# A "Wreckless" Harvest

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - One of a mere cupful of residential wineries in Sacramento, Wreckless Blenders this summer celebrates 14 years of wine making. The boutique operation produces about 100 cases of wine (1200 bottles) for sale each year. Using grapes from Mendocino County and El Dorado Hills, the Carmichael business crushes, ferments and ages its vintage. It then blends, bottles and labels five varieties of red wine in John Troiano's busy garage.

Retired plant pathologist Troiano (71) grew up in New Jersey. His Italian grandfather made wine in a Brooklyn basement. "I never knew my grandfather and my dad didn't make wine, but the passion skipped a generation and came back in me. My Slavic mom grew

beets and tomatoes in our back yard; she had me weeding and composting. I guess my interest in growing things came from that." Troiano earned a doctorate in plant pathology at Rutgers University and started experimenting with wine blending on the Ithaca campus. "I was interested in acidity and sugar content," he explains. "Being a scientist, I studied the numbers behind what made wine pleasant to drink."

In 1984, Dr Troiano and his bride Vicky came to California. Settling in downtown Sacramento, he began a 35-year career with the State Department of Pesticide Regulation. To give their infant son Kyle playing space, they found a home near Ancil Hoffman Park. On land once farmed by pioneer Mary Deterding, Troiano e famiglia put down roots. Their hillside was clayish but the scientist dug in peat to improve the soil. He then planted 32 sapling

grapes of three Mediterranean varieties. As his knowledge grew, he became a pillar of the Sacramento Winemakers Club and - with several aficionado friends - formed a home-based operation they called FatCat vintners. Through years of serious research, experiment and tasting, the group formulated serious wines. FatCat's Bordeaux-style blends won State Fair gold medals and were the toast of regional wine clubs.

Troiano swears by oak-barrel aging. "We've used stainless steel kegs and glass carboys," he explains. "We learned wine aged in wood tastes smoother." As business grew, 20 oak barrels (some relics from French vineyards) rolled into his chilly cellar. Renamed Wreckless Blenders in 2007, owners include Troiano's blender buddies Jim Brown, John "Rocket" Nichols, and Dave Ashuckian. Quirky label spelling is

## CDPH Launches New Campaign to Combat Teen Vaping

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) launched a new advertising campaign called "Tell Your Story," in response to the latest high school vaping data from its 2019-20 California Student Tobacco Survey. California has made progress in combating the youth vaping epidemic, but with kids going back to in-person learning, it is crucial we continue making progress.

The survey, which includes data from September 2019 to March 2020, revealed that California's high school vaping rate is at its lowest in four years (8.2%) while the number of California teens trying to quit vaping more than doubled since 2018. During the same time, numerous youth and young adults were hospitalized due to the e-cigarette, or vaping product use-associated lung injury (EVALI) outbreak, sending a warning to young people across the state. California was the first state in the nation to respond to the deadly EVALI outbreak with a large-scale public awareness advertising campaign to protect young people, launched by Governor Gavin Newsom's Executive Order on September 16, 2019.

As California was responding to the EVALI epidemic, the COVID-19 pandemic created another public health crisis that attacks the lungs, reinforcing lung health as a top priority. Smoking and vaping harms the lungs, putting Californians who vape at greater risk from COVID-19. Research has shown teens who have tried vaping are five times more likely to test positive for COVID-19.

"By addressing the dangers of vaping as part of our preparation for schools reopening, California is taking an even more proactive approach in protecting youth health," said Dr. Tomás J. Aragón, CDPH Director and State Public Health Officer. "Returning to in-person learning could mean a spike in teen vaping use at exactly the wrong time. It's critical young people know the facts about the dangers of vaping and have the support and resources they need to avoid use or quit."

The "Tell Your Story" campaign features real stories from young people and highlights their journey to quit vaping. The campaign educates youth and young adults about the harmful health effects of vapes and connects them with evidenced-based resources to quit, especially as they're exposed to increased social pressure in school environments.

"Seeing the impact vaping had on my health and

# Sac County Public Health Issues New Health Order

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Due to the continued day-over-day case rate increases of COVID-19 from the highly infectious Delta variant, the Sacramento County Public Health Officer has issued a health order requiring masking indoors regardless of vaccination status. In less than a month, Sacramento's daily case rate has risen drastically, from 5.2 on June 24 to 18.3 on July 20.

While cases continue to surge and until vaccination rates have increased in Sacramento County, all residents must wear masks in all indoor public settings, venues, gatherings, and workplaces, such as, but not limited to: offices, retail stores, restaurants and bars, theaters, family entertainment centers, conference centers, and State and local government offices

serving the public.

The steep increase in daily cases is in part, due to the highly contagious Delta variant. Sacramento County currently has 149 confirmed cases, however not every specimen is tested for the variants - so actual numbers may be much higher.

"The continued increase in cases is concerning - universal indoor use of masks, is the least disruptive and most immediately impactful measure to take to slow the rate of transmission"

said Sacramento County Public Health Officer Olivia Kasirye. "Our best protection against COVID-19 continues to be the vaccine. We urge all eligible residents to get vaccinated in order to protect themselves, and their family and friends."

In alignment with the recently updated CDC and CDPH guidelines and with the rapid increase in cases due to the Delta variant, it has become necessary to elevate the indoor mask recommendation to a mandate.

Those who are not vaccinated or only partially vaccinated remain highly vulnerable to the infectious Delta variant. Vaccinations have proven to be effective against the Delta variant and all variants of COVID-19 - slowing the rate of spread and mitigating severe symptoms. All residents 12 and older are strongly encouraged to get vaccinated as soon as possible. Currently, only 49 percent of the County's population is fully vaccinated. Public Health is increasing efforts to offer free, easy and accessible vaccinations clinics to Sacramento County residents. ## IRS Continues Unemployment Compensation Adjustments

**WASHINGTON D.C. (MPG)** - The Internal Revenue Service reported that another 1.5 million taxpayers will receive refunds averaging more than \$1,600 as it continues to adjust unemployment compensation from previously filed income tax returns.

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, which became law in March, excluded up to \$10,200 in 2020 unemployment compensation from taxable income calculations. The exclusion applied to individuals and married couples whose modified adjusted gross income was less than \$150,000.

Refunds by direct deposit will begin July 28 and refunds by paper check will begin July 30. This is the fourth round of refunds related to the unemployment compensation exclusion provision.

Since May, the IRS has issued over 8.7 million unemployment compensation refunds totaling over \$10 billion. The IRS will continue reviewing and adjusting tax returns in this category this summer.

The IRS effort focused on minimizing burden on taxpayers so that most people won't have to take any additional action to receive the refund. The IRS review means most taxpayers affected by this change will not have to file an amended return because IRS employees have reviewed and adjusted their tax returns for them. For taxpayers who overpaid, the IRS will either refund the overpayment or apply it to other outstanding taxes or other federal or state debts owed.

For this round, the IRS identified approximately 1.7 million taxpayers due an adjustment. Of that number, approximately 1.5 million taxpayers are expected to receive a refund. The refund average is \$1,686.

The IRS started with the simplest tax returns and is now reviewing more complex returns. The average refund amount is higher for this round because the IRS included an adjustment to the Advance Premium Tax Credit (APTC).

Most taxpayers need not take any action and there is no need to call

the IRS. However, if, because of the excluded unemployment compensation, taxpayers are now eligible for deductions or credits not claimed on the original return, they should file a Form 1040-X, Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return.

### Taxpayers Should File an Amended Return If They:

Did not submit a Schedule 8812 with the original return to claim the Additional Child Tax Credit and are now eligible for the credit after the unemployment compensation exclusion;

Did not submit a Schedule EIC with the original return to claim the Earned Income Tax Credit (with qualifying dependents) and are now eligible for the credit after the unemployment compensation exclusion;

Are now eligible for any other credits and/or deductions not mentioned below. Make sure to include any required forms or schedules.

### Taxpayers Do Not Need to File an Amended Return if They:

Already filed a tax return and did not claim the unemployment exclusion; the IRS will determine the correct taxable amount of unemployment compensation and tax;

Have an adjustment, because of the exclusion, that will result in an increase in any non-refundable or refundable credits reported on the original return;

Did not claim the following credits on their tax return but are now eligible when the unemployment exclusion is applied: Recovery Rebate Credit, Earned Income Credit with no qualifying dependents or the Advance Premium Tax Credit. The IRS will calculate the credit and include it in any overpayment;

Filed a married filing joint return, live in a community property state, and entered a smaller exclusion amount than entitled on Schedule 1, line 8.

Taxpayers will generally receive letters from the IRS within 30 days of the adjustment, informing them of what kind of adjustment was made (such as refund, payment of IRS debt payment or payment offset for other authorized debts) and the amount of the adjustment. ★

## It's Back-Tooth-School Season

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Healthy teeth not only help children eat, speak and sleep better, they also help them to perform better in school. With the beginning of the school year just around the corner, the Sacramento County Oral Health Program encourages parents and caregivers to make getting a dental check-up for their children a priority.

That's especially true for children entering kindergarten. California requires that all children have a comprehensive oral check-up by the time they are ready to enter public school. The "Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment" helps schools identify children suffering from

untreated dental disease.

"Visiting the dentist before school starts should be at the top of every family's back-to-school checklist along with school physicals, vaccinations and school supplies," said Sacramento County Health Officer, Dr. Olivia Kasirye. "Regular dental check-ups allow dentists to identify dental problems early and allow children to receive preventive treatments, such as sealants and fluoride."

Cavities, which are largely preventable, remain the most common chronic childhood disease. In the Sacramento region, more than 46 percent of students have experienced tooth decay by third grade. To help address the issue, Sacramento County Oral Health Program is

partnering with Smile, California, the Medi-Cal Dental Program's campaign to help Medi-Cal members make use of their dental benefit, and the California Department of Public Health's Office of Oral Health, in a statewide Back-Tooth-School effort to raise awareness about the importance of children's dental health.

## Schubert Calls for Withdrawal of Dangerous Petty Theft Legislation

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - On July 26, 2021, former U.S. Senator Barbara Boxer became yet another victim of a violent robbery in California. This was a strong-arm robbery of an 80-year-old grandmother in broad daylight in Oakland's Jack London Square, which is in California Senator Nancy Skinner's district. Senator Skinner is currently proposing new legislation that would make this horrific crime, strong-arm robbery, a misdemeanor petty theft under Senate Bill 82.

Fortunately, the former senator was not seriously injured. While Senator Boxer is a prominent and household name, there are countless lesser-known victims who have endured similar attacks. To be clear,

these victims were subjected to a violent crime. It would be an injustice to minimize their trauma by calling it misdemeanor petty theft—a low-level offense that is eligible for diversion. SB 82 has nothing to do with justice reform – it is madness that only encourages lawlessness and victimizes citizens in counties throughout the state.

"The assault and robbery of former Senator Boxer is a stark example of the surging and brazen violent crime occurring across California," states Sacramento County District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert. "Senator Skinner's bill to reduce these violent crimes to a misdemeanor and eligible for diversion is a disgrace to victims' rights and dangerous for public safety. I urge Senator Skinner to abandon this dangerous bill." ★

# County Announces Watershed Stewardship and Education Grant

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - The Sacramento County Stormwater Quality Program is accepting applications for the 2021-22 Watershed Stewardship and Education Grant. Each year the Stormwater Quality Program offers schools, non-profit and community organizations up to \$2,500 for projects to help students understand the importance of keeping local creeks and rivers clean and healthy.

This is the 16th year the County is offering grants to help raise awareness about the need for protecting creeks and rivers. By collaborating with schools and non-profits over the years, the County has seen positive results from the community as they develop a better understanding of stormwater

pollution. Along with helping the environment, many participants find completing a project like this can be a great team-building effort.

Thirty-five schools have participated in the program over the years. Will Rogers Middle School is one of the original participants and has taken part in the program every year since it launched in 2005.

Past grant winners have completed 115 projects like creek clean ups; hands on education about Sacramento's watershed, creeks, or rivers; creating eco-friendly gardens; water quality experiments to assess the health of a creek/river; and creating school-wide campaigns to increase awareness about stormwater pollution. Each year grant winners submit a report to the County on their projects; each showing many students in the program gain a better understanding of stormwater pollution and the environment.

To be eligible for this grant, projects must in some way protect or enhance local creeks, rivers, or watersheds. Projects will generally fall into one or more of the

following categories:

**Educational Projects** - Projects that inform or instruct about the aquatic ecosystem, watersheds, or stormwater pollution prevention; **School/Club Projects** - Projects that can be organized by teachers, classrooms, or clubs; **Community Outreach Projects** - Projects that involve and inspire the community; **Monitoring Project** - Projects that measure water quality, species, or habitat; **Restoration Projects** - Projects that restore or enhance riparian habitats, wetlands, creeks, or rivers

Eligible projects must be implemented within the Stormwater Utility boundaries of Sacramento County or directly affect the residents of these areas. The application for the 2021-22 Watershed Stewardship and Education Grant is available on the Stormwater Quality Program webpage.

The application deadline is Sep. 30, 2021, and the grants will be awarded in October.

# Sacramento County Housing Element Update Approved

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously on July 27 to adopt the 2021-2029 Housing Element brought forth by the Office of Planning and Environmental Review (PER).

State housing law requires Sacramento County to plan to meet the housing needs of all income groups through the Housing Element, an element of the County's General Plan. The Housing Element update that was approved will result in modifications to the 2013-2021 Housing Element to address the changing needs of County residents as well as changes to State housing law.

"For the last year, we have been hard at work updating the Housing Element for 2021-2029," said Leanne Mueller, Senior Planner with Sacramento County's Office of Planning and Environmental Review. "This project has undergone rounds

of public outreach, workshops and hearings, and draft revisions to incorporate public comments, and we are so proud of all the work the Long Range Planning team, other County staff, and our partner agencies have put in."

The purpose of the housing element is:

To identify and analyze existing and projected housing needs for all income groups; To include goals, policies and programs to address the identified needs; And, to provide enough sites for new housing development to occur during the 2021-2029 planning period.

The California Department of Housing and Community Development gives the number of housing units each region must plan for to each regional body, known as councils of governments (COGs). The COGs then break down the total number of units into income categories and they give each city and county their "fair share" of the regional number.

Each city and county is required to show that it can accommodate its "fair share" of units for each income category. This process is known as the Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA) and it is a key requirement of housing elements.

Sacramento County is within the six-county region of the Sacramento Area Council of Governments. Sacramento County's total RHNA for 2021 - 2029 is 21,272 units, and the Housing Element update outlines how the County will meet that goal. In particular, the Housing Element update addresses the need to create affordable housing opportunities for low-income households in areas which offer the best chance at economic advancement, high educational attainment, and good physical and mental health.

"It felt exhilarating and fulfilling to be back in contact with our club members," says Troiano. "We enjoyed catching up with what was happening in their lives – over a glass of wine."

## Hellish Heat

Sweltering heat is upon us, so I checked in with Nicolette Pace MS,RDN, CDE etc to give us some tips on how to stay cool and beat this hellish heat. She shared these ten tips with me on my POPPOFF Radio Show. We must prevent heatstroke. Nicolette emphasized that heatstroke is no joke. It's life threatening. Here's help to prevent a health disaster!

- 1. DON'T GO OUTSIDE.** If temps are 91 degrees or greater avoid going outside for longer than necessary. Your body is trying to cool down in the heat, so your skin temperature can rise to 105 degrees. Seek areas that are either air-conditioned or are in dense shade preferably with a breeze.
- 2. DON'T STAY IN THE SUN.** Umbrellas and shelters can help as does a cloudy day. However, this is not a license to tackle the heat and stay outdoors. Limit outdoors to one hour or less.
- 3. DON'T EXERCISE OUTDOORS.** Physical activity increases heart rate and sweating and fluid loss raises body temperature. Combat this high risk category for heatstroke and exhaustion either by exercising indoors, targeting outside activity to either early AM, later PM, or when temperatures drop below 91 degrees.

Never was it more mandatory to alternate alcohol with H2O and limit cocktails, straight shots, beer, and wine to health guidelines.
- 5. DON'T DRINK SUGARY BEVERAGES.** Super sweet sugary drinks contribute to dehydration by displacing water in body tissues

in an attempt to dilute blood sugar concentration. This, in turn, leads to bloating and water loss. It's especially serious for people with diabetes, cardiovascular and kidney concerns, so drink cool water to feel better fast.

- 6. DON'T EAT SALTY SNACKS OR PROCESSED FOODS.** Like sugar, too much salt contributes to bloating and ultimately dehydration. It causes more thirst and urination, disrupting kidney hormones and the body's delicate electrolyte balance. It's wise to avoid excessive sodium.

- 9. DON'T USE SUNSCREEN.** Many people may not realize sunscreen is not a heatstroke preventer. Sunscreen is very very necessary for UV ray protection but it doesn't protect from heatstroke.
- 10. DON'T WEAR TIGHT SKIMPY CLOTHES.** Fewer clothes help you lose more heat! Sweating is very important to cool down so tight synthetic fiber, polyester-type fabric lock in heat and raise body temperature. Wear light colors and loose fitting natural clothes.

## Medi-Cal Members Can Get Help with Internet Costs

**Sacramento County Press Release**

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Registration is now open for an emergency broadband program that will help Medi-Cal members and other low-income residents receive up to \$50 a month to cover their internet costs. All Medi-Cal members qualify, and it will not affect their health coverage. Funds are limited, so act quickly.

The Emergency Broadband Benefit Program is a Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program that provides a

temporary discount on monthly broadband bills during the COVID-19 pandemic for qualifying low-income households.

**To qualify you must have:**  
An income that is at or below 135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines or participate in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medi-Cal, or Lifeline;

Been approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision in the 2019-2020 or 2020-2021 school year; Received a Federal Pell

Grant during the current award year;

Experienced a substantial loss of income due to job loss or furlough since February 29, 2020 and the household had a total income in 2020 at or below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers; or

Met the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 program.

The program will end once the program funds are exhausted, or six months after the Department of Health and Human Services declares an end to the pandemic, whichever comes first. ★

## Updated Computer Models Released for Key Water Projects

**Department of Water Resources Press Release**

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The Bureau of Reclamation and the California Department of Water Resources (DWR) released the next versions of two computer models that simulate operations of the State Water Project (SWP) and the Central Valley Project (CVP). Water managers use the models – CalSim II and CalSim 3 – to examine project operations under various assumptions for hydrologic conditions, project facilities and regulatory requirements.

"Having the ability to model events in a virtual world is a tremendous help in drought planning and improving sustainability of our water resources," said Erik Reyes, DWR's Supervising Engineer. "These highly complex and extensive models allow for studying a number of key changed conditions, including climate change."

A beta version of CalSim 3 was originally released in 2017 for public comment. Since then several changes have been made to the model, including the full incorporation of the San Joaquin River, updated integration of groundwater and surface water interaction and new areas of simulation coverage in upstream watersheds. Both CalSim 3 and CalSim II, which are being updated from the last public release in October 2019, include refinements to the depiction of many regulatory criteria.

"The inclusion of enhanced physical modeling in CalSim 3, particularly the implementation of stream-groundwater interaction, represents a great stride forward in analytical capabilities for Central Valley Project and State Water Project planning studies," stated Derya Sumer, Reclamation's Water Supply and Operations Analysis Branch Chief.

These and other improvements enhance the ability to model the ever-changing conditions that dynamically affect the projects, including impacts to infrastructure, operating or regulatory criteria, land uses and climate change.

The models and preliminary documentation are available here. Full documentation is expected to be made available in November 2021.

## CDPH Launches New Campaign to Combat Teen Vaping

my family, after I got out of the hospital, I knew I had to focus on living a healthier lifestyle, and that started with quitting vaping," said Blake Grey, a 20-year-old content creator and "Tell Your Story" campaign ambassador from Los Angeles. Grey underwent emergency surgery in 2019 when he was diagnosed with pneumomediastinum, caused by a vaping injury that burned a hole in his esophagus. "I'd tried quitting before, and it was easy to fall back into old habits. But with the support of friends and family, I was able to get into the best shape of my life and found myself in a much better place mentally as well without needing to vape."

The "Tell Your Story" campaign promotes the "I Can Quit" text message program, an evidenced-based quit vaping effort

that helps support the quitting process and emphasizes how to develop and successfully practice coping strategies. The program is centered on a desired quit date and then adjusts the content and timing of the texts, so they are relevant to the users' phase of quitting. The text program covers topics including motivation, planning, goal setting, seeking support, self-talk, withdrawal management, recovering from slips and much more.

The annual student tobacco survey conducted by CDPH, in partnership with University of California, San Diego, assessed the use of and attitudes toward tobacco products among middle and high school students along with social and environmental exposure to various tobacco products and advertisements. Additional key findings

from the report include:

Overall tobacco use (9.7%) among high school students was mainly driven by the rate of vape use (8.2%). Vape products were the most used tobacco product among students across gender, race/ethnicity, and grade; In 2020, 11.6% of LGBTQ+ identifying high school students in California vaped, compared to the overall California high school vaping rate of 8.2 percent; High school students who rated their mental health as poor had higher current tobacco use prevalence (16.1%) compared to those who rated their mental health as good to excellent (7.9%); The vast majority of teens who vape use flavored vapes (96.2%).

# Newsom, Facing Recall, Worries About Blackouts

Several factors propelled the 2003 recall of then-Gov. Gray Davis, but one of the most powerful was his clumsy handling of an electric power crisis that had resulted in rolling blackouts.

The crisis resulted from the ill-conceived and misnamed “deregulation” of power supplies that the Legislature and Davis’ predecessor, Pete Wilson, had enacted seven years earlier. It virtually invited power suppliers such as Enron to game the system.

When the system failed, Davis was governor and failed to deal with it quickly and effectively. As Davis dithered and power supplies dwindled, one major utility, Pacific Gas and Electric, declared bankruptcy and a second, Southern California Edison, came very close to insolvency.

The state finally stepped into the dysfunctional market and began buying power itself to prevent further blackouts, but the political damage to Davis had been done and the recall campaign was rolling.

This bit of history frames the emergency decree that Gov. Gavin Newsom, who also faces a recall election, issued last Friday.

With high temperatures driving power demand upwards, with drought curtailing hydroelectric generation and with the state more dependent on less reliable solar and wind power, California faces a looming supply shortfall that could force power blackouts.

The state might be 3,500 megawatts short on hot afternoons this summer and as much as 5,000 megawatts short next summer if the drought continues.

Newsom wants the state’s energy regulators, the independent agency that operates the electric grid and the utilities themselves to go all-out in tapping whatever sources they can to avoid blackouts. That would include the natural gas-fired plants that the state wants to phase out and auxiliary diesel- and natural gas-powered standby plants in industrial plants.

Newsom suspends environmental clearances and other regulatory procedures to accelerate new power sources, including battery banks to back up solar and wind projects. He also directs utilities to pay up to \$2 per kilowatt-hour – many times the standard rate – to industrial customers for reducing their draw from the grid and shifting to backup generators, promising that the state will reimburse their outlays.

Newsom’s order declares that “conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property exist due to rapid, unforeseen, sudden, and severe energy shortages throughout California caused by these climate events...”

The key word is “unforeseen,” a not-so-subtle disclaimer of political

responsibility if blackouts occur. But in reality, he had plenty of warning that California was short of electric energy.

Last summer, the state experienced brief blackouts during late afternoon and early evening hours as solar power production began its daily decline and the state could not procure enough backup power from the regional grid to cover the deficit.

It was a wakeup call about the state’s growing dependence on solar, wind and other emission-free sources that lack the dependability of more traditional generation – unless the state has sufficient battery banks or other ways to store and supply power when needed the most.

“These blackouts, which occurred without prior warning or enough time for preparation, are unacceptable and unbecoming of the nation’s largest and most innovative state. This cannot stand,” Newsom said at the time.

If Newsom had heeded the 2020 warning and done then what he wants to do now to improve resiliency, the state would have been better equipped to deal with the current shortfall. He has to hope that California will avoid blackouts in the six weeks between now and the close of voting on September 14, or that if the lights do go out, voters won’t punish him as they did Gray Davis 18 years ago.

# CDC Recommends Face Covering for Indoors

## California Department of Public Health

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The COVID-19 vaccines are effective in preventing serious disease. Unvaccinated persons are more likely to get infected and spread the virus which is transmitted through the air and concentrates indoors. About 15% of our population remains without the option for vaccination (children under 12 years old are not yet eligible) and risk for COVID-19 exposure and infection will remain until we reach full community immunity.

The purpose of this guidance is to provide information about higher risk settings where masks are required or recommended to prevent transmission to persons with higher risk of infection (e.g., unvaccinated or immunocompromised persons), to persons with prolonged, cumulative exposures (e.g., workers), or to persons whose vaccination status is unknown. When people who are not fully vaccinated wear a mask correctly, they protect others as well as themselves. Consistent and correct mask use by people who are not fully vaccinated is especially important indoors.

With the emergence of the more contagious Delta variant in California which now accounts for over 80% of cases sequenced, cases and hospitalizations of COVID-19

are rising throughout the state, especially amongst those that remain unvaccinated.

Despite ongoing outreach and improving COVID-19 vaccine access, as of July 27, 2021, a significant proportion of Californians throughout the state are not yet fully vaccinated. The Delta variant is two times as contagious than early COVID-19 variants, leading to increasing infections.

In California, unvaccinated persons continue to be required to wear masks in all indoor public settings. This guidance is an update, in light of review of the most recent CDC recommendations. To achieve universal masking in indoor public settings, we are recommending that fully vaccinated people also mask in indoor public settings across California. This adds an extra precautionary measure for all to reduce the transmission of COVID-19, especially in communities currently seeing the highest transmission rates. Local health jurisdictions may be more restrictive than this guidance.

In California, fully vaccinated people might choose to wear a mask in indoor non-public settings, particularly if they are immunocompromised or at increased risk for severe disease from COVID-19, or if they have someone in their household who is immunocompromised, at increased risk of severe

disease, not fully vaccinated, or not yet eligible for vaccination.

In workplaces, employers are subject to the Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Emergency Temporary Standards (ETS) or in some workplaces the Cal/OSHA Aerosol Transmissible Diseases (ATD) Standard and should consult those regulations for additional applicable requirements.

### Masking Requirements

Masks are required for all individuals in the following indoor settings, regardless of vaccination status:

**On public transit** (examples: airplanes, ships, ferries, trains, subways, buses, taxis, and ride-shares) and in transportation hubs (examples: airport, bus terminal, marina, train station, seaport or other port, subway station, or any other area that provides transportation); **Indoors** in K-12 schools, childcare; **Emergency shelters** and cooling centers

Masks are required for all individuals, in the following indoor settings, regardless of vaccination status (and surgical masks are recommended):

Healthcare settings[6]; State and local correctional facilities and detention centers[7]; Homeless shelters[8]; Long Term Care Settings[9]; Adult and Senior Care Facilities[10]. Additionally, masks are required

for unvaccinated individuals in indoor public settings and businesses (examples: retail, restaurants, theaters, family entertainment centers, meetings, state and local government offices serving the public).

See State Health Officer Order, issued on July 26, 2021, for a full list of high-risk congregate and other healthcare settings where surgical masks are required for unvaccinated workers, and recommendations for respirator use for unvaccinated workers in healthcare and long-term care facilities in situations or settings not covered by Cal OSHA ETS or ATD.

For additional information on types of masks, the most effective masks, and ensuring a well-fitted mask, individuals should refer to CDPH Get the Most out of Masking and see CDPH Masking Guidance Frequently Asked Questions for more information.

### Guidance for Businesses, Venue Operators or Hosts

In settings where masks are required only for unvaccinated individuals, businesses, venue operators or hosts may choose to:

Provide information to all patrons, guests and attendees regarding vaccination requirements and allow vaccinated individuals to self-attest that they are in compliance prior to entry; Implement vaccine verification to determine whether individuals are required to wear a mask; Require all patrons to wear masks; No person can be prevented from wearing a mask as a condition of participation in an activity or entry into a business.

### Exemptions to Masking Requirements

The following individuals are exempt from wearing masks at all times:

Persons younger than two years old. Very young children must not wear a mask because of the risk of suffocation; Persons with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents wearing a mask. This includes persons with a medical condition for whom wearing a mask could obstruct breathing or who are unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a mask without assistance; Persons who are hearing impaired, or communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication; Persons for whom wearing a mask would create a risk to the person related to their work, as determined by local, state, or federal regulators or workplace safety guidelines.

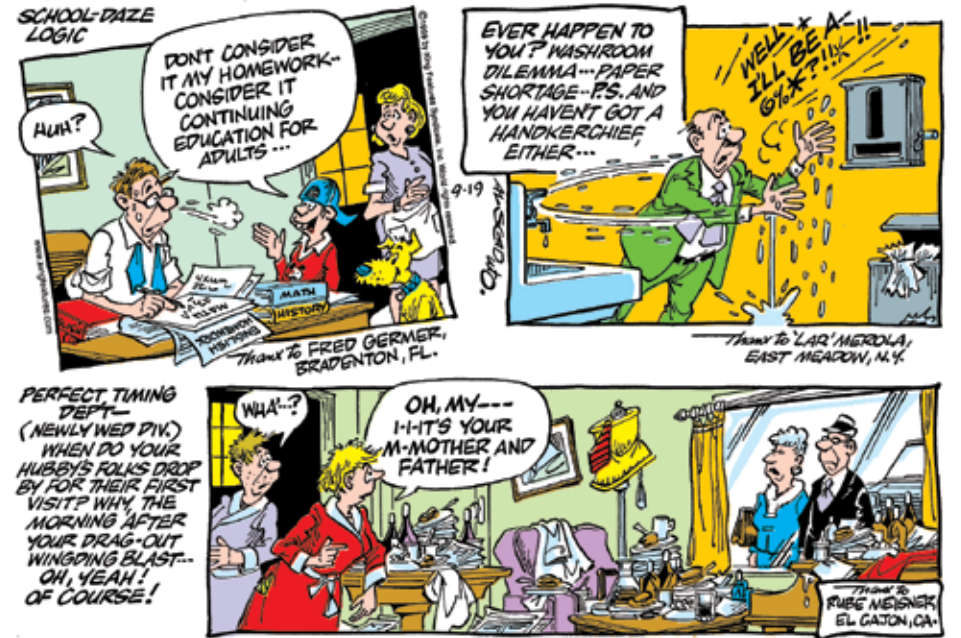

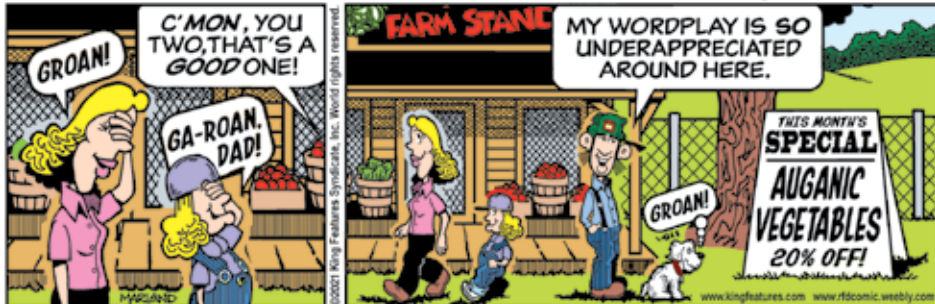

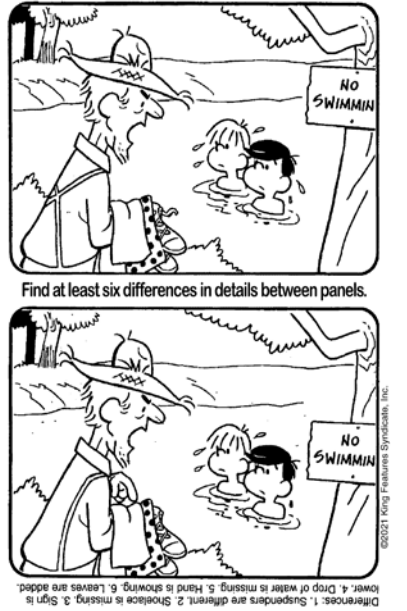

# Do I Enroll in Medicare at 65 or Keep Working?



Toni King

Toni:

I will turn 65 in October and am worried that my employer will be having a lay off due to struggles in the oil industry. I do not know what to do regarding Medicare because

I have great benefits covering my husband and myself. Should I enroll in Medicare now since I'm turning 65 or wait until I am either laid off or decide to retire.

Thanks, Karen from Sugar Land area

Karen:

You have a few different Medicare enrollment options available to you that are not explained in the Medicare & You handbook.

Enrolling in Medicare Parts A and B when turning 65 is called the "Initial Enrollment Period. The Medicare enrollment time is called the "Medicare effective date schedule." It is a very important window of time for those who are "only" turning 65 not those past 65 and 90 days retiring or laid off from their current employment with benefits.

The "Medicare effective date schedule" is the 7-month period which occurs 3 months before turning 65, the month you turn 65 and 3 months after turning 65 when your Medicare begins.

Below is a simple explanation of the Medicare effective date schedule with the delays:

- Enrolling 3 months before turning 65, your Medicare begins the first day of the month you turn 65. *Karen's would begin October 1st*
- Enroll the month you turn 65, then Medicare will begin **1 month** after you sign up. *Karen if you enroll in October, then your Medicare begins November 1st.*
- Enroll 1 month after you turn 65, your Medicare will begin **2 months** after you sign up. *Karen if you enroll in November; your Medicare begins February 1st.*

- Enroll 2 months after you turn 65, your Medicare will begin **3 months** after you sign up. *Karen if you enroll in December; your Medicare begins April 1st.*
- Enroll 3 months after you turn 65, your Medicare will begin **3 months** after you sign up. *Karen if you enroll in January; your Medicare will begin May 1st.*

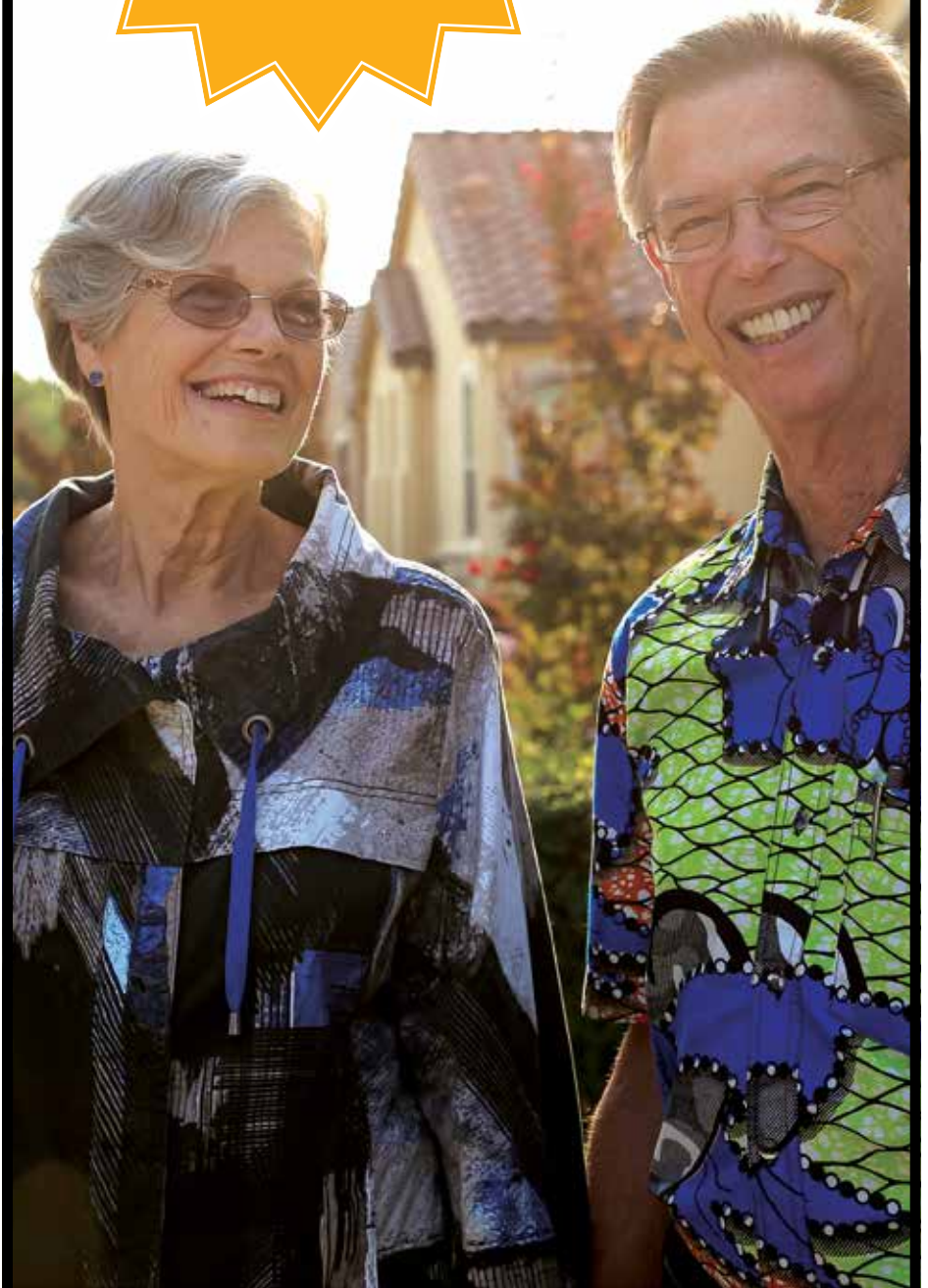
Karen during a Toni Says® Medicare consultation with someone who wishes to apply for Medicare as you are discussing, we help that person with a personalized Medicare plan to meet their specific needs. Medicare is not "cookie cutter...one size does not fit all!"

Let's say you wait until February to retire which is the first month past your "Medicare effective date schedule." we would advise you to apply at your local Social Security office for a Medicare SEP (Special Enrollment Period) with form #CMS L-564 "Request for Employment Information" which is signed by your company HR and CMS-40B "Application for Part B". Your Medicare could begin February 1st not March 1st or April 1st as if you had applied during your Medicare effective date schedule.

Karen, when you enroll in Medicare Part A and B whether working full-time or not, your Medicare premiums start the month that your Medicare Part B begins. Your Medicare Part B and D premiums will be based on your MAGI amount reported to the IRS from 2 years ago. Medicare premiums for 2021 are based on 2019 MAGI amount reported to the IRS. SSA-44 form can appeal your income has lowered and you wish to appeal the higher Medicare premium.
