Midas Visitor a Knockout for Kids

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Teenage boxing champion Lorenzo Powell dispensed school supplies and advice to dozens of Carmichael kids during a backpack giveaway last weekend. Sponsored by the Midas auto shop, the event was geared to help families with back-to-school expenses.

In July, Powell (19) became the top amateur in his division by winning the USA National Championship in Wichita, Kansas. A week later, he took the Golden Gloves State Championship in Fresno. Bouts in Tulsa, Oklahoma next week will decide his fortune in the Golden Gloves National Championship.

Taking a break from training, the local celebrity was a knockout at Midas.

"I'm honored to help kids like this," Powell said. "I never say no to an opportunity to give back."

The youngest of nine children in his South Sacramento family, Powell took up boxing at 11. Coached by former fighter Marty Chima, he maintained a 3.9 grade point average while training to win his "Desert Showdown" belt in Indio, California in 2016.

"Even when he was out of town for three weeks, Lorenzo stayed on top of his studies," Chima recalled. "He's disciplined. One night, after he won a quarter-final fight, he rushed back to the hotel and finished a

school assignment. It had a 12-midnight deadline and he turned it in at 11:59 p.m. - and scored an A."

Among Powell's proudest trophies is a medal that attests to his integrity. The athlete shared his story with young supporters in Carmichael. While jogging in Sacramento last year, he found an abandoned satchel, inside was \$3000 and the owner's ID. He returned the cash (the proceeds of a fundraiser) to the 93-year-old owner and was offered a \$50 reward.

"At the time I was fundraising for my own expenses," he said. "I was selling tee shirts for \$25 each. I gave the lady two of them. That way, we were even. I didn't want a reward for

Oriental Fruit Flies Detected in Sacramento County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Agricultural Commissioner, in cooperation with the California Department of Food and Agriculture and the United States Department of Agriculture, have initiated an extensive survey and eradication plan in response to the detection of four male oriental fruit flies (OFF), *Bactrocera dorsalis*, in the Wilton area of Sacramento County.

The initial detection was confirmed on July 19, 2022. The detections were made as part of our coordinated pest prevention system that protects our agriculture and natural resources from invasive species with early detection a key component to successfully eradicating an infestation before it can become established.

The extensive survey, also known as a delimitation survey, consists of multiple oriental fruit fly traps placed in concentric circles going out 4.5 miles in each direction from the oriental fruit fly detection sites. Additional OFF detections may trigger a quarantine.

Following the principles of Integrated Pest Management (IPM), agricultural officials use "male attractant" technique as the mainstay of the eradication effort for this invasive species. This approach has successfully eliminated dozens of fruit fly infestations in California. Trained workers squirt a small patch of fruit fly attractant mixed with a very small dose of an organic pesticide, Spinosad, approximately 8-10 feet off the ground on street trees and similar surfaces; male fruit flies are attracted to the mixture and perish after consuming it. The male attractant treatment program is being carried out over an area that extends 1.5 miles from each site where the oriental fruit flies were trapped.

While fruit flies and other invasive species that threaten California's crops and natural environment are sometimes detected in agricultural areas, the vast majority are found in urban and suburban communities. The most common pathway for these pests to enter the state is by "hitchhiking" in fruits and vegetables brought back illegally by travelers as they return from infested regions of the world or from packages of home grown produce sent to California. Hometown Rockers at Milagro

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - An August 20 concert at Milagro Centre will feature a band with unbroken Carmichael ties.

Drummer and Wasted Space co-founder Johnnie Barnes represents the third generation of his family to call Carmichael home. His mom Barbara was among local children who made adobe bricks during Carmichael Presbyterian Church construction. She later married his dad in the chapel she helped build. "It's a little history that gives me an extra connection to my hometown," says Barnes.

Young Johnnie discovered a talent for percussion while at San Juan District's Albert Schweitzer Elementary and continued drumming while at Del Campo High. Years later, he met singer Michelle Holman as each both picked up kids from Schweitzer Elementary. The single

parents had music in common and before long, they were married and gigging together. The Barnes now have two grandchildren at Schweitzer.

"It's special for a family to have had three generations at the same school," considers Barnes.

Michelle and I live around the corner from the home my parents built in the 1960s. I've never left Carmichael. I feel really grounded here."

Wasted Space began in 1994. Working as an automotive technician in Orangevale, Barnes heard

guitar playing from a paint store next door. "I went to look, and I found Mike Roser," he recalls. "I said: 'hey, I'm a drummer - we should get together.'

"We got a group going and one day were practicing in the back of Mike's

Lawmakers Get Busy

State lawmakers have reconvened in Sacramento after a month-long summer recess – during which some traveled abroad on trips funded by special interest groups that lobby them on various issues – for the final, frenzied month of the legislative session.

Legislators face an Aug. 31 deadline to determine the fate of hundreds of bills. Hanging over the high-intensity process is the Nov. 8 general election, which could affect how some lawmakers – especially those vying for contested seats in the state Assembly and Senate vote on hot-button proposals.

In a preview of the difficult decisions facing lawmakers, hundreds of fast food workers were set to rally at the state Capitol Sunday night in support of a bill that would permit the state to negotiate wages, hours and work conditions for an industry that employs an estimated 700,000 people. A similar measure failed to pass last year.

The proposal, backed by labor unions and opposed by business and restaurant groups, has divided Democrats, some of whom are wary of broadly extending liability for labor violations from fast food franchise owners to the corporate chains they work with.

But that’s just one of the many controversial bills before lawmakers, some of which face votes as soon as today. Here’s a look at some of the key

bills, broken down by subject area:

- **Abortion.** With California voters deciding in November whether to enshrine the right to abortion and contraception in the state constitution, lawmakers are considering more than a dozen bills to increase access and strengthen protections. Perhaps the most contentious proposal is Oakland Democratic Assemblymember Buffy Wicks’ to prevent women from being held civilly or criminally liable for their pregnancy outcomes. Opponents have argued the bill would legalize infanticide, which Wicks says is categorically false.

- **Guns.** Following the U.S. Supreme Court’s recent ruling dramatically expanding gun rights, Democratic lawmakers countered with a bill they said would comply with the opinion while also making California’s concealed carry law more restrictive. If passed, it’s all but certain to be hit with legal challenges from gun rights groups.

- **COVID.** Legislators still have to determine the fate of some of the most contentious bills introduced by Democrats’ vaccine working group, including proposals to allow kids 15 and older to get vaccinated without parental consent

and another to categorize doctors’ “dissemination of misinformation” related to COVID-19 as unprofessional conduct.

- **Housing and homelessness.** Gov. Gavin Newsom’s contentious proposal to force severely mentally ill Californians into treatment and housing is facing critical votes, as is a bill that aims to increase affordable housing construction but has divided influential labor groups.

- **Nursing homes.** Lawmakers will consider a bill to reform California’s nursing home licensing system, whose sponsors say it was watered down

so severely they can no longer support it. After a CalMatters investigation last year, legislators warned that “people are dying as we wait.”

- **Labor and workplace.** Legislators have quite a few high-profile labor bills on their hands, including one to allow their own staffers to unionize and another to force companies to publicly disclose more data about pay gaps. They will also decide, after two Newsom vetoes last year, whether to allow farmworkers to vote by mail in union elections and to increase payments from the state’s paid family leave program so more low-wage

workers can take time off to care for a newborn child or sick family member.

- **Criminal justice.** Amid an ongoing debate over criminal justice reform, legislators will consider a proposal to block prisons, jails and private immigration detention centers from holding people in solitary confinement for more than 15 consecutive days. They’ll also decide whether to limit prosecutors’ ability to seek either the death penalty or life without parole for accomplices in certain felony murders who neither killed nor intended to kill.

- **Environment.** Not long after Newsom signed a law requiring all single-use packaging and foodware to be recyclable, reusable, refillable or compostable by 2030, lawmakers will determine whether to force online retailers to reduce the use of single-use plastics such as bubble wrap and styrofoam peanuts.

- **Internet and tech.** The Capitol is bracing for a showdown over a pair of bills – both of which are facing intense pushback from the tech industry – to significantly expand kids’ privacy rights online and to allow public prosecutors to hold social media companies civilly liable for intentionally addicting youth. Lawmakers will also decide whether to slap regulations on the cryptocurrency industry. The votes come as some legislators are set to gather with tech lobbyists later this week at a Napa Valley resort for a two-day event billed by organizers as the Technology Policy Summit. ★

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Carmichael's famous son Todd Morgan scored a record crowd of more than 2000 fans for his park performance last weekend.

The concert continued a summer series that has brought music to Carmichael Park's sound shell since June. Morgan and his Emblems trio showcased retro rock and original material. Aged 31, the musician has been working professionally since his teens.

"His first song was Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star," recalls his manager/mom, Barbara Morgan. "Todd knew all the lyrics to Rod Stewart's 'Hot Legs' when he was three."

His parents brought him a little keyboard and he wrote songs for his first album at ten. From childhood debuts, Carmichael community has supported Morgan. Girls screamed when he danced at Garfield Elementary talent shows. Applause continued when he added boogie-woogie piano to his act at Winston Churchill Middle School.

Morgan was known at Rio Americano High as the kid who played piano. No one knew he could sing until he wailed "St James Infirmary" at a Carmichael Kiwanis Jazz Festival; then a multi-talent was acclaimed. At barely 15, he was a California State Fair headliner.

Though 50s and 60s hits remain gig staples, Morgan's biggest kick comes when fans request his original tunes. "I'm honored if they put my music in the same class as some of their favorites songs," he says. "I love it when older people say my songs sound like 'real music' to them."

"Carmichael - and the people who supported me early in my career - are always going to be important. My aim is to make people happy. To me, that's a respectable goal."

All community concerts are free and dancing is encouraged. Carmichael Park is located at 5750 Grant Avenue. La Sierra Center is at 5325 Engle Road. Gibbons Park is at 4701 Gibbons Drive. ★

Evaluation of Safe Stay Sites in Sacramento County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Homelessness is the top issue I hear about from residents, property owners, and business owners. It is a crisis that demands bold action.

The County of Sacramento, as well as my colleagues on the Board of Supervisors and I, have been working hard on solutions for more housing and increased mental health and substance abuse services. The County has a variety of housing from shelters, scattered site housing, transitional housing, and permanent supportive housing in all five Supervisorial Districts. The County has also significantly increased the number of treatment beds for addiction and mental illness. However, we desperately need to do more.

The County is continuing to explore shelter locations in unincorporated communities to help get the homeless connected with services and housing while providing relief to residents and businesses from the negative impacts of encampments in public places. I am firmly convinced that the best path to alleviate our homelessness crisis, especially in light of changes to state law and federal court decisions, is to create more alternatives to offer the homeless while prohibiting places they can camp and holding those who violate the law accountable for their actions.

Last year, the Board of Supervisors directed the

Department of General Services to evaluate all County property that had the physical potential to serve as a community shelter site. My office and County staff are still evaluating several parcels in the Third District, including two properties in Carmichael that could accommodate one small "Safe Stay" community for 25-30 people.

Contrary to statements being made by some community members, nothing has been proposed for a decision by the County or the Board of Supervisors, and nothing will be proposed or considered until there is extensive community engagement. Also contrary to misleading statements being made, two properties are being evaluated in Carmichael, but only one shelter site, if any, will ultimately be proposed in the community.

There has been a lot of discussion on social media about work currently occurring behind the Carmichael Library. This has nothing to do with any homelessness project. The Carmichael Water District is using the County-owned property behind the library for staging and storage as part of the La Vista Storage Tank Project.

The original La Vista Tank and Booster Pump was built in 1971 and was identified in the District's Master Plan for upgrading and replacement. This project, which has been planned since 2020, consists of constructing a new 3,000,000-gallon storage tank and booster pump station, new water line piping, and electrical conduits. The project is estimated to be completed in 2023. The Carmichael Water District has specific information about the project on its website at <http://carmichaelwd.org>.

I would like to briefly describe my plans for community engagement before a Safe Stay site is proposed in Carmichael. My office has already

hosted a meeting with community and law enforcement stakeholders who actively work on homelessness issues with the County. These stakeholders include Carmichael business organizations and homeless service providers, Carmichael Library representatives, Sheriff's officials, and the Community Prosecutor assigned to Carmichael.

The purpose of this initial, small meeting was to hear directly from these stakeholders about the County's approach to homelessness, which site might be best to continue exploring for a shelter and discuss suggestions for larger community engagement. My next level of community engagement will be direct, one-on-one meetings with residents and businesses adjacent to the preferable site to hear their concerns and ways to mitigate them if we decide to proceed with a proposal. I will then host multiple community meetings to give everyone in Carmichael a chance to make their voices heard.

As many of you know, the Board recently approved two Safe Stay shelter sites in the south part of the County to serve the homeless in nearby communities. The Safe Stay sites are designed to maximize the ability to get people off the streets and open spaces and into a safe and sanitary location that provides access to services and housing.

County staff and Supervisor Kennedy hosted several community meetings before either of these sites came to the Board of Supervisors for approval. These meetings gave the community the opportunity to express concerns and influence the design, structure, and operation of the Safe Stay sites. If the County decides to move forward with a proposal for a site in Carmichael, the level of community engagement and influence will be the same. ★

Oriental Fruit Flies Detected in Sacramento County

protect California's agricultural and natural resources; please Don't Pack a Pest when traveling or mailing packages.

"Invasive non-native fruit flies are serious pests for California's agricultural industry and backyard gardens," said Sacramento County Agricultural Commissioner Chris Flores. "These recent detections on the heels of a recent oriental fruit fly detection in the community of Rancho Murrieta reminds us that we need to remain vigilant in protecting our agricultural and natural resources. When traveling abroad or mailing packages to California, we urge the public not to bring back or ship fruits and vegetables as they are pathways for oriental fruit flies and other invasive species entering our state."

The oriental fruit fly is known to target over 230 different fruit, vegetable, and plant commodities. Important California crops at risk include pome, stone fruits, citrus, dates, avocados, peppers, and tomatoes. Damage occurs when the female fruit fly lays her

eggs inside the fruit. The eggs hatch into maggots, which tunnel through the flesh of the fruit, making it unfit for consumption.

The oriental fruit fly is widespread throughout much of the mainland of southern Asia and neighboring islands, including Sri Lanka and Taiwan, and has invaded other areas, most notably Africa and Hawaii.

Federal, state, and county agricultural officials work year-round, 365 days a year, to prevent, deter, detect, and eliminate the threat of invasive species and diseases that can damage or destroy our agricultural products and natural environment. The efforts are aimed at keeping California's natural environment and food supply plentiful, safe and pest-free.

Correctional Officer Pleads Guilty to Civil Rights Violations for Assaults on Inmates and Cover Up

U.S. Attorney's Office, Eastern District of California

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Arturo Pacheco, 40, of Elk Grove, pleaded guilty on July 25, 2022, to criminal civil rights violations for the on duty assault of two inmates entrusted to his care and to submitting false reports about those incidents in an attempt to cover them up, U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

According to court documents, Pacheco was a correctional officer at California State Prison, Sacramento (CSP-Sacramento). On September 15, 2016, while escorting an inmate, Pacheco grabbed the legs of the inmate, pulling the legs out from under him. The inmate, whose hands were handcuffed behind his back, fell forward onto the concrete floor, breaking his jaw, several teeth, and suffering other injuries. That inmate was transported to UC Davis Medical Center where he received treatment for his injuries. Approximately two days later, the inmate suffered a pulmonary embolism and died. While the inmate was receiving treatment, Pacheco, a sergeant, and other correctional officers began falsifying reports to cover up the incident.

Following the death of the inmate, investigators uncovered a second incident involving Pacheco. In that incident, on May 19, 2016, Pacheco had, unprovoked, discharged a canister of pepper spray at short range

into the eyes of an inmate who was inside of a prison cell. Pacheco falsified his report in that case to make it appear as though his actions were justified in order to save the life of the inmate. In reality, the inmate was fully complying with commands, and any use of force at that time was unlawful.

As outlined in the factual basis to his plea agreement, Pacheco sent text messages to a friend after the May 2016 incident, commenting how "funny" the incident was and "[i]t's all about how u write ur report," "plus ur partners have ur back," "As Pacheco said, "[b]lood, broken glass, n just u n ur partners. ... Green light!"

"Pacheco deprived inmates of their civil rights, abusing his position of authority as a correctional officer to harm them," said U.S. Attorney Talbert. "While Pacheco thought a 'green wall' or code of silence would protect him, he was wrong. His crimes have come to light and now he has admitted to his assaults and cover up. Those who violate the public's trust by harming inmates 'under the color of law' or by covering up wrongdoing must and will be held accountable."

"The FBI is deeply committed to protecting the rights of all Americans, and those rights do not stop behind the walls of our prisons," said Acting Special Agent in Charge Dennis Guertin. "Today's guilty plea is the result of an intensive investigation conducted by the FBI and our

partners at the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation and the United States Attorney's Office. Corruption and civil rights violations within our prisons are some of the most difficult to detect and investigate, and we encourage anyone who has knowledge of similar crimes to reach out to any FBI field office or submit information to tips.fbi.gov."

This case is the product of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation with the cooperation of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Office of Internal Affairs. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Michael D. Anderson and Rosanne L. Rust are prosecuting the case.

Pacheco remains out of custody pending sentencing. Fellow former California State Prison, Sacramento correctional officer, Ashley M. Aurich, charged separately, is pending sentencing as well.

Pacheco is scheduled to be sentenced by U.S. District Judge William B. Shubb on October 17, 2022. Pacheco faces a maximum statutory penalty of 20 years in prison on each of the false reporting counts and 10 years in prison on each of the assault counts and a \$250,000 fine per count. The actual sentence, however, will be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables. ★

Arrest Made in Homicide Attempt at Alta Arden and Glendale Lane

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Bureau arrested Chad Jones (36) of Sacramento County for the attempted murder (shooting) of an adult male subject on July 28, 2022, near Glendale Lane and Alta Arden. Major Crimes Detectives tracked Jones to the City of Sacramento and took him into custody at approximately 5 AM. The Sheriff's Office thanks the Sacramento Police Department's SWAT for

their assistance in apprehending Mr. Jones. Jones is well known to local law enforcement and was on Formal Searchable Probation (Until 2024) stemming from felony cases dating back to 2019; he was prohibited from possessing firearms.

Jones was booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail on a single count of attempted murder and is being held without bail. He will be in court (Department 62) on Tuesday August 2, 2022, at 3pm. No suspects are outstanding in this case. No further information is available at this time.

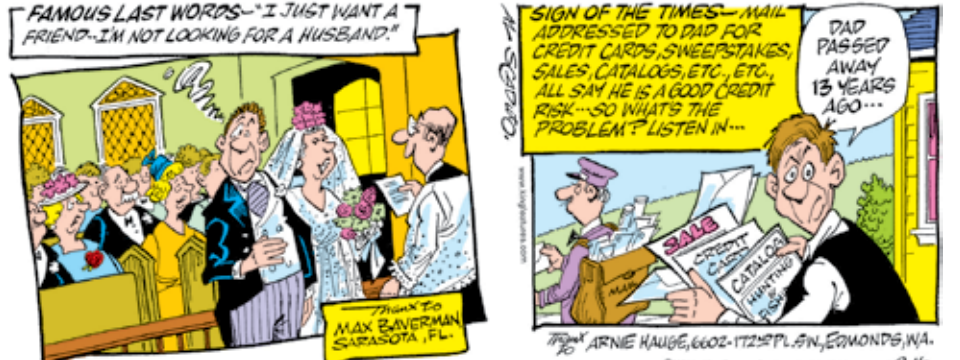

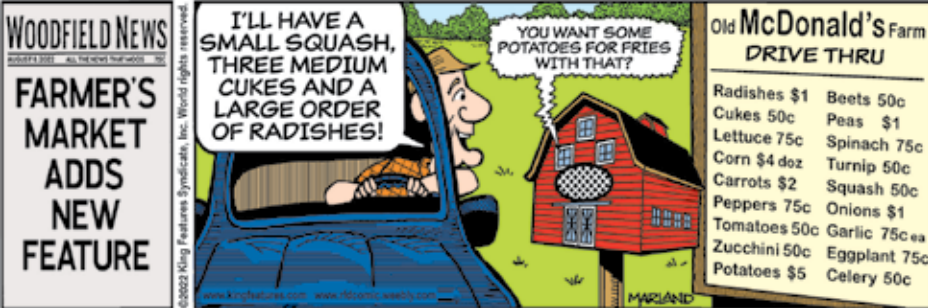

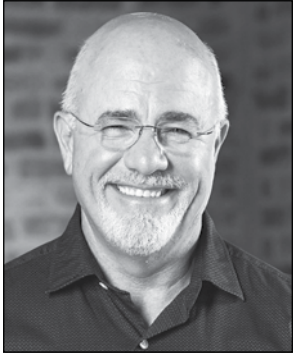

Proverbs 22:7 says the borrower is slave to the lender. Now, the Bible doesn't say debt is a sin, but it definitely discourages debt, and it teaches us to live our lives differently than the rest of the world. That's the case when it comes to handling money, too.

If you do this, you'd be turning your dad into your creditor in a very real sense. That's going to make family dinners taste different, because you'll be eating with your lender instead of just good old dad. Money has a way of changing the family dynamic, and it's almost never for the good. Suddenly, you're getting raised eyebrows if you buy something for yourself, because even the nicest, most generous folks have opinions.

If it were me, I'd say thanks, but no thanks. There's no way I'd be in financial debt to my dad.

Now, if he were to offer to make paying off

your debt a gift – one that was given with no strings attached to help you two get into the mission field quicker – I'd be okay with that and I'd be deeply grateful and honored.

But I would never tell you to go into debt to a parent. Your dad is probably thinking it's better for you to be in debt to him rather than some uncaring bank or credit card company. But I just wouldn't want to do anything that might jeopardize your relationship.
