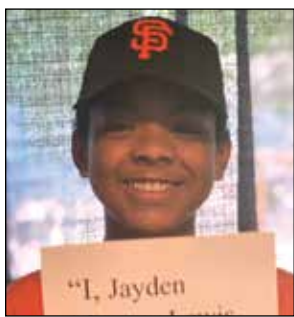

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On Monday, the City of Rancho Cordova broke ground on Rancho Cordova Fiber City, which is a citywide, ultra-high-speed fiber network in partnership with SiFi Networks and GigabitNow.

“As we have witnessed first-hand during the pandemic, high speed internet is no longer a luxury, but a necessity,” Rancho Cordova Mayor Donald Terry said. “We are now a nation of Zoom meetings and because of a global pandemic, online education became the only way our kids could learn in school.”

Rancho Cordova is the first city in Northern California to bring citywide, Gigabit plus broadband delivered by an extensive fiber network that, once built out, will reach every house and business in Rancho Cordova. It’s just one of the initiatives that gives Rancho Cordova its Smart City status, according to a city press release.

“Rancho Cordova’s Smart City status will be strengthened by the city-wide fiber network. And what is a Smart City? It is a city that is built with high tech connectivity to enhance city services for its residents and businesses,” Terry said. “Not just for today, but into the future. And not

just for a few but for everyone.”

The project, which has been privately funded, will provide 10 gigabit internet speeds to all residents, businesses and institutions in Rancho Cordova. Once completed, the network will be open to multiple service providers, but the first provider will be GigabitNow. This dynamic should open up for better competition and rates for the community.

“This project represents a significant investment of \$63 million—private investment at no cost to the taxpayer. We are extremely proud that Rancho Cordova will be our first fiber city in Northern California,”

Kiley Responds to Newsom Extending School Mask Mandate

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) released the following statement in response to Governor Newsom’s announcement that the statewide school mask mandate will continue until March 12, 2022:

“There is absolutely no basis for continuing the statewide school mask mandate another day. That’s why almost every other state has moved on. Rather than finally acknowledge evidence and common sense, the Governor has chosen to give California kids another two weeks of pointless misery.”

“This is the same Governor who kept schools closed longer than any state in the country. It’s the same Governor who tried to stop students from enrolling in high-performing charter schools soon after COVID began. Young people in California will pay a lasting price for Gavin Newsom’s indecent school policies.”

“It’s no wonder that dozens of school districts across the state have completely tuned the Governor out. They are doing what is right for their kids.”

“The Governor is also refusing to give up his emergency powers and continuing the State of Emergency in violation of the plain text of the Emergency Services Act. The Legislature must act to stop this lawlessness, end the emergency, and let the people of California move on with their lives.”

While California students wait until March 12, one day ago Gov. Kathy Hochel of New York announced that students would no longer need to mask starting Wednesday, March 2. ★

Black History Month: Meet Our City Team

City of Rancho Cordova

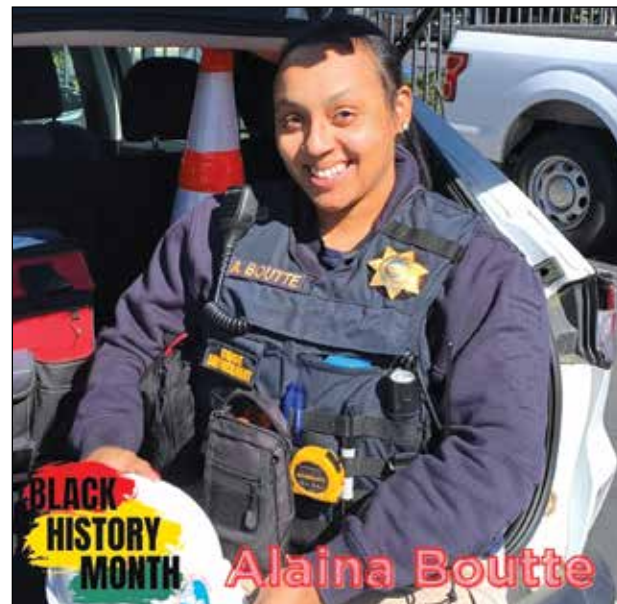
RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova is a diverse community of nearly 80,000 who live here and 65,000 who work here. In fact, Rancho Cordova is one of the most diverse cities in the United States.

The city’s team is also diverse. As we celebrate Black History Month, here are the stories of four of the city’s team members.

Alaina Boutte

Alaina Boutte grew up in New Orleans, Louisiana among a mostly African American, mixed-race community. Whenever Alaina was asked as a child what she wanted to be when she grew up, she always answered an attorney and the “first Black woman president.”

When Alaina was a senior in high school, Hurricane Katrina happened. Her life was turned upside down when a levee near where she lived broke and destroyed her home. Her family decided to

move back to Sacramento, which was where her parents had originally met. Her father, a construction worker and Marine Corps veteran, traveled back and forth rebuilding the City of New Orleans and the family home.

Alaina finished out her senior year and enrolled at Loyola University New Orleans and then Sacramento State

University. In college, she obtained a position working for the Department of Homeland Security overseeing different TSA checkpoints.

Alaina then joined the City of Sacramento as a Parking Enforcement Officer. She found a mentor in one of the city’s female fire chiefs and became interested in joining the fire service. Alaina became a

Reserve Firefighter with the hope of becoming a firefighter, but she sustained an injury that prevented her from doing so.

Alaina then joined the city’s Code Enforcement team and now serves our community as a Code Enforcement Officer II for the Rental Housing Inspection program. The program ensures healthy and safe rental housing for residents in our community.

Alaina also volunteers her time with the NAACP and Sacramento Urban League young professionals.

What does Black History Month mean to you? “Black History Month to me is acknowledging our oppressive history in America, while also recognizing our accomplishments and what we’ve been able to come back from,” said Alaina. “We continue to advance and make history despite our circumstances and the systemic racism that is still

Cordova Lancers Hit the Diamond for 2022 Season

RANCHO CORDOVA (MPG) - Did I ever tell you how much I love the game of baseball? If not, let me tell you now, I LOVE THE GAME OF BASEBALL!

So, when I heard that Major League Baseball was locked out due to player and owner negotiations, I was very upset.

Springtime was meant for the start of baseball, and without it, it seemed like old man winter was going to hang around a lot longer. Well, buy me some peanuts and Cracker Jacks!

Last Friday, I made the long walk from the parking lot at Hagan Community Park towards Peterson Field. I heard the snap of the hard ball hitting a leather glove, the crack of the bat and the sound of the fans cheering. In that moment, I knew baseball was back.

As I made my way towards the stands directly behind home plate a familiar face caught my eye, the legend himself, Guy Anderson, a hall of fame high school coach. Anderson led the Cordova High School (CHS) baseball program to 927 wins over 45 years and to several championship seasons starting in the early 1970's.

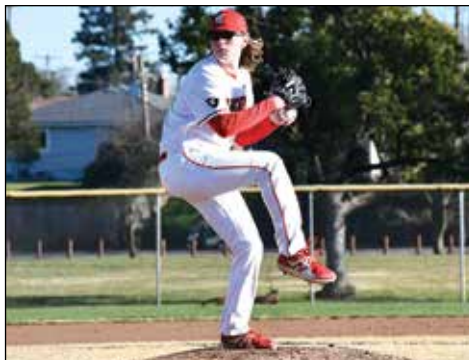
Talking a little baseball with Anderson while gazing out onto Peterson Field, one can't help but think about the past players that not only made their marks in CHS history but went on to play in the major leagues.

Names like Chris Bosio, Geoff Jenkins, Randy Lerch, Jerry Manuel, Larry Wolfe and Max Venable to name a few. All these players had several things in common. They had remarkable talent, loved the game of baseball and were all coached by Anderson.

Fast forward to the present, this brings us to another player coached by Anderson, Scott Ahlstrom, head coach of the 2022 Lancers. Ahlstrom played at Cordova from 1999 to 2001. After graduating, he planned to play baseball for American River College, but the events of 9/11 inspired him to enlist in the



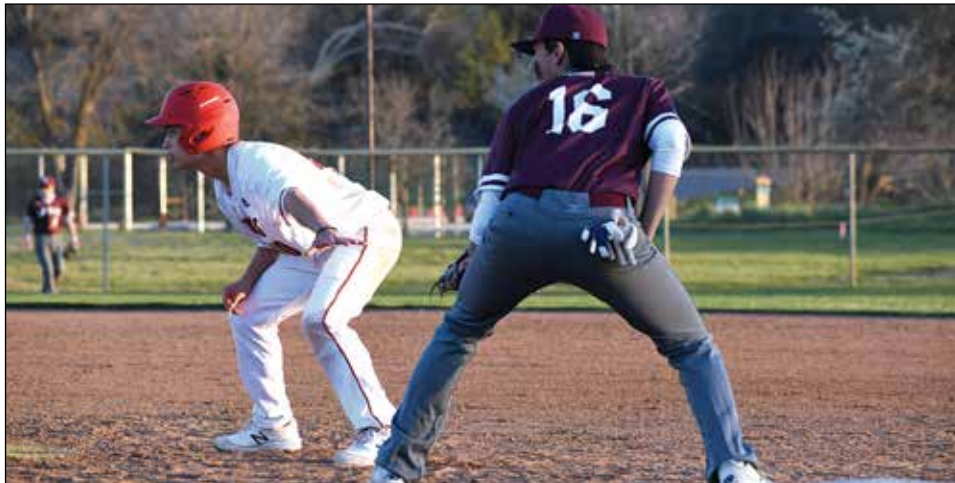
Members of the Cordova High School baseball team pose for a photo following a 5-4 win in eight innings against Union Mine on Friday, Feb. 25 at Peterson Field.

After his return from active duty, Ahlstrom started a family and took on the roles of husband, father and eventually... coach. It was always a goal for Ahlstrom to coach at Cordova, so when the opportunity came knocking in 2020, he answered the door. Additionally, Ahlstrom helps operate the Izturis Baseball Academy in Rancho Cordova to develop young players.

This year's team seems to be shaping up nicely with the return of some key players from last season. One returnee is senior captain Matt Jernigan who is Western Oregon University bound! Jernigan, who can pitch as well as play first base and outfield, is coming off a stellar season and has started 2022 right where he left off.

Other talented returning seniors are Cody Fennel and Justin Nelson, two utility players who can pitch and play catcher. Some impactful juniors are Eli Campbell and captain Alfredo Cervantes IV, who both play the infield. Campbell is currently on the disabled list for a few more weeks with a broken finger suffered while playing basketball for the Lancers.

"My goal is to get CHS back on the path it used to be on for baseball and curb the recent trend of CHS losing student athletes to play for Folsom High School," Ahlstrom said. "We have talented players coming in as freshmen next year, one being standout player Levi Nyberg."

Ahlstrom believes many other top young players will follow in Nyberg's footsteps to play for the Lancers. This trend has impacted the rosters of many other sports at Cordova for years now. Ahlstrom has a deep passion for athletics at CHS and for athletes in Rancho Cordova. His passion is fueled by his parents also being Cordova graduates.

If you would like to watch some baseball and cheer the Lancers on as they strive for another title, come on out to the next two home games on March 7 and 18. All games are played at Peterson Field in Hagan Park and start at 3:30 P.M.

Grand Jury Calls for Independent Audit of Cares Act Spending

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Grand Jury is calling into question the use and distribution of more than \$181 million received in federal CARES (Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security) Act funding by the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors. Following a nearly year-long secret investigation, the Grand Jury has learned that in the midst of a county-wide emergency, the Supervisors made questionable and opaque maneuvers that skirted the intent of the CARES Act, to the benefit of County coffers and with scant regard for the needs of its citizens.

Enacted in March 2020, the CARES Act covered extraordinary and necessary pandemic related expenditures incurred by state and local government agencies. A fundamental CARES Act requirement was that funding utilized by government agencies had to be allocated for pandemic specific activities, and could not be applied toward already budgeted items. The Grand Jury's investigation revealed that the County of Sacramento made no CARES Act funding plan to support countywide COVID-19 relief activities. Instead, the County Chief Executive directed, and the Board of Supervisors approved, allocation of \$104 million of its \$181 million in CARES Act funding directly to the Sheriff's Office. That same amount of Sheriff's Office funding was then transferred back into the County's

General Fund, a move the Grand Jury considers confusing at best and possibly illegal.

"The County Chief Executive has argued that the budget move was legal, however the Grand Jury has not been able to make that determination," says Grand Jury Foreperson Deanna Hanson. "We are calling for an independent audit, because Sacramento County residents deserve answers."

While the CARES Act permitted its funding to support public safety, the County's maneuver was inconsistent with the widely publicized intent that funds be directed to meet community challenges triggered by the COVID-19 pandemic. Neither the County Executive nor the Board presented any statutory or regulatory language, or a legal opinion, to verify this assertion. "At a minimum, these elected representatives, had an obligation to notify its constituents of the fund allocation and transfer," Hanson explains.

In its report, the Grand Jury points out that in sharp contrast to the County, the Sacramento City Council allocated nearly all of its CARES Act funding directly to community agencies and businesses to help alleviate impacts of the pandemic. Formal responses to the report are required from both the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors and Sacramento County Sheriff Scott Jones. The full investigation is available for public review on the Grand Jury website: www.saccourt.ca.gov. ★

SiFi Networks' Geoff Spickler said.

The specifics for the project will be to cut a 1 1/4 inch wide by 12-inch-deep incision (trench) where the road meets the curb. Fiber cables will be laid in the trench and sealed, according to information

provided by the city.

The project is starting at the intersection of Chassella Way and Aramon Drive with the neighborhood projected to go live in about six to seven months. The whole city is scheduled to be on the network in two years. ★

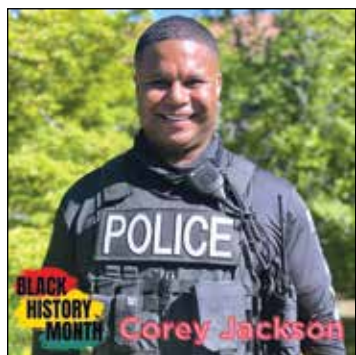

present in our country today. I'm very proud to be the first African American female code enforcement officer and International Code Council Certified Building Inspector for the city. I'm also proud of my people's journey and the journey still ahead."

Corey Jackson

RCPD Officer Corey Jackson grew up in Rosemont with a desire to give back to his community. His sixth grade teacher still has the homework assignment where he wrote he wanted to be a police officer when he grew up.

But Officer Jackson's journey began as a behavioral therapist. He worked at an after-school program with youth and adults with mental health needs, autism, and special needs.

Officer Jackson then joined the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office to continue doing the same job of supporting those with mental health needs but now in a badge and uniform. He worked in corrections with inmates with mental health and psychiatric needs, before coming to RCPD Patrol.

While responding to calls, Officer Jackson realized there was a need for mental health services, but there was not a Mental Crisis Support Team

dedicated to our area. He presented the idea to the leadership, and learned they'd been working on the idea, but were excited by his passion and initiative.

Officer Jackson is now part of the city's Mobile Crisis Support Team, alongside a County Licensed Mental Health Clinician, that responds to emergency calls to support Rancho Cordova residents experiencing mental health crises. In addition, the team has a County-contracted Peer Navigator that follows up with individuals with potential mental health needs to ensure they are offered support in navigating care systems and linked to appropriate services.

What does Black History Month mean to you? "Black History Month is a great opportunity to learn about great leaders of our past," said Officer Jackson. "Not only do we learn about well-known leaders, like Martin Luther King Jr. and Jackie Robinson, but we learn about people like Mamie Till (Mother of Emmitt Till) and how her fight helped pushed the civil rights movement."

Dalia Fadl grew up in the Sudan, a country in northeastern Africa, that she reminisces

is very rich with culture from multiple tribes and hundreds of languages and dialects spoken. Her community is welcoming and warm, hard-working and focused on education, and shared what they had with you, even if they didn't have much.

When political turmoil broke out in the country, Dalia's family thought there might be better opportunities in another coun-



try. Her older brother came to the United States, went to Sacramento State University for his Master's Degree, and then helped the family move here.

Dalia began attending an adult school to advance her English and fondly remembers her teacher encouraging her not to be afraid of making mistakes and keep talking. She enrolled in Sacramento City College and then transferred to University of California, Berkeley where she graduated with her Civil Engineering Degree.

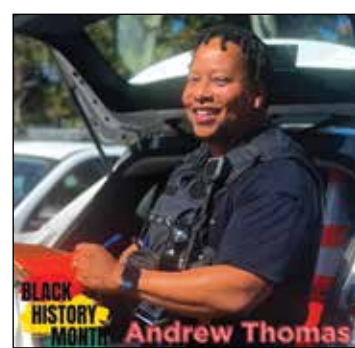
Dalia worked at the Sacramento County Department of Water Resources and City of Sacramento Department of Utilities before joining the city's Public Works team. She is a Principal Civil Engineer and oversees the city's Stormwater Division that protects our waterways.

Throughout Dalia's journey, she has focused on representing

her culture and background by remaining active in the Sudanese community. She also has a passion for showing people that whatever your background, you can succeed and make a difference. Dalia participated in a mentoring program at Sacramento State University, one of her mentees whom she reunited with when she started working at the city.

What does Black History Month mean to you? "Because I always have Sudan in the back of my mind, Black History Month is a time to celebrate my culture and background, and an opportunity to teach others about my country and culture," said Dalia. "It is also a time to be thankful for where I am at today and look into the future to see how I can be a change agent to help others get to the same place. I feel like it's my responsibility to make sure those from different backgrounds have opportunities."

Andrew Thomas grew up in the Oak Park Neighborhood of Sacramento. He remembers it wasn't the best of areas growing up, and he could have been pulled in a not-so-positive direction.

But in high school, he decided to join student government and

then the key club that focused on community service projects, from planting trees to visiting senior living facilities. Andrew was the only African American in the key club. He was elected Vice President his junior year, making him feel like the first Barack Obama of the key club, and then President his senior year.

After Andrew graduated, he was in limbo over whether he should go to college, as neither of his parents had gone. He decided to go into the Job Corps, based on feedback from other family who had gone through, and joined the Security and Investigations Trade. He completed his trade and got a high-level security job alongside retired law enforcement and military.

Andrew then worked at California Independent System Operator, followed by the City of Sacramento in Parking Enforcement, Code Enforcement and Business Compliance. He then joined the city's team in January as a Code Enforcement Officer.

What does Black History Month mean to you? "You are able to see where we are at now versus where we were before, and the things we are able to do versus what we weren't able to do. Things have changed so much for the better, but many things still need to change," said Andrew. "Being Black for me is knowing you're going to endure some kind of struggle during your life. When you overcome that struggle, because you will, it makes you a stronger person."

1. Remove pills from containers and put them in a clear zipper bag. Keep medicated liquids and creams in original containers.
2. Recycle your empty containers, but first scratch off or black out personal information.
3. Find a medication collection bin near you, and place the zipper pill bags, liquids, and creams in the bin.

How California Mistreated its Working Families

Democratic politicians frequently and vehemently express their admiration for and support of what they call “working families,” while contending that rival Republicans lack such empathy.

Despite that political posture, the Democratic governor of California, with the implicit support of a Democrat-dominated Legislature, has imposed unnecessary misery on those they purport to value, as a new report from the Legislature’s budget analyst confirms.

When COVID-19 struck California two years ago, Gov. Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency and ordered closure of large segments of the state’s economy to battle its spread. Almost immediately, more than two million workers were laid off as their employers complied with the orders and most applied for unemployment insurance benefits to keep themselves and their families housed and fed.

Whether the closures and resulting layoffs were justified, in terms of their pandemic-fighting effects, will be endlessly debated. Regardless, they happened and having lost their jobs by executive decree, the suddenly idled workers’ claims for benefits deserved rapid and accurate processing by

Newsom’s Employment Development Department.

Instead, EDD’s pandemic operations rapidly devolved into a bureaucratic Chernobyl with immense and prolonged backlogs of claims, unresponsive handling of claimants’ inquiries, rampant fraud and, as the new report details, botched anti-fraud practices that blocked payments to those with legitimate claims.

The state’s oversight agencies, particularly the state auditor’s office, have steadfastly catalogued EDD’s shortcomings and the latest report, focusing on about \$20 billion in fraudulent payments and EDD’s measures to battle it, comes from the Legislative Analyst’s Office.

What emerges is a tale of an agency repeatedly failing to act when necessary and then overreacting as it tries to correct its previous errors.

Embarrassed by the revelations of fraud, mostly involving special federal jobless benefits, EDD’s managers went overboard in adopting anti-fraud policies, thus denying benefits to many legitimate and qualified claimants, the LAO report declares.

At one point, it says, “EDD and (and an outside contractor) identified 1.1 million claims as potentially fraudulent. EDD stopped payments for these claims. Workers were not notified ahead of time. To reopen their accounts, workers had to verify their identity using ID.me or their accounts would be closed permanently. Ultimately, more than half of the claims (600,000) flagged as fraudulent were confirmed as legitimate.”

Thus, the “working families” that Democrats profess to treasure have been doubly

and triply mistreated.

Newsom’s proposed 2022-23 budget contains funds for six contracts by outside vendors to prevent future fraud, in addition to 13 other fraud-related contracts and the LAO report questions “whether additional anti-fraud efforts are warranted at this time.”

“Moving forward at this time with new, additional layers of fraud protection also would move the department further out of balance by again prioritizing fraud elimination at the expense of prompt and straightforward payments,” the report states.

One of the most irritating things about the EDD’s incredibly bad performance over the last two years is that its political overseers had plenty of warning. During the previous recession that began in 2007, the department experienced great difficulty in handling a surge of unemployment insurance claims because of antiquated tools and procedures.

However, once that recession ended, the agency reverted to its customary ministerial role and no one — in particular Newsom’s predecessor, Jerry Brown — took the proactive step of improving EDD’s capabilities before the next recession hit.

Thus, when it did hit in 2020 by Newsom’s decree, the department was overwhelmed and the shortcomings revealed in the previous recession were magnified. It’s another reminder of government’s endemic inability to look ahead and plan ahead.

"Even though we are called Raising Men, we are Raising Women too", Rodney says, "Three years ago I realized that there were not as many girls signing up for the challenge and that those that did were wearing Raising

Men t-shirts. That did not sit well with me, so we created Raising Women Lawn Care Service". Now young ladies receive Raising Women t-shirts.

Raising Men is a 501(c)3 and relies completely on the generosity of supporters for the equipment, the shirts, hats and travel expenses. You can donate and learn all about the group on weareraisingmen.com. You can also purchase adult sized shirts and hats in support of your kids and the program. In addition, you can see video testimony from the kids and view news stories that have been done.

This program really is putting the care back into lawn care, and your kids can meet some interesting people. One mother said, "Sometimes people insisted on paying, so we just didn't count those lawns". It is left to the kids and their parents to determine who could use their help. Summer is coming up on us fast. If your kids have energy to burn, and don't know where to burn it off, consider this challenge. It's a great way for your kids to learn about their community. ★

Information About the Application
On May 3, 2021, GSWC filed its Cost of Capital Application, A.21-05-003, with the CPUC. In the application, GSWC is requesting to increase its Cost of Capital, which is the rate of return the company is authorized to recover on its investments in critical infrastructure required to deliver safe and reliable water service. If approved by the CPUC, GSWC's rate of return will increase by 0.27% from the current return of 7.91% to 8.18% for 2022, 2023, and 2024. If approved, GSWC's request will reflect its Cost of Capital in rates beginning January 1, 2022.

The authorized Cost of Capital determines the amount of money GSWC is allowed to recover in rates as a return on the money it has invested. In this proceeding, the CPUC will determine a reasonable capital structure (financial plan), the costs of long-term debt (loans and financial obligations over one year), and the level of return investors should receive. This request is subject to change per the Water Cost of Capital Mechanism, which allows for automatic annual adjustments to the return on equity and fixed cost of debt in the cost of capital.

How does the rest of this process work?
This application has been assigned to a CPUC Administrative Law Judge who will consider proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process. The Administrative Law Judge will issue a proposed decision that may adopt GSWC's application, modify it, or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision with a different outcome. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners at a public CPUC Voting Meeting.

Parties to the proceeding will review GSWC's application, including the Public Advocates Office, which is an independent consumer advocate within the CPUC that represents customers to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels.
