Inflation and California **Policies are** the Grinch that stole Christmas

Are you ready for the most expensive holiday season in forever? Hold on to your wallets, because high inflation and wrongheaded California policies are the Grinch that stole Christmas, pressuring family budgets and diminishing our quality of life.

If you've gone to the grocery store or shopping mall, you've witnessed a spike in inflation like we haven't seen in decades. The consumer price index surged 6.2 percent from a year ago in October, the highest increase since 1990. But the story is actually worse. The October monthly increase was itself 0.9 percent, which would indicate an annualized increase of nearly 11 percent. As famously put by Nobel Prize winning economist Milton Friedman, inflation is always a monetary phenomenon. When the federal government flooded the country with stimulus dollars without accompanying goods and services, inflation was entirely predictable. What does this mean for the average working family? It means that every item on your holiday dinner table will cost more. Gifts for your children will cost more. Heating your house will cost more. Gas, hotel rooms, movie tickets, clothing, haircuts will all cost more. Inflation robs purchasing power from each and every dollar you make. Workers may be seeing increased wages, but when they don't keep up with price increases, people become poorer even as they earn more. As ugly as the picture is nationally, California is worse. Our state isn't responsible for the flood of dollars driving inflation, but it's stacking bad state policies on top of bad federal policies and making it tougher for families to make ends meet. For example, so called 'green energy" policies drive our residential electricity costs more than 50-percent higher than the national average. A California specific Continued on page 4

A Right to Housing?

The law says that every student is entitled to a free public education.

What if it said the same about housing?

That's what Darrell Steinberg, the mayor of Sacramento, believes to be the key to addressing California's homelessness. He recently proposed an ordinance that would require the city to provide at least two housing or shelter options to people living on the streets.

If those options weren't available, the person could sue the city. But if the homeless individual turned down the available options, they would be compelled to come inside, albeit using social workers, not police.

In the latest episode of the California Housing Crisis Podcast, The Los Angeles Times' Liam Dillon and CalMatters' Manuela Tobias interview Steinberg on his proposal, and how it has evolved

"I want to put out what I believe, which is fundamentally, that the public policy of the society must be that people live indoors," he said. "Ninety to 95% of that is the government's obligation. The last five to 10% may fall on some individuals."

Board Adopts Final District Map

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Board of Supervisors, at its Dec. 7 meeting, voted to adopt the Final Supervisorial District Map.

The Final Map is a result of the Board of Supervisors' direction on revisions to the earlier draft maps presented at its Nov. 2, 16 and 17 as public input.

17 Board meeting, at which the Board approved the Final Draft Map, Sacramento County's Geographic Information System (GIS) team worked with National Demographics Corporation (NDC), the County's redistricting consultant, to proof the district lines suggested by the Board. They also compared it to the district lines, Census blocks and legal boundary descriptions for all jurisdictions in Sacramento County, including cities.

NDC and the County's GIS team made minor adjustments to the Final Draft Map to address miscoding of census County's redistricting blocks, to avoid sliver precincts and new ballot types, and to adhere to the Board's recommendations on Nov. 16-17. Geographic descriptions of each supervisorial district boundary are also available.

can utilize the interactive map titled, "Final Supervisorial District Map" to view the new lines and see where they

reside within them. Additionally, the County offers several district lookup tools and online maps. Because those tools use different source data, the County is coordinating the update to the tools simultaneously in order to provide consistency among the tools. The update will be com-


pleted in January 2022. The public submitted more than 200 Board meetings, as well written comments containing suggestions for Following the Nov. redistricting and supervisorial boundary lines. The public also submitted their own maps for consideration, either hand-drawn or drawn using the mapping tools available.


> Every ten years, following the Census count, the resulting census data is used to geographically define electoral districts, at all levels of government, through a process called redistricting. Redistricting ensures that each of the electoral district boundaries have about the same number of people and comply with the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965.

Continued from page 1 would take effect starting in 2023, or later if the city makes substantial progress on housing options by fall 2022.

Liam and Manuela also discussed the results of a

poll on homelessness in Los Angeles County conducted by the L.A. Business Council Institute and the L.A. Times.

The poll found 94% of voters viewed homelessness as a serious or very serious

problem – a similar number as two years ago. However, over the past couple years the city and county have spent hundreds of millions of dollars to deal with homelessness.

What has changed, however, is how people think the issue must be addressed: While voters were evenly split last time about spending money on short-term solutions such as shelter and on long-term solutions such as housing, 57% said officials should focus on "short-term shelter sites."

Senator Nielsen Urges Caution on Projected \$31 Billion State Surplus

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Jim Nielsen, R-Red Bluff, issued the following statement in response to the Legislative Analyst's Office report, The 2022-23 Budget: California's Fiscal Outlook, which projects a \$31 billion surplus.

"A \$31 billion surplus is not an invitation to build future spending obligations.

"Legislative Democrats used up their bag of tricks last year to avoid triggering the Gann Limit, which restricts how fast state spending can grow.

"The Gann Limit, which was passed on the heels of Prop. 13, expressed the

wisdom of voters. The surplus either needs to go back to taxpayers or be used for essential functions, like education, infrastructure and paying down debt.

"As the vice chair of the Senate Budget and Fiscal Review Committee, I urge The Legislature and the governor to proceed with caution."

Sacramento County Grand Jury Recruiting for 2022–23

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County's Superior Court announced today that it has officially opened its application process seeking new jurors to serve on the 2022-23 Sacramento County Grand Jury. Nineteen Sacramento County residents, and 11 alternates, will be selected from among the qualified applicants to volunteer for the term which runs from July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023.

The Grand Jury is the independent watchdog over the county's government agencies and services. Jurors investigate the performance of county, city, and local governing entities ranging from school districts to the criminal justice system to health and welfare agencies. Additionally, the Sacramento County Grand Jury is authorized to hear criminal indictments, and jurors have the rare opportunity to visit detention facilities throughout the region.

"The Grand Jury is entrusted by the public to investigate and report on local government operations and to ensure responsibilities are being fulfilled honestly and with integrity," explains Grand Jury Foreperson Deanna Hanson. "It is also our duty to make certain the public understands our work and has the opportunity to be involved."

The current Grand Jury recently issued a report on COVID-19 vaccine mandates for K-12 public schools. It also received significant news media coverage earlier this month on its report regarding the serious safety concerns facing the Del Paso Manor Water District. Anyone may file a complaint against a county government entity with the Grand Jury for review and investigative consideration. All Grand Jury activities are conducted in secrecy.

Jurors act as volunteers and receive a small stipend for their work. To be considered as a Grand Juror, applications must be received by January 28, 2022. Anyone applying must be a Sacramento

County resident over the age of 18. Further qualification requirements are available on the Grand Jury website. Those who initially qualify will be interviewed, with the final Grand Jury empanelment taking place on June 3, 2022. To apply, visit the Grand Jury website at: www.sacgrandjury.org.

DWR Announces State Water Project Allocation

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -Today, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) announced its initial State Water Project (SWP) allocation for 2022 along with several steps to manage the state's water supply in anticipation of a third dry year with reservoirs at or near historic lows.

Given the unprecedented drought conditions, the SWP's initial allocation for December 1 will focus on the health and safety needs for 2022 of the 29 water agencies that contract to receive SWP supplies. DWR has advised these water agencies to expect an initial allocation that prioritizes health and safety water needs and that the SWP will not be planning water deliveries through its typical allocation process until the state has a clearer picture of the hydrologic and reservoir conditions going into the spring.

DWR is focused on prioritizing water supply in four categories: water for health and safety needs and Delta salinity control; water for endangered species; water to reserve in storage; and water for additional supply allocations if the hydrology allows.

"Despite a wet start to the water year, conditions have dried out since that first storm, and we are still planning for a belowaverage water year. That means we need to prepare now for a dry winter and severe drought conditions to continue through 2022," said DWR Director Karla Nemeth. "We will be working with our federal partners and SWP contractors to take a conservative planning approach to balance limited water supplies with the needs of residents, businesses, and the environment."

In addition to limiting the initial allocation to health and safety needs, DWR is making plans to adjust SWP operations this winter and spring. DWR is capturing and storing water when possible, in Lake Oroville and south of the Delta in San Luis Reservoir to increase available supplies for 2022 and will continue to do so throughout the winter. Health and safety demands for the Bay Area and Central and Southern California will be met with water available from the Delta as well as water stored in San Luis Reservoir. Water in Lake Oroville will be reserved to maintain Delta water quality, protect endangered species, and meet senior water right needs. Beyond minimal exports to meet South Bay health and safety needs, water stored in Lake Oroville will be used for south of Delta deliveries only if hydrology conditions improve. DWR plans to conserve as much storage as possible in Oroville in anticipation of a third dry year, and potentially a dry 2023.


Also, today, DWR along with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, submitted a new Temporary Urgency Change Petition (TUCP) to the State Water Resources Control Board. If approved, the petition would allow for the State Water Project and the Central Valley Project to operate under modifications to the water quality and water right permit requirements in the Delta from February through April 2022, should conditions warrant. These modifications may be needed to conserve water in Lake Oroville to ensure minimum health and safety water supplies are available later in the year if dry conditions persist. If significant precipitation materializes in the next few months, standards may be met through natural means and modifications to SWP and CVP operations may not be necessary.

DWR is also delaying the removal of the Emergency Drought Salinity Barrier in the Delta. The rock barrier across West False River was scheduled to be removed by November 30, however drought conditions have persisted and leaving the barrier in place will enable a more efficient drought response in spring 2022 if needed. DWR plans to create a notch in the barrier in January 2022 to allow for fish passage and boat traffic until April 2022.

"It is going to take a multi-pronged approach to successfully respond to these unprecedented drought conditions," said Nemeth.

Each year, DWR provides the initial State Water Project allocation by December 1 based on available water storage and projected water supply demands. Allocations are updated monthly as snowpack and runoff information is assessed, with a final allocation typically determined in May or June.

The lowest initial allocations were 5 percent in 2010 and 2014. Last year, the initial SWP allocation was 10 percent, however due to increasing dry conditions, the final allocation was lowered to 5 percent.

California's 'Tort Wars' Heating Up Again

One of the Capitol's most enduring conflicts pits personal injury attorneys and their allies in consumer advocacy groups against corporate interests and their insurers.

The two factions clash incessantly over what events are deemed wrongful acts (torts), who can sue over those acts and what monetary damages can be awarded.

Dubbed "tort wars," the conflict has raged for decades in the Legislature, in the courts and occasionally via ballot measures, each side depicting itself as the good guys and the other as rapaciously evil. Millions of dollars are spent each year on lobbyists, media strategists, political campaign advisors and other tools of the political trade.

The intensity of the war varies from year to year, and 2022 is shaping up as one its hotter periods as the factions propose dueling ballot measures. One would effectively undo a 1975 law that limits damages for "pain and suffering" in medical malpractice cases, while another would place a new limit on the fees that personal injury attorneys can claim.

That 1975 law, entitled the Medical Injury

(MICRA) and signed by Jerry Brown during his first year as governor, limits non-economic damages for malpractice to \$250,000. Its passage was not only a big win for medical providers and their insurers but the opening salvo of the war.

The attorneys not only have tried - very unsuccessfully so far — to repeal or modify MICRA but have sought to expand opportunities to sue and collect damages and fees, such as allowing them to intervene in cases that ordinarily would be handled by local or state legal authorities.

Business groups and insurers, meanwhile, have not only attempted to blunt the attorneys' expansive ambition but to carry the MICRA model of damage limits into other potential injury cases.

In 1987, 12 years after MICRA was enacted, the speaker of the state Assembly, Willie Brown, mediated extensive negotiations between the warring factions on a truce, culminating in the infamous "napkin deal" worked out in Frank Fat's restaurant near the Capitol with Brown hopping from table to table.

Quickly ratified by the Legislature, it gave lobbyists for every interest involved something to take back to their clients, including a slight modification of MICRA and new protections for the tobacco industry from lawsuits by smokers for cancer and other illnesses.

The napkin deal truce lasted for a few years, but tort wars resumed in the 1990s and have been waged ever since on specific newspapers.

Compensation Reform Act issues, including several unsuccessful efforts to change MICRA. One subset of the conflict, involving roughly the same interests, has been perennial jousting over workers' compensation, the employer-financed, multi-billion-dollar system that covers job-related injuries and illnesses.

A ballot measure that would indirectly but effectively repeal MICRA is already qualified for the 2022 ballot even though the anti-MICRA coalition has failed repeatedly in the past to undo what the Legislature and Jerry Brown wrought 46 years ago.

Meanwhile, the Civil Justice Association of California, an umbrella organization of business and insurance interests, has unveiled its own initiative measure that would limit lawyers' contingency fees in personal injury cases to 20% of monetary judgements, sharply lower than the traditional one-third or more. The goal, obviously, is to make attorneys less willing to take on cases.

The stage is set, therefore, for the competing factions to spend tens of millions of dollars to persuade voters, which would be a tiny fraction of the many billions of dollars at stake in the outcome. And regardless of what happens next year, the immense stakes mean tort wars will continue to rage indefinitely.

And make sure the resolution you choose is very important to you. Writing down a goal just because it's what someone else is doing, or because it sounds like a good idea, isn't good enough. If your goal isn't yours, it won't happen.

Second, set benchmarks. Let's say you want to pay off your credit cards before July. You need to make that goal measurable throughout the year by setting benchmarks. If you owe \$5,000 on your credit cards and want to pay them off in six months, you need to pay about \$833 towards them every month. Write your benchmark down beneath your goal, and make a plan it done.

Three, find an accountability partner. A great tions, but research shows accountability partner isn't afraid to ask how your goals are coming along, and they'll call you on it when you're slacking. If you set a financial goal, a good accountability partner isn't going to be the friend who always asks you to go shopping. Studies

a strong accountability partner increases the likelihood of achieving a goal dramatically. And finally, make sure you reward yourself along the way. It's tough to stay motivated when hitting

your goal takes a while. Lots of folks start out at full speed, only to see the momentum disappear over time. You might treat yourself to a night at the movies when you've paid off the first \$1,000 on your credit cards, or maybe a nice, new shirt when you've paid off half the card.

Sometimes life doesn't work out the way we think it will. Isaac. Our priorities can change, and our goals may change, too. If that's why you didn't make your resolutions happen this year, that's fine. Just don't make the mistake of thinking it's too late to change and improve your life!



Citizen Redistricting Commission's Last-Minute Change

Dear Madam Chairman:

The Carmichael Chamber of Commerce is respectfully writing to object to the Citizen Redistricting Commission's last-minute Assembly maps of December 8, 2021, splitting the unincorporated City of Carmichael into two separate Assembly Districts. Carmichael is a community of interest (COI) that should not be divided.

As the organization that represents the business and residents of Carmichael, we feel we have our pulse on the interests of Carmichael and its neighboring business communities. The Carmichael Community, over its history, has rejected annexation into the City of

Sacramento and shares no shared values, no common law enforcement, no common school districts, and no common areas of social, economic, or ethnic interest. Therefore, Carmichael as a whole should be included in the same Assembly District as its closely related unincorporated neighbors of Foothill Farms, Fair Oaks, Gold River, and Orangevale.

The entire community of Carmichael shares the same School District (San Juan Unified School District) as its unincorporated neighbors in Fair Oaks, Gold River, Orangevale, Citrus Heights. Children from all parts of the school district take their children through Open Enrollment to schools in Carmichael.

The entire community of located in Carmichael. Carmichael shares the same Law Enforcement (Sacramento County Sheriff) as Fair Oaks, Gold River, Orangevale, and the City of Rancho Cordova (who contracts with the Sacramento County Sheriff).

The Carmichael Community also represents the following Communities of Interest that will dramatically be affected by this split.

Slavic Community of Interest in Carmichael - The Slavic community is well established in Carmichael and extends into Citrus Heights, Foothill Farms, Fair Oaks, Orangevale, and Rancho Cordova. To separate the western portion of Carmichael would separate the Slavic Community who has many businesses, churches, and families

Carmichael Senior Citizen Community of Interest -Carmichael has the most significant senior citizen concentration in Sacramento County, with over 20 assisted living and senior housing facilities. This is much in common with Fair Oaks, Citrus Heights, and Orangevale, which share large senior citizen populations. Dividing Carmichael would dilute the Carmichael Senior Citizens Community of Interest.

We believe that the current Legislative District map puts our community at a considerable disadvantage. We feel our voice will be fractured, and this takes away our ability to truly ensure that elected officials represent the needs and

concerns of solely our community.

We appreciate the Commission's willingness to hear from the people and their community organizations. The Carmichael Chamber of Commerce respectfully requests the 2020 Citizens Redistricting Commission restore Carmichael as a whole Community of interest to an Assembly District.

Homicide Investigation on Van Alstine Avenue Small Business Nails Big Award

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - At approximately 10:03 p.m. on Tuesday, December 7, 2021, the Sheriff's Communications Center received several calls from residents in a large apartment complex on the 5900 block of Van Alstine Avenue in Sacramento County stating they heard gunshots and heard a scream.

Upon arrival, deputies located one adult male who sustained at least one gunshot wound to the upper body. Deputies initiated life saving measures until Metro Fire arrived to take over and transport the victim to an area hospital. The victim was pronounced deceased by medical staff at the hospital.

Homicide detectives and crime scene investigators responded to the scene, interviewed witnesses and gathered evidence. No further information or suspect information is available at this time.

The identity of the victim in this case will be released by the Sacramento County Coroner's Office after identification and notification of next of kin.







