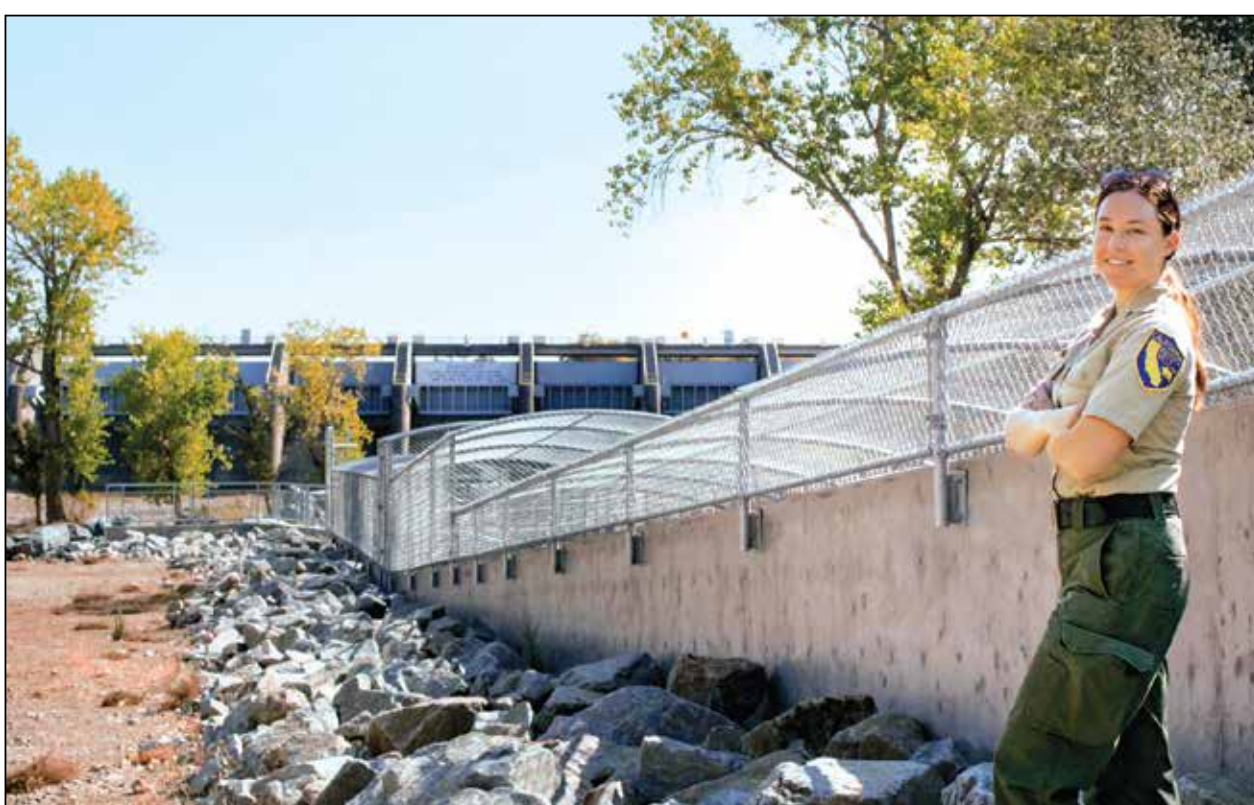

Ready for Fall Run

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - A \$9.7 million project extending Nimbus Hatchery's famous fish ladder into Nimbus Basin is complete. The hatchery's outdated weir and ladder system last year served a final season. When the new passage is activated this November, salmon will take an elongated route to fishery processing. Their 1,900 ft climb will offer visitor viewing windows and a "Sam-Cam" to observe heroic Chinooks ending their lifecycles hundreds of miles from the Pacific Ocean.

Three years in construction, the ladder and its water-level flume are designed to lead those fish that have

not spawned naturally to hatchery fertilization. Egg and milt harvesting began here in the 1950s, after dam construction blocked migratory paths for American River salmon and steelhead. To divert returning fish, a picket weir previously spanned the American River below Hazel Bridge. The device was laboriously dismantled every January and though the weir operated adequately for 65 seasons, a better system has long been on Fish and Wildlife Department wish lists. "The new construction," predicts Bureau of Reclamation project engineer Mark Curney, "will increase the hatchery's operational flexibility and improve public and employee safety."

Many migrating fish breed and die before reaching the facility. Currently

under construction, a gravel bed restoration project near Ancil Hoffman Park will increase mating chances by adding 16,000 yards of gravel to existing beds. The altered American River nevertheless still offers insufficient nesting locations and to mitigate, the Nimbus facility must hatch and dispatch thousands of fry every spring. These reach maturity after several years in the ocean then instinctively head upstream to spawn new generations.

Though recent heatwaves have warmed the American River, it is hoped that water temperatures cool to preferred breeding frigidities by November. Fish that reach Nimbus unfulfilled will be lured by churning water. Piped from Lake Natoma, *Continued on page 3*

Planning a New Planning Commission

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - "Darcy Run!" Councilmember Siri Pulipati humorously said.

City Planning Manager Darcy Goulart probably thought she was done with her presentation to City Council on the reinstating of the City's Planning Commission on Monday, September 20, but instead her exit was delayed not once but twice due to much debate, discussion and no small amount of confusion by members.

Dismantled years ago due to lack of projects and inefficiencies, the Planning Commission is a body whose duties include overseeing conditional use permits, major design reviews (residential, commercial and industrial) plus other land uses within the city.

At a previous Council Meeting a few months ago, the Council and staff discussed the Planning Commission's roles and responsibilities whereas Monday they focused on the qualifications and selection process of members. The hope is the new Planning Commission to be sworn in January 2022.

Most in the Council were in agreement on the Commission containing 7 members (5 appointed, 2 At-large), 2 year terms, experience not necessarily needed and that all members live within the city limits (as opposed to just living in the planning area). However, a point they strongly differed on was the selection process.

Councilmember David Sander and Vice Mayor Donald Terry favored a full Council approval on any nominee while Mayor Garret Gatewood and Councilmember Linda Budge felt their allotted choice should stand on its own without question and be trusted. To think otherwise, was in the words of Councilmember Linda Budge, "a little cheeky". Siri Pulipati was open to both views but ultimately came down on the side of full Councilmember approval.

Another point of contention was how the two At-large members would be appointed with concerns of how long they should run and how they would be chosen. Without any clear consensus on how to address, Councilmember Pulipati suggested to staff to work on a few solutions, but 15 minutes of tense discussion continued instead until City Manager Cyrus stated staff would prepare something. To this, Pulipati—who obviously

this torrent will fill a 150-yard flume that precedes the final climb. The channel is entirely caged to protect salmonids from poaching and debris; nearby riverbanks are permanently closed to anglers. The new ladder parallels a realigned bike trail that runs between Nimbus and Lake Natoma.

Hell-bent on reproduction, fish will encounter submerged barriers, a 10-foot deep pond and concrete steps. Visitor lookouts are positioned to enhance viewing. “We’ve wanted submerged windows for ages,” says Nimbus interpretive specialist Stephanie Ambrosia. “It’s a great way to show how fish group; how they rest between steps and the physiological changes that occur during their long journey from the ocean. Some have bones exposed and fins hanging off. These changes are more visible from underwater.”

Some nature lovers might miss the autumn spectacle of massive Chinooks

challenging the old hatchery weir. The barrier will nevertheless not be scrapped; its metal sections will remain in storage for emergency service. Heralding a new age of California State Hatchery efficiency, a 60-foot mural was last week completed on the facility grounds. San Francisco-based artist Max Erhman’s canvas spans the walls of silos that store fish food near the visitor center. The work was funded by Wide Open Walls, a street art nonprofit supported Sacramento Metropolitan Arts Commission. Central to Erhman’s design, a steelhead bursts from the river to symbolize nature’s leap of faith to the future.

Nimbus Hatchery is located at 2001 Nimbus Rd, Gold River. Facility parking is open and the completed fish ladder may be viewed from walking trails. The Salmon and steelhead spawning season runs from November to March. For more information, visit: www.wildlife.ca.gov/fishing/hatcheries/nimbus. ★

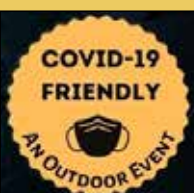

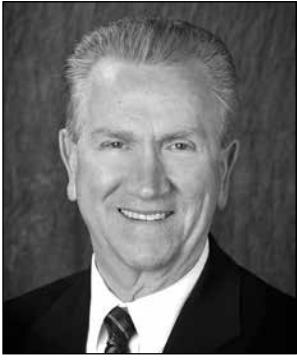

brought her "A" humor game to the night's meeting—wryly chimed in they were exactly where they had started.

Aside from the Planning Commission, the Council also received updates on possible new parking code updates as well as the implementation of electric vehicle charging stations. Discussed strategies that could become de rigueur in the city were reducing minimum parking space requirements for residential and non-residential uses, establishing maximum parking space requirements, and providing parking reductions for new developments near transit/rideshare. In regard to electric vehicle charging stations, the council discussed the need for placement of the stations in the most optimal locations due to battery needs.

The Council also was presented with information on the City's tool, Rancho Cordova Online, where residents can apply for, renew and pay for licenses, submit permits and plans and apply for meeting or event space. Services that heretofore had to be done by mail or in person are now at one's fingertips 24 hours a day.

Councilmember Siri Pulipati led off the Council Reports by reporting on her meeting with the Folsom Lake College Council, getting a look at their 2021/2022 program, and happily finding funds are in place to support new refugee students. She also attended a luncheon with the Folsom Cordova Unified Superintendent who gave an update on school precautions against COVID-19 as well as security measures to combat a new Tik-Tok challenge where students are being called on to steal school property.

Councilmember David Sander warmly spoke about the success of the recent Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony and marveled at the talent of this and each year. He confessed he was late to a Sacramento Children's

Museum releasing of butterflies events to honor grandparents but Vice Mayor Terry and Councilmember Pulipati noted they were able to happily do so.

Attending a Los Rios Community College School District meeting, Vice Mayor Terry reported the city won praise for its program that offers first-time, full-time students up to two years of tuition-free education.

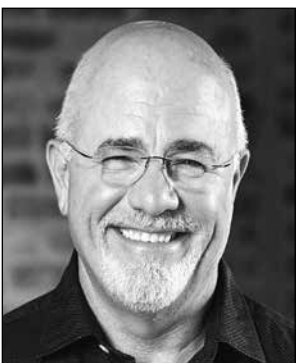
All of the council noted the dedication of the Cit Hall's atrium in the memory of past Mayor Dan Skoglund. Another powerful dedication, the Council spoke on was the memorial for slain officer Mark Stasyuk. Both Councilmembers Bugde and Pulipati remarked on the powerful image of Stasyuk's mother honoring her son, and Mayor Gatewood felt the memorial statue was "one of the finest pieces of art in the city."

At the beginning of the night, new city employees were introduced and there was a presentation on the Cordova Lancers, Leaders and Legends aka MACH a Cordova High School mentoring program with testimony from both adults and students. David Sander called MACH the best youth program in Rancho Cordova.

City Manager Cyrus Abhar announced two open positions on the Community Enhancement Funds Oversight Committee.

The Council also received an update on the current drought from city water providers Golden State Water, Sacramento County Water Agency, and Cal American Water. Governor Newsom has called for all Californians to reduce their water use by 15 percent. The presenters commended the successful job Ranch Cordova residents did conserving water in the previous drought 5 years ago and said reducing the amount of outdoor watering as the biggest opportunity to save.

"Next year could be worse and we need to do as much as we can today," said a representative. ★



Dave Ramsey Says

Here's how you do it. List all your income sources for the month. Your income should include paychecks, small-business income, side jobs, residual income, child support and so on. If it's money that comes into your household's bank account, write it down and add it up.

Next, list every single expense you have each month. Rent, food, cable, phones and everything in between. Your expenses vary from one month to the next, and this is why you make a new budget each month. Your giving budget might be high in December when Christmas rolls around. The car budget will spike during months when you pay insurance or renew your tags. Focus on one month at a time.

Now, subtract your expenses from your income. Ideally, this number will be zero. It might take a few months of practice, so don't worry if it doesn't balance out immediately. If it doesn't, it just means you need to do something to bring one of the numbers up, the other one down—or both. If you're spending more than you make, you need to make some cuts in your

spending. If you need to generate more money, get a part-time job or sell a bunch of stuff.

The deal with a zero-based budget is this: every dollar must have a name. That means every dollar has a designated job to do. If you fill out every item in your budget and come out \$100 ahead—meaning you have nothing for that \$100 to do—you haven't finished your budget. You have to find a job for that \$100. It's your decision what it does, but if you don't give it a name and purpose, you'll end up blowing it and wondering where it went.

I have a good job and make pretty good money, but I'm tired of always worrying about my finances and being strapped for cash at the end of the month. I've heard you talk about getting out of debt and living on a zero-based budget, but what exactly is a zero-based budget?

Dear Edward,

The concept of a zero-based budget is simple: income minus outgo equals zero. If you bring home \$4,000 a month, you want everything you spend, save, give and invest to equal \$4,000. That way, you know where every one of your dollars is going. Not knowing where the money's going is what kills lots of people's financial dreams. They think they know how much they're spending and where it's going, but they really don't.

Society for the Blind in Sac Receives \$10K to Teach Braille

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Society for the Blind recently received \$10,000 from Golden 1 Credit Union to provide Braille literacy for children in Sacramento and across Northern California who are blind or have vision loss.

“Today, less than 10 percent of children with vision loss are literate,” said Shari Roesler, executive director, Society for the Blind. “They are not learning Braille and are unable to read, write and comprehend. By third grade they are significantly behind their sighted peers, and 50 percent of high school students who are blind drop out before graduating. Literacy is key to improving academic outcomes and pointing these children toward college and careers. We are grateful to Golden 1 Credit Union for helping us fill this gap so children with vision loss can be successful and independent when they grow up.”

The grant will allow Society for the Blind to provide Braille literacy classes, instruction materials and training in assistive devices for up to 100 new children who are blind or have low vision in elementary through high schools across the region. Through Society for the Blind’s After-School Academy for children from first grade through high school, students will learn Grade 1 Braille, including the alphabet, spelling, numbers, reading and writing. Middle and high school students

who pass Grade 1 Braille will learn Grade 2 Braille, which includes shortened or contracted words as well as the Nemeth Code-Braille for math and science.

Students also will receive subject-based tutoring based on an initial assessment upon entering the program.

“As we continue to learn more about the

short- and long-term educational impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on our vulnerable populations, we know it is especially important to provide support to organizations that enrich the minds of future generations,” said Erica Taylor, vice president of communications and community relations. “Golden 1 is inspired by the mission of Society for the Blind, and we are honored to help them continue to serve their community.”

For 67 years, Society for the Blind has created innovative ways to empower individuals living with low vision or blindness to discover, develop and achieve their full potential. Renewed Tax Credit Can Help Employers Hire Workers

IRS Special Announcement

WASHINGTON - With many businesses facing a tight job market, the Internal Revenue Service reminds employers to check out a valuable tax credit available to them for hiring long-term unemployment recipients and other groups of workers facing significant barriers to employment.

During National Small Business Week, the IRS is highlighting tax benefits and resources designed to help new and existing small businesses. For any business now hiring, the Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) may help.

Legislation enacted in December extended the WOTC through the end of 2025. This long-standing tax benefit encourages employers to hire workers certified as members of any of ten targeted groups facing barriers to employment. With millions of Americans out of work at one time or another since the pandemic began, the IRS noted that one of these targeted groups is long-term unemployment recipients who have been unemployed for at least 27 consecutive weeks and have received state or federal unemployment benefits during part or all of that time.

The other groups include certain veterans and recipients of various kinds of public assistance, among others. Specifically, the 10 groups are: Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) recipients, Unemployed veterans, including disabled veterans, Formerly incarcerated individuals, Designated community residents living in Empowerment Zones or Rural Renewal Counties, Vocational rehabilitation referrals, Summer youth employees living in Empowerment Zones, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients, Supplemental Security Income (SSI) recipients, Long-term family

assistance recipients, Long-term unemployment recipients.

To qualify for the credit, an employer must first request certification by submitting IRS Form 8850, Pre-screening Notice and Certification Request for the Work Opportunity Credit, to their state workforce agency (SWA). Do not submit this form to the IRS.

Normally, Form 8850 must be submitted to the SWA within 28 days after the eligible worker begins work. But under a special relief provision, a Nov. 8, 2021, submission deadline applies to two groups of new hires – qualified summer youth employees living in Empowerment Zones and designated community residents living in Empowerment Zones.

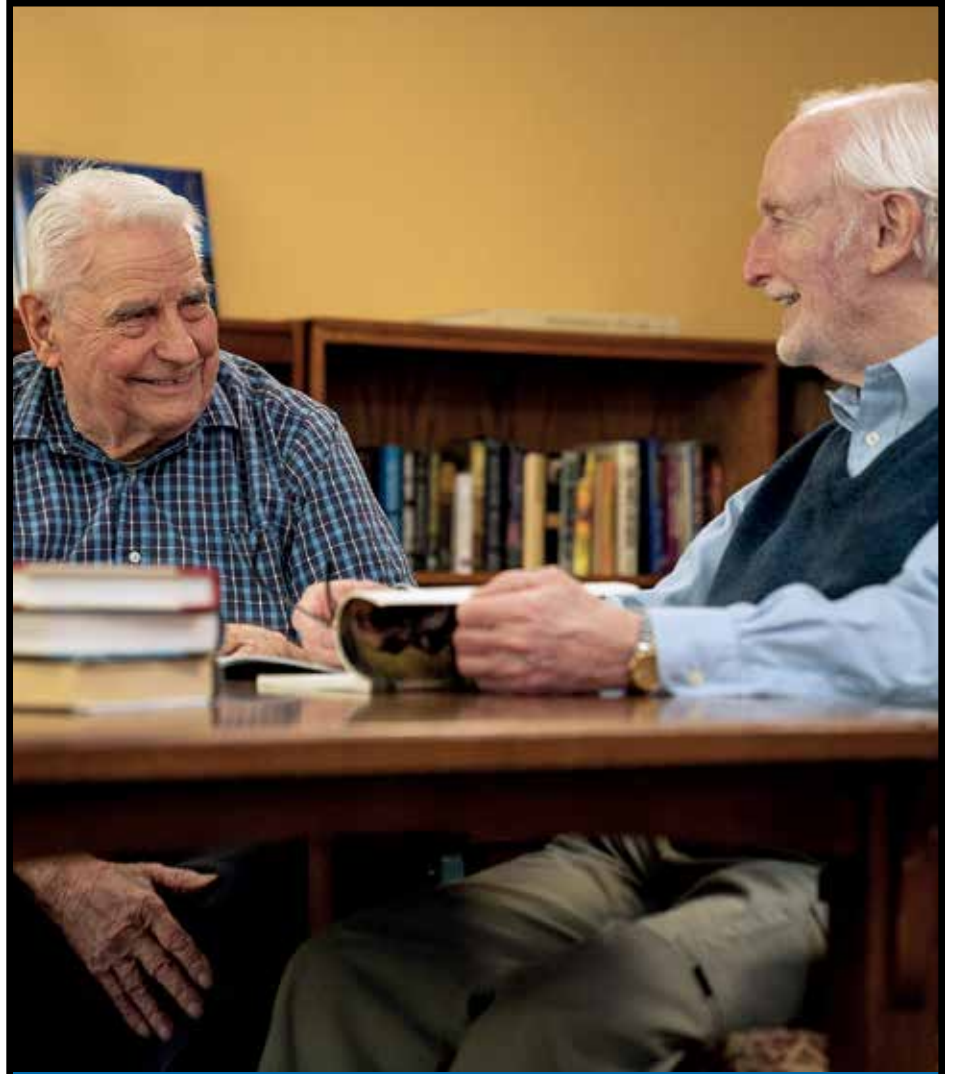
To qualify for the Nov. 8 submission deadline, eligible employees must start work on or after Jan. 1, 2021, and before Oct. 9, 2021. Other requirements and further details can be found in Notice 2021-43 and the instructions (.pdf) to Form 8850.

Eligible businesses claim the WOTC on their federal income tax return. It is generally based on wages paid to eligible workers during the first year of employment.

The credit is first figured on Form 5884, Work Opportunity Credit, and then is claimed on Form 3800, General Business Credit.

Though the credit is not available to tax-exempt organizations for most groups of new hires, a special rule allows them to claim the WOTC for hiring qualified veterans. These organizations claim the credit against payroll taxes on Form 5884-C, Work Opportunity Credit for Qualified Tax Exempt Organizations.
