CDPH Warns Schools of 'Rainbow Fentanyl'

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) this week warned school leaders about a new and concerning "rainbow fentanyl" drug that may interest youth. In a letter to superintendents and charter school administrators, CDPH Director and State Public Health Officer Tomás J. Aragón warned that "rainbow fentanyl" is a potentially fatal drug found in pills and powders in a variety of bright col-

"Rainbow fentanyl can be found in many forms, including pills, powder, and blocks that can resemble sidewalk chalk or candy," said Dr. Aragón. "Any pill, regardless of its color, shape, or size, that does not come from a health care provider or pharmacist can contain fentanyl and can be deadly," he said.

In its letter, CDPH points to a recent warning from the United States Drug Enforcement Agency that notes the highly addictive and potentially deadly "rainbow fentanyl" has been found in at least 18 states.

Anyone who encounters fentanyl in any form should not handle it and should call 911 immediately.

Recognizing the signs of opioid overdose can save a life. Here are some things to look for:

Small, constricted "pinpoint pupils"; Falling asleep or losing consciousness; Slow, weak, or no breathing; Choking or gurgling sounds; Limp body; Cold and/or clammy skin; Discolored skin (especially in lips and nails).

It may be hard to tell if a person is high or experiencing an overdose. If you aren't sure, treat it like an overdose. Here are the steps that could save a life: 1) Call 911 immediately; 2) Administer naloxone, if available; 3) Try to keep the person awake and breathing; 4) Lay the *Continued on page 3*


Highway 50 Project Moves Forward

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Rancho Cordova City Council approved nearly \$10 million in funding for a long-planned interchange on US 50 between Sunrise and Hazel Avenues. The proposed Rancho Cordova Parkway Interchange would be a "south only," two-mile interchange that will connect Highway 50 to new housing and commercial construction on White Rock Road.

The unanimous vote during the September 6th meeting will allow City Manager Cyrus Abhar to negotiate a contract in the amount of \$9,672,794 with Mark Thomas & Company. The contract will result in civil engineering and structural designs for the new interchange, plus environmental and right of way support.

The San Jose based company, with offices in

Cosumnes River Blvd. Interchange at I-5, the Watt Ave. Interchange on U.S. 50 and a 13-mile State

Aerospace Museum: We Did Do It!

MCCLELLAN, CA (MPG) -The Aerospace Museum hosted its second annual STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) 'We Can Do It' event on Saturday, September 24, 2022. The co-chairs Heidi Sanborn and Linda Martin put together an experience meant for girls in junior high and high school. The program encourages them to consider studies and careers in math, science and engineering. Specializing in aerospace technology from multiple eras, the Museum is uniquely situated to provide this.

Statistically, girls participate in STEM endeavors less than boys. Twenty-six percent of STEM participants are female. The program leads interests in such areas as robotics, space and many other math-based careers. Also offered are the satisfaction of career choice as well as challenges in scientific and intellectual pursuits of all kinds. For the intellectually curious, these paths are not only personally rewarding but also beneficial to a technologically based society.

The Aerospace Museum called on Rosie the Riveter as a mascot for the Saturday event. During World War II, women became involved in assisting the Allies by working in factories. Iconic views of Rosie the Riveter appeared on t-shirts worn by volunteers, attendees and staff. They also sported red scarves with white dots

following the female factory workers of the 1940s.

A story about women who broke ground laying the foundations for the U.S. space program became famous recently in the movie Hidden Figures. The Museum is currently working on a mural featuring famous women in the history of aviation. Also prominent on the museum floor is a display highlighting women historical figures in science and math.

Spearheading the Saturday encounter were two co-chairs, both highly passionate about students becoming involved in STEM activities. Linda Martin is the Museum Board's President and was formerly an Assistant Supervisor of the San Juan Unified School District, one of the Sacramento area school districts and located nearby the museum. She feels strongly that girls

should be exposed to science and math so that doors can open, and women can enter careers in the field. For this, role models and mentors are needed.

Heidi Sanborn is the other co-chair of the event. She is an elected official on the SMUD Board. Her other passion is waste and recycling. She was instrumental in getting California State SB 54 passed which will aid in achieving zero carbon in packaging by 2030. As the daughter of a chemist, she was inspired to look into a STEM career herself and has been challenged and inspired by it. She wants the community to know that STEM activities at the museum are monthly and a strong focus of the facility.

San Juan Unified School District partners with the Aerospace Museum. As a great illustration of support, girls were bussed from various junior high and high schools to attend the event. The busses were packed with girls representative of the cultural diversity in the Sacramento region. They visited the planes, used program passports to show their viewing of various displays and connected with career mentors. On the lighter side, snacks were enjoyed, pictures with friends were taken, a few stepped into cultural dance steps as the disc jockey played lively and cultural tunes with a beat around and

had pictures taken, generally enjoying themselves. The general atmosphere was both entertaining and educational

Volunteers and staff are an integral part of the venue on special days like 'We Can Do It'. Phyllis Caesar, a former principal in SJUSD, was enjoying her first volunteer event at the museum. Liz Stowell, a passionate STEM advocate, has been at the museum for quite some time. She began as an air traffic controller in New York and then went on to work with high voltage power grids. Her father was a pilot and bomber in World War II, so she has had an interest in aviation for a long time.

Elliot Lopez entered into the spirit of the day by sporting the bandana and t-shirt. He has been part of the educational support staff at the museum for a few months and loves his job there, as do many of the other enthusiastic staff.

A panel of speakers took the stage in the afternoon to discuss their careers and interests in STEM and hopefully inspire others to participate in like pursuits.

Since the museum does not receive local or state funding, it relies heavily on its support partners and Saturday was no exception. SJUSD paid for and provided the busses for enthusiastic junior high and high school students. SMUD brought giveaways and information. The Girl Scouts, a local robotic team, and volunteers from St. Francis High School in Sacramento also participated. \star

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Members of the General John A. Sutter Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), presented three community service awards for voluntary service to the local community on Saturday, September 17th at the Sylvan Community Center at 7521 Community Drive in Citrus Heights.

Each of the three award winners were nominated by someone in the local community who suggested them to the DAR Sutter chapter for this special recognition. The Members of the DAR Sutter Chapter wish to acknowledge, honor, and thank these three honorees for their important contribution to the local community.

The honored recipients were:

Susan Maxwell Skinner, for her work in the community teaching about wildlife along the American River, community historian and speaker, and coverage of veteran events. Skinner is a reporter for the Messenger Publishing Group and writes feature stories for the Carmichael Times. Skinner, through her American River Nature blog on Facebook, has photographed and

tracked a pair of bald eagles along the river for approximately 8 years.

"It's the closest the American Bald Eagle have ever nested to the Sacramento area. They are truly beautiful and wonderful creatures," she said. Skinner said she was honored to be recognized by the DAR for her work.

"It's an honor to give back to the community you love with the skills you have," Skinner said.

Sander found himself voting in favor of the project, while taking note of the cost.

"Aye vote, for some very expensive engineering," he said during the September 6th meeting. "A new record, I think, on any project we've ever looked at."

Rancho Cordova Mayor Donald Terry agreed.

"It's a big darn project," he echoed.

According to a report prepared by City staff, the new interchange project is expected to reduce congestion and improve the flow of traffic at both the Sunrise Blvd. and Hazel Ave. offramps from Highway 50. It is also expected to spur future housing development and job growth, plus create additional access to light rail and other forms of regional transit.

In addition, the project is expected to expand the bike network on Rancho Cordova Parkway south of US 50. The intent is to connect these trails along Rancho Cordova Parkway between White Rock Road and Easton Valley Parkway.

They will ultimately connect to the bicycle lane and trail system in the future Westborough development.

Funding for the project will come from several sources. This includes traffic mitigation fees, supplemental transportation fees, Sunridge Park Community Facilities District, and federal grants. The city staff report does not anticipate any impact on the City's General Fund.

Construction on the interchange is expected to begin in 2025 and is expected to take 3-4 years to complete. The estimated construction price tag is \$127 million. The City Council vote also instructed city staff to investigate federal grant opportunities to offset the cost of the project.

The City Council also approved a resolution to move forward with plans to widen Sunrise Blvd. between Kiefer Blvd. and Jackson Road (Highway 16). The project seeks to widen this 1.3 mile stretch of Sunrise from two lanes to four. The project will also result in bike lanes. improved bridge structures and additional traffic signals. ★

Apex Predator MMA Wins Gold at BJJ Santa Cruz Tournament Ph



Even a Thanksgiving feast couldn't keep gold away from Rancho Cordova native Edgar Alberto.

SANTA CRUZ, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordova native Edgar Alberto won gold at the Brazilian Jui-Jitsu Tour Santa Cruz Tournament on September 10 at Kaiser Permanente Arena.

Head coach and owner Rudy Vidaurri has now coached Alberto to three gold medals and one national bronze medal since opening Apex Predator Mixed Martial Arts almost one year ago. Edgar suffered a high ankle sprain just a month before the tournament and had considered withdrawing from competing until doctors cleared him to fight.

There was also nobody initially entered in his division, so Edgar arrived at the arena uncertain of his fight status. While tournament officials scrambled to find him an opponent, Edgar and his family decided to take a trip to a local diner where he proceeded to eat turkey, mashed potatoes, stuffing and pie. Unbeknownst to the Alberto family, an opponent was found at the last minute.

Meanwhile, Edgar arrived at the arena in street clothes just 10 minutes after eating a Thanksgiving dinner, and to his surprise, his name was being called for the fight. Vidaurri entered through the coaches entrance and shoved his way up to the barricade moments before the fight.

After hustling to change into his fight wear, Alberto walked on to the mat, full of turkey and pie, and won 18-0 on points without ever really being challenged. This victory marks the fourth gold medal for Apex Predator and continues with an undefeated streak in regional championships.

Bera: Bipartisan Bill Protects Physicians from Medicare Pay Cuts

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - U.S. Representatives Ami Bera, M.D. (D-CA) and Larry Bucshon, M.D. (R-IN), introduced on September 13, 2022, bipartisan legislation to provide critical relief to physicians who are scheduled to receive Medicare payment cuts. The Supporting Medicare Providers Act of 2022 would ensure payments to these providers are kept stable and extend certain increases in payments for physicians' services under the Medicare program through 2023.

"As an internal medicine doctor by training, I know that cutting payments for physicians further strains our health care system and the ability for health care professionals to provide the best care for their patients," said Representative Bera. "It's time Congress reforms Medicare provider payments to ensure that we have a stable Medicare payment system so that we can transition move towards value, not volume."

Reps. Bera and Bucshon have been long standing champions and have led successful efforts to mitigate proposed cuts in health care payments. Last week, they issued a Request for Information regarding the implementation of the Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act of 2015 to identify steps Congress should take to stabilize the Medicare payment system, without dramatic increases in Medicare spending, while ensuring successful value-based care incentives are in place.

In 2023, physicians face more than 8.42% payment cuts, this bill would stop the 4.42% cuts in Medicare payments providers will face on January 1st.

"The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services' 2023 Medicare Physician Fee Schedule proposed rule, if implemented, will result in untenable Medicare payment cuts for physicians and jeopardize patients' timely access to primary care. That's why the American Academy of Family Physicians endorses the Supporting Medicare Providers Act of 2022, which will avert these cuts and ensure physicians can continue serving Medicare patients for another year. Importantly, this legislation signals that more administrative and legislative action is needed to ensure sustainable Medicare physician payment, transition to value-based care, and address health disparities. The AAFP continues to advocate for payment reforms that appropriately invest in primary care and ensure physicians have the resources and flexibility they need to care for all their patients. Only then can we truly move the needle on health equity, better population health, and health care expenditures," said Sterling N. Ransone, Jr., MD, FAAFP, President, American Academy of Family Physicians.

Rancho Cordova Vice Mayor **Issues Street Name Challenge**

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

- "What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet "

It is one of the most famous lines ever written by English playwright, poet, and actor William Shakespeare. This line appears in perhaps his most famous work: Romeo and Juliet. It was Juliet's way of telling Romeo that names are not important.

Please forgive the Rancho Cordova City Council if they offer a slight disagreement to Shakespeare's finest work, especially when it comes to the task of naming new streets, neighborhoods, facilities, and parks. To them, names matter.

It's the reason why the City Council voted to create a subcommittee to develop a process that would establish a specific set of rules or criteria for naming streets, neighborhoods, or facilities. That set of rules, presented by Deputy City Manager Micah Runner during the September 19th City Council meeting, drew considerable feedback as well as an open invitation from Vice Mayor Linda Budge.



Rancho Cordova City Council has created a subcommittee to develop a process that would establish a specific set of rules or criteria for naming streets, neighborhoods, or facilities.

"If people have specific ideas in terms of fleshing out either the categories or the people, we would love to hear that," Budge said.

The criteria developed by the subcommittee so far would focus on names of people or businesses that have made a special volunteer or professional contribution to Rancho Cordova. People or businesses from the city that have made a substantial national contribution would also be under consideration. One example of this would be Aerojet, the rocket and missile propulsion manufacturer that is still based in the city.

The City would also work closely with housing developers and encourage them to follow an approved set of themes for new communities, streets, and parks. Themes that have already been put on this list include California history, state wildflowers, gold rush history and natural or scientific elements.

"This is a deceptively simple and complicated project," said Councilmember David M. Sander, who worked on the subcommittee with Budge. "It's simple to say here are the parameters. It's going to be difficult, perhaps, to make lists."

Proposed street or community names could also be drawn from a list of people. The criteria developed by the subcommittee so far includes, but is not limited to, community leaders, veterans, faith leaders, outstanding teachers, original landowners, or famous sports figures.

"This is truly relevant to the City of Rancho Cordova," said Councilmember Siri Pulipati, who congratulated both Budge and Sander for the committee work. "It really brings it into perspective when you have a history associated with it."

The City Council approved a motion to instruct city staff to immediately provide themes to developers to use for new neighborhoods. The naming subcommittee will also continue to meet to further develop lists for facilities, major roads, and neighborhood streets. Budge even suggested the use of honorary names for a short period of time.

"We saw this in Indianapolis while on a study mission," the Vice Mayor said. "Every year they renamed all the streets around the city's football stadium (Lucas Oil Stadium) for the people who were playing on the football team that year. It was a way of honoring people for a certain period of time."



Hornets Roll Past Colorado State, 41-10

FORT COLLINS, CO (MPG) - Sacramento State set a school record for points against an FBS team and amassed nearly 400 yards of offense in a 41-10 win over Colorado State on Saturday at Canvas Stadium. The win improved the No. 6 ranked Hornets to 3-0 on the season for the first time since 1992 and gave the team its first win over an FBS team since defeating Colorado in 2012.

The Hornets have still yet to trail in a game this season and have now won 11 consecutive regular season games dating back to last season. The 31-point margin of victory was the largest by an FCS school

since Western Illinois beat Coastal Carolina 52-10 in 2017. CSU fell to 0-4.

Sacramento State quickly moved down the field on its first drive of the game, covering 74 yards on eight plays. Jake Dunniway competed 4-of-5 passes during the series, including a 32-yard pass to Parker Clayton down the left sideline. Asher O'Hara did the rest with a 6-yard rush around the right end for his fifth rushing touchdown of the year.

Colorado State threatened late in the first quarter after a 56-yard pass to Troy Horton took the ball inside the Hornet 10. After the quarter ended, the Sacramento State defense kept the Rams out of the

over an FBS opponent end zone and the team was forced to settle for a 24-yard field goal from Michael Boyle.

> Sacramento State responded with an 11-play, 75-yard drive to go ahead 14-3. The team capitalized on two defensive penalties on third-down plays to keep the drive alive and capped the series with a 5-yard touchdown pass to Pierre Williams. On the play, the ball was deflected by a Ram defender near the front of the zone and sailed to the backline where Williams won the jump ball for his first TD of the year.

> The Hornets extended their lead moments later. Marte Mapu recorded a third-down sack to force a punt which was returned 44-yards by Marcus

Mulcher all the way to the CSU 16. Two plays later, O'Hara dumped the ball off the Fulcher who plowed his way up the sideline for the score.

The final five minutes of the first half saw a flurry of action. Sacramento State was knocking on the door of another touchdown when Jake Dunniway was intercepted by Jack Howell at the CSU 11. The Rams turned the turnover into seven points with a 52-yard catch and run from Brayden Fowler-Nicolosi to Horton with 1:17 remaining. That drive was kept alive by a 4th-and-3 conversion near midfield.

Sacramento State stormed right back with an 8-play drive of its own which ended with a

45-yard field goal from Kyle Sentkowski to give the team at 24-10 lead at halftime.

The Hornet defense made the first big play of the second half, stopping Colorado State on 4th-and-1 from their own 32. Eight plays later, O'Hara soared over the line on 3rd-and-goal from the 1 to push the advantage to 31-10 with just under five minutes to play in the third quarter.

Sacramento State put a ribbon on the victory with a 47-yard field goal from Kyle Sentkowski 10 seconds into the fourth quarter and then a 16-play drive which ended on a 1-yard touchdown run from Cameron Skattebo which took 10:50 off the clock.

The Hornets outgained

CSU, 395-253 and held a nearly eight-minute advantage in time of possession (33:58-26:02). O'Hara was a perfect 10-for-10 for 71 yards and touchdown passing while Dunniway tallied 164 yards and a score on 12-of-23. Jared Gipson led the team with five receptions (50 yards) while Skattebo had a team-high 56 receiving yards to go along with his 67 rushing yards.

Defensively, Armon Bailey led Sacramento State with eight tackles while Marte Mapu contributed seven with a sack. Brandon Knott added the other sack for the Hornets.

Sacramento will start Big Sky Conference play next Saturday, Oct. 1, at Cal Poly.




