RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -The BPOE - The Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks – or popular name, Best People on Earth -Lodge #2484 is nicknamed the "Pony Express Lodge" because its first location on Folsom Boulevard was one of the original Pony Express stops. It has moved a couple of times, to its home at

11440 Elks Circle in Rancho Cordova. The membership was over 300

before, but the two-year shutdown because of COVID was hard on the Lodge. After those years, the membership is now around 217. "We're like the Phoenix, we're trying to pull ourselves out of the ashes," said Jack Melvin, trustee, and chair of the house committee Exalted ruler John Garrett said the Lodge is getting its life back. "People want to get out after being housebound for two years. They want to have a little fun in life instead of looking at the four walls."

The requirements for membership are to be at least 21 years of age, an American citizen, to believe in God, and be of good moral character. Applicants must be sponsored by an Elk to join. Let's Talk Trash

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

- If you have garbage cans, you should have recently received a green and white bucket due to the new program mandated by SB1383, a California-wide mandate signed into law by Governor Jerry Brown in 2016. Rancho Cordova Public Works manager of operations and maintenance Steve Harriman spoke about the effects of this law at the Rancho Cordova July luncheon.

Harriman listed the life cycle of this program in six steps. (1) You have your pail in the house, you scrape your plate, and the contents of your pail goes into the organics container outside. (2) The container is collected. (3) The material from your organics container is transported. (4) The material is sent to a composting facility, ground up, cleaned of contaminants, and generates compost. (5) The compost is used in agricultural operations and grows food. (6) We consume the food, resulting in food scraps and start the cycle over.

"(The bucket) is a visual representation of the huge

changes coming," said Annah Rulon, municipal sales manager for Republic Services. "At the very least, if someone hasn't heard of the program at all, they're going to say, 'What the heck is this?' And they're going to start asking questions."

The program does cost money. "We have, in Rancho Cordova," Harriman said, "two additional collection drivers, two additional vehicles, a route auditor who is going to be flipping lids in the neighborhoods, customer service and outreach, a kitchen pail which is delivered to each customer, and additional costs for the mixed materials." Because of the increased costs, Republic Services rates have increased, depending on the size of the container. For the smallest container, 32 gallons, the increase is \$4.95 a month, the medium sized, \$5.90 a month, and for the large, \$7.95 a month.

The bill, introduced in 2016 by Ricardo Lara (D) District 33, now California Insurance Commissioner, requires that California

reduce landfill disposal of organic waste by 75% by 2025. "Which basically means," Harriman said, "that greater than 20 million tons of organic waste has to go somewhere other than the landfill by 2025. These are extremely aggressive goals." The bill is a response to the "greenhouse gas" effect noted when organic material goes into a landfill, gets buried and is subject to anaerobic decomposition which releases methane.

Covered CA Rates to Increase

Premiums for health insurance plans sold through the state marketplace will increase an average of 6% next year, Covered California officials announced.

This rate hike is the largest California has seen since 2019. In the last three years, insurers had kept average increases under 2%.

Rate changes vary by region – from an 11.7% increase in Imperial, Inyo and Mono counties to zero change in Fresno, Kings, and Madera counties.

When premiums increase, an individual's financial aid usually does, too. Aid is based on household income, so subsidies may offset some of the increase. But people who don't qualify for subsidies will bear the full cost of the rate hike.

"Premiums are a capturing of what health care costs are, how they vary across geographies and communities, how health care costs are growing over time, which we know in this country are already too high and rising," said Jessica Altman, executive director of Covered California.

She noted that California's rate hike is still lower than it is in other states. A recent Kaiser Family Foundation analysis found a 10% average premium increase proposed by 72 insurers in 13 other states.

The rate increase, Altman said, is largely attributed to people resuming doctor visits

and procedures that they postponed during peaks of the COVID-19 pandemic. There is also the cost of general inflation.

About one percent of the increase, however, is attributed to the potential loss of enhanced subsidies from the federal government, which are set to expire at the end of this year. Without the additional aid, people will pay more for their premiums, likely pushing young, healthy people to drop their coverage. And when healthy people leave the marketplace, premiums go up for everyone.

The federal government's American Rescue Plan last year provided California with around \$3 billion designated for two years of additional financial aid through Covered California. The new law helped further reduce what people paid for their monthly premiums, driving more people to sign up for health insurance. It also expanded who was eligible for savings to include middle-income individuals.

Currently 1.7 million Californians buy their coverage through the state marketplace. Covered California has estimated that if Congress does not renew the American Rescue Plan subsidies, about 1 million people will see their premiums double and about 220,000 would likely drop their coverage.

"(The rate increase) for the subsidized population is almost divorced from what they pay out of pocket. What's more important is what happens with the (American Rescue Plan) subsidies," said Christine Eibner, a senior economist for the RAND Corporation, a think tank.

Altman said the sooner Congress acts

the better the chance of avoiding consumer confusion in the fall. Covered California usually sends renewal notices to enrollees beginning in October, ahead of the sign-up period, and having clarity for people by then is key.

"There have been references both ways, 'Will it be permanent? Will it be temporary? Will it stay in the current form?... Or will there be some adjustments to it?' – and we really don't know," Altman said about the conversations happening in Washington, D.C.

California's 2022-23 budget includes \$304 million for middle-class marketplace enrollees that would kick in if Congress does not renew the aid. While helpful, it would not fill the hole the annual \$1.7 billion federal aid would leave, Altman said.

Covered California also announced that another insurer, Aetna CVS Health, will join the state marketplace and be an option for people in El Dorado, Fresno, Kings, Madera, Placer, Sacramento and Yolo counties. Meanwhile, Anthem Blue Cross will expand into San Diego County.

about unusable organic waste material. "Quite startling to me, is that we throw away almost 6 million tons a year of edible food in California," Harriman said. "This is at a time when many Californians, adults and children, are food insecure. A lot of wonderful, edible food ends up getting thrown away." Establishing an edible food recovery program is required as well. Carrie Johnson, director of the Cordova Food Locker, will be working with the City on that."

There have been assorted reactions to the program, but Peter Lane, mixed media teacher at Mitchell Middle School and resident of Rancho Cordova, has started on the program and loves it. "I love the idea behind it," Lane said. "I'm curious to see how it's being implemented on a global scale, and how that will roll over to, let's say, a school, and . . . how we're going to separate our food that way."

Here are a few questions by those attending the luncheon, with answers by Harriman that may be abbreviated because of space considerations.

Question: What are some of the biggest hurdles you might encounter with this program? **Answer:** The hurdles are many. On

the one hand we have the legislature saying, 'You must divert this material from the landfill and process it,' and then we have a regulatory and environmental review framework in California that makes it incredibly difficult to site and permit and operate these facilities. Education is a major hurdle, helping people to understand. Question: What happens to people who are not compliant? Answer: 30 days. (laughter) It does require some sort of enforcement mechanism . . . I think it's going to be a while before we get to the point where we're actually using our code enforcement. Our first step is really to educate and help people out. Question: I can see many benefits in the overall program here, but what is the actual end game here? Is this all about climate change? **Answer:** For the legislature, yes.

Harrison emphasized education and outreach to the community and praised public information officers Maria Kniestedt and Danielle Hale for their work together with himself and Republic Services.

The local Lodge is a member of the Rancho Chamber of Commerce. "We also work very closely with the City," Melvin said. "The City has given us some grants to upgrade our building when we moved back in, like air conditioning our back bar, a whole brand-new grant. We've been so grateful for it."

The building, ready for use, is available for rental - with a capacity of 200 seated guests, a commercial kitchen for catering, full-service bar and lounge, and abundant parking space. "It can be used for going-away parties, anniversaries, graduations, memorials," said Melvin. "Just call and tell us what you need." There are discounts for nonprofit organizations. To inquire about hall rental, use the phone number and e-mail above.

The reasons for joining the Elks are many, but chairman of the board and trustee Norm Mayers gave two. "We've got a great, great group of people, and the second (reason) is to find ways to give back to the community." There are many Lodge activities throughout the year for members and their guests, such as the twice a month Pasta Night, and the shrimp and rib dinner held recently, at which veterans could attend for half price. The annual crab feed was held in February 2022, there is a theater group and Dixieland Jazz Night. There is pub grub at the bar, which is open for major sports events. There are poker and cornhole tournaments, and holiday parties. There are some events that the

public attends as well, such as the Fashion Show, with vendor booths from the community offering their wares. Money earned goes to various service projects.

"Every state has its own major project on top of our Elks National Foundation," Mayers said. He also authors the Rancho Elks newsletter titled Elk Droppings. "Our Hawaii and California association raises funds amounting to about \$5 million a year. We used these to provide, last year, about 41,000 eye tests to preschool kids . . . as well as providing a lot of in-home care for disabled children." The

Lodge supports local food banks and veterans organizations, Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts.

The Elks Lodge was started in New York in the 1800s by a group of actors. Now with more than 2,100 lodges nationwide, the Elks donate over \$200,000,000 in goods and services every year and are second only to the U.S. government in awarding scholarships. The very first Veterans Hospital was built and donated to the U.S. Government by the Elks.

"I joined for the RV parks," said Mayers. "A lot of Elks Lodges have places to park at a reduced rate. I got involved about 8 or 9 years ago and I'm chairman of the board now. I've got a lot more out of the Elks by being an active member than just taking advantage of the RV parking. The nice thing is that with over 2,000 lodges around the country ... you walk in there and . . . it's like you've been missed. You end up being brothers and sisters with every other Elk around the country. It's a nice feeling."

This program identifies and encourages the ever-increasing levels of performance improvement and innovation within the public fleet industry. Fleets are judged on showing leadership with staff, with customers, and within the community; staying efficient and competitive; overcoming challenges; and having a vision and direction for the operation.

The County has long embraced clean air initiatives and has acted in many capacities to reduce dependence on foreign oil and use resources wisely. This commitment to

"The County has 2,800 vehicles in its fleet," said Keith Leech Chief, Fleet Services Division and Parking Enterprise. "By converting more than 60 percent of our total fuel consumption to renewable fuels and transitioning to advanced hybrid electric technology, we have significantly reduced our carbon footprint while achieving significant ongoing savings in fuel costs."

The Department of General Services Fleet Services Division is currently partnering with SMUD for free-of-charge fleet advisory services to deliver a comprehensive fleet electrification assessment with recommendations to transition the county's fleet to Zero-Emission Vehicles.

Troubled Bullet Train Project Given a Reprieve

In 2019, just weeks after being inaugurated as California's governor, Gavin Newsom issued what many took as a death knell for the state's troubled bullet train project.

"But let's be real," Newsom told legislators in his first State of the State address. "The current project, as planned, would cost too much and respectfully take too long. There's been too little oversight and not enough transparency.

"Right now, there simply isn't a path to get from Sacramento to San Diego, let alone from San Francisco to L.A.," Newsom said. "I wish there were. However, we do have the capacity to complete a high-speed rail link between Merced and Bakersfield."

It seemed as though Newsom wanted to finish the initial phase in the San Joaquin Valley and then give up on a statewide link between the San Francisco Bay Area (and perhaps Sacramento) and Southern California.

The reaction from project supporters, particularly construction unions, was swift and sharply negative and Newsom claimed that reporters misinterpreted his intentions.

"I just think people in

the media should pause before they run headlines and actually consider the facts and maybe even ask the person that's stating things before they run with things," Newsom said. "That's the deep lesson I learned in this."

He insisted that he wasn't abandoning a state-wide system, but wanted to concentrate first on completing a working portion in the San Joaquin Valley. That limited goal, however, also has vexed the governor as costs continued to rise and work slowed to a crawl.

Seizing on Newsom's words, President Donald Trump's administration tried to claw back a nearly \$1 billion federal grant for the project that predecessor Barack Obama had awarded. When Joe Biden became president, the grant was restored.

Last year, Newsom asked the Legislature to appropriate the \$4.2 billion remainder of a \$9.95 billion bond issue that voters approved in 2008 to build the system, but legislative leaders balked, saying, in essence, that it would be money down a rathole and would be better spent on local and regional transit projects.

The stalemate over the bond money lasted for a year but in June, Newsom bought off legislative naysayers by providing \$3.65 billion from the state's huge budget surplus for the local projects in return for freeing the bond money.

However, the compromise also included an inspector general's position to oversee the High Speed Rail Authority,

which outside critics have faulted for delays and cost overruns.

"They know that with the inspector general that they're going to be watched," Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon, one of the sharpest critics, said. "They're going to be held accountable."

There has been some construction, including a bridge over the San Joaquin River near Fresno, but having tracks that will carry trains is years away and heavy expenses loom for electrification and rolling stock. Newsom has also expanded the San Joaquin section on both ends to Merced in the north and Bakersfield in the south, which carries its own price tag.

It could be a decade, or more, before trains actually begin carrying passengers between the two cities, but without connecting Bakersfield to Los Angeles and Merced to San Francisco, the segment would be little more than an amusement park ride.

As it stands — and as Newsom said in that 2019 speech — there are no plans to finance multi-billion-dollar extensions to make the bullet train a real transportation alternative. He seems to be content to provide enough money to maintain construction for the remainder of his governorship and leave it to his successor — or successors — to decide what to do after that.







Budget Invests to Help Fully Restore California's Tourism Economy

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- The new state budget agreed upon by Gov. Gavin Newsom and state lawmakers will include \$15 million in marketing funds to support the ongoing recovery of California's tourism economy.

These funds will be used to supplement Visit California's proven tourism efforts by providing direct support for domestic tourism marketing programs aimed at driving increased travel to destinations and communities throughout California.

The new funding builds on the state's previous investment of \$95 million in tourism marketing stimulus in 2021, which has been critical to reviving the state's hard-hit tourism sector and accelerating the travel industry's path to

Visitor spending in

California grew 46% last year compared to 2020, totaling \$100.2 billion, according to Visit California's 2021 Economic Impact Report. Updated economic projections now forecast that travel spending will reach 2019 levels by 2023 - ayear earlier than previous estimates.

"California's travel and hospitality industry is grateful to Gov. Newsom and the Legislature for including \$15 million in the state budget to continue the tourism economy's recovery from the devastating pandemic," said Visit California President and CEO Caroline Beteta. "The state funding will supplement the travel industry's contribution and allow Visit California to continue marketing programs across the nation to inspire travel to the Golden State. The \$95 million allocated by the Legislature a year ago helped California reclaim its nation-leading tourism market share and reestablish itself as one of the state's most reliable job producers. This \$15 million contribution will help finish the job and bring California's tourism economy back to pre-pandemic levels in 2023."

This stimulus will provide additional resources that will help Visit California close the gap in the state's uneven tourism recovery by supporting marketing programs aimed at promoting family travel, professional meetings and travel to California's urban hubs, which continue to be disproportionately impacted by the pandemic.

Please be Aware of Scams **Targeting SMUD Customers**

SMUD News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - SMUD reminds customers to be on the lookout for scammers claiming to represent SMUD and threatening disconnection if immediate payments are not made.

A scam currently being used works like this: Scammers contact a customer - sometimes from a phone number that appears to be SMUD's customer service number – and threaten disconnection if a payment is not made within 20-40 minutes via a pre-paid debit card, often at a pay station such as CVS or Safeway stores (not authorized SMUD pay stations). Some scammers have even asked for a cash payment to be made in person at a public location. The scammer demands that the customer call back a non-SMUD number with payment details. When the customer calls the number, it is answered with a recording of SMUD's phone-based

customer service menu. When the customer chooses a menu option, the call will go to voicemail or will be answered by a scammer posing as a SMUD employee.

SMUD representatives will never call a customer and direct them to a non-SMUD payment facility or require a specific method of payment such as cash, wire payment or money card.

A list of authorized SMUD pay stations with a map of nearby locations can be viewed by visiting smud.org/Pay.

If customers receive a suspicious call, SMUD asks them to ask for a name and number, then hang up and call SMUD at one of the following published numbers: Residential customers: 1-888-742-SMUD (7683); Business customers: 1-877-622-SMUD (7683); Customers can also email SMUD at scamreporting@smud.org with the same information.

DBW Reminds Boaters to Carry a California Boater Card

California State Parks News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California State Parks' Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) reminds California boaters of the requirement to obtain and carry a California Boater Card when boating on state inland and coastal waterways. Applying for one is a simple process, it costs \$10 and lasts a lifetime. Operators who are not in compliance with the law and caught operating a vessel without their California Boater Card will be cited accordingly. This is considered an infraction and base fines can range anywhere from \$100

U.S. Coast Guard boating accident data show that states with some form of boating safety education have fewer accidents and fatalities than states without any boater education requirements. California is one of the last states to implement a mandatory boating education requirement. The law is being phased-in by age. By Jan. 1, 2023, all boaters 50 years of age or younger must carry a card. All boaters, regardless of age, will need to carry one by Jan. 1, 2025. The card is verification that its holder has successfully taken and passed an approved boating safety education course. It is important to note there are exemptions to the law. For example, those operating a rental vessel or possessing a valid marine operator's license issued by the U.S. Coast Guard do not need to obtain a California Boater Card. To date, DBW has issued more than 143,000 cards.

"It's not just novice boaters that benefit from this education program by learning the boating rules of the road," said DBW Acting Deputy Director Ramona Fernandez. "Even experienced boaters find that a boating safety course can help them improve their boating knowledge and stay up to date with current boating laws."

Applying for a California Boater Card is a simple process. Boaters can complete their application by visiting CaliforniaBoaterCard. com. The card only costs \$10 and lasts a lifetime. Boaters have an option to complete an online, classroom or a home study course. Boaters only need to complete one of the approved courses. Once DBW has received your application, proof of education and payment, you will receive a 90-day temporary boater card by email. You should receive your official boater card by mail within 30 days from the time the application was approved. Detailed information on the process and information on available boating safety courses is available online at CaliforniaBoaterCard.com. A toll-free telephone support line is also available at (844) 421-8333.

On

Knocking Down Barriers and Beer Cans

The story of River Cats outfielder Austin Dean

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- Have you ever seen that viral video from September 2019 when a Miami Marlins outfielder threw a baseball at a tower of beer cans? If you haven't, you're missing out.

The Major League Baseball (MLB) player who participated in such a unique, in-game, event was Austin Dean, who is now with the San Francisco Giants' Triple-A affiliate, the Sacramento River Cats. The viral moment occurred on Sept. 20, 2019, during a matchup between the Marlins and eventual World Series Champions, Washington Nationals, a game that the Nationals won 6-4.

Dean's game within the game didn't take place in just any regular season affair. The video of Dean recorded by a fan went viral across the country on the same day that Miami suffered its 100th loss of the season. Therefore, some fans in attendance at what was once known as "Marlins Park," now known as LoanDepot Park, needed some extra entertainment to get through the end of what had been a tough season for Marlins fans.

"The funny thing about it was, is that they had already started that pyramid by inning one. So, it was working its way up," Dean told the Messenger Publishing Group with a smile before taking on the El Paso Chihuahuas at Sutter Health Park on June 22. "It was (being built at) the AutoNation Alley (Deck) so there were quite a few people. There were at least three guys."

Dean was impressed with the commitment and determination of the three gentlemen building

the pyramid. The video, originally posted by the Marlins' Twitter account, shows the pyramid at a strong and sturdy 54 cans by the time Dean caved into the fanatics' demands.

'The seventh inning rolls around and it's huge, it's at its peak," Dean said. "I finally looked at them like, "you know what, whatever, I'll give it a shot.' I finally looked at them and gave them the nod."

By that point, Dean was in, and operation beer can pyramid was a go! The 28-year-old outfielder, who was 26 at the time, slowly walked towards the fans standing in left-center field, lined it up, and as NBA broadcaster Mike Breen would say, "BANG," bullseye. Dean didn't take down the entire pyramid, but he perfectly nailed the single beer can standing atop the fivestory creation.

"My biggest thing was like, 'alright, I can't go short here, you can't miss it,' right? Just aim for the vicinity of the area and just hope we knock some down, right? I throw the ball, had a little cut on to it, and it was just perfect," Dean explained. "Knocks the top can over, they go nuts."

His teammates at the time doubted him, but the video evidence spoke for itself, garnering 3.4 million views just on Twitter with what Dean described as a "fun moment."

"After the end of the game, (my) phone is just blowing up," Dean recalled. "Probably 300-500 messages, just like notifications about all that going on. I was like, 'this is absolutely incredible.' If you get me to do that again, there's no chance that I could do that again. I wasn't looking for clout."

Dean explained that the video gets posted randomly, once or twice a year, by various baseball accounts on social media. However, the various accounts usually don't tag him in the video because nobody seems to remember that he was the guy that made the moment happen!

As for Dean's career on the field, he was traded from the Marlins in January 2020 to the St. Louis Cardinals, who have arguably the best fans in all of MLB according to many.

"I would agree, they have probably one of the best fan bases in baseball," Dean said. "Especially playing in Busch Stadium as a Cardinal is awesome. I've played as an opponent as well and I can even say, it was even great there. Everybody was super nice in the outfield. That's the epitome of baseball right there, (with) amazing fans and

an amazing atmosphere as well."

Dean spent the 2018 and 2019 seasons with Miami before playing two seasons in St. Louis in 2020 and 2021. On Nov. 5, 2021, the Giants claimed Dean off waivers. In March 2022, he was designated for assignment and began his career as a River Cat.

"Austin comes to play every day and he's the same guy," River Cats manager Dave Brundage told MPG on June 22. "He might be goofy at times, (but) he's here to play and wants to win, he wants to succeed and he brings a lot of energy every single day. I appreciate that from a manager's standpoint, somebody that loves to play the game and plays it correctly.'

So far this season for Sacramento, Dean has a (.249) batting average with 11 home runs, 36 RBI and 68 strikeouts in 68 games played.

"He is really good in the clubhouse and has been a really good leader," River Cats hitting coach Damon Minor said about Dean to MPG in a phone interview on June 23. "On the field, he has been a really good strength (for us)."

Dean and his wife are expecting a baby in December and the gender is being kept a secret to be shared among close friends and family. However, the 28-year-old did indicate that when he found out the gender on June 20, it made him, "really, really, really happy," so take that as you may.

"I was very fortunate enough that the Giants got to pick me up," Dean said. "I got put on waivers during spring training and it's not something that you want to go through. But at the same time, I still got a job, which I'm happy about, and this is a time where I need to reflect and find ways to get better and kind of prove myself again." ★
