## Cordova Gridiron Is Heating Up!

*Big Red Gearing Up for 2023-24 Season*

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The Cordova Lancer football team has been preparing in the off-season for the 2023-24 season with conditioning, weightlifting, game situation drills and a 7 on 7 touch football competition with other area football programs including Jesuit, Vista Del Lago and Fremont. They have been learning new offensive and defensive plays. They also have been doing this with a completely new set of coaches, as once again the historic program has new leadership.

Heading the new leadership is Coach John (JP) Dolliver. Dolliver came to Cordova from El Camino High where he helped rebuild their football program. Dolliver, in his 25th plus year of coaching football will make this season his 8th year

at the head coaching position. He knows a great deal about the success and tradition that precedes him in this position. "I'm excited for the opportunity to help return Cordova Football to a proud tradition while understanding the shoes I will be filling. The names of Dewey Guerra, Ron Lancaster and Max Miller float around me everyday", said Dolliver.

Coach Dolliver's philosophy starts with the foundation that he established at his other programs. This philosophy, which he calls the "Four C's", are Commitment to the task at hand, Courage to see the task through, Compassion for others and Quiet Confidence in our success. "My father taught me to embrace these words at a young age and I have lived by them ever since", said Dolliver.

I asked Coach Dolliver what his expectations for the upcoming

season were and his response was very grounded. "I'm more concerned with the grade book than the scoreboard and how my young men conduct themselves in the community over reaching the end zone. If we build strong men of character who understand their priorities, success on the field will come", said Coach Dolliver. Dolliver plans on striving for a positive team culture that is characterized by his "Four C's". The virtues that he hopes to encompass in all of his Cordova football players are academics, community, and sportsmanship.

Coach Dolliver understands that a successful program requires a great coaching staff and he has compiled a team of coaches to accompany him on the sidelines and in the press box. His coaches are Pedro Garza as Assistant Head Coach and

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - National "Hire a Veteran Day" will be observed on Tuesday, July 25, 2023. And if you're a recent military veteran in the Sacramento area, ready to take the next step in your career, then register now for a special veterans' hiring event at the PRIDE Industries Career Hub at 7011 Sylvan Road on Tuesday, July 25th in Citrus Heights from 10 am to 2 pm.

"It's our first time locally hosting this event in Citrus Heights," said Charles Smith, PRIDE Industries (PRIDE) recruitment manager/talent acquisition in a telephone interview from his Texas office. "It's a corporate event for us and we're eager to spread the word about this special event."

Since 1966, PRIDE Industries has provided employment recruiting services to the military, serving 17 major bases across the country. The company also counts hundreds of veterans of all ranks among its management team and on its board of directors.

PRIDE Industries also partners with multiple government and private organizations including the Department of Veterans Affairs, and the State of California Employment Development Department (EDD) to support the professional development of active and former service members who are ready to build or transition into rewarding civilian careers.

The national "Hire A Veteran Day" aims to inspire employers to recruit and hire veterans by recognizing the unique skills and values that former soldiers, sailors, airmen, Marines and Coast Guardsmen bring to the workforce. ## SMUD's Shine Program Is Now Accepting Applications

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - SMUD is announcing that the application period for its Shine Awards is now open to nonprofit organizations. Shine is a community development program designed to improve and revitalize neighborhoods in the Sacramento region.

Proposals should focus on projects that support zero carbon workforce development, environmental justice and equity, inclusive economic development and STEM education. Shine projects align with SMUD's Clean Energy Vision, which will eliminate all carbon emissions from its power supply by 2030.

Shine awards will range from \$5,000 to \$100,000 and are very competitive. Any incorporated nonprofit organization within SMUD's service area is eligible to apply. Shine awards are available at three funding levels: Spark (up to \$10,000), Amplifier (up to \$50,000) and Transformer (up to \$100,000). Applications will be accepted through July 31.

While SMUD will consider a broad variety of potential projects, it is primarily interested in proposals that:

Align with SMUD's 2030 Clean Energy Vision and are powered by clean energy solutions; Promote energy efficiency, energy conservation and

greenhouse gas reduction, particularly in diverse and under-resourced communities (environmental justice & equity); Involve clean energy education related to energy efficiency, renewable energy, or related STEM fields; Advance inclusive zero carbon workforce development, and; Support community revitalization and placemaking.

SMUD will host multiple informational webinar sessions about Shine and the application process. A registration link and application can be found on [smud.org/Shine](http://smud.org/Shine).

This year, SMUD awarded over \$500,000 in Shine sponsorships to 22 local nonprofits. SMUD received a wide range of

applications; the selected projects were able to successfully demonstrate collaboration and the potential for broad neighborhood impact.

Each year SMUD contributes approximately \$3 million in financial support and in-kind services to community-based organizations. SMUD will continue to support healthy, vibrant and economically sustainable neighborhoods for all customers, with a special eye toward improving equity in our region through SMUD's Sustainable Communities program.

# Governor Signs Bill to Strengthen Domestic Violence Restraining Orders

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Governor Gavin Newsom recently signed into law Assembly Bill (AB) 467, a bipartisan measure authored by Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel (D - Encino) that will strengthen the ability of judges to grant and modify domestic violence protective orders.

"At a time in which violence against women and domestic abuse have increased to record levels around the world, it is crucial that we ensure domestic violence restraining orders are offering the fullest possible protection," said Assemblymember Gabriel. "This legislation will clarify a judge's authority over these orders, and extend the amount of time a court can modify the orders to ensure that we are providing ample protection to victims of domestic abuse."

Santa Clara County District Attorney Jeff Rosen, sponsor of the bill, hailed the new law as crucial to make sure that victims of crime can petition the court to change the terms of restraining orders during the 10-year lifetime of those orders. In some instances, victims will need more protections from the court, and in others fewer. District Attorney Rosen said, "Giving judges the ability to modify

their own court orders will help victims of domestic violence manage the protections to keep them safe. We are so grateful to Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel for championing this important new law."

Ambiguity in current law has left some courts confused as to when and for how long they have authority over domestic violence restraining orders and when they can modify provisions related to contact between the restrained person and the protected person, which can either be a "peaceful contact order" (PCO) or a no contact order (NCO). Victims often seek to modify the order from PCO to NCO or vice versa.

Some courts have determined that if the defendant is no longer serving a sentence and is not on probation, they do not have the jurisdiction to modify the order, even if both the victim and defendant request it. This confusion in current law is detrimental to both victims and defendants. AB 467 gives sentencing courts the authority to modify the terms of a peaceful contact order or no contact order and make modifications to the order throughout the duration of the domestic violence protective order.

Jesse Gabriel proudly represents the San Fernando Valley in the California State Legislature. ★

# Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Welcomes New Volunteers

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - On June 22, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office announced they are looking for additional volunteers to round out the variety of programs they offer the community. Despite the fact many living within county lines are unaware volunteer tasks even exist, residents should know that the tasks available often coincide with duties of trained law enforcement. Many of the county's volunteers have experience working as a police officer or in emergency services, however, anyone who is of applicable age and meets the requirements is welcome to give their time.

According to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, there are currently five different divisions volunteers are welcome to apply to: The Sheriff's Amateur Radio Program (SHARP), Volunteer Reserve Officer, Volunteers in Partnership with the Sheriff (VIPS), Search & Rescue, and a youth program called the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Explorer Program.

SHARP was created in 1977 after an increase in theft crimes hit the region. It was further inspired by the level of participation from the community that came about when the Police were working to apprehend the East Area Rapist. It became clear that year how valuable citizens were when it came to operating radio and helping to relay emergency information. All volunteers are licensed by the FCC, and, according to their website, "have the responsibility of assisting the Sacramento County Emergency Operations Center with any emergency requiring auxiliary communication."

VIPS meanwhile, provide clerical support, work in the Community Service Center, assist with Missing Person follow-ups, and patrol neighborhoods. They are granted authority to

report code and parking violations, perform vacation checks on homes, and other basic Officer duties as directed by patrol.

Margie, a VIPS since 2013 stated, "After I retired as a teacher, I wanted to give back to the community a little more and have something to do. The main reason I do this is to help the public and the small chores I do for the department keep that kind of thing off the shoulders of the deputies, so they are able to do more to keep us safe."

Those wishing to be a VIPS should note it is one of the biggest time commitments – the Sheriff's Office requires its volunteer team to give at least 16 hours per month – and participants should realize they won't necessarily be the most popular people in town. Since the VIPS are known for issuing citations throughout the County, they sometimes ruffle the feathers of those on the receiving end. When asked about the volunteer group, resident Stephanie Vasquez stated, "No thank you! You couldn't pay me to be around crooked people."

For those who have a passion for serving with law enforcement, volunteering at the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office is not just for adults. The Sheriff's Office Explorer Program is another group that's been around since the 1970s and is aimed at young people aged 14-20 who are interested in a career in law enforcement. As resident Bill Shanklin stated, the youth involved in the program are "our hope for the future."

Explorers learn self-defense, training in search and seizure laws and arrests, practice public speaking and learn to work on a team. There are also opportunities for Explorers to compete with sister groups around the nation.

# Campbell and Nyberg Make All-Metro Team!

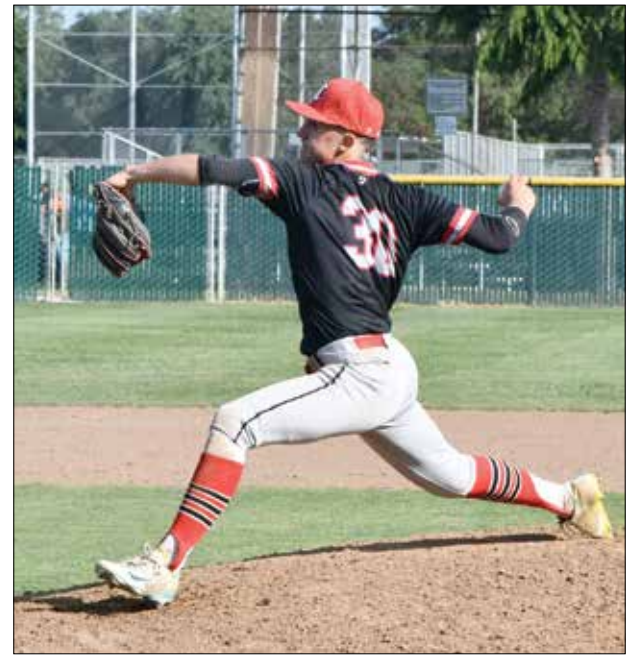

Campbell, who graduated in May, was selected to the First Team All-Metro as a utility player. Freshman Levi Nyberg was selected to the Second Team All-Metro also as a utility player. Levi was the only freshman to make the list.

Senior Eli Campbell's stats for the year were: Batting Average .544; On Base Percentage .620; Earned Run Average 0.82; Slugging Percentage: .947. Campbell finished his final season at Cordova with 31 hits in 57 at bats with 13 doubles, 5 triples and picked up a total of 27 RBI's. Campbell has decided to play baseball for Sacramento City College and develop his playing skills in hopes of getting a D1 scholarship offer or get drafted.

# Jehovah's Witness Conventions Returning to Downtown Sacramento

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - After a three-year pandemic pause, one of the largest convention organizations in the world has chosen downtown Sacramento to host its global three-day event, the 2023 "Exercise Patience"! Convention.

The return happens just in time to use the newly renovated SAFE Credit Union Convention Center, and will draw an estimated 28,000 attendees to the downtown area during a time when most locals are away for the summer.

Prior to 2020, summers in Sacramento drew Jehovah's Witnesses from all over Northern California who filled hotels and restaurants as they attended their annual conventions at the Sleep Train Arena. In 2020, the pandemic interrupted that tradition when the Witnesses canceled their in-person events throughout the world and held their convention programs as virtual events in more than 500 languages. Starting in late June of this year, the Witnesses will bring back the tradition to Sacramento, hosting conventions exclusively downtown at the SAFE Credit Union Convention Center. Conventions will be held over seven weekends this summer starting June 30, 2023, and ending Aug 13, 2023. The conventions will be held in English for five weekends and two (July 14-16, July 21-23) in Spanish.

"After three years

without in-person conventions, we can't wait to gather together again for these special annual events," said Adrian Barnes, local spokesman for Jehovah's Witnesses. "It's particularly exciting that we are returning to support beautiful downtown Sacramento, where the local restaurants, businesses and residents have always been welcoming."

Some 6,000 conventions will be held worldwide as part of the 2023 "Exercise Patience"! Convention series. In the United States alone, more than 700 conventions will be held in 144 host cities. From Friday through Sunday, six convention sessions will explore the quality of patience, highlighting its modern-day relevance through Scriptural examples. A live baptism will be performed following the Saturday morning session and a prerecorded drama will be featured in two parts during the Saturday and Sunday afternoon sessions.

"Given the challenges

we face today as individuals and communities, the theme of our convention, "Exercise Patience"!, is particularly timely," said Barnes. "The three-day program will share practical ways attendees can cultivate and display patience, which in turn contributes to stronger relationships and more compassionate communities, including right here in Sacramento."

Jehovah's Witnesses have been holding public conventions in stadiums, arenas, convention centers, and theaters around the world for more than 100 years. After resuming smaller in-person meetings and their public ministry during 2022, the summer of 2023 marks the first time they will gather at much larger regional events around the world since the lifting of pandemic restrictions.

resume writing assistance, describing vocational training opportunities and job placement assistance which includes roles with PRIDE Industries and its employment partners. Scholarships for military children are also available.

Smith said PRIDE is also in the process of hiring a dedicated veterans' liaison to work in the Citrus Heights office.

# Cybertip Operation Targeting Child Predators Leads to 23 Arrests

Sacramento County Sheriff's Dept. News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - From June 18th to July 1st, the Sacramento Valley Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (ICAC) partnered with 29 different federal and local law enforcement agencies in Northern California to conduct a large cybertip operation targeting child predators.

The operation resulted in the execution of 37 warrants and 23 arrests across Northern California. Two notable arrests that came from Sacramento County were Jonathan Kasten of Rancho Cordova and Brian Schmeltz of Sacramento.

Kasten was arrested for:  
PC 311.11(a) - Possession of child pornography

PC 311.4(d) - Production/manufacturing of child pornography

PC 29180(b) - Failure to affix DOJ issued serial number prior to assembling firearm

PC 30605(a) - Illegal possession

of assault weapon

Kasten had multiple CSAM images, including a video of himself and a child victim. He is currently in custody without bail and is being investigated for additional sex crimes.

Schmeltz was arrested for:

PC 288.3 - Communication with a minor with intent to commit sex offense

PC 288.4(a)(1) - Arranging to meet with a minor for lewd purposes

PC 664/288(a) - Attempted lewd act with child under 14

PC 664/311.4(d) - Attempted solicitation for child pornography

Schmeltz had been chatting with 3 different ICAC detectives who were posing as children under the age of 14 during the operation. Detectives believe it is possible that Schmeltz was communicating with other minors. Any potential victims are encouraged to contact the Sheriff's Office. Schmeltz is currently in custody without bail and is awaiting his next court date.

# Walking Through Every Open Door

*Advice and Insights from Diplomatic Consultant W. Bruce Lee*

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - W. Bruce Lee is a man of experience and humility, and he said he attributes his success to always saying yes to the next challenge — accepting the next invitation, undertaking the next assignment, choosing to “always walk through doors that are open for me.”

Lee’s work spans the industries of government, business, and education. He has taught at the University of Phoenix and William Jessup University, worked in the Governor’s Finance Department for the State of California, and worked as a business coach for various national corporations. Lee has served in the halls of government most of his life — running statewide initiatives, twice elected as Mayor of Loomis, and elected as Director of the Placer County Water Agency, among other offices. Currently, he serves as the executive officer of the Phoenix Correspondence Commission, a nonpartisan governmental entity (established by all 50 states) that works to balance State and Federal authority.

In recent years, Lee has turned his skills toward diplomatic consulting—helping communities, businesses, and governments around the world find pathways to success as well as hope for the future.

Born and raised in the Sacramento Region, Lee has traveled the world, advising organizations in places such as Nepal, Singapore, and China. He has worked in South America,

In all nations — regardless of differing systems of government, economy, and cultural standards — the same basic needs exist. And people always seek to overcome challenges, achieve their goals, and better their lives. But Lee has also seen that “there is a human tendency toward selfishness, and selfishness creates greed, which in government will lead to short-term benefits in one’s own self-interest, but does

not create any long-term sustainability.” Lee, “and look not at what is right for themselves, but what is right for their constituents, and for their society as a whole.” Practical solu-

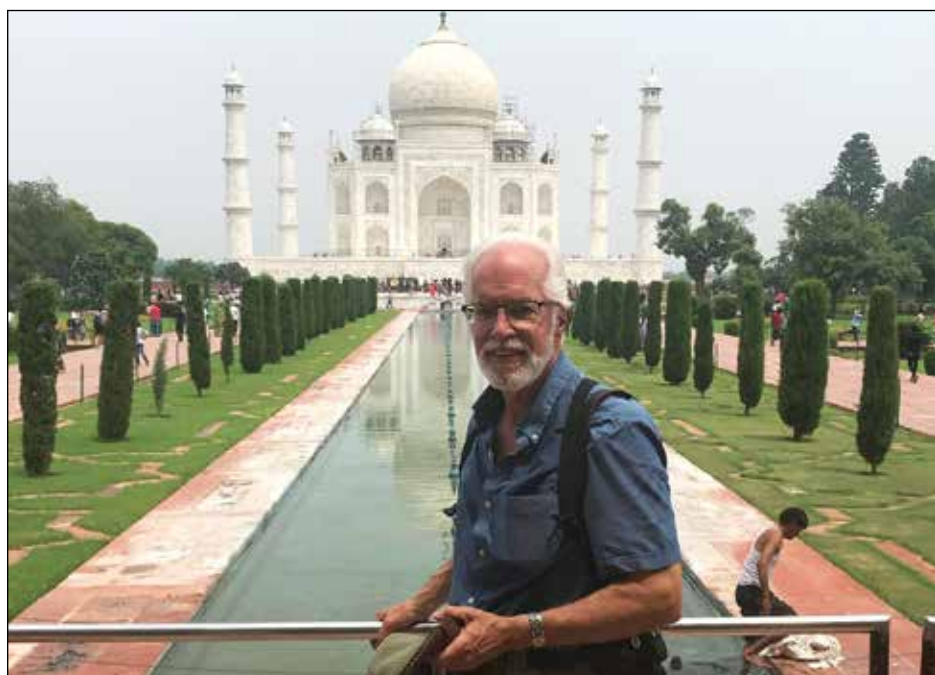
tions are needed, so that is where Lee comes in, offering guidance on how governments can provide opportunities that better serve their people, creating stronger communities that support a stronger nation. In business settings, the advice is similarly applied: better products and services create a more satisfied customer base, better employee morale, and a stronger company for the long term.

Whether in a classroom, boardroom, or the legislature of foreign governments, Lee said the core of his work is about “equipping people” and showing them that there are practical solutions to every challenge. He often sees “a lot of activity, with plenty of energy and money to make things happen — but a lack of results.” While people often want an easy answer, Lee cautions that there is “no one right answer, no magic bullet.” Change takes effort and discipline. There are answers, and while they won’t come overnight, there is always hope for

improving the situation — and Lee strives to help everyone find that hope. “We need to exercise sound critical thinking and wisdom in how we approach our problem solving,” said Lee. “We have to take responsibility for ourselves and for our society.”

In his life, Lee spends his time and money investing not in himself, but in others, wherever he sees a need: “Wherever I am able to be of benefit, it is my honor and privilege to be of service,” said Lee. “I can offer what I have.” As a deeply religious man, Lee credits God for his many accomplishments. “God has been good to me,” said Lee. “I live in a country where I’ve been able to get a good education and develop useful skills. God has treated me much better than I deserve. And it’s easy to take these things for granted, but it’s essential that we do not.”

Seeing the struggles of communities around the world has broadened Lee’s perspective. He believes that many Americans don’t realize how fortunate they are. “Our social, economic, and political freedoms are hard-won,” said Lee. “Diligence is necessary in their protection, otherwise they may easily slip away.” For many around the world, America is “still the light on the hill,” said Lee. “They see we’re doing things differently, and we need to protect that.”

Australia, New Zealand, Europe and Eastern Europe, the Middle East, and various African countries —including Cameroon, Rwanda, Ethiopia, Zimbabwe, Tunisia, Uganda, Nigeria, and South Sudan.

Lee has found that all societies are built upon three main systems: economic, government, and culture. And every society is unique in the way these features integrate and reinforce each other. But Lee cautioned that different cultures don’t always support the same economic or governmental systems. So, as an outsider in these countries, Lee said, “I don’t assume.” His first and most important step is to listen: “You tell me what you need, and then I can help to achieve those results.”

Lee cautioned that many people here live lives of privilege and feel no sense of responsibility toward others. But Lee said, “We have a massive responsibility to our community.” Whatever skills each of us have, Lee believes we are called to use them for the good of others, whether that is in construction, farming, teaching, etc. “If it benefits people in a tangible way, inspires them, gives them hope—that’s a blessing,” said Lee.

His advice can be boiled down to a simple message: “Let’s love our neighbors. Let’s not take things for granted. Let us be of good hope, because whatever challenges we may see around us, they are resolvable if we work together in a civilized way, not marred by violence in word or action. ... Let us seek to honor each other and learn from each other. All of that takes commitment and humility.”

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - As part of the Local Homeless Action Plan (LHAP) and in conjunction with the City-County Partnership Agreement, the Coordinated Access System (CAS) has been developed by Sacramento Steps Forward. The CAS is a streamlined system that matches people experiencing homelessness with housing and service options. This process prioritizes limited local shelter and housing resources, so people with the highest vulnerability can be connected to supports as quickly as possible.

In Sacramento, the front door for CAS is 2-1-1 Sacramento. Households can call the Housing Crisis Line at 2-1-1 (select #8) to be triaged

to appropriate resources. In addition, trained agencies with Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) access can conduct the individual or family shelter assessment to place a household on the shelter waitlist.

**Why is Coordinated Access Critical?**  
It’s an efficient, equitable, client-centered approach to ending homelessness. Key strategy of the Local Homeless Action Plan; Requirement of the Sacramento City/County Partnership Agreement; CAS connects people who are unhoused with critical resources and services; CAS creates a pathway for people who are unhoused to navigate an end to their housing crisis; Without system coordination, the community is limited in
