate welfare above the fiscal welfare of our entire state."

It bolsters the opposition campaign's contention that Lyft wants the new money for climate change programs because it would subsidize a state mandate that it and other ride companies convert their fleets to zero emission vehicles.

Newsom's opposition is just one of the strange bedfellows makeup of campaigns for and against Proposition 30. His Democratic Party has endorsed the measure, as have groups that have been Newsom allies on climate change. But the California Teachers Association joins him in opposition, improbably aligned with the state Republican Party and anti-tax groups.

This time around, therefore, one cannot say that raising taxes on the rich will be an easy sell.

Social Security Matters

Surviving Spouse Benefits Explained

Dear Rusty: Y If I file at age 63 what percentage does my wife receive if I die? Does this percentage change if I wait to file closer to my full retirement age? And what does my wife receive if I die before I file for my benefits?

Signed: Planning Ahead

Dear Planning: When you file for your own Social Security benefit will affect the survivor benefit your wife is entitled to as your widow. If you claim at age 63, her benefit as your widow will be based on your age 63 amount. If you wait longer to claim your own Social Security, your own benefit will be higher and so will your wife's entitlement as your survivor. In other words, your wife's benefit as your widow will be based on the amount you are receiving when you die, and the longer you wait to claim your own Social Security, the higher your wife's survivor entitlement will be.

Exactly how much your wife will get monthly as your widow depends also on her own age when she claims her survivor benefit. If you were to die

first, your wife can claim a reduced survivor benefit as early as age 60 but doing so will result in a benefit which is 28.5% lower than it would be if she waits until her own full retirement age (67) to claim. Survivor benefits do not reach maximum until the survivor reaches full retirement age (FRA) and, if claimed before that, the benefit will be reduced by 4.75% for each full year early, to a maximum reduction of 28.5%. So, although your wife's base survivor benefit will be the actual (100%) amount you were receiving when you die, her monthly survivor payment will be reduced if she claims the survivor benefit before her FRA. It is an actuarial reduction of .396% less survivor benefit for each month prior to FRA the survivor benefit is claimed.

If you wait to file for your own benefit but die before you actually start collecting your benefits, your wife's entitlement as your widow will be based upon the amount you were entitled to when you died, even though you had not yet claimed. Your wife can also delay claiming her survivor benefit until she reaches her FRA to maximize her benefit as your widow. But there is more to consider.

If your wife is working full time, it is often not prudent (and may not be possible) to collect Social Security benefits before reaching full retirement age.

That's because of Social Security's earnings test, which limits how much can be earned while collecting SS benefits before FRA. The earnings limit for 2022 is \$19,560 (changes yearly) and if that is exceeded SS will take away benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 over the limit. If the limit is significantly exceeded your wife could be temporarily ineligible to get benefits, until her earnings are less, or until she reaches her full retirement age (the earnings limit no longer applies when FRA is reached).

Finally, it's important to note that all Social Security rules are gender-neutral, meaning that the rules apply equally to both spouses. But in any case, a surviving spouse can only get one benefit – either their own or their survivor benefit, whichever is highest.

ASK THE DMV



The California DMV offers specialized options for seniors over 70 years old

The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) wants to help you maintain your driving independence for as long as you can drive safely. The DMV offers resources to help you take care of your DMV tasks from the comfort of your home or at your local field office. California drivers, aged 70 years or older, have until the end of 2022 to take advantage of a temporary rule that offers driver's license or identification (ID) card renewal online or by mail, even if a renewal notice states that the driver is required to visit a DMV field office. If you still need to apply for your REAL ID for the first time you will still need to visit a DMV field office to complete the application process. You can shorten your in-person visit at the DMV by starting the REAL ID application online and uploading the required documents before making an appointment at a field office.

Q: Are there other alternatives for DMV services besides online or in-person?

A: The DMV continues to develop innovative approaches to streamline processes and limit the time customers spend in field offices by offering many services online that used to require an office visit. In many instances, the customer starts the process online and then is contacted later by a DMV representative through email to complete the transaction. The DMV also increased the number of items that can be taken care of at a kiosk as well as increased kiosk language options.

Q: I am 70 years old and need to renew my license, but do not feel safe coming to a DMV office. What can I do?

A: Until the end of 2022, eligible senior drivers and REAL ID cardholders can renew noncommercial driver's license and ID cards at dmv.ca.gov/online or by mail, even if your renewal notice states a visit to a DMV office is required.

Q: Once I receive my renewal notice in the mail, how long should I wait to renew my driver's license or ID card?

A: If you choose to take advantage of the DMV's online services to renew, you should try to do so upon receiving your renewal notice in the mail. Keep in mind that driver's licenses and ID cards generally arrive in the mail within two to four weeks following renewal.

Hornets Roll Past Colorado State, 41-10

FORT COLLINS, CO (MPG)

Sacramento State set a school record for points against an FBS team and amassed nearly 400 yards of offense in a 41-10 win over Colorado State on Saturday at Canvas Stadium. The win improved the No. 6 ranked Hornets to 3-0 on the season for the first time since 1992 and gave the team its first win over an FBS team since defeating Colorado in 2012. The Hornets have still yet to trail in a game this season and have now won 11 consecutive regular season games dating back to last season. The 31-point margin of victory was the largest by an FCS school

over an FBS opponent since Western Illinois beat Coastal Carolina 52-10 in 2017. CSU fell to 0-4. Sacramento State quickly moved down the field on its first drive of the game, covering 74 yards on eight plays. Jake Dunningway competed 4-of-5 passes during the series, including a 32-yard pass to Parker Clayton down the left sideline. Asher O'Hara did the rest with a 6-yard rush around the right end for his fifth rushing touchdown of the year. Colorado State threatened late in the first quarter after a 56-yard pass to Troy Horton took the ball inside the Hornet 10. After the quarter ended, the Sacramento State defense kept the Rams out of the

end zone and the team was forced to settle for a 24-yard field goal from Michael Boyle. Sacramento State responded with an 11-play, 75-yard drive to go ahead 14-3. The team capitalized on two defensive penalties on third-down plays to keep the drive alive and capped the series with a 5-yard touchdown pass to Pierre Williams. On the play, the ball was deflected by a Ram defender near the front of the zone and sailed to the backline where Williams won the jump ball for his first TD of the year. The Hornets extended their lead moments later. Marte Mapu recorded a third-down sack to force a punt which was returned 44-yards by Marcus

Mulcher all the way to the CSU 16. Two plays later, O'Hara dumped the ball off the Fulcher who plowed his way up the sideline for the score. The final five minutes of the first half saw a flurry of action. Sacramento State was knocking on the door of another touchdown when Jake Dunningway was intercepted by Jack Howell at the CSU 11. The Rams turned the turnover into seven points with a 52-yard catch and run from Brayden Fowler-Nicolosi to Horton with 1:17 remaining. That drive was kept alive by a 4th-and-3 conversion near midfield. Sacramento State stormed right back with an 8-play drive of its own which ended with a

45-yard field goal from Kyle Sentkowski to give the team at 24-10 lead at halftime. The Hornet defense made the first big play of the second half, stopping Colorado State on 4th-and-1 from their own 32. Eight plays later, O'Hara soared over the line on 3rd-and-goal from the 1 to push the advantage to 31-10 with just under five minutes to play in the third quarter. Sacramento State put a ribbon on the victory with a 47-yard field goal from Kyle Sentkowski 10 seconds into the fourth quarter and then a 16-play drive which ended on a 1-yard touchdown run from Cameron Skattebo which took 10:50 off the clock. The Hornets outgained

CSU, 395-253 and held a nearly eight-minute advantage in time of possession (33:58-26:02). O'Hara was a perfect 10-for-10 for 71 yards and touchdown passing while Dunningway tallied 164 yards and a score on 12-of-23. Jared Gipson led the team with five receptions (50 yards) while Skattebo had a team-high 56 receiving yards to go along with his 67 rushing yards. Defensively, Armon Bailey led Sacramento State with eight tackles while Marte Mapu contributed seven with a sack. Brandon Knott added the other sack for the Hornets. Sacramento will start Big Sky Conference play next Saturday, Oct. 1, at Cal Poly. ★
