

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Two days of carnival rides, circus acts, music, food and fireworks kick off Tuesday, July 3 as the Rancho Cordova Fourth of July Celebration rolls into high gear for Rancho Cordova's biggest community bash.

Gates open at 4 PM on July 3 and July 4 for two great days of fun. Admission is \$5 and parking is \$10.

The fun is to include the All-America Mile Run followed by the Rancho Cordova Fourth of July Parade, filling Coloma Road with runners, floats and six high school marching bands – all in celebration of Independence Day, a tradition dating back to 1776.

July 3 opens with a fun-filled evening in Hagan Park, with gates opening at 4 PM. Inside, guests can enjoy carnival rides, take in the Los Moralitos Circus (shows are at 5 and 7 PM), explore gastronomic offerings from 20 food vendors, take a miniature steam train or pedal boat ride

or engage in laser tag. At 8:15 PM, the action shifts to the concert venue where the Cripple Creek Band will entertain with Southern Rock music. When it's dark, fireworks will light up the skies.

July 4 features a long and busy schedule beginning with the All-America Mile Run, sponsored by the Rancho Cordova Track Club at 9 AM. It's a fast and fun one-mile jaunt down Coloma Road, clearing the way for what follows.

The beloved Rancho Cordova Fourth of July Parade comes next at 10 a.m., traveling down Coloma Road before turning down Chase Drive. The parade will feature an astounding six high school marching bands, all providing music to assure a great and patriotic show.

The July 4 action in Hagan Park begins at 4 PM when the gates open for another evening of activities, featuring carnival rides and Los Moralitos Circus shows at 5 and 7 PM. Pedal boat and steam train rides continue, as does laser tag. At 8:15 PM the Rancho Cordova Fourth of July will rock you with "Queen Nation" – a Queen tribute band – followed by the Rancho Cordova Fourth of July Fireworks Spectacular, the most artfully planned fireworks show in the region.

Grand Jury Releases **New Status** Review

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - When required to respond to a Sacramento County Grand Jury report showing a less than robust record of leadership at the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Grand Jury found that the Board of Supervisors has opted to dodge and deflect. But the Grand Jury's deep concern, plainly stated in that February 2022 report, continues.

In the Grand Jury's newly issued Status Review, it finds that the Board's responses to the Grand Jury report reflect the Board's continuing refusal to acknowledge or accept responsibility for any deficiencies of leadership, accountability or engagement at the outset of the 2020 countywide emergency.

The Grand Jury in its February 2022 report called out the Board for lack of oversight and leadership during the first five critical months of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Grand Jury conducted extensive research and interviews which found: 1) the Board of Supervisors handed off essential decision-making and CARES Act funding responsibility to its County Executive, or his designee; 2) the Board did not receive timely reports on allocation of CARES Act funds; 3) it failed to demand regular public updates on County pandemic activities; and 4) the Board failed to provide public forums to assess the vast array of needs and challenges faced by residents across Sacramento County.

The record of Board sessions speaks for itself: No actions were taken to publicly account for use of emergency funding, engaging with local residents and businesses, and even with its own agency heads, and is documented in the Grand Jury report.

It was this pattern of lack of leadership, engagement and oversight that was contained in the Grand Jury's report, and the basis of its findings and recommendations. The Grand Jury found that in the Board's response, it unfortunately cloaks itself in bureaucratic, misleading, and at times inaccurate statements.

The Board Supervisors' position that there is 'nothing to see here' reflects the precise leadership and accountability deficiencies

Sacramento County Recommended Budget Approved

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously on June 9 to approve the \$7.3 billion recommended budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23.

"Sacramento County's FY 2022-23 budget works to address many of the needs of our community and includes additional investments in programs and services related to homelessness, mental health, substance abuse and social services for some of the most vulnerable people among us, while maintaining vital and essential existing services," said District Five Supervisor and Board Chair Don Nottoli.

The \$7.3 billion budget consists of \$2.8 billion in Enterprise and Special Revenue Fund appropriations (utility rates, fees and other dedicated revenue), \$3.5 billion in General Fund appropriations (\$936 million in discretionary resources, \$1.1 billion in restricted funds, and the remaining \$1.4 billion with Federal, State and fee revenue dedicated to specific purposes), and \$1.1 billion in Restricted Funds.

"This approved budget reflects substantial investments in new and enhanced programs based on the Board's priorities and a survey of Sacramento residents," said County Executive Ann Edwards. "In addition to increased funding addressing homelessness, social services and improving the condition of County roads, we were able to set aside more money in the County's 'rainy day' reserve funds."

The recommended budget recognized new or enhanced areas of growth, including annual commitments of: Addressing Homelessness – \$5.3 million to fund new programs and services addressing homelessness in the County; Road Pavement Rehabilitation Projects – \$20 million in one-time Net County Cost transferred from the General Fund to the Roads Fund to fund pavement maintenance and rehabilitation on roads throughout the unincorporated County. Substance Use Disorder Residential Treatment

Services to procure an additional 156 beds annually for substance use disorder residential treatment; Crisis Stabilization Units - \$5 million for the Department of Health Services to establish a pool for behavioral health crisis stabilization units, which is a service the County is required to provide to Medi-Cal beneficiaries; Mental Health Services Act Full Service Partnership - \$7.5 million in MHSA and Federal match for the Department of Health Services to procure Full Service Partnership programming as a requirement in fulfilling permanent supportive housing commitments; School-Based Mental

It's a First Class Fourth Practice Fireworks Safety This Fourth of July Season

City of Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova, RCPD and Sacramento Metro Fire District encourage residents to be safe when using fireworks this Fourth of July season.

The unsafe use of fireworks can have devastating effects, including fire-related property damage and severe injuries. And, with news of the drought, the risk of fire is extremely high.

A "social host" ordinance has been in effect since June 2021. Now, you could face up to a year in county jail and up to a \$1,000 fine for illegal fireworks that are used at your property or gathering.

Keep your loved ones and community safe by following key safety tips and know how to report illegal fireworks use.

Fireworks 101: All legal fireworks in California are called Safe and Sane Fireworks and must bear the State Fire Marshal's seal; Safe and Sane Fireworks may be sold only at licensed and permitted businesses from noon on June 28, 2022 through 10 PM on July 4, 2022; In Rancho Cordova, use of fireworks is allowed only between noon on June 28, 2022 through 10 PM on July 4, 2022, and only between 8 AM and 10 PM daily during this period; Fireworks that explode or leave the ground are illegal in California; It is illegal for anyone under 18 years of age to use fireworks, and it is also illegal to sell, give or deliver fireworks to anyone under 18; It is illegal to point or throw a firework into a crowd or at people; Fireworks are not allowed in any public park.

Safety Tips: Always have a bucket of water nearby to dispose of fireworks and leave in the water overnight before disposing; Always have a hose connected to water available in case of fire; Do not use fireworks near dry grass or other flammable materials. Mow your lawn more frequently to reduce fire hazards; Do not use fireworks while under a canopy, covered balcony, covered patio or under a tree or bushes; Never attempt to relight or "fix" fireworks; Pets can become frightened by the loud sounds of fireworks. Keep your pets indoors, or if you take a pet with you, keep him or her leashed and under your direct control at all times; Leave the fireworks to the pros! 

Sacramento County to Launch First 'Safe Stay' Site

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Board of Supervisors approved Sacramento County's first proposed "Safe Stay Community" for persons experiencing homelessness. The new concept community will open at 8144 Florin Road, on the corner of Power Inn and Florin at the former site of a now razed grocery store. The site will house up to 100 Pallet sleeping cabins – both single and double occupancy, bathrooms, and communal gathering spaces. At any point in time, it can shelter up to 125 people.

The Board originally heard this item at its April 26 meeting but voted to delay the item six weeks to allow for more community outreach and engagement.

Safe stay communities are temporary shelter settings for unhoused community members. These communities are built as a safer and more sanitary environment and offer critical services oriented towards exiting to permanent housing. Each site will include 24/7 security, case management services, on-site power, sanitation and food services. The County will develop good neighbor policies for the operator and occupants.

"This is an important first step in implementing Safe Stay Communities throughout the County," said District 2 Supervisor, Patrick Kennedy. "This project will ensure people experiencing homelessness in the area will be put in a stable environment and are connected to services to help get their lives in order. We are fully committed to making this and other Safe Stay Communities a success for our neighborhoods, business districts and our homeless paidbhors."

The County is concurrently standing up Encampment Services Teams who will connect people living unsheltered into the communities and are already providing deeper connections to County behavioral health services. connection to benefits like CalFresh, CalWorks, Medi-Cal, etc., linkages to longer-term shelters, and flexible funding to help support individuals' transition into permanent housing. Ultimately, all sites should be considered as a stepping stone to stabilize and support individuals on a pathway to permanent housing.

this right, both in terms of ensuring the surrounding community feels listened to, and to best serve our unsheltered constituents," said First District Supervisor Phil Serna who represents the north side of Florin Road in the area where the Safe Stay campus is proposed. "It is absolutely incumbent that the 'Safe Stay' campus be a great neighbor to nearby residents, businesses, educational campuses, and places of worship.

"It is vital that we get

It's why that as the third vote to approve the county's first 'Safe Stay' site, I was insistent critical 'good neighbor' policy elements be adopted." said Supervisor Serna.

While homelessness can be successfully addressed by providing stable, affordable housing, combined with appropriate support services, this approach can take many years. Safe Stay Communities provide immediate safe and hygienic locations for persons experiencing homelessness to live and access services. The communities also provide a consistent location for service providers and outreach workers to engage on a more regular basis with occupants.

Additionally, some of the broader community benefits anticipated by having this safe space community include a reduction in trash and debris, the mitigation of environmental and health hazards, and the ability to restore land previously occupied by unsanctioned encampments to its intended use.

Work will begin on the site in the near future, including the assembly of the cabins, followed by additional infrastructure, such as electricity and sewer, through the summer/fall - we anticipate moving guests sometime in November if there are no delays. Former Shell Gas Station Manager Overwhelmed by Support

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On Monday, June 13, Rancho Cordova Shell gas station manager John Szczecina made national news when he accidentally set premium gas to sell for 69 cents a gallon and was subsequently fired for the loss of \$16,000 incurred to the business in a span of 3 hours.

Later that week, Szczecina's sister, Paula Jackson, tried to make things right by setting up a GoFundMe campaign after considering the possibility that not only could the mistake cause John his job, but also that he might be sued. "Please contribute," she wrote online, "even a few dollars per person could erase this huge deficit for

him which is a small deficit for all of US."

The business owners of the station located at Sunrise Boulevard and White Rock Road did not respond as to where the company stood on paying the amount back.

When donations over \$20,825 were raised for something most people took for an honest mistake, Szczecina became overwhelmed with so many sympathizing with his cause. "Wow, I am overwhelmed... I didn't think it would take off like a rocket like that," said Szczecina, "Thank you very much for helping me out."

As of June 20, the amount raised climbed to \$24,087 and donations to this fund are no longer accepted.

Health Program – \$4.3 million of Medi-Cal funding for the Department of Health Services to provide increased support to the school-based mental health program, with a planned site expansion to 40 sites; Child, Family and Adult Services – \$19.1 million to support Child Family and Adult Services' programs, including \$5.4 million to provide enhanced security services at the Centralized Placement Support Unit; Afghan Refugee Assistance

- \$3 million in Net County Cost for the Department of Human Assistance to provide services to support new Afghan arrivals in adjusting to their new environment.

During budget deliberations, the Board added additional items totaling \$2.6 million in appropriations, which included: \$1 million for additional scattered sites to house people experiencing homelessness; \$498,072 to provide a fourth staff position in District 12.4 and 5 . \$450,000

house people experiencing homelessness; \$498,072 to provide a fourth staff position in Districts 1,3,4 and 5; \$450,000 for improvements at McFarland Ranch, American River Ranch and Dillard Ranch; \$167,881 to provide a position supporting homeless issues in District 2; \$150,000 to Visit Sacramento for a total annual contribution of \$500,000; \$106,690 to provide additional staffing for the Clerk of the Board's Office;

\$100,000 to the Mack Road Partnership to purchase the South Sacramento Community Center property; \$75,000 to Splash for vernal pool education; \$25,000 for an additional \$5,000 in TOT District Funds for each District.

The Board also set aside \$5 million to fund the new American River Parkway Homeless Reserve.

"I'm grateful to my colleagues and staff for supporting my proposal to assist the American Parkway Foundation in their well-coordinated efforts to proactively assist those living in the Parkway so we can save the Parkway," said District One Supervisor Phil Serna.

The numbers on the Recommended Budget will change between now and September, when the County receives new information, including the impact of the State Budget and updated revenue totals. The Final Budget will come back to the Board of Supervisors in September for review and adoption.

"We know that Rancho Cordova is a


community that loves to give back. With Volunteer Central, finding volunteers and volunteer opportunities will be easier than ever," said Matt Buland, Community Engagement Assistant.

4th of July Reminder: Keep it Safe, Keep it Legal

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - With Independence Day coming up, please remember to know the risks of fireworks, only use legal fireworks and stay safe when using. If you see or suspect illegal firework usage, please report it! See reporting contact information below.

The County has teamed up with our cities, fire and law enforcement jurisdictions to educate our community members on how to celebrate safely, how to spot a safe and sane firework and how to report illegal fireworks usage. In addition, many jurisdictions are enforcing stricter penalties this year for illegal fireworks usage.

Sacramento County Board of Supervisors adopted a social host ordinance that levies fines, starting at \$1,000, against property owners that either use or allow use of illegal fireworks on their property, in addition to fines for use in places like the American River Parkway. Read more about the Social Host Ordinance.

Calls for service throughout the County increase dramatically on July 4, and emergency response resources are stretched extremely thin. During the holiday weekend, please use 9-1-1 for emergencies only – like an active fire or injury or immediate threat to persons or property. Each jurisdiction has provided an alternative method to report illegal fireworks sale and usage.

Together, we can ensure that Independence Day celebrations are fun,

safe and do not cause undue injury or fire in our communities.

Know the Risks

The unsafe use of fireworks can cause severe burns, amputations, blinding and even death; Damaging fires may occur when children use fireworks unsupervised by adults; Parents are responsible for any property damage or injuries caused by all fireworks.

Keep it Legal

All legal fireworks in California are called Safe and Sane Fireworks and must bear the State Fire Marshal's seal; Safe and Sane Fireworks may only be used and sold from noon June 28th through midnight on July 4th; Any firework that goes up in the air or explodes is illegal and dangerous.

Keep It Safe

Always have a bucket of water to dispose of fireworks and leave in the water overnight before disposing; Always have a hose connected to water available in case of fire; Do not use fireworks near dry grass or other flammable materials; Do not use fireworks while under a canopy, covered balcony, covered patio or under a tree or bushes



And Another Thing 'High Flight'

Virgin Galactic and SpaceX are two of the space craft which a couple of the today's billionaires have sent into space and back, with pretty wealthy civilians who pay \$200,000.00 or more to ride into space. They are able to see the earth with a beautiful view, and are weightless for a few minutes. I grew up with many other kids who used their imaginations. Back then, it was either only in your mind, or in a science fiction book or movie. We have now sent people to circle the moon, land on it, and then come back to earth. Now we've seen our thoughts from the past about going into space come true.

Apollo 11 was the spacecraft that first landed humans on the Moon. Commander Neil Armstrong and lunar module pilot Buzz Aldrin, both Americans, landed the Apollo Lunar Module Eagle on the Moon on July 20, 1969, at 20:17 UTC. It was almost unreal that something like that could happen. Landing a man on the moon in the 1960s was President John F. Kennedy's goal when he talked about what he believed our country could do.

The sanctity of human life, the quality of deserving respect for life and the world in which we live, all seemed to come out of what that young aviator was saying. To me, that is what is missing in so many young people of today. They seem to miss the importance of life and the world in which they live in today. Here is "High Flight,"

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


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Defendant Convicted of Kidnapping, Three Sexual Assaults

Sac County DA News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Manuel Sicario was convicted by a jury of kidnap for the purpose of rape, assault with the intent to commit rape, sexual battery, attempted sexual battery, annoying or molesting a child and indecent exposure.

The jury also found true allegations that Sicario kidnapped the victim; the victim was particularly vulnerable; Sicario's crimes were carried out with planning, sophistication, and professionalism; and Sicario engaged in a violent conduct that indicates a serious danger to society.

On August 10, 2019, the 15-year-old victim was at Sutter's Landing when Sicario walked up next to her and began to masturbate. As Sicario masturbated, he pulled the victim towards him. The victim was able to pull away from him and flee. She did not call the police. On August 18, 2019, the second victim was at Sutter's Landing when Sicario came near her and began to strip down to his underwear. The victim was so uncomfortable with Sicario's behavior that she took a video of him. When the victim turned her back on Sicario, he immediately jumped on her. Sicario straddled the victim and tried to grope her. The victim was able to throw Sicario off of her, run away and call 911. The third victim was jogging on the bike path at Sutter's Landing when she encountered Sicario standing on the bike path. When she tried to pass him, Sicario grabbed her, dragged her down the bike path and took her under the I-80 overpass. Sicario threw the victim to the ground exposed himself. He then held one of the victim's hands down as he pulled her clothes to expose her body. The victim tried to fight off Sicario during the entire attack. When Sicario covered the victim's mouth to prevent her from screaming, the victim bit his hand so hard that he let her go for a minute. The victim ran away screaming for help. Law enforcement took the second victim's video of Sicario and released it to the public, resulting in numerous tips. The tips included the first victim reporting that she was assaulted by the suspect as well. Sicario was located in Tulare County and arrested on August 28, 2019.

Sicario faces a maximum sentence of 32 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for July 6, 2022, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 10 before the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle.

Defendant Convicted of Charges Stemming from Domestic Violence Assault

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Michael Dwyer was convicted by a jury of kidnapping, kidnapping for carjacking, domestic violence, evading an officer with willful disregard, and making terrorist threats.

Dwyer and the victim were estranged. On July 15, 2016, the victim opened her garage door and Dwyer immediately rushed into the garage. Dwyer punched the victim in the head, took her phone, duct taped her mouth shut, and tied her hands with zip ties. He forced her back into her house and threatened to kill her, her children, and her parents. Dwyer then threw the victim in the trunk of her car and drove her to his residence. While tied up in the trunk, the victim pressed random buttons on her iWatch until she got a hold of someone who called 911. Officers were not able to find the victim since Dwyer had taken her to his residence. At the house, Dwyer forced the victim into his bathtub, tied her legs with zip ties, and water boarded her because he wanted her to

admit she was having an affair. He also showed her a curling iron and told her he would stick it inside of her and burn her. After begging Dwyer to loosen the ties on her hands, he cut the ties on her hands, but tied her to a chair. He then swallowed a cupful of pills. When Dwyer passed out, the victim was able to cut the zip ties off and get her phone before running out of the house. Officers saw the victim running down the street with no shoes and duct tape still around her neck. Before officers could get all the information from the victim, Dwyer pulled out of his garage in the victim's car and fled. Officers chased Dwyer who was speeding in excess of 100mph while running red lights and stop signs. The pursuit ended when Dwyer lost control of the victim's car. The Sacramento Police Department, Elk Grove Police Department and CHP all worked together to investigate this case.

Dwyer faces a maximum sentence of 18 years and 8 months to life in prison. Sentencing is set for July 6, 2022, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 20 before the Honorable Michael Sweet.

CHP Arrests Teen for Attempted Murder

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Highway Patrol (CHP) arrested a Sacramento teen on multiple felony charges stemming from the April 2022 shooting in a south Sacramento parking lot, which left a local man with serious injuries.

Since the April 22 incident,

CHP investigators worked to identify the suspected shooter and his accomplice. On Tuesday, June 7, officers from the CHP's South Sacramento Area office conducted an operation in which the alleged shooter, 16-year-old Joesuff Cochrun, was located and taken into custody without incident. He was booked into

Facility on multiple felony charges, including attempted murder, conspiracy to commit armed robbery, and robbery.

An arrest warrant has been issued for a second suspect wanted in the shooting that occurred in the parking lot of the Employment Development Department at 2901 50th St.

Larry Bernard Scott Jr., of Sacramento, is wanted on similar felony charges as the suspect in custody.

The involved vehicle, a gold 2000 Chevrolet Malibu, was located at a third residence in Sacramento and taken as evidence to be searched pursuant to a search warrant.

The incident remains under



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
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
