Job Demand and New Hiring Trends "Spring Up"

Local companies Expect Growth in Second Quarter



With businesses and employers looking to begin to add new employees in the second quarter, smiles are returning to the faces of many area job-seekers


Sacramento Region - Employers in Sacramento are warming up to increasing demands for products and services by planning to hire additions to their current workforce in the second quarter of 2010. While some specific industry segments remain weak, Pacific Staffing has discovered that hiring attributed to the need for more workers rose to thirtyseven percent (37%) of overall demand in the latest telephone poll of 100 top companies. At this period last year, just fourteen percent (14%) planned growth hiring in the months of April, May and June. This was also the second Quarter this year to demonstrate increased motivation by employers to grow. Twentypercent (20%) of hiring in January, February and March was attributed

to demand for workforce growth. Sixty-one percent (61%) of the Sacramento regional companies polled between Feb. 22 and March 18th report plans to hire in the second Quarter. In contrast, and a virtual reversal of the survey numbers, fifty-nine percent (59%) of employers weren't hiring anyone during these same months in 2009. As the weather heats up in Sacramento, twenty-percent (20%) of hiring is motivated by seasonal changes in April, May and June according to regional employers contacted. Another Strong Extra Indicator: When asked if more employees were requesting time off for vacations this year than last year, twenty-two percent of HR contacts said, "Yes." A greater confidence in workforce stability

and economic recovery would be indicated as 10% of Service, 4% of Manufacturers, 4% of Construction and 4% of Retail companies report more workers taking time off in the months ahead than at this time last year. Some economic uncertainty weakness in remains with hiring demand problematic in specific industry segments including printing/publishing, manufactured housing, construction and auto retail. The demand for sales and

technical skills are both in high demand in the next three months. Sacramento regional HR contacts also report needs for workers with customer service, manufacturing and construction trades experience in the next Quarter.

The greatest ongoing workplace and human resources challenge concerning employers remains the cost of healthcare benefits.

Thar's (Still!) Gold in Them Thar Hills!

Many Californians happily live, work, travel, and play on the former sites of California's 1800s Gold Rush, never imagining the nearby riches that still remain undiscovered. Although gold is no longer found in the fabled quantities of those heady days, far fewer folks search for it as well. Some of those who do are more successful than you might imagine. Jerry Levitt is a self-described "sourdough" who has been mining gold for almost 30 years. While he has claims in both Alaska and Northern California, some of his richest finds have come from the South Fork of the American River. "Anyone can try their

luck on the American River across from Coloma Park," he advises. "That's still a great place to pan. Kids often pull out fingernail-sized nuggets." And when you find gold, be quiet about it! Jerry says that real 49ers never cried, "Eureka!" "Why would you do that?" he asks. "Someone would know who to rob!" Instead, successful gold panners would quickly stick the gold nuggets in their mouths and keep them under their tongues until the end of the day. "The smart ones never said a word to anyone about their findings," says Jerry. Even today, when people ask if there's any gold left to find, many modern miners will say, "NO!" (But if they mumble, it might be because they have gold

nuggets under their tongues!) Retired from the State Board of Equalization, Jerry also has some tax advice for modern gold hunters. "Gold that you find – it's called 'bullion' – is tax-free to the finder. But if you sell it, successive buyers have to pay taxes on it." At one time, Jerry's hobby yielded enough tax-free gold to pay for an anone-month vacation nual on Waikiki Beach!

Jerry will be sharing his gold-panning expertise and stories with visitors to the Discovery Museum Science & Space Center on April 10 and 11. Troughs will be filled with water and sand, and salted with genuine semi-precious stones and minerals, including real gold. Tenderfoot miners can

rent a "claim" at the trough for \$3, and Jerry will show them the finer points of panning. Glass vials are provided to take home the treasure should miners decide against hiding their findings under their tongues. For those who would like to own and wear genuine Sacramentoarea gold nuggets, Jerry's gold is available at the Museum Store in the form of beautiful jewelry and belt buckles, all handmade by the miner himself.



ROCK DOC By Dr. E. Kirsten Peters

Twenty-five years ago I was spending my summers beside sulfur-belching hot springs in northern California. The hot springs were not as big as Yellowstone's. Most were just a few feet across, one or two about a dozen feet wide. None of them were truly boiling, but they were hot to the touch and gases bubbled vigorously out of them.

To add to the general ambience of roasting sulfur, air temperatures in that part of California each July and August are in the 100-degree range, and in addition to sulfur, the hot springs carried a lot of mercury, arsenic and other toxic metals. Any normal person would have fled the scene. But I loved it all, because in addition to the hellish aspect of the hot springs, they carried trace amounts of gold in their waters. That meant they

precipitated meaningful amounts of gold where the waters cooled. That's all pretty unusual in this world. In fact, it's the only place I

world. In fact, it's the only place I knew where gold makes it all the way to the surface of the Earth in such low temperature waters.

Memories and images of those summers crowded my mind recently as I was learning about something else that's unique to certain hot springs, namely those that are more acid and higher

temperature. Yellowstone has some like these, with pH values down to 1 and even 0 (amazing, but true). If you have been to Yellowstone, these are the "ugly" and stinky hot springs and mud pots to the north of the main lake. It's natural to think nothing could live in the conditions of such spring water. But the Yellowstone hot springs have a host of "archaeal" organisms living in them. That name means they are single cell creatures that, like bacteria, have no nucleus, but they are even more primitive than bacteria.

One kind of archaeal organism is Sulfolobus solfataricus. (Yes, I know microbiologists love names that can look intimidating at first. But just concentrate on the fact the 'sulf' and 'solf' syllables suggests a love of sulfur, and the 'lob' syllable suggests a lobe-like shape for the microbe when you look at it under the microscope.) Sulfolobus solfataricus live in Yellowstone's hot springs and elsewhere in the world, too.

Professor Cynthia Haseltine of Washington State University and her graduate students study the creatures in question. And she's trying to teach me a little about them, because of my old interest in hot springs. (And, I suspect, because she's interested in "my" hot springs that can transport mercury and gold. But we'll get to that.) But already I've been in for big surprises.

In middle age, I thought I knew the basics of life. But it turns out I'm really woefully ignorant. Haseltine's microscopic "bugs" can fuel themselves in two radically different ways. Like you and me, they can eat carbon and nutrients and live on that. But they can also make a living off carbon dioxide and sulfur. I knew little bugs could do the carbon dioxide and sulfur diet, but I didn't know they could switch back and forth to "our" sort of eating, too, when it suits them.

"But that makes sense in evolutionary terms," Haseltine says. "If a microbe is living in the hot spring with sulfur and carbon dioxide available, it can grow – but that's slow growth. But then if leaves fall into the hot spring in the fall, Sulfolobus solfataricus can 'switch' and make a living and grow more quickly using the leaves as fuel."

Back to me in California, crouching over the hot springs that carried gold. All the work we did in that project tried to explain gold transport without respect to living creatures. But what excited both Professor Haseltine and this Rock Head in talking to each other is the possibility that some Sulfolobus organism is not just present in the spring – Haseltine is sure it is – but that it may be interacting with the trace amounts of gold in the waters in ways that bring them to the surface. Imagine that: from eating sulfur to dead leaves to, just maybe, ingesting gold, too.

That's quite a bug.

"We all love to win. But how many people love to train?" --Mark Spitz

At the 1972 Olympics, swimmer Mark Spitz won seven gold medals and set seven new world records. An incredible feat that was unequaled for 36 years. Those who have achieved a high level of proficiency have done so as the result of repetitious practice. Success is never realized instantly and certainly not after only just a few tries. Countless hours are spent learning and relearning. Athletes devote hours each day to perfecting their skills and abilities. They consistently exercise, watch their diet, and practice their Musicians practice sport. each arrangement relentlessly until their performance is flawless. Doctors, lawyers, engineers, teachers and other professionals spend thousands of hours in school to learn their requisite skills. Over and over, pilots train to handle every possible situation they may encounter while flying. There are no shortcuts. Developing new skills and habits requires repetition. It is in satisfying this requirement that many people fall short. There is a growing lack of patience that pervades general society and influences expectations. There is an overriding

desire for instant results.

Getting water to boil is a good example of the role of repetition. Suppose you're in a rush. You put the pot on the stove, turn on the heat, and nothing happens. Patiently you wait 5 seconds, 10 seconds and yet there is still no change. Even after a full two minutes, the water is still not boiling. Obviously you can't get water to boil. Other people may be able to do it, but it won't work for you.

Of course the above scenario is ludicrous. Anyone can get water to boil by applying enough heat for a long enough period of time. What's surprising is how many people turn the heat on for only a moment in their own lives before erroneously pronouncing their attempt a failure. Doing something only once and expecting instant results is no different that expecting water to boil in five or ten seconds.

Adequate repetition of sufficient effort is essential before you can enjoy the fruits of your labor. To boil water, there is a minimum amount of heat that is required. If the heat is set below the minimum, the water will never boil regardless of how long you leave it on the stove. Once you exceed the minimum temperature, the amount of time required for the water to boil depends on how hot the burner is and the quantity of water in the pot. Your effort is the heat and

the magnitude of your goal is the size of the pot. How much repetition is required is the time. Without adequate repetition of great enough efforts, nothing will be accomplished.

There is no way to determine exactly how much repetition will be required. Therefore, all you can do is to keep at your task until you succeed. To give up before your goal has been realized is a shame and a waste. Alackofrepetitionisresponsible more disappointment for than any other single cause.

You don't have to boil all of your water in one pot. You can work on one cup at a time. This strategy makes even the largest task doable and you can see results for boiling each cup much faster than waiting for the whole pot to boil. To put the power of repetition

to work for you, setup a schedule where you can work on your task every day. Take small steps. Consistency is critical. Devoting even 10 minutes a day is better than one hour a week. Once you form a habit of repetition, your successes will multiply.

HOT TUB TIME MACHINE (Rated R)

People easily offended by raunchy comedy might want to avoid "Hot Tub Time Machine." Of course, the same warning could have been issued for "The Hangover," which proved to be a major comedy hit. Then there's the string of Judd Apatow comedies that were also hilariously demented farces. The gross-out comedic trend continues on a winning roll with the timetraveling exploits of a group of grown men reclaiming their glory days through the marvelous power of a hot tub. And you thought hot tubs were beneficial only for their therapeutic powers of the bubbly hot water.

The best friends, who form the core group in "Hot Tub Time Machine," are what one might charitably call losers. Adam (John Cusack), an insurance salesman, is morose and forlorn because his girlfriend just moved out, taking most of the furniture and the big screen TV. Nick (Craig Robinson), who long ago gave up his dream of a singing career, works as a dog groomer and contends with a wife who cheated on him. The self-absorbed Lou (Rob Corddry)

is an alcoholic party animal who ends up in the hospital for what appeared to be a suicide attempt. Rounding out the group is Adam's nephew Jacob (Clark Duke), a video-game playing geek

who won't leave his basement. To avoid Lou's relapse into more reckless behavior, Adam and Nick, joined by Jacob, take him to a ski resort where they had attended Winterfest '86, a bacchanalia of sex and booze for the young hipsters of the mid-1980s. In the intervening years, the resort town has declined so much that it resembles a ghost town and the hotel is in shambles. Assisted

by a surly one-armed bellboy (Crispin Glover, the group checks into the same suite they had more than 20 years before, but the hot tub is rusted and moldy. With the help of a mysterious handyman (Chevy Chase), the hot tub is transformed into pristine working condition, albeit it with a twist.

After relaxing in the soothing waters while drinking abundantly, the group is magically transported to 1986, where the fashion styles appear to be the greatest shock. Quickly adapting to the retro environment, the buddies decide they may try to change things that happened in the past. In particular, Adam would not like to be stabbed in the eye once

again when breaking up with his girlfriend. Lou would prefer not to be beaten up by a nasty bunch of ski patrol jerks. The aspiring singer Nick would like to be more aggressive in his stage debut with the local band.

not yet born in 1986, wants to be sure nothing alters history to point that he does not exist. This proves to be the conundrum for the group. They cannot change history so much that they are unable to return to the present, but neither can they resist trying to alter destiny on the margins to improve their fate. One of the funniest scenes involves an inebriated Nick calling his future wife, who happens to be only nine years old. Adam is smitten with a pretty girl named Alice (Lizzy Caplan), though any future together seems unlikely. Lou appears destined to remain a booze-fueled reckless fool no matter what.

Just for its title alone, "Hot Tub Time Machine" is an irresistible lure. The beauty of this film, given its excess of raunchiness, sexual antics and comic vulgarity, is that it is wildly funny for its slavish devotion to sheer idiocy. The four time-travelers are a nicely balanced group for their diverse comic talents. The wildeyed Rob Corddry, of course, is the most manic of the group. John Cusack revives characters he played in the 1980s. The grounded Craig Robinson delivers an earnest portrayal of an aggrieved party. Clark Duke makes a nice comic foil. If you enjoyed "The Hangover" and other comic films of this ilk, "Hot Tub Time Machine" proves to be a real blast.



Don't Do it for the Gas Mileage

Dear Dave,

Is it worth the trouble to sell my old car now and buy a hybrid or another car that gets better gas mileage? I'm getting mixed advice from my friends on this issue. - Ted

Dear Ted.

Hybrids are a really big deal now, aren't they? Lots of people

want to get rid of their \$10,000 cars and buy these \$25,000 cars so they can save on gas. Let's take a closer look at this. So, you're going to spend \$15,000 extra to save on gas. Did you ever think about how long it will take to get your money back? Let's say you go from averaging 15 miles per gallon to 25 miles per gallon, and you drive 100 miles each week. That will save you about \$10 a week at recent, average gas prices. That means it would take almost 29 years to get your money back in this deal. Does this make sense

to you? It sure doesn't to me! Listen, I'm all about saving money on gas. But people have lost their minds if they think it makes sense to go \$15,000 into debt-or spend \$15,000 cash-to save \$10 a week on this kind of deal. The truth is that a lot of people who do this kind of thing aren't as worried about the environment or saving gas as they are about having that "I'm cool in a hybrid" feeling.

Hybrids are a really new technology and that means they're going to improve rapidly. You don't want to buy a first generation hybrid and then have to go through the pain of trying to sell the thing five years from now. Talk about something that's going to go down in value like a rock! Now, if you're driving an \$8,000 car that absolutely drinks gas, and you want to sell it and buy some little \$8,000 gas sipper, I'm fine with that. But don't use the gas argument to rationalize buying an expensive new car or even spending a dime more on a different car. Make a lateral move, or better yet a move down in price, and you'll save money from day one! - Dave

Is there a Recommended Vacation Percentage?

Dear Dave,

Should you skip vacations when you're getting out of debt? Also, once you're debtfree, is there a rule as to what percentage of your income you should use on vacations? - Carl

Dear Carl,

Ithinkyoushouldputvacations on hold while you're trying to get out of debt. My family and I didn't go on vacation for nearly 10 years while we were getting out of debt. Why? Because we had work to do! We had bills to pay and kids to feed. That's just the way it goes sometimes.

I'm not sure that there's a specific percentage involved on vacation spending. It definitely shouldn't damage your financial foundation, or put you back into debt once you've worked your way out. You don't touch your emergency fund to go on vacation, and you don't stop funding your retirement or saving money so the kids can go to college. You just save up, and pay cash! In most cases, this kind of plan

will almost force your vacation spending to be a reasonable percentage of your income. - Dave






