Projects are Digging Deep

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Small boys are rejoicing at the sight of 49-ton bulldozers and rock-laden trucks roaring into the American River near Fair Oaks. But big fish will be the real beneficiaries.

Started this month, a \$2 million project continues Sacramento Water Forum efforts to restore breeding habitats for vulnerable fish species. More than 42,000 cubic yards of gravel are being added to Lower Sailor Bar and Nimbus Basin locations. The program is geared to help Chinook salmon and steelhead repopulation.

Human river alterations have threatened these species since the Gold Rush. More recently, dam construction blocked spawning paths and barred natural gravel movement. "The lower part of the American River is gravel-starved," explains Water Forum Habitat Manager Erica

Bishop. "Some salmon and steelhead return to home waters and can't find a place to spawn. "Though the Nimbus Hatchery has a role in juvenile fish production, the Water Forum's focus is to help adult salmonids complete life cycles naturally."

Current projects must be finished before salmon surge home in fall. After the Chinook giants, steelhead will nest in the same areas. "Our work is targeted over time frames least likely to affect migrating fish," says Bishop. "And although the ongoing drought can make their conditions challenging, we focus on long-term river improvement."

Steelhead and salmon once swam from the Pacific Ocean via 200 miles of breeding sites. More than 150 years of human development have reduced options to about 12 miles. "Fish can't build nests among boulders," notes Bishop. "They need moveable gravel." To this end, the program includes mechanical

selection of many tons of small-diameter stones. Nursery channels will also be built to shelter hatchlings before their Pacific migration.

Similar restorations above Sailor Bar accommodated 1000 new Chinook nests in 2019. New gravel beds at Ancil Hoffman Park last year supplied 30 percent of all American River steelhead breeding. "Results are immediate," notes Bishop. "We see salmon beginning to spawn as we finish our projects. We know our restored habitats work."

Sailor Bar and Nimbus projects will wrap by early October. Staging areas are fenced during construction but river access is not restricted. Work will pause to enable weekend and Labor Day recreation.

County's New Inspector General Appointed

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously today to approve Francine Tournour as the new Inspector General for Sacramento County. Tournour will begin serving in that role on Sept. 1, 2022.

"Following a nationwide recruitment, we're pleased to announce Francine Tournour was selected as the best and most qualified candidate," said Board Chair and District Five Supervisor Don Nottoli. "We look forward to welcoming Ms. Tournour and her work in providing independent review and accountability in her role as Inspector General."

Two collaborative interview panels were convened for the Inspector General search, whose members included the Chair of the board, the Sheriff, representatives from both the Law Enforcement Management Association and the Deputy Sheriff's Association, and members from the Community Review Commission.

Tournour began her career in law enforcement as a Deputy Sheriff in Contra Costa County, where she quickly gained an appreciation for the complex field of law enforcement. After working in law enforcement for a brief period, she began working for the City of Sacramento as a Deputy Director for the Office of Public Safety Accountability.

In 2008, she was promoted to the Director role of that office, where she was responsible for conducting all complex and sensitive investigations for the City's 1,300 employees.

Tournour has a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Madonna University and a master's degree in Emergency Management from California State University, Long Beach.

The Office of Inspector General was created to facilitate the Board of Supervisors' responsibility to oversee without interfering with the Sheriff's investigative or personnel deployment functions.

The Inspector General ensures the integrity of the citizen complaint process and the thoroughness and fairness of related Sheriff's Office investigations, while fostering

Reducing Homeless Deaths in Sac County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - In Sacramento County, 2021 was an unprecedented year for loss of life in this region. The Sacramento County Coroner had more overall deaths reported to their office than any other year in history – 8,677 deaths reported. Sacramento County similarly saw an increase in the deaths of its unhoused population.

NOTE: The Coroner's Office does not receive a report of every county resident's death. For example, deaths signed off by a supervising doctor are not reported to the Coroner. Additionally, natural deaths occurring in a hospital or medical facility and/or under a hospice physician's care are not coroner cases which require a coroner death investigation.

The Coroner releases

a report every year of the deaths, causes and some demographics for people experiencing homelessness at the time of death. In 2021, 199 deaths were reported to the coroner's office that were investigated and determined to be people who were experiencing homeless. While this is an increase from the years prior, it is not the same incremental increase as the overall increase in the homeless population, based on the most recent point in time count.

The causes of death among the unhoused population vary, but overwhelmingly, the causes are unnatural – death by substance use, vehicular or homicide. Decedents were overwhelmingly male, and there was a disproportionate number of black and Hispanic deaths compared to the overall homeless population demographics.

Substance abuse

continues to be the leader in untimely deaths of the unhoused population at nearly half of all deaths in 2021, as compared to just 3 percent of the overall county population.

Sacramento County continues to invest in existing and new programs to help meet the needs of the homeless population. The County is investing \$181 million annually on current and new programs, and services and to mitigate the impacts of homelessness. Not only does the County fund 1,300 indoor shelter beds on any given night, but continues to fund new and diversified programs such as:

Increasing the offerings in 2022/23 to those experiencing behavioral health, both mental health and substance abuse, crises:

\$10 million to procure an additional 156 beds for Substance Use Disorder residential treatment;

\$5 million for behavioral

health crisis stabilization units required in Medi-Cal; \$7.5 million in Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) funds and federal match for additional Full Service Partnerships;

The County has approved two new-concept locations for Safe Stay Communities, adding another 165 indoor beds that provide privacy, dignity and a place for people to receive services to end their homelessness;

The County added 11 new behavioral health staff to the Encampment Service Teams to connect people to mental health and substance abuse services; Allocated \$1 million in the 2022/23 budget to expand the scattered site sheltering program;

Allocated \$10 million in ARPA funding for a Landlord Engagement and Assistance Program (LEAP), which will fund re-housing of

El Camino Dominates Cordova in Shutout Win

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The first two weeks of the 2022 high school sports season have not been kind to the Cordova varsity football team.

The Lancers (0-2) lost their first game of the season by 34 points at home to Bella Vista on August 19. Given the lopsided loss, one

would think there's nowhere to go but up for Cordova, right? Wrong!

Even with an extra day of rest before their next game, things somehow got worse for the Lancers. Cordova lost on the road at El Camino (2-0) by a score of 41-0 on Saturday night. Through two games under interim head coach and alumnus Kyle Williams, the Lancers have

been outscored 89-14.

Cordova senior quarterback Kevin Lewis completed only 1-of-5 passing attempts for seven yards. His one completion went to junior Ruvim Kravchuk. Lewis, who is a dual-threat QB, had much more success on the ground, rushing 15 times for 114 yards (7.6 average).

Lewis has been the one bright spot for the Lancers so far this

season. The 5-foot-10 senior also plays defensive back and was tied for a team-high in tackles with seven. Junior Aleksey Medvedeva also had seven total tackles. Four other Cordova players had five tackles each.

One of those four is defensive end, Michael Brown. The 6-foot-4, 188-pound junior also had two quarterback hurries. Stats

from the Eagles' offensive explosion were not made available by press time.

The Lancers will attempt to rebound from the back-to-back losses when they play at Rio Linda (1-1) on Friday. El Camino will go on the road for the first time this season and play at Foothill. Kickoff for both games is scheduled for 7 p.m. ★

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordova's tribute to an extraordinary sports legacy continues this week at the Mills Station Arts and Culture Center (MACC). The exhibit continues through Sept. 10.

"Champions is a love letter to Cordova High School, a remarkable collection that puts into perspective the amazing athletes, coaches and supporters whose lives were shaped on the fields and in the gyms of Rancho Cordova," said Shelly Blanchard, executive director of the Cordova Community Council, which facilitates the Hall of Fame. "Lancers, parents, teachers and fans of all generations of Cordova sports will be mesmerized by this showcase."

The exhibit covers more than 60 years of Cordova sports history, including sports stars who have gone on to the National Football League, Major League Baseball, or have triumphed in life, thanks to the lessons of resilience, hard work and commitment learned through sports.

The exhibit includes informational panels describing the accomplishments of the more than 100 individual athletes, coaches and key supporters who have shaped the rich history.

It also showcases extraordinary teams from over the years, ranging from the famed, and nationally top-ranked, Cordova High Football Team of 1975, to legendary

baseball and basketball teams which have left their marks in the record books over the years.

The exhibit also includes sports gear like Super Bowl footballs awarded in honor of former Cordova High players Seneca Wallace and Gerald Wilhite, cheerleading uniforms from over the decades, boxer Otis Griffin's jewel-studded championship belt and so much more.

But beyond the hardware, the power of the exhibit rests in the emotions evoked by visitors checking out photos of friends from high school and college glory days, remembering coaches who changed the course of a lifetime,

or the celebration of individuals who championed the accomplishments of so many Cordova youth over the years.

"Cordova's sports legacy is such an important facet of community life over the decades," said Blanchard. "The beauty of sports is how it brings together dreams of greatness,

overcoming failure and dedication to excellence. These values jump off the walls and paint a picture of what it takes to be a winner."

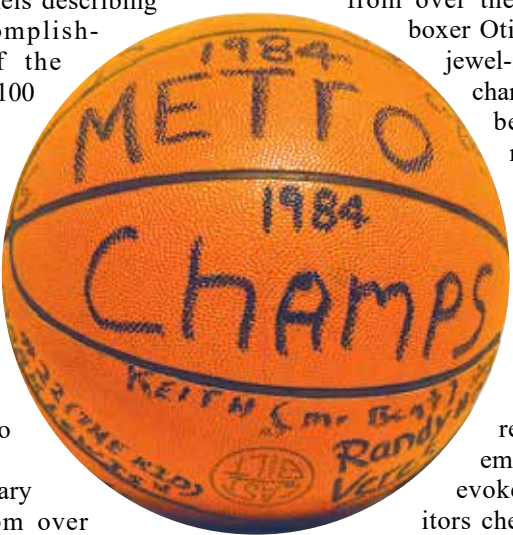
The exhibit includes the stories of former pro baseball players who got their start in Rancho Cordova, as well as football players who went on

to the NFL, and others who reached the most elite levels of their sport, including bowling, boxing, MMA and more. The coaches that started these players on their paths to glory are remembered, as are individuals who took lessons learned on the playing field and parlayed them into medical degrees, military leadership, elite coaching careers and more.

The exhibit is a prelude to the Seventh Annual Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony which will be held at Rancho Cordova City Hall on Sept. 10. Hosted by television personality and Cordova High grad Ken Rudolph, tickets are now available online at cordovacouncil.org or by calling the Cordova Community Council at 916-273-5707.

The MACC is open from 3-8 p.m. on Thursday and Fridays, and on Saturdays from 11 a.m. until 4 p.m. Admission to the Champions exhibit is free of charge. Additional activities at the MACC during the exhibit are also planned, including a reception for past inductees and the public on Sept. 9. The final day for the exhibit is Sept. 10. Final Recommended Budget Hearings Begin September 7

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors will begin Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 Revised Recommended Budget hearings on Wednesday, Sept. 7, at 9:30 a.m. in the Sacramento County Administration Building located at 700 H Street, Sacramento, 95814. If necessary, hearings will continue on Sept. 8 and 9 at the same time and location.

The hearing schedule, in order: IHSS Public Authority Budget Deliberation and Approval; Introduction by the County Executive to the FY 2022-23 Revised Recommended Budget; Public Comment; Board Deliberation and Approval to Revisions of the Approved Recommended Budget. The numbers in the recommended budget change between June and September when the County receives new information, including the impact of the State Budget and updated revenue totals. Because of that new information, the Revised Recommended Budget comes back to the Board for review and adoption in September.

The Board of Supervisors approved the FY 2022-23 Recommended Budget on June 9. The \$7.3 billion spending plan reflected substantial investments in new and enhanced programs based on the Board's priorities and a survey of Sacramento residents. The budget included annual commitments of an additional \$6.5 million to fund new programs and services addressing homelessness in the County; \$10 million to procure an additional 156 beds annually for substance use disorder residential treatment; \$7.5 million in Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) and Federal matching funds to fulfill permanent supportive housing commitments; and \$20 million in one-time costs to fund pavement maintenance and road rehabilitation in the unincorporated County, among others.

Members of the public may attend the hearings and be heard on any item in the budget, either publicly, over the phone or through written comments. The budget hearings will also be telecast live on Metro Cable 14 and on sccob.saccounty.gov/Pages/BOSPublicMeetings.aspx. ★

CSUS Baseball Welcomes Jon Wente as Pitching Coach

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A veteran coach with a quarter century of experience mentoring student-athletes at all levels, Jon Wente has been named as the pitching coach for the Sacramento State baseball program on August 9, Head Coach Reggie Christiansen announced.

"We are excited to have Jon join us as our new pitching coach," Christiansen said. "Jon has a tremendous track record and has won at every step of his career. Our players and staff are excited to welcome him to Sacramento."

A native of Cave Creek, Ariz., Wente spent the last eight seasons as the pitching coach at a pair of Western Athletic Conference rivals, the last two at Grand Canyon following six years as the associate head coach, recruiting coordinator, and pitching coach at UT Arlington.

He also has experience as a head coach at Hutchison Community College in Kansas (2003-04), Odessa College in Texas (2005), and a nine-year run at Central Arizona College (2006-14), while also serving as an assistant for the Vaqueros following his collegiate playing career.

"My family and I are grateful for this tremendous

opportunity to coach at Sacramento State," Wente said. "Coach Christiansen and Coach (David) Flores have been great to work with throughout the entire process and I am very excited for the chance to work with and learn from some great pitchers."

During his time as an assistant with the Lopes and Mavericks, Wente saw 11 of his student-athletes selected in the Major League Baseball first-year player draft – five of those at GCU and six more during his time on the staff at UTA – including five of those in the top 15 rounds.

Over the last two seasons, Wente helped lead Grand Canyon to a combined 80-42-1 overall record and a 54-12 mark in Western Athletic Conference play, capturing the league tournament title in 2021 and lifting the Lopes to a pair of NCAA regional berths. Last year, GCU broke into the top 25 for the final three weeks of the regular season and set a new program Division I record with 41 victories, while the pitching staff ranked No. 10 in the nation in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.00), No. 19 in walks allowed per nine innings (3.31), No. 27 in strikeouts per nine innings (9.9), and No. 36 in WHIP (1.38).

Individually, closer Vince Reilly was fifth in the NCAA with 14 saves while conference pitcher and freshman of the year Daniel Avitia ranked among the top 30 in both strikeouts (No. 28 with 111) and strikeouts per nine innings (No. 29 with 5.84).

Prior to his arrival in Phoenix, Wente built a strong staff at UT Arlington, including a combined 2.42 team

ERA in 2020 – a mark that ranked No. 18 nationally. The Mavericks also ranked No. 14 in the nation with 6.33 hits per nine innings that year and claimed a Sun Belt Conference Western Division title in 2017 with a staff that led the league in saves (18) and finished second in ERA (3.27).

After earning his first head coaching positions at Hutchinson CC and Odessa College, Wente built an impressive resume at Central Arizona College as its head coach, leading the Vaqueros to six consecutive Region I championships, including 56 wins and a runner-up finish at the 2011 World Series and a third-place World Series finish in 2008.

In nine seasons with the Vaqueros, Wente posted a 402-165 (.709) record and saw 28 of his players drafted by Major League clubs – including major leaguers Ian Kinsler, Scott Hairston, and Josh Spence – and holds a 513-226 (.696) mark overall in 11 seasons as a head coach.

He also has experience on the international level as a coach for USA Baseball, helping lead the 18U team to a silver medal at the 2006 World Championships in Cuba, coaching the likes of Matt Harvey, Freddie Freeman, Blake Beavan, and Mike Moustakas.

As a player, Wente began at Central Arizona (1994-95) before finishing his career at Arizona State (1996) and McNeese State (1997), setting the Cowboys' single-season record for innings pitched (119.0) in 21 appearances (16 starts) ★

300+ households from shelters and encampments;

Allocated \$28 million in MHSA funding since 2017 through the MHSA Housing Program and No Place Like Home Program;

The County has 221 housing units funded through MHSA and an additional

234 coming in the next two years.

The solutions to end homelessness are complicated and multi-faceted, and there is no "one size fits all," but through the hard work and dedication of the County, our cities and our partners, we are committed to work with compassion and urgency to decrease deaths in our homeless population. ★

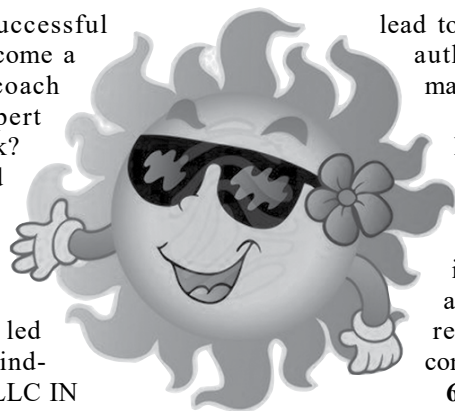

Defendant Convicted of Murdering His Father

Sac County DA News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Matthew Holverstott was convicted by a jury of the second-degree murder of James Holverstott and elder abuse.

The victim was Matthew Holverstott's father. Matthew Holverstott threatened to kill his father over a real estate deal. The next day, Matthew Holverstott met his father in the parking lot of a church. He then called 911 claiming his father slipped and fell. The father was rushed to the

hospital and died the same day. Matthew Holverstott immediately tried to obtain his father's pension and estate assets valued at approximately \$800,000-\$900,000. An autopsy determined the father suffered six separate blunt force injuries to the head and 14 separate blunt force injuries to his body.

Holverstott faces a maximum sentence of 16 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for August 31, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 42 before the Honorable Allen Sumner. ★

Felon Arrested for Stolen Auto and Possession of Firearm

Defendant Sentenced for Sexually Abusing Child in Multiple Cities

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Edwin "Vin" Cuxeva was sentenced to 28 years in state prison. On June 30, 2022, Cuxeva pled guilty to 11 counts of lewd and lascivious acts with a child.

Cuxeva molested the victim when she was 12 to 17 years old and committed the abuse in multiple cities across the state, including Sacramento and Los Angeles. The sexual abuse included multiple acts of sexual intercourse, oral copulation and fondling.

During an emotional sentencing hearing before Commissioner Ken Brody, the victim, along with her siblings and mother, delivered poignant statements that detailed the trauma they endured over several years of abuse. In closing her statement, the victim articulated, "I am here to say that in spite of Edwin Cuxeva, today I have found my joy, my peace, and my justice. I know that nothing will ever give me back what he grotesquely stole from me and my family but we have many more branches we can grow beyond this garden." ★

Fire at Large E-Waste Recycling Warehouse

MATHER, CA (MPG) - On August 9th at approximately 11:00 am, Metro Fire crews responded to a working commercial structure fire at a very large e-waste recycling warehouse in Mather.

The overall size of the structure, and zero visibility conditions inside, made locating the fire challenging. Another challenge came when crews found a dead water hydrant but overcame the issue by dedicating a water supply engine to lay in from another hydrant close by.

Battalion 14 set the incident up for

success early by seeing all 4 sides, establishing parameters for crews going inside with hand lines to fight the fire, and strategically placing resources to envelop the fire. A building manager was also quickly located and was used as a resource for accountability of all workers, and to gain awareness of the overall layout of the building. Truck crews on the roof reported a very solid conventional roof and coordinated ventilation with crews inside.

The fire origin was a very large conveyor system about 30' inside the building from our main point of entry. The cause has been determined unintentional. ★

4 Paws 2 Freedom Creates Special Partnerships

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A nonprofit, 4 Paws 2 Freedom, is helping veterans and first responders suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder, one friendly tail wag at a time.

"Four Paws 2 Freedom started in 2011 from the experience of an initial small group of military veterans with PTSD who gained personal freedom through the company of a trained service dog," said board chairman Steve Barnett, a former combat Army infantryman who served a tour of duty in Iraq.

"Our organization, and those whom we've been able to serve, have been growing steadily ever since," Barnett said. His own service dog is Cambria, a Spanish Burgos pointer.

Barnett attended 4 Paws 2 Freedom training classes training his service dog, and soon became an apprentice trainer. He now works full-time for the Rancho Cordova-based nonprofit.

He recognized his own feelings of PTSD associated with his memories of his tour of duty in Iraq from 2006-07 when he returned to the states.

"Service dogs can help in many ways. They can be trained to provide a buffer zone between their human and others, help recognize repetitive motions and then respond, and be especially alert to the approach of someone from behind," he said.

"A trained service dog can offer that level of support to guide their human to a safe place, interrupt nightmares and many other important tasks," Barnett said.

4 Paws 2 Freedom, founded in 2011 is a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation and has been able to help between 350-450 veterans and first responders and their service dogs who have graduated through their training program, Barnett said. The training program takes nine months to complete.

Military veterans or a qualified first responder, defined as a person who has a trauma resulting in PTSD as a result of a public service action, may receive service dog training at no charge, Barnett said.

"All varieties can be suitable, but most dogs begin with a weight of 20 pounds and go up to 90 pounds. Generally, there are no breed restrictions," Barnett said.

"I look for a canine candidate that the

owner can have full confidence in, with the kind of outgoing personality and temperament his owner can truly trust in."

4 Paws 2 Freedom has an applicant waiting list. Barnett recommended that interested applicants contact him through the group's website for more information or to apply.

Training classes are offered at Pet Food Express in Roseville, El Dorado Hills, at Sierra College and at 4 Paws 2 Freedom's home office at 2376 Zinfandel Drive in Saint Clement's Episcopal Church in Rancho Cordova.

All applicants must be physically and emotionally able to train their own service dog; be disabled by the symptoms of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and live within 100 miles of program headquarters in Rancho Cordova, Barnett said.

Trained service dogs and their owners must re-certify every year to maintain their "certified service dog" status with 4 Paws 2 Freedom. Service dogs must have a dog licensed in the city or county where they reside.

"Most importantly, they must be able to meet the physical and financial needs of an assistance dog," Barnett said.

"For me, once I returned home from Iraq, I didn't fully trust that I was safe," Barnett said. "With my dog, I have a great partner in whom I can fully trust."

4 Paws 2 Freedom welcomes the donation of dog treats used for training, treat pouches and leashes, Barnett said. "We appreciate the public support of our service dog training programs in every way."

Rancho Cordova Mayor Wants End to Meetings Held Online

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Mayor of Rancho Cordova announced late last month that he would like to see an end to City Council meetings that are conducted through Zoom or any other online program.

Mayor Donald Terry announced his intention to return to a more normal setting for future meetings during a Special Meeting and city budget workshop held on August 23rd.

"My assumptions are that the way we are handling (these) workshops is probably never going to happen again," Terry announced. "Trying to run these

(meetings) by Zoom and online doesn't lend itself to the kind of format that we used to have."

Mayor Terry announced during the workshop hosted on Zoom and online that meetings that took place in public, in Rancho Cordova City Council chambers, had a lot more "give and take" in the public debate over how taxpayer dollars are used and allocated. He believes that a return to traditional meetings will encourage more input from Rancho Cordova residents.

Terry's comments came during a budget workshop that focused on city spending priorities for the next fiscal year and through 2025. ★
