# Fish Aided by New Projects

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -Beginning next month, parts of the American River will change to benefit salmon and steelhead migration.

Sacramento Water Forum programs will add nearly 42,000 cubic yards of gravel to Lower Sailor Bar and Nimbus Basin. The projects - continuing habitat restoration undertaken by the agency since 2008 – are geared to improve breeding opportunity for diminished chinook salmon and steelhead populations.

Man-made river alterations have

threatened these species since gold rush excavations. More recently, Folsom and Nimbus dams blocked spawning paths; dams also barred natural gravel movement to lower river reaches.

"Some salmon and steelhead return to their home water and can't find a place to spawn," explained Water Forum Habitat Manager Erica Bishop. "Though the Nimbus Hatchery has a role in juvenile fish production, the Water Forum's focus is to help salmonids complete life cycles naturally.

"Steelhead and salmon once had 200 miles of the American River

watershed for spawning as they returned from the ocean," Bishop noted. "We've limited this to about 12 miles. Fish can't build nests among boulders. They need moveable gravel to make their redds (nests). The lower American River is gravel starved. We need to do everything we can to allow these fish to maintain their species."

Lower Sailor Bar work begins August 1; the Nimbus Basin project starts August 27. In preparation, tons of Lake Natoma stones have been graded to suitable size. This gravel will be trucked to Nimbus and Sailor Bar for redistribution.

### **Leader Driven by Promise of the Future**

#### RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

- Rancho Cordova City Manager Cyrus Abhar is proud of the reputation he's earned as someone who is tough with taxpayer dollars. It's important to him that Rancho Cordova doesn't get into financial debt under his watch.

"But this doesn't mean I'm frugal either," Abhar told the Messenger Publishing Group during a recent interview.

He does admit, however, that "frugal" is a term many Rancho Cordova taxpayers would appreciate.

Rancho Cordova is a rapidly growing community. The 2020 Census found that more than 74,000 people call the city home. That's an increase of more than 10,000 people since the previous 2010 census. The city of Rancho Cordova operates under a strong city manager form of government, which means Abhar takes direction from the city council, but he calls the shots.

He is nearing an important milestone. Abhar joined the city of Rancho

Cordova nearly 20 years ago, when the community officially incorporated into a city in 2003. He initially served as public works director and says one of his first jobs was to procure a coffee machine and carpets for the building that served as a temporary city hall.

"Not many people gave us a chance to make it," Abhar admitted. "They thought we would go back to Sacramento County and say, 'take us back.""

State Assemblyman Ken Cooley, who helped guide the incorporation process when he served as a founding Rancho Cordova city councilmember, saw a lot of promise in Abhar. It's why he convinced the young Sacramento County employee to take a chance

policies implemented by the Rancho Cordova City Council. It's a delicate balancing act for Abhar, who says he is focused on reshaping the

Rancho Cordova community in a way that improves the quality of life for all city residents. That means innovative approaches to crime and homelessness, while creating a desirable place to live and work.

"Rancho Cordova did have a problem with a reputation for crime before the city incorporated," said

### **Ancient Near Eastern History Featured at State Fair**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - A new face at the Sacramento State Fair this year at the Valley Sculpture Artists (VSA) booth is Raad Alnahat, an immigrant from Iraq who will be filling the VSA demonstration spot Chris Thompson held at the fair for many years.

Alnahat has many credentials and will be demonstrating his unique process of combining sculpture and ceramics to construct large figures during the two weeks of the fair. He will show his particular process for how he constructs larger format forms. His work reflects his culture, featuring works from biblical days. After Israel, Iraq has the most biblical history of any country in the world.

One of Alnahat's pieces is a six-foot tall, 250-pound statue of the last great king of Assyria. King Ashurbanipal of the Neo-Assyrian Empire reigned for 38 years from 669 BC to his death in 631 BC in Nineveh. The four intricate sections of his piece include the head, a lion and an engraved tablet with writing in four languages.

Alnahat studied in Iraq, receiving his Certificate of Fine Arts in Baghdad in 1985, specializing in sculpture. He has taught painting, ceramics, and calligraphy for over 10 years and participated in many galleries and exhibits in Iraq, including his own personal exhibit 1987. He shared in an email that he had to leave Nineveh, Iraq in 2008 because of the war. He traveled to Turkey and lived there for two years showing his work in

numerous galleries as well as teaching calligraphy.

"I came to the United States in 2010 with my family and began studying all forms of art to improve myself, but I mostly enjoyed ceramics because it relates closely to my style. I studied at American River College and one of my large sculptures stands in their Art department today. Through my work in ceramics, I was able to combine ceramics with sculpture. My work is mostly influenced from our history in Iraq such as the Babylonian empire,

Assyrian empire, etc."
Alnahat will be demonstrating his unique style daily at the VSA booth from 1 p.m.to 4 p.m. ★

Habitat restoration includes nursery inlets to accommodate growing juvenile fish before their migration to the Pacific Ocean. Planting of native vegetation around inlets will engineer shade and bring insects to feed small fry.

In a larger 2021 project, 16,000 cubic yards of gravel were bulldozed into shallows near Ancil Hoffman Park. Working against the clock, the project restored habitat for the fall salmon migration. Soon after, steelhead spawned in the same gravel beds.

"We have a narrow work window, as specified by the Endangered Species Act," Bishop said. "Our work is targeted over time frames least likely to affect migrating fish."

Project success is evident. 2019 restoration above Sailor Bar resulted in 1,000 new chinook nests. The augmented Ancil Hoffman site last winter housed 30% of all American River steelhead spawning.

"Results are immediate," Bishop noted. "We see salmon beginning to spawn as we finish our projects. We know our restored habitats work.

"Although the ongoing drought can make river conditions challenging for fish, our projects focus on long-term improvement of river health."

Habitat restorations have been completed at River Bend Park, Sacramento Bar and in stretches of the American River along Sunrise Road. Lower Sailor Bar and Nimbus projects will wrap by early October. Though staging areas will be fenced during construction, river access and rafter use will not be restricted. In-river work will pause to enable weekend and Labor Day recreation.

Water forum projects are supported by the Bureau of Reclamation, CA Prop 68 funding, Sacramento City and County and signatory water agencies.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rebuilding Together Sacramento and the City of Rancho Cordova have partnered since 2014 to improve the health, safety, efficiency and curb appeal of Rancho Cordova homes and to support residents who need a helping hand. This year's program provided no-cost home improvements for 31 families, thanks to the city's Community Enhancement & Investment Fund.

One such family is the Splettstoessers. Ten years ago, LeAnn Splettstoesser and her family moved from Fresno and found a new place to call home in the City of Rancho Cordova. LeAnn's husband has a lung disease, and they found the air quality, doctors and insurance were better in the Sacramento region, and they have family living here.

LeAnn is the sole provider for her husband and four children. She works out of her home and volunteers at a nearby elementary school, where her son who has autism attends

LeAnn heard through the local paper, The

Grapevine Independent, and a TV station about the home improvements offered by nonprofit Rebuilding Together Sacramento.

She had made several DIY home improvements, but the work was becoming too much on top of her job, volunteering, and caring for her family, so she applied for the program and was selected.

Rebuilding Together Sacramento staff met with LeAnn to develop a list of projects, and in June 2022, LeAnn's dream project list became a reality. Volunteers converted the front yard to drought resistant landscape, replaced fencing, performed electrical work, removed an interior wall, and more.

"Thank you for making my home safe and healthy for my family and helping me so I don't have to do it on my own," said LeAnn. "I'm an independent person, and you feel responsible to do it for yourself. But sometimes, help is okay."

Abhar. "But in the past 20 years we have created what I believe is a very business friendly environment with lots of positive options that range from affordable housing, transportation and of course, the American River."

Statistics compiled by the Rancho Cordova Police Department do bear out a drop in some violent crimes, an accomplishment that Abhar is proud of. RCPD, for example, investigated an average of nearly six murders and 103 robberies every year during the period of 2011-2015. Last year, the murder rate dropped to two, combined with 74 robberies. However, some property crimes that had shown a decrease, such as auto theft, have picked back up again.

The "business friendly environment" cited by Abhar is confirmed by Rancho Cordova's leadership in the business community. Diann Rogers serves as the president and CEO of the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce. She says her opinion of Abhar grew exponentially during the recent COVID-19 crisis.

"Cyrus is one of the most collaborative people I've ever worked with," Rogers said. "He's responsive and I like that. If there's any kind of a problem, Cyrus is the type of person to reach out and ask for solutions. He's very proactive. Some leaders don't operate like that."

It's that collaborative process that has led to the construction of amenities such

as bicycle lanes and parks where none previously existed in Rancho Cordova. Abhar refers to them as "quality of life" improvements and believes the recent investment into a project called the Mills Crossing Civic Center will further enhance Rancho Cordova's reputation.

"This is a 10-acre site on Folsom Blvd. next to the Folsom Lake College, Rancho Cordova Center that will result in a community hub," Abhar said. "We are currently in the planning and design phase that will result in the construction of a performing arts center and even a community center at that location."

Abhar cautions, however, none of these types of investments would be possible without a prudent fiscal approach to running city government.

"For us to be able to dream and build great things, we have to be fiscally solvent," Abhar said. "The legacy I want to leave for this community is that I left it better than I found it. I don't want to saddle the people of Rancho Cordova with a financial mess they are forced to pay off after I've left."

While Abhar can dream, Cooley believes it's the little things that will help define the city manager's work within the local community.

"If you drive down Coloma Road and take a right on Chardonnay, you will see homes that were built in the 1950's," Cooley said. "They all have brand new roads. That's called taking care of people. That's Cyrus Abhar."





### **Southern Cal Ports and Warehouses Face Threats**

As California's post-World War II industrial economy slumped during the 1970s, civic and business leaders in the state's two major metropolitan areas made some momentous bets on their economic futures.

While the San Francisco Bay Area opted for the emerging sector of digital technology, Southern California – Los Angeles particularly – believed that its future lay in logistics, tying the region to the fast-growing economies of Asia.

Southern California expanded and modernized its twin ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach to handle what became a flood of container ships from China and other Asian nations. Rail and highway connections were improved and the region's "Inland Empire" became a massive logistics center of warehouses and distribution centers serving the entire nation.

It's estimated that 40% of U.S. imports and 25% of the nation's exports pass through Southern California's ports.

Although logistics industry salaries are not high in comparison to those of the Bay Area's tech industry, its warehouses and other facilities have provided much-needed jobs for the wave of immigrants, mostly from Latin America, that Southern California

experienced in the 1980s and

However, despite its importance, Southern California's logistics industry faces an uncertain future as the movement of goods becomes increasingly competitive and, as industry leaders complain, new state laws and regulations raise operational costs that could encourage shippers to go elsewhere.

As shipping volume increased in recent years, new Inland Empire warehouses proliferated to handle the traffic, creating a backlash of opposition from local residents and environmental groups.

Attorney General Rob Bonta sued the city of Fontana for approving a warehouse close to a high school and Assemblywoman Eloise Gómez Reyes, a San Bernardino Democrat, introduced legislation requiring new warehouses in Riverside and San Bernardino counties to be located at last 1,000 feet from "sensitive receptors" such as schools.

Business groups have opposed the measure, saying that its setback requirements and a provision of the bill requiring unionized labor on warehouse projects would hamstring development of facilities needed to handle ever-increasing amounts of cargo. The bill has passed the Assembly and is pending in the Senate.

Meanwhile, John McLaurin, president of the Pacific Merchant Shipping Association, told Gov. Gavin Newsom in a letter last month that several new state policies also threaten to curtail the logistics industry's ability to handle increasing amounts of cargo.

He specifically cited new

rules from the California Air Resources Board that prohibit older trucks from handling cargo at the ports and require replacement trucks to be zero-emission vehicles "that are currently unavailable due to the shortage of semi conductors and other equipment."

McLaurin also noted that while a just-passed state budget trailer bill purports to "invest in port-specific high-priority projects that increase goods movement capacity on rail and roadways serving ports and at port terminals," it also bans spending for "fully automated cargo handling equipment."

The prohibition is supposedly aimed at protecting port jobs from being automated but McLaurin told Newsom that unions have already agreed to provisions allowing automation, which is needed to keep Los Angeles and Long Beach ports competitive in the battle for shipping business vis-à-vis other ports.

"California's ports have no more room to grow except up," McLaurin said. "If we are to meet the needs of California consumers and exporters, support hundreds of thousands of supply chain related jobs and function as a competitive gateway, innovation along the waterfront should be encouraged - not

These issues are a warning that as logistics have become so important to Southern California's economy, the industry's future should not be taken for granted.

### **CA Assembly Requests Action by the Governor to Protect the Trucking Industry**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On Tuesday, July 5, Assembly Republicans sent a letter to Governor Gavin Newsom, urging him to delay implementation of AB 5 or exempt independent truckers entirely from its employee reclassification (ABC) test. The Supreme Court declined to hear a case on June 30th that would have challenged the new law, now putting AB 5 on the fasttrack for going into effect in California.

"California's and the nation's economy in part depends on our ability to move products through our ports. The employment standards that AB 5 sets for independent truckers puts more undue stress on our economy and will increase shipping costs, driving inflation even higher. We are trying to prevent our already strained supply chain from getting worse, and if there are cuts to the trucking workforce, this will hurt both businesses and consumers.'

"The sad reality is that the devastating ramifications of this ruling will be felt

most among minority truck owners - my constituents. Not only will the rollout of AB 5 hamper minority truck owners in their goal to achieve the American Dream, but it will also force our owner-operator fleets to give up their independence and ability to work on their own terms. Many of the signatories of this letter argued strongly against AB 5 on these grounds. While I respect the Supreme Court's decision, this issue falls upon the failures of our state to prevent unintended consequences of rash policy decisions, such as

The letter calls on Governor Newsom to use his executive powers to either delay application of AB 5 or exempt the trucking industry altogether from the ABC test, which determines whether a worker is an employee or an independent contractor. By not taking action, the Governor would be eliminating 20 percent of California's vital supply chain workforce.

### RCPD Arrests Three Subjects During **Shoulder Tap Decoy Operation**

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On June 30, 2022, Rancho Cordova Police Department (RCPD) officers conducted a Shoulder Tap Decoy Operation in the City of Rancho Cordova.

The Shoulder Tap Decoy Operation program focuses on reducing the availability of alcohol to minors and alcohol-related crime to keep our community safe.


A minor under the direct supervision of RCPD stands outside a liquor or convenience store and asks patrons to buy them alcohol. The minor indicates in some way they are underage and cannot purchase

If the adults agree to purchase alcohol for the minor, agents then arrest and cite them for furnishing alcohol to the minor. The penalty for furnishing alcohol to a minor is a minimum \$1,000 fine and

24 hours of community service. During the Should Tap Decoy Operation, RCPD arrested and cited three subjects for furnishing alcohol to a minor.

One strategy in the city's four-pronged, proactive policing approach is crime prevention. RCPD partners with residents and businesses to identify and implement ways to deter crime before it occurs. RCPD will continue to partner with ABC and our community on crime prevention and compliance.

ABC protects communities through education, prevention, and enforcement programs designed to increase compliance with California's alcoholic beverage laws. ABC is a department of the Business, Consumer Services and Housing Agency. Funding for this program was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. ★







### **Defendant Sentenced to Life** for Multiple Child Sexual Assaults

Sac County DA News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On June 17, 2022, the Honorable Delbert Oros sentenced Alvaro Rodas to 130 years to life in

On June 28, 2021, Rodas pled to four counts of lewd acts upon a child under 14, two counts of forcible lewd acts upon a child under 14, four counts of sex acts with a child under 10 years old, and one count of child endangerment.

Rodas sexually assaulted several children over a period of more than 10 years starting in California in 2006. He also forced some victims to participate in sexually abusing other child victims. In June of 2017, Sacramento police officers responded to reports of sexual abuse made by two of the

When officers conducted a consent search and search warrant of Rodas's home, they found child pornography and videos of some of the sexual assaults against the victims. \*

Between 2006 and 2017, Douglas sexually assaulted two girls on separate and multiple occasions when the girls would visit him at his home. One of the victims was 5 years old when the

abuse began, the second victim was 7 years old. Douglas was prosecuted and convicted of sexually assaulting one of the victims, and then the second victim came forward and disclosed that Douglas had sexually assaulted her as

Douglas faces a maximum sentence of 22 years in prison. Sentencing is set for August 5, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 22 before the Honorable Sharon Lueras.

### **Defendant Convicted of Sexually Abusing 3 Young Girls**

Sac County DA News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On June 30, 2022, Nehemiah Watson was convicted by a jury of nine counts of child sexual assault. The jury also found true multiple aggravating factors.

Between 2013 and 2016, Watson molested three young girls. Watson sexually abused one victim when she was between 6 and 8 years old, the second

victim when she was between the age of 5 and 6 years old and the third victim when she was 12 to 13 years old. Watson threatened the third victim that if she told someone about the abuse he would harm a member of her family.

Watson faces a maximum sentence of 24 years in prison. Sentencing is set for August 2, 2022, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 40 before the Honorable Steve White.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On June 30, 2022, Edwin "Vin" Cuxeva pled guilty to 11 counts of lewd and lascivious acts with a child.

### Sacramento County Approves Vehicle Collision with Pedestrian Second 'Safe Stay' Site

By Janna Haynes, Sacramento County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -

The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved Sacramento County's second proposed "Safe Stay Community" for persons experiencing homelessness. The second community will open at 7001 East Parkway in part of the parking lot of the current County Department of Health Services building. The site will house up to 45 Pallet sleeping cabins – both single and double occupancy, bathrooms, and communal gathering spaces. At any point in time, it can shelter up to 55 people.

The first location, at 8144 Florin Road (near Power Inn) was approved on June 8 by the Board and will have 100 sleeping shelters that can accommodate up to 125 at any given time. Both locations will be operated by an experienced provider that will handle on-site staff and manage neighbor relations and the day to day needs of the community.

These communities are built as a safer and more sanitary environment and offer critical services oriented towards exiting to permanent housing. Each site will include 24/7 security, case management services, on-site power, sanitation and food services. The County will develop good neighbor policies for the operator and occupants as well as create an oversight committee made up of County staff, community members and those with lived experience to help further guide progress in the County response.

"I am thrilled to have a second location approved and ready to build in District 2," said District 2 Supervisor Patrick Kennedy. "The need in our area is great. These new Safe Stay Communities will go a long way to help those in South Sacramento experiencing homelessness with stable shelter, drug and alcohol services, mental health services, job training, and a connection to other vital services that will lead to a healthy lifestyle and self-sufficiency while providing relief to the businesses and residents in the community that have experienced the impacts of homelessness."

Guests for every Safe Stay Community will be brought in from the immediate neighborhood, not only providing direct relief to the community, but providing local and dignified shelter in an area the guest is familiar with.

The East Parkway location will likely move on a parallel timeline as the Florin and Power Inn location and will hopefully welcome guests early next year.

While homelessness can be successfully addressed by providing stable, affordable housing, combined with appropriate support services, this approach can take many years. Safe Stay Communities provide immediate safe and hygienic locations for persons experiencing homelessness to live and access services. The communities also provide a consistent location for service providers and outreach workers to engage on a more regular basis with occupants.

Additionally, some of the broader community benefits anticipated by having this safe space community include a reduction in trash and debris, the mitigation of environmental and health hazards, and the ability to restore land previously occupied by unsanctioned encampments to its intended use.



**PENSACOLA, FL (MPG)** - Hospital man Emily Hoskins, a native of Sacramento, California, serves the U.S. Navy assigned to Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command Pensacola operating out of Naval Air Station Pensacola.

Hoskins joined the Navy two years ago.

Hoskins and the sailors they serve with have many opportunities to achieve accomplishments during their military service.

### Sac State Baseball Players Now in the Pros

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Summer is here and, as the temperatures begin to heat up, so have the performances of Sacramento State baseball alumni at all levels across the country (all stats as of June 15).

#### **Rhys Hoskins**

(Philadelphia Phillies - MLB)

Fresh off a 4-for-5 performance against Miami that saw him slug a double, a pair of home runs — the first a threerun shot that tied the game, and the second a solo shot that gave Philadelphia the lead and drive in six (https://www. mlb.com/phillies/video/rhyshoskins-two-home-run-game), Hoskins is enjoying a stellar month of June, batting .354 with nine extra base hits and 12 RBI for the Phillies, with hits in 11 of his last 15 games and raising his average 26 points in the process. The six-year Major League veteran is batting .480 and slugging 1.080 over his last seven games and hitting .351 over his last 15 contests. Hoskins' 13 home runs this year are third on the team behind only Kyle Schwarber and Bryce Harper, while his 36 RBI are second behind only Harper.

#### Sam Long (San Francisco Giants - MLB)

Following a brief stay at AAA Sacramento, Long has rejoined the San Francisco roster after being recalled on June 7 and has shined in his last three appearances — all in relief — for the big club, allowing just four hits over his last eight scoreless innings, walking a pair and striking out three to lower his ERA to 1.96 in 12 Major League appearances. He surrendered a single hit at Miami in two innings of work in his first game back on June 2, walked only one without allowing a hit in three scoreless innings against Colorado on June 7, and

scattered three hits over three innings in a start against the rival Dodgers on June 11. When you include his five appearances for the River Cats before returning to the Bay Area, Long has posted a 2.35 ERA over his last 15.1 innings of work, having not allowed a run since May 10 at El Paso.

#### **Nathan Lukes** (Buffalo Bisons -Toronto Blue Jays AAA)

Now in his third full season at the Triple-A level with the Blue Jays organization, Lukes has blistered the ball through the first 54 games of the season, batting .301 with an .819 OPS for Buffalo in the International League, adding 16 doubles, five home runs, and 26 RBI to his stat line while also swiping 12 bases. Lukes is hitting .324 in the month of June - mere points behind the .325 he hit in April for the Bisons – thanks to hits in nine of his 12 games this month, which included four home runs and 11 RBI in

#### **Justin Dillon** (Syracuse Mets -New York Mets AAA)

that stretch.

Before making a trip to the seven-day disabled list on May 31, Dillon has been solid out of the bullpen for Syracuse, posting a 3.45 ERA over 15.2 innings of work in 11 appearances for the Mets' Triple-A squad, striking out 18 and holding opponents to a .254 average. In his last appearance against Rochester, he struck out a season-high four over 1.2 innings of work and posted a 1.86 ERA in six appearances in the month of May, allowing just two earned on eight hits over 9.2 innings of work while striking out 10.
