**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - Rock 'n roll blasted motorists at the Palm and Fair Oaks intersection last weekend. As the School of Rock celebrated a new campus, young musicians – many attired for Halloween – staged a show fit to scare ghosts from creaky old Serritella's Restaurant building.

The school is part of an international franchise that coaches young musicians in music performance. Aged from four to 18, students are tutored toward professionalism. Owners Jason Kline and his wife Cecilia Yi-Kline run similar operations in Roseville and Elk Grove and, with 440 budding artists, their Elk

Grove school is rated top performer among US franchises. Roseville has around 200 attendees and the new Carmichael base has enrolled about 100 in six months. Fifteen teachers supply tuition.

"We're performance based," explains Kline. "Kids come for lessons and work on their parts for a weekly group rehearsal. They also learn leadership. We're creating a more well-rounded musician. Music is a universal language; it gives artists wings so they can fly anywhere."

Getting the Carmichael campus up to scratch was a year-long journey. The Klins bought the building after its long-time restaurant occupants moved to the Milagro Centre. A new floor plan includes many sound-proof lesson and rehearsal studios. A

designer by trade, Jason Kline also repurposed Serritella's vintage bar as a reception desk. "I hate waste," he explains. "That bar was part of the building's history. So why not keep it?"

"The place had been vacant for a year. There was so much neglect. Dealing with the homeless was another challenge. Then the pandemic hit. Contractors were hard to find, and material costs went up." To cap it all, an out-of-control SUV smashed through his lobby in August. "Fortunately, no one was hurt," reports Kline. "It's been a tough road. But we're grateful we've had the support of the community all along. We love being here."

**Operation: HOT SPOTS Nails More Bad Guys**

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert has announced the results from the 5th annual "Operation: Hot Spots," a coordinated countywide sting operation aimed at reducing the demand side of human trafficking by targeting sex buyers and sex exploiters.

Community-based organizations from the Sacramento Together Against Human Trafficking coalition voiced the need to crack down on sex buyers who fund and sustain the sex trafficking trade. In response, DA Anne Marie Schubert led the effort to organize this countywide operation, with a commitment from local law enforcement agencies to conduct operations throughout the year to reduce sex trafficking.

The District Attorney's Office created training videos for law enforcement agencies featuring experts on human trafficking victims (adults and juveniles), suspect tactics/manipulations, conducting trafficking investigations, and insights on evidence collection for prosecutions. Education was also provided on our community resources and the services available to victims of human trafficking. Victim advocates are involved in the sting operations to assist with intervention and service referrals for individuals victimized by human traffickers.

In October 2021, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, Sacramento Police Department, Folsom Police Department, Parole, Probation, District Attorney's Office, California Highway Patrol and FBI worked collaboratively to conduct street and hotel operations targeting sex buyers. The operation included law enforcement postings of fake decoy prostitution ads.

The results were: 261 sex buyer responses to fake decoy ads; 22 citations of sex buyers for soliciting for prostitution – court dates are in January 2022; 1 charged with human trafficking of a minor; 1 charged with pandering; 2 opened investigations into pimping and pandering; 2 arrests for carrying a loaded firearm registered to another.

Those convicted of soliciting another for the purpose of buying sex or agreeing to engage in an act of buying a person to engage in an act of

## Sheriff's Hero Joins Park Honorees

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - Forty-eight years have not dimmed memories of Sheriff's Corporal Bruce Verhoeven, who died in

1973 Sacramento shooting incident. The Sheriff's Academy in Carmichael boasts a museum and a street named for him; a foundation established in his name assists police families in times of need.

The corporal's name

last weekend joined 14 other heroes on the Wall of Honor at Patriots Park (Fair Oaks). "It's a proud day for my family," said Verhoeven's daughter Tracey. "Growing up without dad was tough for our family but we always knew

he died doing what he believed in -- protecting other people. That was his life's purpose."

The popular warrant officer was La Sierra High School graduate and Foothill farms resident.

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - For many independent artists and makers, 2020 was a devastating blow because of all the COVID-19 related event closures.

Now there is a feeling of hope amongst many of these small businesses because they are able to once again participate in events like the Sacramento Harvest Festival, happening November 19-21 at Cal Expo.

"In 2020, we had a temporary rebrand to 'Harvest Market' which allowed us to operate under the same regulations that Farmer's Markets did," said Nancy Glenn, owner of the Harvest Festival Original Art and Craft Show. The Sacramento Harvest Festival boasts thousands of American handmade crafts, including original art, jewelry, pottery, clothing, specialty foods, home décor and much more. Throughout the weekend there will also be strolling entertainment, delicious festival foods, artist demonstrations and more.

# Los Rios Spring Class Schedules Now Online

# Hands-on Christmas Fair is Back

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - St John the Evangelist School's annual craft blowout – "A Holiday Show of Hands" – returns as a live event on December 3 and 4.

Due to pandemic restrictions, the festival was reinvented last year as a virtual event. "We've had to introduce some protocols this time," explains indefatigable fair founder Pat Holbus. "Last year was a success but we're glad to welcome people back to a real fair this year. It's our most important school fundraiser. We've never canceled in 43 years."

A vaccination certificate – or proof of a negative COVID test within 72 hours – is required to enter this year's market. Unlike previous years, the 2021 fair will run for only two days. Sunday vending has been

ruled out in order to sanitize St John's for Monday classes.

More than 150 vendors will fill the entire Catholic school campus. Shoppers can also register to bid online for an auction of about 200 items. Most are donated by event vendors; other prizes have been purchased and contributed by church and school supporters. The auction will also offer gourmet food baskets and out-of-town adventures.

In keeping with the festival's tradition for delicious food, St John's will offer homemade lasagna dinners on Friday evening and other specialties on Saturday. Food trucks will also be on hand. An early bird admission is charged on Friday; Saturday attendance is free.

Ten years into his police career, he responded to a robbery-in-progress call from the Gemco store on Fulton Avenue. An armed suspect had fled the store to hide in a nearby apartment complex. Verhoeven cordoned off an area to contain the suspect but, fearing bystanders might be injured, he broke cover and ordered the suspect to drop his gun. The suspect opened fire and Verhoeven was shot. He was awarded a posthumous Sheriff's Department Medal of Valor for the act of bravery that cost his life.

Public response to the tragedy was overwhelming. Thousands of donations poured in for the officer's wife Betty and her two children. After family needs were met, Betty directed surplus funds to a foundation established in her husband's name. "Bruce was a wonderful husband and father," she said. "I miss him every day. His death was a huge tragedy for us but it's comforting that his foundation has been able to help so many other families. It means his memory will never die."

Among speakers at Patriots Park, Sheriff Department veteran Sharon Telles – now a Bruce Verhoeven Foundation trustee – recalled how the pre-Christmas tragedy devastated the Sheriff's downtown office where she

worked. "Bruce was the happiest guy you'd ever know," she said. "We always knew when he was in the building – we could hear him laughing and joking. He loved his job. We'd been one big, happy family and our family was suddenly very silent."

Assemblyman Ken Cooley recalled President Abraham Lincoln's reference to "mystic chords of memory" that stretch from patriots' graves. "In honoring Bruce Verhoeven, we connect with those who have gone before," said Cooley. "He put on his uniform and went out to risk his life for people he'd never met. He should never be forgotten."

CHP veteran Rich Desmond suggested the Wall of Honor served to remind the community of sacrifices made by many law officers and their families. "We are all united by the patriots we remember today," said the District 3 Supervisor.

Sheriff Chief Deputy Jim Barnes noted that police officers sign up with the understanding that tragedies happen in their ranks. "In our profession, we say never forget," he said. "We never do. Knowing that people gather here today to celebrate officers who gave their lives brings us comfort. It tells us our community needs us. We'll always do our very best for them." ★

# A Confusing Array of Sports Betting Measures

Memo to California voters: Prepare to be confused because you could be facing four competing ballot measures next year to legalize sports wagering.

Indian tribes that now have a monopoly on casino gambling in California, big on-line sports betting corporations, horse racing tracks, and local poker parlors are jousting for control of what could be countless billions of dollars in bets on sporting events.

Following a 2018 U.S. Supreme Court ruling that made sports betting legal, a number of other states have accepted it, and the major professional sports leagues, which condemned sports betting for decades, have struck deals with major on-line betting operations.

However, years of efforts in the California Legislature to fashion a system acceptable to all stakeholders fell short. The legislative stalemate meant – as it often does in California – a shift to the alternative arena of ballot measures.

Major casino-owning tribes struck first with a measure that would extend their gambling monopoly to sports wagering, qualifying it for the 2022 ballot.

In reaction, three other

initiatives are in the works, each of which would benefit its sponsor in some way, but it's not certain that all will make the ballot. Although the election is a year away, the calendar for qualifying measures is fairly advanced and sponsors will have to hustle to make it – which means spending millions of dollars for professional signature-gathering campaigns.

The tribal measure already ticketed for the ballot would require sports wagers to be placed either in existing casinos or in locations owned by the tribes. It also would allow sports wagers at major horse racing tracks – an obvious ploy to dampen potential opposition – but would not allow on-line bets on sports events.

The measure, if passed, would block DraftKings and FanDuel, the two major on-line wagering outfits that yearn to operate in California. But it also includes a sly legal attack on the local poker parlors, which have long feuded with the casino tribes, and the cardrooms struck back with a measure of their own that would allow them to accept sports wagers.

Very quickly, DraftKings and FanDuel pledged millions of dollars for a third measure that would allow them to operate in California and have drawn support from some big city mayors by promising that their proposal would provide money to deal with homelessness.

Finally, three casino-owning tribes, two of which have backed the

original tribal measure, are floating a fourth measure that would allow on-line betting controlled by the tribes. It's a hedge against the DraftKings-FanDuel measure because it assumes that given a choice between wagering on-line or driving to a casino to place a bet, betters would prefer the former.


Millions of dollars are already being spent by the sponsors of the four measures and they've commenced hostilities with dueling public relations campaigns in advance of what promises to be a tsunami of television and on-line advertising to persuade voters to choose one over the others.

It would surprise no one if hundreds of millions of dollars are spent on the campaigns next year, because the millions would be pocket lint compared to the billions of wagering dollars that would flow through the hands of whichever interests can claim legal authority.

That said, it's also possible that the campaigns will be short-circuited by a political deal. Those who sponsor ballot measures can remove them from the ballot if their demands are met by legislation.

Given the years of legislative stalemate on the issue, it's difficult to see the competing interests agreeing to divvy up the pie, but it's not an impossible resolution.

We have about \$27,000 of debt left to pay off, and he makes a little over \$80,000 a year. I'm nervous because his slow season is coming up between now and then. During this time, he usually gets about half the hours – and, of course, less money – than he does during the rest of the year. I'm a little scared, even though there hasn't been a strike in the last six years. Do you think we should go ahead and pay off our remaining debt or hold onto every

penny in case they walk out?

– Cheyanne

Dear Cheyanne,

I'm going to tell you something that might just blow your mind: You two can pay off the debt and have some money set aside to live on in that length of time. If you do that, you'll actually be more ready for a strike than ever before. You'll both have to be on the same page financially and do things with a sense of urgency, but right now, I don't think you've got too much to worry about.

The likelihood of them going on strike is pretty low. Chances are, they're just rattling their sabers and talking big to posture for the negotiations. Most factories are behind right now, and the last thing they want is to get even further behind. Everything has been so screwed up by COVID-19 that unless the union demands some completely ridiculous stuff,

things will probably work out fine.

I think you guys are going to be fine, Cheyanne. Should you be intentional and thoughtful about the situation? Absolutely. It's always wise to look ahead and plan for the future. Getting that debt paid off and saving up a bunch of cash will give you real peace of mind.

I'm calling for a single, lead point of contact to keep all stakeholders on track and bring all parties to the table for new ideas and solutions. These regulations are failing to recognize the gravity of this situation and the reality that the supply chain is fully interrupted. Without the necessary materials,

goods, and infrastructure it is impossible for California companies to meet the fast approaching deadlines. Without CARB publicly stating their cooperation, I am certain that we will see excessive fines and penalties on all companies and ports involved in this current goods movement crises. Lastly, we need to ensure the safety of our truckers, dock workers, ship crews, and everyone else who are working tirelessly to tackle the Mount Everest of containers awaiting them on the more than 70 ships currently parked offshore to unload products for all Americans."

# American Innovators, not Regulators, Will Solve Climate Change

President Biden has pledged to cut America's greenhouse gas emissions in half by 2030. He intends to meet this ambitious target through a wave of new federal spending and government programs. Yet, our best hope for reducing carbon emissions isn't new government spending. It's a technological sea-change – one that can only come from the private sector.

Government is slowing progress against climate change by imposing regulations that prevent emissions-lowering technologies from reaching the market. If our leaders really want to save the planet, they need to get out of the way of entrepreneurs who can actually do so.

One would expect the government to embrace technology with the potential to cut carbon pollution. President Biden himself has promised to "spur American technological innovation" as part of his climate agenda.

Unfortunately, some of the most promising green-tech breakthroughs face severe headwinds as a result of misguided or antiquated federal policies.

One such technology – profiled in "They Say It Can't Be Done," a new documentary on the relationship between innovators and regulations – is an artificial tree developed by Arizona State University physicist and engineer Klaus Lackner. These man-made trees contain a special plastic resin that can absorb carbon dioxide and release it when submerged in water. They're 1,000 times more effective at taking in carbon dioxide from the air than natural trees. Once captured, this carbon dioxide can then be reclaimed and converted into fuel.

Lackner's design could be scaled to produce units that each remove a metric ton of carbon dioxide daily. The main stumbling block is the lack of clear regulations surrounding carbon capture technologies.

Until a uniform federal framework exists, the process of bringing this technology to market will remain impossibly complicated

and fraught with risk.

Or consider technologies that could reduce the need for large-scale livestock farming. Raising billions of chickens, pigs, and cattle requires vast amounts of water, feed, and land. The resulting carbon footprint is massive – about 7.1 gigatons of greenhouse gases a year.

Here too, new technologies could help reduce emissions. Researchers are designing cell-cultured meat produced in the lab rather than the feedlot. This lab-grown protein is safe, healthy, and far less carbon-intensive than traditionally farmed meat.

One start-up that makes lab-grown meat, Eat Just Inc., has obtained approval to sell its cell-cultured chicken in Singapore. But it's still waiting on the green light from American regulators. According to the firm's founder, it could be another year – or more – before U.S. approval comes through.

For an industry as capital-intensive as cultured meat production, this sluggish approval process can make it impossible for a start-up to launch and get its products to market.

High-tech solutions like these are precisely what's required to protect our planet from the threat of climate change. While it's impossible to say whether lab-grown meat or artificial trees are the best solution, an accessible and level regulatory playing field allows the best innovations to thrive.

Too many Americans believe that when it comes to climate change, only the government is up to the task. The fact is, the main barrier to large-scale adoption of sustainable technologies isn't a lack of government involvement, but too much – or at least the wrong kind.

In order to make good on his promise to reduce the nation's carbon footprint, the president and his team will need to recognize how government obstructs the development and deployment of technology that can fulfill that promise.

prostitution, face a maximum penalty of 180 days in county jail, will be subject to search and seizure, and may be ordered to stay away from the involved locations or known "stroll" areas.

"We are committed to continuing sting operations through the Sacramento Together coalition to target sex traffickers and buyers as well as maximize our efforts to protect and serve victims of sexual exploitation."

# Joint Statement from Agencies Regarding Pfizer Vaccine for Children

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The California Health and Human Services Agency Secretary Dr. Mark Ghaly, and Director of the California Department of Public Health and State Public Health Officer Dr. Tomás J. Aragón, issued a joint statement on the Western States Scientific Safety Review Workgroup's recommendation to administer Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines for children ages 5-11.

"Vaccines are how we end this pandemic, and the ability to vaccinate more children who have remained vulnerable to COVID-19 strengthens our fight against this deadly virus. Californians ages 5-11 can now get the same robust protection that has helped save countless lives. The vaccine has been administered safely to millions of people ages 12 and up, and federal and state medical experts agree that the clinical trials have been rigorous in demonstrating that the vaccine is safe and effective for children ages 5-11. Last year's winter surge was devastating in our state, and it is critically important that all eligible Californians supercharge their protection against COVID-19 ahead of the winter months. By getting more family members including children ages 5-11 vaccinated, we can celebrate the holidays safely and help avoid preventable hospitalizations and deaths."

California will begin vaccinating

children ages 5-11 today with 500 organizations across the state receiving their first shipments through next Monday. The state was allocated 1.2 million pediatric doses from the federal government with adequate supply to vaccinate all newly eligible Californians becoming available in the coming weeks. The state has more than 4,000 locations ready to vaccinate children ages 5-11 as supply increases and is leveraging existing infrastructure and partnerships used to administer vaccines to teens and young adults. This includes working closely with medical providers, local health departments, schools, community partners and others to administer vaccines safely and equitably through mobile clinics and vaccine pop-ups in the hardest-hit communities across the state.

Parents are encouraged to call their child's health care provider to schedule a COVID-19 vaccine appointment. Parents can also visit [MyTurn.ca.gov](http://MyTurn.ca.gov) or call the hotline at 833-422-4255 beginning tomorrow to find a nearby vaccination site. The COVID-19 vaccine is free for all Californians regardless of insurance and immigration status. All Californians are strongly encouraged to get vaccinated or complete their vaccination series, get a booster when eligible, and get a flu vaccine, which can be administered at the same time.

Senator Ochoa Bogh released the following statement:





DO YOU HAVE QUESTIONS ABOUT REAL ID?

**REAL ID** SAFE. SECURE. SMART.

The DMV has answers! Changes to the deadline, limited-time fee waivers, and a simplified application process have all been recently announced. Read below for details on how to get your REAL ID.

**Q: I Paid The Fee To Renew My Driver's License Online Last Year, But Offices Were Closed Due To COVID-19, So I Couldn't Get a REAL ID. Will I Have To Pay A Fee Again To Upgrade To The REAL ID This Year?**

**A: No!** For a limited time, customers who have recently renewed a driver's license or identification card that is not federally compliant will be able to upgrade to a REAL ID for free! If you paid a fee to renew a driver's license or ID card between since March 2020, you will qualify but you must act now – the free REAL ID upgrade is only available until the end of the year.

The DMV is offering this free upgrade as a part of their continual efforts to accommodate customers who faced barriers due to COVID-19. It's important that everyone who is eligible and wants one can get a REAL ID. In May 2023, anyone flying domestically, visiting a military base or other federal facility will need a form of federal ID, like a REAL ID, to do so.

The process to get a REAL ID is also easier than ever – it is now possible to begin the REAL ID application and upload your documents online before visiting a DMV office to complete the process. Making your visit at the window 10 minutes or less.

**Q: Which documents will I need to get a REAL ID?**

**A:** The DMV has made it easier than ever to get a REAL ID. Recently the DMV also announced that you no longer need to supply your social security card – just your social security number. To apply, you will need to provide ONE identity document that includes your date of birth and your full name – like an original or certified birth certificate, or a valid US passport. You'll also need to provide TWO documents that show your name and address to prove you're a California resident. You can use cell phone and utilities bills, your mortgage, bank statements, or even your vehicle registration.

You can start your application online today and find a complete step-by-step checklist of all approved documents at [REALID.dmv.ca.gov](http://REALID.dmv.ca.gov). If you upload your documents online before visiting a DMV office to complete the process, your time at the window will be 10 minutes or less.

# Pasteur Act can Reinvigorate the Broken Antibiotic Market

**Commentary**

Antibiotics have made modern medicine possible. Without them, surgeries and other routine medical procedures would be incredibly risky to conduct. In fact, antibiotics are so prevalent throughout society – Americans fill over 260 million antibiotics prescriptions annually at the pharmacy – that it's tough to fathom a world without them.

But we may have to start fathoming.

Bacteria and fungi are developing immunity to our current arsenal of antibiotics. Every time a patient takes these drugs – whether for strep throat or to prevent post-surgery infections – some bacteria may survive and multiply into stronger, more resistant strains.

Without more research and development spending that yields a constant stream of new antibiotics, millions could die in the years ahead.

The threat is already circulating among us. Each year, more than 35,000 Americans die from a drug resistant infection. Researchers at

Washington University in St. Louis believe the true annual death toll may exceed 162,000.

All Americans – including healthy young people – are at risk from these “superbugs.” Children, cancer patients, and people over the age of 60 are at even greater risk, though. Patients with chronic conditions are also particularly vulnerable.

Antimicrobial resistance was especially apparent during the height of the pandemic. A recent study found that 50% of those who died from Covid-19 had acquired a secondary bacterial infection in their last days of life.

It's critical we have medicines capable of treating bacterial infections. When old antibiotics become ineffective, we need new, cutting-edge drugs to replace them. Yet the high-risk nature of antibiotic R&D can deter even the most hopeful investor from funding much-needed projects.

Antibiotics are only used for about a week and should only be prescribed when absolutely necessary. As a result, firms typically sell

relatively few doses of antibiotics. Since more regularly prescribed medicines are more likely to return investors their money, companies do not invest time and capital in developing drugs for pathogens that are rare today – but pose a grave threat to public health in the future.

Researchers warn that without new antibiotics, drug-resistant infections could kill 10 million people annually by 2050.

Thankfully, bipartisan minds in Congress recognize the need for new antibiotics and proposed a method to reinvigorate antibiotic research and development. Named after the famed microbiologist Louis Pasteur, the PASTEUR Act would adjust the incentive structure for antibiotics research.

The bill would implement a “Netflix-style” payment model for antibiotics in which the government pays firms a fixed fee for access to their treatments. Antibiotic developers' revenue wouldn't depend solely on sales volume – though developers would still be free to sell the medicines to

hospitals and insurers.

The Pasteur Act also prevents overprescribing by establishing a new grant system to support antibiotic stewardship programs in hospitals. These programs seek to improve doctors' antibiotic prescribing habits by investing in education, accountability, reporting and tracking of antibiotic usage and resistance.

As founders and CEOs of research organizations focused on antibiotic development, we are committed to saving patients' lives. We sometimes find ourselves competing for the same investor dollars. However, we stand firmly together on this important issue – because the solution is clear. If passed, the PASTEUR Act will boost antibiotic innovation and support the backbone of modern medicine.

We can all agree on that.

# Proposed Initiative Enters Circulation

Office of California Secretary of State Dr. Shirley N. Weber

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Secretary of State Dr. Shirley N. Weber announced that the proponents of a new initiative were cleared to begin collecting petition signatures on October 29, 2021.

The Attorney General prepares the legal title and summary that is required to appear on initiative petitions. When the official language is complete, the Attorney General forwards it to the proponents and to the Secretary of State, and the initiative may be circulated for signatures. The Secretary of State then provides calendar deadlines to the proponents and to county elections officials. The Attorney General's official title and summary for the measure is as follows:

**REQUIRES ON-SITE LICENSED MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL AT KIDNEY DIALYSIS CLINICS AND ESTABLISHES OTHER STATE REQUIREMENTS. INITIATIVE STATUTE.** Requires physician, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant, with six months' relevant experience, on site during treatment at outpatient kidney dialysis clinics; authorizes exemption for staffing shortage if qualified medical professional is available through telehealth. Requires clinics to disclose to patients all physicians with clinic

ownership interests of five percent or more. Requires clinics to report dialysis-related infection data to state. Prohibits clinics from closing or substantially reducing services without state approval. Prohibits clinics from refusing to treat patients based on source of payment. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local governments: Increased state and local government costs likely in the low tens of millions of dollars annually. (21-0013.)

The Secretary of State's tracking number for this measure is 1907 and the Attorney General's tracking number is 21-0013.

The proponents of the measure, Sean Fleming and Jonathan Everhart, must collect signatures of 623,212 registered voters (five percent of the total votes cast for governor in the November 2018 general election) in order for the measure to become eligible for the ballot. The proponents have 180 days to circulate petitions for the measure, meaning the signatures must be submitted to county elections officials no later than April 27, 2022. 

# Turning 65 ... Is Medicare Annual Enrollment Time for Me?

*Hello Toni:*

I turn 65 in April and overwhelmed by all the mail I am getting this year for Medicare Annual Enrollment. What do I do? The mail from companies says theirs is the best, but they all offer the same thing

with dental, vision and gym membership.

One Medicare Advantage commercial on TV says that they can put \$144 back in your Social Security check. I am not receiving my Social Security check and wonder how I can get the \$144.

If I do not enroll in Medicare at the right time everybody says I will get a penalty that will last the rest of my life. How does someone know what is the right decision for their situation? Look forward to your answer.

Matt,

The answer to your question is you can do **NOTHING!!! NADA!!!** during the Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (aka Open Enrollment) because **you are not 65** yet and have not enrolled in Medicare.

Next year's, Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (aka Open Enrollment) is when you can make a change to your Part D plan, change, or enroll in a Medicare Advantage plan with or without a Medicare Part D prescription drug plan.

You **MUST** have already turned 65 or under 65 and enrolled in Medicare to enroll or change either a Medicare Part D prescription drug plan or Medicare Advantage plan during Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (aka Open Enrollment).

Since you are turning 65 in April and will be in your **Medicare Initial Enrollment Period** that is a **7-month period** that begins 3 months prior to April, the month of April and 3 months after. January is 3 months prior to April, which is a good time to begin enrolling in Medicare and exploring which Medicare option best fits your specific medical and prescription drug needs.

Talk with your medical provider to discover what type of Medicare plan whether Medicare Advantage plan with prescription drug plan or Original/Traditional Medicare with a Medicare Supplement and a stand-alone Medicare Part D plan is right for your health situation and the prescriptions you are taking.

As we say at the Toni Says® office, "Medicare is not a cookie cutter, one size or plan does not fit everyone." The insurance companies market their specific Medicare plans and want you to believe that theirs is perfect for you.




