SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Agricultural Commissioner, in cooperation with the California Department of Food and Agriculture and the United States Department of Agriculture, have initiated an extensive survey and eradication plan in response to the detection of four male oriental fruit flies (OFF), Bactrocera dorsalis, in the Wilton area of Sacramento County.

The initial detection was confirmed on July 19, 2022. The detections were made as part of our coordinated pest prevention system that protects our agriculture and natural resources from invasive species with early detection a key component to successfully eradicating an infestation before it can become established.

The extensive survey, also known as a delimitation survey, consists of multiple oriental fruit fly traps placed in concentric circles going out 4.5 miles in each direction from the oriental fruit fly detection sites. Additional OFF detections may trigger a quarantine.

Following the principles of Integrated Pest Management (IPM), agricultural officials use "male attractant" technique as the mainstay of the eradication effort for this invasive species. This approach has successfully eliminated dozens of fruit fly infestations in California. Trained workers squirt a small patch of fruit fly attractant mixed with a very small dose of an organic pesticide, Spinosad, approximately 8-10 feet off the ground on street trees and similar surfaces; male fruit flies are attracted to the mixture and perish after consuming it. The male attractant treatment program is being carried out over an area that extends 1.5 miles from each site where the oriental fruit flies were trapped.

While fruit flies and other invasive species that threaten California's crops and natural environment are sometimes detected in agricultural areas, the vast majority are found in urban and suburban communities. The most common pathway for these pests to enter the state is by "hitchhiking" Continued on page 10

Keep Pets Safe During Hot Weather

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Every year, Sacramento County residents do their best to keep cool during the summer heat. Failing to keep cool in extreme temperatures can cause adverse health effects for residents – both humans and animals.

Unlike humans, cats and dogs cannot sweat to keep cool; they cool their bodies off through panting and the pads of their feet. As a pet owner, it's important to take measures to keep them cool during high temperatures.

Here are some tips for keeping your pet safe from the heat:

Never leave your pet in a parked car: Even cracking a window won't protect your pets. It is against the law in California and could be punishable by a fine or imprisonment. A car can reach 120 degrees in just minutes; even if the windows are slightly open the car can still reach 102 degrees. A dog's normal temperature is 101.5 degrees; at 120 degrees your pet can suffer from heat exhaustion and die and at 107 degrees brain damage occurs. Check out this video on how hot it gets in cars.

Avoid extreme heat: When temperatures get above the 90s, take your pet inside. For outdoor pets, be sure to provide them with plenty of fresh, cold water in a tip-proof water dish and shade for them to cool down.

Don't exercise with your pets when it is too hot: Older and certain long-haired dogs can be particularly susceptible to heat, and hot asphalt can burn their paws. Exercise in the early morning or cool evenings and make sure both of you have plenty of water.

Use sunscreen: Pets get sunburned just like people, and if your pet has light skin or fur, they can be particularly susceptible to a painful burn, and even skin cancer. Use sunscreen on sensitive areas, such as ears or nose to make sure your pets are protected.

Secure your dog during transport: Make sure your dog is secured safely in your vehicle. Cross-tethering your dog with a rope or containing them via a kennel in the bed of your truck will help prevent the dog from falling or jumping from the vehicle. Also, please note that truck beds can get hot when exposed to

the sun and that can severely burn dog footpads. Transporting animals on a public highway or public roadway without properly securing them could be punishable by a fine.

Be your pet's lifeguard: While swimming can help pets get exercise without overheating, always supervise pets when swimming either in a pool or in waterways. Dogs can get tired swimming, particularly in rivers where they have to fight against currents. To avoid drowning, make sure they wear life jackets and keep them out of the water when flows are high.

If pets have been exposed to high temperatures...

Be alert for signs of heat stress including heavy panting, glazed eyes, a rapid pulse, unsteadiness, staggering gait, vomiting, or a deep red or purple tongue.

Immediately move your pet to the shade to gradually lower their temperature. Apply cool (not cold) water to the pet, and provide lukewarm or cool water to drink. Take your pet to a veterinary hospital immediately. It could save their life.

In the world of Rancho Cordova youth sports, which is comprised of dedicated volunteers giving untold numbers of hours, Dennis Lamantia stood apart.

Dennis was the former president and treasurer of Rancho Cordova Little League where each year hundreds of kids learn life skills which can only be taught on the baseball diamond.

Dennis' philosophy was this:

Little League is not just for players; it's for families. It's not just about developing baseball skills; it's about developing life skills. It's about building teamwork on the field and a sense of community on the sidelines. The more you put into the season, the more you will get out of it.

Come Early/Stay Late. The 10 minutes before and after a practice/game can be the most fun for your player. Encourage your players to play/dine together after a game.

Practice. Schedule a baseball play date, a lesson, go to a batting cage or just play catch in the yard.

Volunteer. On or off the field, for an hour or a season, young or old, we'll find a way you can help. Be a role model – cheer for great plays and great effort - regardless of team. Accept bad calls – they go both ways. Remember the kids are watching you.

League would be enough to fill a book, but it didn't stop there.

When it became obvious that youth football was on the ropes in Rancho Cordova and would probably not continue, it was Dennis who jumped in to accomplish a top to bottom renovation and reconstitute the league. To do this he had to win over the confidence of elected officials, school officials, youth football league organizations and more. Then he had to win over parents who had lost faith in the league, recruit coaches to take a chance and convince an army of doubters it could be done. He did that and more, and with astonishing speed, he resurrected and evolved youth football in the City of Rancho Cordova.

Running two youth sports leagues in the city would be too much for most people, but the story was not over. When it appeared that a fledgling youth basketball program might not make it, Dennis again jumped in to provide the administrative and organizational

know-how needed to get yet another youth sports league off the ground. The Rancho Cordova Youth Basketball League is just getting started, but without Dennis Lamantia it may not have happened at all

at all. With those three plates spinning, Dennis next applied his considerable skills to the launch of the Rancho Cordova Track Club. Bringing his solid reputation as a youth sports leader to the line, he helped lead the establishment of this bright star on the Rancho Cordova sports map, which has hosted regional track meets attracting thousands of youth athletes over the past two years. Even as Dennis left his life behind this week, young Rancho Cordova athletes were competing in the USATF National Junior Olympics Track and Field Championship after getting their start at the Rancho Cordova Track Club nurtured by Dennis and others.

Dennis was the secretary of the Rancho Cordova Athletic Association where he was a true leader. Through his excellent example, he helped Positive Coaching Alliance principles come off the page and into action. Because of his leadership, Rancho Cordova youth sports parents, coaches, managers, leaders and players in four sports disciplines are all learning the important goals of "Better Athletes, Better People."

The Rancho Cordova Athletic Association is a convening of giants in our community. These selfless leaders devote hundreds, if not thousands, of hours a year to provide great experiences for boys and girls in our city, and they do it as volunteers. In every case, they have stayed on to lead leagues long after their own children have aged out.

In that forum, Dennis, as the leader of FOUR leagues, was a respected giant among giants. In 2018, the Cordova Community Council Foundation honored Dennis' remarkable contributions to the youth of the community with a prestigious award during the Annual Community Volunteer Awards ceremony.

"Dennis was a true force of nature, and anyone who was aware of the length and breadth of his service marveled at it," said David Sander, President of the RCAA and Rancho Cordova City Councilman. "The best way to honor Dennis is to be more like him and get involved. As he was fond of saying – there is always another field to mow."

The passing of Dennis Lamantia leaves an unfathomable hole in our community heart. The RCAA conveys most sincere condolences to Dennis' family and the thousands of children whose lives he has touched over the years.





Correctional Officer Pleads Guilty to Civil Rights Violations for Assaults on Inmates and Cover Up

U.S. Attorney's Office, Eastern District of California

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Arturo Pacheco, 40, of Elk Grove, pleaded guilty on July 25, 2022, to criminal civil rights violations for the on duty assault of two inmates entrusted to his care and to submitting false reports about those incidents in an attempt to cover them up, U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

According to court documents, Pacheco was a correctional officer at California State Prison, Sacramento (CSP-Sacramento). On September 15, 2016, while escorting an inmate, Pacheco grabbed the legs of the inmate, pulling the legs out from under him. The inmate, whose hands were handcuffed behind his back, fell forward onto the concrete floor, breaking his jaw, several teeth, and suffering other injuries. That inmate was transported to UC Davis Medical Center where he received treatment for his injuries. Approximately two days later, the inmate suffered a pulmonary embolism and died. While the inmate was receiving treatment, Pacheco, a sergeant, and other correctional officers began falsifying reports to cover up the incident.

Following the death of the inmate, investigators uncovered a second incident involving Pacheco. In that incident, on May 19, 2016, Pacheco had, unprovoked, discharged a canister of pepper spray at short range

into the eyes of an inmate who was inside of a prison cell. Pacheco falsified his report in that case to make it appear as though his actions were justified in order to save the life of the inmate. In reality, the inmate was fully complying with commands, and any use of force at that time was unlawful.

As outlined in the factual basis to his plea agreement, Pacheco sent text messages to a friend after the May 2016 incident, commenting how "funny" the incident was and "[i] t's all about how u write ur report", "plus ur partners have ur back." As Pacheco said, "[b]lood, broken glass, n just u n ur partners. ... Green light!'

"Pacheco deprived inmates of their civil rights, abusing his position of authority as a correctional officer to harm them," said U.S. Attorney Talbert. "While Pacheco thought a 'green wall' or code of silence would protect him, he was wrong. His crimes have come to light and now he has admitted to his assaults and cover up. Those who violate the public's trust by harming inmates 'under the color of law' or by covering up wrongdoing must and will be held accountable.'

"The FBI is deeply committed to protecting the rights of all Americans, and those rights do not stop behind the walls of our prisons," said Acting Special Agent in Charge Dennis Guertin. "Today's guilty plea is the result of an intensive investigation conducted by the FBI and our partners at the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation and the United States Attorney's Office. Corruption and civil rights violations within our prisons are some of the most difficult to detect and investigate, and we encourage anyone who has knowledge of similar crimes to reach out to any FBI field office or submit information to tips.fbi.gov."

This case is the product of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation with the cooperation of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Office of Internal Affairs. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Michael D. Anderson and Rosanne L. Rust are prosecuting

Pacheco remains out of custody pending sentencing. Fellow former California State Prison, Sacramento correctional officer, Ashley M. Aurich, charged separately, is pending sentencing as well.

Pacheco is scheduled to be sentenced by U.S. District Judge William B. Shubb on October 17, 2022. Pacheco faces a maximum statutory penalty of 20 years in prison on each of the false reporting counts and 10 years in prison on each of the assault counts and a \$250,000 fine per count. The actual sentence, however, will be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables.

Arrest Made in Homicide Attempt at Alta Arden and Glendale Lane

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Bureau arrested Chad Jones (36) of Sacramento County for the attempted murder (shooting) of an adult male subject on July 28, 2022, near Glendale Lane and Alta Arden. Major Crimes Detectives tracked Jones to the City of Sacramento and took him into custody at approximately 5 AM. The Sheriff's Office thanks the Sacramento Police Department's SWAT for

their assistance in apprehending Mr. Jones. Jones is well known to local law enforcement and was on Formal Searchable Probation (Until 2024) stemming from felony cases dating back to 2019; he was prohibited from possessing firearms.

Jones was booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail on a single count of attempted murder and is being held without bail. He will be in court (Department 62) on Tuesday August 2, 2022, at 3pm. No suspects are outstanding in this case. No further information is available at this time.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY - Sleeping cabin construction at Sacramento County's new concept "Safe Stay Community" to shelter persons experiencing homelessness has officially begun. The new project, located at 8144 Florin Road, on the corner of Power Inn and Florin at the former site of a now razed grocery store will have 100 sleeping cabins constructed on the site. Construction of the Pallet cabins is expected to take 10 days.

Once cabin construction is complete, infrastructure work such as running power and sewer lines will take several months to complete. In addition to the cabins, the site will have a sanitation trailer for restrooms and showers, staff quarters for the 24/7 on-site operator, a security booth to manage all persons on-site, a communal eating area, storage units for possessions guests bring that do not fit in their cabin and a pet relief area. The site is expected to begin welcoming guests late this fall. It will ultimately be able to shelter 125 people at any point in time.

"Seeing the Safe Stay sleeping cabins go up is very exciting," said District 2 Supervisor Patrick Kennedy. "It is it an important step forward in welcoming guests into this new sheltering model, and the community can begin to see how this will benefit

the neighborhood and local businesses."

Pallet has built nearly 100 communities in 50 cities across the U.S., with 76 currently operating in 45 cities including multiple locations in Northern and Southern California. The unique design and capabilities of the cabins such as a door that can be locked for privacy and safety, heating and cooling to protect guests from extreme weather events and the individualized areas that further provide a sense of space that allows people to shelter and receive services with dignity and respect.

In addition to the hard working Pallet staff, the Pallet structures are being put together by members of the Sacramento Regional Conservation Corps (SRCC) – a non-profit, workforce development and education agency. They provide an opportunity for 18-26 year-old young adults to acquire paid work experience and job skills on conservation projects in a four county region. Young adults, from diverse backgrounds, receive technical skills training and educational achievement. Their area of focus is recycling and conservation projects that enhance and protect our environment.

in fruits and vegetables brought back illegally by travelers as they return from infested regions of the world or from packages of home grown produce sent to California. Help protect California's agricultural and natural resources; please Don't Pack a Pest when traveling or mailing packages.

"Invasive non-native fruit flies are serious pests for California's agricultural industry and backyard gardens," said Sacramento County Agricultural Commissioner Chris Flores. "These recent detections on the heels of a recent oriental fruit fly detection in the community of Rancho Murrieta reminds us that we need to remain vigilant in protecting our agricultural and natural resources. When traveling abroad or mailing packages to California, we urge the public not to bring back or ship fruits and vegetables as they are pathways for oriental fruit flies and other invasive species entering our state."

The oriental fruit fly is known to target over 230 different fruit, vegetable, and plant commodities. Important California crops at risk include pome, stone fruits,

citrus, dates, avocados, peppers, and tomatoes. Damage occurs when the female fruit fly lays her eggs inside the fruit. The eggs hatch into maggots, which tunnel through the flesh of the fruit, making it unfit for consumption.

The oriental fruit fly is widespread throughout much of the mainland of southern Asia and neighboring islands, including Sri Lanka and Taiwan, and has invaded other areas, most notably Africa and Hawaii.

Federal, state, and county agricultural officials work year-round, 365 days a year, to prevent, deter, detect, and eliminate the threat of invasive species and diseases that can damage or destroy our agricultural products and natural environment. The efforts are aimed at keeping California's natural environment and food supply plentiful, safe and pest-free.

"I could easily have given out more awards as this exhibit displays merit in the theme of abstract portraits," said Juror Cherie Hacker.
