Getting Help Grooming The Park

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - More than a village, it takes hundreds of green fingers and around 1800 cloven hooves to maintain Sutter Jensen Community Park. During second-Saturday workdays, Friends of Jensen Botanical Garden volunteers groom flower beds in the park's three-acre botanical section. The 20 stalwarts are up to most toil, but they don't tackle the park's 10 undeveloped acres.

For that herculean task, Carmichael Recreation and Park District last week imported 450 workers who labored for food alone. Lincoln-based, the Gregory Livestock Company herd surged from transport trucks and immediately got chomping. While temporary fences contained the goats, no rock, ravine or creek bed slowed them. Acre by acre, tinder-dry vegetation was cropped to ground level in than mowers. They don't bother

"The goats get in everywhere," approved CRPD Services Manager James Perry. "They're not a cheap solution - we can only afford them in one of our parks each season but they free our staff for other work. They also do a much more thorough job of brush clearance than any mechanical method."

In seasons of fire risk, ruminants forage on rocky terrain without causing blade sparks; they're also quieter ground-dwelling birds and are environmentally friendly. The herd is

Park and Swim Club Pool **Resources for Safety**

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) -Carmichael Recreation and Park District's newest program has launched with a big splash. Partnering with DART Swimming Sacramento - and with funding from Carmichael Parks Foundation - the District is supplying subsidized swimming lessons for

children aged 3 to 17. Carmichael kids can apply for reductions of 50 percent from the cost of lessons. Learners from outside the area may qualify for discounts of 30 percent. (Subsidies are geared to help low-income families; otherwise, two weeks of lessons cost \$75 per child). The Parks Foundation has allocated \$4000 for scholarships and will consider further sponsorship to continue the program beyond

The courses aim to prevent drownings. "Our Past president Ken Hall lives on the American River Bluffs," explains board member Sue Boucher. "He's seen the danger for swimmers. Following the success of our 2019 Dinner in Park fundraiser. he and the Foundation presented the idea of children's water safety lessons to CRPD." Though

COVID nixed 2020 plans, a connection forged with **DART Swimming School** fast-stroked plans for this summer. "We've formed a great partnership to make this work," predicts Boucher. "If these lessons save the life of one child, it will all be worth it."

Organizers are overwhelmed by community response. Within a week of first enrollments, more than 100 children were registered; applications – from as far away as Elk Grove are still churning in.

"This response shows the need for affordable swimming lessons in our entire region," says CRPD staffer Alaina Loftus. "I'm thankful we can help."

Eight-session courses kick off June 14, June next summer." 28 and June 12 at the El Camino High School pool. Tuition will be provided by adult coaches, at a ratio of one teacher per four children. 15 Indicted in Cocaine and Heroin **Trafficking Conspiracies**

U.S. Attorney's Office Eastern District of California

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A federal grand jury returned a 45-count indictment today against 15 defendants for a conspiracy to traffic cocaine, cocaine base, and heroin in the Sacramento area, Acting U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

The indictment charges the following defendants: Tyrone Anderson, 40, of Sacramento; Maurice Bryant, 51, of Antelope; Yovanny Ontiveros, 41, of Sacramento; Alex White, 61, of North Highlands; Jason Tolbert, 44, of Sacramento; Andre Hellams, 38, of North Highlands; Michael Hampton, 57, of Vallejo; Steven Hampton, 61, of Sacramento: Wilmer Harden, 52, of Elk Grove; Charles Sidney Carter, 34, of Sacramento; Bobby Conner, 50, of Sacramento; Jerome Adams, 54, of North Highlands; Dwight Haney, 49, of Sacramento; Arlington Caine, 47, of Rio Linda; and Mark Martin, 62, of Sacramento.

The indictment charges Bryant, Harden, Anderson, Carter, Conner, Adams, Haney, Caine, Martin, White, Hellams, Tolbert, Steven Hampton, and Michael Hampton with conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute at least 5 kilograms of cocaine and 280 grams of cocaine base. The indictment also charges Anderson and Ontiveros with conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute heroin. During and in furtherance of these conspiracies, the indictment charges certain defendants with distributing cocaine and cocaine base, possessing with intent to distribute cocaine and cocaine base, possessing with intent to distribute heroin, possessing firearms as felons, and using communication facilities to facilitate drug trafficking offenses. According to court documents, between March 1, 2018, and May 19, 2021, law enforcement seized over 5 kilograms of cocaine, a kilogram of heroin, a half kilogram of cocaine base, and multiple firearms.

"This investigation and indictment results in the dismantling of a network of long-time leaders and organizers in a regional cocaine, heroin, and crack cocaine distribution chain that stretches beyond the Eastern District of California, through

County Shelter Dog Recruited into SAFE CU Adds New Board Members **Search Dog Rescue Program**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County's Bradshaw Animal Shelter intakes thousands of pets in the community each year. Most of these pets are reunited with their owners or are able to find loving forever homes to be adopted into. However, some shelter pets have a difficult time finding a normal adoptive home which is where the shelter's foster and rescue program steps in. The foster and rescue program works with local foster and rescue providers in the community to help shelter pets that need a little extra assistance on the way to their happy ending.

Foster care providers provide temporary care outside of the shelter to animals such as those too young for adoption, needing to recover from an illness or injury, for behavior modification, or just because they need a break from the stresses of shelter life. Rescue group partners are also a huge help as they pull shelter animals who otherwise have a difficult time being adopted due to age, medical condition or the need for behavioral modification that cannot be resolved in a foster home.

Recently, a shelter dog named Chapo was having a difficult time finding the perfect home to suit his mental and physical stimulation needs. After a month of no luck with potential adopters, shelter staff soon realized the Belgian Malinois would never be happy in a pet-only home due to his high energy,



drive and intelligence. So, they reached out the National Disaster Search Dog Foundation (NDSDF). NDSDF is an organization based in Santa Paula, California that strengthens disaster response across America by rescuing and recruiting dogs and partnering them with firefighters and other first responders to find people buried alive in the wreckage of disasters.

"Groups such as NDSDF give dogs that have no chance of placement in a normal pet home an opportunity for a great outcome and a chance to truly thrive in the world," said Shasta Stratton-Quirk, the shelter animal care attendant who reached out to the rescue. "Because some dogs are not able to be adopted out through normal routes, it is the job of the foster and rescue team to find an outlet where they can reach their true potential. We cannot wait to see what the future holds for Chapo!"

After viewing videos of Chapo's amazing agility skills, drive and personality, NDSDF quickly arranged for a flight to recruit him and he was on his way to Santa Paula. Thanks to the shelter's rescue partners and the care and dedication of our shelter staff, Chapo is on the path to have a greater purpose to help save the lives of others. In the meantime, NDSDF is letting him settle into his new environment. They report that Chapo is working on obedience training and manners, learning fitness exercises, playing with and meeting his trainers, and will enjoy a trip to their "doggy day spa" where he will receive a well-deserved bath and

Continued from page 1 Southern California, and into Mexico," said Acting U.S. Attorney Talbert.

"This criminal organization utilized an interstate drug pipeline that reached far beyond the Sacramento region," said DEA Special Agent in Charge Wade R. Shannon. "These arrests underscore our commitment to rid communities of drug trafficking networks and the poison they peddle."

"The FBI is proud to partner with its local, state, and federal Strike Force partners to disrupt and dismantle violent criminal organizations that threaten the safety of the communities we serve," said Special Agent in Charge Sean Ragan of the FBI Sacramento Field Office. "Together, we are stronger, leveraging seamless communication and our individual strengths to identify and disrupt illegal drug distribution networks."

"The success of this indictment highlights the importance and necessity of law enforcement partnerships across the spectrum," said Special Agent in Charge Tatum King, who oversees HSI operations in Northern California. "Strong partnerships among federal, state and local law enforcement agencies are critical to apprehending those that profit from the purveyance of dangerous drugs to our communities."

This case is the product of an investigation by the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Homeland Security Investigations, the U.S. Marshals Service, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, the U.S. Forest Service, the U.S. Postal Inspection Service, the Bureau of Land Management, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, the California Department of Justice, the California Highway Patrol, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, and the Sacramento Police Department. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Cameron L. Desmond and Aaron D. Pennekamp are prosecuting the case.

If convicted of the conspiracy to base of operations.

distribute and possess with intent to distribute cocaine and cocaine base charge, Bryant, Harden, Anderson, Carter, Conner, Adams, Haney, Caine, Martin, White, Hellams, Tolbert, Steven Hampton, and Michael Hampton face a maximum statutory penalty of life in prison and a \$10 million fine. If convicted of the conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute heroin charge, Bryant and Ontiveros face a maximum statutory penalty of 20 years in prison and a \$1 million fine. Any sentence, however, would be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables. The charges are only allegations; the defendants are presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty beyond a

reasonable doubt. This prosecution is part of the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) Strike Force Initiative, which provides for the establishment of permanent multi-agency task force teams that work side-by-side in the same location. The Sacramento Strike Force is a co-located model enables agents from different agencies to collaborate on intelligence-driven, multi-jurisdictional operations to disrupt and dismantle the most significant drug traffickers, money launderers, gangs, and transnational criminal organizations. The specific mission of the Sacramento Strike Force is to identify, investigate, disrupt, and dismantle the most significant drug trafficking organizations (DTOs) and transnational criminal organizations (TCOs) shipping narcotics, firearms, and money through the Eastern District of California, thereby reducing the flow of these criminal resources in California and the rest of the United States. The Sacramento Strike Force leads intelligence-driven investigations targeting the leadership and support elements of these DTOs and TCOs operating within the Eastern District of California, regardless of their geographic

tended by shepherds and dogs who sleep with their charges at night. Coyotes, mountain lions and bobcats are occasional threats; hydration is another concern. Herdsman Steve Gregory delivered water to the Carmichael worksite daily. Though the animals work at casual pace, they are cost-effective. Goat teeth grind seeds to pulp, so weed regrowth is limited. Goat droppings return nitrogen to the soil.

In Carmichael, the visitors were an attraction. Families flocked to view their pastoral presence. "Apart from a few bleats, you hardly know they're here," noted a Sutter Avenue neighbor. "I was surprised by how many people came out to

watch them every day. These animals are a peaceful sight and it's good for kids to see what rural Carmichael must have been like 100 years ago."

Friends of Jensen Botanical Garden volunteers also welcomed their efficient co-workers. "Goats and gardens are both part of the nature we all enjoy," said coordinator Beverley Scott. "We love how they beautify areas of the park that aren't so attractive. When the goats get done — and all the brush is cleared — the beauty of our efforts is highlighted. Together we're great team."

Keep Circulating

keeping us beating the drum of our dreams. But do we really understand what it takes to keep it going? Dr. Susan Smith-Jones gave me some insight on my POPPOFF Radio Show recently. According to **Dr. Jones,** our cardiovascular system is made up of heart and blood vessels. It transports oxygen and other nutrients to all organs and tissues in our body. And it removes carbon dioxide and other waste products. If the arteries, veins, and capillaries were all laid out end-to-end, would you believe it would extend as far as 60,000 miles long? And the heart is pumping blood throughout. So maintaining healthy circulation is a must.

Here's the important news. Dr. Jones told me the quality of foods we eat has a tremendous bearing on our circulatory health. High-fiber, plant-based foods like fruits, veggies, legumes, nuts, and seeds offer the essential vitamins, minerals, and nutrients the body and circulation need to survive. Why? Atherosclerosis is when plaque builds up along the walls of our arteries. Risk factors that can contribute to plaque buildup include high blood pressure, high cholesterol, tobacco use, diabetes, unhealthy diet, low levels of physical health activity, and being overweight or obese. Atherosclerosis can gradually make the arteries narrower, affecting the amount of blood flowing through them. So the organs and tissues may lack oxygen. When atherosclerosis affects the heart arteries, it's called coronary heart disease. Other arteries can also be affected as well...peripheral artery disease. That can affect blood flow to your

We go from day to day with our heart legs, feet, arms, and hands. Sometimes an artery may become completely blocked by plaque or a blood clot. Then a heart attack or stroke can occur.

> She went on to point out that nitric oxide is a molecule that's produced naturally by our body, and it's important for circulation because it supports vasodilation, meaning it relaxes the inner muscles of the blood vessels, causing them to widen and increase circulation. Some of the best food sources of nitric oxide include beets, celery, lettuce, carrots, green beans, collard greens, parsley, cabbage, and spinach. Here are a few more foods that support healthy circulation...cayenne pepper, pomegranate, onions, cinnamon, garlic, salmon, beets, turmeric, leafy greens, citrus fruits, walnuts, tomatoes, berries, and



U.S. judge overturns California's ban on assault weapons - California first restricted assault weapons in 1989, with multiple updates to the law since then. | 4 June 2021 | A federal judge has overturned California's three-decade-old ban on assault weapons, ruling that it violates the constitutional right to bear arms. U.S. District Judge Roger Benitez of San Diego ruled Friday that the state's definition of illegal military-style rifles unlawfully deprives law-abiding Californians of weapons commonly allowed in most other states.

Scientists race to rescue Western monarch butterflies after 99 percent of species is wiped out | 4 June 2021 | A coalition of conservation groups is working with the state of California in an effort to save the Western monarch butterfly from the brink of extinction. The population of Western monarchs that once migrated to California in the millions has seen a dramatic drop over the past several decades. The San Francisco Chronicle reports the population of Western monarchs has seen a 99 percent decline since the 1980s... In an attempt to save the monarchs, the Rivers Partners group and others are working with the California Department of Fish and Wildlife to plant more than 30,000 milkweed plants across more than 600 acres of the state with the hopes of bringing the insect's numbers back, according to The San Francisco Chronicle.

Shocking study finds 10% of world's giant sequoias killed by Castle Fire -Redwood forests are world's most efficient way of removing and storing global warming causing carbon dioxide in the atmosphere. | 2 June 2021 | (CA) What was once a lush forest is now a "moonscape." At least a tenth of the world's mature giant sequoias were destroyed by a single wildfire that tore through the southern Sierra Nevada late last year, according to a draft report prepared by scientists with the National Park Service and shared with the Visalia Times-Delta. The catastrophic discovery that forest managers called "mind-blowing" comes five months after firefighters contained the Castle Fire -- which scorched 175,000 acres across the Sequoia National Park and forest. Between 7,500 and 10,000 monarchs perished in the wildfire, which equates to 10% to 14% of the world's mature giant sequoia population, the study found.

We human beings hate to admit failure. Even though our brains may know when some endeavor has failed, our emotions and our egos trying to make it work.

Indeed, the syndrome has developed its own linguistic phrases, such as "throwing good money after bad," or "sunk costs," or "cutting our losses."

Private businesses are usually – but not always willing to shut down or sell off ventures that don't pan out. Ford Motor Co. failed to attract enough buyers. But the Boeing Co. stuck with an elongated version of its 737 jetliner even after two crashed and killed 346 people, and is still trying to make it acceptable.

Government officials are generally less willing to admit failure, perhaps because, unlike business personal financial stakes in outcomes. Their guiding, albeit informal, rule is that launching new programs enhances one's standing while shutting down those that fail just angers their stakeholders.

Self Employed ... Should I Enroll in Medicare Part B??



Toni King

Hello Toni:

I need your help about enrolling in Part B or delaying it. I am self-employed with no employees, turning 65 with an individual Blue Cross/Blue Shield health plan that

covers me and my wife. I have been told by friends that since I am still working, paying taxes and have health insurance that I do not need Part B.

A business associate, who is also selfemployed delayed his Part B because he is under his wife's employers group health insurance. I do not want to make a big mistake. Please explain the difference in my situation and my friend's.

Thanks, Bill from Tulsa, OK

Hello Bill:

Great Medicare question Bill, ... last week I consulted with a person that is also self-employed, but was given wrong advise about delaying his Part B. His Medicare nightmare is now starting ... Medicare does not recognize individual plans like yours as "true company" benefits with creditable prescription drug coverage for delaying your Part B. Now this fellow who is 66 will receive not only a 10% penalty for each year due to not enrolling in Part B at the right time, but a 20% penalty (2 years 65 and 66) each month for as long as he is on Medicare or should I say the rest of his life. The 20% penalty goes up as the Part B premium changes. Stinks doesn't it!!

Bill, since you currently have an individual health insurance plan not "true group" health insurance, I would recommend that you enroll in Part B during your "Initial Enrollment Period". Many believe that Medicare is automatic, this is only true if you are receiving your Social Security check when you turn 65.

Not working full time with true company benefits is what Medicare looks for to keep from giving you the 10% per year or says.com.

12-month period Part B penalty.

If you are not receiving your Social Security check and want your Medicare to begin the 1st day of the month you turn 65, you can sign up for Medicare anytime during the 3 months before your 65th birthday. Go online to www.socialsecurity.gov/benefits/medicare to apply for Medicare Parts A

Your business associate who is covered under his working spouse's "true employer" group health benefits can delay enrolling in Medicare. He must follow Medicare's enrollment rules as Social Security deems.

"Still working" are magic words when it comes to enrolling past 65 and losing your or your spouse's company benefits. The Medicare and You Handbook discusses under the subtitle of "Should I enroll in Part B" about delaying Medicare Part B when you are leaving your or your spouse's group benefits and "that you can sign up for Part B anytime during the 8-month period that begins the month after the employment ends or the coverage ends, whichever happens first".

Even though the Medicare & You handbook states that there is an 8-month period that one can enroll without receiving a Medicare Part B penalty, the handbook does not clarify that those who delay will not have any of the benefits that Medicare Part B covers.

During a Toni Says Medicare consultation, we recommend that your and/or your spouse's Medicare Parts A and B begin the first day that your or your spouse's employer group health plan is ending, to be sure there is medical coverage when a healthcare need occurs.

Student Services takes House Cleaning to New Heights

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - "Leave the ladders to us," says Chris Anderson, owner of Student Services in Roseville. "From professionally trained and friendly technicians to industry-leading equipment – we're bringing exterior house cleaning to new heights," Anderson said.

Anderson's company, Student Services, which he said is rebranding this summer to do business as Home Heroes, is rapidly climbing the ladder to success. His geographic service area extends north to south from Roseville to Elk Grove and includes Natomas and Citrus Heights.

Six years ago, Anderson was an 18-year-old Sierra College freshman, desperate to pay for his college education. No more.

"Much of the specific services we provide are ladder-related, because for the adult senior market, getting up on a ladder to do something around the house is likely the last thing they want to do," Anderson said. "The catch is, they often need a ladder in order to do their home maintenance and often don't have one."

"The mission of Home Heroes will be to come to the rescue of homeowners," Anderson said. "We help provide maintenance for their residential property so they can maintain the level of personal independence in the place they truly love the most."

Many of the 20 different planned 55+ senior residential communities in the greater Roseville area were built on specific single story floor plan models. Pricing is based on the physical model of the residence and on the level of cleaning detail the customer may require, Anderson said.

Anderson said he cherishes the relationships which he's built with his regular, older customers, many of whom are widowed, or live alone, providing a valuable service to them as well as companionship. Since his company involves ladder work, all his employees are covered by a general liability insurance policy and worker's compensation when in the field, he said

"We also use the latest cleaning technologies to ensure time-efficient, thorough, and safe services. Equipment such as water-fed poles and safety equipment like fall protection ensure that we complete our work safely with minimal ladder use," he said.


