

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - One of the busiest libraries in Sacramento County, the Carmichael Library, has a new branch supervisor.

Sheri Garcia comes to the Marconi Avenue hub from Ella McClatchy Branch (mid-Sacramento).

A 39-year veteran of library service, Garcia was Carmichael-raised and occupies her old family home.

Her previous library postings required commutes; the new job is just minutes from her street. "Working here is the culminating experience of my career," says Garcia. "I get to see people from where I grew up. As you move around in a library system, you can find yourself in places where you have to work at building connections. Last week I helped a lady from my street. It feels great to be so dialed into a community."

Americano and saw her two daughters graduate from El Camino High. One is now a pharmacist in the Bahamas; the other handles human resources for Sacramento Public Libraries.

"Using this facility was huge for them," confirms their mom. "I brought them here when they were toddlers. They were reluctant at first – libraries were places where mom worked – not cool. But my girls became great readers. I credit this library for getting them into colleges and helping them into careers they love.

"I also came here as a little girl. The building was a different shape but it had the same metal giraffe on the wall. I was curious about all sorts of things. I found answers in books. My friends and I would get shushed by the librarians for chatting. We don't shush people these days. We want libraries to be happy, welcoming, motivating places."

After more than two years of pandemic closures, Carmichael branch is back in business five days per

week. Much has changed in the interim. Like many local agencies, the facility copes with Carmichael's transient population. Per public library policy, no one is turned away.

Popular activities like Family Story Time (10:15 am, Thursdays) are restarting. The library also offers free lunches to patrons aged 18 and under. The Tuesday-to Friday program fills the gap in school meal availability during summer vacation.

"Free lunches also get children into our library," explains Garcia. "It's wonderful to hear young voices here again. Some patrons might find kids rowdy and disruptive. But libraries are all about learning.

"Children's learning is our future. We're delighted to have kids back." Carmichael Library is located at 5605 Marconi Avenue. Open hours are from 10 am to 6 pm, Tuesday through Saturday. Doors are closed Sunday and Monday. To contact Branch Supervisor Garcia, email

Covered CA Rates to Increase

Premiums for health insurance plans sold through the state marketplace will increase an average of 6% next year, Covered California officials announced

This rate hike is the largest California has seen since 2019. In the last three years, insurers had kept average increases under 2%.

Rate changes vary by region – from an 11.7% increase in Imperial, Inyo and Mono counties to zero change in Fresno, Kings, and Madera counties.

When premiums increase, an individual's financial aid usually does, too. Aid is based on household income. so subsidies may offset some of the increase. But people who don't qualify for subsidies will bear the full cost of the rate hike.

"Premiums are a capturing of what health care costs are, how they vary across geographies and communities, how health care costs are growing over time, which we know in this country are already too high and rising," said Jessica Altman, executive director of Covered California.

She noted that California's rate hike is still lower than it is in other states. A recent Kaiser Family Foundation analysis found a 10% average premium increase proposed by 72 insurers in 13 other states.

The rate increase, Altman said, is largely attributed to people resuming doctor visits

and procedures that they postponed during peaks of the COVID-19 pandemic. There is also the cost of general inflation.

About one percent of the increase, however, is attributed to the potential loss of enhanced subsidies from the federal government, which are set to expire at the end of this year. Without the additional aid, people will pay more for their premiums, likely pushing young, healthy people to drop their coverage. And when healthy people leave the marketplace, premiums go up for everyone.

The federal government's American Rescue Plan last year provided California with around \$3 billion designated for two years of additional financial aid through Covered California. The new law helped further reduce what people paid for their monthly premiums, driving more people to sign up for health insurance. It also expanded who was eligible for savings to include middle-income individuals.

Currently 1.7 million Californians buy their coverage through the state marketplace. Covered California has estimated that if Congress does not renew the American Rescue Plan subsidies, about 1 million people will see their premiums double and about 220,000 would likely drop their coverage.

"(The rate increase) for the subsidized population is almost divorced from what they pay out of pocket. What's more important is what happens with the (American Rescue Plan) subsidies," said Christine Eibner, a senior economist for the RAND Corporation, a think tank.

Altman said the sooner Congress acts

the better the chance of avoiding consumer confusion in the fall. Covered California usually sends renewal notices to enrollees beginning in October, ahead of the sign-up period, and having clarity for people by then is key.

"There have been references both ways, 'Will it be permanent? Will it be temporary? Will it stay in the current form?... Or will there be some adjustments to it?' - and we really don't know," Altman said about the conversations happening in Washington, D.C.

California's 2022-23 budget includes \$304 million for middle-class marketplace enrollees that would kick in if Congress does not renew the aid. While helpful, it would not fill the hole the annual \$1.7 billion federal aid would leave, Altman said.

Covered California also announced that another insurer, Aetna CVS Health, will join the state marketplace and be an option for people in El Dorado, Fresno, Kings, Madera, Placer, Sacramento and Yolo counties. Meanwhile, Anthem Blue Cross will expand into San Diego County.



Budget Invests to Help Fully Restore California's Tourism Economy

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- The new state budget agreed upon by Gov. Gavin Newsom and state lawmakers will include \$15 million in marketing funds to support the ongoing recovery of California's tourism economy.

These funds will be used to supplement Visit California's proven tourism efforts by providing direct support for domestic tourism marketing programs aimed at driving increased travel to destinations and communities throughout California.

The new funding builds on the state's previous investment of \$95 million in tourism marketing stimulus in 2021, which has been critical to reviving the state's hard-hit tourism sector and accelerating the travel industry's path to

Visitor spending in

California grew 46% last year compared to 2020, totaling \$100.2 billion, according to Visit California's 2021 Economic Impact Report. Updated economic projections now forecast that travel spending will reach 2019 levels by 2023 - a year earlier than previous estimates.

"California's travel and hospitality industry is grateful to Gov. Newsom and the Legislature for including \$15 million in the state budget to continue the tourism economy's recovery from the devastating pandemic," said Visit California President and CEO Caroline Beteta. "The state funding will supplement the travel industry's contribution and allow Visit California to continue marketing programs across the nation to inspire travel to the Golden State. The \$95 million allocated by the Legislature a year ago helped California reclaim its nation-leading tourism market share and reestablish itself as one of the state's most reliable job producers. This \$15 million contribution will help finish the job and bring California's tourism economy back to pre-pandemic levels in 2023."

This stimulus will provide additional resources that will help Visit California close the gap in the state's uneven tourism recovery by supporting marketing programs aimed at promoting family travel, professional meetings and travel to California's urban hubs, which continue to be disproportionately impacted by the pandemic.

Initial projections estimate that the state's \$15 million investment in tourism marketing stimulus will generate at least \$4 billion in visitor spending at California businesses and create 37,600 travel and hospitality jobs.

Arden Middle School Teacher Arrested for Multiple Counts of Child Sexual Abuse

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On July 19, 2022, Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Child Abuse Detectives coordinated with the defense attorney of Glenn C. Alejandrino (49), to turn himself into the Main Jail on an arrest warrant. Alejandrino is a Sacramento County Resident and a teacher for the San Juan Unified School District since 1996

Sacramento Sheriff's Deputies took Glenn C. Alejandrino into custody on multiple felony counts including Lewd or Lascivious Acts with a Child Under 14, Lewd Act on Child/Victim w/More Than 10 years Age Difference, Communicating w/Minor with Intent to Commit Sex Offense, Furnish Marijuana to Minor Under 14 years Old, and Contribute to Delinquency of Minor and Molesting a Child Under Age 18. Alejandrino worked in Early Childhood Education from 1996 to 1998 then as a 6th grade teacher at Cowan Elementary School between the years of 1999 and

2012. In 2013, he transferred to Arden Middle School where he taught 8th grade Leadership and Government until 2022. There are multiple victims spanning the time frame of 2019 to 2021. He is accused of furnishing his students with alcohol, marijuana, pornography and sex toys. All the charges stemming from this warrant arrest are believed to have taken place at Alejandrino's residence. Investigators believe the victims were in Alejandrino's home with their parents' consent and knowledge.

Alejandrino posted bail in the amount of \$350,000 and will appear in court on Wednesday July 20, 2022 to answer for the charges.

This is an active and ongoing criminal investigation. DBW Reminds Boaters to Carry a California Boater Card

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California State Parks' Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) reminds California boaters of the requirement to obtain and carry a California Boater Card when boating on state inland and coastal waterways. Applying for one is a simple process, it costs \$10 and lasts a lifetime. Operators who are not in compliance with the law and caught operating a vessel without their California Boater Card will be cited accordingly. This is considered an infraction and base fines can range anywhere from \$100 – \$500.

U.S. Coast Guard boating accident data show that states with some form of boating safety education have fewer accidents and fatalities than states without any boater education requirements. California is one of the last states to implement a mandatory boating education requirement. The law is being phased-in by age. By Jan. 1, 2023, all boaters 50 years of age or younger must carry a card. All boaters, regardless of age, will need to carry one by Jan. 1, 2025. The card is verification that its holder has successfully taken and passed an approved boating safety education course. It is important to note there are exemptions to the law. For example, those operating a rental vessel or possessing a valid marine operator's license issued by the U.S. Coast Guard do not need to obtain a California Boater Card. To date, DBW has issued more than 143,000 cards.

"It's not just novice boaters that benefit from this education program by learning the

boating rules of the road," said DBW Acting Deputy Director Ramona Fernandez. "Even experienced boaters find that a boating safety course can help them improve their boating knowledge and stay up to date with current boating laws."

Applying for a California Boater Card is a simple process. Boaters can complete their application by visiting CaliforniaBoaterCard. com. The card only costs \$10 and lasts a lifetime. Boaters have an option to complete an online, classroom or a home study course. Boaters only need to complete one of the approved courses. Once DBW has received your application, proof of education and payment, you will receive a 90-day temporary boater card by email. You should receive your official boater card by mail within 30 days from the time the application was approved. Detailed information on the process and information on available boating safety courses is available online at CaliforniaBoaterCard.com. A toll-free telephone support line is also available at (844) 421-8333.

California State Parks and the recreational programs supported by its divisions of Boating and Waterways, Historic Preservation and Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation provide the opportunity for families, friends, and communities to connect. Off-highway motor vehicle recreation, boating activities, horseback riding, cycling, hiking, camping, rock climbing, tours, hikes, school group enrichment, and special events are just some of the activities enjoyed in 279 park units organized into 21 field districts throughout the state. Suspect Cantrell Arrested for Sexual Abuse of a Child

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On July 8, 2022, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office arrested 46-year-old Samuel Paul Cantrell on 15 counts of lewd and lascivious acts with a child under 14 and 1 count of Possessing Obscene Matter Depicting Person Under 18. The accusations occurred multiple times over a two-year period with one victim. Cantrell is currently being held in the Sacramento County Main Jail with a bail amount of

\$1,500,000.

Cantrell worked as a volunteer Youth Group Leader / Youth Worship Leader at Crossroads Church in Carmichael. The victim stemming from this arrest was not associated with Crossroads Church and investigators are not implicating the organization.

Unsecured Property Taxes Due Aug. 31

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Annual bills for Sacramento County unsecured personal property taxes for fiscal year 2022-2023 will be mailed on July 22, 2022, and are payable without delinquent penalties through Aug. 31, 2022.

Unsecured property tax bills are mailed to all owners of unsecured property in July of each year. If you owned unsecured property in Sacramento County, such as a boat or aircraft, or if you leased or owned fixtures and equipment related to a business on Jan. 1, 2022, and do not receive a tax bill by Aug. 7, 2022, please contact the Sacramento County Tax Collector's Unsecured Property Tax Unit at (916) 874-7833, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m., Monday through Friday excluding holidays.

Nonreceipt of a tax bill does not excuse delinquency or allow the tax

collector to cancel penalties or collection costs.

Tax bills become delinquent if not paid in the Tax Collector's Office by 5 p.m. on Aug. 31, 202, or received by mail bearing a postmark of Aug. 31, 2022.


If the tax bill is not paid by the delinquency date, a 10% penalty and collection cost will be added. DMV registration may be withheld on watercraft if unsecured property taxes are reported delinquent. If a tax bill remains unpaid after Oct. 31, 2022, additional collection costs and monthly penalties at the rate of 1.5% will be added to the base tax.

Payments may be made by mail or in person at the County Tax Collector's Office located at 700 "H" Street, Room 1710, Sacramento, CA 95814, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, holidays excluded. For credit/debit or eCheck payments please visit the Sacramento County Property Tax Bill Information System website. ★



Please be Aware of Scams Targeting SMUD Customers

SMUD News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - SMUD reminds customers to be on the look-out for scammers claiming to represent SMUD and threatening disconnection if

immediate payments are not made. A scam currently being used works like this: Scammers contact a customer - sometimes from a phone number that appears to be SMUD's customer service number – and threaten disconnection if a payment is not made within 20-40 minutes via a pre-paid debit card, often at a pay station such as CVS or Safeway stores (not authorized SMUD pay stations). Some scammers have even asked for a cash payment to be made in person at a public location. The scammer demands that the customer call back a non-SMUD number with payment details. When the customer calls the number, it is answered with a recording of SMUD's phone-based customer service menu. When the customer chooses a menu option, the call will go to voicemail or will be answered by a scammer posing as a SMUD employee.

SMUD representatives will never call a customer and direct them to a non-SMUD payment facility or require a specific method of payment such as cash, wire payment or money card.

A list of authorized SMUD pay stations with a map of nearby locations can be viewed by visiting smud.org/Pay.

If customers receive a suspicious call, SMUD asks them to ask for a name and number, then hang up and call SMUD at one of the following published numbers: Residential customers: 1-888-742-SMUD (7683); Business customers: 1-877-622-SMUD (7683); Customers can also email SMUD at scamreporting@smud.org with the same information.







Background

The City of Citrus Heights is seeking two Maintenance Worker I/II's to staff the City's new Beautification Crew assigned to the General Services Department. The Maintenance Worker I/II positions will be responsible for helping improve the overall appearance throughout the community through proactive blight abatement efforts, as well as supporting the divisions overall maintenance needs

The Positions

The Maintenance Worker I/II positions assigned as the Beautification Crew will operate under the Operations & Maintenance Division, and will be directly supervised by the Construction & Maintenance Inspector Supervisor. The Beautification Crew's focus will be on helping to improve the aesthetics of the community by working proactively to help eliminate and deter blight

within public rights of way. Daily lead direction will be provided by the Supervisor, as well as through the department's customer support team. Maintenance Worker I/II will be responsible for performing general maintenance tasks, including but not limited to, proactive debris and trash removal from public right-of-way and other areas including materials from unlawful camping activity; weed abatement and leaf blowing/collection; graffiti removal; pressure washing; special beautification projects; and illegal sign removal.

These positions will also assist with responding to general citizen concerns or issues in the community or other department maintenance needs. The Maintenance Worker I/II may assist with general maintenance throughout the City, including landscaping areas, medians and public right-of-ways, bus stops, and

other areas of business district or residential areas. Assignments will frequently extend to collaborating with other City departments and outside agencies, such as working with the Citrus Heights Police Department, Sunrise Recreation and Park District, Cal Trans and others. Board Approves 2022–23 MHSA Annual Update

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On June 14, 2022, Behavioral Health Deputy Director Ryan Quist presented the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) FY 2022-23 Annual Update to the MHSA Three-Year Plan for Board approval. The annual update reflected the January 2022 Board action to increase MHSA expenditure contracts by \$25 million.

"With recognition of increasing needs and the behavioral health workforce challenges, this past year the Board of Supervisors approved acceleration of our MHSA spending plan to ensure we can get additional services out to the community," said Health Services Director, Chevon Kothari. "What was once a significant reserve of MHSA funding is strategically being spent down in the upcoming few years to address unprecedented needs."

MHSA funding is facilitating a mental health delivery and treatment system in Sacramento County to provide care and reduce untreated mental illness by implementing programs under Community Services and Support (CSS), Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI), and Innovation (INN) that improve mental health practices. Additionally, MHSA funding supports countywide efforts to expedite services for individuals with serious mental illness, co-occurring substance use disorders and are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

Community Services and Support (CSS)

CSS funds are used for mental health treatment services and support for children/youth and their families living with severe emotional disturbance, adults living with a serious mental illness, and housing for these populations. Programs include:

Community Opportunities for Recovery & Engagement; Sierra Elder Wellness Full Service Partnership (FSP); Permanent Supportive Housing (includes FSPs); Transcultural Wellness Center FSP; Wellness & Recovery; Adult FSP; Juvenile Justice Diversion and Treatment FSP; Transitional Age Youth FSP; Crisis Residential Programs; Children's Community Mental Health Services; Mental Health Crisis/Urgent Care Clinic; Family FSP

In FY 2020-21, the implemented CSS-funded FSP programs served 2,590 unduplicated clients and the implemented General System Development programs served 32,043 unduplicated clients.

Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI)

PEI can fund programs and activities designed to prevent mental illness from occurring or becoming more severe and disabling. Examples of current PEI programs include Mobile Crisis Support Teams, Consumer-Operated Warm Line, Mental Health Navigator, Bullying

Prevention Education and Training, etc. In FY 2020-21, PEI-funded Programs:

Supported 65,453 callers through the Suicide Crisis Line; Served 72,033 across Suicide Prevention; Outreached to 7,165 through Suicide Prevention; Served 2,810 across Strengthening Families; Trained 49,742 through Strengthening Families; Served 304 across Integrated Health and Wellness; Outreached to 183 through Integrated Health and Wellness

Innovation (INN)

INN projects are time-limited and are approved by the state's Mental Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission (MHSOAC) to test new and/or improved mental health practices or approaches to increase access to MHSA programs (including unserved/underserved), increase service quality and promote inter-agency collaboration. Currently, INN programs include;

Mental Health Crisis/Urgent Care Clinic: Opened in November 2017 (expansion to 24/7 operation in progress); Behavioral Health Crisis Services Collaborative: Opened in September 2019; Community Justice Support Program (formerly Forensic Behavioral Health Multi-System Team): Implemented in 2021-22

MHSA Housing Program

Housing for homeless individuals living with serious mental illness continues to be an important initiative for DHS, as well as an accomplishment and success story. Since the inception of MHSA planning, housing for homeless individuals living with mental illness has been a high priority, and Sacramento County has achieved considerable success in this area through the MHSA Housing Program. Since 2007, Sacramento County has invested more than \$28 million in local one-time setaside MHSA funding and County MHSA dollars administered by the state and Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency on behalf of DHS to address homelessness for MHSA-eligible clients.

In FY 2019-20, MHSA-funded programs:

Housed 563 clients/households who were homeless; Prevented 1,431 clients/households at imminent risk of becoming homeless; Served 161 clients/households residing in MHSA-funded apartments; Provided rental assistance to 4,682 clients/households; and, Provided 7,815 services utilizing MHSA housing flex

"There is no wrong entrance door to access mental health services," said Ryan Quist. "MHSA funding and expansion creates access points intended to meet clients where they are and make access to services effortless."

Knocking Down Barriers and Beer Cans

The story of River Cats outfielder Austin Dean

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- Have you ever seen that viral video from September 2019 when a Miami Marlins outfielder threw a baseball at a tower of beer cans? If you haven't, you're missing out.

The Major League Baseball (MLB) player who participated in such a unique, in-game, event was Austin Dean, who is now with the San Francisco Giants' Triple-A affiliate, the Sacramento River Cats. The viral moment occurred on Sept. 20, 2019, during a matchup between the Marlins and eventual World Series Champions, Washington Nationals, a game that the Nationals won 6-4.

Dean's game within the game didn't take place in just any regular season affair. The video of Dean recorded by a fan went viral across the country on the same day that Miami suffered its 100th loss of the season. Therefore, some fans in attendance at what was once known as "Marlins Park," now known as LoanDepot Park, needed some extra entertainment to get through the end of what had been a tough season for Marlins fans.

"The funny thing about it was, is that they had already started that pyramid by inning one. So, it was working its way up," Dean told the Messenger Publishing Group with a smile before taking on the El Paso Chihuahuas at Sutter Health Park on June 22. "It was (being built at) the AutoNation Alley (Deck) so there were quite a few people. There were at least three guys."

Dean was impressed with the commitment and determination of the three gentlemen building

the pyramid. The video, originally posted by the Marlins' Twitter account, shows the pyramid at a strong and sturdy 54 cans by the time Dean caved into the fanatics' demands.

"The seventh inning rolls around and it's huge, it's at its peak," Dean said. "I finally looked at them like, "you know what, whatever, I'll give it a shot.' I finally looked at them and gave them the nod."

By that point, Dean was in, and operation beer can pyramid was a go! The 28-year-old outfielder, who was 26 at the time, slowly walked towards the fans standing in left-center field, lined it up, and as NBA broadcaster Mike Breen would say, "BANG," bullseye. Dean didn't take down the entire pyramid, but he perfectly nailed the single beer can standing atop the five-story creation.

"My biggest thing was like, 'alright, I can't go short here, you can't miss it,' right? Just aim for the vicinity of the area and just hope we knock some down, right? I throw the ball, had a little cut on to it, and it was just perfect," Dean explained. "Knocks the top can over, they go nuts."

His teammates at the time doubted him, but the video evidence spoke for itself, garnering 3.4 million views just on Twitter with what Dean described as a "fun moment."

"After the end of the game, (my) phone is just blowing up," Dean recalled. "Probably 300-500 messages, just like notifications about all that going on. I was like, 'this is absolutely incredible.' If you get me to do that again, there's no chance that I could do that again. I wasn't looking for clout."

Dean explained that the video gets posted randomly, once or twice a year, by various baseball accounts on social media. However, the various accounts usually don't tag him in the video because nobody seems to remember that he was the guy that made the moment happen!

As for Dean's career on the field, he was traded from the Marlins in January 2020 to the St. Louis Cardinals, who have arguably the best fans in all of MLB according to many.

"I would agree, they have probably one of the best fan bases in baseball," Dean said. "Especially playing in Busch Stadium as a Cardinal is awesome. I've played as an opponent as well and I can even say, it was even great there. Everybody was super nice in the outfield. That's the epitome of baseball right there, (with) amazing fans and

an amazing atmosphere as well."

Dean spent the 2018 and 2019 seasons with Miami before playing two seasons in St. Louis in 2020 and 2021. On Nov. 5, 2021, the Giants claimed Dean off waivers. In March 2022, he was designated for assignment and began his career as a River Cat.

"Austin comes to play every day and he's the same guy," River Cats manager Dave Brundage told MPG on June 22. "He might be goofy at times, (but) he's here to play and wants to win, he wants to succeed and he brings a lot of energy every single day. I appreciate that from a manager's standpoint, somebody that loves to play the game and plays it correctly."

So far this season for Sacramento, Dean has a (.249) batting average with 11 home runs, 36 RBI and 68 strikeouts in 68 games played.

"He is really good in the clubhouse and has been a really good leader," River Cats hitting coach Damon Minor said about Dean to MPG in a phone interview on June 23. "On the field, he has been a really good strength (for us)."
