Free County Flu Clinics Going on Now

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - With flu season approaching, Sacramento County Public Health urges everyone to get a flu shot to protect themselves and their families from influenza. From Sept. 28 – Nov. 13, the Sacramento County Immunization Assistance Program will host free Adult and Family Flu Clinics throughout Sacramento County.

This year it is especially important to get a flu shot as COVID-19 continues to spread. In an effort to fight both viruses, all Public Health clinics will offer flu and COVID-19 vaccines, including at existing COVID-19 vaccine clinics. It is safe to receive flu and COVID-19 vaccines at the same time, according to the

"Vaccines are proven to reduce the risk of severe illness, hospitalization and death," said Sacramento County Public Health Officer Dr. Olivia Kasirye. "Those who cannot receive infants and individuals with a compromised immune system such as those going through chemotherapy, rely on others being vaccinated to help protect them."

All clinics take walkins, without the need for appointments.

Vaccination of people at high risk for flu complications is especially important to decrease their risk of severe illness. These include seniors and people with chronic conditions such as diabetes, high blood pressure, lung disease and kidney disease. The same underlying health conditions put people at higher risk for COVID-19. If you are at high risk, it is especially important for you to get a flu vaccine this year. Getting a flu vaccine will not only reduce your risk from flu but also help conserve potentially scarce health care resources.

Flu vaccine is also recommended for infants ages six months and older who do not have a medical condition that makes the flu vaccine inadvisable.

As with COVID-19, it's crucial to practice good health habits:

If you feel flu-like symptoms, limit contact with others to keep from infecting them:

Stay home for at least 24 hours after you fever is gone, except to get medical care or for other necessities; Cover your coughs or sneezes and wash your hands; Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth; Clean and disinfect surfaces and Continued on page 3

Cost-of-Living Crisis Continues to Drive Up California's Poverty Rate

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - According to data published by the U.S. Census Bureau, California continues to have the worst poverty rate among all states when adjusted to account for government programs designed to help low-income families and necessary expenses for critical goods and services.

"More people live in poverty in California than in any other state because of our high and rising costs of living. More than 16 percent of Americans living in poverty live in California, despite being home to just 12 percent of the population," said Rob Lapsley, president of the California Business Roundtable. "Driven by our housing and overall cost-of-living crisis, more Californians struggling to make ends meet are falling into poverty."

California's costadjusted poverty rate (2018-2020 average) was 15.4 percent, while 16.5 percent of all Americans living in poverty live in California. Rates among the other states ranged from 5.9 percent in Minnesota to 14.5 percent in Mississippi (16.5 percent in DC), with the US average at 11.2 percent and the average among all states other than California at 10.6 percent. For the first time, California residents paid more for electricity in March 2021 than the average for all other states

continue to pay the highest gas taxes and prices in the country and for the ongoing housing crisis through increased housing costs. As tracked by the Center for Jobs and the Economy's Affordability Index, nearly all necessity costs for the average California family continue to increase.

"Unfortunately, it is likely that our poverty crisis will continue to get worse," Mr. Lapsley continued. "We are seeing a significant increase in inflation, which will drive costs up even higher. At in the nation. They also the same time, a series of new and expensive energy mandates are being implemented, which will drive up the cost on home electricity, gasoline, goods and services, and housing. And let's not forget the more than \$200 billion in new and higher taxes introduced by the California Legislature in 2021 alone. With more than 24 million unconnected households nationwide, the digital divide disproportionately affects minority and low-income populations. According to the Federal Communications Commission, 35 percent of adults who do not use broadband at home are older, poorer, less educated, more likely to be a racial or ethnic minority, and more likely to have a disability than those with a home connection. 

Who is Using All the Water!

Californians reduced their water use at home by a meager 1.8% statewide in July compared to last year, even after Gov. Gavin Newsom urged residents to conserve 15% and drought continues to spread across the state.

Officials warned water providers south of the Delta who rely on state water allocations - already slashed to 5% this year - to brace for the possibility of zero supply next year.

The Department of Water Resources also cautioned that next year's cuts in supply could expand to growers and others known as settlement contractors, whose claims to the water predate California's massive systems of reservoirs, aqueducts and canals.

"Californians always have hope, and that's healthy. But Nemeth, director of the state Department of Water Resources, said in an interview. "We're doing more conservative planning than we've ever done."

Drought conditions deemed extreme or worse now cover nearly 90% of the state. Hundreds of domestic wells are running dry, and levels in major reservoirs have dropped drastically below historic averages - which bodes ill for supplies next year.

"The challenge is there is no water," Nemeth said.

"We're planning for the worst, but we are hoping for something better," Nemeth added at today's meeting of the State Water Resources Control Board.

In early July, Newsom urged Californians to voluntarily cut hold water use were along the domestic water use by 15%, but hard-hit North Coast, with a in the absence of a statewide mandate, a patchwork of restrictions has emerged. The result: Californians used about 191.5 billion acre feet of water in their homes, businesses and other industrial or institutional spaces reduced its use by 37%. Both

"I'm not here to say 1.8 is a good number," said Joaquin Esquivel, chair of the State Water Resources Control Board, at a Monday press briefing. "We're going to have to continue to dig in deeper and look forward to seeing what the numbers show then in August."

statewide conservation orders, Esquivel said that for now, the board is reflecting on the data. "We need to continue to see that response and decision-making, and the state's here to make sure that if we need to go mandatory, that's where we're going."

The biggest drops in housenearly 17% reduction in July 2021 compared with July 2020. The Sonoma County city of Healdsburg led the state by cutting its water use by more than half, and Cloverdale, which

in July, only 1.8% less than a cities enacted mandatory water use restrictions.

Water use in the South Coast region, which includes Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego and Ventura counties, was roughly even with last summer, down 0.1%. However, about 40% of water suppliers in the area actually used more water.

San Francisco Bay Area res-When asked when to expect idents cut their water use by 8.4%. Northern and southern San Joaquin Valley residents reduced use by 0.8% and 1.6%, respectively.

Officials warned that major cuts could come for irrigation districts, cities and other water users south of the Delta relying on supplies from the State Water Project, which provides water to 27 million Californians and 750,000 acres of farmland.

At this point, Nemeth said there's "a slim likelihood" of supplies for these water systems, which includes the giant Metropolitan Water District, which provides imported water to 19 million people in Southern California. Worst-case scenario. she said, "we've asked them to plan for no allocation from the State Water Project."

Those suppliers, including in the Bay Area, Southern California, the Central Coast and the San Joaquin Valley, have seen steep cuts before, during the last drought in 2014. But this time is worse: Even a wet year is unlikely to bring relief.

"We're starting with record low (reservoir) storage," Nemeth said. "We would have to have north of 140% of (average) precipitation to generate average runoff into the reservoirs that would begin filling that hole."

State and federal project operators have come under fire from environmental advocates for supplying hundreds of thousands of acre feet to these senior contractors, while failing to meet water quality standards and cutting allocations to more-junior agricultural contractors and cities.

Feather River Con-tractors,

for instance, were allocated the lowest levels allowed in their contracts, but still were expected to receive nearly 600,000 acre feet of water, according to the Department of Water Resources - enough water to supply 1.8 million Southern California households for a year. That's about three times more water than long-term State Water Project contractors, including the giant Metropolitan Water District, were provided.

California's drought conditions and warming temperatures are threatening salmon and other

For endangered Sacra-mento River winter-run Chinook salmon, "we've modeled the temperature dependent mortality at about 80% this year, meaning only 20% even survive to make it out of the gravel," Barry Thom, West Coast regional administrator for NOAA Fisheries, told the water board.

Doug Obegi, a senior attorney with the Natural Resources Defense Council, urged the board on Tuesday to require state and federal water project operators to cut supplies to settlement contractors to protect fish.

If supplies aren't reduced, "you're going to have even worse temperature mortality of salmon next year," Obegi told CalMatters. "You start with less water, and you have less at the end of the year, you're going to have a lot more dead fish. It's grim."

Nemeth said she issued the early warning to prepare growers dependent on senior contracts well in advance of making planting decisions.

Last year, early planting by growers "really limited the amount of decisions we thought we could make without causing real economic damage," Nemeth said. This year, "We want to alert them sooner that it could be worse than they've experienced before."

At the age of 92, Joy passed away peacefully feeling the love of her family; Mary Lou, Charley,





Suspect Arrested for Carjacking and Maple Glen Officer Involved Shooting

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -PROLOGUE: On September 7, 2021, at approximately 9:54 p.m., officers from a local police department responded to a call from a 72-year-old female victim who stated that her grandson assaulted her, forcibly removed her from her vehicle and drove away with the car leaving her in the street. Officers arrived and rendered aid to the victim until fire arrived and transported her to a local area hospital for treatment of a possible arm fracture. This incident was not known by the Sheriff's Office Communications Center or responding deputies at the time of the incident.

Approximately 9 minutes later on September 7, 2021, at 10:03 P.M., the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Communications Center received a call from a resident on Maple Glen Road in Sacramento County stating that someone crashed their automobile into a ditch outside their home. The caller explained that an elderly member of their household went out to check on the only person inside the disabled vehicle and was physically assaulted as the subject exited the car in an attempt to leave the scene. The male suspect then began walking southbound on Maple Glen Road. Fixed video evidence at the scene shows that the subject entered onto the porch of another residence and attempted to open the front door but it was locked. He then left the porch, picked up a large river rock from the yard and returned to the porch, rang the doorbell and appeared to wait for someone to answer the door. After a few minutes when no one answered the door, he left with the rock in his hand. He walked off the property and continued southward on Maple Glen to a third residence where he attempted to open the locked perimeter security gate.

The first deputy arrived on Maple Glen driving north in a marked sheriff's patrol SUV. The deputy saw a subject that matched the description given by the original caller walking down the street towards the patrol vehicle on the passenger side of the SUV. The deputy stopped and called out for the suspect to stop. He ignored the command and kept walking down the side of the SUV. The deputy got out of his vehicle continuing to give commands as he walked down the driver's side until both met at the back. The suspect, with the rock, struck the deputy in the head so hard that the rock bounced and traveled several feet from the initial impact, causing him to become dazed and disoriented.

The deputy then fired the first round and fell to the ground. The suspect, not fazed by the sound of the gunfire then immediately engages the grounded deputy in a physical fight, punching and kicking him as he attempts to get off the ground. The deputy then fires a second round but the suspect continues to assault him through the gunfire. It is only after three more rounds are fired, two of which hit the suspect, does he finally disengage from the fight and falls to the ground in a seated position.

Additional deputies arrived on scene and rendered aid to the suspect until fire arrived and transported him to an area hospital for treatment. He remains hospitalized in stable condition.

Sheriff's Office Detectives, Internal Affairs, Crime Scene Investigators, the California Department of Justice OIS Team and the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office Investigators responded to the scene and initiated an officer-involved shooting investigation.

The suspect is 26-year-old Darren Napolean Stone who is well known to regional law enforcement. Upon release from the hospital, Stone will be booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail on multiple felony charges.

The deputy involved in the shooting is assigned to the K-9 Unit and is an 11 year veteran of law enforcement. He has been with the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office since 2010 and has 6 years of patrol experience. He was transported to a medical center for treatment of a concussion and thankfully, expected to make a full recovery. We look forward to him returning to full duty very soon.

The material being released has been identified as significant to this incident and includes original 911 calls, in-car camera video, body cam video and private surveillance video. All videos being released have been minimally redacted to ensure the confidentiality and privacy of those involved. This is an active investigation. The information provided in this video release is preliminary and subject to change as investigators learn more.

COMPLETION OF THE FIVE-YEAR REVIEW White Rock Road Dump 1 Located on Aerojet Property South of White Rock Road

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) is informing the community that the 2015 remedy completed for the White Rock Road Dump 1 site (WRRD1) remains protective. WRRD1 is south of White Rock Road on Aerojet-Rocketdyne property, Rancho Cordova, 95742. DTSC recently completed a Five-Year Review of WRRD1, to review and reevaluate the adequacy and verify the completed remedy remains protective of human health, safety, and the environment.

WRRD1 operated as a municipal waste burn dump that served Sacramento County and operated from 1952 or 1953 to 1957. WRRD1 occupies six acres and is located on Aerojet-Rocketdyne property south-southwest of the Old White Rock Road/Nimbus Road intersection. A second municipal burn dump was located east-northeast of the Old White Rock Road/Nimbus Road intersection and operated from August 1957 to February 1958. This dump was known as White Rock Road Dump 2 (WRRD2).

Burn debris and contaminated soil within WRRD1 and WRRD2 were consolidated and compacted within a smaller area of WRRD1. The consolidated and compacted waste was subsequently covered as a final remedy in 2015. The cover consists of a 1-foot thick layer of fine-grained vegetative soil cover, an 8-ounce geotextile fabric, and a 3-foot thick layer well graded dredge tailings.

Long-term components of the remedy include long-term monitoring and land use restriction inspections of WRRD1 to ensure compliance with the Operations and Maintenance Agreement and Land Use Covenant. The Five-Year Review concluded that the remedy is still protective of human health and the environment. DTSC will continue to monitor the Site.

Defendant Convicted for Brutal Rape, Sexual Assault of Two Victims

Office of Sacramento County District Attorney

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -Hawthorne McGee was convicted by a jury of rape, rape of a 14-year-old and oral copulation by force of a 14-year-old. The jury also found true a multiple victim enhancement.

In June 2006, the then 14-year-old victim saw a friend driving in a car with McGee. The victim and her friend ended up going back to McGee's house. McGee instructed the friend to leave the house and the victim stayed behind. McGee then forcefully and brutally raped the victim for approximately one hour in his living room. McGee's girlfriend was in the bedroom, but she could hear the victim crying and telling McGee she was only 14 years old. The girlfriend was able to drive the victim away from the house. In November 2009, a separate victim was waiting for the light rail when McGee began talking

to her. McGee persuaded her to go have pizza with him. He then persuaded her to go back to a motel with him. The victim stated numerous times to McGee that she did not want to have sex and that they were just going to the motel to talk. The victim stated that once inside the room, McGee punched her several times and strangled her as he began to sexually assault her. The victim passed out and woke up in the bed several hours later with injuries all over her body. Evidentiary exams were conducted and DNA was collected after both sexual assaults. A CODIS hit later matched to McGee. After further investigation, charges were filed against McGee for both

McGee has prior convictions for domestic violence, gun possession, DUI and reckless driving.

McGee faces a maximum sentence of 45 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for October 20, 2021, at 1:30 pm in Department 23 before the Honorable Laurie Earl.





as much as I did. See you next year!



Big Red will be playing their next game on October 15th against Johnson. Go Big Red!






