CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - How many volunteers does it take a plant a tree?

More than 50 Kiwanians, SMUD employees, Carmichael Park District staff and other workers got National Clean Air Day off to a healthy start last week by planting saplings in La Sierra Community Center. The landscaping replaces Modesto ashes whose demise (through natural attrition) reduced shade for sports events and for the Californian Montessori Project School campus.

Donated by Sacramento Tree Foundation, 12 new trees included willow oaks, frontier elms and Zelkovas. All are varieties chosen to tolerate Sacramento drought and growing extremes of climate change. "SMUD recognizes we're in a climate emergency" explained SMUD director Heidi Sanborn. "We're on a path to achieve zero carbon emissions from our power supply by the year 2030. As a utility company, we lead the nation in setting this goal. We support the Tree Foundation because showed up to aid the Clean Air Day plants take carbon from the atmo- effort. "We're Kiwanians – that's sphere to the soil. We're combatting

urban heat islands by providing shade. These trees will grow big. They'll partially cover hot asphalt and help keep the schoolyard cool."

Sanborn is also a Carmichael Kiwanis member and joins Len Ohlendorf in chairing the club's Giving Tree Project. This program aims to beautify, to improve air quality and to increase shade at local schools. "We're planting trees to give back to the community and to help kids," she told volunteers who

Water District Rejects **Counterclaims** of Former **Employees**

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Earlier this year, the Carmichael Water District Board of Directors voted to move forward with a lawsuit against former General Manager Steve Nugent, former Assistant General Manager Lynette Moreno, and former Human Resources Coordinator Lori Kalisiak.

The move came after a special procedures audit report revealed that more than \$640,000 in benefits had been received by District employees over 10 years without Board approval - and the majority of the unauthorized funds went to those three members of management staff. The District contends that Nugent, Moreno, and Kalisiak conspired to obtain these benefits, so the lawsuit, filed in April, seeks restitution for the total value.

In July, the defendants' attorney, Wesley Ehlers, filed an answer to the lawsuit, in the form of a cross-complaint for damages against the District. Claims for Moreno and Kalisiak were submitted under the Government Claims Act, which gives the District an opportunity to consider and remedy the claimed injuries before a lawsuit is officially filed. The claims specifically name Directors Mark Emmerson, Jeff Nelson, Ron Greenwood, and Paul Selsky, as well as current General Manager Cathy Lee, stating that they have slandered and defamed the claimants, causing emotional distress, loss of wages and employment opportunities, and other damages.

Moreno's claim states that she was slated for promotion to general manager when former General Manager Steve Nugent announced his retirement in July 2019. But her attorney says contract negotiations failed because the District wanted Moreno to accept benefits less than what she was making as assistant manager. They then recruited to fill the position, ultimately hiring Lee for the role. According to Moreno's attorney, after Lee was hired, she and the named directors began harassing and undermining Moreno.

The claims for both Moreno and Kalisiak state that they were accused of embezzlement through employee benefits, with Lee making such comments during staff meetings. And their attorney claims that when the Board of Directors voted in May 2020 to remove the

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Mentally capable, terminally ill patients with less than six months to live will now have much easier access to medical aid-in-dying, thanks to a bill just signed by Gov.

Patients still have to get the approval of two doctors, but Senate Bill 380 shortens the waiting period between 2 oral requests for the prescription from 15 days to 48

Gavin Newsom.

Amanda Villegas, an advocate and widow of cancer patient Chris Davis who passed away soon after diagnosis in 2019 without being able to take advantage of the end-of-life care option, said his suffering – and his family's – was prolonged unnecessarily.

"He wanted other patients to not have to endure what he endured," Villegas recounted. "He told me, 'Don't stop. Show the photos, tell my story. Let it be known that this needs to change."

Groups opposed to the bill

cite religious and moral concerns. A study from Kaiser found one-third of terminally ill adults who ask for medical aid-in-dying pass away before they complete the eligibility process. Advocates estimate since California's End of Life Option Act took effect five years ago, almost 1,400 people have died before obtaining a prescription.

The bill also requires hospitals and hospices to post their stance on medical aidin-dying on their websites, so patients do not waste precious time trying to find out if their provider is willing to help them.

Kim Callinan, president and CEO of the Compassion and Choices Action Network, said she hopes other states will follow the Golden State's lead.

"This is a huge victory for the moment, for Californians and for really dying Americans in every state," Callinan asserted.

The bill takes effect Jan. 1. Nine other states and Washington D.C have passed medical aid-in-dying legislation. ★

unauthorized benefits, it was clear the matter had already been discussed in a closed session, in violation of the Ralph M. Brown Act that guarantees public access to meetings and materials.

The claims further state that the directions given to Richardson & Company, LLP, which conducted the special procedures audit of employee benefits from 2010 through July 2020, included false claims about the creation of an unauthorized benefits package, resulting in multiple inaccuracies in the final report. Moreno and Kalisiak claim that the benefits were authorized by the directors and created under their direction as part of an employee retention program discussed in former General Manager Nugent's performance evaluations in 2008. Their claim asserts that the benefits were authorized since for more than a decade the directors approved budgets and expenditures that included those benefits.

Moreno ultimately resigned from her position in December 2020 due to what her attorney calls a hostile work environment, while Kalisiak was terminated after the April 2021 meeting when the Board announced the lawsuit. Kalisiak's claim also includes a demand for defense and indemnity because she contends that her conduct was within the scope and course of her employment, as she was only promoted to her management position in October 2011, after the benefits had already been implemented.

While this type of demand can be legally upheld, the District can refuse to provide a defense if they contend that any of three conditions apply: the act was not within the scope of employment, providing a defense would create a conflict of interest, or the former employee's actions were due to fraud, corruption, or malice. In its answer, the District must provide a reason for refusal, and General Manager Lee submitted a memo on the matter, writing, "Those reasons are obvious - the District has sued the defendant former managers, including Ms. Kalisiak, because they worked in concert to obtain unauthorized benefits from the District without Board approval or authorization in a value exceeding \$640,000, and have refused to acknowledge any wrongdoing or make any restitution." Lee recommended that Kalisiak's demand for defense and indemnity be refused "on all three grounds."

At a special meeting on August 2, 2021, the Board of Directors unanimously voted to reject all the claims of Moreno and Kalisiak. District Counsel Josh Horowitz stated that all the issues raised in the countersuit would be addressed during litigation.

After losing more than \$640,000 over 10 years, the District is looking to strengthen internal controls to avoid similar incidents in the future. Richardson & Company's special procedures audit report recommended reviews of employee pay and benefits as part of the District's annual audit. Richardson & Company have experience working on this particular issue. Lee suggested that they were best positioned to perform these services and ensure the previous problems had been resolved. The cost of these services – \$8,500 for the audit, with some additional funding for any unforeseen expenses that arise during the scope of work – was not included in the current budget, so at the September 21 meeting the Board voted unanimously to approve \$10,000 to cover these costs.



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Will New Measures Fix California's Colleges?

As California's population swelled in the post-World War II era, thanks to a flood of newcomers from other states and the postwar baby boom, it had a major impact on the state's colleges.

New Californians, many of them veterans seeking education under the GI bill, and, eventually, the baby boomers sought college degrees as tickets to prosperous futures. Meanwhile, the state's economy needed educated workers as it evolved from agriculture and other resource-based sectors into manufacturing, logistics and technology.

There was, however, little or no logic to how the paper during the last few University of California, state colleges (later universities) and an expanding array of locally governed community colleges met the demand. Each segment, and often each college, decided which students would be admitted and what courses would be offered.

As the collegiate chaos worsened, Gov. Pat Brown, elected in 1958, proposed that the three be folded into a single higher education system, as other states were doing. However, his proposal didn't sit well with those running the schools and the upshot was a compromise called the "Master Plan for

Higher Education."

Adopted in 1960, the plan sought to define each segment's role, minimize competition for students and money, and make movement of students from one level to another seamless.

The University of the brightest 12.5% of high school graduates, conduct research and award doctorate degrees in a variety of fields. State colleges would admit the top 33% of high school grads, train professionals such as teachers and engineers and award master's degrees. Community colleges would handle anyone else "capable of benefiting from instruction," award two-year associate degrees and prepare students for transfers into four-year

That was the theory, anyway, and it kind of worked for a decade or two, but began to fall apart for many reasons – demographic, economic, financial and political and has largely existed on decades.

Periodically, politicians and educators have toyed with the idea of overhauling the master plan, but in higher education, as with other public programs, inertia reigns. Those who wield authority, however flawed, are generally unwilling to risk it via systemic change.

Legislature has tinkered with aspects of the plan but the three sectors have steadily become more competitive and the theoretically seamless pathway for students to climb through the systems has often been choked. The state universities

sought, with some success, to penetrate UC's monopoly on doctorate degrees and the community colleges, likewise, gained the experimental ability to offer four-year degrees in a few

Last week, Gov. Gavin California would take in Newsom signed a sheaf of higher education bills, some of which purport to shore up

master plan weaknesses. "We're turning commitments into reality by ensuring that our students have more access to high-quality educational opportunities, creating a change of course for generations to come and bolstering California's innovation economy," Newsom said. "Californians have thrived at our world class universities for decades, but not everyone has had similar access. Today that's changing."


The most important measures, Assembly Bill 928 and AB 1111, are aimed at making it easier for students to begin higher education in low-cost community colleges and transfer into UC and the state university systems by eliminating petty curricular conflicts.

Another important one, AB 927, extends the experimental ability of community colleges to award baccalaureate degrees in technical fields that the four-year colleges have shunned.

We don't know whether the package will improve Occasionally, the California's lagging ability to provide the highly trained workforce that its economy needs. But it's a commendable, long-overdue effort.

WHEREAS, section 17556, et seq. of the Education Code authorizes the San Juan Unified School District ("District") to dedicate or convey an easement/real property to municipal corporations for public streets or highways and to a public corporation, to lay, construct, reconstruct, maintain and operate water, sewer, gas, or storm drain facilities or ditches, electric or telephone lines, and access roads used in connection therewith, either with or without consideration and without a vote of the electors of the District being taken;

WHEREAS, the District desires to dedicate a permanent easement for access and maintenance to the Citrus Heights Water District for the purpose of construction, reconstruction, installation, replacement, removal, repair, alteration, operation, maintenance, inspection and use of a 12" water main within the easement area and through that certain real property in the City of Citrus Heights, County of Sacramento, State of California, at Mesa Verde High School, located at 750 I Carriage Drive, Citrus Heights, CA 95621. The proposed easement is specifically described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by the reference (hereinafter referred to as the "Easement"); and

WHEREAS, the District desires to give notice of its intent to dedicate to the Citrus Heights Water District the Easement described above and to call a public hearing in connection therewith.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Education of San Juan Unified School District does hereby resolve as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted as true and correct.

Section 2. The District declares its intent to dedicate and convey the Easement to the Citrus Heights Water District, as described and depicted in Exhibit" A" for the purposes set forth in the Grant of Easement Document attached here forth.

Section 3. The Superintendent or a designee thereof is hereby directed to give notice that on October 26, 2021 at 6:30 p.m. or as soon thereafter as practicable, at the District Board Room, located at 3738 Walnut Avenue, Carmichael, CA, the board will hold a public hearing on the question of making the conveyance of the Easement to the Citrus Heights Water District. The public hearing shall be held during a regularly scheduled public meeting of the board. Notice of the public hearing shall be given by posting copies of this resolution, signed by the majority of the board, in three public places within the District at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing, and by publishing the notice once in a newspaper of general circulation in the District, at least five (5) days prior to the hearing. At the time and place of the hearing, if no legal protest is entered, the board may adopt a resolution by a two-thirds vote of all its members authorizing and directing the conveyance of the Easement to the Citrus Heights Water District.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO CONVEY A TEMPORARY EASEMENT TO THE CITRUS HEIGHTS WATER DISTRICT

WHEREAS, San Juan Unified School District ("District") owns real property located at 750 I Carriage Drive, Citrus Heights, California, in the County of Sacramento, State of California, bearing Assessor's Parcel Number (APN 204-0220-001-0000);

WHEREAS, Citrus Heights Water District ("CHWD") has requested that the District convey to CHWD, a Temporary Construction Easement ("Easement") for right of way and construction purposes, over an area of real property on APN (204-0220-001-0000) of approximately 3 I, I 77 .23 square feet, as generally described and depicted in Exhibit A ("Easement Area");

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Easement is for CHWD to access and construct a 12-inch water transmission main on the District's property;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code section 17557, before so conveying property, a school district's governing board must adopt a resolution in an open meeting by a twothirds vote of all of its members declaring the intention to convey the property.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Education of the San Juan Unified School District hereby finds, determines, declares, orders, and resolves as follows:

1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted as true and correct.

2. Intent to Dedicate, Terms, and Conditions. Pursuant to Education Code sections 17556, et seq., it is the intention of the District to convey to CHWD the Easement generally described and depicted in the attached Exhibit A for the purposes described herein.

3. Public Hearing. Public-Service Workers Rejoice as Feds Forgive Student Debt

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -Hundreds of thousands of teachers, nurses, social workers, military officers and others in public service can breathe a sigh of relief as the Biden adminreforms to the publicservice loan forgiveness

program. Miguel Cardona, U.S. Secretary of Education, said the program will be streamlined so about 550,000 more people will qualify.

"In 2007, Congress made a pledge to forgive loans if you serve the community for ten years, and we're going to remarked.

The program is supposed to pay off remaining loans for people who have made payments for ten

years while working in a qualifying profession, but you had to have a certain type of loan. Now, people can get a waiver and be able to count payments on other types of student loans toward the forgiveness program.

Merrie Wolf, a longtime istration announced major math teacher from Tulsa, was told after a decade of payments that she would have to convert to a different type of loan and start the clock all over again.

> "The student-loan process has been a nightmare, to say the least," Wolf asserted. "I was led to believe a whole ten years that I was headed toward Public Service Loan Forgiveness."

According to the make that right," Cardona Institute for College Access and Success. in 2018-19, the most recent year from which data is available, 48% of California college graduates had student loan debt, with an average debt load of more than \$21,000.

A GAO report found 99% of the people who apply for the Public Service Loan Forgiveness program are denied.

Jesse Yedinak Gray, research director and assistant professor at Brown University School of Public Health, said the changes are a light at the end of the tunnel after years of crushing debt.

"It's a lot of money that you don't get to use to save for retirement, or save for, say, my son's education either," Gray pointed out. "It's ending up costing so much more than I ever thought it would."

The changes mean more military officers will qualify, and the feds are going to review all applications that were previously denied.





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Parents: The Secret to Drug-Free Youth

On average, kids first try drugs between the ages of 13-15. Statistics like these can be terrifying to parents who are trying to keep their children drugfree in a world that glamorizes getting high. While statistics around teen drug abuse are troubling, there is one ray of hope that continues to bring adolescent drug use down: Parents. Research repeatedly shows that parents are the number one influence in their child's life. So armed with the knowledge that you really can make a difference, let's talk about the "how" of helping your child stay drug-free.

Set clear expectations

Help your child stay drug-free by setting clear rules and expectations. Talk to your child about family rules concerning drugs, marijuana, alcohol, inhalants, and other risky behaviors. Set clear consequences about what happens when those rules are broken. School-sponsored programs should NOT be the first time your child hears about or considers the consequences of drug use. Research shows that you should talk to your child about the harms and dangers of drugs as early as nine years old.

Come up with a plan

With your child or teen come up with a plan for when they will be confronted with the choice to participate in risky behaviors. Talk out and act out different scenarios with your child before they face these tense situations with peer pressure and emotional stress on their own. You might get some pushback from your older teens about roleplaying. Share your personal experiences or other stories that will help your teen feel empowered to say "no" in high-pressure situations.

The plan to stay drug-free should also include steps for what to do if your child makes a mistake or finds themselves in a bad situation. Growing up my family had a code word that we could text to our

parents that meant "come get me right now!" When I would find myself in a tricky situation I would send off the code word in a text to my dad. Within a few seconds, my dad would call asking me to come home. That way I didn't have to come up with excuses of why I was leaving early--I just blamed my "uncool" parents.

Show you care

Lastly, be involved in your child's life. Every time your child or teen leaves the house you should be asking questions about who they will be with, what they are doing, and if parents will be present. When you know your child and are an active part of their life, having tough conversations becomes a lot easier. Building and maintaining trust between you and your child starts with becoming part of their world. Have fun together, talk together, and ask them questions about their day. When you show your child you care about every part of their life they are more likely to open up to you about the things that are troubling them.

Helping your child stay drug-free doesn't have to be overly complicated. As their parent, you have the power to influence their decisions now and in the future. Don't shy away from hard conversations about family rules and expectations, but instead see it as your chance to help shape your child's future.



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






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Capitol Waste Indeed

Just months ago, we anticipated a \$54 billion state budget deficit, expecting cuts to funding and resources that would continue the economic onslaught of the pandemic. However in 2021, we found ourselves with a \$15 billion one time budget surplus, and a proposed 2021-22 budget of \$221 billion. Finally a \$262.6 billion was approved. which includes \$1 billion dedicated to the wildfire and forest resilience action plan; \$1.5 billion in relief for small businesses; and \$2.7 billion to achieve the state's zeroemission vehicle goals.

These are big needs and big numbers! Shouldn't we expect that our electeds spend these dollars wisely and serve us with our interests in mind? At the same time we are spending \$1 billion on our wildfires, our legislators are also spending a little more than \$1 billion on a luxury project for themselves.

It should not be too much to ask that a luxury project which sidelines the needs of Californians should itself be sidelined. This project – known as the Capitol Annex Project – will demolish-and-rebuild the historic Capitol Annex (which houses lawmakers' offices), build an underground parking structure exclusively for high-ranking elected officials, and construct a visitor

center, to the tune of a whopping \$1.2 billion dollars.

To put this sum in perspective, consider similar spending plans outlined in the state's 2021-22 budget as mentioned above. There is no doubt \$1.2 billion can go far in helping Californians – so why waste it on a project that would only benefit our politicians?

Certainly, ensuring the safety of our legislators' workplace is important. Yet, experts say that the Capitol Annex can be retrofitted to address health and safety concerns for a fraction of the cost of the current plan. Additionally, a "Swing Space" that is housing legislators during the Annex rebuild is already funded at \$450 million, with office space and parking aplenty. As for the visitor center, moving forward with a Disneyland-like attraction during a pandemic is ill-conceived.

Most concerning of all is where the \$1.2 billion project funding will be pulled from - the wallets of taxpayers. Since the project was approved to be funded using revenue bonds in a fiscal emergency, that means we are racking up 30% more in interest on the debt to be repaid over 30 years, ballooning the cost of the

The legislature denied project information to the Historic State Capitol Commission - which was created by the legislature in 1976 to protect the State Capitol's historical and architectural restoration integrity - resulting in the resignaprotest. Cooley and the Joint Rules Committee are calling the shots. Why all the secrecy?

Even without the COVID crisis, the Capitol Annex project is a stunning waste of taxpayer dollars - especially when the state has so many pressing matters that need to be addressed. While we can be hopeful about having a budget surplus, we need to face the realities of today. Many Californians are still struggling to put food on the table, many remain unemployed, and many continue to face homelessness.

When the Legislature resumes session, they have a responsibility to focus on our economic recovery, ensuring Californians needs are met first. Under the umbrella of Save Our Capitol!, the Sacramento Taxpayers Association, small businesses, preservationists and environmentalists call upon Governor Newsom and the legislature to pause the Capitol Annex Project, and revaluate its need with input from experts and the public.
