Grand Jury Finds Board of Supervisors Ignored Health Officer During Covid Crisis

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - An extensive investigation into the handling of the COVID-19 crisis by the Sacramento County Office of Public Health (OPH) has led the Grand Jury to find that the County Board of Supervisors ignored its Public Health Officer for five months before finally engaging in any sort of dialogue regarding the County's COVID-19 activities and its impact on County residents.

The Grand Jury's report states that when the pandemic hit Sacramento County, the OPH responded immediately. However, despite asking for assistance early on, Public Health Officer Dr. Olivia Kasirye was allowed to appear before the County Supervisors only after Board members received a confidential email from Dr. Kasirye. That communication detailed the range of the OPH pandemic response efforts and the enormous burden being borne by staff and volunteers committed to protect the community.

The exemplary level of service and commitment exhibited by Dr. Kasirye and OPH staff and volunteers made the critical difference in the County's rapid and effective COVID-19 response, the Grand Jury investigation found. In stark contrast, the Board's apathy during the most significant public health emergency in over a century, one that impacted every resident of Sacramento County, delayed needed OPH program funding and undercut public health order enforcement. Under such emergency circumstances, OPH response efforts and funding instead should have been the Board's first priority.

In the face of an overwhelming public health emergency, Dr. Kasirye and OPH staff were well prepared to carry out COVID-19 pandemic response activities, according to the Grand Jury's findings. OPH utilized its dedicated staff, along with a volunteer corps of professionals, issuing and enforcing COVID-19 public health orders in coordination with its state and federal counterparts. Connecting Communities with Infrastructure

- In his address at the April Rancho Cordova Luncheon at City Hall, public works director Albert Stricker said, "It's important to us to connect our communities ... We have a vibrant and growing city, we have 26 miles of trails that connect our entire community, and we have a community that's all driving toward the same goal of making Rancho Cordova an amazing place."

Addressing first the infrastructure work already done, Stricker spoke of the over \$100 million the City has invested in rehabilitating local roads and sidewalks citywide. International Drive has

been connected to Sunrise Boulevard, one of the most highly traveled arterials in the entire region. And in five different phases in 17 years Folsom Boulevard

has been converted from the wide expanse of asphalt it was into much more. "The median added beautiful landscape and it also separated traffic, which is

a major safety improvement," Stricker said. "We added bicycle lanes, we added new signals through the corridor ... A really

Next Hornets Coach Introduced

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Journeyman coach David Patrick was introduced as the new Sacramento State men's basketball coach on Tuesday afternoon, April 15, at the Hornet Athletic Center.

Patrick is the 15th head coach in program history. He most recently served as the associate head coach for the men's basketball team at the University of Oklahoma last season.

"It's a dream come true for me," Patrick said Tuesday at his introductory press conference. "(My family and I) have always wanted to come back to California in the right situation. I was in a good spot at Oklahoma (and) had no reason to leave unless it was for a great opportunity. When you see Sac State after being in NorCal for a long time, I just thought it was somewhere that was untouched, somewhere that could really blossom."

Patrick takes over for interim coach Brandon Laird, who stepped in for Brian Katz after he retired days before last season began following 13 seasons due to a health issue. The Hornets won five of their last seven games to end the season and had 11 total wins, the most wins for any first-year Sac State head coach in the Division I era. Laird spent 11 years with the Hornets program.

According to a report from The State Hornet, the student news organization at Sac State, Laird and Katz were unhappy with the mishandling of the coaching staff's departure by the Sac State Athletics Department.

Sac State Athletic Director Mark Orr has known Patrick for years, dating back to their days together at Saint Mary's College. Patrick served as an associate head coach for the men's basketball team from 2006-2010 while Orr was Director of Athletics and Recreation.

"The previous staff left great character here, that's where it starts at," Patrick said. "The talent is one thing but high character kids is what you want to be around. I can get the players, that's not the hard part. It's the character, it's guys that wanna win and guys that wanna win at a high level. And we'll do that here, I promise you that."

"We're going to recruit from the inside out. We'll recruit here locally and then build out from nationally and internationally."

It didn't take long for Patrick to get started

recruiting from the NCAA transfer portal.

On Monday, April 14 he signed 6-foot-9 Australian forward Hunter Marks, a three-year starter who is transferring from Hartford. Several college basketball reporters were surprised Marks signed with the Hornets rather than a high-major school, indicating that the new Sac State coach got a steal of a prospect. Four days later Patrick reunited with Callum McRae, a 7-foot-1 Kiwi center who is transferring from UC Riverside.

Patrick brings many years of college coaching experience at several different stops with him to Sacramento. Since 2006 when Patrick retired from his playing career overseas, he has been an assistant coach at six collegiate programs.

In 2018, he got his first head coaching job at UC Riverside, where he spent two seasons. Patrick made an impact in his short stint with the Highlanders, as he currently holds the best two-year start in school history with a 27-38 (.415) record. In his second season at UCR, he led the team to a 17-15 record, which is the most wins in the program's Division I era.

"This isn't a steppingstone job for me," Patrick said. "I've got two girls that are (in)

tenth grade and sixth grade, we're not trying to jump spots. If you look at my resume, I've kind of moved a little bit the last year or two but that's not what we're about. We're about staying somewhere and staying here to make it last."

With his experience, Patrick has brought in some great players over the years. He has recruited 19 players who have gone on to play professionally with 11 of them playing in the NBA. Seven of those players were selected in the NBA Draft and four were first round picks.

In 2016 while Patrick was at LSU, his godson Ben Simmons was selected with the first overall pick in the draft by the Philadelphia 76ers. Simmons has gone on to become the 2018 Rookie of the Year, a three-time All-Star and has been selected to the All-Defensive First Team twice during four seasons in the league.

"I am so excited for coach Patrick to take on the role as head coach at Sacramento State," Simmons said in a Sac State news release. "He is one of the most underrated coaches and recruiters in the country. When I went through the recruiting process, there was never a doubt that I wanted to be coached by him. He is more than a coach,

he is family. He cares deeply about his players, not only as it relates to basketball, but also life."

Other current NBA players that Patrick has coached include Desmond Bane of the Memphis Grizzlies, Moses Moody of the Golden State Warriors and Patty Mills of the Brooklyn Nets. The 46-year-old Patrick has coached on five NCAA Tournament teams, four NIT teams and was an assistant coach on the Australian men's national basketball team that won bronze at the 2020 Summer Olympics.

"I think if you win in the classroom, you win on the floor," Patrick said. "This degree will help you longer in life because the ball is going to stop bouncing at some point. And this is a lifelong deal with me. I want to be at their weddings, when they have children, this is about a life term relationship, not just the four years that I'm going to be with these student-athletes."

Patrick said that he is going to rely on his older players and prioritize playing defense and rebounding.

"Everybody wants to shoot and play offense," Patrick said. "But they'll tell you the first day of practice every morning we're starting with bricks and getting after it. I promise you we'll be one of the best defensive and rebounding teams not only in the Big Sky (Conference) but in the country, I guarantee that."

The new Sac State men's basketball coach addressed the size of the Nest at his introductory press conference. The 1,012 seat multi-purpose gymnasium that the Hornets play in is one the oldest and smallest venues in all of NCAA Division I college basketball.

"The gym doesn't matter, it's the people," Patrick said. "If you're going somewhere for just the gym, you ain't going for the right reasons. (If we) get a real trust and relationship with these student-athletes, it doesn't matter where they play at."

Patrick will now attempt to do something that no Sac State basketball team, men's or women's, has ever done: Win a Big Sky Conference Championship and advance to the NCAA Tournament.

"People say, 'Why Sac State? Why would you take (the) Sac State (head coaching position)? You're at a Power Five job.' But I see this place being somewhere you can compete for Big Sky Championships yearly," Patrick said. "I promise you we'll win a lot of games here over at Sac State." ★

Female Nonprofit Leaders Making this a Better World

City of Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Women in the nonprofit sector are on a daily mission to create an even better Rancho Cordova.

No one brings more joy to Rancho Cordova than Shelly Blanchard, whose official title is Executive Director of the Cordova Community Council but who should also be known as the Queen of Fun. For those of you who don't know Shelly, she is the force behind Kids Day, iFest, 4th of July, Summer Concert Series, Movies in the Park, the Christmas Tree Lighting and much more. Recently, we had an opportunity to sit down with Shelly and realized that, for the most part, women are now the forces behind most of the nonprofits in the city. Shelly talks about the history of nonprofits in Rancho Cordova, her greatest challenges and inspirations, and what advice she'd like to pass on to the next generation of female leaders.

one. But one bit of wisdom from the great humanitarian Mother Teresa has always stuck with me and that is this: "If you can't feed a hundred people, then just feed one."

That really sums up how I feel about community service—that everyone can do something—and should. It all matters.

Q: What would you say to young women who aspire to lead nonprofits? What is your advice to them?

A: If you have a passion, find other people who share it and change your corner of the world. "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world. Indeed, it is the only thing that ever has." The famous anthropologist Margaret Mead said that, and I believe it to be true.

Q: When did you begin as the Executive Director of the Cordova Community Council, and what did nonprofit leadership look like at that time?

A: I began at the Cordova Community Council in 2007, which was my first foray into the nonprofit world. I was not alone as a female nonprofit leader. Nonprofits have always been a place to find dedicated women. So many nonprofits have roots in social movements, or community needs, and I think a lot of women leaders probably started out just like me – a volunteer wanting to work with others who want to make something better.

Nonprofits are usually mission-driven and are inspiring and empowering places to work. Women have been leading smaller nonprofits for a long time. The big difference is that today, women are leading nonprofits in what used to be "male only" territory, like Little League and Rotary Club, and they have turned a lot of small nonprofits into powerhouses.

Q: When did you begin to notice a shift to more females in nonprofit leadership roles in Rancho Cordova, and what are those organizations?

A: The shift in leadership of nonprofits has actually been studied. What was discovered is that in nonprofits, women get a lot of opportunities to watch other women lead, which encourages women to seek more responsibility. Nonprofits

are great networking operations because they need to collaborate to survive, or they are formed for the purpose of collaborating. I saw one study that said 57 percent of women in nonprofits aspire to hold leadership roles compared to 37 percent of women working for companies. That's probably because for a lot of us it is more satisfying to improve the lives of children, for example, than make more money for a company that makes widgets.

In Rancho Cordova, the nonprofit scene is dominated by women leaders. While there are really outstanding men leading nonprofits here, women nonprofit leaders are the norm, even in organizations with long histories of focusing on men or fields once considered the realm of men.

A local example would be the all-female executive team of Darcy Brewer and Angela Terry at the California Capital Airshow. Airshows were once the domain of retired Air Force veterans and pilots, but not so here. Rotary Club and Kiwanis Club did not even admit women to membership until the late 1980s, but both clubs here in Rancho Cordova have women leaders (Tracey McGlinn and Nora Stroke). Rancho Cordova Little League is led by a woman (Cassie Reyes), as are the Sacramento Children's Museum (Sharon Stone-Smith), the Rancho Cordova River City Concert Band (Melanie Freer), Symphony d'Oro (Lorraine Crozier), Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce

(Diann Rogers), Rancho Cordova Food Locker (Carrie Johnson), Rancho Cordova Arts (Lydia Bredin), and Whisker Warriors (Theresa Kolvenbach). Many more successful nonprofits have women as organization presidents or executive officers.

Q: Why do you think this trend to nonprofit women leaders is occurring, and how do you think it's changing the face of nonprofits?

A: I think it's just a great time to be a woman because no matter where you look, women are a force to be reckoned with, and nonprofits are no exception. Women are the leaders of more than half of small nonprofits in the country. There is a way to go for the larger nonprofits, but there is certainly no turning back the clock on this one--women are here to stay.

Q: What has been your greatest challenge as the Executive Director of the Cordova Community Council? And what has been your greatest joy?

A: Like most nonprofit leaders, I am mission-driven, so meeting our goal of "making Rancho Cordova the envy of the region" is the greatest challenge. Having days when we are is my greatest joy!

Q: What woman has inspired you the most and in what way?

A: There have been so many inspiring women over time, so it is hard to pick just

important part of this project was to provide sidewalk and all of the amenities that I just mentioned, from Sunrise Boulevard all the way down to Bradshaw.”

Other work includes the Mather Heritage Trail; the plaza at Chase and Coloma giving students room to stand until they can safely cross the road; the partnership with local community members and the Sacramento Tree Foundation resulting in 3,000 trees planted to date, with 20,000 more planned; the investment in Cordova Recreation and Park District to improve their pool. “We work hard every day to keep our City beautiful,” Stricker said. “I would contend that Rancho Cordova is one of the cleanest, if not the cleanest and most beautiful City in this entire region.”

There is a lot in the works that “we can get excited about,” Stricker said. In collaboration with Center of Praise Ministries, the Rancho Cordova Youth Center is to open later this summer. Road and sidewalk rehabilitation continues. Design phase is open for a new bridge crossing for bicycles and pedestrians adjacent to Zinfandel, over Freeway 50. Planning for the future Civic Center continues. The south side of Sunrise leading to where it connects to Jackson Road is in the design process to be augmented from a 2-lane to 4-lane road with median and intersection improvement.

In the bigger and most visionary projects, Stricker said, there will be a new interchange mid-way between Sunrise Boulevard and Hazel Avenue that will provide parallel capacity to Sunrise, helping to relieve traffic and provide access to new residential property, commercial retail,

and industrial property. “Pending finding those construction dollars,” Stricker said, “we expect to complete this project within the next decade.”

White Rock Road east of Costco has a mile long section that is temporarily closed, to be replaced with a 4-lane road with a median and bicycle and pedestrian improvements. “Why are we doing this right now?” Stricker asked. “One of the immediate reasons is ... Elliott Homes brand new subdivision in Rio del Oro, the beginning of their first 440-unit subdivision ... model homes are expected to be completed and open in mid May.” Stricker said White Rock Road is expected to be open to through traffic by the end of June or early July.

Stricker started working for the City in 2005, under Cyrus Abhar who was then the public works director. When Abhar moved to the city manager position, Stricker took on the public works director role. “I’ve enjoyed working for Cyrus Abhar,” Stricker said, “one of the finest leaders and a great mentor of mine.” Stricker has a bachelor’s degree in groundwater hydrology, and a master’s degree in geotechnical, earthquake and civil engineering.

In conclusion, Stricker said, “The City over these 19 years so far has invested in over \$250 million in infrastructure to support economic development, to bring communities together, to improve the quality of life in Rancho Cordova while we’re addressing our deferred maintenance ... It’s really about the people that I get to work with, too. Our public works team, we’re proudly behind the scenes every single day ... they’re the ones that are really making this happen.” ★

enforcement efforts aimed at protection were stymied by lack of cooperation from local County law enforcement agencies.

“The Grand Jury is dumbfounded that the County Board of Supervisors seemed completely disconnected from the Office of Public Health

in the midst of the crisis our community faced,” states Jury Foreperson Deanna Hanson, “And, it is simply irresponsible to think that Sacramento will never face another situation that needs immediate attention.”

With an eye toward the future, the Grand Jury recommends that the County Board of Supervisors, the

County Executive and the County Office of Public Health jointly develop a public health emergency response plan, designed to recognize and meet the immediate requirements of OPH to implement future public health orders and best ensure the safety of Sacramento County residents. ★

Dare to Live Without Limits

Enthusiasm



Among the many choices you have is the degree of enthusiasm you inject into your life. At one end of the spectrum are those who drag themselves through each day as if it were a prison sentence. When you greet this type of person and ask how they are doing, a likely response is, "I'm alive." At the other end of the scale are those who reply, "Great."

Your level of enthusiasm is much more important than you might realize. Is enthusiasm a cause or a result? Is a person enthusiastic when and because circumstances are good or do circumstances become good as a result of one's enthusiasm? Too often, people believe enthusiasm is a result. Actually, enthusiasm is much more often a cause.

Good things can and do happen without your influence. But if you are only enthusiastic in response to these chance occurrences, then you are cheating yourself by not harnessing the power of enthusiasm to improve life. Enthusiasm will never do any harm but it will do a lot of good. Enthusiasm generates a force that will impact everything you do.

One of the hardest things to do is be enthusiastic when a situation is not ideal. When you are disappointed by life's twists, turns, and, surprises it's easy to feel dejected. How can you summon up enthusiasm when there is seemingly no reason to feel enthusiastic?

How we feel has much

more of an impact on what happens to us than we realize. The key to changing any habit is consistent practice and repetition. Enthusiasm isn't guaranteed to improve every situation so you can't just try it once and then dismiss its effect if you don't get instant results.

In your interpersonal communications, enthusiasm influences your perceived credibility. If you attempt to convey thoughts and ideas with a lackluster delivery, few people will be moved. But someone whose enthusiasm is bubbling over has an extraordinary impact on others. If you have any doubts, think about the type of people who make the biggest impression on you.

Suppose you are looking for a new job. You have had several interviews with no job offers. Now you're on your way to yet another interview. As much as you would like to secure this job, your hopes are not high. With a low level of enthusiasm, you sit down for the interview. There's no smile on your face and you have a troubled expression on your face.

What kind of impression will you make on the interviewer? Granted, your past interview results weren't that exciting, but what are your chances for this job if you are devoid of enthusiasm?

Put yourself in the shoes of the interviewer. Your company wants to hire the best possible person for the position. You have to make a decision between

two candidates. The one who is a little more qualified, showed no spark, enthusiasm, or drive. The other applicant could barely sit still. His desire for the job and intent to excel was unmistakable. Who would you hire?

The interviewer doesn't care why one person was enthusiastic and the other wasn't. The significant factor is that an enthusiastic worker typically is more reliable, is more conscientious, and interacts better with coworkers. This is a perfect example of enthusiasm being a cause rather than a result.

To summon enthusiasm, visualize how you would feel if your life were perfect. Before you walk in for a job interview, imagine how you would feel if you were offered the job. Then maintain that same feeling and excitement during the interview.

Act enthusiastic to feel enthusiastic. Think about how you come across to others. Is there a sparkle in your eye, excitement in your voice, and a nice smile and pleasant look on your face? The more enthusiastic you are, the more life will go in your favor.

COVID-T Variant Looks Deadly to California Freedom

A dangerous strain of COVID is ripping through the California legislature. This new variant, COVID-T, for Totalitarian, threatens to sacrifice every, last, tiny shred of medical freedom in California on the altar of utopian "safetyism" and make the California U-Haul shortages of the past seem like quaint memories.

COVID is no longer a crisis. This is good news! Nearly 75-percent of eligible Californians are fully vaccinated, a number that doesn't include those partially vaccinated or who have natural immunity acquired through infection. Deaths are, mercifully, at a trickle. We should be celebrating the manageable threat that now confronts us.

But the COVID-T proves that the panic and fear that characterized the early, unchecked era of the pandemic are still surging in the legislature.

Even as the futility of masking and shutdowns become evident in reflection, California legislators have introduced a number of hyper-controlling, uber-safety bills aimed at forcing left-wing vaccine orthodoxy onto everyone.

- Here's a sampling:
- Assembly Bill (AB) 1993 (Wicks)** - Employers must get proof of vaccine before hiring a new employee or face a fine;
- AB 1797 (Weber)** - Creates a vaccine registry, which could be used

to deny services to the unvaccinated;

- Senate Bill (SB) 866 (Wiener)** - Lets 12-year-old children consent to vaccines even against the wishes of their parents;
- SB 871 (Pan)** - Lets schools ban students who are not COVID vaccinated;
- AB 2098 (Low)** - Disciplines doctors for spreading COVID "misinformation." Think of all the official announcements and guidance that have since proven wrong! This is an astonishing assault on free speech.
- SB 1464 (Pan)** - Mandates Sheriffs enforce state vaccine orders and withholds state funds from counties that don't enforce.

There are others. These bills aim to deny livelihoods, education, and shut down debate surrounding COVID treatment and policy. Here's hoping they don't try to cut off banking and travel to the unvaccinated but this collection of bills shows an unlimited appetite for punishing people into compliance.

I'm sure the bills' authors would scream "I follow the science!" The problem is, science isn't policy. It is an input to policy. Policies are an expression of values, not equations. I'm sure science would show that high-speed impacts are deadlier than low-speed impacts, but that doesn't tell us the speed limit.

Like COVID, car accidents are "transmissible" to other people. But, even with "the science" and the risk to others, we don't have turtle crawls on our highways. Why? Because all policies involve tradeoffs and there are competing values in the world. Freedom and choice, to name just two, are often ignored in Sacramento but they should be balanced against other needs and desires in crafting laws and regulations.

This is a point lost on legislators who want to cut off the world to those who don't line up for the vaccine, even if they have natural immunity to COVID from prior infection. The 100% safety COVID Puritans who imagine zero-COVID fueled by unquestioning obedience forget the experiences of the past two years. They forget the millions of closed businesses, the lonely elderly who died without the comfort of their families, or the masked and isolated children whose educations and mental health were sacrificed to zero COVID.

A legislature that facilitates heroin use and lets mentally ill homeless terrorize innocents on the streets seems a little selective in the dangers they want to police. COVID has been granted its own risk category, superior to all others. It makes no sense.

California is turning into the least hospitable place to live in the country. People are fleeing this state in such numbers that U-Haul actually ran out of trucks to service the exodus earlier this year. But that outmigration will be tiny compared to the people flocking to freer states to avoid the life-controlling COVID-T.

You should control your medical decisions, not legislators who might be wearing masks alone in their cars but not at sporting events or restaurants. Don't ever let them take your freedom.

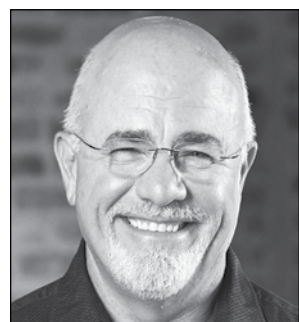

CA Dream Fund to Award Microgrants to Small Businesses

Nielsen Factors 'Early Release Policy' in K Street Shootings

"Gun control is not the answer. Getting guns out of the hands of the people prohibited from having them and keeping violent felons in prison should be the focus." ★

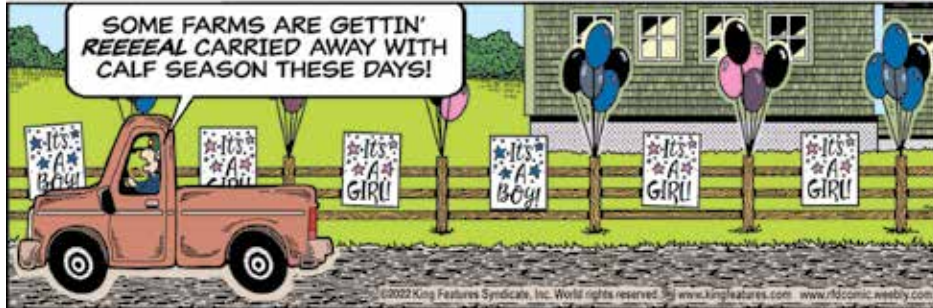

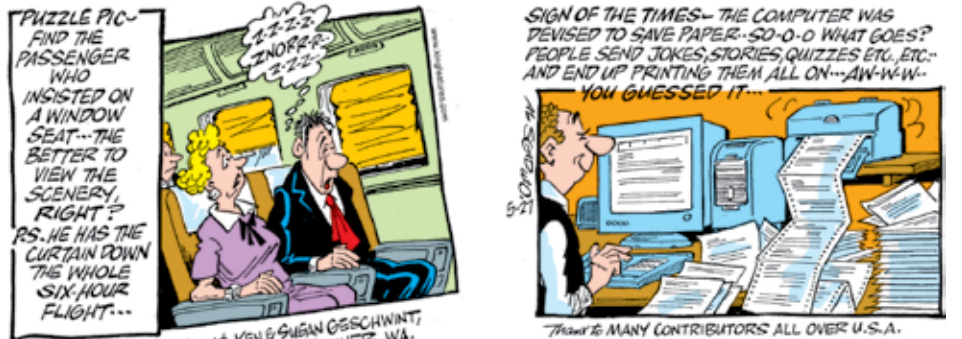

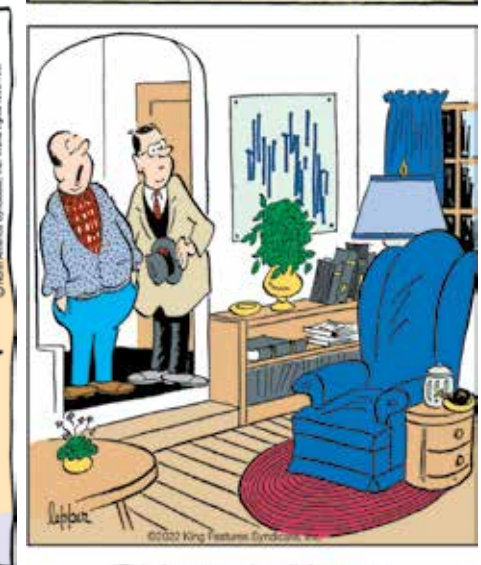

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - "No one has ever drowned in sweat," said Cordova varsity tennis coach Jeff Pieczynski who goes by "Coach Pie."

This inspirational quote has followed him around for many, many years while he was first learning the game of tennis. Coach Pie is in his seventh year as the tennis coach for the boy's and girl's teams at Cordova High. Before Cordova High, coach Pie was a tennis teaching professional for 13+ years.

He has also studied tennis instruction for two years, taught in Europe for one and a half years, taught in the Midwest for a few years, was the junior coordinator at Johnson Ranch Racquet Club in Roseville for 4 years and was head tennis professional at the Del Norte Club in Sacramento for 4+ years. So as you can see,

Unless your community has an active tennis club that helps promote the sport

to the younger generation, most kids grow up without ever even touching a tennis racquet. This seems to be the dilemma with a lot of high schools in the region including Cordova.

This is the challenge that coach Pie faces season after season. Most of the kids trying out for the team are beginners. So, when new kids show up for the tennis team that have had the opportunity of playing the sport against a parent or relative that has played the game for years, his eyes light up with enthusiasm.

Such is the case of key players freshman Alie Rohrer (girls singles no. 1), sophomore Delia Shcherbanyuk girls singles no. 2) and junior Sean Trinh (boys singles no. 1). It has been proven that good players will make your beginning players better. This in turn will make your entire team better and be the catalyst of a successful season.
