Hall of Fame Marathoner Helen Klein Honored on 100th Birthday

- Hall of Fame Runner Helen Klein was honored by the Rancho Cordova City Council for her 100th birthday.

Longtime Rancho Cordova resident, world record holder and great-great grandmother Helen Klein was recognized by the City Council on November 21 in honor of her 100th birthday. Helen holds 75 national and world records for running and has run 90 marathons and 143 ultramarathons. The Rancho Cordova City Council presented Helen with a proclamation and a key to the city.

"When I was young, I ran all of those races by 'taking to the tortoise' and going slow up the mountains and by running fast downhill and on the flats. Now that I am nearing my 100th birthday, I am 'taking to the tortoise' and going slowly uphill, downhill and on the flats," Helen joked. "I am just so

Helen's running career did not begin until she was 55 and until then, she had not run a single mile. When she was challenged to a 10-mile race, Helen began training. At 66, she was one of the first to complete the Grand Slam of Ultrarunning, one of the oldest 100-mile races in the United States. At 72, she completed a 145-mile race in the Sahara Desert in Morocco, only weeks later

to complete the 370-mile Echo Challenge in Utah.

"Helen is an absolute inspiration, and my colleagues and I wish her a very Happy Birthday," said Vice Mayor Linda Budge.



Americorps Fellows and the Girl Scouts Heart of Central California's Mobile STEM Center,

these tactile projects kept participants actively

engaged while learning. One highlight of the day

was feedback received from a newly established local Daisy Troop. Having formed just one week prior, the STEM Expo was the troop's first Girl Scouts event. They arrived early and were some of the last to leave! Their enthusiastic troop leader made connections for future activities inspired by both the event itself and by other leaders in attendance. The troop is especially interested in working more with Code Ninjas.

Over the last 30 years, employment in STEM occupations has grown 79% with the promise of continued growth in the fields. Women comprise only 34% of the STEM workforce and have lower

median salaries than their male counterparts.

The future for women in STEM is far brighter, however, thanks to events like this that inspire tomorrow's thinkers and leaders. STEM is a foundational part of the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, the four-pillar framework around which all our activities are built. Along with the other pillars (outdoors, life skills, and entrepreneurship) Girl Scouts is committed to providing opportunities for growth through STEM-focused learning.



FOLSOM, CA (MPG) - $\mathrm{Dr}.$ Art Pimentel has been appointed the fourth president of Folsom Lake College by the Los Rios Community College District Board of Trustees at their December 14, 2022 meeting. He will begin his tenure at Folsom Lake College on January 9, 2023.

With over 17 years of higher education experience, Pimentel's extensive background includes leadership of student and instructional services, fiscal management, marketing, community outreach, enrollment management, facilities management, government relations, and institutional and strategic planning. This also marks a return to Los Rios where he previously worked for five years within the district including serving as the Dean for Sacramento City College's West Sacramento Center and as the district's Interim Director of Educational

Services and Student

Success.

Pimentel most recently served as President of Woodland Community College. Under his leadership, Woodland Community College increased its student retention rates by over 5% since 2019, increased enrollment by 9% post-pandemic, began construction on the college's \$42 million performing arts and culinary services building, expanded behavioral health services through a partnership with Yolo County, and developed strong partnerships with all K-12 districts in the college's service area to expand dual enrollment and career exploration opportunities.

"We couldn't be happier to welcome Dr. Pimentel back to Los Rios and to Folsom Lake College," said Brian King, Chancellor of the Los Rios Community College District. "Dr. Pimentel brings a wealth of skill and expertise to the presidency, and a deep commitment to the students of our region. I can't wait to see the great things that FLC will accomplish under Art's leadership."

Pimentel earned his Bachelor of Arts in Social Sciences from California State University, Sacramento; his Master of Arts in Educational Leadership from California State University, Sacramento; and his Doctorate in Education (Ed.D.) from the University of California, Davis.

In addition to his career in higher education, Pimentel has been active within the community. He was elected to the Woodland City Council and served from 2004-2008, elected Mayor of Woodland in 2008 and served from 2008-2012, and served on the Woodland Joint Unified School District Board of Trustees in 2014. He also served as the Chairman for the Yolo County Transportation District, Yolo-Solano Air Quality District, and the Cleaner Air Partnership of Sacramento.

"I look forward to joining the Folsom Lake College family and working with college staff and faculty to continue the important work of increasing access to higher education by focusing on closing equity gaps and improving student achievement," shared Pimentel.

Pimentel will succeed Dr. Whitney Yamamura who departed Folsom Lake College in August 2022 to serve as Chancellor of the Coast Community College District in Costa Mesa, CA. Retired Folsom Lake College President Dr. Rachel Rosenthal has been serving as Interim President since Dr. Yamamura's departure while the college and district conducted the comprehensive nationwide search process. The community will have the opportunity to welcome Dr. Pimentel at events this spring.

I was one of the first employees when the city incorporated in 2003 and also served as Chief Building Official and Public Works Director before becoming City Manager.

As I reflect upon the past 20 years, I am amazed at what we have been able to accomplish together. We've created

a City Hall and police station, renovated a historic cemetery, created a center for arts and culture, invested hundreds of millions of dollars in infrastructure, built a youth center, created an award-winning housing project for homeless and disabled veterans, and attracted hundreds of new businesses and thousands of jobs, including a recent announcement that Solidigm will bring 1,900 high-paying tech jobs to Rancho Cordova.

Former Sacramento City Firefighter Sentenced for Sexual Assault

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Honorable Allen Sumner sentenced Christian Madrigal to 7 years and 4 months in prison. On May 20, 2022, a jury convicted Madrigal of assault with intent to rape and forcible digital penetration.

On April 13, 2015, the victim went out to celebrate her birthday with some friends. One of her friends was dating Christian Madrigal, who had just joined the City of Sacramento Fire Department. After their night out, the victim, the victim's friend who was dating Madrigal along with

Madrigal went back to stay the night at Madrigal's apartment.

While the victim was asleep on the couch, Madrigal forced himself on her and sexually assaulted her for several hours that night. The next morning, the victim reported the sexual assault to law enforcement and underwent a sexual assault examination.

In 2018, detectives reinitiated the investigation and interviewed all of the witnesses who were present on the night of the sexual assault and the District Attorney's Crime Lab found that DNA on the victim's underwear was consistent with Madrigal's DNA.

CHP South Sacramento Officer to be Released from Hospital

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On October 15th, 2022, at approximately 11:26 PM, California Highway Patrol's (CHP) South Sacramento units were dispatched to a fatal hit-and-run traffic crash which occurred on northbound Stockton Boulevard, north of Requa Way.

Approximately one hour later (October 16th at 12:31 AM), as officers were on scene investigating the aforementioned fatal crash, a 2007 Ford Mustang traveling northbound on Stockton Boulevard at a high rate of speed entered the closure and collided with an officer on scene. The officer who was struck was standing outside of a patrol vehicle and sustained major injuries; the officer was transported to a local hospital for treatment. The CHP Multidisciplinary Accident Investigation Team responded to the crash scene to assist with the investigation. It is likely the driver of the Ford was under the influence of alcohol

and drugs during the time of the crash, and he was placed under arrest for suspicion of DUI.

Officer Aaron Weikert, a 12-year veteran of the CHP, is scheduled to be released tomorrow, December 21, 2022, at 11 AM from UC Davis Medical Center. Officer Weikert sustained major injuries throughout his entire body due to the traffic crash and has a long road of recovery ahead of him. He wishes to thank everyone for the support and prayers as he recovers from his injuries. Officer Weikert's three children all wanted one thing this Christmas, and that was to have their father home. Officer Weikert and his wife both requested that they give no media interviews tomorrow. If any media wishes to be on scene at the time of Officer Weikert's release, please contact CHP South Sacramento Public Information Officer Mark Leavitt.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Cordova cross country team competed in the CIF Sac-Joaquin Section Finals, the qualifying meet for the CIF State Cross Country Championships.

Freshman Carson Caditz started the day off on a good foot. He placed 30th out of 45 participants, with a massive personal record of 13:33. He dropped one minute and 20 seconds off his time. This was one of the best performances we have seen by an underclassman.

Sophomore Stephany Santana was set to defend her medal from the previous year. She placed 9th out of 50, with a massive personal record of 14:10. She dropped one minute and 24 seconds off her time. This performance earned her another medal. She now has back-to-back individual section medals.

"We are so happy for Stephany and the strides she has made," said coach Josh Gruver. "She had an incredible season and has big goals going into next season."

Insco went undefeated in the Greater Sacramento League Championships this season and went on to run three miles in 16:15 at the CIF SJS Sun-Sections. He's a two-time GSL champion.

"Daniel's performance was one of the gutsiest we have seen since 2009," Gruver said. "He put himself in the mix at the start of the race and ran with heart. He has worked extremely hard since the summer. Daniel will be back next year to make another push for [the] state meet."

Federal Judge Blocks Newsom's **Foolish Gun Law**

Politicians, being egocentric by nature, sometimes do foolish, even childish, things in their insatiable hunger for attention.

California Gov. Gavin Newsom did a foolish thing last summer when he persuaded the Legislature to pass Senate Bill 1327, which would have subjected makers of guns prohibited by state law to civil lawsuits. It essentially stripped them of their right to defend themselves by making them liable for court fees.

It was patterned on a 2021 Texas law (Senate Bill 8) that made anyone who "who aids or abets" an abortion after six weeks of pregnancy subject to private lawsuits with similar restrictions on mounting a defense.

Newsom more or less admitted that SB 1327 was a stunt aimed at marshalling opposition to the Texas law. The bill even has language that repeals itself if and when the Texas law is overturned in court

Litigation on the Texas law is underway. This month, the U.S. Supreme Court declared that a lawsuit challenging the law can proceed.

Meanwhile, however, California gun rights groups mounted a legal challenge

to SB 1327, and this week, U.S. District Court Judge Roger Benitez, who has decisions in recent years, blocked the law's enforcement. His order came with some sharp criticism for making it virtually impossidefend themselves

of (SB 1327) is to trench on a citizen's right of access to the courts and to discourage the peaceful vindication of an enumerated constitutional right," he wrote. "Because the state fee-shifting statute undermines a citizen's constitutional rights, it is this court's role to declare its invalidity and enjoin its threat."

Newsom had once described Benitez as a "wholly-owned subsidiary of the gun lobby and the National Rifle Association" after one of the judge's previous gun control rulings, but after this week's decision, he effusively praised

Benitez. "I want to thank Judge Benitez," Newsom said in a statement. "We have been saying all along that Texas' anti-abortion law is outrageous. Judge Benitez just confirmed it is also unconstitutional. The provision in California's law that he struck down is a replica of what Texas did, and his explanation of why this part of SB 1327 unfairly blocks access to the courts SB 8. There is no longer any doubt that Texas' cruel anti-abortion law should also be struck down."

It should be struck down for the same reasons – that it unconstitutionally limissued other pro-gun rights its the right to defend oneself against a lawsuit. But whether it will be is not

Wade, explicitly declared that there is no constitutional right to abortion while the "right to bear arms" is specifically mentioned in the Bill of Rights.

Given that difference, and the Supreme Court's obvious distaste for severely restrictive gun laws, it's entirely possible that California's law will be permanently blocked while the Texas law survives, at least in some form.

Whatever the outcome, however, the SB 1327 saga is an exercise in political oneupsmanship that makes a mockery of the legislative process. Passing a law in California with the declared intent of shaming a law in Texas while putting Californians in legal jeopardy is political malpractice.

Newsom and the legislators who voted for SB 1327 should be ashamed of themselves. They should be spending their time on California's many serious problems, not trying to tell Texas what it should be





Demolition-by-Neglect: How the Legislature Plans to Destroy State History

Commentary by Save Our Capitol!

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Save Our Capitol! issued the following statement in response to the California Legislature's claim that the Capitol Annex, one of the state's most significant historic governmental buildings, is too damaged to rehabilitate:

"The Capitol Annex is in need of significant repairs to ensure the safety of legislative and executive staff; however, much of these repairs could – and should – have been done over the past 70 years. In 2005, the Department of General Services (DGS) prepared a plan to upgrade and modernize the building, but the Legislature decided not to move forward with it. Now, lawmakers say it's too damaged to rehabilitate. That's simply not true.

"After they neglected to properly maintain the building, and without conducting a rehabilitation feasibility study, DGS and the Joint Committee on Rules (JRC), lead on the project within the Legislature, decided demolition was the only option. They had no basis upon which to conclude that the building could not be rehabilitated to modern standards.

"In fact, the State knows exactly how to rehabilitate older buildings. The original Capitol, Library and Courts Building, and the Jesse M. Unruh Building have all been successfully rehabilitated. They are all older buildings than the Annex. And, claims that asbestos abatement is impossible for the Annex are misleading. The Unruh Building contains asbestos, as do many older buildings, and crews are able to properly remove it or rehabilitate around it, which is very common with historic buildings. The Environmental

Impact Report for the Unruh Building contains plans for how crews will properly remove and dispose of hazardous materials such as asbestos and leadbased paint, and even calls on "restoring the building to the Secretary of the Interior Standards and Guidelines for the Restoration of Historic Buildings." The same standards the State is refusing to comply with for the Capitol Annex Project.

"Clearly, the State is capable of preserving and rehabilitating—rather than demolishing—when it wants to, so why are lawmakers choosing to destroy Capitol Park, the West Steps, and the Annex to the tune of \$1.2 billion when rehabilitation is estimated to cost around

"The choice is between erasing or embracing a central part of California's history. It's clear to us which side the Legislature and DGS should be on, but without Governor Newsom's engagement, state history will be erased and every Californian will lose the ability to walk the halls of their Capitol Annex and gather or protest at the West Steps.

"With the support of California voters, taxpayers, small businesses, preservationists, and environmentalists, we will continue to fight to save the historic Annex, Capitol Park, the West Steps, and the entire west side of the original Capitol."



SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Eduardo Godinez was convicted by a jury of domestic violence, assault by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury and battery with serious bodily injury.

The jury also found true great bodily injury enhancements and the aggravating factor that Godinez engaged in violent conduct that indicates a serious danger to society. It was also found true that Godinez has a prior 2019 felony domestic violence conviction.

Godinez and the victim began dating in February 2020. The victim reported that Godinez started physically abusing her in the summer of 2021, but she did not report the past abuse. On February

14, 2022, Godinez became angry with the victim and repeatedly called her names and accused her of cheating.

Godinez then forcefully hit the victim in the back, causing her extreme pain. The victim went home without seeking medical attention. The next day, the victim became dizzy and passed out. She was taken to the hospital where it was discovered that one of her ribs was fractured, her spleen was lacerated and she had internal bleeding caused by the blow to her back. The victim remained in the hospital for sev-

Godinez faces a maximum sentence of 10 years in prison. Sentencing is set for December 16, 2022, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 33 before the Honorable Laurel White.

Jordan demands FBI turn over all communications with Twitter as probe of censorship heats up

23 Dec 2022 | House Judiciary Committee Republicans led by incoming Chairman Jim Jordan demanded Friday that FBI Director Chris Wray turn over records of all communications and payments the law enforcement agency had with Twitter, signaling aggressive investigations of social media censorship next year. Jordan's office said the release of internal files by Twitter's new owner, Elon Musk, had unmasked an "ongoing surveillance operation" that exceeded FBI investigative authorities and that resulted in a "coordinated misinformation effort between the FBI and Twitter to suppress and censor free speech." "We are investigating politicization and abuses at the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as well as Big Tech's censorship of conservatives online," Jordan, R-Ohio, and Rep. Mike Johnson, R-La., wrote Wray in an oversight letter. "Newly released information shows the FBI has coordinated extensively with Twitter to censor or otherwise affect content on Twitter's platform."

House GOP locates emails, texts showing Pelosi office directly involved in failed Jan. 6 security

21 Dec 2022 | House Republicans gathered a trove of text and email messages showing House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's office was directly involved in the creation and editing of the Capitol security plan that failed during the January 6, 2021, riot and that security officials later declared they had been "denied again and again" the resources needed to protect one of the nation's most important homes of democracy. The internal communications were made public Wednesday in a report compiled by Republican Reps. Rodney Davis, Jim Banks, Troy Nehls, Jim Jordan and Kelly Armstrong that encompasses the results of months of investigation they did of evidence that had been ignored by the Democratic-led Jan. 6 committee. The lawmakers were authorized by House Minority Leader Kevin McCarthy to do their

Biden Regime Delays Paychecks to National Guard Members for Christmas After Announcing Another \$45 Billion Giveaway to Ukraine

23 Dec 2022 | Earlier this week, Senate Republicans, under the leadership of Mitch McConnell, came to an agreement with Democrats on a 1.7 trillion spending bill to avoid a government shutdown. The bill gives another 44.9 billion to Ukraine where it disappears into the ether. According to Roll Call, "The package includes 858 billion in defense spending, a nearly 10 percent increase over the previous fiscal year, and 787 billion in non-defense spending, close to an 8 percent increase. It also would provide roughly 85 billion in supplemental funding for Ukraine and disaster relief." But despite the price tag, the bill does not secure the open US border with Mexico. And the bill does little to help working Americans or their families. National Guard members were informed this week that their check will not come in until after Christmas.

FBI paid Twitter \$3.5M 'to do its bidding'

21 Dec 2022 | The FBI handed nearly 3.5 million of taxpayers m-ney to Twitter to pay its staff to handle requests from the bureau as it sought to ban accounts. A Twitter employee wrote in a February 2020 email that the company's Safety, Content & Law Enforcement (SCALE) had "collected 3,415,323" in less than two years from the FBI for "law-enforcement related projects." The email, which was revealed by journalist Michael Shellenberger, stated that SCALE had instituted a "reimbursement program" in exchange for devoting staff hours to "processing requests from the FBI." The emails was entitled "Run the business - We made m-ney!." The accounts the FBI asked Twitter to ban were largely linked to conservatives and "foreign influence operations."

DOJ snooped on House Intelligence Committee investigators during Russia probe, subpoenas show

19 Dec 2022 | In an extraordinary intrusion on congressional oversight, the Justice Department used grand jury subpoenas to secretly obtain the personal email and phone data of at least two top House Intelligence Committee investigators back in November 2017 just as they and their boss, then-Chairman Devin Nunes, were assembling bombshell evidence of FBI abuses in the Russia collusion probe, Just the News has learned. The subpoenas, obtained by Just the News, show the DOJ demanded that Google turn over personal email and phone data from the two senior staffers on Nov. 20, 2017, and that responsive materials were to be returned to DOJ by Dec. 5, 2017. The subpoenas were delivered during a critical time frame in the committee's effort to expose the Donald Trump-Russia collusion investigation as having been driven by an uncorroborated political opposition dossier funded by Hillary Clinton. Nunes's committee was locked at the time in a bitter struggle to force the FBI and DOJ to turn over records to the committee.

White House Can't Mandate COVID Jabs for Federal **Contractors - Appeals Court**

20 Dec 2022 | A federal appeals court on Monday struck down a White House rule requiring anyone employed by a federal contractor to be vaccinated against COVID-19 as a condition of government contracts. A three-panel judge of the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals voted 2-1 to affirm a lower court judgment that barred Joe Biden's September 2021 executive order in three states after Louisiana, Indiana, and Mississippi sued to challenge the rule. These three states sued the Biden administration in the Western District of Louisiana in their capacities as federal contractors themselves, winning an injunction and stay by the district court. In upholding the lower court finding, Judge Kurt Engelhardt, an appointee of former President Donald Trump, said in his majority opinion (pdf) that a broad interpretation of the law could have given Biden "nearly unlimited authority to introduce requirements into federal contracts."

Chip Roy blows up over \$1.7T spending bill in fiery floor speech: 'Destroying the United States'

23 Dec 2022 | Rep. Chip Roy on Friday blew up at the process that is forcing a quick vote on a 1.7 trillion bill that no one has read and said the Democratic rush job is destroying the country. "We're spending m-ney we don't have," the Texas Republican said Friday morning on the House floor. "Go home and sell your projects, go home and talk about all the pork you're bringing home. But you're destroying the United States of America, absolutely destroying this body." Roy offered several amendments to the mammoth spending bill, none of which were allowed as Democrat leaders pushed for a vote by midday Friday. ..."Everything the American people is watching right now is a complete sham," Roy added. "It's a fraud, a fraud being perpetrated on the American people right before their eyes, right as we head into Christmas." ... Roy also bristled at the idea that more than half of the House members voting Friday might already be home for Christmas. Most lawmakers requested proxy voting Friday, which lets them claim worries about COVID as a reason to vote remotely.

McConnell's Ukraine comments show why Republican voters flocked to Trump

22 Dec 2022 | Senate Minority Leader Mitchell McConnell (R-KY) is a veteran of the Washington Swamp and a savvy politician who's been in office since 1985... But his most recent comments about Ukraine are indicative of why Republican voters have grown to loathe the "establishment." Even more so, it shows why many of them supported former President Donald Trump. McConnell believes the country should keep sending endless billions of taxpayer m-ney to Ukraine. It's a puzzling statement, given his political experience, and not representative of the sentiment of most Republican voters. Sac State and Street Soccer USA to Host 18th Homeless World Cup

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

The Homeless World Cup (HWC) street soccer tournament, in its 20th anniversary year after a three-year pandemic interruption, will be played at Sacramento State July 8-15, 2023.

The event will be in a U.S. city – and on a college campus – for the first time. Cardiff, Wales, was the host city the last time the tournament was held, in 2019. Previous tournaments have been in Europe, Australia, South America, and Africa. The event traditionally draws thousands of spectators.

The tournament, first played in 2003 in Graz, Austria, is the landmark street soccer event presented by Homeless World Cup Foundation, an umbrella organization for a network of charities that conduct year-round street soccer programs for men, women and children experiencing homelessness.

Sacramento State President Robert S. Nelsen said the University's role as tournament host is another example of its commitment to "building deep and meaningful connections in our community and beyond."

"I am proud that we will host the Homeless World Cup in 2023, and I look forward to welcoming athletes from around the world to the Sacramento State campus," Nelsen said. "This event will reimagine the conversations surrounding the global issue of homelessness while transforming the lives of the athletes as well as the spectators."

Up to 64 HWC partners from around the world will participate, featuring hundreds of players who are experiencing homelessness. Matches will be played on three street soccer fields set up in Hornet Stadium. The playing areas are smaller than traditional soccer fields and enclosed, leading to fast-paced, continuous action.

University residence halls will provide housing for players during the competition.

Street Soccer USA, a national nonprofit working in more than a dozen US cities, is HWC's American partner and features a robust program in Sacramento led by Sac State alumnae Tiffany Fraser and Lisa Wrightsman.

"These players are people deserving of respect," Wrightsman said. "They're not out there playing for money or cars. They are people who have very little in their lives, and they're working hard, and smiling, and lifting one another up. I hope that people

watching them are able to

appreciate that."

Lawrence Cann, co-founder and president, Street Soccer USA said hosting the Homeless World Cup for the first time in the United States is a signal of Street Soccer USA's ambition to drive social impact through soccer at scale and from the bottom up.

"Be prepared to feel the true power of teamwork and community before, during, and after this one-of-a-kind event," Cann said.

"The Homeless World Cup places those across the world who are most in need at the very center of our attention and showcases not their challenges, but their abilities and humanity. We are grateful to the leadership of Sacramento State and proud to partner with them to bring this event and its legacy to the California capital."

Mel Young, Homeless World Cup president and co-founder, said the tournament shows how sport can change lives while illustrating HWC partners' commitment to the work of ending homelessness.







TEMPE, AZ (MPG) - 2020 Rio Linda High School graduate Cameron Skattebo has made his decision on where he will be taking his talents to next.

Skattebo is headed to the desert to play in the Pac-12 Conference at Arizona State University. The 5-foot-10, 212 pound running back announced his decision with a tweet on Saturday afternoon, December 17.

"It's official!!! I found home!!! #ForksUp can't wait to get to work!!!! It just feels right," Skattebo said on Twitter along with a picture of him wearing his new Sun Devil threads.

Skattebo spent the last three years staying close to home and playing for Sacramento State. Following the departure of head coach Troy Taylor for Stanford University

Mon-Thu 4PM-9PM Fri-Sat 2PM-9PM after a historic 2022 season, Skattebo entered the NCAA transfer portal with two years of collegiate eligibility remaining.

"Sacramento State has enabled me to develop relationships that will last a lifetime," Skattebo wrote in a statement which was shared on his social media accounts. "Sacramento is and will always be my home, and being able to play in the community where I grew up, in front of my family and friends has meant the most to me."

Taylor announced his decision to move on from Sac State on December 10, the morning after the Hornets' 66-63 loss to Incarnate Word in the quarterfinals of the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Playoffs. Two days later, Skattebo publicized his intentions. In the five days that he was in the portal, the bruising running back also received offers from Texas State and San Jose State.

In three seasons on varsity at Rio Linda, Skattebo was a three-time first team all-league selection and finished his career with 6,192 rushing yards and 69 touchdowns. Skattebo also led his school to a section championship in 2018.

In two seasons on the field at Sac State, he was a third team all-Big Sky Conference selection in 2021 and first team all-Big Sky in 2022. He cemented himself in the Hornet history books by winning the 2022 Big Sky Offensive

after a historic 2022 season, Skattebo entered the importantly.

Skattebo became the third Sac State player of all-time to win the award. He did so by racking up 1,251 rushing yards, 281 receiving yards on 24 receptions and nine total touchdowns. Skattebo was also a 2022 Associated Press FCS All-America third team selection.

"I would also like to thank the Hornet fans for all the support and love over the past three years," Skattebo wrote in the statement released on December 12. "We have created memories that I'll always cherish."

On his way to Tempe, Arizona this past weekend to visit what eventually became his new home, Skattebo came across a young man who was a fan of his. The boy's father was so impressed by Skattebo that he tweeted about the interaction to share with the world.

"Son & I on a [plane emoji] to AZ. Son notices @camskattebo5 board our flight & is excited the whole trip," tweeted the proud dad, Maury Castaneda, who is the athletic director at Yuba City High School. "When we get off plane son asks Cam for autograph. Cam takes time to sign & take a pic. Made my sons day. Thank you!!"

Arizona State got themselves a great football player and an even better person. Best of luck to Cam in Arizona. The NFL is right around the corner.
