Let the Games Begin

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - In what took nearly a decade to come to fruition following several delays, the Mills Middle School Softball Complex officially opened to the public Saturday morning in Rancho Cordova.

The complex technically opened in May 2021, but the formal grand opening celebration was postponed due to the coronavirus pandemic. In fact, the complex was set to open in March 2020 until COVID-19 shut down sports and life as we know it around the world.

Saturday was not only the grand opening of the new complex, but also Opening Day for the 57th season of Cordova Girls Softball.

Back in 2012, the Folsom Cordova Unified School District (FCUSD) introduced Measure P, a facilities improvement bond that passed with 71.48% of the vote. The bond allocated \$68 million in funding for the FCUSD. One of the many upgrades planned for with the new funding was a complete redesign of the girl's softball fields at Mills.

Among the hundreds of young

Biden Plans to Accept Ukrainian Refugees

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On Monday, March 14th, 2022, the State Assembly sent a bipartisan letter to President Biden urging swift actions to adopt policies to welcome displaced Ukrainians. This letter emphasized the urgency of the matter and recommended the use of humanitarian parole as a mechanism to quickly allow refugees to seek asylum in the United States. The letter, spearheaded by Assemblymembers Cooley, Gallagher, and Kalra, was signed by 67 Assemblymembers from both sides of the aisle.

On March 24, 2022, President Biden announced that the United States would be accepting 100,000 refugees from Ukraine utilizing a number of legal pathways, one such pathway being humanitarian parole. This news is momentous for the many Ukrainians and Ukrainian-American's in the Sacramento region. Vlad Skots, President of the local non-profit Ukrainian American House, has been engaging with California leaders to inform them of the humanitarian crisis being faced by Ukrainian people abroad and at home. This partnership between the Ukrainian-American community and the California Legislature was instrumental in the organization of the letter to the President. Assemblyman Cooley takes pride in the leadership California and its people demonstrated in urging this critical step forward.

Assemblyman Cooley remarks, "Ukraine's national anthem opens with the phrase, 'The Dignity and Freedom of Ukraine has not yet Perished.' With the entire world watching, we are awe-struck to see how a free people fight for their dignity, for their freedom, and to keep their unperishable national identity. We support the fullest possible U.S. partnerships in support of this courageous and determined people."

Assemblyman Ken Cooley represents the 8th Assembly District which includes the communities of Arden-Arcade, Carmichael, Citrus Heights, Rancho Cordova, Rancho Murieta, Rosemont, Wilton and other portions of unincorporated Sacramento County. Get to Know Heart Craft Studio

City of Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova is home to over 3,500 businesses that employ a workforce of 65,000+, making us one of the largest employment centers in the Greater Sacramento region. Women have started creative businesses in our city, from breweries with a passion for making beer to bakeries that make your tastebuds smile. As we celebrate Women's History Month in March, meet one of these business owners, Danielle Vinson of Heart Craft Studio.

Danielle's road to opening Heart Craft Studio in Rancho Cordova was a winding road. Her first business, Rugged Lotus, started in Los Angeles as an idea to merge her loves of hiking and yoga, and evolved into a pop-up e-commerce boutique with her own handmade healing gemstone jewelry and yoga lifestyle gear. A marriage, two sons, and seven moves all led her to focus on her passion for art.

Danielle's journey in Rancho Cordova started in 2017 when her family moved to the Anatolia Neighborhood. Shortly after the move, Danielle's youngest son was diagnosed with Autism, and she focused on getting her son the support he needed. Her older son also started Kindergarten at Sunrise Elementary School.

Danielle volunteered as an art teacher at the school doing monthly art programs. She became known as the neighborhood art mom and received requests from others to do art classes. Due to the demand, Danielle launched Rugged Lotus art classes at local businesses and parties, which was going well until the COVID-19 pandemic hit. The silver lining was it gave Danielle time to explore what she always wanted to do, open a brick-and-mortar community space.

"Anatolia Village is truly a village. It almost seems like a fantasy until you experience it. My family has never had that sense of community," said Danielle. "It was important to me to open my business on the Anatolia side of Highway 50 so I could offer something for our community specifically. I also wanted to be close enough to the surrounding area that people could come from all over."

Then in December 2020, Danielle's dad passed away from a heart attack, and she was paralyzed with grief. Danielle couldn't think of moving forward with her business, after all the wisdom he'd provided her as a father and an entrepreneur, and she decided to revisit it in the summer. However, she started business entrepreneurship, drawing, internet marketing, and other classes at Folsom Lake College to build more of a foundation.

One day in spring 2021, Danielle was driving on Sunrise Boulevard when she saw a For Lease sign. She knew the business that had been there prior, had been looking at the space next door, and saw it was perfect. After going back and forth not sure if she was ready, Danielle followed her heart and got the keys in September.

Heart Craft Studio was born as a place for creative exploration. Danielle and her team of instructors teach

different classes, from painting to fiber art to cookie decorating, and they hold community events. The business name comes from the term heart chakra in yoga with a focus on the heart center. If you look closely at the inside of the heart-shaped logo, it's Danielle's rendering of her dad's fingerprint.

"Art has gotten me through a lot of my own life hurdles. I want to be able to offer that much-needed break to tune out the rest of what's going on and reset," said Danielle. "My son told me recently that I was in the business of celebrating. It's a gift, especially now more than ever, to share in these moments of joy and happiness. I feel so blessed and grateful."

Danielle has created the space to be inclusive so differently-abled people feel at home, like her son. She hosted an all-abilities craft fair for special needs individuals of all ages and abilities. She also has a calm break room for those who might be having a hard time or are over stimulated, so they can take a break.

Paperless Billing Now Offered by Revenue Recovery

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Department of Finance's Revenue Recovery Division, which provides billing and collection services for the County, has a great new tool to help customers manage their payments and pay their bills online!

This tool, Revenue Recovery Online, makes managing payments a breeze! With Revenue Recovery Online you can:

Sign up for paperless & receive statements via email; View previous statements, correspondence and payment history; Set up payment reminders; Pay Online; and, Set up auto pay, so you never miss a due date

This new paperless billing option will help Revenue Recovery customers avoid potential postal delays while also offering a greener alternative to mailed paper bills.

Effective Oct. 1, 2021, the United States Postal Service revised its service standards for certain first-class mail items that increase the delivery time from 1-3 days to 5 days. This new standard may delay customers' receipt of mail from us and our receipt of mail from them (including payments).

Revenue Recovery sends out close to 100,000 customer statements every month. It is estimated that the standard 45-foot pine tree can produce roughly 10,000 sheets of paper, so every year, Revenue Recovery uses roughly 120 greenhouse gas absorbing pine trees worth of paper, excluding envelopes and other correspondence.

A New Universe for Entertainment

Maroon 5 to Perform Opening Concert in June

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - It wasn't just a tour of an upcoming entertainment center for the region, it was the tour of a new entertainment universe. You could see in these construction stages just how fantastic this venue will be, from the closeness to the stars on stage to the orbit of the VIP skyboxes over every event.

The venue at Hard Rock Live, named Kumi Event Center, is in Wheatland, just a short drive from almost any population center in the region.

Mark Birtha, President of Hard Rock Hotel & Casino Sacramento at Fire Mountain, led a tour of local media on March 22, 2022 through the build-out construction area of the concert stage and surrounding support areas. He explained the layout, concessions, and how the bands and performers would access the main stage. "We are excited to provide our guests with authentic experiences that rock in a venue that is filling a great void in the Sacramento region," Birtha said.

Birtha expressed his enthusiasm for the project saying, "This entertainment center will help revitalize the community." He later commented, "Upcoming events include MMA, and additional concerts will soon be announced. Yuba-Sutter Chamber of Commerce has scheduled a major event for next year."

The 65,000-square-foot facility has state-of-the-art in-house sound and lighting, unrivaled sightlines, a second-floor mezzanine level, VIP skyboxes, and mobile-stage technology, creating intimate experiences for events of varying sizes.

The big announcement was of the opening performers. With a live television audience watching, Birtha had the construction crew drop the banner showing which band is coming to the stage in June. "Maroon 5 is the perfect band to help us celebrate Hard Rock Live's grand opening. They are incredible live performers and live music is fundamental to the Hard Rock brand. This new venue will become the place for entertainment and world class amenities for the city of

Sacramento."

Grammy® Award-winning, multi-platinum band Maroon 5 are set to headline the grand opening of the brand-new Hard Rock Live in Sacramento on June 3, 2022. The band will launch the opening of

the 2,500-seat entertainment venue. The opening celebrations are part of the building's \$75 million property expansion, to be completed spring 2022.

Tickets went on sale Friday, March 25 at Ticketmaster.com, starting at \$99.50.

VIP skyboxes will seat approximately 20 people each.

Maroon 5's performance is only one of the many shows coming to Hard Rock Live this summer and fall, as the new venue continues to add a variety of acts and a diverse calendar for the remainder of 2022 and into 2023.

The center is also designed to be converted for use during a local emergency, such as the region experienced during the recent fires. "We will be able to provide shelter and food in case of an emergency," Birtha said.

The building crew currently employs about 250 construction workers. The venue, when opened, will have approximately 100 employees for shows. They expect to have between 50 and 60 shows per year.

Jodi Goodman, representative from Live Nation said, "This was a natural fit. It is truly more state of the art in Northern California. For Live Nation events it is a really, really great asset. We can see an enormous future together for us." Live Nation, the world's leading live entertainment company, will be the exclusive talent booking agency for the venue.

Finally, Progress on Vital Sites Reservoir Project

Simple logic tells us that as climate change alters precipitation patterns, California must expand its capacity to capture and store water.

Even if the overall amount of precipitation remains unchanged, we will receive more of it in the form of rain and less as snow, which means the natural reservoir of the Sierra snowpack will decline as a water source.

We can prepare for that decline by creating more storage, either in new reservoirs or by replenishing underground aquifers. However, despite the urgency of the situation — one underscored by the current drought — California politicians have been lackadaisical about doing what needs to be done.

Local and regional water authorities have been more diligent. Southern California's recent construction of more storage capacity is one reason it is less affected by the current drought than Northern California.

Belatedly, increasing storage is moving upward on the political agenda. Last week, the federal Environmental Protection Agency invited sponsors of the Sites Reservoir

project, which has been on the back burner for decades, to apply for a \$2.2 billion loan that would cover roughly 40% of the project's estimated cost.

Along with some state water bond money and commitments from prospective users of the project — Southern California water agencies, mostly — Sites is now in position to put together a financing package to make it a reality.

"We've definitely turned the corner and we have a nice tailwind at our back," said Jerry Brown, executive director of the Sites Project Authority. Brown is not related to former Gov. Jerry Brown, whose Colusa County retirement home, incidentally, is not far from Sites.

It's not going to happen immediately, despite the urgency of the situation. Just assembling the loan package and getting approval could take several years and there are other hurdles to clear. Nevertheless, the strong possibility of a federal loan is a huge step forward.

If it becomes reality, the reservoir would be constructed on the west side of the Sacramento Valley, west of Maxwell. It would have a capacity of up to 1.8 million acre-feet of water, about half the size of the state's Lake Oroville, but unlike Oroville, would not dam a major river.

Sites would be an off-stream reservoir, similar to — and slightly smaller than — the San Luis Reservoir in the Pacheco

Pass west of Los Banos. During periods of high precipitation and runoff, Sacramento River water would be pumped into Sites, then released back into the river as needed for agriculture, residential use or to maintain flows for fish.

As an off-stream reservoir, Sites escapes at least some of the traditional opposition to big water projects from environmental groups, but there is some criticism that it could be used to divert water during low precipitation periods.

"It's just a, kind of, different way of thinking about it," project boss Brown told the Associated Press. "There's a lot of fear and distrust and we have to operate in a way that we, you know, secure trust and address the fears."

The good news about Sites should be kept in perspective. It's just one of many steps that California must take to protect its vital water supply from the potential ravages of climate change.

It's entirely possible that climate change will not only change the mix of precipitation — more rain and less snow — but reduce the overall volume of water that falls on California, thus making more storage even more crucial while forcing us to rethink the entire pattern of water use.

Nothing is more critical to California's future.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On Thursday, March 17, the United States

Environmental Protection Agency formally invited the Sites Project Authority to apply for a Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (WIFIA) program loan.

"This is good news, especially after Senate Democrats recently killed my legislation — Senate Bill 890 — that would have helped fully fund Sites Reservoir," said Nielsen.

In total, Sites will be eligible for up to \$2.2 billion in low-interest loans, which accounts for 49 percent of

the project's cost.

Although the WIFIA program is primarily used for wastewater and drinking water systems, the America's Water Infrastructure Act of 2018 directed the EPA and Reclamation to work towards opening the program to some Reclamation water projects as well.

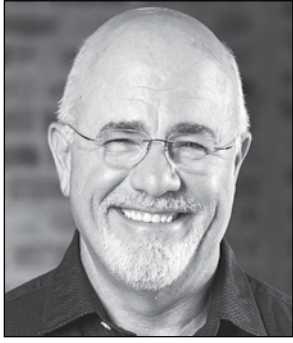

I haven't worked outside the home in a few years, but according to the terms of the divorce I'll receive \$75,000 in cash on the day the divorce is finalized. I also have about \$5,000 in debt on a credit card I am responsible for paying. Other than that, I have no debt. Can you give me some advice for moving forward in my life?

– Starla

Dear Starla,

I'm truly sorry to hear you're going through this.

Dave Ramsey says

If you're not already connected to a good church, I hope you'll consider finding one. Having caring people of faith around you in times like this can help a lot.

The credit card debt is a small part of your financial picture right now. Still, my advice is to go ahead and pay it off as soon as you receive the settlement money. That way, you'll be completely debt-free and still have \$70,000 in the bank.

There's a little bit of a catch, though. You'll need to live for a while like that money isn't there. Use just enough to get yourself settled somewhere else, if that's a consideration, and then start looking for a job so you can eat and pay the utilities. There are tons of places hiring right now, and the money's decent, so it shouldn't be too hard to start generating a regular income soon.

If you'll do this, that big chunk of cash will still be

sitting there a year from now when the pain of the divorce has lessened a bit. At that point, you'll be stronger and more emotionally and mentally ready to think about the future and make real plans.

And if you haven't already, cut up that credit card and close the account. The last thing you need right now is an avenue to more debt. God bless you, Starla.

or just cooling off during the hot Rancho Cordova summers. Swimming is one of the best exercises because it engages the whole body. Water-based exercise reduces impact on joints and provides steady resistance, making it ideal for people with joint-related issues. Having access to water-play is great for mental health as well. It improves mood in adults and the play feature is great for brain and motor skill development in small children. The Cordova Community Pool expands the aquatic capabilities in the community and is the only public pool in Rancho Cordova that accommodates swim teams and lap swimming.

As a part of improving the health and wellbeing of the community, the District created inclusive guidelines and signage. Swim Attire Guidelines encourage patrons to wear attire designed for water activities including, but not limited to, swimsuits, athletic shorts and dry-fit clothing. For safety reasons, the guidelines advise that patrons should not wear clothing that is excessively heavy or made of absorbent material. Additionally, the locker rooms at the Cordova Community Pool have signs that

promote an inclusive environment. At the entrance and throughout each locker room, signs are displayed which feature the text "CRPD supports a person's right to use the locker facility consistent with their gender identity". In developing and implementing these guidelines and signs, the District has created and will continue to foster a positive culture where community members can feel welcome and enjoy activities at the Cordova Community Pool.

The District looks forward to being able to offer additional programs, including adaptive programs, for community members to enjoy.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Animal shelters around the country are gearing up for what is known as “kitten season,” when cats begin to give birth to countless kitten litters. Typically beginning in late spring and continuing throughout summer, kitten season stretches the already-thin resources animal shelters and rescues have when the influx of unwanted kittens and cats crowd shelter and kennel space.

The Bradshaw Shelter’s Foster Care Program helps save lives and space during this hectic season.

“Foster care providers are critical to our efforts to save lives,” said Foster/Rescue Coordinator, Violet Pina. “Fosters provide a safe, loving, temporary place to live where the animals can thrive until they are ready to be adopted to their forever homes. Kitten season is one of our busiest times of the year so we need all of the help we can get.”

Residents interested in becoming fosters should submit a foster application to FosterRescueProgram@sacounty.net. The shelter provides all food,

bedding, supplies, toys and more at no cost to the foster. Fostering is a great way to help alleviate the impact of kitten season at your local shelter and can provide temporary companionship for those still working from home.

However, working outside of the home doesn’t need to be an impediment to becoming a foster; most animals in foster care do not require constant monitoring. Typically, animals who need fostering are kittens and puppies less than two months old.

As far as space for fostering, a bathroom, laundry room or spare bedroom is typically appropriate. The time commitment for fostering can be anywhere from one to six weeks, depending on the animal’s size at the time of fostering.

Additional foster needs include caring for sick or injured animals, nursing mothers and litters, giving animals a break from the shelter, and more.

RESTRAINING ORDERS

Center for Excellence in Cellular Manufacturing to be Built

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - ThermoGenesis Holdings, Inc. (Nasdaq: THMO), in partnership with the City of Rancho Cordova and the Greater Sacramento Economic Council (GSEC), announced that the company is building a multi-million dollar, 35,500-square-foot Center for Excellence in Cellular Manufacturing in Rancho Cordova, a suburb of Greater Sacramento, to provide contract manufacturing services for cell therapies, including the one called "CAR-T cell therapy", which could save the lives of many cancer

patients just like Emily Whitehead.

The field of CAR-T cell therapy emerged in 2012 when a young girl named Emily Whitehead, diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia at 5 years old, received the first CAR-T cell therapy after all other treatment options had been exhausted. The CAR-T cell therapy saved her life, and she is now celebrating nine years cancer-free.

The work was led by Professor Carl June at the University of Pennsylvania. They then published their impressive results in the New England Journal of Medicine in 2017, reporting clinical trial data from

111 patients treated with autologous (using one's own cells) anti-CD19 CAR-T cell therapy, where the response rate was 82%, and the complete response rate was 54%. This was remarkable when compared to the results of traditional cancer therapies.

In 2017, following the exceptional clinical outcome, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved the first CAR-T cell therapy, Kymriah®, using patient's own immune cells for the treatment of acute lymphoblastic leukemia. By the end of 2021, the FDA approved five CAR-T therapies for various forms of blood cancers, and globally,

there are over 1,200 registered CAR-T cell related clinical trials targeting a variety of blood and solid tumors.

The CAR-T cell therapy, along with other cell-based therapies, will now be the focus at the Center for Excellence. The Center for Excellence will be an expansion of ThermoGenesis' current operations in the region with a goal of quadrupling production efficiency and cutting cell gene therapy (CGT) drug costs in half. The project anticipates creating more than 100 high paying professional jobs and generating \$500+ million in new revenue over the next 10 years.

Chris Xu, Ph.D, Chief Executive Officer of ThermoGenesis, commented, "ThermoGenesis aspires to leverage our 35 years of innovative history and knowledge to build a competitive advantage in cellular manufacturing for cell gene therapies, which we envision will become a major part of the future of medicine. We believe this new center will facilitate the development of more innovative cellular drugs, serving the needs of future drug developers and patients, and bringing more innovations into the healthcare field."
