CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - After nearly 20 months of pandemic hiatus, the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce is back to in-person business. Its first 2021 luncheon will reunite members on August 24. One of Carmichael's longest-serving community groups, the 73-year-old nonprofit last year cancelled meetings and fundraisers and resorted to communication via Zoom.

"Like many organizations, we've had a challenging time," says Chamber President Joe Green. "We never stopped working for our members, but COVID restricted our group

activities. We're happy we can now greet friends one-on-one and get back to our mission of connecting business and community. We feel reinvigorated and excited to move forward." Recently appointed Julie DePrada-Schott will next week take office as the group's Executive Director. The 45-year-old previously worked for the Sunrise Market Place Business Improvement District. She will sit among several new directors at the Carmichael board table.

Members can meet CEO DePrada-Schott during an August 11 mixer at River City Brewery. The informal event is open to the public and offers a no-host bar. Next on the agenda is the Chamber's sit-down luncheon on August 24 at the Milagro Centre. Nationally-known martial arts teacher and motivator Dave Kovar is the speaker. This limited-space event costs \$20 for members. Business members may also join a monthly first-Wednesday luncheon at Rey Azteca Cantina.

School Board Approves Expansion and New Election Map

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On July 27, the San Juan Unified School District (SJUSD) Board of Education moved toward compliance with the California Voting Rights Act (CVRA) by holding the final public hearings on the transition to trustee-area elections.

Many community members spoke in support of expanding the Board to seven seats, both at the July 27 public hearings and at multiple rounds of public hearings in recent weeks. Proponents of the expansion argued that more Board members would result in better representation, in particular for underrepresented areas with higher concentrations of minority voters, such as Arden Arcade and Citrus Heights.

After hearing all the comments from the community about the possible expansion, most Board members stated they could see the pros and cons of both options. While some community members preferred remaining at five seats, the Board acknowledged that the majority of public comments supported expansion. They voted 4-1 in favor of expanding the Board to seven, with Vice President Michael McKibbin dissenting.

McKibbin reasoned that the move to trustee-area elections would already provide more localized representation, and that a seven-member Board might have a more difficult time reaching consensus, thus making governance more difficult. "I do not believe that moving to seven trustees would be a triumph of good governance. I think it would be a triumph for politics," said McKibbin, echoing a community concern that the push for expansion is due to some residents' political ambitions.

After voting to expand, the Board next deliberated on whether to ask the State Board of Education for a waiver allowing SJUSD to bypass the legal requirements associated with that expansion. Without a waiver, the decision to expand would need to be taken to the voters of the district in a special election – and SJUSD would be responsible for the cost. If voters approved the expansion, the Board would then be required to appoint the new members, whose terms would then (due to outdated terms in the Education Code) end in odd-numbered years. This would cause major

New "Jazzershop" Community Chorus Forms in Fair Oaks

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - A new mixed-voice a cappella community chorus, "Stay Tuned" has formed in Fair Oaks. Their vocal style is decidedly "jazzershop," a term coined by their musical director Terrie Carrozzella.

"We are jazz-focused, but we also sing some pop and other a cappella music." The term barbershop relates to the way which the music is arranged," she said.

The chorus welcomes all singers and embraces the motto "everyone in harmony," said its director. The chorus is a subsidiary of a well-known Sacramento-based men's barbershop chorus, the award-winning Voices of California (VoCal) Chorus.

Membership is approximately 25, Carrozzella said. She anticipates that

number to grow as the public looks to engage in more community group activities such as singing.

Fifteen members of the chorus attended the group's

first in-person rehearsal in more than a year Sunday, June 27th in the backyard of a member's residence in Granite Bay.

"It's my first rehearsal,"

said Raphael Pazo, who said he didn't mind the drive from Lodi. "It's a very friendly, diverse mix of singers. I look forward to

Sacramento Motorcycling: A Capital City Tradition

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - "Zip, Speed, Sport, Thrills." These four words describe a sport which came roaring into the Sacramento area in the early 1900s bringing with it ready-made participants, audiences, and prominent men and women ready to become involved in its success in Sacramento and beyond.

The quote, printed in the Sacramento Bee on May 16, 1929 is from Frank J. Murray, the first exclusive Harley Davidson dealer in Sacramento.

The newly released book, "Sacramento Motorcycling: A Capital City Tradition," written by Kimberly Reed Edwards, a native Sacramentan, is a page turner, full of local cities and addresses, sports venues, places of business, and residents from many walks of life who helped put Northern California on the map as one of the biggest motorcycle hubs in California.

As the author explains, this distinction was bound to happen. Sacramento had always been a racing town and its residents had a love affair with spectator sports. Before this "motorized bike" arrived on the scene, bicycle races put on by the Capital City Wheelmen brought audiences for competitions at Agricultural Park at G and 22nd, eventually moving to the new State Fairgrounds Riverside and Stockton. There, Sacramentans were roused by exciting motorcycle races more thrilling than ever seen here.

A love of the sport quickly developed that crossed ages, jobs, education, occupations, and social standing.

In 1913 two clubs merged to become the Capital City Motorcycle Club. The Capital City Wheelmen, formed in 1886, was the second oldest bicycle club in Northern California. But as their membership aged and became more social, their sights turned to the Sacramento Motorcycle Club, holding races as early as 1910. Members from both clubs realized that the Wheelmen had the political connections while the new club would provide new blood.

Two decades later, the Fort Sutter Motorcycle Club was formed primarily for Indian riders, but welcoming bikes of all makes and models.

Group rides travelled to destinations including Elk Grove, Folsom, Auburn, and Delta towns. Hill climbs, races, and scrambles took place from Placerville to Stockton,

Murray's sister-in-law Irene Kaminsky was one of three sisters who started the women's motorcycle club, the Sacramento Cyclettes. She and her husband Julius loaned money to the Cyclettes and the Capital City Motorcycle Club to build their respective clubhouses. At age 45, she learned to golf after attending a driving range clinic on Auburn Boulevard, now known as Haggin Oaks Golf Course. With practice and determination, she became

a consistent golfer. In 1953, she was elected to the Sacramento Golf Council, where she served as treasurer. By some accounts, she was the first female council member. Elected as a charter member of the Sacramento Women's Golf Club, she served as president for two years. She helped to organize tournaments and banquets for area golfers and became known as the "Mother of Junior Golf." Edwards' book has a myriad of photos of women riders, prim and proper when not competing.

Norris Rancourt, a well-known West Coast competitor who rode the famous Orrin-Hall built "Gadget" in the 1960s, later became Sacramento's first Honda dealer and the 29th in the United States, located on Fair Oaks Boulevard.

One element of society that the motorcycle industry impacted a great deal was law enforcement. In preparation for World War II, police officers trained for a possible invasion with steel helmets, gas masks and machine guns on their eighteen-inch Harleys.

According to Edwards' biography in the book, "Her father owned a small motorcycle shop near the railroad tracks in downtown Sacramento. She compiled this history to honor the Sacramentans who shaped the early motorcycle craze, beginning with the Capital City Wheelmen, early dealers, downtown merchants and a group of ardent riders." Edwards says her favorite part of compiling the book was learning about the many heroes right here in Sacramento. ★

Carmichael, Roseville and Orangevale and many others.

By December, 1919 Frank J. Murray had become Sacramento's first exclusive Harley

dealer at 508 J Street. A rider himself, he brought credibility to his new business along with his many contacts which included the police department and newspaper reporters.

singing with them."

Cynthia McCarver, of Elk Grove, sings baritone. She's sung before in a vocal quartet with Carrozzella. McCarver said she was attracted by becoming part of a mixed a cappella group where so many choral groups are segregated by gender.

"It's a relaxed and supportive environment. If you do sing, don't be shy. Come to a rehearsal," she said.

Dwayne Smith, a resident of Antelope, sings bass. "I've been singing most of my adult life, mostly in all-male choruses and barbershop groups," he said. Smith, a member of Voices of California (VoCal) said the chance to sing in a jazz style in a mixed chorus creatively appealed to him.

Carrozzella told chorus members they now have a rehearsal space at the Old Fair Oaks Library at 4200 Temescal Street near the arts council building for the next four to six months. Their next rehearsal will be Sunday, July 25th from 2 to 5 p.m. in Fair Oaks at the new location.

"Since we're a non-profit, we needed to find an affordable rehearsal facility which welcomes our unique culture and can host us on Sunday afternoons," Carrozzella said.

"Our songs aren't typically traditional barbershop songs. Our repertoire includes "Life is Just a Bowl of Cherries," "We Can Change the World," and the Frank Sinatra favorite, "That's Life," all sung in jazz style," she said.

The members of Stay Tuned had met for their first and only physical rehearsal last spring in Fair Oaks just before the pandemic suspended their ability to gather.

"What kept us going during the pandemic was that the singers in Stay Tuned are top-notch, and were eager to get back together and sing," she said.

"Members came to our spring Zoom practice sessions knowing their music, and their singing was of such high quality, that the singers themselves could sense our chorus has the potential to be a very strong unit with a really amazing sound," Carrozzella said.

Carrozzella, a singer herself, directs two choruses and trains singers from across the West Coast. A native of Placerville, Calif., she has been singing in barbershop choruses for over 25 years. She attended Shenandoah Conservatory of Music after high school. The barbershop organization's Sweet Adelines and the Barbershop Harmony Society, to which she still belongs to, taught her much about music, performance, and vocalization, she said.

"Barbershop is a unique art form and it's not what most people expect," she said.

"It's not all about men in straw hats singing dated music. Barbershop music can be as current as today's pop. The structure of the chords can create an incredible ringing tone or 'fifth voice' from four parts."

"It takes a lot of skill to sing barbershop arrangements well. We are all a cappella, so we do not have instruments to tune to," she said.

Stay Tuned welcomes new singers with an ability to sing at a high level and understand that since the chorus meets for rehearsal only once a month, "they've

got to come to rehearsal prepared," Carrozzella said.

The chorus also has an audition process to ensure that the overall quality of its sound remains. The audition process requires singers to learn their part and then sing it in a quartet with other members.

"This way, we ensure singers can hold their part against others. One of the big benefits of the chorus is that we don't just provide music, we also provide learning tracks, so non-music readers can still join us," she said.

"Part of the reason why I started this chorus, was that I was not seeing the level of diversity in other choral groups which I thought should be there," Carrozzella said.

"I have learned that some singers don't feel comfortable in some chorus environments, and it's vital that all singers have a place to fully share their voices without having to question if they belong. I simply do not accept members who don't embrace this message."

Carrozzella expects to have some sectional rehearsals periodically which will also help solidify the group's overall vocal sound.

"In regard to COVID, we are being very cautious. All of our members are vaccinated. We are also in discussion over how we will move forward with welcoming new members, but ensuring the overall safety of all," she said.

issues for future elections since SJUSD elects its Board members in even-numbered years. In a special election, it would also be possible for voters to reject the expansion altogether, leaving the SJUSD with a five-member board elected at-large, and therefore out of compliance with the CVRA.

The Board members all agreed it was preferable to have new Board members elected by voters rather than appointed. They also agreed that any money spent on a special election is money that is taken away from students and classrooms. The Board voted unanimously to seek the waiver to bypass the special election.

During public comment on the map selection, some community members stated that none of the maps were good enough. They argued that the maps combined low-income areas with nearby affluent neighborhoods, which they said would dilute the voting strength of the low-income voters. Some asked that the Board delay the decision so that other maps could be drafted and reviewed.

But the Board doesn't have the option to delay the map selection. Under the CVRA, if the agency completes the transition during the Safe Harbor timeline, it limits the amount of attorneys' fees (approximately \$30,000) they must pay to the plaintiffs' attorneys. According to the attorney for SJUSD, the Safe Harbor timeline was paused in April 2020 due to the Governor's emergency order during the pandemic, but the clock restarted with the expiration of that order on June 30, 2021. Meanwhile, plaintiffs' attorney, Scott Rafferty, brought a lawsuit against SJUSD in October 2020 after the district didn't implement trustee-area elections ahead of the 2020 election. Without an extension agreement from Mr. Rafferty, the SJUSD must continue on the accelerated timeline.

Plaintiffs in the lawsuit were among those asking for a delay in the decision, and Mr. Rafferty himself even spoke during public comment. He argued that the Board needs "to deal with us as partners, not adversaries. ... This map will not stand. None of these maps will stand. They all mix millionaires with refugees and working-class people and Latinos."

Board member Zima Creason stated,

"Once there's a lawsuit, you have to deal with the lawsuit. So, the idea that we're partners now, my position is: No, we're not. A lawsuit stopped that, and it's unfortunate." She shares the concern of low- and high-income neighborhoods combined in the same areas and acknowledged that none of the maps are perfect. Creason said she would have preferred a longer timeline to work toward the best possible map, but that isn't possible with the current time constraints.

While community members offered a variety of opinions about which map best represents the district, the majority preferred Map 3. President Paula Villescaz agreed that there is no perfect map that will satisfy everyone. In this process, "there are no good choices, just good decisions," she said. The Board voted 4-1 in favor of Map 3, with Vice President McKibbin dissenting, since he preferred Map 4.

The Board then voted on election sequencing. With the new seven trustee areas, there would be three open seats: Area 1, on the west side; Area 6, in the Fair Oaks/Gold River area; and Area 7, in part of Citrus Heights. Board members Paula Villescaz and Pam Costa would be in Area 2, Zima Creason in Area 3, Saul Hernandez in Area 4, and Michael McKibbin in Area 5. The transition process specifies that current Board members must be allowed to serve out their terms, so choosing election sequencing aligned with incumbents' terms would ensure open seats are filled as soon as possible.

The recommendation was that Areas 3 and 5 be up for election in 2022, which is when Creason and McKibbin would be up for reelection anyway. Two of the open areas would also be up for election in 2022. In 2024, Areas 2 and 4 would be up for reelection, which is when Villescaz, Costa, and Hernandez would be up for reelection. One of the open areas would also be up for election in 2024. The decision of which open areas would be up for election in those years would be determined by lottery by the Sacramento County Committee on School District Organization. The Board voted 4-1 to approve the sequencing, with McKibbin dissenting.

California Educators Battle Over Woke Math

The modern world runs on mathematics.

From balancing a checkbook to calculating rocket trajectories, human beings rely on their ability to understand and use mathematical tools, and we expect our schools to develop those tools in their young charges.

But how and when? For the past eight months, a philosophical war has raged in California education circles over a plan to sharply, even radically, change math instruction at all grade levels.

In January, the state Instructional Quality Commission released a draft “mathematics framework” that would shift instruction from the traditional, and somewhat linear, approach to one steeped in race and culture, or “woke” in contemporary parlance.

The draft declares that traditional math instruction, in which students progress from counting and simple arithmetic into geometry, algebra, trigonometry and eventually calculus as they advance through the grades, “has much to correct (because) the subject and community of mathematics has a history of exclusion

and filtering, rather than inclusion and welcoming.”

“There persists a mentality that some people are ‘bad in math’ (or otherwise do not belong), and this mentality pervades many sources and at many levels,” the draft continues. “Girls and Black and Brown children, notably, represent groups that more often receive messages that they are not capable of high-level mathematics, compared to their White and male counterparts.”

To counter that perceived shortcoming, the proposal would have students of all innate abilities remain together well into high school, essentially eliminating accelerated moves into higher-level mathematics, such as calculus, by those who exhibit desire and aptitude.

Moreover, math instruction would be reoriented from the linear manipulation of numbers into a tool for social justice.

“Mathematics educators have an imperative to impart upon their students the argument that mathematics is a tool that can be used to both understand and change the world,” the draft declares.

The draft generated a backlash from advocates of traditional math, including an open letter signed by hundreds of academics.

“California is on the verge of politicizing K-12 math in a potentially disastrous way,” the letter declared. “Its proposed Mathematics Curriculum Framework is presented as a step toward social justice and racial equity, but its effect would be the opposite – to rob all Californians,

especially the poorest and most vulnerable, who always suffer most when schools fail to teach their students. As textbooks and other teaching materials approved by the state would have to follow this framework and since teachers are expected to use it as a guide, its potential to steal a promising future from our children is enormous.”

Rather than reframe math in social justice terms, the critics contend, California should do a better job of teaching math skills that students will need in the real world, particularly students from disadvantaged backgrounds.

The conflict mirrors a previous dustup over an ethnic studies curriculum as well as the current nationwide debate over whether “critical race theory” should be taught in school or banned.

Advocates of the new curriculum are playing with the lives of millions of children and the state’s economic and societal future. Implicitly they are shifting blame for the state’s embarrassingly low scores in nationwide math achievement tests from themselves to the traditional way math has been taught.

How, then, do they explain why kids in other states and nations are thriving with traditional math? Can they prove that their proposal will improve real world outcomes, or are they just indulging their ideological fantasies?

PG&E Suspension of Service Disconnections Extended

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA (MPG) - Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) announced recently that it will extend the moratorium on utility service disconnections through September 30, 2021. The moratorium was put in place in March 2020 by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC).

“We believe extending the service disconnection moratorium for all customers allows for additional relief efforts from the state to take shape while protecting our customers who are financially struggling,” said Marlene Santos, PG&E Executive Vice President and Chief Customer Officer.

As part of the company’s ongoing efforts to help customers manage their bills, PG&E will auto-enroll eligible customers in new extended payment plans by the end of September to coincide with the potential ending of the moratorium.

While the moratorium has been extended, other emergency customer protections put in place by the CPUC during the pandemic have expired.

Recertifications and Post-Enrollment Verifications for the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) and Family Electric Rate Assistance (FERA) programs have resumed. CARE/FERA customers whose program eligibility would have expired between March 4, 2020 and June 30, 2021 will be required to re-certify. Customers whose program eligibility expired on or after July 1, 2021 will be required to recertify within 90 days. The earliest a customer may be removed from CARE/FERA is October 1, 2021 after a series of direct mail and targeted email communications.

PG&E has helped almost 300,000 residential customers enroll in CARE since February 2020 providing income-qualified customers with a monthly discount.

In addition, Medical Practitioner Certifications for the Medical Baseline Program have resumed. Active Medical Baseline customers who have enrolled in the program under the consumer protections and customers with non-permanent medical conditions as designated by their medical practitioners will be required to recertify for their continued eligibility. PG&E will proactively communicate with Medical Baseline customers and remind them of their upcoming recertifications.

The transition coincides with the launch of PG&E’s new online Medical Baseline medical practitioner portal. This new portal will allow customers and their medical practitioners to complete the Medical Baseline certification/recertification process fully online. The new online application is accessible at pge.com/medicalbaseline.

In 2020, 192,000 customers were enrolled in PG&E’s Medical Baseline Program. As of June 2021, there are more than 256,000 PG&E residential customers signed up for Medical Baseline.

PG&E has proactively reached out to almost 400,000 impacted customers since the start of the pandemic and continues to partner with local Community Based Organizations to support customers.

PG&E is dedicated to helping customers as the company slowly moves back to more normal billing operations later this year. For more information log onto pge.com/covid19. ★

How to End California's Homelessness Crisis

Homelessness is a growing problem in virtually every state. Nowhere is it more pressing than in California, which in the past three years spent more than \$13 billion, roughly \$30,000 annually for each homeless person, to address it. Tragically, its "housing first" approach is a colossal failure. Overall, says the state auditor's office, California's homelessness programs are disjointed and poorly managed.

Despite little progress, policymakers keep throwing more money at the problem. Rather than adopting California's current government-centric approach, other states should learn from its mistakes by embracing reforms that directly tackle the core issues.

Many homeless suffer from mental illness and substance abuse struggles that require creating a pathway to recovery. Unfortunately, the legal precedent of *Martin v. City of Boise* is creating a "right to live on the streets." Policy changes such as California's voter-approved Proposition 47 have effectively discouraged the enforcement of shoplifting items up to \$950, creating a means for the addicted or mentally ill homeless to support their habits.

Instead of enabling homelessness, states should ensure appropriate punishment for those who violate the law. However, interactions with law enforcement should be viewed as opportunities to connect homeless individuals with the help and resources they need.

One innovative approach is homeless courts that "sentence" offenders to treatment, then expunging their records once successfully

completed, as proposed in the California's Compassionate Intervention Act. At the same time, the developing "right to sleep on the street" needs to be challenged through legal channels.

To complement these efforts, states should partner with private nonprofits that have successfully helped many transition off the streets. Even President Barack Obama has acknowledged that "the private and philanthropic sectors are responsible for some of the best thinking, innovation, and evidence-based approaches to ending homelessness."

Shelters to Shutters represents exactly what he was talking about. The Vienna, Virginia, nonprofit emphasizes job placement and housing based on the mantra that "the solution truly

needs to be about both." Another strategy initiates contact with the homeless by providing necessities, including bag storage, transportation, Internet access, and a sitting room. While offering these services, the Crossroads Welcome Center in Tennessee determines each client's needs and tries to direct them to institutions for further care.

Given the severity of today's crisis, the homeless need to be relocated with an urgency. San Diego's use of large tents that serve as transitional housing for about 700 a night and cost roughly \$11.3 million shows how this can be done.

California's infamous unaffordability problems are also a causal driver of homelessness. Policymakers nationwide should implement

regulatory reforms that lessen excessive living costs to alleviate the economic pressures driving too many people into the streets.

The California Environmental Quality Act, the biggest barrier to homebuilding, increases costs, and causes extended construction delays. It, as well as similar laws elsewhere, is overdue for reform.

States should pursue zoning regulatory reform to simplify multi-layered restrictions, speed up the building-permit process, and ease restrictions on building duplexes, triplexes, and granny flats in order to expand the stock of affordable housing. Eliminating rent control would also meaningfully expand the supply of housing and reduce costs, particularly in cities where housing is the most expensive.

Sustainably addressing the homelessness crisis in California and every state is a moral imperative and an economic necessity. Current conditions are the unintended consequence of policies implemented by state and local governments. Though the situation is dire in California, the good news is states can make a meaningful difference if they reject the Golden State's ill-advised policies. Adopting the right policies should be at the top of every state's legislative to-do list.

The first week, my wife and I moved to Houston from Oklahoma, I had a wonderful surprise in my front yard and there was your Medicare column discussing different Medicare

I did not realize I could have chosen a Medicare Supplement instead of a Medicare Advantage plan when my Medicare Part B began this May after losing my job with company benefits. Your article explained that a 6-month Medicare Supplement open enrollment period because I am new to Medicare and just enrolled in Part B.

I am confused on how to disenroll from this Medicare Advantage plan and return to Medicare with a Medicare supplement. Time is ticking because my cancer treatment needs to begin soon. I need to do this fast!!

Hi there, James:

Thank you for the great compliment!! I know how overwhelming it can be to understand the rules of Medicare, especially when you are mentally stressed due to a serious illness.

- Loss of creditable prescription drug coverage.(insurance through your employer)

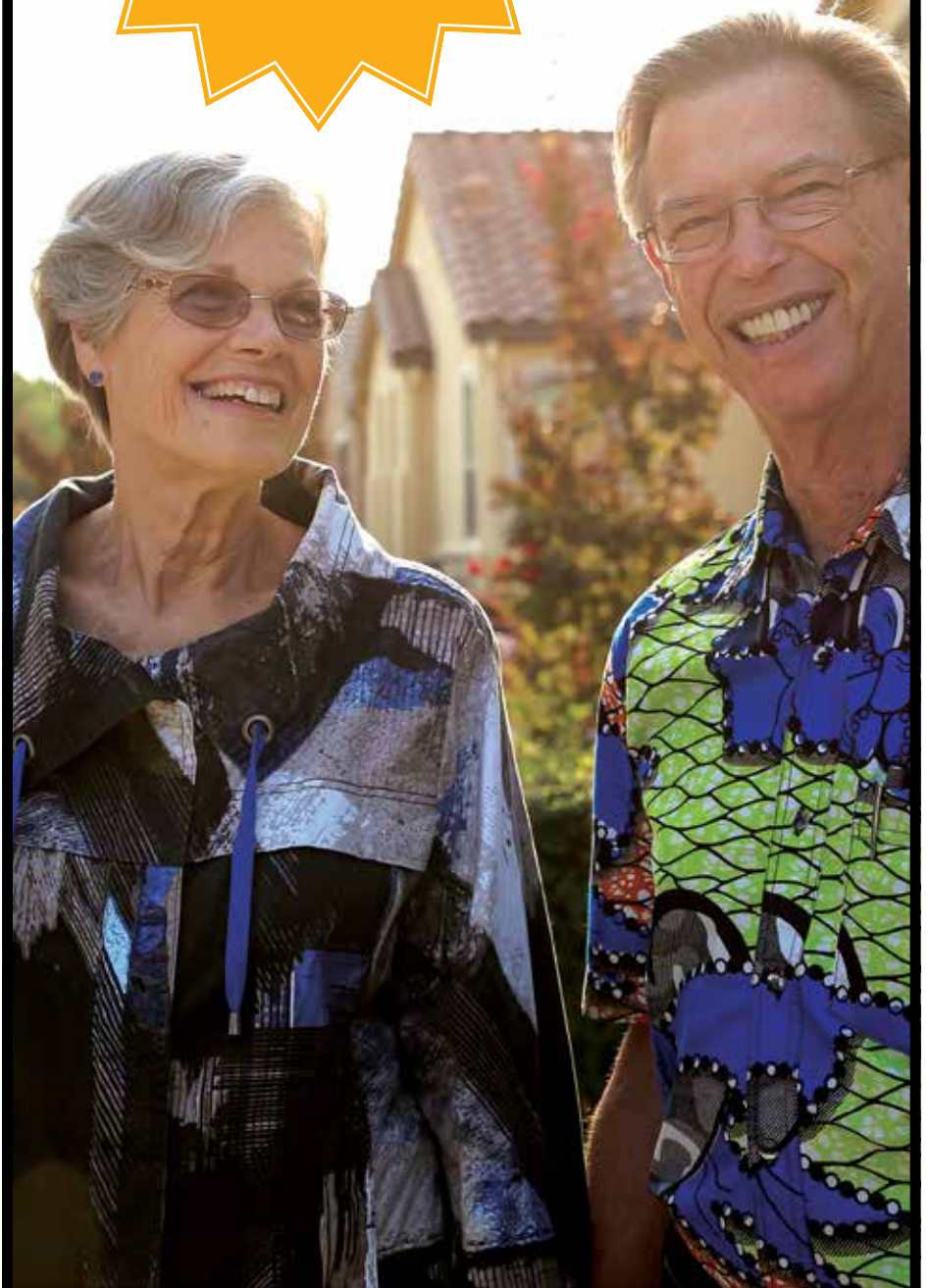
The trick to disenrolling from a Medicare Advantage Plan when a SEP is granted is to enroll in a Stand-alone Part D plan and automatically you are disenrolled from your Advantage plan and back to Original Medicare. Returning to Original Medicare will be effective on the 1st of the next month.

Receiving Medigap/Medicare Supplement Open Enrollment: James because you enrolled in Part B this May and are within your 6-month Medigap/Medicare Supplement open enrollment period which ends on October 31 when your 6-month winds down and you can receive guaranteed issue. Medicare's definition for guaranteed issue is that your acceptance in any Medicare Supplement plan is guaranteed during your Medigap/Medicare supplement open enrollment period which lasts for 6 months beginning the first day of the month in which you are either age 65 or older and have enrolled in Medicare Part B.

Wait past 6 months from enrolling in Part B and you must qualify with having to answer medical underwriting questions.

United Way Helps Launch Three-Year Digital Equity Program

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - United Way California Capital Region launched its three-year digital equity partnership with the City of Sacramento, SMUD, City of Rancho Cordova and community nonprofits to close the local digital divide – unequal technology and internet access – that has expanded during the pandemic. Building on its pilot project with the City of Sacramento in fall 2020, United Way and its partners are working to address the issue of digital equity long-term both inside and beyond the city limits.

“The digital divide is not new, but it has expanded rapidly with the pandemic when so many parents began working from home and kids began learning remotely,” said Amber Lovett, interim president and CEO, United Way California Capital Region. “We need to address this issue immediately, and we need to be looking at how we can continue working toward digital equity long after the pandemic ends. This program is doing exactly that, and we are grateful to have so many community partners who recognize that this is a systemic issue and critical for achieving equity across the region.”

United Way is partnering with select community-based nonprofits to identify and triage households eligible for broadband assistance, computers and devices, and basic digital

literacy. These selected nonprofits will work with digital champions – community residents with technological skills who speak multiple languages – to provide outreach and case management in targeted geographic areas. Other partners, including local school districts, will provide outreach and referrals. Community hub partners, such as social service providers, will provide outreach, direct assistance and basic digital literacy and will work with the digital champions.

“Closing the digital divide is crucial to ensuring that everyone in our region can access educational

and economic opportunity,” said Mayor Darrell Steinberg. “I’m proud that as a city, we have invested nearly \$200 million over the past three years directly in community programs like these, working with dedicated partners like United Way, SMUD and our many nonprofits that work tirelessly to make Sacramento a more equitable place.”

With more than 24 million unconnected households nationwide, the digital divide disproportionately affects minority and low-income populations. According to the Federal Communications Commission, 35 percent

of adults who do not use broadband at home are older, poorer, less educated, more likely to be a racial or ethnic minority, and more likely to have a disability than those with a home connection. In Sacramento, there are neighborhoods where 25 percent of households have no internet access.

“SMUD’s goal is to improve the lives of our customers, and we’re doing that through innovative partnerships that serve those in greatest need,” said SMUD Director Gregg Fishman. “Our Sustainable Communities program is working throughout the region to provide equity

and access to under-resourced communities so everyone has the same opportunity to thrive. Closing the digital divide will play a key role in uplifting our community.”

Eligible households can complete an initial screening application, and once approved, will be considered for a variety of services, including internet access for up to 2,000 households a year, refurbished desktop computers for up to 500 people per year and digital literacy training through online resources and classes. Through the program, households will receive a year of free internet access

either through Comcast Digital Essential Services’ broadband or through an AT&T hot spot, with priority given to low-income households with children and senior citizens. Those in need of digital literacy will receive a list of online sites or may be referred to partner nonprofits with access to virtual or in-person classes. The program’s digital champions will provide basic digital literacy support including web forms, email set-up, internet research and access to resources. For eligibility requirements: YourLocalUnitedWay.org/Digital or 211.

Over the course of three months in fall 2020, United Way’s pilot program with the City of Sacramento, which was spearheaded by Sacramento City Councilmember Angelique Ashby, distributed 949 laptops and 266 hotspots and trained 115 participants, creating the foundation for the broader partnership.

“Bridging the digital divide is a moral imperative,” said Mayor Pro Tem Angelique Ashby. “Championing this effort during the pandemic has been an honor and has created a path forward to continuing the work of connecting our neighborhoods to affordable, fast, reliable access to the internet.”

The program is funded through City of Sacramento, SMUD, City of Rancho Cordova and United Way California Capital Region. The portion of funding from United Way comes from the \$10 million gift it received from renowned philanthropist MacKenzie Scott in December 2020. ★
