## California Gets 101 New CHP Officers

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The newest members of the California Highway Patrol (CHP) were sworn in today during a graduation ceremony at the CHP Academy in West Sacramento. The 101 officers are part of the CHP's multiyear recruiting campaign to fill 1,000 vacant officer positions by hiring qualified individuals from California's diverse communities.

"I want to commend these men and women. not just for the hard work they put in the past several months while training at the Academy, but for their willingness to serve the public," said CHP Commissioner Sean Duryee. "These new officers are valued members of the CHP who are committed to improving safety in California for many years to come.'

CHP Cadet Training Class I-23 is one of six cadet classes scheduled to attend the Academy in 2023. After completing

26 weeks of instruction at the CHP's live-in training facility, the newly sworn officers will report to various CHP offices throughout the state.

At the CHP Academy, cadet training starts with nobility in policing, leadership, professionalism and ethics, and cultural diversity. Additionally, cadets receive instruction on mental illness response and crisis intervention techniques. Training also covers vehicle patrol, crash investigation, first aid, and the apprehension of suspected violators, including those who drive under the influence. Cadets also receive training in traffic control, report writing, recovery of stolen vehicles, assisting the motoring public, issuing citations, emergency scene management, and various codes, including the California Vehicle Code, Penal Code, and

Health and Safety Code.

Resource Families, also known as foster families, provide loving homes to children who are unable to be safely maintained with their parents. While reunification is always the primary goal, many resource families also provide legal permanency for children when reunification cannot be achieved.

Sacramento County recognizes the tremendous contributions of resource families and all the ways they make a difference for the children and families in our communities.

"The impact our Resource Families make on the lives of the children and youth we serve is immeasurable. They are both a safety net and a bridge for healing and are often our greatest facilitators of change. We appreciate our partnership with our Resource Families on behalf of all efforts being made for the kids and families we serve," says Sacramento County's Deputy Director of Child Protective Services Melissa Lloyd.

The picnic celebrated current resource families, however, DCFAS also wants to take this opportunity to acknowledge the need for more families to provide this critical service. 

math to underserved community members. They are proud to offer free admission for up to four people per EBT card (normal parking fees remain in place).

Sacramento Children's Museum – Proud to serve the community by removing barriers for underserved families who want to enjoy the museum's exhibits and programming, the museum offers a reduced \$2 admission for EBT cardholders for up to four individuals. Reservations are required for certain events and more details are available.

Sacramento History Museum – With a "History Awaits!" focus on educating local, regional, national, and international visitors of all ages about Sacramento's rich and fascinating history, the museum is a proud participant in the accessibility program and offers \$2 admission for EBT cardholders (plus those with WIC) for up to four individuals. More information about accessibility programs and reduced-cost memberships is available.

No advance registration is needed for those who qualify to gain reduced or free admission as part of the Museums for All program but will be asked to show their SNAP cards and matching photo IDS at the time of entry. Additionally, there are no limits as to how many times qualified program participants can visit the participating museums. ## Track Club Has Big Impact at Junior Olympics

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -The Rancho Cordova Track Club (RCTC) is in its third year of existence and the impact this young track club is making at the National level is astonishing. This year's Junior Olympics National Championship Track Meet was held at Hayward Field, in Eugene, Oregon, and is organized by the USA Track & Field organization (USATF). Hayward Field is a historic location for Track & Field at the University of Oregon, and it was recently rebuilt with a \$300M+ donation from Nike, which is headquartered in Oregon and whose founder Phil Knight attended and competed in track in Eugene.

Last year the event was held in Sacramento and the RCTC qualified 11 athletes to compete. This year RCTC sent a record 15 athletes to the 2023 USATF Junior Olympics, and brought back some serious recognition and national stature. Rancho Cordova Track Club founder and Cross Country Coach Josh Gruver said, "Seeing the success of the Rancho Cordova Track Club Athletes has been amazing to witness this season. It's been rewarding to see the program grow in the past three years. Looking forward to seeing more Junior Olympic Qualifiers each season and represent the City of Rancho Cordova on the National Stage."

Rancho Cordova Vice Mayor David Sander and co-founder of the RCTC has been a thrower coach for his son Charles and other athletes for the past eight years. Coach Sander is credited with increasing athlete participation in the javelin, shot put, hammer and discus. Coach Sander's son Charles is a three time Junior Olympian who has competed in Shot Put, Discus, Hammer and Javelin at the national level. He is the only RCTC athlete to have qualified to compete in the national championships three times, and the only RCTC athlete to have competed in all four throwing events at the Junior Olympics. "Hayward Field is perhaps the best Track and Field venue

to throw a javelin or a shot where Olympians have competed and World Records have been set" said RCTC athlete Charles Sander.

The road to the Junior Olympics is challenging. Athletes need to be top performers at two levels before qualifying for the nationals their local association meet, and then also at a regional championship. Rancho Cordova Track Club qualified 11 throwers, 3 steeplechase runners and 1 thrower/high jumper for this year's games. RCTC thrower Ben Condrin is a recent high school graduate and has been training about 20 months as a thrower with the club, winning many accolades as a hammer and discus thrower. Condrin threw the 12lb hammer 59.85m, winning an incredible 2nd place in the nation for the event. He was named an All-American athlete, an accolade reserved for the top eight finishers in each Junior Olympic event. Notably, he is the first All-American athlete for the RCTC, and the highest ever finisher for the three year old club.

Two other RCTC athletes taking home All-American honors were recent high school graduate Matthew Palchak and junior Tyler Lange. Palchak outdid himself at these Junior Olympics - winning an amazing double All-American distinction, once for men's shot put (16.89m) placing 7th and once for men's discus (49.10m), placing 8th. He now has two of the distinctive and sought after red hats that are given to the in the world, and it was such All-American athletes. Lange a thrill to compete there, also won the special red hat

with his men's Shot Put throw of 17.13m. His 4th place finish is an amazing accomplishment since the 17 year old was competing against 18 year-olds from around the nation.

Palchuk and Lange also contributed to a very rare sight - as the RCTC won 2 of the top 8 spots in men's Shot Put - a very rare occurrence at a national competition. To have one club capture 25% of the All-Americans named in a highly competitive event like shot put or discus is quite rare. Amazingly, that very nearly repeated itself in men's discus when Condrin finished 9th, right behind Palchak who was on the podium in 8th.

Not to be outdone, the club's younger athletes also scored big in the Steeplechase. Caleb Mahoney ran the 2k Steeplechase in 7:06.49 and came in 4th - earning him All-American status as a 14 year old competitor. Cameron Laret (also 14) ran that race and finished very strong in 11th place. Alex Chavez competed in the 17/18 year old Steeplechase race and finished strong as well.

"There is no question that our hard-working athletes made a huge impact and put Rancho Cordova on the map. Particularly among the throwing athletes, fans and coaches - we are suddenly among the teams to be watched in the U.S.," said RCTC Throws Coach Sander. "We now have top athletes approaching us, and asking how they can be part of our Rancho Cordova team."

Other RCTC athletes Lauren Riley, 18, a long-term and successful athlete in the club competed in women's shot put and women's discus. Elise Blomquist joined her in the shot put competition and as a 17 year-old is looking to returning again next year as a shot put and hammer throw competitor. Another 17 year-old, Magdalena Becerril competed in women's javelin and threw for a personal best. Becerril is also aiming for next year, but as a heptathlete, as well as a shot put and javelin athlete. The Track Club also had some younger than high school competitors who qualified for the Junior Olympics - Gabriella Devlin (age 14) in High Jump and Javelin, Sidney Johnson (age 13) in Shot Put and Discus, Skylar Johnson (age 10) in Shot Put, and Lily Oliver (age 8) in Shot Put.

Throws Coach Henry Sharoyan said, "Some of the younger athletes are developing so fast, and getting so good that we just know they are going to keep our momentum going in this club, inspiring kids here in Rancho Cordova to push their limits and achieve things they didn't think were possible. That's what makes it so rewarding to be involved in this sport, and in this club."

Rancho Cordova Track Club Head Coach Jay Devlin summed it up like this, "These awards are great. The amazing success of the young Rancho Cordova Track Club can be attributed to many things skilled and dedicated athletes and families, a supportive community that has invested in unique throwing and steeplechase facilities, a City of Rancho Cordova-Folsom Cordova School District partnership, and good positive coaching. But in the end, it comes down to the youth athlete, whose athletic experience will shape their future life by instilling confidence, the ability to do hard work pursuing lofty goals and face challenges with determination. The futures of these young athletes are the real products of the success of this Rancho Cordova Track Club."

last two years, including starting blocks, hurdles, timing equipment and even a hammer throw

### **Proposals In California Legislature Would Encourage Government Secrecy**

Bill McEwen, a columnist for San Joaquin Valley news site GV Wire, posed several of what he considered to be routine factual questions to the state Department of Public Health last week about a mysterious laboratory discovered in the small town of Reedlev.

The laboratory, in an abandoned warehouse, contained mice, biological fluids and samples of dreaded diseases including HIV, malaria and COVID-19. Federal and state investigators are delving into the situation, which surfaced when a city building code inspector noticed a hose snaking out of a wall in the warehouse.

McEwen wanted to know how the department oversees laboratories, how often they are inspected and how illegal labs get discovered. But he got nowhere. Department officials refused to answer passed the Senate on a 26-3 even the most basic operational questions and told McEwen to search their website to find answers.

"Administration of @ GavinNewsom has zero commitment to transparency," McEwen tweeted in frustration.

It was an example of what reporters and others have increasingly experienced in recent years as they attempt to decipher what politicians

It's not hyperbole to say that Act, which governs local gova wall of secrecy has been erected around the state Capitol and the surrounding complex of buildings housing state agencies.

It was beginning to happen before COVID-19 struck the state in 2020 but it worsened during the pandemic as Gov. Gavin Newsom wielded emergency powers that suspended many of the "sunshine laws" governing open meetings, open records and other forms of access.

Newsom and other officials became used to operating out of public view and even after the pandemic eased, they continued the same practices.

The post-pandemic syndrome manifests itself not only in politicians and other officials seeking to avoid the give-and-take of direct questioning by reporters, as McEwen learned, but in the proliferation of meetings that are accessible only via

California's First Amendment Coalition, which the Bagley-Keene Open attempts to preserve access to governmental records and meetings, may be fighting an uphill battle as the Legislature moves several measures that would reinforce closed door government, to wit:

•Senate Bill 544, which vote and now pending in the Assembly, would amend the state Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act, which governs state boards and commissions, by permanently allowing them to conduct meetings without in-person attendance, allowing only internet or telephonic access by the public.

pending in the Assembly after years, spending all but a few 32-8 Senate approval, would

ernments, to similarly allow "multi-jurisdictional, crosscounty local agencies with appointed members" to meet via teleconference "without posting agendas at each teleconference location, identifying each teleconference location in the notice and agenda, making each teleconference location accessible to the public, and requiring at least a quorum of the eligible legislative body to participate from within the local agency's jurisdiction..."

•Senate Bill 411, approved by the Senate on a 30-5 vote and also pending in the Assembly, would allow such teleconference meetings by "neighborhood councils" without in-person access and is specifically aimed at 99 such bodies in Los Angeles.

Ginny LaRoe, advocacy director of the First Amendment Coalition, captured the essence of these measures in her comment on SB 544: "SB 544 rewrites Meetings Act to allow officials serving on any state body - think CPUC, POST, State Bar and many more - to never again show up in person to a physical meeting location. This is government by telephone."

The three bills have garnered a string of critical newspaper editorials - reflecting the fact that journalists are particularly affected by creeping official secrecy - but they nevertheless continue to

just about everything has become like hay ready to burn. Let's face it, forests and homes have no protection against wild fires...except perhaps you. Dr. Adrienne Edwards, a plant botanist with Rachel Schleiger, a plant ecologist, came to together to help us with "Firescaping

Your home." They shared some tips on my POPPOFF Radio Show.

1. FAMILY FIRST. Know that being prepared to evacuate saves your family and that is more important than your home and landscaping. Have "Go Bag" that includes your wildland fire action plan (house preparation, packing lists, evacuation plans, and contact numbers) so when an emergency arises you and your family are ready to go.

2. STRUCTURES. Assess your house and any other structures where you live for fire vulnerability. Then prioritize fireproofing on those structures with respect to degree of hazard, and costs for upgrades. They provide lots of tips in their book, but you can also consult with a professional or contractor with experience in how to make homes fire resistant.

3. LANDSCAPES. Noncombustible Zone (0-5 Ft). No more "no more foundation plantings". During fire season (depending on conditions) nothing combustible should be within 5 feet of any structure. That includes wood fencing. Lean, Clean, and Green Zone (5-30 Fr), or more depending on slope. Research indicates that thinning fuels within 30 Ft of structures, and maintaining a noncombustible zone next to structures, are far more important than anything you might do beyond the Lean, Clean and Green

We have had a hot few weeks and Zones. Plants should be kept healthy and clustered plantings can be punctuated by noncombustible areas of rock, bare ground, and inorganic mulches etc.

**4. HABITAT SUPPORT.** Think about your neighbors, that is, your plant neighbors, your wildlife neighbors, and your human neighbors. The more land we develop, the more we need to provide oases for native plants. Pollinators and other wildlife need food, shelter, and water. Learn more how to provide those resources in your yard and when. The timing of when you clear vegetation can have huge impacts on pollinators and birds in particular. In a cooler, wetter year, you should leave flowers, seeds, branches and other habitat in in place longer prior to fire season to allow organisms to reproduce. In a hotter, drier year you might have to clear vegetation sooner, but many of your wildlife neighbors can be a weak link in the firescaping chain, so fire resilience also should be coordinated at the community level. For example, fences may make good neighbors, but wood fences shed embers like crazy. When attached to houses, fires can burn house-to- house following fence lines toppling like dominoes.

5. ENJOY. Enjoy the natural beauty of your region with the confidence you have prepared for evacuation if needed and reduced your fire risks while continuing to support the habitat around you. You can check them out with more at www.firescapingyourhome.com. Wherever you live, checking some of the boxes for safety can't hurt. Stay safe.

## Next Phase of Recycled Water Begins for California

State Water Resources Control Board News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Achieving a major milestone in the state's efforts to maximize the potential of recycled water, the State Water Resources Control Board announced on July 11, 2023, proposed regulations that would allow for water systems to add wastewater that has been treated to levels meeting or exceeding all drinking water standards to their potable supplies. The process, known as direct potable reuse, will enable systems to generate a climate-resilient water source while reducing the amount of wastewater they release to rivers and the ocean.

This development advances Gov. Newsom's all-of-the-above Water Supply Strategy, which includes the goal of recycling and reusing at least 800,000 acre-feet of water per year by 2030.

This turning point in California's history with recycled water, which began in the mid-20th century with the use of recycled water for crops, comes after an expert panel of 12 scientists and engineers evaluated work by the State Water Board's Division of Drinking Water and determined that the proposed regulations are protective of public health. The regulations are the most advanced in the nation and reinforce California's position as a leader of innovative solutions to climate challenges. They are now open for public comment and subject to revision based on that input

"This moment has been some time in the making because we have been careful and thorough to produce regulations that ensure, down to a chemical level, that water treated to these standards will be pure and wholesome," said Darrin Polhemus, deputy director for the

Division of Drinking Water. "In fact, the extensive treatment requirements we've proposed mean that direct potable reuse processes in California will produce water of higher quality and lower risk than many traditional drinking water sources."

Direct potable reuse relies entirely on immediate, multi-barrier treatment that can recycle wastewater to drinking water standards in a matter of hours. This contrasts to the method currently being deployed in major projects launched throughout the state, called indirect potable reuse, which further improves treated wastewater over time through groundwater recharge or dilution with surface water. While no formal direct potable reuse projects can be initiated in California until the regulations are adopted, water agencies in Santa Clara, San Diego and the city of Los Angeles have launched pilot projects in recent years.

"We've seen real enthusiasm and interest from major urban water agencies, who are the ones that will take direct potable reuse forward, adding it to their water supply portfolios to increase resiliency," added Polhemus. "California has been a leader for years in water recycling, and this last step—going directly from treatment to usage as drinking water—builds on that experience and the expertise of scientists and engineers who have worked with recycled water for many years."

The board will consider adoption of the regulations before the end of the year.

The State Water Board's mission is to preserve, enhance and restore the quality of California's water resources and drinking water for the protection of the environment, public health, and all beneficial uses, and to ensure proper resource allocation and efficient use for present and future generations.
