Sac County Comments on New Rumors Regarding Elections Staff

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - It has come to the attention of the Sacramento County Department of Voter Registration and Elections that there are rumors circulating nationally and even internationally, that there are two employees of the Dominion technology company that are employed in our Registrar’s office.

These rumors are false. The genesis of these rumors is still unclear, but due to the prevalence of this rumor, our office is addressing this lie head-on:

No Dominion employees have ever been or ever will be employed by the Sacramento County Voter Registration & Elections Department;

Our Lead Support Technician from Dominion was on-site the first day of Logic & Accuracy testing (Monday, 8/9) and will be back next Monday (8/16) for the first day of Logic & Accuracy testing on the tabulation system;

The purpose of the limited on-site technician support is to provide subject matter expertise in the maintenance and/or repair of the voting equipment should any equipment fail during the Logic & Accuracy testing. On-site presence can expedite the RMA (Return Material Authorization) process to replace equipment in the event of failure.

Maintenance and/or repair processes are performed by Sacramento County Voter Registration & Elections staff. The vendor may only provide expertise and advice on how to best achieve the maintenance and/or repair of voting equipment;

On-site vendor support is required to be scheduled in advance, the vendor personnel must wear an identification badge and be escorted by Sacramento County Voter Registration & Elections Department staff at all times while on the premises. **They are not allowed to touch voting equipment, election files, or ballots at any time.** ★

Don't Save the Clock Tower

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Marty McFly did not time travel to the Monday, August 2 City Council Meeting in a DeLorean to save the Clock Tower. If he had, the cinematic character would have met a council whose dislike of the clock tower façade for a new 50' cellular tower had already led to a completely new look. Located on Folsom Boulevard between Grocery Outlet and Target, the proposed structure featured in its new design a city skyline and silhouetted residents gathering together against a sky blue hue emblazoned with the city’s name.

The concept didn’t go over particularly smoothly. There was an extended amount of confusion as to the order of presentation and comment on the subject with even the applicants themselves pushing back their thoughts until Councilmember David Sander would be present; Sander was the most vocally opposed to the clock tower concept. “Pretty strange”

said Vice-Mayor Donald Terry with regard to the proceedings.

Councilmember Linda Budge - who had taken the design to representatives from the city’s art community - felt the color wouldn’t age well, the river iconography would be more favorable to the city and most pointedly, that the skyline utilized wasn’t even Rancho Cordova’s but Sacramento’s. Discussion was planned to renew on August 16.

Also, during the meeting, Economic Development

Manager Amanda Norton presented background information on applicants for the Workforce Recovery Program. The goal of the program - of which funds between \$500,000 - \$1 million - is to assist business who have workforce development programs that aid residents by giving them new job skills to advance their career or find employment. Representatives of the businesses who sent in proposals spoke out about the immense benefits of the program not only to them but to

the community at large. “We can provide qualified job candidates for employers,” said the rep from DP Global Solutions.

Kim Juran Karageorgiou, Director of Administrative Services gave an overview about American Rescue Plan Act funding. The city has a total allocation of \$15,588,333 to use toward COVID-19 impacted areas with a cutoff date of 2026 in the areas of public health response, revenue loss, broadband infrastructure and more. Vice-President Terry supported the desires of resident Faizah Mughal for the areas to be prioritized on economic lines.

After the emotional last council meeting that delved deep into topic of the planned Civic Center, there was some obvious residue left over with residents upset over the usual 3-minutes public comment time being reduced to two on end and Mayor Garret Gatewood discussing his desire to keep on connecting with the community on the Mills Crossing location. ★



Residents Rally for Parkway

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - A jewel of Sacramento life and leisure, the American River Parkway is closer to destruction than at any time since its establishment in the '60s. In recent months, more than 11 percent of its 4800 acres have burned. The river's flow - drinking water for millions -- is polluted. Wildlife is displaced and suffering. People who might otherwise enjoy the 23-mile stretch of public land are daunted by its increasing homeless population. Garbage accumulates at many tons per month. County and volunteer efforts cannot keep up with it.

An estimated 1000 campers live rough on the Parkway. A perfect storm of circumstances -- drug abuse; criminal justice "reforms," a scarcity of affordable housing and the COVID pandemic - have caused record levels of homelessness. Displaced people flock to inhabit a once-pristine wildernesses and damage to riparian havens is incalculable. "As a kid, I kayaked from Carmichael to Discovery Park and didn't see a single camper," recalls District 3 Supervisor Rich Desmond. "I never expect to see long stretches of campsites and garbage, like we have now. We should be ashamed that our children have to experience nature with this backdrop."

Desmond spoke at a forum recently convened by the American River Parkway Foundation. Attended by more than 200 concerned citizens, the event offered a wake-up call documentary called "Parkway in Peril." Several volunteer Parkway stewards contributed voice-over.

"The Parkway gets more visitors per year than Yosemite," said Chris Balaan. "Imagine someone throwing a bottle into the Merced River. People don't seem to have a problem doing it to the American River."

Two hours of passionate discussion followed the presentation.

Heading the forum, Supervisor Phil Serna related his experience of being stuck by a drug-user's needle during a volunteer river cleanup. He pledged himself and his District 3 colleague Rich Desmond to be "100 percent behind saving the Parkway. It bodes well that we're all sitting here," said the District 1 leader.

- from fire, to drug presence, garbage pollution, and fears for recreational safety -- resulted from unauthorized campers. Recent statutes, prevent Rangers from ousting Parkway dwellers if they have nowhere else to sleep. Other activities can nevertheless be prosecuted: littering is illegal; hunting

spots are illegal.

Deputy Metro Fire Chief Niko King confirmed that nearly all parkland conflagrations this year originated in encampments.

Trash and sewage dumping is another issue. Higher than acceptable E.coli readings are not all camper-related but much riverside

and tweekers (meth users) bringing things into parkway encampments that destroy aesthetics, sanitation and safety. We are the voice of the Parkway. We need to speak out on the issue of illegal camping... it can't be allowed to continue."

Volunteer Leigh Rutledge said formerly pristine river areas were now landfills. "We are so fortunate that a group of people had the foresight to save this land for all of us," she said. "We're going to let it become one giant garbage dump. And a burned garbage dump. We've got to do what it takes to stop this."

A nature-lover advocated for wildlife. "Imagine what losing 11 percent of your range means to animals" said the speaker. "Flood plain parks are not just for human leisure. Our Parkway was set aside as a habitat for hundreds of animal species. What protection do they have when we allow it to be burned, polluted and filled with garbage?"

Supervisor Serna said Sacramento County was resource-challenged but not guilty of letting grass grow under its feet. Sites were being considered for a triage center - with support services - for the homeless. When taxed to recommend how the public could help save the Parkway, Serna and fellow panelists urged:

Volunteer for trash clean ups; Report illegal fires; Write letters to officials; Attend Supervisorial meetings and call the County to task.

Explained Supervisor Rich Desmond: "Showing up and complaining achieves progress in our creating alternative places for homeless people to go. When we have these places, there will be no excuse for us not enforcing ordinances and stopping the destruction of our Parkway."

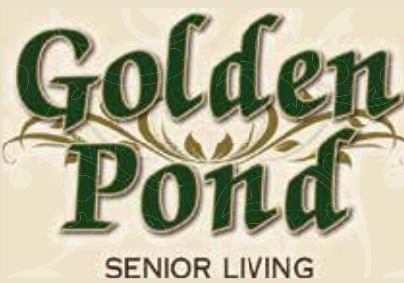

What is the Most Important Thing you have Heard or Read About?

I first began writing an article (or column) to the Grapevine in 1999 when I was the Honorable Mayor of Rancho Cordova. The owner of the Grapevine, Bob Ling, said he thought since I was the Honorable Mayor I might write a "Mayor's Corner." I hadn't done that before, but I gave it a try, and had to thank him for giving me the chance to do something new like that. I have thanked him ever since.

Something which I wrote about was the negotiations between our Incorporation Committee and Sacramento County. Our committee brought the details needed about Rancho Cordova's incorporation. Then, while that was going on, something happened on September 11, 2001 which shocked our whole country and the world. It was the first time that our country had ever been attacked on our soil. That will always be remembered, and neither will the wars which followed that event on 9-11-2001.

Now back to the incorporation negotiations in 2002. We were finally approved by the Local Agency Formation Commission, and were

sent to the County Supervisors for an election date. We were placed on the November 5, 2002 general election. We received the approval of cityhood by 78% of the voters. Then we worked for 8 months to make sure that when we began as a city on July 1, 2003 we would be ready. And all of that was in my column.

We have all been paying attention to things like the new homes and new parks in Rancho Cordova: moving our community Christmas tree from St. John Vianney church property on Coloma Road to the Village Green Park off of Zinfandel Drive; move our borrowed City Hall on Gold Canal Drive to our own City Hall on Prospect Park Drive; and definitely talk about the fact that our city is always operating in the black. That was something which was definitely in my column, especially when everyone was hit during the "Great Recession," and many local governments, regional governments, and states were operating in the red.

That recession lasted for about 5 years, and then we were in a drought for 5 years which ended, and now we are in a drought again. We are hoping

that this coming winter will give us the rain and snow we need so this drought will end soon.

What is the most important thing you have heard or read about? There are so many things going on right now that I can't decide what is the most important. The Dixie Fire is burning on, and is only one of the fires; earthquake in Haiti a couple of days ago, and now tropical storms are coming in to Haiti. Afghanistan was taken over again by the Taliban, who in the past killed many of their citizens, and forced the women to stay at home and not get an education.

The COVID-19 delta variant is sending many people to the hospitals again, but this time there are many 39 year old or younger people, and that includes children and infants too. I know there are many people who will not take the vaccine, but I have seen some of those same people who said no are now in the hospital and are wishing they had taken the vaccine. Look at the information which may already show the answers you are looking for about the vaccines. I will have more in my column on Aug. 27, 2021.

A Message from your Mayor

In the old days, school started in September and coincided with baseball's championship games. The World Series was always a topic of conversation at recess, but this week, school bells have rung and students are practicing with their soccer teams. Let's wish them a successful season.

One of our elementary schools, Robert J. McGarvey Elementary, has a school garden which was featured on Good Day Sacramento on August 16. I hope you were able to tune in to watch this segment, showing how community partnerships impact student lives. Who worked together to create the garden? The City of Rancho Cordova awarded a \$10,000 Community Enhancement Fund Grant. Also, two Eagle Scouts built wood planter boxes and the composter, plus supervised the paved reading patio area and a raised herb garden. Finally, the McGarvey Parent Faculty Organization did fundraising for the posts, concrete, and tools for making the patio. Students receive hands-on garden education during school and during an after-school garden club. Students will apply this knowledge throughout the rest of their lives. The focus will be on healthy eating of fruits and vegetables, increasing girls' interest in STEM curriculum (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math), and improving academic success in math, science and writing – all tied to garden education.

You may have seen me participating in "National Night Out 2021" on August 3, 2021, along with many City Team members. I visited the neighborhoods of Sunridge Anatolia and Kavala

Ranch; Rio Del Oro and Somerset; and lastly Mills Ranch. At each event I met our friendly, enthusiastic citizens and had a ball loudly singing karaoke to "She's a Brick House!" Do you know that song? Each place had delicious food provided by the neighborhood, and I enjoyed the gooey cheese pizza; cold, sweet watermelon; and smoky, melt-in-my-mouth brisket. Wow! What wonderful cooks live in Rancho Cordova!

I have been honored to attend three community events. First, I was invited along with 20 other elected representatives to go to the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce's 9th annual Elected Officials Reception. We gathered at the Sacramento Children's Museum, a jewel in our city, to visit and exchange ideas for helping our community grow to its full potential of helping others. Secondly, I spoke at the Rancho Cordova Elks Lodge to the senior men's group, including wise elders, about the growth in our city and answered their questions. Regional San Project to Receive Grant Funding for Harvest Water

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The United States Bureau of Reclamation (USBR) recently announced that Regional San will receive \$1.7 million to help fund Regional San's Harvest Water Program. This additional funding adds to the previous \$4.2 million received from USBR and \$287.5 million in Proposition 1 funding. Harvest Water was established to meet Regional San's goal of increasing the use of recycled water by providing tertiary-treated wastewater for farmers—demonstrating Regional San's ongoing commitment to environmental stewardship.

Harvest Water represents one of the largest agricultural water reuse projects

in the United States. Once complete, it will provide up to 50,000 acre-feet per year of drought-resistant, Title 22 water to irrigate up to 16,000 acres of permanent agriculture and habitat conservation lands near the Cosumnes River and Stone Lakes National Wildlife Refuge in Sacramento County.

"Securing these funds helps Regional San in our efforts to increase recycled water use in the Sacramento region," said Prabhakar Somavarapu, Regional San's General Manager. "Recycled wastewater provides a safe and sustainable water supply for agriculture, irrigation and habitat restoration. It also reduces the need for groundwater pumping."

Next steps include continued planning efforts

with local farmers and development of designs for pumping, transmission and distribution systems to convey recycled water from the wastewater treatment plant near Elk Grove to farmers in southern Sacramento County. The first phase of the recycled water delivery system is expected to be operational by late 2024.

Strong Demand in Home Sales Begin Shift Towards Normalized Market

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Sacramento-area new home sales continued moving toward more normal patterns in July but still reflect continued strong demand, the North State Building Industry Association reported.

Area builders reported selling 501 homes during the month in the seven-county region. That was the lowest number reported so far this year and appears to reflect that the market is continuing to shift into its normal pattern — sales peak in the spring, plateau during the summer and then continue drifting lower during the rest of the year.

But sales are still robust compared to historical averages. The average number of sales during July since the BIA began keeping records in 1997 is just 366, and July's total was the second-highest recorded in the region since 2007. It was eclipsed only by the massive 888 sales that took place in July 2020 as the market rebounded from the huge drop-off in sales that spring due to the onset of the

COVID-19 restrictions.

Michael Strech, the BIA's president and CEO, said the gradual movement towards a more normal market is welcome but that builders will continue working to meet the strong demand shown by area buyers.

"There continues to be a strong demand for new homes in the region as buyers look for homes that have been designed with today's needs for space and flexibility in mind," Strech said. "Despite serious supply chain issues that are causing construction delays, our members continue to work hard to find solutions and complete construction as quickly as possible."

"The continued strong market for new and existing homes also provides even more proof that the supply of housing in the region does not meet the demand. Local governments need to work with builders to reduce fees and other costs and to allow the construction of more new housing to begin closing the gap."

The report reflects sales in El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Yolo and Yuba counties. ★

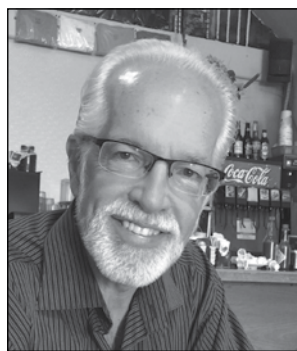

"We the Government"

"WE THE PEOPLE" begins the Preamble of the US Constitution ... signed September 17, 1787 and ratified June 21, 1788. The preamble is a brief introductory statement of the Constitution's core purposes and guiding principles.

Thanks to the vision and sacrifice of the founders who established our constitutional republic - we have a nation which is founded on ideals and not personalities. There was no king, no tribal chief, no dictator, no military general, it was "We the People" ruling ourselves.

However, many of us do not consider the obvious next step is that "We the People" also means "We the Government".

For many of us in our daily lives, we think of the government as a "them". They are telling us what to do. They are taking our money through taxes. They are being fair or unfair. They are not doing enough or doing too much!

But actually, the government is us! We have nothing to complain about ... unless we are complaining about ourselves. We get exactly the government we deserve. If we do not like our government, it is our own fault. Now that may sound harsh and blunt ... but ultimately it is true.

Therefore, we cannot simply treat our government as something to sneer at, but rather we must treat it as something we own! Because we do. We own our government. And, we

must exercise our ownership over our governments - local, state, federal, and otherwise.

However, as owners, many of us have delegated too much authority to our employees - those employees being our elected officials. And, that is precisely what elected officials are - our employees. They are accountable to us, the owners, the citizens. We owe them courtesy and respect, as we should do with all people. But, they are our employees.

Moreover, while some have delegated too much authority; worse yet, some of us have abdicated our authority to these employees! We become absentee owners who in our minds have let the employees become our masters and we the servants. (Remember, we call them "Public Servants".) But abdication breeds an erosive attitude of, "I am not responsible for my community or my life; they (the government) are responsible." Personal responsibility becomes diminished and government responsibility is enlarged. As an elected official, how many people came to me to complain about this or that ... but when I asked them if they voted in the last election, their reply would be, "No, I was too busy."

In light of this collective complacency, this ongoing "We the Government" column is dedicated to empowering citizens to exercise healthy ownership over their governments. And, being a responsible owner ... a responsible citizen means that we must care, be informed, be good decision makers, and be involved! And, I know that sounds like a lot of work and that we are all busy, but remember what we have to lose - liberty, choice, freedoms. We have a unique, remarkable society - the envy of much of the world.

Remember, left to its own, everything declines and dies. A rolling ball

on the ground stops. A flourishing business goes idle. A marriage fails. A government morphs into something hideous. Energy must be invested to keep the ball rolling, the business fresh, a relationship full of love, a government on track to be the servant of its citizens.

The good news is that our forefathers paid the biggest price to start our constitutional republic, and we only have to keep it going. The ball on the ground must be kicked hard to make it roll, but once rolling only a little more energy is necessary to keep it moving in the correct direction. And, as Helen Keller observed, "The world is moved along, not only by the mighty shoves of its heroes, but also by the aggregate of tiny pushes of each honest worker."

We do not have to be a hero to keep our community sound, but all of us must work together with each of our "tiny pushes". If you are interested in learning more about how to preserve our freedoms and become "We the Government," I look forward to continuing our conversation in upcoming articles for this column.

I'll be sharing information about local organizations, such as the Sacramento Taxpayers Association, that are empowering citizens locally; practical steps about how to hold our government leaders accountable; and lesser know political news that has major implications for our local freedoms. In the meantime, stay hopeful and keep carrying on our torch of liberty!

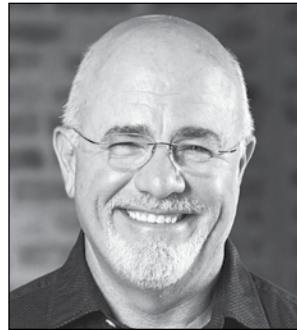

In your situation, I'd advise pushing the pause button on the Baby Steps for now. Forget about paying down debt, until mom and the baby come home, and you're sure everyone's healthy and safe. You could even hang on to it all until she decides to start work. But the bottom line is if everybody's okay, the baby and all those connected expenses - like formula, diapers, and daycare - just become part of a regular monthly budget.

Your wife is going to be making pretty good money once she starts her job. And the truth is babies are not all that expensive. There are costs involved in having kids, but it's not like we're talking thousands of dollars a month out of your budget just because you had a baby. Can you buy lots and lots of things for a baby? Can

those things cost a ridiculous amount of money? Of course! The list of things you could buy goes on and on. But a healthy, new baby doesn't need much, and having one at home isn't going to break the bank.

I think any financial fear or uncertainty you may be experiencing right now will disappear once you've got a couple months of adjusting your budget and getting used to the new normal under your belt. Then, when you and your wife decide it's time to start her career, you can begin paying off debt in a really big way!

The hands-on Ford Driving Skills for Life (DSFL) program will launch in the Sacramento region Aug. 28-29. The program highlighting three key aspects:

Hands-on driving sessions focusing on critical factors influencing teen crashes: vehicle handling, hazard recognition, speed, space management, distraction and impairment; Ford Driving Skills for Life and the Governors Highway Safety Association have **invested more than \$1 million in 2021** to improve teen driving skills and reduce motor vehicle crashes, which are the leading cause of death for U.S. teens; During the pandemic, **traffic deaths surged reaching a 13-year high** even though there was a significant decline in driving. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) reported that 38,680 people were killed on U.S. roadways in 2020, the highest number since 2007 and an increase of 7.2% from the year before. Alarming, traffic deaths surged in 2020, reaching a 13-year high even though there was a significant decline in driving during the COVID-19 pandemic. In addition, recent studies have revealed that parents are frustrated and concerned with the lack of in-car training offered to newly licensed teen drivers, especially during the pandemic.

"The lack of experience of newly licensed drivers remains a serious problem resulting in a disproportionate number of crashes for teens. We are grateful to be able to safely resume free, hands-on training that is so desperately needed," said Jim Graham, Global Manager, Ford Driving Skills for Life.

In California, drivers ages

16-19 are nearly three times as likely to be in a serious crash compared to other drivers. **In California**, 164 teens ages 16 to 19 were killed in crashes in 2019, with 354 drivers 20 and under involved in deadly crashes across the U.S. over the same time period.

Back-to-School Vaccinations

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Students are getting ready to go back to school, and whether it's via distance learning or in person, it is important children and teens are up-to-date on their vaccinations.

This year, Sacramento County Public Health recommends the addition of a COVID-19 vaccine for youth. The Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine has been approved by the CDC for children ages 12 and above. COVID-19 vaccine clinics are available at multiple locations throughout the county.

"Vaccines are always an important part of back-to-school time, and to even enroll in school, it is still required by law that you meet immunization requirements," said Dr. Olivia Kasirye, Sacramento County Public Health Officer. "Not getting your children vaccinated will make them more vulnerable to preventable diseases like whooping cough, the flu and measles."

Immunizations Required to Enter Kindergarten:

Polio; Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis (DTaP); Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR); Hepatitis B; Varicella (Chickenpox)

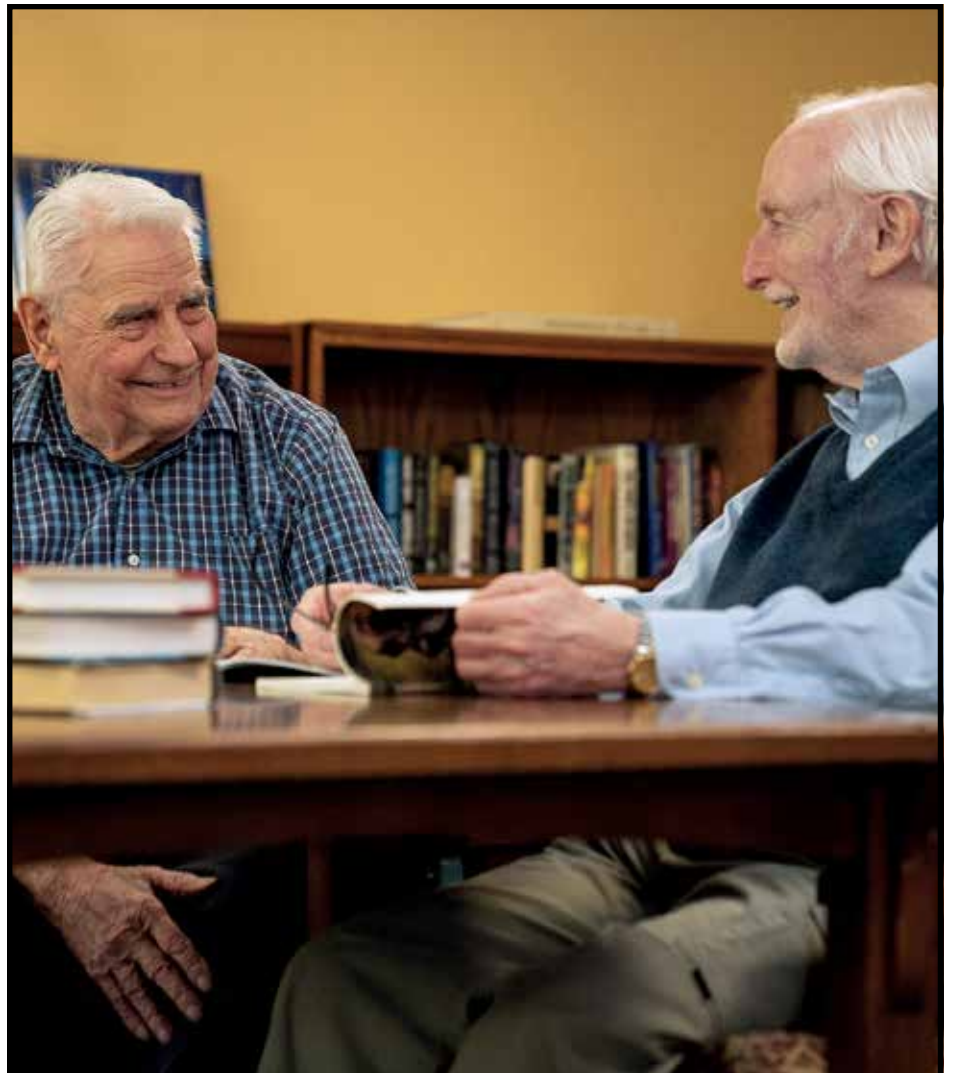
Immunizations required to enter 7th grade:

Tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis booster (Tdap); Varicella (Chickenpox)

If your child hasn't received one or more of these vaccines, make an appointment for them to get caught up today. The Sacramento County Immunization Assistance Program may be able to help by providing information about immunizations for school and provide assistance in obtaining immunization services for children and adults in Sacramento County. The program also provides referrals for clients to immunization resources, consultation services, and conducting flu vaccine clinics each fall, as well as providing state-supplied vaccines during vaccine-preventable disease outbreaks. You can reach the program from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. weekdays at 916-875-7468.

If you don't have health insurance, or your insurance policy doesn't cover all recommended childhood vaccines, your child may be eligible for vaccines through the Vaccines for Children program.

You can find out what vaccines your child needs at all ages by reviewing the CDC's recommended Childhood Immunization Schedule at <https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/schedules/easy-to-read/child-easyread.html>. ★

White House increases US troops to help with Kabul evacuation to 5,000 | 14 Aug 2021 | The State Department said Secretary of State Antony Blinken spoke with Afghan President Ashraf Ghani Saturday about the Taliban's violent offensive. The 82nd Airborne Division's alert brigade will send 1,000 paratroopers to Kabul next week to reach the White House's goal of 5,000 troops in the city to protect the evacuation of U.S. personnel, Fox News reports. There were already 1,000 U.S. service members on the ground, according to defense officials. Another 3,000 Marines and soldiers will be in place by the end of the week. The remaining two battalions of the 82nd Airborne Brigade Combat Team will stage in Kuwait as a ready reserve.

Biden Weighs Mandating Vaccines for Interstate Travel | 13 Aug 2021 | Joe Biden is weighing vaccines mandates for interstate travel, according to The Associated Press (AP) on Thursday. "Still, while more severe [coronavirus] measures – such as mandating vaccines for interstate travel or changing how the federal government reimburses treatment for those who are unvaccinated and become ill with COVID-19 – have been discussed," the AP writes, "the administration worried that they would be too polarizing for the moment."

Forty percent of migrants released in Texas border city test positive for COVID-19, officials say | 11 Aug 2021 | The city of Laredo, Texas, has refused to take in migrants who have been bused in from elsewhere on the border after discovering 40% of them tested positive for the coronavirus, according to two local government officials. "That was very high," Laredo Mayor Pete Saenz said in an interview, referring to the infection rate among migrants dropped off by the Border Patrol last week. Laredo health authority, Dr. Victor Trevino, confirmed the numbers. The 40% infection rate is the highest known positivity rate along the U.S.-Mexico border. Last week, McAllen, Texas, reported a 15% positivity rate among migrants released from custody.

Marines Rebuke Def. Sec.: 'No Mandatory Vaccinations for My Marines' | 13 Aug 2021 | Marine Corps General David H. Berger on Monday rebuked Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin's edict requiring all Armed Forces personnel to submit to Covid-19 vaccinations under threat of court martial or discharge, said a source in Gen. Berger's office who overheard a heated conversation between them. Gen. Berger telephoned the defense secretary minutes after he said in a press conference that the Covid-19 vaccination is needed to maintain military readiness and that he would enforce the mandatory vaccination policy regardless of FDA approval status. "There will be no mandatory vaccinations for my Marines," Gen. Berger said. In a transcript of the call reviewed by Real Raw News, Gen. Berger lambasted Austin and branded him a traitor. "Under no circumstances will Marines be compelled to take a potentially hazardous vaccination that the FDA won't even fully endorse," Gen. Berger told Austin. "You are a coward and a traitor, manipulated by people pushing bad policy on the men and women who provide security to our nation. Neither you nor your puppet president has authority to enforce such a policy."

Lawsuit involving 1,200 first responders targets state's vaccination policy for government workers | 12 Aug 2021 | (HI) On behalf of 1,200 first responders statewide, a group of attorneys announced Thursday it is filing a lawsuit against the state over its vaccination policy for government workers. The group argued the mandate violates workers' constitutional rights and employers should not be able to decide how to grant exemptions for religion because it is a personal belief. The lawyers also criticized Gov. David Ige (D) and all four county mayors for not creating a uniform statewide plan – and claimed the governor did not give unions the opportunity to negotiate before the policy was announced.

Bunny Bonanza Helps Shelter Rabbits Find Adopters

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County's Bradshaw Animal Shelter intakes and cares for thousands of animals from the community all year round. The event was held at the shelter on Sunday, Aug. 8 and was sponsored by the shelter's non-profit affiliate - Teaching Everyone Animals Matter (TEAM). FUR and the shelter's staff and volunteers lead the event and provided adopters with helpful resources, adoption counseling and bunny speed dating so that each shelter rabbit would find the perfect home. This was the first time that the public and potential adopters were able to visit without an adoption appointment since the pandemic forced the closure of their public counter in early 2020.

Six rabbits were able to find loving forever homes during the event and many were adopted prior to Bunny Bonanza due to social media posts, which is a large number of rabbit adoptions in one month for the shelter. There are still several rabbits up for adoption and the public is welcome to make adoption appointments by calling the adoption line at 916-875-2287 Tuesday - Sunday between 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. FUR and the Bradshaw Animal Shelter plan to make this a recurring monthly event to help more shelter rabbits find their way home.
