County's Response to Homelessness

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County is actively engaged in multiple strategies to provide services that unhoused residents need to transition into safe, stable housing.

In Fiscal Year 2021/2022 alone, we have invested nearly \$50 million in homeless specific programs, services, shelter, re-housing and data infrastructure to serve our community, with funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) and the County's General Fund, among others.

Notable projects this year include:

Safe Stay community developments - providing on-site services, security and re-housing to move people from unsheltered homelessness into housing and other supportive services while providing much needed respite to the neighborhoods through a reduction in trash, tents, violence and blight.

Encampment Service teams: Comprised of Outreach navigators, re-housing staff and clinical staff to

provide behavioral health assessments and referrals for those living in encampments.

Additional investment of the construction of Marisol Village - an affordable housing project slated to add an additional 116 units to the final project.

Invested three years of funding to greatly expand Coordinated Access (CAS), a powerful collaboration designed to ensure that homeless persons and persons at risk of homelessness are matched, as quickly as possible, with the services that will most effectively end their homelessness. This funding provides for increased coverage at 211, and new field-based staff to assist households into crisis support services and rehousing.

Landlord Engagement and Re-Housing Supports: conducting outreach and educational events to recruit landlords and expand the availability of rental units; investment in incentives such as sign-on bonuses, move-in assistance, vacancy loss payments, etc. to support landlord retention; and increasing flexible


RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The opening of the Cordova Community Pool, as a body of water, at Hagan Community Park last year has already begun to affect the migration patterns of some very peculiar species. This piece contains 8 pounds of glass rods fused together, with LED lighting that has a capacity for 166 variations of lighting patterns. In second place was Linda Nunes for The Practice of Happiness. Nunes recently hosted a solo show at the MACC and has a first place mixed media work currently on display at the City Hall Art Show. Third place went to Monica Lee, Untitled. "She is a book artist," Gleason said.

The MACC is open Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. This exhibit runs from Thursday, June 2, through Saturday, June 18. Hours are 3-8 PM.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In response to Governor Gavin Newsom's March 28 Executive Order the State Water Resources Control Board adopted an emergency water conservation regulation that will ensure more aggressive conservation by local water agencies across the state.

The new regulation bans irrigating turf at commercial, industrial, and institutional properties, such as grass in front of or next to large industrial or commercial buildings. The ban does not include watering turf that is used for recreation or other community purposes, water used at residences or water to maintain trees. The regulation also requires all urban water suppliers to implement conservation actions under Level 2 of their Water Shortage Contingency Plans.

In March 2022, the state's urban retail water suppliers reported average water use statewide that was nearly 19% greater than in March 2020, lowering the state's cumulative water savings since July 2021 to 3.7%. On May 23, 2022, Governor Newsom convened leaders from the state's largest urban water suppliers imploring them to take more aggressive action to combat drought.

"The severity of this drought requires all Californians to save water in every possible way," said Joaquin Esquivel, chair of the State Water Board. "The regulation compels water systems and local authorities to implement a range of additional critical conservation measures as we enter the hot and dry summer months."

Level 2 water shortage contingency plans are meant to address up to a 20% shortage of water supplies. In addition to implementing Level 2 actions, the regulation requires urban water suppliers to fast-track supply and demand assessments to plan for potential extended dry conditions.

Level 2 actions often include things such as: Limiting outdoor irrigation to certain days or hours; Increasing patrolling to identify water waste; Enforcing water-use prohibitions; Increasing communication about the importance of water conservation.


Some water suppliers already have imposed strong new restrictions on customers' water use in accordance with their drought management plans. However, about half of the state's 436 water suppliers (both urban water retailers and wholesalers) have not yet activated Level 2, and 36 have not submitted drought plans. The emergency regulation will require suppliers without drought plans to take certain conservation actions, such as conducting outreach to customers about conservation, restricting outdoor irrigation to two days a week and enforcing against wasteful water practices.

The approved regulation will be submitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) for approval, which typically occurs within 10 calendar days. The ban on non-functional turf becomes effective upon OAL approval and the Level 2 requirements for urban water suppliers are proposed to take effect on June 10, 2022.

The regulation will give suppliers new options to reduce water waste if they choose to use them. A violation of the non-functional turf irrigation provision, for example, would be an infraction and subject to a fine of up to \$500.

People who see water waste should report it at savewater.ca.gov.

The State Water Board's mission is to preserve, enhance and restore the quality of California's water resources and drinking water for the protection of the environment, public health and all beneficial uses, and to ensure proper allocation and efficient use for present and future generations.

"STC is open to both singles and couples. We're an active group of people who are tall and love getting together and having fun," said their president, Bob Huggett. "Anyone at least 21 years of age may join if they meet the club's height requirements."

'We host events which satisfy the variety of tastes and interests of our members. We try to have get-togethers at fun places such as bar and grills, interesting restaurants, night clubs, and whatever else we can think of that's likely to be fun and enjoyable," Huggett

"Without the height, we're just average people, and there's nothing really special about us. In the club, that's a common trait we have: We're all tall," Huggett said. "It costs nothing to attend your first event, look us up."

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
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
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

The City of Rancho Cordova Planning Department (City) is the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Lead Agency for the proposed SFPP Bradshaw Terminal Renewable By Rail Minor Design Review and Non-Conforming Use Permit Project (Proposed Project). The City has directed the preparation of an Initial Study (IS) Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) in compliance with

Project Location: The Project occurs within portions of the existing approximately 27.6-acre Bradshaw Terminal within APNs 068-0160-100 and 068-0160-099 located at the southeast corner of Folsom Boulevard and Bradshaw Road, in the City of Rancho

The Project also occurs within portions of the existing Sacramento Regional Transit (SacRT) right of way within APNs 068-0160-001, 077-0010-001, and 077-0010-020 located south of and adjacent to Folsom Boulevard between Routier Road and Bradshaw

Project Description: SFPP, L.P. (SFPP), a subsidiary of Kinder Morgan, proposes to expand its Bradshaw Terminal to allow for renewable diesel (RD) and biodiesel operations. The SFPP Bradshaw Terminal Renewable By Rail Project (project) would include new rail infrastructure at Bradshaw Terminal and within the existing Sacramento Regional Transit (SacRT) and Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) rail corridor. Within the existing rail corridor, a new rail runaround would be installed to spot approximately 22 railcars on SacRT right-of-way for railcar delivery purposes

Within the Bradshaw Terminal, the project would have approximately 22 railcar storage/offload locations with rail spots dedicated for biodiesel and RD offloading. The rail system would be able to offload approximately 20,000 barrels per day (bpd) of total product to include 1,240 bpd of biodiesel. The Bradshaw Terminal would normally receive one (1) rail delivery per day, up to 5 days per week (M-F).

The project would also include a new 80,000-barrel (bbl) RD storage tank and a new insulated biodiesel tank with approximately 15,000-bbl working capacity. Both tanks would be installed within the existing secondary containment area; however, the containment area would be modified slightly for the new volumes.

Additionally, the project would include a new two-lane truck blending and loading rack. The truck rack would be capable of blending biodiesel with CARB diesel or RD. Truck loading may to take place up to 7 days per week. The project's proposed fuel throughput would result in 112 new truck loads per day, for 224 new truck trips per day.

Potentially Significant Environmental Impacts: Potentially significant impacts to biological resources, cultural resources, hazards/hazardous materials, tribal cultural resources, and mandatory findings of significance were identified in the Initial Study. All impacts would be reduced to a less than significant level with the implementation of identified mitigation measures.

Hazardous Waste Sites: Pursuant to Section 15087(c)(6) of the Guidelines for California Environmental Quality Act, the City of Rancho Cordova acknowledges the Project site is part of a designated hazardous waste site

IS/MND Document Review and Availability: The public review and comment period for the Draft IS/MND will extend for 30 days starting June 10, 2022 and ending July 11, 2022. rental subsidies to improve the efficacy of voucher and homeless housing subsidy

Funding 60 beds through December 2024 to support the Parkway Navigation team, prioritizing those exiting the portion of the Parkway between Interstate 5 and Highway 160. The Salvation Army will provide 24/7 staffing, food, laundry, case management and re-housing supports, with an annual goal of rehousing 180 people who previously lived on the Parkway.

Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Housing Program adding 60 units that provide a continuum of interventions including homelessness prevention, flexible housing funds, rapid rehousing, and permanent supportive housing for persons experiencing both homelessness and mental health issues. These units are on top of a recent \$27.3 million in No Place Like Home (NPLH) funding to build/renovate 137 additional dedicated apartments. Another \$9.5 million in NPLH funding is currently under State review to build an additional 37 dedicated apartments.

Additionally, working with our partners in all our cities is crucial to address the issue. Sacramento County and the City of Sacramento in particular must remain focused on addressing issues together, taking into account our responsibility to constituents, stakeholders and our home-

The County and City of Sacramento have collaborated for the past several years to identify and pursue opportunities to partner on projects that will serve the homeless population in the most efficient and effective way possible. While there are many good ideas to address the immediate and long-term needs around homelessness, not every project is feasible.

For example, the City and County were recently exploring a large site to

potentially purchase and renovate as shelter with on-site wrap around services for people experiencing homelessness. After careful consideration, the County decided not to pursue the project for multiple reasons, including the cost of the real estate, the limitations imposed by the property owner that would interfere with provision of critical services and the relatively small number of people who would be served for such a large investment. The County has multiple sheltering projects under consideration for a similar or lesser amount of funding that will serve greater numbers of people over the long term and result in permanent exits from homelessness.

Critical to our success is the ability to partner with the City of Sacramento and the other six cities in our jurisdiction - but also weighing the benefits and drawbacks of every dollar spent with the end goal of reaching every person experiencing homelessness. The County is ready to support projects and programs that are aligned with evidence-based approaches to addressing homelessness.

Sacramento is facing an unprecedented crisis of homelessness in our community. This crisis cannot be pinpointed to one specific cause, rather a myriad of complicated issues including a housing affordability gap, the impacts of COVID-19 and the overwhelming need for mental health and drug and alcohol rehabilitation services.

The Point-in-Time count results will likely show a significant increase in unhoused residents in Sacramento County. Now more than ever, the County and cities can work side by side to address this crisis. Together we are stronger, more effective and more capable of success.







