

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - With the arrival of spring, members of the Sacramento Telangana Association (STA) celebrated the Holi Festival of Colors, according to the Hindu calendar, on Saturday, March 19, at Village Green Park.



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Captain Mike Sedam has been assigned as the new commander for the California Highway Patrol (CHP), North Sacramento Area.

Captain Sedam reported to the North Sacramento Area from the Sacramento Communications Center. He has been the interim commander since August 2021. Regarding his new assignment, Captain Sedam stated, "I am extremely proud to be given the opportunity to work with the high performing professionals at the North Sacramento Area who truly care about the public we serve. I look forward to working with the community and our allied agency partners." In addition to serving as the North Sacramento Area commander, Captain Sedam is also a board member for the Law Enforcement Chaplaincy Sacramento. Captain Sedam grew up in Northern California and has served with the CHP for over 26 years. Captain Sedam holds two master's degrees: one in security studies from the Naval Postgraduate School and the other in public administration from California State University, Fresno.

The North Sacramento Area provides safety, service, and security to residents, commuters, and tourists using the 62 miles of state highways and 1,200 miles of country roads within its area of responsibility. This includes Interstate 5, Interstate 80, State Route 51 (Business 80), State Route 160, and State Route 99. The North Sacramento Area is focused on preventing injuries and deaths on roadways, serving the public, and assisting allied agencies. In addition to officers and professional staff, the North Sacramento Area has an active Senior Volunteer Program and Explorer Program.

Before settling in Rancho Cordova, Alma grew up in Atlanta where she attended the only high school for Black students in her city. After high school, Alma received a Bachelor of Liberal Arts from Morris Brown College and went

on to teach elementary school for over 20 years. Her husband, Robert D. Wilson, Sr., was an original Tuskegee Airmen. The Air Force took

them to different bases in the United States and England. They were stationed at Mather Air Force Base in 1964, and the two liked Rancho

Cordova and decided to call it home. Together, they had four children and were married for 50 years at the time of Robert's death in 1997.

"It doesn't feel any different to turn 100," said Alma. "Take each year as it comes and keep on striving. Do what you can, as long as you can."

Alma is a member of Cordova Baptist church in Rancho Cordova, and she has five grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren. She enjoys reading and doing crossword puzzles, which she says keep her mind sharp.

Farewell, ARCO!

Kings Organization and Fans Say Goodbye to the 'Old Barn'

SACRAMENTO CA (MPG) - ARCO Arena, Power Balance Pavilion, and Sleep Train Arena are three names that were synonymous with the home of the

Sacramento Kings for 28 ARCO Arena officially closed Saturday

in Natomas for good, as members of the Kings organization and fans said their final farewells to a building that opened in 1988 and meant so much to a city for so long.

"This is a shining example that in Sacramento there was a time when we were at the top of the basketball world and this is where you had to come to see the 'Greatest Show on Court,' so that gives us hope," said Doug Christie, who played shooting guard in Sacramento from 2000 to 2005. "This building is different than Golden 1 (Center). Golden 1 has things to walk around and see. But here, there was 17,000 people already sitting in their seat. When we came out of that tunnel it was energy, if you didn't have it, they gave it to you."

Christie, now an assistant coach with the Kings, Vlade Divac and Brad Miller were the former Kings players in attendance Saturday. Olympic gold medalist Ruthie Bolton made an appearance to represent the Monarchs, the former WNBA team that won a championship for Sacramento in 2005 before disbanding in 2009.

"This was the venue (where) the fans were the soul, and we were the show," Christie said. "That mix is something that you don't find. We were whitehot before Miami. We were beautiful basketball before Golden State. The only thing we didn't do is put a ring on it. I told (Kings' owner) Vivek (Ranadivé) when we were standing here, 'It's gonna happen, it will. And when it does, right on the bottom down there, just put ARCO because that would be so very fitting."

Ranadivé, who kept the team from moving out of Sacramento in 2013, and former owner Gregg Lukenbill, who brought the franchise to the 916 in 1985, each spoke

Saturday morning about the former home known to many as the "Old Barn."

"I know this is a bittersweet moment for everyone because there is some amazing memories," Ranadivé said. "I describe this place as a communal fireplace. The firepit is the arena, the players are the fire, they lit that fire. The fans huddled around that communal fireplace and it's been an amazing fireplace. So, thanks to all of you for the memories."

Also in attendance for the farewell were politicians, Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg and Vice Mayor Angelique Ashby, as well as former Kings coach and broadcaster Jerry Reynolds.

"This is very emotional because there isn't a Sacramentan who hasn't been part of this community for decades who doesn't have incredible memories of experiences here at, I know it's Sleep Train, ARCO Arena. It's what it is, ARCO Arena," Steinberg said. "The memories, even the painful ones, are all good."

The "Farewell to ARCO Arena" event was open to season ticket holders starting at noon Saturday and to the public from 2-6 P.M. Fans had the opportunity to walk through the old arena, take photos and write farewell messages that will remain on the site.

The Kings also gave away an abundance of free boxes of team memorabilia like jerseys and signed basketballs that were stored over the years at ARCO,

to those who were willing soul of this building," to brave the long line. The Christie said. "I never knew event was one last get-together for Kings fans at the place they called home for many years.

It is well documented that Sacramento has struggled for many years on the court, as the current team is 25-48 and close to missing the playoffs for what would be an NBA record 16th consecutive season. However, the Kings' best years in Sacramento so far were at ARCO, including nine playoff appearances, eight consecutive from 1998 to 2006, and a trip to the 2002 Western Conference Finals.

In 2013, the arena set a Guinness World Record for loudest indoor sports roar at 126 decibels.

"I truly appreciate the

that wood, metal and plastic could make such a sound. But it was a sound that I will never forget."

Off the court, ARCO hosted concerts, high school and college sports, WWE, MMA, Disney on Ice and so much more.

After fighting for years to keep their team in town, Kings fans were rewarded in 2016 with the Golden 1 Center. Now, the space in Natomas that they once called home will be demolished in the coming months to make way for a new medical center and hospital.


"One of the epic moments of my life was to be able to stand here, and I'll just repeat what I said, I said, 'This is

County Shelter Reopens Veterinary Outreach Program

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -Sacramento County's Bradshaw Animal Shelter is bringing back their mobile pet wellness clinic.

Their first clinic is scheduled for Sunday, March 20, 2022, at Howe Park in the Arden-Arcade area between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m.

The mobile dog clinic is part of the Bradshaw Animal Assistance Team (BAAT) veterinary outreach. The program provides free basic veterinary services to low-income and unsheltered pet owners in Sacramento County. Prior to the pandemic, the volunteer-run program provided critical care for more than 9,200 pets in our community from 2016 to 2019.

"The need for care has only increased

during the past two years of the pandemic," says BAAT Clinic & Shelter Volunteer Coordinator, Celeste Ingrid. "We're looking forward to getting back into our communities with the care that disadvantaged pets need."

The mobile clinic offers many free services for dogs including:

- · Vaccinations Microchipping
- Deworming
- Engraved ID tags and collars
- Flea prevention
- Treatment of some minor medical conditions

Social Workers: Making Communities Better

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, **CA (MPG)** - Social workers make communities better. They help protect children, youth, and the elderly from abuse. They connect people suffering from substance abuse and mental illness to services. They link people challenged by homelessness, poverty and lack of healthcare to housing, benefits and employment. They help severely disabled individuals live in the least restrictive environment possible.

March is National Social Work Month, and Sacramento County joins the National Association of Social Work (NASW) in celebrating this great profession and in sharing this year's motto, "The Time is Right for Social Work."

The goal of Social Work Month is to inform the public, policymakers and legislators about the way social workers meet people where they are every day and help them live to their fullest potential.

Sacramento County employs almost 600 social workers in many different County departments. The

Department of Child, Family and Adult Services (DCFAS) and the Department of Human Assistance (DHA) have the largest numbers of social workers on staff.

DCFAS social workers link individuals and families to services that promote the safety, health and well-being of community members across all ages. Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, they continued to provide in-person visits, working on the frontlines along with doctors, nurses, law enforcement and other essential employees.

At DHA, social workers help families who are experiencing homelessness, domestic violence and other family crises. They help clients learn job-seeking skills. A team of social workers specializes in helping clients navigate the challenging disability benefits process. DHA also has a social worker in the General Assistance Program making referrals to service agencies.

In addition to these efforts, DHA also has social workers assigned to the Homeless Outreach and Encampment Teams working with Sacramentans experiencing homelessness to navigate public benefits

and shelter/housing options.

"Our DCFAS social workers are everyday heroes and I feel privileged to be a part of this team," said Michelle Callejas, Director of the Department of Children, Family and Adult Services.

"The social workers in DHA work tirelessly to help those in the greatest need of services become self-sufficient and independent. It is because of their efforts and the efforts of those they work with across department and jurisdictional lines that Sacramentans can thrive and be safe," said Ethan Dye, Director of Human Assistance.

Social work is one of the fastest-growing professions in the United States, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. At the same time, Sacramento County has an ongoing need for social workers to help the community's most vulnerable residents. The Human Services Social Worker and Human Services Social Worker (with Master's Degree) positions are on continuous file, meaning the County is always accepting applications. Regional San Awarded Funding for Harvest Water Project

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Water Commission recently announced that Regional San will receive about \$4.3 million in additional Proposition 1 grant funding from California's Water Storage Investment Program (WSIP). These funds will help finance Regional San's Harvest Water Program. This additional funding adds to the previous \$287.5 million in WSIP funding, for an overall total award of about \$292 million.

Harvest Water was established to meet Regional San's goal of increasing the use of recycled water by providing tertiary-treated wastewater for farmers – demonstrating Regional San's ongoing commitment to environmental stewardship.

Harvest Water represents one of the largest agricultural water reuse projects in the United States. Once complete, it will provide up to 50,000 acre-feet per year of drought-resistant recycled water to irrigate up to 16,000 acres of permanent agriculture and habitat conservation lands near the Cosumnes River and Stone Lakes National Wildlife Refuge in Sacramento County.

"Regional San takes its commitment to environmental stewardship very seriously," said Christoph Dobson, Regional San's General Manager. "Securing these funds helps our efforts to provide a safe and sustainable water supply for agriculture, irrigation and habitat protection. It also reduces the need for groundwater pumping, a critical need in today's drought conditions."

Next steps include continued planning efforts with local farmers and development of designs for pumping, transmission and distribution systems to convey recycled water from the wastewater treatment plant near Elk Grove to farmers in southern Sacramento County. The first phase of the recycled water delivery system is expected to be operational by 2025.

We are looking for individuals who volunteered or have engaged and managed volunteers to ensure vital and social services such as food, housing, transportation or mental health were provided. This may include all volunteering that enables an organization's reach to extend across the wider community to support our most vulnerable populations. This could consider their contribution to deliver vital services such as more digital and online volunteering or phone services taking the place of previously face-to-face services.

Award Categories

Youth Volunteer of the Year - This award goes to a youth volunteer under age 21 who has contributed a minimum of 25 hours of service between January 2021 and December 2021. The winner receives a \$500 Margaret Einspahr Memorial Award.

Individual Volunteer of the Year -This award goes to a volunteer over the age of 21 who has contributed a minimum of 25 hours of service between January 2021 and December 2021. The winner receives a \$100 award to their organization.

Volunteer Manager of the Year -This award goes to a volunteer manager (paid or unpaid). The winner receives a \$100 award to their organization in addition to a one year complimentary DOVIA Sacramento organization membership.

Eligibility

Agency where the individual volunteered or is a volunteer manager is a charitable, nonprofit or public organization between January 2021 and December 2021; All nominee volunteer organizations must provide service for the community at large; Groups providing members-only services are not eligible; Service organizations must endorse nominations; Volunteer service may have been performed on work release time, without pay or for student course credit. Out of pocket expense reimbursement is permissible; Volunteer service must have been performed in Sacramento, Yolo, Placer, El Dorado, Nevada, Yuba or Sutter Counties; Current DOVIA board members are not eligible for the Volunteer Manager of the Year award; Nominated service work must have been performed between January 1, 2021 and December 31, 2021; Past winners of the three awards are not eligible to win.

A panel of community leaders, independent of DOVIA board of directors and members, reviews each nomination and chooses a winner in each category. Nominees will be contacted by DOVIA shortly after the nomination due date of Friday, April 15, 2022, 5 pm Pacific.

DOVIA will introduce and honor all nominees and announce the winners with an awards ceremony on May 18, 2022 from 4-6 pm at The Grand Hall at the Clunie Center, 601 Alhambra Boulevard, Sacramento 95816. We encourage all nominees and nominators to attend on this special day. Revised Sacramento County Housing Element Approved

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously on March 8 to adopt a resolution amending the Sacramento County General Plan, including the Housing Element.

The Board of Supervisors approved the initial General Plan Amendment amending the Housing Element of the Sacramento County General Plan back in July 2021, and Planning and Environmental Review (PER) submitted the adopted Housing Element to State of California Housing and Community Development Department (HCD) for certification in July 2021.

On October 28, 2021, PER staff received a letter from HCD requiring additional changes for certification.

Between December 2021 and February 2022, PER staff worked with HCD and the Sacramento Housing Alliance (SHA) to address all concerns and comments related to the Housing Element.

"The Revised Housing Element includes program clarifications that respond to the State of California Housing and Community Development Department and Sacramento Housing Alliance comments," said Todd Smith, Principal Planner. "With the approval of the Board of Supervisors, the adopted Housing Element will be resubmitted to the HCD, and we are confident that it will be



We Stand with the People of Ukraine

Sacramento has one of the largest Ukrainian immigrant populations in the USA, and they are stepping up to help the besieged, freedom-loving people of Ukraine push back against Putin's

aggressions. While President Trump was our leader, Russia was in check. During the Bush and Obama Administrations, Putin successfully restored control over parts of the former Soviet Union, and now he's back on the battlefield because of Biden's weakness.

While Putin was able to ignore any consequences of crossing Biden, he underestimated the resolve of the Ukrainian people to remain independent of Russia. Their bravery and patriotism has been admirable and worthy of our respect and

assistance. One Sacramento resident who has a personal stake in the Ukraine's survival is local businessman and candidate for Congress Max Semenenko. With family under siege in his former country, Max is stepping up to inform Sacramentans on the circumstances that led to this invasion, and how to help the people of Ukraine persevere.

Below are Max Semenenko's observations:

"Vladimir Putin has shattered European security and is threatening nuclear war against any country that stands in his way. Putin's war against innocent Ukrainians is criminal and an attack on the fundamental principles of sovereignty and self-determination that underpin global security. NATO and the west have no choice but to recognize what's unfolding in Europe. The world must stop Vladimir Putin.

I was born in Ukraine, and I understand why Ukrainians want to join NATO: Peace, security, freedom. Ukraine declared independence in 1991, when the communist Supreme Soviet of Ukraine proclaimed that Ukraine would no longer follow the laws of USSR. What the people of Ukraine didn't do in 1991 was ask to remain a part of a Soviet Union. Nor did they want to continue living under Russian laws.

Putin claims Russians in Ukraine are estranged from their homeland, are under attack, and that Russia is coming to their defense. In 2014, Putin began issuing Russian passports to ethnic Russians in Crimea and areas in eastern Ukraine. Crimea was invaded and annexed to Russia soon after. Putin has since continued his asymmetrical form of cultural warfare in eastern Ukraine while arming and directing "Russian rebels" to fight a war of "independence" against

I support heavy sanctions on Russia and engaging our allies to ban Russia from international banking and financial markets. The USA must step up aid for Ukraine's resistance, and when Vladimir Putin threatens nuclear retaliation, President Biden and our NATO allies must communicate our resolve to halt Russian aggression in equally strong terms.


This new reality demands a new posturing and resurgence of NATO forces into eastern Europe. We must immediately demonstrate by our actions that the United States and NATO will fight back and reverse any further Russian aggression.

The USA and our allies have blindly tolerated dependence on Russian energy supplies, in effect financing their wars. It's not too late to return the United States to its status as an energy independent nation, and as a Member of Congress that will be one of my priorities.

I am personally supporting and working with Revived Soldiers Ukraine, a non-profit that is providing aid to Ukrainian families and healthcare to wounded soldiers. You can join me and donate at www.

rsukraine.org. Please pray for peace - for the United States, our soldiers, and our leaders. Pray for the safety of our friends and allies facing the enemy, Ukrainian leaders, families, and those on the frontlines."

How Will Newsom's Gas Price Relief Promise Work?

It's time once again for some fun with numbers, in this case data surrounding the sharp spike in gas prices.

Although the recent uptick in fuel prices varies from community to community and even station to station, a good estimate of the increase, perhaps a bit conservative, is \$1 per gallon. It's mostly due to global oil markets reacting to the Russian invasion of Ukraine and efforts to punish Russian President Vladimir Putin with economic sanctions.

Last week in his State of the State address, Gov. Gavin Newsom dropped his previous proposal to offset the gas price increase with a very small "pause" in a scheduled state gas tax

"Now, it's clear we must go further," Newsom said. "That's why, working with legislative leadership, I'll be submitting a proposal to put money back in the pockets of Californians to address rising gas prices."

That was it — no details, just a vague promise. While we await some indication of what Newsom intends, let's put a buck-a-gallon price increase in numerical hardly worth doing. perspective:

drive 29 million automoas pickups and SUVs;

-Each year, they rack up 330 billion miles of automotive travel, an average of about 11,000 miles per

-Motorists burn 15 billion gallons of gasoline each year, which averages out to 517 gallons of fuel for each vehicle (43 gallons per month) and an average of 21 miles to the gallon;

-Therefore, on average Californians are paying an extra \$43 per month to drive, if one assumes the price increase has been \$1 per gallon.

Higher costs for refueling their cars can certainly be painful to those in lower income brackets or those, such as long-distance commuters, who are running up high mileage counts. But unto itself, \$43 a month shouldn't be a critical issue for many Californians.

That said, we tend to focus on sharp price increases in everyday commodities, such as gasoline, as an indicator of high inflation. It's a squeaky wheel in political terms — and politicians feel compelled to grease the wheel or face a popular backlash.

So what can Newsom and legislators do to offset higher gas prices in this election year?

The tax increase pause Newsom originally proposed would have cost about \$500 million or a \$17 annual savings per vehicle, California newspapers.

However, fully offsetting -Californians own and the jump could be a major hit on the state budget. biles and light trucks, such At \$1 per gallon, it would require the state to rebate about \$15 billion to motorists for a full year — almost exactly what the prison system costs — or just over \$500 per vehicle.

The trick will be to make rebates large enough to have some positive psychological response from California motorists but small enough to avoid a major budget impact.

Would \$100 per car enough, perhaps for one 20-gallon fillup — sufficiently impress Californians that their politicians' hearts are in the right place? Even that relatively small amount would cost the state budget about \$3 billion.

Rebates of any size would be relatively easy to distribute if done on a per-vehicle basis, since the state already has data on vehicle ownership.

It would become infinitely more complex to focus relief for those who are feeling price increases most keenly, such as low-income motorists or super commuters. That could become a bureaucratic nightmare on a par with the dysfunctional Employment Development Department.

The rebate promise is now on the agenda and it will be a very interesting situation to monitor.







For those who adhere to Hindu belief, Holi is an annual opportunity for soul searching and praying, in order to extricate the interior life of the evils of past errors and conflicts and turn to forgiving and forgetting.

"Over 800 packets of color were distributed," according to Reddy, who said the dousing of colors was a way to reflect the season of flowering, blooming and newness in nature.

From kids and adults alike in the hundreds was heard, "Happy Holi! Happy Holi! Happy Holi!"

"And, just like that," Sloan noted, 'people started blooming-just like flowers."

Sloan said he was left with the impression that the Indian festival was analogous to painting, where "people arrive as blank canvases and, throughout the duration of the event, become unique art pieces in exhibit." Therein lay the significance of color in the human consciousness and identity, much celebrated in the religions of southern Asia.

Reddy took a moment to thank


