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

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) was awarded on May 5, 2023, a \$45.1 million grant from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to support the purchase of 16 new light rail vehicles.

The grant through the FY22/23 Rail Vehicle Replacement Program, a new program created by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, will help SacRT towards the purchase of 16 new low-floor light rail vehicles from Siemens Mobility in south Sacramento. SacRT is one of six transit agencies nationwide and the only in FTA Region 9 to receive this grant. SacRT previously purchased 28 new low-floor light rail trains from Siemens Mobility and has a contract to order up to 76. Those vehicles are currently undergoing a testing process before they can be put into service early next year. With the order of an additional 16 new low-floor trains. SacRT will have 44 new low-floor vehicles, which is close to two-thirds of all the vehicles needed to operate on our light rail system.

SacRT has secured more than \$350 million for our Light Rail Modernization Project, which includes the purchase of new low-floor trains, modifications to station platforms and adding a passing track to provide 15-minute service to Folsom area stations.

'The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law is delivering federal dollars across the nation - and here in Sacramento our innovators at SacRT are ready to capitalize on its benefits for the community," said Congresswoman Doris Matsui (CA-07). "I was proud to fight for this infusion of federal funds that will replace 35-yearold light rail vehicles with new modern trains built right here in Sacramento by Siemens Mobility. This \$45 million grant is helping us build Sacramento's

future and will enable us to continue leading the way on sustainable, clean, and equitable public transportation."

"Sacramento Regional Transit is crucial for mobility in the Sacramento region, but the current light rail cars have reached the end of their useful life, said Congressman Ami Bera (CA-06). "I am proud to have helped secure funding through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law for a new fleet of low-floor cars that will enhance the rider experience and make light rail accessible to all, including those with mobility restrictions, parents with strollers, and cyclists."

"As we celebrate SacRT's 50 years of service to the regionwe can also look to the future," Senator Alex Padilla said. "I have been proud to support and see SacRT's efforts over the finish line to secure federal funding for new, modern light rail cars. Today's grant announcement is a major investment in regional mobility, making light rail cleaner, safer, and more accessible for everyone."

"I want to thank Senator Padilla and Representatives Matsui and Bera for championing the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law that created this new grant program, said SacRT Board Chair and Sacramento County Supervisor Patrick Kennedy. "This significant funding award will help accelerate SacRT's light rail modernization program and puts us one step closer to replacing our aging light rail fleet with entirely new and modern, low-floor vehicles that will improve accessibility for all riders. These new vehicles are being built by Siemens, right here in Sacramento, so this is also a significant boost to the economic prosperity of the region."

"We are very grateful to the Federal Transit Administration, FTA Administrator Nuria Fernandez and FTA Region 9 Administrator Ray Tellis for their extraordinary leadership for recognizing how important it is to replace our aging fleet of light rail vehicles," said SacRT General Manager/CEO Henry Li. "We also owe our gratitude to Senator Alex Padilla, Representative Doris Matsui and Representative Ami Bera for supporting this grant opportunity and SacRT in general. We are a stronger community because of the work they do on our behalf, and we will be even better when these new, modern low-floor light rail trains are in service early next year."

This new FTA funding along with other grant funding from the Sacramento Area of Governments (SACOG) and the state is being used for the new purchase of 16 low-floor light rail trains.

At the end of April, the state of California awarded SacRT \$8.5 million in grant funding through the Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP) to help support improved train technology, including real-time train arrival, passenger announcement system and more. Furthermore, this week the SACOG Transportation Committee approved their 2023 Regional Funding recommendations which include nearly \$6.5 million for SacRT's Light Rail vehicles replacements and \$5 million for station conversions to accommodate the new vehicles. New low-floor light rail trains are expected to be in service on the Gold line by summer 2024. Learn more at sacrt.com/ modernization.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (**MPG**) - SAFE Credit Union is proud to once again support the creators of "farm to wellness" programs exclusively offered to veterans in the Sacramento region.

The credit union is awarding a \$10,000 grant to Rancho Cordova-based Soil Born Farms – providers of job training and therapeutic experiences for veterans at its 55-acre American River Ranch farm.

"Sacramento is rich in agricultural history and farm to fork practices. Our foundation at SAFE is rooted in supporting our military and veterans," says SAFE President and CEO Faye Nabhani. "It is amazing and rewarding for us to be able to substantively support both of these efforts with this grant."

SAFE annually awards **Community Sustainability** Grant Program grants to two nonprofits dedicated to impacting the lives of veterans in area communities. The credit union opened in 1940 as the Sacramento Air Depot Federal Credit Union, initially serving members of the military and their families. The grant marks the second time the credit union has backed the veterans program and farm that fosters connections among food, health and the environment. SAFE is also awarding \$20,000 to Volunteers of America Northern California and Northern Nevada for its

program assisting homeless veterans.

Soil Born Farms Founder and Co-Director Shawn Harrison says the organization plans to use the funding to provide support for two veterans enrolled in the farm's Veteran Apprentice Program and to expand the organization's Veteran Field Days, where veterans are immersed in agricultural practices for the day.

Harrison says the grant from SAFE allows the nonprofit to conduct slower and more thoughtful programming with local veterans.

"The funding from SAFE Credit Union allows us to create a more gradual immersion into the farm experience for a diverteam in producing more nutritious food for people in our community."

Army veteran and Rancho Cordova resident Bryce Wilson, who served as a radio communications specialist from 2007-12, including two combat tours and one overseas training exercise with the Royal Thai Armed Forces, completed Soil Born Farm's apprenticeship program and now works there as a farmer.

"The apprenticeship program allowed me to rediscover the potential I had as a person, that I was more than a soldier," says Wilson who handles orchard maintenance and fruit production.

"It allowed me to grow as an individual and helped me to reintegrate back into the community."

The farm – which grows a diversity of vegetable, herbs, flowers, and tree fruit – also educates youth and adults about how to curate Sacramento's local food system while encouraging healthy lifestyles and nurturing the environment. 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How Will California Deal With Budget **Deficits That Seem Here To Stay?**

A little more than two weeks remain before the June 15 constitutional deadline for enacting a 2023-24 state budget.

It's as certain as anything in politics can be that the Legislature will pass something it calls a budget. If lawmakers missed the deadline, they could lose their paychecks.

It's equally certain that whatever they enact will not be the final plan for the 2023-24 fiscal year that begins July 1. Due to declines in revenue, the state faces not only a multi-billion-dollar deficit in the forthcoming year but the likelihood of continuing gaps for several years thereafter.

There is, moreover, neither consensus on the scope of the deficit nor agreement on how the governor and legislators respond. Meanwhile, those in the Capitol are besieged by pleas by those with stakes in the budget to protect their projects and programs and demands for even greater allocations.

When Gov. Gavin Newsom introduced his first version of the budget in January, he said the state had a \$22.5 billion deficit, and then increased the shortfall by another \$9 billion in the revised budget

proposal this month. Legislature's budget analyst, Gabe Petek, told his bosses that it's really \$34.5 billion and, more ominously, declared that the state faces continuing deficits averaging \$18 billion for several more years.

It is, in the parlance of fiscal mavens, a "structural deficit," meaning it's baked into the state's finances regardless of underlying economic conditions. All of the competing versions of the state's fiscal situation also assume that California hike would merely recapture does not experience a recession in the near future.

Were a recession to strike, the deficits could grow by tens of billions of dollars because California's revenue system is dangerously dependent on taxing the incomes of the state's wealthiest residents, as Newsom's budget acknowledges.

tax system, where nearly half of all personal income tax in the state is paid by the top 1% of earners, has contributed to extreme budget volatility over the years," the May revision says. "Maintaining budget stability requires long-term planning in the face of these revenue fluctuations."

In light of that statement and Petek's rather gloomy long-term projections, will Newsom and the Legislature respond responsibly? Or will they take the easy way out, paper over the current deficit with creative bookkeeping and backdoor borrowing, and ignore the structural deficit until it becomes a *vears*, spending all but a few crisis?

essentially a short-term Immediately, however, the response, dipping the usual bag of fiscal tricks to produce a budget that would be balanced on paper - assuming his deficit estimate of \$31.5 billion is accurate.

> Both Senate and the Assembly leaderships have adopted budget frameworks that purport to protect vital services but differ in approach. The Assembly's version would reshuffle appropriations while the Senate's would cover the gap by raising corporate income taxes, arguing that a tax money large corporations gained from the Trump-era federal tax overhaul.

Although Newsom immediately rejected a corporate tax increase, if the deficit is as wide and chronic as Petek projects, budget stakeholders will intensify their demands for tax increases of some kind.

In recent elections, California voters have "California's progressive rejected proposed increases in property taxes and personal income taxes on the wealthy. Newsom opposed the income tax increase, is now opposing the Senate's proposed corporate tax, and also has rejected periodic bills to impose a wealth tax.

"A wealth tax is not part of the conversation," Newsom said of this year's version. "Wealth taxes are going nowhere in California."

This year's budget dance will kick off a political tussle over spending and taxes that will likely continue for the remainder of Newsom's governorship.

DRAFT REMEDIAL ACTION PLAN FOR AEROJET AREA 49000 FOR REVIEW RANCHO CORDOVA, CALIFORNIA PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: JUNE 8, 2023 – JULY 13, 2023

WHAT IS BEING PROPOSED? A draft Remedial Action Plan (RAP) has been prepared for Aerojet Area 49000, located immediately west of Nimbus Road and south of Folsom Boulevard, in Rancho Cordova, California 95670 (Site). The Site is a 71-acre portion of the Aerojet Superfund Site. The Site was recently purchased by NorthPoint Development, LLC (NorthPoint). NorthPoint plans to construct a total of five (5) warehouses and four (4) stormwater detention basins for the proposed Rancho Cordova Logistics Center development.

The Site was previously investigated and remediated as part of the Perimeter Groundwater Operable Unit (PGOU) of the Aerojet Superfund Site. Land use restrictions were placed following remediation, including restrictions on groundwater use and requirements for soil vapor mitigation for new buildings if the Site was redeveloped in the future. The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is the lead agency administering, executing, and enforcing the land use covenants (LUCs) that specify these restrictions

This RAP proposes the LUC-required soil vapor mitigation for Buildings 1 and 2, the only buildings planned for construction at this time. Buildings 3, 4, and 5 are scheduled for possible construction later and not included in this RAP.

If approved, the DTSC would oversee the proposed remedial activities for soil vapor mitigation at Area 49000. We invite you to review and comment on the draft RAP, which describes the history and investigation of the Site, assesses different vapor mitigation methods, and recommends a specific course of action.



be publicly accountable and accessible. In late 2022, the Board created DHSH, which became official in January of 2023 and will assume most of the budget and programs from existing departments on July 1, 2023. Part of DHSH's mission as a newly created department is to increase the diversity and accountability of its programs and outcomes.

The goals for year one are to increase communication from the County both internally to County employees and externally to those living unhoused, advocates, stakeholders, residents and business owners.

This includes increasing engagement in the community, both with those being served and those wanting more information about the department, the County and the overall work being done to address homelessness in the region.

DHSH is committed to sharing out-

programs, but also in our own journalistic reporting. While the County has historically relied on trusted reporting from its local media partners, the need for accuracy and consistency has never been greater. To this end, the County will use its own communication channels to their fullest extent and work to position County staff and trusted partners as the source of information, not the media. The County will also endeavor to not just share the wins and successes, but also the process and the lessons learned from shortfalls.

In conjunction with the workshop, the County and staff from the City of Sacramento also reported on the sixmonth status update of the City/County Partnership Agreement.

Homelessness is a Countywide issue that impacts everyone. Meaningfully addressing the various aspects of each person's homelessness requires creative collaboration and sustainable solutions.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - We've goat some exciting news! The Sacramento County Department of Regional Parks has initiated its multi-pronged plan to reduce fire risk, defend wildlife habitats and protect our natural resources and the neighborhoods adjacent to the parks.

For its 2023 Fire Fuel Reduction Action Plan, the Department of Regional Parks has lined up sheep and goat grazing contracts, is utilizing maintenance crews to maintain fire breaks, and is issuing fuel break maintenance permits to properties bordering Park properties.

"We're seeing more vegetation than we have in past years thanks to the strong winter storms that passed through," said Liz Bellas, Director of Regional Parks. "Our fire fuel reduction work is going to be particularly critical this year as this vegetation dries out in the late spring."

To decrease the number and size potential of wildfires in our parks system, the techniques used will be applicable for each area and will include:

Firebreaks – A combination of mowing, soil discing and targeted herbicides will be used where appropriate to create perimeters around open fields, along fence lines and behind neighborhoods. This work is scheduled to be completed by the end of June.

Ladder Fuel Hand-Crews – In limited, hard-to-reach areas, hand-crews will remove vegetation that allows the potential for a fire to climb up or move into urban areas. **Grazing** –There are hundreds of acres of undeveloped or protected land in our Regional Parks. Goats and sheep are ideal for vegetation management and are great at eating down weeds, bushes and grass that manned crews cannot get to. Grazing is expected to occur through the end of June.

Annual Encroachment Permits – Residents who live adjacent to Regional Parks' properties are able to apply for free annual encroachment permits to maintain a fire break behind their property line. These allow residents to string-trim grass and weeds for up to 50 feet beyond their private property line. To request a permit, provide your name, address and contact information to Regional Parks at parksinfo@SacCounty.gov.

Additionally, the Ranger Division will continue its increased education and enforcement efforts related to illegal fires and cooking along the parkway in an effort to reduce the number of new fire outbreaks.

Visitors to Sacramento County Regional Parks should be aware of the following regulations:

Open flame fires are NOT allowed, and barbequing is only permitted in designated picnic areas.

Smoking is only allowed in developed picnic areas, asphalt surfaces, golf courses and levee tops along the American River Parkway.


