RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -

Assemblymembers Ken Cooley (Rancho Cordova), Kevin McCarty (Sacramento) and Jim Cooper (Elk Grove) announced their efforts to address public safety on the American River Parkway after the brutal slaying of 20-year-old Emma Roark. Local communities and neighboring families have been increasingly riled by the level of violence, dangerous debris and environmental destruction left by illegal campers on the American River Parkway. Sacramento area representatives have introduced AB 2633, which defines parklands with heightened risk of environmental degradation and damage due to the unique and valuable resources within it, such as the American River Parkway, as "special parklands." This bill authorizes the removal of illegal campsites

from these parks to prevent unnecessary environmental destruction and addresses public safety hazards.

In addition, they are proposing \$50 million in grant funding to go to counties and regional park districts to support efforts to protect the parkway. Goals of the grant program include 1) preventing fires by reducing the incidents of illegal campfires in regional parks, 2) reducing homelessness by providing services and housing options, and 3) protecting park visitors, wildlife and our natural resources.

"I live almost exactly one mile from this precious location. For decades, I have brought my own children and grandchildren here to experience and wonder at the world around them. Public safety and environmental protection are paramount to the value of this parkway," said Assemblyman Ken Cooley. Severe violence has been committed both against the transient population and by some of its members along the watershed lands oftentimes under the cover of dense vegetation, right alongside homes and trails frequented by vulnerable populations such as children, seniors and individuals travelling alone.

"I'm proud to author AB 2633, along with Assemblymember Ken Cooley, to preserve and protect our cherished American River Parkway," said Assemblymember Kevin McCarty, Sacramento. "Sadly, because of illegal camping, the American River Parkway isn't safe enough - resulting in locals thinking twice about visiting our jewel of Sacramento. We can humanely and aggressively address homelessness and ensure that our Parkway remains a regional treasure." With the climate crisis underway, wildfire has been an increasing threat to California. In the Sacramento region, the American River Parkway, Continued on page 12

Start a Neighborhood Engagement Group

City of Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - If you are interested in meeting your neighbors and strengthening your neighborhood, consider forming a neighborhood group with help and resources from the city.

The city's Community Engagement team works with residents to form neighborhood groups that bring a neighborhood's goals to fruition. No two neighborhoods are alike, which is why this program partners to meet the needs of each unique neighborhood. Some groups want to meet frequently, while others prefer to host events annually or semi-annually. Members of each group determine their goals and objectives, including how often they meet and what they want to accomplish.

Jim and Sue Garcia have lived in Rancho Cordova for over 40 years and learned about the It Takes a Lincoln Village (ITLV) neighborhood group when the annual ITLV Christmas Parade passed by their house. They have been members of the ITLV group for six years and have coordinated neighborhood walks, volunteered at the city's COVID-19 vaccine clinics and even judged a Halloween house-decorating contest for the Somerset Ranch neighborhood group. "Through this program, we have had access to resources, events and information we wouldn't have had otherwise," said Jim. "We love our community, and we love the support the city provides us with." To help support their efforts, many neighborhood groups also apply for Community Grants, which are funded by the city's **Community Enhancement** & Investment Fund. Any community group, organization, collection of neighbors, club or agency that is seeking funding to complete an activity or project that improves the quality of life in a Rancho Cordova neighborhood is eligible to apply for the program. "The city believes that when neighbors gather to build their community, the city should support these efforts to ensure a safe, inviting and livable community. The Community Grants program is a great way for a neighborhood group or any group of residents or neighbors to make their dreams come true in their neighborhood," said Lorianne Ulm, Community



SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento State's student-run online radio station KSSU celebrated 30 years of broadcasting to the campus community and beyond on April 8 in the University Union.

KSSU has served as a radio industry training ground and student sounding board since it launched on the airwaves in 1991. More than 3,000 Sac State students have worked at the station.

It now is heard via the internet from its studio on the first floor of the University Union. Each semester about 40 student volunteers, not all looking for broadcasting careers, learn a wide range of skills related to broadcasting, advertising, engineering, programming, journalism, and other fields.

"This is our audio sandbox," said KSSU advisor Aaron Wall, student

services coordinator for Associated Students Inc. "Students play music that they love and talk about lockdown, KSSU maintopics that interest them."

KSSU offers news, talk shows, music and interviews, sponsors campus events, and hosts podcast workshops. It has become a consistent Sac State presence, broadcasting remotely from a variety

of university and student events.

During the pandemic tained its connection with the campus community as DJs worked from makeshift studios at home.

Doctor to Run Canyons 100k Fundraiser for New Moms

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Local physician Dr. Timothy Phelan will run the Canyons 100k on April 23 to raise funds to expand health and nutrition programs for new moms at the Sacramento Life Center. Phelan practices at Creekside OB/ GYN of Folsom and has completed more than 50 competitive running events in the last 10 years, including road marathons and ultra-marathons. This is his fourth fundraiser for the Sacramento Life Center, raising more than \$30,000 total in his previous 100k, 50k and 40k runs. Phelan hopes to raise \$10,000 for the Sacramento Life Center during the Canyons 100k. To make a donation, visit SacLife.org. "For 50 years, the

Sacramento Life Center has offered a safe place for women to find the compassion and support they need to become a parent," Phelan said. "I am proud to support this wonderful organization and its mission. I hope our community members will donate however much they can."

Considered the birthplace of mountain ultra-trail running, the Canyons 100k is run over the most scenic and difficult sections of the Western States trail. The 100-kilometer (62.2 mile) route travels from downtown Auburn to the China Wall staging area campground, with more than 16,000 feet of ascent. Runners will experience panorama

vistas of the Sierras and cross streams and wooden bridges through historic settlements like Michigan Bluff and Deadwood Cemetery, traveling the same trails prospectors and mules did more than 150 years ago.

"Dr. Phelan is a tireless advocate for pregnant women and new moms, and we are so grateful that he chooses to support the Sacramento Life Center through his competitive races," said Marie Leatherby, executive director, Sacramento Life Center. "The pandemic and housing crisis have been especially rough on the moms we serve. Every donation will make an important difference for a local family."

Now in its 50th anniversary year, the Sacramento Life Center's mission is to offer compassion, support, resources and free medical care to women and couples facing an unplanned or unsupported pregnancy. The Sacramento Life Center's licensed Sac Valley Pregnancy Clinic includes a primary clinic and mobile clinic that provide all services for free, including pregnancy tests, STD tests, ultrasounds, pap smears, well woman exams, patient advocacy for men and women, education and resource referrals. In 2018, the Sacramento Life Center achieved accreditation by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care, which ensures the group has met nationally recognized standards for the provision of high-quality health care. The nonprofit also offers a 24-hour hotline and program for women who have experienced pregnancy loss. Korean Culture Celebrated with Dance and Drums

- High octane movement and rhythmic traditional drumming were highlights of a performance to celebrate Rancho Cordova Korean Culture Day, observed on stage at the Koreana Plaza International Market on March 19 with a capacity audience looking on. KP owner BJ Yu hosted the colorful spectacle.

Featuring a youthful allmale cast of traditional performers from Chung-Ang University, a private university in Seoul, South Korea, the performing group is on a tour of "K-Culture Public Diplomacy," sharing the rich and ancient heritage of one of America's strongest partners in Asia.

The hour-long performance was highlighted by the rhythms of various Korean drums. Drums play an important part in traditional Korean music, ranging from folk music to royal court music. There are a wide variety of shapes and sizes for use both in accompanying other instruments and in special drumming performances, such as showcased in the KP Market performance.

Dancers performed impressive leaps and kept time with the drumming while swirling ribbons attached to sticks and headpieces. Paul Cho, president of the Sacramento Valley Korean American Community, said the storyline celebrated natural components of nature, including wind and rain. The performance was attended by several South Korean dignitaries, including Kyungtae Kim, Consul,

representing the Consulate General of the Republic of Korea.

The performance was called "Yeo Eum," which means "Sharing Sound." The performance was created in 2020 and has been showcased throughout Korea and the world. The mission of the tour is to contribute to the popularization of Korean traditional culture by showcasing a variety of instruments, dances and costumes.

Rancho Cordova Vice Mayor Linda Budge presented a City Proclamation declaring March 19 as Korean Culture Day in the city. Councilmember Garrett Gatewood became part of the show by stepping in to perform a traditional revolving plate maneuver during which he sent a rotating plate flying through the air to be deftly caught at the end of a stick held by one of the performers.

The proclamation noted that Rancho Cordova is home to a large percentage of the Korean American owned businesses in the region, supporting Korean entrepreneurship and hosting international shopping and entertainment opportunities, such as the KP Market.

It also noted Rancho Cordova's participation in Korean cultural events such as the Annual Full Moon Festival, planting gifts of Mugungwa, a South Korean State Flower, on the grounds of City Hall, and the 2017 gift of books, periodicals and other media to the Rancho Cordova Library by the Korean Consulate in San Francisco. The gift was intended to provide education and cultural exchange in Rancho Cordova. *

The Mimosa House Opens

GOLD RIVER, CA (MPG) - Family-owned restaurant The Mimosa House has added Gold River to their previous five locations with a ribbon cutting on March 23. "I started as a dishwasher back at least 10 years ago, at the first one over in Folsom," said Devin Dedier, chief operations officer of the business. "Then after that, we did El Dorado Hills and Roseville, and then after that Rancho Cordova, East Sacramento, and now we're in Gold River." The family also owns Stick House, an Asian fusion restaurant in El Dorado Hills Town Center.

Every Sunday, Devin said, the family would go out to family brunch, and the five kids would always bug their father, Louis Dedier, to start a restaurant. "It's any kid's dream to come into a restaurant where you can eat all the food that you want," Devin said. "So we pestered him enough to where he was finally, 'Okay, I'll invest in a restaurant.""

The Mimosa House menu is very large, around seven pages of just breakfast

items. "We all fought over what items to put on the menu," Devin said. "We couldn't really decide on just a one-page menu, so we decided, 'Let's just do everything that we like.' From there it took on a life of its own." The restaurant started with just a few flavors of mimosas. "Then we fought over it again because all of us like different things," Devin said. "Now we have pretty close to 100 different Mimosa flavors."

Louis, the owner and CEO, said, "The idea behind the menu was, you could come here every week and never have the same item again all year." In addition to the large menu, they have a new special every week. "Special doesn't mean it's cheap, special doesn't mean it's discounted," Louis said. "Special means it's special." A breakfast sandwich they call the Mary Lou came from a woman in El Dorado Hills. "It did what she wanted, we put it on special, it sold at the beginning, so we named it after her. It's all community based."

The family was talking originally about expanding outside of the Sacramento area. "We're trying to find that fine line between expanding too much and keeping everything local, family friendly," Devin said. "We want it to feel like when you come into our restaurant you know us because we're neighbors. And we don't want to miss out on that feeling once we start expanding to other cities. That's probably why we kept everything so local because we're really trying to showcase that we really are local."

As time went on, it was the tradition of the kids of the family to work in the restaurants and decide for themselves if they would continue to be part of the restaurant industry. "My father still is owning, as CEO, and then my mother is senior vice president, my older sister is compliance officer, myself as operations officer, my little sister, she's going to be taking a little break because she's pregnant, she's going to be due in July, that's super exciting, and then my youngest sister is just now going to college at Folsom Lake College."

Louis has one brother and four sisters, his wife, Stephanie, has two sisters and two brothers. "We're a very large family in Sacramento."

Lancers Off to Great Start in League Play


RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Cordova High School varsity baseball team entered tournament play this week on a six-game winning streak following a sweep of Valley to begin Greater Sacramento League action.

Senior captain Matt Jernigan, who has signed a national letter of intent to play at Western Oregon, leads the Lancers in hits and RBI. He has gone 16-for-30 with 16 RBI and 10 runs scored. Other players with double digit hit totals are senior Ashton Ready and juniors Alfredo Cervantes IV, Joey Stark and Eli Campbell.


Jernigan has thrown a team-high 24.1 innings with a 2.01 ERA. The left-handed flamethrower has struck out 42 batters. Fellow seniors Justin Nelson and Troy Combs have logged 11.1 and 11 innings, respectively, while striking out more than a batter per inning.

The Lancers (7-4, 3-0 Greater Sacramento) beat Valley (2-6, 2-4) by a score of 16-0 Monday, April 4, 25-1 Tuesday and 17-5 Thursday to extend their overall win streak to six games as of April 10. If you're keeping score at home, the Lancers demolished the Vikings, outscoring them a combined 58-6 over three games.

In 2021, Cordova went 13-2 in league play to finish a game behind West Campus. Last year marked the first full season under head coach Scott


Ahlstrom. The third-year coach took over prior to the 2020 season that was halted after two games due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Prior to Ahlstrom taking over, the Lancers had just one winning season from 2015-2019. The team went 16-11 overall last spring.

As of press time, the results of Cordova's tournament games are unknown. However, the Lancers begun the tournament Monday with afternoon matchups against Grant (6-6, 3-3 Metropolitan) and Yuba City (9-9, 6-6 Capital Valley).

If you'd like to come watch Cordova compete in league play, the Lancers will host three games against Natomas (2-13-2, 1-5) on April 18, 19 and 21, each at 4 P.M. before a home doubleheader versus West Campus (3-1, 3-0) on April 23 at 11 A.M. ★

California's Gun Restrictions are a Failure side effects of Prohibition

Inevitably, last weekend's horrendous fusillade of bullets on a downtown Sacramento street that left six people dead and at least a dozen wounded generated demands for new gun controls in state that already has the nation's most restrictive firearms laws. However, if anything, what happened just two blocks from the state Capitol underscores the folly of believing that "gun violence" can be meaningfully reduced by trying to choke off the supply of firearms – any more than the prohibition of liquor or the war on drugs succeeded. The state's gun laws have hassled law-abiding hunters and gun hobbyists and some are in danger of being declared unconstitutional. However, Californians already own more than 20 million rifles, shotguns and handguns and are buying hundreds of thousands more each year. Nor have these laws prevented the lawless from obtaining weapons via theft, smuggling from other states or the illicit manufacture of untraceable "ghost guns." Indeed, state restrictions have made the black market even more lucrative, mirroring the


and the decades-long drug war.

Initial evidence indicates that those who fired more than 100 rounds in a street crowded with bar and nightclub patrons probably were violating one or more gun laws. The two brothers that police arrested and are suspected of involvement in the mass shooting were charged with illegal possession of weapons – one for possession of an illegal fully automatic firearm. So why, if California's much-vaunted gun control laws have failed to choke off the supply of legal and illegal weapons, do politicians continue to claim that enacting even more will have an effect? Some may believe it, the evidence notwithstanding, while others want to appear to be doing something about a problem because they don't have any other answers. And those who propose and enact new gun laws are often woefully ignorant about guns or even existing laws. In the aftermath of the shooting, Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg lamented to a radio interviewer about California's difficulty in reducing the number of guns, saying, "You just have to go to a gun show in Reno to buy an assault weapon without a background check and come right back to California." Advocates of more laws often cite a "gun show loophole" but it's a myth. Under federal law, one must be a resident of Nevada and undergo a federal background check to legally buy a gun in Reno.

Moreover, while California professes to have banned "assault weapons," the state's definition of them involves cosmetic features, rather than their lethality. Perfectly legal semi-automatic rifles that lack those features are available for sale everywhere in the state.

The newest effort at gun control in California, backed by Gov. Gavin Newsom, would authorize personal lawsuits against the manufacturers and sellers of illegal assault rifles or ghost guns, mirroring a new Texas law allowing suits against those who perform abortions. The legislation, Senate Bill 1327, is just a stunt - one of Newsom's periodic jabs at a rival state. Those who could be sued under the bill are already committing criminal acts in California and a federal law prohibits suits against manufacturers of legal firearms, including the "assault weapons" that California and a few other states purport - but fail - to outlaw. The bottom line is this: Actor Alec Baldwin's claims notwithstanding, guns don't fire on their own. Someone must accidentally or purposely pull the trigger and that should be the focus of efforts to reduce violence - such as more vigorous enforcement of laws banning gun possession by felons and those under court order. 

In one survey by Forbes. com, several successful entrepreneurs were asked how many hours per week they worked. Not one said less than 50, and the majority put in closer to 70 or 80 hours a week. While the latter may not be feasible if you're already working a full-time job, the idea is the same. 



technical education program at Mills Middle School, initiated Lego wall art for students in her classes who wanted to participate. cat pavilion. Smith will give a Spotlight Artist talk on Thursday, April 21, at 6 p.m.



which is an urban parkway nestled alongside multiple communities, teeming with wildlife, presents heightened risks and hazards

Specifically, illegal campfires have caused wildfires that have destroyed hundreds of acres of regional parklands. In recent years, The American River Parkway has seen incidents of illegal fires, camping, and dumping skyrocket- threatening the parkway's beauty, sustainability, and the safety of visitors, adjacent communities, schools and businesses. The Sacramento Bee reported that by June 2021, 60+ illegal fires scorched more than 130 acres of this treasured parkway, including newly restored habitat.

Including, last year, after countless hours and thousands of dollars in grants and donations for the restoration of an

imperiled turtle habitat, the newly restored habitat burned to ashes. More importantly, strong winds can push campfires through encampments with dense vegetation and fuel, and into adjacent neighborhoods, leaving little time for both campers and residents to flee.

Without intervention and protection, California's outdoor spaces that serve multiple specialized environmental, public safety and recreational functions, will continue to be at risk of degradation and damage. Protecting the American River Parkway from illegal fires and providing those suffering from homelessness with services and healthier housing options, will ensure its preservation and lead to healthier and safer communities throughout the greater Sacramento area. The proposed \$50 million in grant funding will support all of these goals.
