SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - There was a slight chill in the air, and a breeze signaling an obvious and much wanted change in seasons. Symbolic in its own way on this day of dedication, changes were being made to fully and properly support those local brave men and women who have served our nation but had fallen on harder times. They are now in a season of hope and care.

October 12, 2021 signaled the day of dedication and a "Mission Accomplished" for Mather Veterans Village in Rancho Cordova.

With an estimated 75,000 veterans living in Sacramento County, the area has the second highest percentage of

unsheltered homeless veterans in California counties.

Doug Shoemaker, President of Mercy Housing California, served as Master of Ceremonies for this dedication of one of the most significant projects to be completed in the region in many years.

Housing to support the unique needs of homeless and disabled veterans was virtually non-existent until Mather Veterans Village went from idea to reality.

Bob McGarvey, former Mayor and City Councilmember of Rancho Cordova, said, "We want to be an

example of what others can do."

Bob met with Sacramento County Supervisor Don Nottoli back in 2008 with the vision of Veterans Village. Bob garnered Don's support from Sacramento County, and with his help, the first phase groundbreaking ceremony was held in 2014.

Things Get a Little Heated

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - "Fastest council session ever."

Mayor Garret Gatewood's words were a light comment on the Monday, October 4 Council Meeting's running time - and definitely true. The much shorter than usual session - 2 hours when compared with past sessions that have crept toward 5 - was also missing the presence of Vice Mayor Donald Terry and a local religious official to conduct the invocation (the prayer was instead spoken by the Mayor himself). Yet, while a few of the usual ingredients were missing, the meeting discussion was no less important to the community... or heated.

During public comment, a number of Lincoln Village residents brought up their frustrations with an ongoing concert series put on by Flame of Fire Ministry of Sacramento. Described by that organization's website as "Holy Spirit-fueled outdoor revival gatherings", those concerned labeled it instead a "nuisance" that through the loudness of the events are impacting their homelife (residents stated activity started as early as 9:00 am and went on through conventional work hours) and in the more drastic words of Ace Duffy Pagan, their lives, referring to harassment he said he received from revival-goers. Another resident called it "the most disrespectful and invasive event I've ever had the displeasure of witnessing."

The concert series is called Awakening Nights.

After hearing the fearful words, the Council appeared to be "awakened" themselves. Mayor Gatewood forcefully stated. "Obviously, we need to take a look into this. I don't like threats to my citizens."

Later, Michael Runner, Deputy City Manager gave more background on the conflict saying they had been working with the community especially during the most recent Awakening event, which occurred at the end of last month. They also were in dialogue with Flame of Fire Ministry bringing them into compliance, and these efforts will be used for all future decisions involving the organization.

On a much warmer note, the Council adopted a resolution authorizing Measure K funds to the tune of \$344,000 (part of a greater \$1,414,000 spread amongst other applicants) to fund workforce recovery and training for the Folsom

Giving Back

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - In her own words, Sarah became homeless and struggled to escape that cycle because "our community's public protections and social programs failed." Luckily, her journey ends in housing and working within the same system that let her down, to be a beacon for good to those on the street.

Sarah recalls, "One of the greatest challenges was the sense of being cast aside. Being a second-class citizen. Not being good enough. Being that homeless girl. If you had a backpack and bike, you were immediately classified as homeless and were treated as such by everyone."

Ten years ago, over the course of five days, Sarah's mother died, and their landlord chose to sell the property. Sarah had to bury her mother and move out of her long-time home in less than a week. Sarah was her

mother's In-Home Support Services (IHSS) worker, so when she passed, Sarah had to collect unemployment. Unfortunately, unemployment does not cover the cost of rent, a security deposit, and other move-in expenses. Her only option was to move in with a relative, who promptly dropped her off at a homeless shelter on their way to Costco.

After a few months of couch surfing and living

on the street, Sarah inherited her mother's housing choice voucher, formerly known as Section 8. Briefly, she moved into her own apartment. After a few months, Sarah's new landlord wrongfully attempted to collect a rental payment after receiving the full rental payment from her voucher program. Disgruntled, the landlord reported Sarah for squatting and had the authorities

remove her from the property. Unjustly, this was non-negotiable. Sarah had 5 minutes to gather her things and leave to the street. Everything left was taken to the dump by the authorities. (If you or someone you know is in a similar housing situation contact Sacramento Self-Help Housing (SSHH) at 916-389-7877.)

This began Sarah's 5-year

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Mentally capable, terminally ill patients with less than six months to live will now have much easier access to medical aid-in-dying, thanks to a bill just signed by Gov. Gavin Newsom.

Patients still have to get the approval of two doctors, but Senate Bill 380 shortens the waiting period between 2 oral requests for the prescription from 15 days to 48 hours.

Amanda Villegas, an advocate and widow of cancer patient Chris Davis who passed away soon after diagnosis in 2019 without being able to take advantage of the end-of-life care option, said his suffering - and his family's - was prolonged unnecessarily.

"He wanted other patients to not have to endure what he endured," Villegas recounted. "He told me, 'Don't stop. Show the photos, tell my story. Let it be known that this needs to change.'"

Groups opposed to the bill

cite religious and moral concerns. A study from Kaiser found one-third of terminally ill adults who ask for medical aid-in-dying pass away before they complete the eligibility process. Advocates estimate since California's End of Life Option Act took effect five years ago, almost 1,400 people have died before obtaining a prescription.

The bill also requires hospitals and hospices to post their stance on medical aid-in-dying on their websites, so patients do not waste precious time trying to find out if their provider is willing to help them.

Kim Callinan, president and CEO of the Compassion and Choices Action Network, said she hopes other states will follow the Golden State's lead.

"This is a huge victory for the moment, for Californians and for really dying Americans in every state," Callinan asserted.

The bill takes effect Jan. 1. Nine other states and Washington D.C have passed medical aid-in-dying legislation.

Volunteers Needed to Help Kids Learn to Read

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Volunteers are needed to help local kids learn to read through United Way California Capital Region's STARS program that pairs volunteers and students up through sixth grade for online literacy tutoring so they can succeed in school. No prior tutoring knowledge is needed, as United Way provides training for its volunteers, all of whom commit to at least one hour each week split into two 30-minute sessions for three months. Volunteers are especially needed during the hours of 3-5pm. For more information or to sign up as a volunteer: YourLocalUnitedWay.org/STARS.

"We know that if kids aren't reading at grade level by fourth grade, they will have a hard time keeping up across multiple subjects for years to come," said Amber Lovett, interim president and CEO, United Way California Capital Region. "Our STARS volunteers make a world of difference in a child's life by giving just one hour a week. Our tutors not only help them read, they act as positive role models that improve children's overall confidence in school."

United Way's STARS, an acronym for Students and Tutors Achieving Reading Success, has 65 volunteers enrolled to work with nearly 100 students in Robla

School District, CHOC housing sites in Yolo County and Woodland Joint Unified School District to provide online tutoring through the platform Book Nook so kids can reach grade level reading. Together, the tutor and student work through the literacy curriculum and build vocabulary, fluency and comprehension skills through a variety of games, books and lessons provided in the online portal.

The local United Way has been helping children improve literacy for more than four years, including through its AARP Experience Corps program that paired retirees with children in schools before the pandemic hit.

For nearly 100 years, United Way California Capital Region has brought local people together to make community change happen. With a mission to build stronger, healthier and more compassionate communities, the local United Way starts at square one: helping every family succeed so their community can too. Serving Amador, El Dorado, Placer, Sacramento and Yolo counties, the local United Way is working to meet its 20-year commitment to significantly reduce poverty in the region by building capacity in undervalued communities, creating meaningful partnerships, seeking equity in education and making social justice investments in families. Young Readers Fund Honors Retiring Library Director Rivkah

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Rivkah K. Sass will retire as Director of the Sacramento Public Library at the end of 2021, but she will be leaving behind a legacy that will help early readers for many years to come. Friends of the Sacramento Public Library has launched a campaign to raise funds to endow the Young Readers Fund, honoring Rivkah Sass and nurturing early readers. Future Library Directors will be able to use income from the endowment to fund books, materials and innovative programs and technology for young readers.

The Friends' fundraising campaign kicked off on September 15 and will wrap up on December 31, with a goal of raising \$100,000. Find out more and donate at: saclibfriends.org.

"When we asked Rivkah how she wants to be remembered, she did not hesitate," said Friends President Karen Wilson. "For Rivkah, it's always been about the kids." The Friends are entering their sixth year of partnership with the Library on Book First, a program that provides a free book to kids in underserved schools, with 60,000 kids receiving books in the program so far. More than 180 schools will take part in Book First in the 2021-22 school year.

A former children's librarian, Rivkah has made Sacramento's library a national frontrunner in its work to support early learning. Her dedication to connect libraries with schools led to the creation of the Student Success card, which gives all

students in a school district full access to the library's digital resources. The library's Summer Reading Program has seen a 400% rise in participation, with more than 33,000 a year people taking part.

In recognition of her leadership, the American Library Association awarded Rivkah its 2020 Charlie Robinson Award, given to a public library director who has been a risk taker, an innovator, or a change agent. Sacramento Public Library is a regular recipient of national recognition.

During her 12 years of service as Library Director, Rivkah has been a determined advocate for library services. Some examples include:

Adding critical staffing to support youth; Responding to the public's request to expand library hours, reworking limited resources to add more than 169 access hours across 28 locations; More than doubling

funding for books and materials to meet community demand for a robust and diverse collection; Leading the effort to launch the Career Online High School initiative at SPL, providing adults the opportunity to earn an accredited high school diploma; Introducing the Library of Things, allowing library users to check out everything from a GoPro camera to a ukulele to a leaf blower; Introducing the I Street Press, making it possible for local writers to self-publish more than 34,000 books since 2011; Installing makers spaces, which are creative spaces equipped with technology like 3D printers and sound equipment.

"Rivkah has done so much for our whole community, especially our children," Wilson says. "The Young Readers Fund gives the community a chance to say thank you, and keep her good work going." ★

stint of homelessness. After years of wandering and just getting by, Sarah began working with the SSHH Homeless Outreach Navigator, Gabby. Outreach navigators work as a resource for those on the street, helping people like Sarah get on track to secure permanent housing by navigating the housing and social programs inventories of the region. When forced to leave her home, Sarah lost important documentation that the navigator was now working to reclaim. Sarah slept in a tent while waiting for her items to be processed. "I was on the street waiting. It was absolute misery. I experienced some messed up stuff."

One morning, Sarah woke up to a text. The navigator's connections and Sarah's patience paid off. She was moving into her own place at Quinn Cottages in Sacramento. Rancho Cordova HART, a local 501(c)3 dedicated to providing resources to the local unhoused, helped Sarah move in and supported the navigator through this effort.

This was one of Sarah's first messages to

her navigator after being housed, "Don't be alarmed if you don't see me. I'll be in the shower turning into a prune. And I'm fine with that."

Sarah didn't stop at just receiving help. Once settled, she posted a donation drive on Next Door to collect sleeping bags for the homeless. It was almost winter. The response was incredible. At one point, "Hugs for the Homeless," sold out the entire stock of sleeping bags on Amazon.com. HOPE Cooperative, a fellow 501(c)3 organization in the region, noticed this good deed and offered Sarah a job as their homeless outreach navigator.

"I've come a long way from eating Popeyes Chicken right out of the dumpster. Now I have a brand-new car and my own place. I have a life now. I have dreams, goals, and aspirations. And I'm making it happen. I've slept in parks, in cemeteries, I've slept in tents. You name it, I have been there. I've come a long way. Now I'm really glad to be giving back to my community."

Senator Dahle's Measure to Expand the Sierra Nevada Conservancy Signed

Senator Brian Dahle (R-Bieber) was pleased to see his measure to increase the pace and scale of forest and watershed restoration signed by the Governor. SB 208 will expand the boundaries of the Sierra Nevada Conservancy (SNC), ensuring the resilience of our natural resources and the communities that depend on them.

SB208 modifies the regional boundaries of the Sierra Nevada Conservancy, as defined in Section 33302 of the Public Resources Code. The modification will add a section of Siskiyou County to the Sierra Nevada Conservancy as well as increase the area of Shasta County already included in the SNC.

The Sierra Nevada Conservancy was created through bi-partisan legislation and signed into California law in 2004. At that time the definition of the region was established to include areas lying within 22 counties of California, including the counties of Alpine, Amador, Butte, Calaveras, El Dorado, Fresno, Inyo, Kern, Lassen, Madera, Mariposa, Modoc, Mono, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Shasta, Sierra, Tehama, Tulare, Tuolumne, and Yuba. There have been no modifications since 2004 to the region's definition.

"I'm pleased to be adding portions of Siskiyou, Shasta and Trinity Counties under the Sierra Nevada Conservancy. The

conservancy has a superior reputation for thoughtful stewardship of one of California's most important resources, our headwaters," said Senator Dahle. "By having all these headwaters under one local agency, it will give more opportunities to manage important forest management projects as well as meadow restoration projects to ensure that we continue to have healthy forests and a robust headwaters system, ensuring all Californians have fresh clean water to drink and safe forests to visit." The Sierra Nevada Conservancy initiates, encourages, and supports efforts that improve the environmental, economic and social well-being of the Sierra Nevada region, its communities and citizens of California.

SB 208 will become effective January 1, 2022.

Senator Brian Dahle represents California's 1st Senate District, which contains all or portions of 11 counties, including Alpine, El Dorado, Lassen, Modoc, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Sacramento, Shasta, Sierra, and Siskiyou. ★

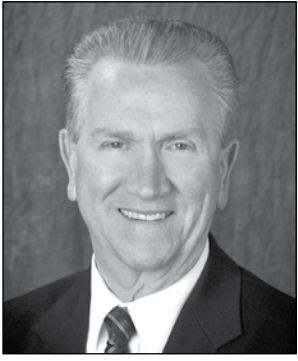

Governor Signs SB 639 Prohibiting Work for Less than State Minimum Wage

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Governor Newsom has signed State Senator Maria Elena Durazo's (D-Los Angeles) SB 639 into law, which will phase out the use of the federal 14(c) certificate in California, and ultimately prohibit paying workers with disabilities less than the California minimum wage and transition workers with disabilities to competitive, integrated employment. California joins Alaska, Maryland, Nevada, New Hampshire, Oregon, and Texas, in outlawing paying workers with disabilities a subminimum wage. The bill is sponsored by Disability Rights California, the State Council on Developmental Disabilities, and Legal Aid at Work.

"California is ending the subminimum wage for people with disabilities," said Senator Durazo. "All work should be treated with dignity, and that means that nobody is paid less than the minimum wage. SB 639 develops a phaseout plan to ensure a path to competitive, integrated employment for these workers. I applaud Governor Newsom for recognizing the injustice that workers with disabilities are facing and remedying this clear violation of their civil rights."

Since 1938, Section 214 (c)(1)(A) of the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) has given California employers the ability to apply for a certificate that allows them to pay employees with disabilities less than the federal minimum wage of \$7.25 an hour. This FLSA 14(c) certificate was intended to provide opportunities for employment for World War I veterans with disabilities, but instead created segregated workplaces, and the unemployment rate of persons with disabilities is twice as high as other workers.

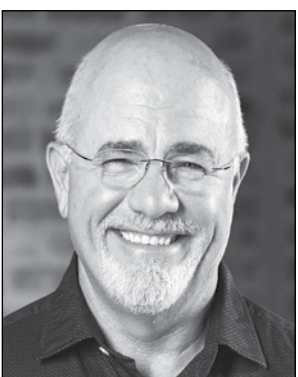
What has actually materialized under FLSA is a pool of highly exploited labor. Over 5,000 Californians with disabilities

are currently working in sheltered workshops and are being paid as little as 2 dollars per hour.

Sheltered workshops were originally developed to provide employment opportunities for disabled World War I veterans returning from service. Since then, sheltered workshops have morphed into full-scale operations to primarily employ persons with intellectual or developmental disabilities in segregated settings. Beyond the FLSA, the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 made it illegal for employers to discriminate against workers who had disabilities. Yet, sheltered workshops remain in operation and the economic opportunities for people with disabilities continue to erode. SB 639 phases out sheltered workshops, develops a path to integrated employment, and ensures workers with disabilities earn no less than the California minimum wage.

"Today was a great day for Californians with disabilities who want to work in the competitive labor market," said Andy Imparato, executive director of Disability Rights California. "By ending the discriminatory practice of paying people with disabilities less than the federally-protected minimum wage, Governor Newsom has helped California reassert its role as a national leader in disability rights and worker rights."

"About 100 years ago, it was seen as compassionate to pay less to people with disabilities," said Aaron Carruthers, executive director of the State Council on Developmental Disabilities. "But times changed, views of what is possible for people with disabilities changed, and options changed. With the Governor's signature, people who were once trapped in sheltered workshops will now be able to design a truly meaningful day. This is the dignity the Governor spoke about when signing the bill." ★

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Centers for Disease Control has recently released additional information regarding booster shots, outlining guidance for who should get a third vaccine dose and who can receive a booster. If you are confused, you're not alone. Here are some helpful FAQs to clear up the confusion around third doses and boosters.

Who can get a booster shot?

The only booster currently available is Pfizer. The CDC recommends individuals receive a booster if it has been at least 6 months since their second Pfizer dose AND they.....

Are 65 years or older; Are 18 to 64 and considered to work in high-risk environments (which include nursing homes, hospitals or healthcare settings, or school settings); Are 18 to 64 and have certain underlying medical conditions.

Can I get a Third Dose?

Let's start with the difference between a booster and a third vaccine dose. Individuals who are severely immunocompromised may not achieve full immunity

from the two-dose regimen. Third doses are available for persons who are moderate to severely immunocompromised. They are only available for those who receive Moderna or Pfizer vaccines and can be given at least 28 days after the second dose.

Can I get a booster if I received the Moderna or Johnson and Johnson vaccine?

Boosters for those who received the Moderna or Johnson and Johnson vaccine are not yet approved by the CDC. Additional information and guidance is expected in the near future.

Where can I get a booster or third dose?

Individuals who are immunocompromised and would like to get a third dose should contact their primary care provider. Healthcare providers, pharmacies and community clinics are currently administering Pfizer boosters for those who are eligible.

Public-Service Workers Rejoice as Feds Forgive Student Debt

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Hundreds of thousands of teachers, nurses, social workers, military officers and others in public service can breathe a sigh of relief as the Biden administration announced major reforms to the public-service loan forgiveness program.

Miguel Cardona, U.S. Secretary of Education, said the program will be streamlined so about 550,000 more people will qualify.

"In 2007, Congress made a pledge to forgive loans if you serve the community for ten years, and we're going to make that right," Cardona remarked.

The program is supposed to pay off remaining loans for people who have made payments for ten

years while working in a qualifying profession, but you had to have a certain type of loan. Now, people can get a waiver and be able to count payments on other types of student loans toward the forgiveness program.

Merrie Wolf, a longtime math teacher from Tulsa, was told after a decade of payments that she would have to convert to a different type of loan and start the clock all over again.

"The student-loan process has been a nightmare, to say the least," Wolf asserted. "I was led to believe a whole ten years that I was headed toward Public Service Loan Forgiveness."

According to the Institute for College Access and Success, in 2018-19, the most recent year from which data is available, 48% of California college

graduates had student loan debt, with an average debt load of more than \$21,000.

A GAO report found 99% of the people who apply for the Public Service Loan Forgiveness program are denied.

Jesse Yedinak Gray, research director and assistant professor at Brown University School of Public Health, said the changes are a light at the end of the tunnel after years of crushing debt.

"It's a lot of money that you don't get to use to save for retirement, or save for, say, my son's education either," Gray pointed out. "It's ending up costing so much more than I ever thought it would."

The changes mean more military officers will qualify, and the feds are going to review all applications that were previously denied. ★

Kiley Demands Accountability for Vaccine Mandates

California Legislature passes 21 bills

The second year of the coronavirus pandemic in California was shaped by two political undercurrents at the state Capitol: a budget awash with cash, thanks to a booming stock market and federal aid, and a looming recall election asking voters to throw Gov. Gavin Newsom out of office.

The massive budget surplus allowed Newsom and legislative Democrats to go big on a progressive agenda they believe will help the state recover from COVID hardships. They passed a \$262.6 billion budget that includes preschool for all 4-year-olds, health insurance for low-income undocumented immigrants age 50 and older, and \$600 stimulus payments for most Californians – landing in bank accounts just weeks before the Sept. 14 recall election.

Newsom found himself with so many dollars to spend that he gave away \$115 million to encourage Californians to get the COVID-19 vaccine with a series of game-show style lotteries.

But gobs of money and Democrats' supermajority didn't make everything possible. Tensions between moderate and liberal Democrats stymied many proposals. The recall threat also may have doomed some

legislation that might have reflected unfavorably upon California and its governor. Bills that stalled included proposals to create single-payer health care, ban corporate donations to political candidates, legalize psychedelic drugs, sanction clinics where addicts can use illegal drugs under medical supervision, and allow people to turn their bodies into garden compost after death.

Progressive legislation to allow more offenders to have their records expunged and overhaul the bail system also stalled amid concerns over California's rising murder rate and an especially brutal killing in Sacramento.

With epic wildfires burning in a state stricken by drought, lawmakers approved \$1 billion for wildfire prevention but rejected a bill that

called for reducing greenhouse gas emissions beyond current mandates, which officials have said California is already not on pace to meet. Democratic Senate leader Toni Atkins told reporters after the last night of the session wrapped up that such ambitious legislation may take more time to negotiate, and she expects that to continue next year.

The final night was unusually subdued

compared with the chaos of the last two years. At the end of 2020, Republican senators were forced to vote remotely because of a COVID infection while Assemblymembers were required to vote in person, prompting one to make a late-night floor speech cradling her newborn baby. Not to mention the previous year, when the Senate was evacuated and a hazmat crew called in

after an anti-vaccine protester tossed a menstrual cup of blood from the overhead gallery, splattering senators.

Amid the relative calm of 2021, lawmakers managed to send the governor hundreds of bills, which he has until Oct. 10 to sign or veto. Even if voters oust him on Sept. 14, the transition period of as long as 38 days means the fate of these bills is in Newsom's hands. ★

Speaking on condition of anonymity, an employee for Southwest said, "The pilots are very upset. There is no organized sick out, but many employees are very disgruntled." The pushback began Friday when a reported three out of 35 employees showed up for work at the Jacksonville center. According to the source, "almost every flight out of Orlando was cancelled," as employees protested the new mandate. The source went on to suggest that the Biden administration was in touch with several airlines over the past week and "threatened all CEOs" to enforce vaccine mandates.

Frontline doctor claims 100 to 200 members of Congress treated with Ivermectin | 10 Oct 2021 | Dr. Pierre Kory of Frontline Doctors recently tweeted the following: "Between 100-200 United States Congress Members (plus many of their staffers & family members) with COVID...were treated by a colleague over the past 15 months with Ivermectin & the I-MASK+ protocol at FLCCC Alliance. None have gone to hospital."

Federal investigators secretly started using 'keyboard warrants' and asked Google to provide govt with users' search terms | 5 Oct 2021 | The U.S. government is reportedly secretly issuing warrants for Google to provide user data on anyone typing in certain search terms, raising fears that innocent online users could get caught up in serious crime investigations at a greater frequency than previously thought. In an attempt to track down [alleged] criminals, federal investigators have started using new "keyword warrants" and used them to ask Google to provide them information on anyone who searched a victim's name or their address during a particular year, an accidentally unsealed court document that Forbes found shows. Google has to respond to thousands of warrant orders each year, but the keyword warrants are a relatively new strategy used by the government and are controversial.

AG Garland's son-in-law's company issues 'resource' claiming Trump supporters are White supremacists | 9 Oct 2021 | An education [sic] company co-founded by Attorney General Merrick Garland's son-in-law issued a "resource" for teachers this year that claims supporters of former President Donald Trump are White supremacists. The educational workshop released by Panorama Education, co-founded by Alexander "Xan" Tanner, the group's president, revolves around "systemic racism" and includes an article as a resource that states the Ku Klux Klan and attendees of Trump's rallies are both "examples of white supremacy."

Federal Workers, U.S. Service Members Sue Biden Admin Over Vaccine Mandates | 2 Oct 2021 | A group of federal workers, including several members of the military, are suing the Biden administration over a pair of mandates directing all federal workers and military service members to get vaccinated against COVID-19. "Americans have remained idle for far too long as our nation's elected officials continue to satisfy their voracious appetites for power," says the lawsuit, filed by a group of plaintiffs including four Air Force officers and a Secret Service agent, according to The Washington Post. Ten plaintiffs filed a suit in the U.S. District Court in Washington on September 23, seeking for the judge to place an injunction on Joe Biden's vaccine mandates that cover all federal workers and contractors, as well as all members of the U.S. military. ★

Parents: The Secret to Drug-Free Youth

On average, kids first try drugs between the ages of 13-15. Statistics like these can be terrifying to parents who are trying to keep their children drug-free in a world that glamorizes getting high. While statistics around teen drug abuse are troubling, there is one ray of hope that continues to bring adolescent drug use down: Parents. Research repeatedly shows that parents are the number one influence in their child's life. So armed with the knowledge that you really can make a difference, let's talk about the "how" of helping your child stay drug-free.

Set clear expectations

Help your child stay drug-free by setting clear rules and expectations. Talk to your child about family rules concerning drugs, marijuana, alcohol, inhalants, and other risky behaviors. Set clear consequences about what happens when those rules are broken. School-sponsored programs should NOT be the first time your child hears about or considers the consequences of drug use. Research shows that you should talk to your child about the harms and dangers of drugs as early as nine years old.

Come up with a plan

With your child or teen come up with a plan for when they will be confronted with the choice to participate in risky behaviors. Talk out and act out different scenarios with your child before they face these tense situations with peer pressure and emotional stress on their own. You might get some pushback from your older teens about roleplaying. Share your personal experiences or other stories that will help your teen feel empowered to say "no" in high-pressure situations.

The plan to stay drug-free should also include steps for what to do if your child makes a mistake or finds themselves in a bad situation. Growing up my family had a code word that we could text to our

parents that meant "come get me right now!" When I would find myself in a tricky situation I would send off the code word in a text to my dad. Within a few seconds, my dad would call asking me to come home. That way I didn't have to come up with excuses of why I was leaving early--I just blamed my "uncool" parents.

Show you care

Lastly, be involved in your child's life. Every time your child or teen leaves the house you should be asking questions about who they will be with, what they are doing, and if parents will be present. When you know your child and are an active part of their life, having tough conversations becomes a lot easier. Building and maintaining trust between you and your child starts with becoming part of their world. Have fun together, talk together, and ask them questions about their day. When you show your child you care about every part of their life they are more likely to open up to you about the things that are troubling them.

Helping your child stay drug-free doesn't have to be overly complicated. As their parent, you have the power to influence their decisions now and in the future. Don't shy away from hard conversations about family rules and expectations, but instead see it as your chance to help shape your child's future.

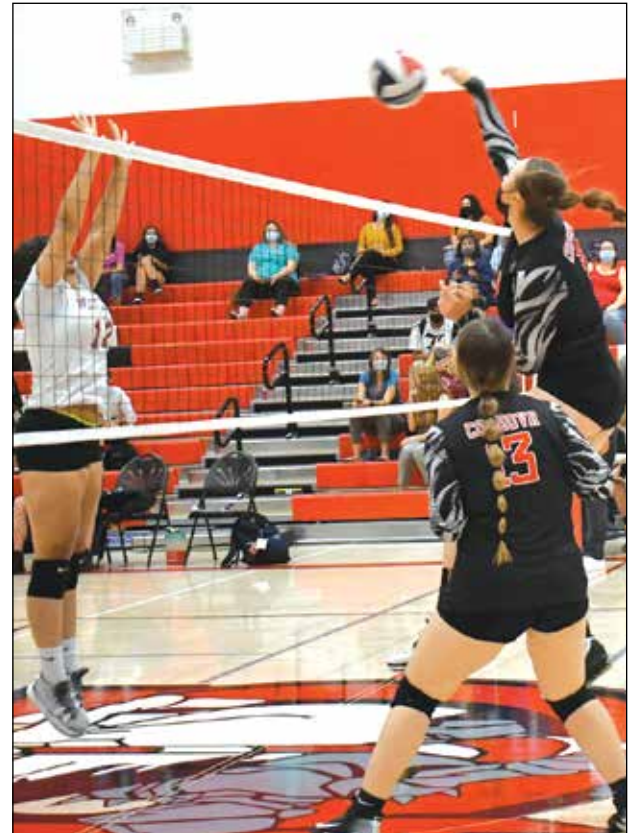

The first 50 permanent supportive housing units in Phase 1 were completed in 2016 and are fully occupied by formerly homeless and disabled veterans and their families.

Mather Veterans Village is the first permanent supportive housing development for homeless and disabled veterans in the Sacramento region.

Garrett Gatewood, Mayor of Rancho Cordova, said in his speech “Veterans Village is Rancho Cordova’s vision of how to treat our veterans.”

The location couldn’t have been more perfect than the City of Rancho Cordova. This community values its veterans, having been the site of an active air force base. Many who served decided

to establish roots in Rancho Cordova, and approximately 5,000 veterans continue to call it home.

Cordova Community Partnership organization. The overall goal is to have a positive career impact or lead into new employment or new careers for residents. Through the program, 170 Rancho Cordova residents will be assisted in such areas as skills building, job placement and mentoring. Of those 170, 50 of those spots will be devoted to bringing mothers back into the workforce.

Economic Development Manager Amanda Norton, who led the presentation, stressed the program was open to all city residents and Shinder Gill from the Folsom Cordova Community Partnership looked forward to increasing “their service capacity to focus on Rancho Cordova” and to identify work barriers to participants and “remove them.”

Councilmembers Siri Pulipati and David Sander had concerns about tracking the long-term success of the program, but both Norton and Gill stated they were positioned to successfully do so. Norton also mentioned she and her team are working in conjunction with the Chamber of Commerce as well as planning a large media rollout to get the information to the public.

Honoring notable sons and daughters of Rancho Cordova, as well as key aspects of the city’s history and place, was brought up when the Council next tackled what Councilmember Sander called the “disconnect” between the city and some of its street names. Deriding such poorly named city streets like “Ocean View” and looking to the future, Sander and Councilmember Linda Budge started a subcommittee on the matter and ideas generated during their meetings were discussed. Specifically, more communication with the developers who are currently the most responsible for submitting street names and to utilize an agreed upon collection of themes broken down into categories and individuals for future naming.

Individuals mentioned were Aerojet scientists, veterans, Sports Hall of Fame members,

local leaders in government, faith, community and more. Categories included Northern California trees, Gold Rush history, space themes, and Wine/Vineyards. Context would also be a factor. For example, veteran names near Mather Airport or Aerojet scientists in Rio or Westborough.

Councilmember Budge felt the Rio del Oro development would make an ideal opportunity to implement any new policies.

Earlier in the night during Council Reports, all assembled praised the recent Air Show along with those behind the scene (organizers, staff, police, volunteers etc.) to make it happen.

“A step into normalcy,” said Mayor Gatewood who brought his amazed mother to her very first city Air Show.

Also mentioned during reports was the award bestowed upon City Manager Cyrus Abhar by the Sacramento Region Business Association as Best City Manager in the region, an honor he humbly felt belonged to not just him but the city and staff.

A little less intense than the anger regarding Flame of Fire, other public comments of the night included Scott Faulds’s idea to challenge nearby cities in how much water each could save which much sparked enthusiasm from the Council. Helen Whelan Bashaw expressed her disappointment in the Planning Commission nomination process discussed on September 20, saying it wasn’t based as much on community focus as choosing “Mini-Me’s” that reflect the attitudes of the Council. Other comments included those about the recent public discussion meeting about Coloma Road improvement.

At the beginning of the night, Mayor Gatewood awarded a Plaque/Proclamation to members of the Soroptimist International of Rancho Cordova and Gold River in honor of Soroptimist International’s 100th anniversary as an organization and the dedication of the local club’s service to the city. ★

State Lawmakers Choose Style Over Security for Capitol Annex Project

If we've learned anything from the January 6 insurrection, it's that we can't take security for granted. Unfortunately, it seems state lawmakers do not share that same sentiment. Why? Because they're planning to build a new glass Capitol building with multiple weak spots, in stark contrast to all other state Capitols.

As a former Marine, current architect, and long-time Californian, I have concerns.

While there's quite some irony that the convoluted Capitol Annex Project is destined to end with a "crystal palace," that's not where my concerns lie. They lie in the fact that no legislator or architect involved in the project discussed how an all-glass exterior poses security risks for state employees.

In these turbulent times when we are routinely reading news reports of attacks on our schools and government buildings, many in the architectural profession choose to increase our facilities' security capacities to ensure the safety of our children and government workers. If it were up to us and security were the primary goal of the facility, we would put the buildings in an underground silo with only one entrance and exit. Considering most people would balk at all state facilities being built underground, we as architects must strike a balance between a fortress and a primarily glass structure with numerous access points, the latter of which is what is being proposed for the new Capitol Annex.

Short of cladding the structure in ballistic glazing, which is cost prohibitive, a glass exterior provides ample opportunity for foul play. Without any exterior walls, like the current granite

and plaster walls of the Capitol and Annex buildings which block small arms rounds, the occupants near the exterior are unable to take cover from possible gun fire. In addition, all-glass walls would disclose the internal movement of law enforcement, such as escorting a high-ranking State leader to safety, as any efforts inside the building would be exposed to the attacker's view outside the building.

As we saw from the January 6 attack, the ability to immediately seek effective cover saves lives while law enforcement tries to get the situation in hand.

Outside of the all-glass concerns, lawmakers are also planning to wrap the proposed Annex basement with a parking garage on three sides. This, too, poses security risks. Not only from vehicular laden bombs, but from aerosol toxic agents which could be released into the building

through the parking garage, agents such as those used in the 1995 Tokyo subway attacks.

If you look at State Capitols around the country, you'll find some similarities – they're sturdy, tough buildings made out of materials such as marble, sandstone, granite, or brick. Why? Because the architects involved in each Capitol's creation knew that a state's legislative hub needs to be regal, functional and, most importantly, safe. Even today, the California State Capitol stands firmly with its Neo-Classical style; why would we weaken her by attaching a delicate glass building to the back?

Clearly, our lawmakers have forgotten about the 2001 incident where a semi-truck rammed into the south steps of the Capitol causing a large fire and \$13.5 million in damages. And, we know that the cost of the repairs from the January 6 attack has already exceeded \$1 million, primarily from busted doors and smashed windows – could you imagine how bad the damage would have been if the U.S. Capitol were made of glass instead of stone, marble, and iron?

California's lawmakers are choosing a trendy design over the safety of staff and the millions of visitors who tour the Capitol each year.

It's time to stop this wasteful, and now, dangerous project.
