They Just Didn't Listen

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Urgent protests of residents, businesspeople and activists fell on deaf ears last week, as Sacramento City Council gave the go ahead to establish a 24-7 homeless sanctuary near the corner of Watt Avenue and Auburn Boulevard.

The center will occupy what looks like a finger on the Sacramento city land map, surrounded by the unincorporated County, just yards from a long-established shelter for vulnerable children. The Children's Receiving Home of Sacramento is located immediately adjacent to a

shuttered campus once occupied by a City-run science museum. The repurposed facility will soon house up to 50 homeless men and women.

More than 100 people protested the new shelter location. Less than a day later, Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg and his council voted unanimously in its favor.

"This decision is gut-wrenching," said District 6 Assembly candidate Cathy Cook. "If any child from the Receiving Home gets harmed by this decision, the City Council will have blood on its hands."

Cook was among community leaders who grabbed signs and joined the protest.

In a speech to protesters, Cook

questioned Steinberg's objectives in placing a homeless facility so close to a children's safe haven. The location, she suggested, exposes kids to "the exact traumas they are trying to overcome."

District 3 County Supervisor Rich Desmond voiced objections in a letter to the City Council.

"The negative impacts," said Desmond, "will not occur within the city's geographical boundaries. In fact, County law enforcement and municipal services will end up shouldering this burden."

Desmond underscored the unfairness of causing unincorporated county residents and businesses bear

New 988 Number for Mental Health Emergencies

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - If you or someone you know is experiencing a mental health crisis, help can be reached 24 hours a day, 7 days a week simply by dialing or texting 988.

Within the United States, that number connects directly to trained mental health professionals at the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline. The program, which began July 16, is modeled after the 911 emergency system. It's meant to be a memorable and quick number that connects people who are suicidal or in any other mental health crisis to a trained mental health professional.

The trained crisis counselors can help people experiencing mental health-related distress such as: thoughts of suicide, mental health or substance use crisis, any other kind of emotional distress.

People can call or text 988 or chat 988lifeline.org for themselves or if they are worried about someone they know who may need crisis support.

Veterans can use the number to reach the Veterans Crisis Line by dialing 988 and then pressing 1. Spanish speaking counselors can be reached by pressing 2 after dialing 988.

UC Davis clinical neuropsychologist Angela Drake plans to encourage patients to use 988 in an emergency situation and as part of a broader self-care plan.

"There is a tremendous unmet need for mental health services in the United States, which has been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. We know that a significant number of people are experiencing mental health issues but lack access to treatment," Drake said. "The new 988 system is a first step toward addressing some of those unmet needs and provides an important safety net for people who are experiencing a mental health crisis."

Calling 988 serves as a universal entry point so that no matter where people live in the United States, they can reach a trained crisis counselor who can help.

The new 988 dialing code is operated through the existing National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. The national network of more than 200 crisis centers helps thousands of people overcome crisis situations every day. These centers are supported by local and state sources

- MealPro LLC, a Citrus Heights-based food preparation and delivery service for ready-made meal plans, has announced a partnership with a rising United States Tennis Association (USTA) men's tennis star, Jenson Brooksby, of Carmichael.

Brooksby is the first athlete brand ambassador for MealPro LLC, according to Andy Sartori, founder of MealPro.

Brooksby, 21, who goes by "JT," is the son of Glen and Tania Brooksby. The young, Sacramento-based, tennis star recently stopped by MealPro headquarters in Citrus Heights at 7433 Greenback Lane, Suite A, and took time to play a round of tennis with Sartori.

While he's home training, MealPro will deliver to him a custom weekly meal package especially tailored to the high nutritional needs of

a competitive professional tennis player. He will also collaborate with MealPro on the creation of his own line of meals for other tennis players like himself.

Brooksby was a top-ranked collegiate tennis recruit of Baylor University in 2019. He sat out his freshman year of college competition in spring 2020 and decided to have a "redshirt year." The term "redshirting" means a student-athletes can practice with the team and gain experience, but usually do not travel for road matches, saving a year of eligibility which may be needed later in their career as an upperclassman.

The current 21-year-old elected to forgo his remaining college eligibility following the COVID-19 shortened season that he redshirted, to turn professional on the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) tour in 2020. The Carmichael native gained his first professional experience in August 2019

when he qualified for the main draw of the US Open.

The ATP Tour is a worldwide top-tier tennis tour for men organized by the ATP. Men's Grand Slam tournaments include the Australian, French and US Open championships and Wimbledon. He recently completed his first full calendar year as a professional tennis player and ranked as high as No. 33 in the world, ascending from outside the world's Top 300 to the fringe of the Top 50.

At the age of 20, Brooksby became the youngest American to reach the US Open Tennis Championships' fourth round since Andy Roddick did so in 2012. He battled through three tough matches and in the Round of 16, took the opening set from, at the time, World No. 1 Novak Djokovic 6-1 before the Serbian rallied behind unrelenting physical play.

"We believe (Brooksby) is the perfect partner to represent our brand and

inspire future generations of athletes," Sartori said. "It's an ideal pairing, and we're excited for what the future holds."

According to Brooksby, this is a mutually beneficial relationship between himself and MealPro.

"MealPro's commitment to creating high quality, nutritious and delicious meals is key to my fitness and training," Brooksby said in a news release. "MealPro offers a range of meal plan options that support the varied nutritional goals of athletes at all levels, and I am delighted to expand our partnership with MealPro to share those options across the tennis community."

MealPro is a vertically integrated meal delivery service. It delivers fully cooked meals directly to its customers' doors in all 50 states from its headquarters in Citrus Heights. The founders of MealPro started the company in 2018 and recently achieved a long-term goal, buying the space it was leasing in Citrus Heights.

Its' online meal selections use organic, gluten and dairy-free ingredients in multiple categories for all diet types, including keto, paleo, custom and a la carte.

Construction of a new customer service call center will be finished soon, Sartori said. A new walk-in reception area offers touch pad ordering, serving local customers who prefer to place and pick up their meal orders in person. One-on-one consultation with a MealPro nutritionist, who can design a personal meal plan, is also available.

Pie Lady Moves to Milagro

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Declared top desert-maker by 2022 Best of Carmichael voters, Diana (Pie Lady) Shockley is crowning this success in a new location.

Her I Love Pie kitchen now fills an aromatic corner of the Milagro Centre, Carmichael. The move from Marconi Avenue premises coincides with a new partnership for the businesswoman.

Her former head pastry chef, Tierney Scalia now holds a stake in the brand. “We bounce ideas off each other,” approves Shockley. “It’s great to work with someone who cares as much about the business and its growth as I do. We cover for each other if we need time for family. Our strengths complement each other. When you combine Tierney’s creativity with my business background, it’s a recipe for success.”

“We enjoy the open dining concept at Milagro. We love seeing our staff enjoying the location, too.”

The partners now lead a team that rises with the reliability of baking powder, dons frilly aprons and crams delectably filled pies into ovens. Business is brisk: thousands of pies after a 2019 launch, opening day at Milagro saw dozens of fragrant desserts boxed and transported to home tables. “It was a strong start,” considers the boss. “With the new location, we’re finding new customers to add to our frequent flyers.”

Raised in Corcoran (central Calif.), Pie Lady started out as pie girl. At

her mom’s elbow, she observed baking from scratch.” Mom always let me have some dough so I could make tiny cookies in my Easy-Bake oven,” she recalls.

“I learned from mom (and later, at a Sacramento culinary school) not to take shortcuts. Baking is an art. I form each pie carefully. I use natural ingredients; no added sugars or preservatives. I sometimes talk to my pies. I tell them how pretty they are and how good they smell. I’m not crazy, I just love them.”

The petite dynamo honed business skills as project manager for Sutter Health in Sacramento. At weekends, she baked pies for farmers markets. “In my office job, I learned to be organized in managing timelines,” she

explains. “Eventually I quit to focus on growing my pie business. Knowing the importance of due diligence helps with anything I plan.”

Shockley serves up twists on traditional. Her strawberry lemon basil pie was inspired by jam recipes. “Certain fruits go well with certain herbs,” she says. “Basil adds a crispness to berry flavors.”

Best-sellers include her salted-caramel Dutch apple pie, key lime with butter crust and the ever-pleasing banana cream. Shamelessly pampering sweet-toothers, she nevertheless accommodates savory taste. “As fall approaches, our quiches and pot pies will return,” she promises. “There really is a pie for everyone.” For the Shockley family, chocolate cream is hard to beat.

Home support is critical: husband Justin runs the roost and co-manages the kids. Daughter Katelyn (14) is another helpmate. “I was brainstorming for a business name,” recalls mom. “Katelyn warned me not to get complicated. She came up with ‘I Love Pie’.

So simple – and it explains everything. She’s my little genius.” In her second year of brand building, the entrepreneur found herself with another bun in the oven. “There’s never a perfect time to have a baby,” she considers. “But little Gwendolyn (1) was very much wanted. I worked until the day before she was delivered. Thankfully, I had no aversions to cooking smells and I was used to being on my feet all day.”

A toddler, a teenager

and a growing company make for long workdays.

“I manage the business side from home,” she says. “I don’t get tired. Each element of the job is fun. My husband usually cooks dinner. He encourages me to put my feet up. We share child care. There’s always one parent – or another adult relative – with the baby.”

Daughters and dad joined celebrations for mom’s Milagro opening. “We’re all excited,” says the boss. “With this move, we look forward to adding new customers to our pie family and getting to know Milagro neighbors. Business is an adventure. There’s a silver lining in every challenge.”

“My silver lining is in a pie tin.”

I Love Pie is located at the Milagro Centre, 6241 Fair Oaks Boulevard, Carmichael. Their hours are 11 a.m.-5 p.m. Wednesday-Sunday; closed Monday & Tuesday. ★

Seniors Missing Out

Some 23 million Californians' bank accounts will get a boost of \$200 to \$1,050, thanks to a new round of payments approved by state lawmakers.

But the payments, aimed at mitigating higher prices for gas and other goods, will leave out lots of low-income Californians. Among those passed over are some seniors, many living on disability benefits, and some of the lowest-income adults.

That's because the direct deposits and debit cards – expected to begin arriving in late October and conclude in January 2023 – will be sent out based on tax returns.


About 3 million Californians are in families that earn little enough that they aren't required to file taxes, according to research by Public Policy Institute of California for its 2019 California Poverty Measure. The poverty rate among people who live in families that don't need to file taxes is 60%, the institute estimates. Neither the state Department of Finance nor the Franchise Tax Board, which is responsible for collecting state personal income tax in California, knew exactly how many Californians will be left out of the rebate.

The Legislature wanted to create a program to send payments to people who don't file taxes and aren't enrolled in safety net programs that received a boost in the budget. But after negotiations with the Newsom administration, that proposal didn't make it into the final budget.

H.D. Palmer, spokesperson for the Department of Finance, said that he couldn't offer specifics on why the proposal didn't make it into the final budget, but that proposals from both sides didn't make it into the compromise.

Representatives for Senate President Pro Tem Toni Atkins and Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon said nobody could figure out how to administer such payments.

"Ultimately, the configuration of the rebate was subject to three-party negotiations

as part of the final budget, and there were concerns that there wasn't an efficient and secure way of accomplishing a grant program to non-tax filers," said a statement from the office of Atkins, a San Diego Democrat.

The Legislature "really wanted to get help to these people, but ... we were not able to do it logistically," said a spokesperson for Rendon, a South Gate Democrat.

The payments will go out to Californians who filed 2020 tax returns by October 2021, according to the Franchise Tax Board, which has a tool for calculating how much you are eligible to receive based on how much you earn and other factors.

But in California, people earning less than \$19,310 who don't have a child or someone else depending on them – one of many different gross income thresholds – aren't required to file income taxes. The state also doesn't count Social Security retirement or disability benefits as taxable income, meaning people who receive those benefits aren't required to pay taxes, so long as they

have minimal other income. Lawmakers tried to aid some low-earners who may not file taxes by increasing payments for people receiving CalWorks benefits, a program for needy families. They also increased benefits for people who receive Supplemental Security Income – a state-supplemented version of social security benefits for senior or disabled people who would otherwise not qualify for, or have extremely small social security payments.

The boosts for people in those two programs are good, said Trinh Phan, a senior staff attorney focused on economic security at Justice in Aging, which advocates for low-income older adults. But, she said, the budget package still leaves out some people who are very low-income.

For example, someone getting by just on Social Security Disability Insurance could miss out on this rebate and the boosts to CalWorks and Supplemental Security Income: They might earn little enough that they don't have to file taxes, but if they don't have kids they likely won't qualify for CalWorks. And, if their disability benefits pay more

than \$1060.21 per month, they wouldn't qualify for Supplemental Security Income either, said Phan.

About a quarter of Americans over 65 live in households where 90% of the family income is Social Security, according to the Social Security Administration. The average retired worker benefit in California is about \$1,500 per month, or \$18,000 per year. The average SSDI benefit is about \$1,300 per month, or \$15,600 per year.

Some low-income Californians won't receive the rebate, Department of Finance spokesperson H.D. Palmer said. But he pointed out that many people who aren't required to file taxes still choose to do so, sometimes to receive other benefits distributed through the system. In 2020, an additional 500,000 low-income tax returns were filed in California, Palmer said in a statement, "presumably to qualify for a Golden State Stimulus payment or perhaps even a federal relief payment." Palmer also pointed to other forms of financial assistance in the budget, such as \$1.4 billion in aid for people with unpaid utility bills.

People who don't pay taxes and aren't in a benefits program run by California are hard for the state to reach quickly with aid. Social security benefits are administered by the federal government, and the state doesn't have data on recipients, said Jesse Rothenstein, a professor of public policy and economics at University of California, Berkeley, and faculty director of the California Policy Lab.

"It's obviously not great that we're missing people, and many of them are some of the most vulnerable people in the economy," said Rothenstein. But, he said, "It's not as if there's a mechanism available that reaches everybody." Given a set of imperfect options, using the tax system was the best choice, Rothenstein said.

It's also the choice lawmakers made when distributing two rounds of Golden State Stimulus payments in 2021. After that move, they faced criticism from disability advocates, and seniors who were left out.

"To see that they have done it again this year is just further proof that nobody's paying attention to people who need the most help," said Charis Hill, a disability

advocate who lives in Sacramento.

California's government doesn't know much about the people who don't file taxes. The Franchise Tax Board doesn't track the number of residents who aren't required to file taxes, or what share of those people live in poverty, according to statements in response to CalMatters' questions. A spokesperson for the board said that no state agencies appear to track that information.

The difficulty of reaching people with this payment exposes a weakness in the state's system "that needs to be addressed on a longer-term basis," said Chris Hoene, executive director of the California Budget and Policy Center, which advocates for targeting aid to lower-income people. Part of the solution would be better data sharing between the federal government and the states, he said.

But, given the options policymakers were considering – including giving money to car owners, as Gov. Newsom proposed, and cutting the gas tax – he thinks the payments based on income are a good outcome. ★

Board to Provide \$1M in Grants to Area Nonprofits

Grantee Program Hearing Notification: Applicants will receive a second electronic notification of schedule for the Board of Supervisors Hearing where recommended award selections will be made.

The Board of Supervisors will make the final determination and approval for all TOT Grant Program recipients.

Budget & Debt Management will notify applicants of funding selections within 5 business days of Board Hearing approval. All notifications will be made electronically.

Budget & Debt Management will draft and administer agreements between the County and grantees.

Keep Pets Safe During Hot Weather

Sac County News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Every year, Sacramento County residents do their best to keep cool during the summer heat. Failing to keep cool in extreme temperatures can cause adverse health effects for residents – both humans and animals.

Unlike humans, cats and dogs cannot sweat to keep cool; they cool their bodies off through panting and the pads of their feet. As a pet owner, it's important to take measures to keep them cool during high temperatures.

Here are some tips for keeping your pet safe from the heat:

Never leave your pet in a parked car: Even cracking a window won't protect your pets. It is against the law in California and could be punishable by a fine or imprisonment. A car can reach 120 degrees in just minutes; even if the windows are slightly open the car can still reach 102 degrees. A dog's normal temperature is 101.5 degrees; at 120 degrees your pet can suffer from heat exhaustion and die and at 107 degrees brain damage occurs. Check out this video on how hot it gets in cars.

Avoid extreme heat: When temperatures get above the 90s, take your pet inside. For outdoor pets, be sure to provide them with plenty of fresh, cold water in a tip-proof water dish and shade for them to cool down.



Be your pet's lifeguard: While swimming can help pets get exercise without overheating, always supervise pets when swimming either in a pool or in waterways. Photo Courtesy of Annaav Dreamstime.com

Don't exercise with your pets when it is too hot: Older and certain long-haired dogs can be particularly susceptible to heat, and hot asphalt can burn their paws. Exercise in the early morning or cool evenings and make sure both of you have plenty of water.

Use sunscreen: Pets get sunburned just like people, and if your pet has light skin or fur, they can be particularly susceptible to a painful burn, and even skin cancer. Use sunscreen on sensitive areas, such as ears or nose to make sure your pets are protected.

Secure your dog during transport:

Make sure your dog is secured safely in your vehicle. Cross-tethering your dog with a rope or containing them via a kennel in the bed of your truck will help prevent the dog from falling or jumping from the vehicle. Also, please note that truck beds can get hot when exposed to the sun and that can severely burn dog footpads. Transporting animals on a public highway or public roadway without properly securing them could be punishable by a fine.

Be your pet's lifeguard: While swimming can help pets get exercise without

overheating, always supervise pets when swimming either in a pool or in waterways. Dogs can get tired swimming, particularly in rivers where they have to fight against currents. To avoid drowning, make sure they wear life jackets and keep them out of the water when flows are high.

If pets have been exposed to high temperatures...

Be alert for signs of heat stress including heavy panting, glazed eyes, a rapid pulse, unsteadiness, staggering gait, vomiting, or a deep red or purple tongue.

Immediately move your pet to the shade to gradually lower their temperature. Apply cool (not cold) water to the pet, and provide lukewarm or cool water to drink. Take your pet to a veterinary hospital immediately. It could save their life.

You're a caring young lady with a great heart, who's also making good money. There's no reason you can't do both things. Help your mom and dad

I know your mom and dad work hard. And they're obviously good people to have raised a daughter like you. But I want you to think about one thing. If you make a habit of fixing their lives without them having a hand in fixing their lives, this scenario could become a nightmare for everyone.

I'd go ahead and help them, but the only way I'd do it is if they promise to let you help them address the reasons they don't have any money — and if they agree to get financial counseling. I can tell you love your mom and dad a lot. And I'm sure they work too hard to be broke. I'm not talking about fussing at them or shaming them, I'm talking about sitting down and having a loving discussion about the issues and what they

can do to start making positive financial changes in their lives.

The fact that your folks have worked their entire lives, and can't come up with money for roof repairs on a small home, tells me something's wrong. The fact that they don't have any money is the symptom. The problem is they've made poor decisions and mishandled the dollars they earned. Even if you don't make a lot, you can still have a little cash set aside for emergencies if you manage it well.

This time next summer, federal regulations will require you to show a REAL ID driver's license or another federally approved form of identification (passport, military ID, etc.) to travel within the U.S. and to visit secure federal facilities (military bases, federal courthouses). Note that a REAL ID cannot be used for international travel, a passport is still required.

It's no secret, we're all ready to start traveling again. And with a REAL ID, you'll be ready! The REAL ID process is easier than ever with the DMV's online services. Get ahead of the summer break rush and start your simple online application today.

Q: My children are 7 and 11 years old. Will they need REAL IDs to fly to Florida next summer?

A: No. The TSA does not require anyone under the age of 18 to provide identification when traveling with a companion within the United States. However, the companion will need a form of federally accepted identification (REAL ID, U.S. Passport, U.S. Passport Card, DHS Trusted Traveler Card, etc.).

the brunt of the shelter's impact. These people, he noted, could not vote to hold City decision makers accountable.

Desmond believes the center would also undermine other amenities — such as the nearby safe car camping site — by over-concentrating homeless services in one area.

Another speaker, Arden-Arcade resident and social worker Aimee Williams questioned the city's "Good Neighbor" policies relating to homeless facilities. She expressed doubts about security, background checks, drug testing and shelter residents leaving at nights.

"I vehemently oppose Mayor Steinberg's plans," she said. "The

Receiving Home is where children go when first removed from their homes by Child Protective Services. This is one of the most traumatic experiences a foster youth faces. It is our moral and ethical obligation to protect children — above anyone else."

Mayor Steinberg's office issued this response, "The City's Department of Community Response has worked extensively over the past month with representatives of the receiving home. Included in Tuesday's Council action was a good neighbor policy that includes such items as round-the-clock security, monitoring of crime data, a no-camping zone around the center and the exclusion of registered sex offenders." ★

New 988 Number for Mental Health Emergencies

and the Department of Health and Human Services' Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).

SAMHSA describes 988 as a first step towards a transformed crisis care system in America. The program is in response to the urgent mental health realities in the U.S. In 2020 alone, the U.S. had one death by suicide about every 11 minutes – and for people aged 10-34 years, suicide is a leading cause

of death. In addition, there were more than 100,000 drug overdose deaths in 2021.

The launch of 988 follows a three-year joint effort by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Federal Communications Commission (FCC), and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to put crisis care in reach for people in need.

2 Decades of Saving Lives with California's Amber Alert

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Highway Patrol (CHP) is celebrating the lifesaving collaboration of many partners behind the scenes, including members of the public, who have helped safely reunite hundreds of abducted children with their families during 20 years of the state's America's Missing: Broadcast Emergency Response (AMBER) Alert system.

"The tremendous success of this program would not be possible without the partnership of law enforcement throughout California, broadcasters, government agencies at both the state and federal level, and members of the public," said CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray. "When a child or at-risk individual goes missing, every second counts, and the AMBER Alert program provides a critical resource for law enforcement and the public."

In July 2002, state law designated the CHP as the statewide coordinator for California's AMBER Alert program. Since the first AMBER Alert activation in August 2002, 376 children or at-risk individuals have been found safe because of the state's emergency alert system designed to recover missing children or at-risk individuals by employing the public's assistance.

The CHP issues an AMBER Alert at the request of a law enforcement agency investigating the abduction of a child or at-risk individual.

For an AMBER Alert to be issued, the CHP works with local law enforcement to confirm: a child 17 years old or younger, or at-risk individual, has been abducted or taken; • the individual is in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or death; and there is information available that if shared with the public, could assist in the safe recovery of the individual.

As the AMBER Alert program has continued to evolve and through the years, the CHP has added secondary distribution methods to supplement the emergency alert system. These include the Wireless Emergency Alerts program, which is operated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Federal Communications Commission; the California Department of Transportation's Changeable Message Signs on freeways; @CHPALerts on Twitter; and the California Lottery displays AMBER Alerts on digital terminal signs and printed on lottery tickets.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On Saturday, July 23, at approximately 12:10 p.m., Metro Fire crews were dispatched after multiple callers reported seeing a large smoke column coming from a house on Marmith Avenue in Carmichael.

Crews arrived to a very large 3 story home, with heavy smoke and fire coming from the garage, 1st floor, and the attic. Crews stretched multiple hose lines to attack the blaze, conducted a thorough search, and vertically ventilated the roof with chainsaws. Fortunately, all occupants made it out safely, and reported the fire starting from the garage after allowing their vehicle to warm up.

Several challenges were overcome on this incident by our responding crews. The layout of the home was very unconventional with multiple stairwells to multiple different areas of the home, the attic space on one side of the home was a living space, and the home had a wine cellar basement. This equates to more complexity operationally with more hose lines and more crews needed to conduct a search. The roof had a very steep pitch roof, so the truck crew ventilating had to cut from a roof ladder

that was attached to the ridge line of the roof. Even with the amount of complexity, heat and significant overhaul work needed to completely extinguish the fire, this incident was controlled quickly and efficiently. Crews were able to save several very important personal items from the home, which the homeowner was also very thankful for. ★

5 Sacramento-Area Locals Selected in MLB Draft

Susac, Hjerpe, Vogt, Harvey and Saul chosen

LOS ANGELES, CA (MPG) - Five Sacramento-area baseball players were recently selected in the 2022 Major League Baseball (MLB) Draft that was held over three days at L.A. Live in Southern California from July 17-19.

Daniel Susac, a 6-foot-4, 218-pound catcher, was the first Sacramentan taken off the board with the No. 19 overall pick in the first round by the Oakland Athletics. Susac played collegiately at the University of Arizona for two seasons from 2021-22 where he was the starting backstop.

Prior to Arizona, Susac played at Jesuit High School in Carmichael before graduating in 2020. His senior season with the Marauders was drastically cut short by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Susac isn't the first catcher in his family to be drafted to an MLB team in the Bay Area. In 2011, Daniel's older brother Andrew was selected in the second round of the MLB Draft by the San Francisco Giants. Andrew played six MLB seasons for four teams and won a World Series with the Giants in 2014.

Cooper Hjerpe, a 6-foot-3, 200-pound left-handed pitcher, was the second Sacramentan taken off the board with the No. 22 overall pick in the first round by the St. Louis Cardinals. Hjerpe played collegiately at Oregon State University for three years from 2020-22 where he was one of the Beavers' best arms. Hjerpe came out of the bullpen in his shortened freshman season before becoming a starter in 2021.

Prior to Oregon State, Hjerpe attended Woodland High School where he pitched and played first base before graduating in 2019. He threw a perfect game for the Wolves against Mira Loma on March 26, 2019, striking out all 15

were always there to support him, and he was blessed with some great coaches, Ryan's dedication, commitment and love for the game got him to where he is today, and we are incredibly proud of him."

Eli Saul, a 6-foot-5, 215-pound right-handed pitcher, was the fifth and final Sacramentan taken off the board with the 378th overall pick in the 13th round by the Arizona Diamondbacks. Saul played collegiately at Sacramento State for three seasons from 2020-22.

Prior to Sac State, Saul attended Prince of Wales Secondary School in Vancouver, British Columbia. According to Sac State Athletics, Saul is the seventh Hornet pitcher taken in the MLB Draft over the last four years. Additionally, this is the second consecutive year that Arizona has selected a Sac State pitcher joining Scott Randall who was taken in the seventh round by the Diamondbacks in 2021 and is currently at High-A Hillsboro.

Saul and Randall join Chris Kinsey in 2003 as the three Hornets drafted by Arizona. According to Sac State Athletics, the Hornets have now had at least one player selected in 10 of the last 11 MLB Drafts, with a player chosen every year except for the pandemic-shortened 2020 draft. Additionally, at least one Sac State player has been drafted or signed as a free agent in each of the last 15 years and in 19 of the last 20 seasons.

One Sacramentan who anticipated hearing his name called and never did is McClatchy High School alumnus, Malcolm Moore. The highly touted 6-foot-2, 210-pound catcher, is committed to play collegiately at Stanford. Due to his strong commitment, MLB teams shied away from risking a draft pick on the 18-year-old who was likely going to Palo Alto regardless of where he may have been selected. ★

batters he faced in a dominant 11-0 win in five innings.

Hjerpe now joins the Cardinals organization which is noted as having one of the best fan bases in MLB according to some. Nick Vogt, a 6-foot-1, 185-pound outfielder, was the third Sacramentan taken off the board with the 210th overall pick in the seventh round by the San Diego Padres. Vogt played collegiately at the University of California, Santa Barbara for three seasons from 2020-22 as an outfielder.

Prior to UC Santa Barbara, Vogt attended Davis High School until 2019 where he was not only an impressive athlete on the baseball and football fields, but also a "model student" in the classroom according to Davis Athletic Director Jeff Lorenson.

"Nick was an amazing baseball player for us, but more importantly a model student athlete with the highest degree of character," Lorenson told MPG via email. "He always put his team first and made his school community a better place!"

In addition to his time at Davis, Vogt also spent time playing for another local team, the Yuba-Sutter Gold Sox, who are based in Marysville. Vogt is the grandson of Gold Sox Managing Partner, Al Montna.

According to Gold Sox General Manager Tommy Lininger, over 75 collegiate athletes have moved on to the pros from the Yuba-Sutter-based program. Vogt most recently played for the Gold Sox in 2020, where he played alongside Ryan Harvey.

"It is great to watch these college ball players develop and move forward in their careers," Lininger said in a recent news release. "We had a solid roster in 2020 and it is no surprise both Vogt and Harvey went so high in this year's draft."

Harvey, a 6-foot-3, 195-pound right-handed pitcher, was the fourth Sacramentan taken off the board with the 340th overall pick in the 11th round by the New York Yankees. Harvey played collegiately with Vogt at UC Santa Barbara for three seasons from 2020-22.

Prior to UC Santa Barbara, Harvey attended Woodcreek High School in Roseville where he pitched and played the outfield before graduating in 2019. Harvey played varsity baseball for the Timberwolves for three seasons, reaching the playoffs each year and winning the Capital Valley Conference League Championship once.

"From a very early age, Ryan loved baseball. If something was round, he would throw it. If something was long, he would swing it," Ryan's mom, Keri Harvey, told MPG via email. "Ryan grew up playing recreational sports but chose to focus only on baseball after his freshman year of high school. Endless hours of wiffle ball turned into hours of studying his favorite professional players as he looked to gain velocity as a pitcher in high school. He also changed his diet and spent a lot of time in the gym getting stronger."

"These habits led to his success at UC Santa Barbara where he was the closer for the team because of his pitching velocity. While we
