The Road to Incorporation

Celebrating 20 Years of Cityhood in Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - As we celebrate 20 years of cityhood in Rancho Cordova, we invite you to take a trip down memory lane in a special series of articles that showcases the behind-the-scenes fight for cityhood, and everything that makes Rancho

Cordova today a great place to live, work, learn and play. This is the first article in that series.

Rancho Cordova officially became a city on July 1, 2003. The road to incorporation was a 40-year effort paved with leadership, grit and determination.

The city's first incorporation drive occurred in 1960-61, but it did not go

far. In 1978, an incorporation committee formed. Civic leaders started with a million dreams to improve quality of life, increase representation of local government, provide greater control over community decisions, and provide an increased level of service.

These leaders commissioned a study Continued on page 3

Fraud Hits California's Food Stamp Program

And you thought California's \$32 billion in Employment Development Department (EDD) fraud was bad.

A small group of criminals in Detroit has managed to pilfer the SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits of nearly 8,000 impoverished California families who were shocked when they discovered their EBT cards had been drained. The criminals stealing access to EBT cards run the gamut from low-level organized criminal gangs in Michigan to criminal syndicates as far-flung as Romania journeying to California, specifically to exploit the gaping security flaws in the SNAP program.

So how is it that they managed to siphon off EBT card numbers and pins with alarming ease? First, the United States Department of Agriculture, which implements the SNAP program, has no incentive to prevent fraud. Like the EDD debacle, these bureaucrats seem completely content to just shovel money out the door with no regard for consequences. Even worse, in recent federal litigation, it was revealed that retailers who accept SNAP/EBT benefits are not obligated to employ advanced point-of-sale systems, the type that generates transaction records in standard grocery stores. In fact, a fraudster could become an EBT retailer by purchasing a point-of-sale terminal on the dark web that's linked to an "approved" retailer. This system has so few guardrails and fraud-detection tools in place that thousands of EBT cards from California were used in a single Michigan city with no "red flags" alerting anyone as to what was happening. Consider the magnitude of these losses. SNAP boasts an annual budget of a staggering \$127 billion. If estimates suggesting that 20% of this amount is lost to fraud are anywhere close to being accurate, it means \$33.4 billion vanishing into thin air every year. Rather than deploying those billions toward helping America's most needy families, SNAP is in fact one of the largest funders of organized criminal groups in the world. The lack of fraud detection and prevention technology within the USDA's SNAP program places an enormous burden on law enforcement Continued on page 3

Boy Scout Project Introduces Sightseeing to Heron Landing Community Park

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - There's a new attraction at Heron Landing Community Park, and it's all thanks to a remarkable Eagle Scout project undertaken by a passionate young scout. With the installation of a brand-new binocular post, park-goers can now marvel at the diverse and vibrant wildlife thriving in the neighboring wetland preserve.

The Boy Scouts of America have long emphasized the importance of environmental stewardship and conservation. Scouts are encouraged to take an active role in their communities, particularly through their Eagle Scout projects. These projects serve as a platform for scouts to demonstrate leadership skills while making a positive impact on their surroundings.

Enter young scout, Gianni Chauppette, an aspiring environmentalist and nature enthusiast from Troop 363 who recognized the potential for wildlife observation at Heron Landing Community Park. Combining his passion for nature and dedication to scouting, Gianni proposed a unique project that

would enhance visitors' connection with the surrounding environment. As part of his project, he was able to raise nearly \$11,000 thanks to contributions from 60 generous community members and Cordova Recreation & Park District.

After thorough research and coordination with park authorities, Gianni led the installation of a pair of ADA-compliant stationary binoculars at a strategic location within Heron Landing Community Park. The binoculars provide park-goers of all abilities with a closer look at the fascinating wildlife inhabiting the adjacent wetland preserve, fostering a deeper appreciation for the delicate ecosystem.

By providing park visitors with access to nature viewing, Gianni has encouraged a greater connection with the environment, sparking curiosity and promoting conservation values. The increased understanding and appreciation for the wetland ecosystem fostered by this project can inspire individuals to take further action to protect and preserve natural habitats.

This new installation at Heron Landing Community Park stands as a testament to Gianni's dedication and commitment to environmental *Continued on page 4*

State Parks Reopens Application Period for Peace Officer Cadet Exams

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -California State Parks has reopened the application period for the State Park Peace Officer Cadet exams. The department invites individuals to "Live the Parks Life" as rangers or lifeguards in the nation's largest state park system. The new deadline to apply is Monday, July 31, 2023. Cadet academy graduates can serve the state as rangers and lifeguards to safeguard both visitors and the historical, cultural and natural resources found in 280 state park units. Offices are located near beaches or waterways, or in deserts, parks, museums, historic parks and state vehicular recreation areas.

"I know firsthand how rewarding it is to be a ranger to not only ensure public safety, but to educate our visitors about the rich history and amazing state parks available here in California," said California State Parks Director Armando Quintero. "We invite you to Live the Parks Life by applying to the State Park Peace Officer Cadet Academy."

The minimum age to be a peace officer is 21 years old. Candidates are required to have a valid California driver's license and have 60 units of college credits, with 21 units being general education.

The entire selection process for becoming a ranger or lifeguard takes approximately 15 months. The first step in the selection/ examination process is to mail, email or hand deliver an application during the open application period. The application is used to determine if the candidate meets the minimum qualifications for admission into the examination, which consists of the Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Entry Level Law Enforcement Test Battery written exam. This exam is used to admit the candidate into the next phases of the selection process, which include the

physical agility test, background investigation, oral interview, and medical and psychological evaluations. Successful applicants will be sent a notification to attend the eight-month-long POST-certified law enforcement academy.

The academy instruction prepares cadets physically, mentally and emotionally to enter the workforce as a state park peace officer ranger or lifeguard. Rangers and lifeguards are sworn officers equipped with a firearm and badge. Cadets will learn how to conduct investigations, make physical arrests, use firearms and perform emergency responses. Training also includes how to actively protect park resources, assist visitors and run interpretive programs.

Below are some frequently asked questions regarding the State Park Peace Officer Cadet Academy:

Do I have to carry a firearm to serve as a ranger or lifeguard?

Yes. Cadet training includes how to conduct investigations, make physical arrests, use firearms and perform emergency responses. What is the age minimum and

age maximum to apply?

Candidates must be at least 21 years of age to become a peace officer. State Park Peace Officer's mandatory retirement age is 65 years, but there is no maximum application age.

I have not completed two years of college yet. Can I still apply while I am still taking classes?

Candidates may be enrolled in college at the time of application

but must have at least 21 units of general education credits satisfying general education curriculum standards with courses (which may include courses in natural science, social science, mathematics, language and humanities). By the time of appointment, a candidate must have completed 60 semester units of study at a state-accredited college or university. A degree in park administration, natural sciences, social sciences, law enforcement or a related field is desirable.

Where is the Cadet Academy located?

Most cadets attend training at Butte College Law Enforcement Academy (Butte County). However, the department may utilize several academy sites, including Mott Training Center at Asilomar in Pacific Grove, South Bay Regional Public Safety Academy at Fort Ord in Monterey, and the Ben Clark Law Enforcement Training facility in Riverside. It is at the department's discretion to determine an academy location for each class.

Do I get paid while at the academy?

Yes. Cadets earn a salary; currently, the monthly salary range is \$3,930 to \$5,300. Most cadets start at the low end of the range unless they are a current state employee with a salary within the range.

To hire a workforce reflective of California's diverse population, California State Parks is committed to ensuring equal access and connecting all job seekers to opportunities through fair hiring and employment practices. Continued from page 1 which found that such a city would be financially viable. But later that year, California voters passed Proposition 13, which completely changed the way in which government is funded in California, and the cityhood drive was put on hold. A Sphere of Influence was adopted, and other signature drives were attempted, but nothing was successful.

Litigation and a U.S. Supreme Court decision allowed Citrus Heights to put cityhood on the ballot in 1996, and it passed. The Rancho Cordova Incorporation Committee was inspired to re-form. A well-organized and focused petition drive, signature-gathering and fundraising campaign resulted in the required number of signatures with a 97% accuracy rate. The committee

negotiated an incorporation deal and revenue neutrality with Sacramento County.

In November 2002, cityhood was on the ballot and passed with 78% of voters approving it, an unprecedented number in California. The City of Rancho Cordova officially became an independent city

on July 1, 2003, with hundreds of people attending a grand celebration at the historic Mills Station.

Over the last 20 years, the city has grown from leasing its first office on White Rock Road at Gold Canal Drive to seven locations, including a beautiful City Hall, Neighborhood Services

Center, Police Station, Corporation Yard, Youth Center, historic cemetery, and arts and culture center. Rancho Cordova has experienced 47% growth to over 81,000 residents. The city has seen a 61% drop in crime and celebrates being a safe community and family friendly place to call home.

Continued from page 1 as well- as they need to divert significant resources at the federal, state and local level to investigate and hold these groups accountable.

To restore integrity to our public assistance programs taxpayers should demand the immediate implementation of frontend identity verification, advanced point-of-sale systems that generate transaction records, mandating the collection of transaction-specific geolocation information, and enforcing rigorous security standards for EBT transactions. To make this happen, we must upgrade the technology of EBT cards to include chips, similar to that on credit cards. This will make it much harder for criminals to skim data. Secondly, merchants should be required to collect data during transactions. The lack of a paper trail makes it nearly impossible to trace fraudulent activity. Thirdly, we must institute identity verification and eligibility determination requirements. SNAP must be easy to access for those who need it, but impossible to access by criminals.

This issue is more than just a financial matter; it's a moral one. It's time to demand that our political leaders and agency heads not only take notice but take decisive action. They must initiate and enforce measures to secure the SNAP program and to ensure that public funds fulfill their intended purpose: to assist those who need them most.

90 Alleged Unlicensed Contractors Face Legal Action Following Sting Operations

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- The Contractors State License Board (CSLB) recently completed a statewide sting and sweep enforcement operation to uncover unlicensed activity in the construction industry. The multistate agency effort organized by the National Association of State Contractors Licensing Agencies (NASCLA) resulted in 90 legal actions related to unlicensed contracting. An additional 37 legal actions were taken for workers compensation insurance violations.

Over three weeks, CSLB joined forces with local law enforcement to conduct undercover sting operations in Sonoma, Sacramento, Madera and San Bernardino

counties. The stings targeted unlicensed contractors, with investigators contacting the suspects through their advertisements.

During the four sting operations, suspected unlicensed operators arrived at designated locations to bid on various projects, such as drywall, bathroom remodeling, turf installation, framing, flooring, exterior and interior painting, concrete, tree removal, landscaping, and plumbing. As a result, 50 individuals may face criminal charges for contracting without a license. These individuals were provided with information on how to obtain a license.

The individuals involved submitted bids that exceeded the legal limit of \$500. California law prohibits unlicensed contractors from bidding and/or contracting for construction work that exceeds \$500 in value, including labor and materials. All may now face legal consequences, which can include substantial fines and potential jail time. Such activity puts consumers at risk in many ways, including failure to meet minimum competency requirements, lack of a license bond, or workers' compensation insurance.

A total of 66 construction sweep operations were conducted in various California counties, including Sacramento, San Diego, Stanislaus, San Joaquin, Fresno, Monterey, Solano, Yolo, Orange, Fresno, Riverside, Butte, Alameda, Placer, Santa Clara, Marin, Santa Barbara, Sutter, Amador, and Santa Cruz. Forty unlicensed contractors were identified during the sweeps and now face an administrative citation or referral to a local prosecutor for contracting without a license.

Additionally, 37 Stop Orders were issued to halt employee labor at active job sites where contractors did not have workers' compensation insurance for their employees.

"Unlicensed contractors pose a significant danger to consumers," said CSLB Registrar David Fogt. "CSLB's Statewide Investigative Fraud Team performs sweeps and stings regularly, and we are proud to be a top contributor in this year's NASCLA's coordinated enforcement effort."

CSLB will continue to partner with agencies throughout the state to combat unlicensed contracting activities. These joint efforts will focus on enforcing contractors license law, safeguarding consumer interests, and maintaining the construction industry's integrity.



How Friction Between Two Major California Laws Impedes Housing Construction

When California Gov. Gavin Newsom made an unusual appearance on Fox News, it was inevitable that conservative commentator Sean Hannity would bore in on California's chronic housing shortage and homelessness crisis.

Why, Hannity asked, did California have such problems?

"Because housing costs are too high," Newsom replied. "Our regulatory thickets are too problematic. Localism has been too impactful, meaning people locally are pushing back against new housing starts and construction."

Newsom's synopsis of the issue is quite accurate. The state's housing shortage stems from the over-regulation of development, largely driven by local opposition. It drives up costs to tenants and would-be homebuyers and pushes some into the streets.

That cause-and-effect relationship was confirmed in a recent in-depth study of homelessness by a UC San Francisco research team.

Having pinpointed the underlying causes of the crisis, one might think that Newsom would energetically attempt to address them.

Last week, as part of a broader budget agreement, the governor persuaded the Legislature to modify the California Environmental ply by decreeing that they

Quality Act, which is commonly misused to thwart housing developments, but he didn't do it for housing. Rather, he wants to streamline CEQA's effect on public works projects, particularly those involving renewable energy and water supply.

Indirectly, therefore, Newsom told Californians that while he says it should be done, he's not willing to take on the heavy lifting to lessen CEQA misuse on housing. His posture continues predecessor Jerry Brown's position of of the two statutes creates a declaring CEQA reform to be "the Lord's work," but being unwilling to do it.

By happenstance, the Capitol's wrangling over CEQA - albeit while ignoring its effect on housing - coincided with the publication of a very lengthy, deeply researched and well-sourced article on how the 53-yearold law thwarts much-needed housing construction.

Christopher Elmendorf, a law professor at UC Davis who specializes in housing issues, and Timothy Duncheon, a San Francisco attorney, focus on "the slow-motion collision" between two overarching "super-statutes," CEQA and the Housing Accountability Act, or HAA.

They demonstrate through case studies that, while the latter attempts to streamline housing construction, the former is used to slow or even kill housing projects by local interests and labor unions.

They focus on a notoriously torturous case in San Francisco, whose Board of Supervisors used CEQA to block a much-needed apartment project on a vacant downtown parking lot due to special interest pressure, sim-

needed more information before giving the development CEQA clearance. But they also cite other cases in which the contradictory priorities of the two laws collide.

Their conflict, Elmendorf and Duncheon say, ties the courts up in knots as judges must, in effect, choose which law is dominant. Sometimes they opt for CEQA and sometimes the HAA, leaving the overall legal atmosphere unclear.

"The ostensible 'super-ness' predicament for courts and other actors because CEQA and the HAA could not be more different in their basic institutional and normative principles," the authors write.

"CEQA's working premise is that 'new construction' is bad for the environment," they point out. "By contrast, the HAA regards housing construction in urbanized areas as presumptively good for the environment."

Carefully drafted legislation and/or CEQA implementation guidelines issued by Newsom's administration could, Elmendorf and Duncheon say, reconcile the two. They could limit CEQA to cases in which there are genuine environmental issues, rather than allowing it to be misused for motives that having nothing to do with the environment, such as forcing developers to use unionized labor.

Their paper lays out the roadmap for the CEQA reform that's needed to truly address California's housing crisis. It should be required reading in the Capitol.



SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - It's time to set the record straight on Sacramento County's Behavioral Health Services for people experiencing homelessness, as well as two specific strategic plans to improve service coordination, collaboration, and funding among governments and non-profit partners.

The County is actively working to strengthen engagement and expand access to behavioral health services for the unhoused population with a variety of services and comprehensive strategic plans.

Strategic Plans to Improve Service Coordination and Collaboration Among Governments

The County, City of Sacramento, SHRA, and Sac Steps Forward (the local Continuum of Care lead agency for the Homeless Response System) adopted a Local Homeless Action Plan (LHAP) last fall. This plan includes strategies aimed at addressing behavioral health and substance use disorder services. Also, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors recently adopted the AT HOME plan-developed by the California State Association of Counties. The plan addresses the lack of a comprehensive statewide approach to homelessness. The goal of the collaborative effort is to establish responsibility and accountability between state and local governments.

Sacramento County is committed to creating real change in our community while also promoting accountability. Sacramento County has numerous programs that provide care for the unhoused, including several services provided by behavioral health staff.

County Behavioral Health Programs and Services for the Unhoused

CORE Wellness Centers: CORE sites are located throughout Sacramento County in neighborhoods where services are most needed. CORE sites were specifically designed with community feedback in mind. The sites provide mental health outpatient services. Staff provides trauma-informed care to help patients. Services at the sites are flexible, and treatments are adjusted based on the patient's personal journey. Each CORE site also has a community wellness center. The wellness centers are open to anyone in Sacramento County.

Homeless Engagement and Response Teams (HEART): The HEART team provides services in encampments and at shelters. The group includes counselors and people who offer peer support. The team works to build trusting relationships with unhoused individuals while meeting them where they are.

investment in behavioral health services, the Board of Supervisors recently approved over \$78 million in additional Behavioral Health investments within the County, including expanding services to the unhoused community, enhancing supported employment services, justice-involved services, building out a second Mental Health Urgent Care, and developing a new Mental Health Treatment Center.

The 64-bed Mental Health Treatment Center will be located on Branch Center Road and is projected to begin operations by the end of 2026. Once it is operational, the capacity will be assessed to determine additional needs.

The County also applied for and was awarded \$21.5M for a youth crisis facility. The facility will include a 16-bed psychiatric health facility and a crisis stabilization unit with a capacity for up to 27 youths at a time.

Acute/Subacute Hospitalization Beds

While the County has successfully met the acute bed needs for psychiatric hospitalization and there is not a shortage of acute beds, a recent RAND report revealed a shortage of 253 subacute beds for the entirety of Sacramento County.

It is important to note that Sacramento County Behavioral Health is responsible for providing mental health services specifically to individuals who are Medi-Cal recipients within the County, rather than the entire County population. There are a total of 566 acute psychiatric hospitalization beds in Sacramento County. Of those, 98 are Countycontrolled beds (available solely for County Behavioral Health Services clients).

It is also important to note the difference between acute and subacute care. Individuals require an acute bed when they are considered a danger to themselves or others due to a mental health condition. Subacute beds are used when someone's crisis has been resolved but they are still recovering, and in need of additional support and not ready for independent living. Subacute beds also help free up acute beds for other people in crisis.

Sacramento County Behavioral Health has taken immediate steps to increase subacute bed availability by expanding funding for contracts with out-of-county Mental Health Rehabilitation Centers (MHRCs). Available beds from these centers have been identified.

Addressing Homelessness: A County Priority

With these significant investments and efforts to expand behavioral health services, Sacramento County is taking action to improve the lives of unhoused individuals.

As Sacramento County continues its journey to deepen engagement and expand access to behavioral health services for the unhoused, it serves as an inspiring example of compassion and collective action. Beyond behavioral health services, several other Sacramento County departments have programs aimed at helping the unhoused and those who are housing insecure, including the Department of Human Assistance and the Department of Homeless Services and Housing. By prioritizing collaboration, accountability, and comprehensive care, the County aims to make a lasting impact in addressing the mental health needs of this vulnerable community.

SacDOT Receives Statewide Award

SACRAMENTO COUNTY. CA (MPG) - It has been less than a year since the County Department of Transportation (SacDOT) finished work on the final portion of the Hazel Avenue Improvement Project. It was a project designed to reduce congestion along Hazel Avenue and improve mobility for bicyclists and pedestrians, and that work recently earned SacDOT a statewide transportation award

The \$60 million project caught the eye of the California Transportation Foundation, which presented SacDOT with its 2023 Local Street Project of the Year award on June 6. For more than 30 years, the non-profit organization has recognized transportation achievements, innovations, and excellence throughout the state. This year's award-winning project was the final phase of a fifteen-year effort to beautify Hazel Avenue from Highway 50 to Madison Avenue. The project widened Hazel Avenue from 4 to 6 lanes to reduce congestion while increasing safety and mobility for all modes of transportation. improvements along Hazel Avenue included:

and pedestrian facilities provide safe connections to the American River Parkway and the trail system adjacent to the Hazel Avenue Bridge and Lake Natoma; Public that completion of the transit enhancements with new turn-out lanes for buses so the traffic can keep moving; The turn-out lanes also allow bus riders to board safely. SacDOT Chief Civil Engineer, Steve White, accepted the award on behalf of the County. White praised Principal Civil Engineer, Melissa Wright, and her in-house design team, led by Project Manager, Tim Stevens and Project Engineer, James Eslabon, for designing and developing the final phase of the Hazel Avenue Improvement Project. Teichert Construction, Other significant Pacific Excavation, RNR Construction Inc., TRC Companies Inc., County Construction Management Inspection Division, and County Real

Estate Division were also acknowledged as integral members for helping build the project.

White also pointed out Hazel Avenue work would not have been possible without the continuing support of the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors and our partnerships with local funding partners Fair Oaks Water District and Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD). SMUD removed overhead powerlines and placed them underground, while the water district used the project to upgrade its water system for residents and businesses.

24/7 Mental Health Urgent Care Clinic: The clinic provides walk-in services to people of all ages who are experiencing a mental health or substance abuse crisis. The clinic has safe spaces for individuals and families.

Sacramento County's Behavioral Health Services for the unhoused also include a Mobile Crisis Response Team to address immediate crisis needs in the community, and the Substance Use Disorder and Youth System of Care, among others.

Through these programs and the tireless efforts of the staff who provide these supports, the County is offering hope to those in need.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Summer has arrived, and rising temperatures are sure to follow in Sacramento County. As the mercury rises, it's important for pet owners to take proactive steps to ensure the well-being and safety of their beloved fourlegged companions. This summer, make sure you're aware of the potential dangers posed by extreme heat and provide essential care to keep your pets cool and comfortable during the sweltering summer season.

Unlike humans, dogs and cats can't sweat to keep cool. Instead, dogs cool themselves off by panting, and both dogs and cats regulate their temperatures through the pads of their feet. As temperatures soar, pets are at a higher risk of heat-related illnesses, such as heatstroke, dehydration, and burned paw pads.

Here are some tips for keeping your pet safe in the heat:

Never leave pets in parked cars: Even on seemingly mild days, the temperature inside a parked car can escalate rapidly, turning it into a deadly heat trap. Leaving pets unattended in cars, even with the windows cracked and even for a short period, can have fatal consequences and is against the law in California. If you need to run errands, leave your pets at home where they are safe and comfortable. Check out this video on how hot it gets in cars;

Hydrate: Make sure your pets always have access to plenty of fresh, cold water;

Avoid peak heat hours: Schedule outdoor activities and walks during cooler parts of the day, such as early mornings or evenings. Asphalt and concrete surfaces can become scorching hot and burn your pet's paw pads, so be mindful of the ground temperature before venturing out. Test the surface with your hand, and if it's too hot for you, it's too hot for your pet; Avoid extreme heat: When temperatures get above the 90s, take your pet inside. For outdoor pets, be sure to provide them with plenty of fresh, cold water in a tipproof water dish and shade for them to cool down; like people, and if your pet has light skin or fur, they can be particularly susceptible to a painful burn and even skin cancer. Use sunscreen on sensitive areas, such as ears or nose, to make sure your pets are protected;

Create a cool environment: Provide your pets with a cool and comfortable place to retreat from the heat. Keep them indoors, preferably in air-conditioned rooms. If air conditioning is not available, use fans or open windows to improve air circulation;

Provide adequate shade: Make sure there is always access to shaded areas when pets are outdoors. Trees, canopies, umbrellas, or pet-specific shade structures can offer protection from direct sunlight and help keep them cool;

Be your pet's lifeguard: While swimming can help pets get exercise without overheating, always supervise pets when swimming either in a pool or in waterways. Dogs can get tired swimming, particularly in rivers where they have to fight against currents. To avoid drowning, make sure they wear life jackets and keep them out of the water when flows are high;

Watch for signs of heatstroke: Familiarize yourself with the symptoms of heatstroke in pets, which can include excessive panting, drooling, glazed eyes, a rapid pulse, lethargy, vomiting, and collapse. If you suspect your pet is suffering from heatstroke, move them to a cool area, apply cool (not cold) water to their body, and seek immediate veterinary attention.

On view from June 10 through October 1, 2023, the exhibit dispels the myth that Black people in the old West were mostly cowboys, showing the rich diversity in African Americans' occu-

pations and achievements in society, religion, education and the arts from 1528 through the Civil Rights Movement.

Organized by The James Museum of Western & Wildlife Art and curator, historian and artist Dr. Carolyn Mazloomi, *Black Pioneers* features 50 quilts created for this exhibit by the Women of Color Quilters Network.

"Quilts and quilt making are important to America and Black culture in particular because the art form was historically one of the few mediums accessible to marginalized groups to tell their own story, to provide warmth for their families and to empower them with a voice through cloth," said Dr. Mazloomi. Quilts were chosen as the exhibit's visual medium because they highlight the intersection of African Americans in the western frontier with the art form's important role

in African American history. For African American women, quilts have always been at the core of artistic expression, taking form in their social, economic and spiritual lives.

"We are honored to host *Black Pioneers* at the California Museum," said Executive Director Amanda Meeker. "The quilts themselves are works of art, with elaborate materials and intricate details. The artistic and narrative elements of the quilts come together to create a powerful visual history lesson that we hope will leave visitors with an expanded view of Black history and American history." landscapes and history of the American West, and wildlife of the world. Dr. Carolvn Mazloomi's own quilts have been exhibited extensively nationwide. Among the exhibitions she has curated is Still We Rise: Race, Culture and Visual Conversations, which visually surveys 400 years of African American history. The largest traveling exhibit of African American quilts ever mounted, it appeared at the California Museum in 2018.


