Sac County **Artists Eligible** for \$10,000 in Grants

SACRAMENTO COUNTY. CA (MPG) - The City of Sacramento's Office of Arts and Culture is now accepting applications for its \$450,000 "Seeding Creativity" individual artists grant program.

The grant program will support 45 individual artists located within Sacramento County with \$10,000 grants to create and/or present new work in the county during the grant period.

The Seeding Creativity grant program is funded through an award to the Office of Arts and Culture from the National Endowment for the Arts' federal American Rescue Plan dollars. Funds may be used to provide fees/stipends for artists to support services for specific project

In addition to grant funds, artists will receive one year of support programming to assist them in career building skills such as building entrepreneurial expertise, leveraging resources, deepening collaborations, developing portfolios and work samples, and crafting work statements.

All grantees are obligated to produce a project by the end of the grant period within one of four chosen pathways: Creation, performance/presentation, social impact and research. Emerging and mid-career artists with a three-year work history in visual, craft, media, design, performing and/or literary arts are encouraged to apply.

Applications close at 11:59 p.m. on June 20, 2022. A free virtual application workshop to review program goals, guidelines and help individuals apply will be held at 4:30 p.m. on May 18. Register on the City's website. The Office of Arts and Culture also provides one-on-one peer mentors to support artists in application preparation.

Applications for grants will be reviewed and scored by a diverse panel comprised of artists from throughout the country as well as community members.



the importance of the employees. "This is the American story," Passof said. "They just put their socks and shoes on, go about their work very quietly and efficiently and do a magnificent job. It's really about the employees." While some employees are new to the company, many have considerable longevity. Bryan Caldwell started out with B&J in 2002, not long after graduating from high school. After two years moving through washing cars, detailing, polishing, priming, and masking for paint, Caldwell decided his interests were in being a body technician. "I get a lot of satisfaction from fixing things," Caldwell said. "So at B&J I get to do something I enjoy while earning a living."

Signs throughout the different departments, designed and created for the event by bookkeeper/ office manager Sonja Warner show personalities and information about the owners, prior owners, and employees. Warner herself has been with B&J since the year 2000, and her sign revealed the "little known fact" that her favorite genre of movie is a "cheesy disaster flick."

B&J Body Shop began in 1961 as B&J Motors, originally named for Bill Zumwalt, Jack White, and Bud Tracy, the original owners. In 1963, the business moved to its current location at the corner of Folsom and Kilgore in Rancho Cordova. In 1973, Buzz Chamblis bought it and in 1975 sold it to Frank Andrews, who hired Rick Johnson and Steve Messner to manage the business. In turn,

Johnson and Messner purchased it and the name became B&J Body Shop, Inc. In 1996, Dan Charlebois partnered with Johnson and Messner and in 1998, the partners added a state-of-the-art paint shop. Charlebois and Passof purchased B&J Body Shop in 2009.

In 2022, the history of the company continues in a way that exemplifies the various ownerships through its history. "We're still hometown folks," Passof said. "There's a lot of corporate consolidation in our industry, but we're one of the proud ones to say that we're a single location and still standing on our own providing some solid, hometown values out here."

New Fire Station 68 Responds to Firefighter Well-being

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -

On May 27, the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District (Metro Fire) opened with a "hose uncoupling" the newly constructed Fire Station 68 in east Rancho Cordova. The now inaugurated facility, located near Douglas Road and Sunrise Boulevard, incorporates state-of-the-art improvements which show the way of the future in firefighting facilities.

Susan Wood, wife of Sac Metro Board Director Ted Wood - Division 4, shared with the crowd that during the economic slowdown, the older Fire Station 68 had been temporarily closed, which left a sizeable "geographic service area hole" in the surroundings.

The new Fire Station 68 located at 12065 Cobble Brook Drive will replace the station that was formerly located at 4381 Anatolia Drive, which Rancho Cordova Mayor Donald Terry described as "more like a shed with a house in the back."

Sac Metro staff said the facility will keep "three firefighters, staffing one fire engine with room to expand staffing as the area continues to build and grow." And there certainly has been a lot of growth recently.

Fire Chief Todd Harms commented on the first stages of the project: "When I first came out here, and we looked at the site, there was nothing that was out here-literally a few roads. There was a little bit of expectation of the growth that was about to happen. But just in the time that we have built this location, the growth has just been incredible."

The fire station, which features state of the art crew quarters, health and wellness facilities, safety equipment, and fast-access sideways opening bay doors (rather than garage-style doors), was designed by Tylor Babcock of MFDB Architects and built

by Trent McCuen of McCuen Construction Inc., and the construction management team led by Sean Strongman.

Speakers highlighted that what makes the new fire station building so innovative are the health and safety features incorporated into its design.

Chief Harms explained that "because someone will live in this fire station 24 hours a day and 365 days a year for the next 60-70 years," they will be exposed to toxic diesel exhaust fumes and soot which cause cancer.

Station 68 features a descending exhaust ducting system that hooks up to tailpipes to expel spent gases, together with divided living and garaged areas which are pressurized at different

levels (somewhat analogous to a space station) so as not to allow contaminants flowing into living spaces when opening doors and other access breaches.

Metro Fire Board of Directors President Cinthia Saylors expressed gratitude that this station prioritizes the long-term health and safety of its members.


"As a retired firefighter, this is extremely important to me," Saylors said, "My generation suffers [from] very many types of cancers because we did not have the protections of sucking up the exhaust fumes; We had to live with the exhaust from our rigs; We had to live with the dirt on our turnouts; We carried our

turnouts inside our rigs... We did not know that just the soot on our turnouts was cancerous."

Newly representing the redrawn Supervisor District 3, which covers Station 68, Supervisor Rich Desmond attended the grand opening and congratulated the fire district and residents.

Desmond said that the new station was not only going to "improve response times... in the local community... but also that it was going to boost Sac Metro's response to all hazards in the county." He was referring to the pre-positioning of wildland response rigs and other special operations which will be based at Station 68.

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National Study of Pregnant Women Finds Increase in Chemical Exposure

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A national 12-year study that enrolled a highly diverse group of pregnant women, including women in the Sacramento region, found rising exposure to chemicals from plastics and pesticides that may be harmful to development.

"This is the first time we've been able to measure the amounts of chemicals in such a large and diverse group of pregnant women - not just identify chemicals," said Tracey J. Woodruff, senior author of the paper. Woodruff is a professor and director of the UC San Francisco Program on Reproductive Health and the Environment and co-director of the UCSF EaRTH Center.

The results of the study, which included co-authors from UC Davis Health, were published May 10, 2022, in Environmental Science & Technology.

Prenatal exposure to industrial chemicals can come from air, food, water, plastics, and other industrial and consumer products. Although these chemicals could be harmful to pregnancy and child development, few of these chemicals are routinely monitored in people.

All Participants had Chemical Exposure

To determine exposure, researchers measured 103 chemicals, mostly from pesticides, plastics, and "replacement chemicals," new forms of chemicals that were banned or phased out, like bisphenol A (BPA) and phthalates. Certain phthalates have been identified as neurotoxic chemicals that can harm child brain development and increase children's risks for learning, attention, and behavioral disorders.

All participants had chemical exposure, and several compounds were detected in all 171 participants. More than 80% of the chem-

icals were found in at least one of the women in the study, and more than a third of the chemicals were found in a majority of the participants. The study also found that some of these chemicals were present in higher amounts than seen in earlier studies.

The multi-institutional study included 171 women from California, Georgia, Illinois, New Hampshire, New York, and Puerto Rico who are part of the National Institutes of Health Environmental influences on Child Health Outcomes program. About one-third (34%) were white, 40% were Latina, 20%

The study found higher exposures for non-white women, those with lower educational attainment, or who were single or had been exposed to tobacco. Latinas had especially high levels of parabens, which are used as preservatives, as well as phthalates and bisphenols, which are used in plastics.

"While pesticides and replacement chemicals were prevalent in all women, we were surprised to find that Latinas had substantially higher levels of parabens, phthalates and

bisphenols," said Jessie Buckley, associ-

ate professor of environmental health and engineering, as well as of epidemiology, at Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health and first author of the

study.

"This could be the result of higher exposures to products with chemicals, such as processed foods or personal care products," Buckley said. "Our findings make clear that the number and scope of chemi-

cals in pregnant women are increasing during a very vulnerable time of development for both the pregnant person and the fetus."

Many of the chemicals the women had been exposed to were replacement chemicals, which may turn out to be just as harmful as the ones they replaced. The study also found many women had been exposed to neonicotinoids, a widely used insecticide that is toxic to bees.

"Exposure to chemicals in the environment is inevitable because they are used widely. We know some of the chemicals cause harm, but for some of the ones being measured for the first time, all we can say with certainty is that exposure to these compounds is occurring.

More work needs to be done to determine potential risks," explained Deborah Bennett, a co-author of the study. Bennett is a professor of environmental health in the UC Davis School of Medicine Department of Public Health Sciences. She helped identify which chemicals to track.

"Exposures are generally low, so pregnant moms should continue to live their lives and not be too concerned," Bennett said. According to Bennett, there are steps people can take to help limit chemical exposures.

"Cook at home using fresh or frozen ingredients - rather than processed or packaged foods - when possible," Bennett said. She also recommends avoiding pesticides and controlling household pests without chemicals. "People can also learn which personal care products have fewer harmful chemicals by checking with organizations such as the Environmental Working Group."

Many of the children in this study will be followed as part of the Environmental influences on NIH Child Health Outcomes (ECHO) program study.

Bennett is leading a separate study funded by the Environmental Protection Agency that is looking at children's exposure to chemicals in household dust. Bennett and her team will track more than 80 chemicals in dust collected from participating homes, including many plasticizers, flame retardants and environmental phenols.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - To further support California families while supplies of infant formula remain limited, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) is adding a new flexibility by expanding purchasing options for the WIC (Women, Infants and Children) program. Effective immediately, families with WIC benefits have eight additional formulas, and a total of 13 options, they can purchase for their

Voters in SF and LA Voice their disgust

It may be tempting to make too much of what happened Tuesday in California's two most prominent cities, San Francisco and Los Angeles.

Right-wing media are screaming that the overwhelming recall of San Francisco's uber-progressive district attorney, Chesa Boudin, and businessman Rick Caruso's top finish in a field of 12 candidates for mayor bodes well for a Republican comeback in this deep blue state.

That's not going to happen.

However, it's also tempting to make too little of Tuesday's voting patterns in those two cities. Progressives rationalize Boudin's ouster and Caruso's strong finish as attempts by the Trumpian right to seize control. In fact Boudin tried, and failed, to make that case to his city's

Rather, both outcomes reflect legitimate concerns by voters, including those who consider themselves to be left-of-center Democrats, that the quality of life in both cities has deteriorated and that their elected leaders have failed to recognize and confront that fact.

Deterioration is especially stark in San Francisco with rampant drug use that gressive that maintaining newspapers.

human life, squalid camps of the homeless dominating city sidewalks and a wave of burglaries and smashand-grab robberies that goes unpunished.

Writer Nellie Bowles vividly captures the San Francisco crisis and why ordinarily progressive San Franciscans became disgusted in a lengthy article that Atlantic magazine published today.

"They did it because (Boudin) didn't seem to care that he was making the citizens of our city miserable in service of an ideology that made sense everywhere but in reality," Bowles wrote. "It's not just about Boudin, though. There is a sense that, on everything from housing to schools, San Francisco has lost the plot – that progressive leaders here have been LARPing left-wing values instead of working to create a livable city. And many San Franciscans have had enough."

Bowles noted that Boudin's recall was foretold by the recall of San Francisco school board members who were preoccupied with symbolic acts of political correctness, such as changing the names on school buildings while ignoring the effects of school closures due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

"I used to tell myself that San Francisco's politics were wacky but the city was trying - really trying to be good," she wrote. "But the reality is that with the smartest minds and so much money and the very best of intentions, San Francisco became a cruel city. It became so dogmatically pro-

is taking a heavy toll on the purity of the politics required accepting - or at least ignoring – devastating results."

> Boudin himself came close to acknowledging why he lost, albeit with a tinge of rationalization, telling the San Francisco Chronicle, "Voters were not given an opportunity to choose between criminal justice reform and something else. They were given an opportunity to voice their frustrations and their outrage and they took that opportunity."

What about Los Angeles?

It has suffered from the same chronic problems that plague San Francisco and a political leadership that has been equally ineffective in dealing with them. Caruso, a very wealthy shopping center developer, tapped into widespread frustration, particularly about crime, in a deluge of self-financed media ads.

Los Angeles' notoriously low voter turnout also helped Caruso garner more than 40% of Tuesday's vote, topping Congresswoman Karen Bass, the candidate of the city's Democratic leadership, by several points.

However, with neither getting a majority, they are headed for a runoff in the November election, when turnout will be higher. That will be a truer test of whether Angelenos are ready for the change that Republicanturned-Democrat Caruso promises but Bass and her supporters shouldn't ignore the quality-of-life backlash.

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CAL FIRE Awards Nearly \$118 Million in Wildfire Prevention Grants

CAL FIRE News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As part of California's strategy to prepare properties and communities against the devastating impacts of wildfires, CAL FIRE announced it will direct nearly \$118 million in funding for 144 local wildfire prevention projects across the

"Drought conditions have once again taken ahold of California and are already contributing to another year of early fire activity," said Joe Tyler, CAL FIRE Director and Fire Chief. "This funding is a critical part of our overall wildfire strategy."

CAL FIRE's Wildfire Prevention Grants enable local organizations like fire safe councils, to implement activities that address the hazards of wildfire and reduce wildfire risk to communities. Funded activities include hazardous fuel reduction, wildfire prevention planning, and wildfire prevention education. These projects all meet the goals and objectives of California's Wildfire and Forest Resilience Action Plan, as well as the Strategic Fire Plan for California.

In Los Angeles County, the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments is one of many organizations receiving funding towards wildfire prevention efforts. Their project will work towards developing a Regional Wildfire Protection Plan that will help to protect over 31 cities and communities, 22 of which are identified as "Communities at Risk". In Lake County, a grant has been awarded to the Robinson Rancheria Band of Pomo Indians for a hazardous fuels reduction project in the wildland-urban

interface that will incorporate professional training as well as a community outreach and education campaign to increase awareness of defensible space and fuels management. In El Dorado County, a grant has been awarded to the El Dorado Fire Safe Council for a project that will assist residents with hazardous tree removal to slow the spread of the bark beetle infestation. The project will also assist with removing stressed and injured trees damaged by the Caldor Fire.

"These 144 local wildfire prevention projects, along with the 105 projects we just funded in September 2021, will significantly increase California communities' preparedness towards wildfires," said Chief Daniel Berlant, CAL FIRE Deputy Director of Community Wildfire Preparedness and Mitigation.

The Wildfire Prevention Grants Program is funded as part of the State's Wildfire and Forest Resilience Strategy, in part with Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds administered by the California Climate Investments (CCI) Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund, CCI is a statewide program that puts billions of Cap-and-Trade dollars to work reducing greenhouse gas emissions, strengthening the economy, and improving public health and the environment - particularly in disadvantaged communities. These grants are part of the Governor's unprecedented \$1.5 billion investment in wildfire resilience. The Governor's Wildfire Resilience initiative has launched 588 projects to date, in addition to projects to be funded by these grants.

DWR Offers Grants to Protect Communities, **Support Fish Populations, and Restore Streams**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Department of

Water Resources (DWR) on Wednesday, June 1, released the final Guidelines and Proposal Solicitation Package for the Riverine Stewardship Program, which provides funding to plan and implement projects that will reduce flooding, improve water quality, and restore streams, creeks, and rivers to enhance the environment for fish, wildlife, and people.

As communities and wildlife alike face challenges posed by climate extremes and California's ongoing drought conditions, the program will award up to \$15 million in competitive grants to implement projects that help reduce flood risk, increase water supply, and enhance and restore fish populations and habitat. The funding will be delivered through the Riverine Stewardship Program and its two subprograms the Urban Streams Restoration Program (USRP) and the San Joaquin Fish Population Enhancement Program.

All three programs will help support watersheds, local wildlife, and aquatic habitat. Eligible projects include habitat restoration, bank stabilization, water

temperature improvements and habitat enhancements to increase water supply reliability to help fish adapt to climate change.

"Climate change is driving multiple threats to California including the severe drought conditions that challenge our communities and fish populations alike," said DWR Director Karla Nemeth. "This funding supports a local and state partnership to make our communities and their streams more drought resilient for people and fish."

Both the Riverine Stewardship Program and San Joaquin Fish Population Enhancement Program are funded by Proposition 13, while the Urban Streams Restoration Program is funded by Proposition 68, 84, and state budget general funds.

During the 2019 solicitation, DWR awarded \$54.4 million in competitive grants to 20 projects that improve habitat and spawning conditions for fish species, reduce flood risk to property and local communities, and more. The Urban Streams Restoration Program, which has funded projects for 35 years, recently celebrated ribbon cutting ceremonies for previously completed restoration projects located in Santa Barbara, Berkeley,

Applications will be accepted starting June 1, 2022, and funding is available for Tribes, local public agencies, and certified non-profits as specified in the program guidelines and proposal solicitation package. Other applicant types such as community groups will be considered on a case-by-case basis. For-profit corporations, non-public entities, and individual landowners are not eligible. The released guidelines will also address future funding that may become available to DWR through the 20222023 Budget Act to address drought resilience and aquatic habitat improvements.

The Urban Streams Restoration Program also provides funding and technical assistance for public engagement, outreach, and underrepresented community support. DWR encourages community participation in project design and implementation to promote educational opportunities to community members of all ages and increase understanding of the project's benefits.

Placer Native Among 5 Marines **Killed in Aircraft Crash**

GLAMIS, CA (MPG) - Five United States Marines tragically died in an aircraft crash Wednesday, June 8, in Glamis, California, during what was supposed to be a routine training session.

One of the five victims was identified as Capt. John J. Sax, 33, of Placer, California. The other four victims were: Cpl. Nathan E. Carlson, 21, of Winnebago, Illinois, a Tiltrotor Crew Chief. Capt. Nicholas P. Losapio, 31, of Rockingham, New Hampshire, an MV-22B Pilot. Cpl. Seth D. Rasmuson, 21, of Johnson, Wyoming, a Tiltrotor Crew Chief. Lance Cpl. Evan A. Strickland, 19, of Valencia, New Mexico, a Tiltrotor Crew Chief.

John Sax graduated from Granite Bay High School and went on to become a MV-22B Pilot for the Marines. John Sax is the son of West Sacramento native and five-time MLB All-Star. Steve Sax

"It is with complete devastation that I announce that my precious son, Johnny was one of the five US Marines that perished on Wednesday, June 8, in the Osprey Military crash near San Diego," Steve Sax said in a statement published Saturday by CBSLA-TV. "For those of you that knew Johnny, you saw his huge smile, bright light, his love for his family, the Marines, the joy of flying airplanes and defending our country! He was my hero and the best man I know, there was no better person to defend our country."

Steve Sax said when

his son John was a boy, he dreamed of being a pilot and would get distracted by planes flying overhead during his Little League baseball games.

"It is with heavy hearts that we mourn the loss of five Marines from the Purple Fox family" said Lt. Col. John C. Miller, Commanding Officer of VMM-364, in a news release. "This is an extremely difficult time for VMM-364 and it is hard to express the impact that this loss has had on our squadron and its families.


"Our primary mission now is taking care of the family members of our fallen Marines and we respectfully request privacy for their families as they navigate this difficult time. We appreciate all the prayers and support from the strong extended Purple Fox family and want them to know that more

information will be forthcoming on how to help."

The five Marines were based at Marine Corps Air Station Camp Pendleton, CA, and were flying on a MV-22B Osprey aircraft at the time of the crash. All five were assigned to the Marine Medium Tiltrotor (VMM) Squadron 364, Marine Aircraft Group (MAG) 39, 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing (MAW), according to a news release from the Marines.

At the time of the mishap according to the Marines, the MV-22B Osprey and crew were conducting routine flight training and that the cause of the crash is under investigation. The crash occurred in Imperial County which is about 115 miles east of San Diego and about 50 miles from Yuma, Arizona.

John Sax served in the Marines for five years and eight months. He was awarded with the National Defense Service Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal and Letter of Appreciation. John Sax is survived by his 20-monthold daughter and his wife Amber, who is pregnant with their second child.







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Cordova Sports Hall of Fame Inductees Announced

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A championship girls basketball team, a standout bowler and a trio of Cordova Lancer football stars are among the athletic legends who will be inducted into the Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame this fall.

The inductees will be honored during the 2022 Induction Ceremony slated for 6 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 10, 2022, at Rancho Cordova City Hall. The class includes athletes, coaches, and Rancho Cordova sports advocates who have exhibited the "Heart of a Champion."

"Rancho Cordova has a uniquely powerful history of youth sports achievement," said David Sander, Rancho Cordova City Councilman and president of the Rancho Cordova Athletic Association (RCAA), "Our Hall of Fame memorializes that incredible history and should inspire our current youth athletes as well."

Honorees elected to the Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame were judged to have attained significant achievements in or have made notable contributions to athletics, as well as exhibiting high standards of character and sportsmanship.

Rancho Cordova Sports luminaries to be inducted during the Seventh Annual Sports Hall of Fame Ceremony include:

1984 Cordova High Girls Basketball Team: Led by All City players Yvette Collins and Mickie Weekly, the 1984 Lady Lancers racked up a 32-1 record on their way to the Section Championship and is considered the best girls basketball team in Cordova High history. The team dominated during a magical year when Rancho Cordova was truly "Title Town," piling up six league championships, with three, including the girls basketball team, advancing to the Section Championships. Along the way, the Lady Lancers became the first girls basketball

team to notch an undefeated regular season. The late John McCants coached both the girls basketball and softball teams to league championships that year to earn Coach of the Year honors.

Steve Abrams (Cordova High '81): Abrams converted an exemplary three-sport high school athletic record into a successful coaching career spanning two decades at the college and high school level in football, soccer and baseball. Along the way he was honored as Elk Grove Volunteer of the Year and founder of the Handing Out HOPE Foundation, which ships donated baseball gear to children around the world.

Rick Anderson (Cordova High '82): Honored in the Coaching category, Anderson was a three-letter cross country runner at Cordova High who went on to become a successful men's cross-country coach at American River College. With degrees in Physical Education and Kinesiology,

Anderson has been a leader of the sport at the college level. Terry Behrens (Cordova High '73): A Mills and Cordova High varsity cheerleader, Behrens went on to become a model and

worked in the motion picture & television industry. She worked on production of 3 feature films with Max Baer Productions and at 20th Century Fox Film Studios in the Executive Office and as Set Lighting Auditor.

Zach Crouch (Cordova High '84): Athlete Crouch was a Cordova High baseball standout who compiled one of the best senior seasons in CHS history. On the mound, Crouch compiled a 13-1 record with a dazzling 1.04 ERA. At the dish, Crouch bashed 10 homers and batted .360, enroute to winning Player of the Year honors by the Sacramento Bee. Also successful on the gridiron, Crouch was an All-Delta League defensive end as a Senior. In 1984, Crouch was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the MLB Amateur Draft and spent five seasons in the Red Sox minor league system.

Jose De La Cruz: A Rancho Cordova police officer, will be honored in the Heart of a Champion category in recognition for outstanding service to youth sports through his leadership of the Rancho Cordova Police Activities League (PAL). In 2018, PAL was awarded rare "Diamond" status by the San Francisco Cordova pioneer family, established herself as a fleet-footed track star prior to Title IX laws which expanded high school sports for female athletes. Running on behalf of the Cordova Dusters at AAU Track Meets, she set and broke several records, eventually running for California State University, Hayward (now CSU East Bay), UC Davis and in the Junior Olympics.

Frank Griffin (Cordova High, '87): Considered one of the Lancer football greats, Griffin was a starter for teams which went 25-1 over two years. A two-time

> All-City and All-League selection, Griffin earned a scholarship to the University of Southern California where he was a starting tight end for three seasons. For the past 10 years Griffin has been considered a top Sacramento area high school football official earning the coveted A+ rating.

Fallon Johnson (Cordova High '03). Johnson will be honored posthumously as she died tragically from injuries sustained in a 2007 car crash in Ames.

Tim McCandless (San Rafael High '75): Honored in the Coaching category, McCandless was a stalwart assistant football coach at Cordova High and other Sacramento area high schools for more than four decades. During his tenure, this beloved coach was part of multiple championships and state titles earned during 49 post season games, 16 league championships, and two Optimist All Star games.

James Montgomery (Cordova High '06): Montgomery is one of only three Rancho Cordova athletes to become a football All American. After wrapping up all available honors in high school football, including the Sacramento Bee's 2005 Offensive Player of the Year, and bragging rights for scoring nine touchdowns in a single game, Montgomery also earned

accolades for All State track accomplishments.

CK Moore (Cordova High '76): An outstanding youth bowler and Cordova High baseball player, an injury ended his baseball dreams early on. But Moore turned to bowling, and in 1996 rolled a perfect 300 on National Television to win the Columbia Open. He followed that up with a 2nd place finish at the Hartford Open, and by season's end - at age 39 - Moore at that time became the oldest rookie to win the Professional Bowlers Association Rookie of the Year Award.


Deborah Green Swain (Cordova High '68): Honored in the Heart of a Champion category, Swain was an outstanding athlete before Title IX transformed opportunities for female athletes. Active in intramural sports, swimming and an accomplished marathoner her entire life, Swain focused her competitive spirit on career, becoming an internationally and nationally recognized expert and author in the area of speech, language and hearing issues.

Sheena Sapaula (Cordova High '03): A CHS softball standout for both the Cordova Lancers and California Breeze, Sapaula gathered an armload of high school honors before heading to the University of Pittsburgh where she continued her winning ways.

Tickets for the induction ceremony are \$30 and include an appetizer and cocktail reception and awards program.


