Teens Tackle Ocean Pollution

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - At St Francis High School, they are known as The Fembots. These tech-savvy teenagers became school heroes when the robot they designed won them a trip to compete on a world stage in Tennessee. Sponsored by the Marine Advanced Technology Education organization, this August robo-clash will challenge young scientists to help solve man-made oceanic problems.

Renamed Team Geneseas for tournaments, the St Francis girls last month topped eight school teams at regional level in Monterey. This qualified them for the robotic equivalent of the Olympics.

The team is part of an 18-student St Francis effort that engages students from junior to senior levels. Fielding a Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV) that gathers trash at

sea, the Fembots beat out seven teams in their division. This week they will pack their 24-pound gadget to travel. Destination is East Tennessee State University in Johnson City, Tennessee.

"They were surprised and excited by their Monterey win," notes adult coach Kitara Crain. "They went into the contest nervous, but I noticed a new confidence after they won. They came home and immediately began working to improve their design." Crain works for the Intel Corporation in Folsom. Fellow team mentor is retired Intel technician Maurice Velandria. Both coaches oversaw the young engineers as they crafted the robot they call Enhydra. They used easy-to-acquire components -- PVC piping; sliced pool noodles; plastic bottles. They also designed a metal frame to hold four underwater cameras in place. Dozens of ping pong balls simulate ocean flotsam and

collection is monitored via on-land computers. Though robot Enhydra lauded in St Francis High labs, the inventors use Jesuit High School's pool for testing. The Catholic alliance will continue in Tennessee: Jesuit's own robotic team will compete in a separate division.

"Our biggest challenge has been the pandemic," explains Fembot pilot Lauren Jones (17). "We had to use Zoom for what would normally be in-person activities. We couldn't meet till March. We hadn't much chance to be hands-on with our ROV, but we've got this far."

Team captain Riley Glenn (18) feels COVID limitations necessitated better understanding of processes. "Our result was a more accurately built robot," she says. "We're excited to go to Tennessee and see what people in higher divisions are doing. We can all learn from that."

15 Percent Water Reductions Urged

Regional Water Authority Press Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Regional Water Authority (RWA) Board of Directors unanimously adopted a resolution urging its 20 water provider members to take actions to voluntarily reduce water use by a minimum of 15 percent.

The action follows RWA's call for 10 percent conservation in May and Gov. Gavin Newsom's July 8 executive order that expanded the drought to 50 of the state's 58 counties and asked residents to reduce water use by 15 percent.

"This is the worst drought since 1977," said RWA Executive Director Jim Peifer. "Water providers are doing a good job of shifting to environmentally-friendly and sustainably-managed groundwater for water supplies, but continued dry weather into winter could pose a challenge."

Folsom Lake levels are currently at 27 percent. Natural inflows into Folsom are zero and expected to remain that way through September. "For comparison, even in 2015 during California's most recent drought, water was still naturally flowing into Folsom," Peifer said.

Local water providers are asking customers to consider taking the following actions:

Stress Your Lawn and Save Your Trees. Try reducing lawn watering times by two minutes, but remember to take steps to protect your trees. Lawn can handle less water and eventually recover while trees can be lost forever. You can find tips and videos for efficiently watering trees at BeWaterSmart.info/trees or sactree.com; **Check soil moisture** with a moisture meter before turning on sprinklers - *saves 80 gallons of water per day*; **Water plants early** in the morning to reduce evaporation - *saves 50 gallons of water each time you water*; **Begin the transition to a beautiful low-water garden** by removing half of your lawn this summer. You'll be ready to add low-water native plants and drip irrigation this winter - *saves 90 gallons of water per day per 1,000 square feet of lawn removed each time you water*; **Contact your water provider about rebates** to replace older irrigation equipment, fixtures and appliances with high-efficiency models, including rebates on smart sprinkler timers, high-efficiency sprinklers, drip irrigation and more. Many have increased rebate amounts to help offset costs.

CHP Cadets Graduate ... Finally!

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The long-awaited graduation of California Highway Patrol (CHP) Cadet Training Class I-20 took place on Friday, July 16th at the CHP Academy. The CHP's 119 newest officers (18 women and 101 men) received their badges following a swearing-in ceremony 75 weeks after their training began.

Traditionally, cadet training at the CHP Academy takes place over 29 weeks. However, a little more than a month after arriving at the academy on February 10, 2020, safety precautions necessitated by the COVID-19 pandemic led to the closure of the live-in training facility in West Sacramento. While away from the academy, cadets were assigned to CHP Area offices throughout the state to observe a wide variety of activities and tasks uniformed officers routinely

perform, enhancing the knowledge they had gained in the classroom. Cadets also participated in online learning for the first time.

"To say these cadets have been well-trained would be an understatement," CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray said. "Today's graduates

persevered through challenging circumstances over a lengthy period of time, demonstrating their commitment to serving the people of California."

At the CHP Academy, cadet training starts with nobility in policing, leadership, professionalism and

ethics, and cultural diversity. Cadets also receive instruction on mental illness response and crisis intervention techniques. The training also covers vehicle patrol, accident investigation, first aid, and the apprehension of suspected violators, including those who drive under the influence of alcohol or drugs. The cadets also receive training in traffic control, report writing, recovery of stolen vehicles, assisting the motoring public, issuing citations, emergency scene management, and knowledge of various codes including the California Vehicle Code, Penal Code, and Health and Safety Code.

Upon graduation, these uniquely trained cadets will be reporting for duty to CHP Area offices throughout the state.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★

Airshow Cleared for Take-Off


Limited Tickets Available to this Year's Event

Mentors Crain and Velandria will accompany the girls to the Big Bend State. Here the St Francis reps – who hail from Carmichael, Rancho Cordova, Sacramento, Granite Bay and Folsom -- will meet similarly scientific teens from China, Singapore, Macau, Turkey and Egypt.

The annual event is geared to nurture future engineers and technicians. “Children might not feel they’re exposed to engineering,” considers mentor Crain. “But many household jobs – anything from changing light bulbs or fixing garden sprinklers – represent problem-solving at core level. Millions of people handle simple engineering every day. Ocean pollution is a massive issue. The MATE program challenges students to approach problems in small pieces. If you have 50 teams making small fixes, then bigger-scale problems become more manageable.”

The St Francis students began their mission with scant robotic smarts. “Everyone learned as they went along,” says Crain. “They were supposed to compete last year, but COVID postponed things. After two years of preparation, all the Monterey teams were talking together, sharing fixes

and ideas. They were competitors, yes. But finding solutions is always more important than being first.”

The Monterey win solidified Fembot ambition. “They’ve pushed themselves,” reports Crain. “They had a problem with their cameras at the competition. So instead of just hoping for the best, they decided to take their whole system apart, find the issue and fix it. They’ve gone from having three cameras that worked reasonably well to having four really solid ones. The girls have upped their game. They’re willing to work harder to achieve stronger outcomes”

Crain credits St Francis students and staff for Fembot success. “This team has reinvigorated everyone’s interest in the robotics program,” she says. “The school’s provided project facilities and funding to get the deck crew and mentors to Tennessee.”

The international contest will run from August 4 to 7. Win or lose, Cain is impressed by the young techies’ growth. “They started out as teenagers who had a little interest in engineering,” she considers. “They’ve grown into people whose capabilities can make something great happen for the world.” ★

Governor Signs Budget Bill Supportive of Small Business



Make an Impact with Investing?

Dear Dave,

A friend recently mentioned something called impact investing to me. What exactly is this? How do impact investment funds perform, and what do you think about them?

– Carson

Dear Carson

Impact investing generally aims to benefit society, while providing a profit for the investor, by investing in companies, funds and organizations that are aligned with causes, certain values or issues. Think of it as a middle ground between traditional investing and charitable giving, where you can match your investing with your own particular

beliefs. It really isn't all that different from investing in traditional mutual funds, except for the goal of the funds.

Since their inception, impact investments have averaged returns of a little less than 6%. That's well below the average return of the S&P 500. Impact investing can do some good, but the truth is it's hard to measure exactly how much good it's doing. If you're going to invest in impact investing funds, you need to make sure you understand exactly how your money is going to help the businesses you invest in, if they're actually doing what they say they're doing, and whether or not they're really making a difference for the better.

As with all investments, it pays to do a lot of research and find an advisor with the heart of a teacher. And never invest in anything if you don't completely understand how it works. Remember, it's your money that's in the mix. Don't feel like the odd man out if you're the

only one not joining in on an investment craze your friends are diving into.

Personally, I recommend investing in good, growth stock mutual funds and real estate paid for with cash. And hey, if you want to make a difference in the world and still invest the old fashioned way, create room in your budget for charitable giving or saving with the goal of making donations to organizations and causes you care about.



Could Crime Surge Push Newsom Recall?

Those who want voters to recall Gov. Gavin Newsom joined crime victim advocates at the state Capitol last Tuesday to accuse the governor of being too lenient on lawbreakers as the state experiences a new wave of crime.

They castigated him for unilaterally suspending executions of murderers and making it easier for felons to win release from state prisons.

“The thing that really alarms me about what the governor did, is that it’s a continuation of policies to undermine the criminal justice system, and to put dangerous people back out onto the streets,” said Marc Klaas, whose daughter, Polly, was murdered 25 years ago by a recently released felon. The killer, Richard Allen Davis, is one of 737 murderers benefiting from Newsom’s death penalty suspension.

A few hours later, Newsom’s office announced that he would hold a press conference in Los Angeles Wednesday “on state action to address crime and reduce retail theft in communities across California.”

Newsom devoted much of the event to signing

Assembly Bill 331, which extends an effort to crack down on organized shoplifting that has plagued California retailers in recent months. But he attributed the sharp increase in violent crime, particularly murders, to “a proliferation of guns on our streets” and noted that “There is not a state that’s been spared.”

The back-to-back events imply that crime may be a new front in the recall campaign and that Newsom feels the need to defend himself.

“In 2020, California saw a troubling rise of more than 500 homicides, the largest jump in state history since record-keeping began in 1960,” the Public Policy Institute of California says in a recent report. “Victims were predominantly Black and Latino, male, and killed by guns on our streets, parking lots, or in vehicles.”

Newsom’s comments about “a proliferation of guns on our streets” echoes declarations by gun control advocates that California’s surge of homicides results from a big jump in gun ownership. Californians legally bought a record 686,435 handguns in 2020 – a nearly 66% increase from the year before – and sales of rifles and shotguns also shot upward.

However, Newsom and other gun control advocates offer no proof of the connection. In fact, a new study by University of California-Davis researchers found no evidence that increases in legal gun sales resulted in more violent crime, seemingly refuting Newsom’s assertion.

“Nationwide, firearm

purchasing and firearm violence increased substantially during the first months of the coronavirus pandemic,” the study by UCD’s Violence Prevention Research Program, concluded. “At the state level, the magnitude of the increase in purchasing was not associated with the magnitude of the increase in firearm violence.”

“Results suggest much of the rise in firearm violence during our study period was attributable to other factors, indicating a need for additional research,” the researchers added.

A more likely scenario is that Californians are buying more guns because their fears of becoming violent crime victims have increased. In recent weeks, the residents of three Northern California homes, one in Solano County and two in Stanislaus County, have shot and killed violent home invaders.

The surge in crime, both violent assaults and thefts, is real. The videos of brazen daylight raids on pharmacies and other stores, particularly in San Francisco, by thieves unafraid of either arrest or prosecution, have become cable television and YouTube staples.

While rising crime might not sink Newsom in the recall election a few weeks hence, if it continues to rise, he could feel the backlash when he runs for re-election in 2022.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County with its cities and numerous special districts is updating the Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) looking at the risk of floods, drought, wildfires, severe weather, and other natural hazards of concern to the County. While hazards such as these cannot be prevented, a Hazard Mitigation Plan forms the foundation for a community’s long-term strategy to reduce disaster losses. A FEMA-approved Hazard Mitigation Plan allows agencies to apply for pre- and post-disaster mitigation grant funding. In addition, this LHMP Update provides for lower costs of flood insurance premiums, through the National Flood Insurance Program’s (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS), to residents of Sacramento County and City of Sacramento, as the two CRS communities.

The process began in August 2020 with an initial planning and public meeting and the establishment of a Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee (HMPC) comprised of representatives from the County, incorporated communities, special districts, other key stakeholders, and the public. The 2021 LHMP Update is scheduled to be finalized and submitted to Cal OES and FEMA in September 2021.

I am concerned that San Juan Unified School District is requiring all K-12 students to wear masks.





CDFW Relocates Over One Million Hatchery Salmon from Klamath River

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Due to drought and poor water conditions in the Klamath River, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) successfully relocated 1.1 million juvenile, fall-run Chinook salmon from its Iron Gate Fish Hatchery in Siskiyou County. The fish were trucked to a nearby satellite facility and to the Trinity River Hatchery 122 miles away where the fish will remain until conditions in the Klamath River improve.

The baby salmon, about seven months old and about three inches in length, are normally released into the Klamath River in May and June. Due to warm water temperatures, low water flow and an exceedingly high probability of succumbing to disease in the river, CDFW decided to retain these salmon within its hatchery system over the summer until Klamath River conditions improve. The unprecedented relocation happened after extensive monitoring, discussion and close collaboration with federal partners, academic specialists and three Native American tribes in the lower Klamath Basin.

The temporary relocation marks the first time CDFW has not released salmon into the Klamath River since construction of the Iron Gate Fish Hatchery in 1962.

CDFW relocated the 1.1 million salmon to provide adequate water conditions over the summer and additional space to accommodate the growing fish. Another 1 million juvenile Chinook salmon will remain at Iron Gate.

"It's extremely challenging to raise cold water fish species in a drought," said Dr.

Mark Clifford, Hatchery Environmental Scientist for CDFW's Northern Region. "The reality is most of these fish would have died if we released them into the river. We need to maintain the integrity of the fall run on the Klamath River and we especially can't afford to lose this generation of fish."

Four Klamath River dams are slated for removal by 2024, the largest dam removal undertaking in U.S. history. The removal is expected to restore fish access to the entire river and the relocated Iron Gate fish could be the first salmon to return to a new Klamath River after their life in the ocean and find miles of additional spawning habitat and contribute to future generations of wild fish.

When conditions improve and before the fish are ultimately released to the Klamath River, the relocated salmon will be returned to the Iron Gate Fish Hatchery for a number of weeks to allow the fish to further imprint on the Klamath River. All of the relocated salmon have been outfitted with unique coded wire tags to allow CDFW and other agencies to determine their origin and destination. All of their adipose fins have been removed to visibly identify them as hatchery reared fish.

CDFW thanks its partners for their time and expertise in working through this difficult situation. These partners include the Karuk Tribe, the Yurok Tribe, the Hoopa Valley Tribe, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Bureau of Reclamation and NOAA Fisheries.
