Stealing Your Water

California's desert becoming a hotbed for water bandits

CENTRAL CALIFORNIA (MPG) - Known for its starry skies, Joshua Trees and 100-plus-degree heat, California's vast desert has recently become a hotbed of something else: thieves stealing California's water.

So who's on the receiving end of all this theft? Local investigators say it's often illegal pot farms.

And with the parched state in a withering drought, water managers are doubling as amateur detectives.

For months, they watched as demand for water spiked. They hired security firms and sent drones to see where the water was going. It wasn't long before the local water czars caught on to a phenomenon happening across parched California: bandits are tapping into fire hydrants and rivers, filling stations and wells stealing

millions of gallons of water.

"It's usually done in the dark of night," said a local water manager who didn't want to be identified because of safety concerns. "So, you'll start to see footprints or you'll see water or wet spots or they'll leave the hydrant cap off the hydrant."

Another local water leader backed out of an interview, citing the same fears.

The desert is now strewn with pot farms. California allows them with proper permits and local approval – which San Bernardino County has not given.

The state also is one of the few places where illegally growing seven marijuana plants can yield the same punishment as illegally growing seven thousand: a misdemeanor and a \$500 fine.

About 80% of California's roughly 30,000 pot farms are illegal,

according to the state water board.

"Where cultivation is illegal is where we're seeing the highest occurrence of water theft complaints," said Yvonne West, director of enforcement for the State Water Resources Control Board. "So these cultivators are turning to theft of municipal or groundwater supplies to support their illegal cultivations."

Through the end of June, 125 Californians reported water thefts to state authorities – more than twice as many as a decade ago.

In Helendale, along historic Route 66, the water district hired a private security guard to investigate who was stealing water.

"We found there was a multitude of locations that were illegal grows," said Kelly Gregg, vice president of Liberty Protection Services. "They were pulling water from some of

CDPH Launches New Campaign to Combat Teen Vaping

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) launched a new advertising campaign called "Tell Your Story," in response to the latest high school vaping data from its 2019-20 California Student Tobacco Survey. California has made progress in combating the youth vaping epidemic, but with kids going back to in-person learning, it is crucial we continue making progress.

The survey, which includes data from September 2019 to March 2020, revealed that California's high school vaping rate is at its lowest in four years (8.2%) while the number of California teens trying to quit vaping more than doubled since 2018. During the same time, numerous youth and young adults were hospitalized due to the e-cigarette, or vaping product use-associated lung injury (EVALI) outbreak, sending a warning to young people across the state. California was the first state in the nation to respond to the deadly EVALI outbreak with a large-scale public awareness advertising campaign to protect young people, launched by Governor Gavin Newsom's Executive Order on September 16, 2019.

As California was responding to the EVALI epidemic, the COVID-19 pandemic created another public health crisis that attacks the lungs, reinforcing lung health as a top priority. Smoking and vaping harms the lungs, putting Californians who vape at greater risk from COVID-19. Research has shown teens who have tried vaping are five times more likely to test positive for COVID-19.

"By addressing the dangers of vaping as part of our preparation for schools reopening, California is taking an even more proactive approach in protecting youth health," said Dr. Tomás J. Aragón, CDPH Director and State Public Health Officer. "Returning to in-person learning could mean a spike in teen vaping use at exactly the wrong time. It's critical young people know the facts about the dangers of vaping and have the support and resources they need to avoid use or quit."

The "Tell Your Story" campaign features real stories from young people and highlights their journey to quit vaping. The campaign educates youth and young adults about the harmful health effects of vapes and connects them with evidenced-based resources to quit, especially as they're exposed to increased social pressure in school environments.

"Seeing the impact vaping

Catalytic Converter Thefts Increase Losses

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Fleet maintenance management of three U-Haul commercial truck rental yards in the city of Rancho Cordova are seeing an increase in catalytic converter thefts on and off their grounds.

Amado Hernandez manages the fleet maintenance and rental center at the U-Haul rental facility at 11351 Pyrites Way in Rancho Cordova.

He welcomes the support of local law enforcement and the general public towards the prevention and deterrence of this type of rising crime, he said.

By his estimates, the three local U-Haul rental centers may have lost over \$2 million in repairs due to an increasing number of stolen catalytic converters and trucks in the greater Sacramento sales zone which his fleet

maintenance center serves.

"We're creating an incident track record," he said. "Some 40-50 trucks have been targeted in our service zone. We've noticed that catalytic converter thefts which typically occur at night both on and off our premises are increasing in recent months," Hernandez said.

The cost to replace the catalytic converter on a typical U-Haul truck can cost up to \$1,500, Hernandez said. The time it takes to remove a converter for its precious metals inside can take mere minutes.

"We're regularly filing police reports with multiple law enforcement agencies in our surrounding

service area, including the City of Sacramento, and the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office," he said.

In all, there are three U-Haul truck rental facilities in Rancho Cordova. Two other dealers are located at 10149 Folsom Boulevard and 10855 Folsom Boulevard which

IRS Continues Unemployment Compensation Adjustments

WASHINGTON D.C. (MPG) - The Internal Revenue Service reported that another 1.5 million taxpayers will receive refunds averaging more than \$1,600 as it continues to adjust unemployment compensation from previously filed income tax returns.

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, which became law in March, excluded up to \$10,200 in 2020 unemployment compensation from taxable income calculations. The exclusion applied to individuals and married couples whose modified adjusted gross income was less than \$150,000.

Refunds by direct deposit will begin July 28 and refunds by paper check will begin July 30. This is the fourth round of refunds related to the unemployment compensation exclusion provision.

Since May, the IRS has issued over 8.7 million unemployment compensation refunds totaling over \$10 billion. The IRS will continue reviewing and adjusting tax returns in this category this summer.

The IRS effort focused on minimizing burden on taxpayers so that most people won't have to take any additional action to receive the refund. The IRS review means most taxpayers affected by this change will not have to file an amended return because IRS employees have reviewed and adjusted their tax returns for them. For taxpayers who overpaid, the IRS will either refund the overpayment or apply it to other outstanding taxes or other federal or state debts owed.

For this round, the IRS identified approximately 1.7 million taxpayers due an adjustment. Of that number, approximately 1.5 million taxpayers are expected to receive a refund. The refund average is \$1,686.

The IRS started with the simplest tax returns and is now reviewing more complex returns. The average refund amount is higher for this round because the IRS included an adjustment to the Advance Premium Tax Credit (APTC).

Most taxpayers need not take any action and there is no need to call

the IRS. However, if, because of the excluded unemployment compensation, taxpayers are now eligible for deductions or credits not claimed on the original return, they should file a Form 1040-X, Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return.

Taxpayers Should File an Amended Return If They:

Did not submit a Schedule 8812 with the original return to claim the Additional Child Tax Credit and are now eligible for the credit after the unemployment compensation exclusion;

Did not submit a Schedule EIC with the original return to claim the Earned Income Tax Credit (with qualifying dependents) and are now eligible for the credit after the unemployment compensation exclusion;

Are now eligible for any other credits and/or deductions not mentioned below. Make sure to include any required forms or schedules.

Taxpayers Do Not Need to File an Amended Return if They:

Already filed a tax return and did not claim the unemployment exclusion; the IRS will determine the correct taxable amount of unemployment compensation and tax;

Have an adjustment, because of the exclusion, that will result in an increase in any non-refundable or refundable credits reported on the original return;

Did not claim the following credits on their tax return but are now eligible when the unemployment exclusion is applied: Recovery Rebate Credit, Earned Income Credit with no qualifying dependents or the Advance Premium Tax Credit. The IRS will calculate the credit and include it in any overpayment;

Filed a married filing joint return, live in a community property state, and entered a smaller exclusion amount than entitled on Schedule 1, line 8.

Taxpayers will generally receive letters from the IRS within 30 days of the adjustment, informing them of what kind of adjustment was made (such as refund, payment of IRS debt payment or payment offset for other authorized debts) and the amount of the adjustment. ★

It's Back-Tooth-School Season

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Healthy teeth not only help children eat, speak and sleep better, they also help them to perform better in school. With the beginning of the school year just around the corner, the Sacramento County Oral Health Program encourages parents and caregivers to make getting a dental check-up for their children a priority.

That's especially true for children entering kindergarten. California requires that all children have a comprehensive oral check-up by the time they are ready to enter public school. The "Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment" helps schools identify children suffering from

untreated dental disease.

"Visiting the dentist before school starts should be at the top of every family's back-to-school checklist along with school physicals, vaccinations and school supplies," said Sacramento County Health Officer, Dr. Olivia Kasirye. "Regular dental check-ups allow dentists to identify dental problems early and allow children to receive preventive treatments, such as sealants and fluoride."

Cavities, which are largely preventable, remain the most common chronic childhood disease. In the Sacramento region, more than 46 percent of students have experienced tooth decay by third grade. To help address the issue, Sacramento County Oral Health Program is

partnering with Smile, California, the Medi-Cal Dental Program's campaign to help Medi-Cal members make use of their dental benefit, and the California Department of Public Health's Office of Oral Health, in a statewide Back-Tooth-School effort to raise awareness about the importance of children's dental health.

Schubert Calls for Withdrawal of Dangerous Petty Theft Legislation

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On July 26, 2021, former U.S. Senator Barbara Boxer became yet another victim of a violent robbery in California. This was a strong-arm robbery of an 80-year-old grandmother in broad daylight in Oakland's Jack London Square, which is in California Senator Nancy Skinner's district. Senator Skinner is currently proposing new legislation that would make this horrific crime, strong-arm robbery, a misdemeanor petty theft under Senate Bill 82.

Fortunately, the former senator was not seriously injured. While Senator Boxer is a prominent and household name, there are countless lesser-known victims who have endured similar attacks. To be clear,

these victims were subjected to a violent crime. It would be an injustice to minimize their trauma by calling it misdemeanor petty theft—a low-level offense that is eligible for diversion. SB 82 has nothing to do with justice reform – it is madness that only encourages lawlessness and victimizes citizens in counties throughout the state.

"The assault and robbery of former Senator Boxer is a stark example of the surging and brazen violent crime occurring across California," states Sacramento County District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert. "Senator Skinner's bill to reduce these violent crimes to a misdemeanor and eligible for diversion is a disgrace to victims' rights and dangerous for public safety. I urge Senator Skinner to abandon this dangerous bill." ★

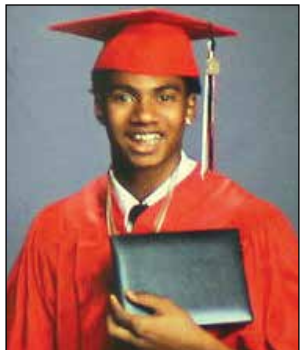
javelin coach for Gonzales and Sander, while Coach Sander coaches them in discus and shot put.

Hellish Heat

Sweltering heat is upon us, so I checked in with Nicolette Pace MS,RDN, CDE etc to give us some tips on how to stay cool and beat this hellish heat. She shared these ten tips with me on my POPPOFF Radio Show. We must prevent heatstroke. Nicolette emphasized that heatstroke is no joke. It's life threatening. Here's help to prevent a health disaster!

- 1. DON'T GO OUTSIDE.** If temps are 91 degrees or greater avoid going outside for longer than necessary. Your body is trying to cool down in the heat, so your skin temperature can rise to 105 degrees. Seek areas that are either air-conditioned or are in dense shade preferably with a breeze.
- 2. DON'T STAY IN THE SUN.** Umbrellas and shelters can help as does a cloudy day. However, this is not a license to tackle the heat and stay outdoors. Limit outdoors to one hour or less.
- 3. DON'T EXERCISE OUTDOORS.** Physical activity increases heart rate and sweating and fluid loss raises body temperature. Combat this high risk category for heatstroke and exhaustion either by exercising indoors, targeting outside activity to either early AM, later PM, or when temperatures drop below 91 degrees.
- 4. DON'T GET DRUNK.** Alcohol is the single worst beverage to take in the heat. Not only does it lead to more urination and dehydration, but it lowers alertness and contributes to mental confusion...a life threatening symptom of heatstroke. Never was it more mandatory to alternate alcohol with H2O and limit cocktails, straight shots, beer, and wine to health guidelines.
- 5. DON'T DRINK SUGARY BEVERAGES.** Super sweet sugary drinks contribute to dehydration by displacing water in body tissues

in an attempt to dilute blood sugar concentration. This, in turn, leads to bloating and water loss. It's especially serious for people with diabetes, cardiovascular and kidney concerns, so drink cool water to feel better fast.

- 6. DON'T EAT SALTY SNACKS OR PROCESSED FOODS.** Like sugar, too much salt contributes to bloating and ultimately dehydration. It causes more thirst and urination, disrupting kidney hormones and the body's delicate electrolyte balance. It's wise to avoid excessive sodium.
- 7. DON'T TAKE EXCESSIVE CAFFEINE.** A long known controversial contributor to fluid loss, caffeinated beverages can do more harm than good. Limit to 300 mg a day, especially if you're in the sun or heat.
- 8. DON'T USE SUGAR SUBSTITUTES TO HYDRATE.** While guilt-free panacea is embraced, know small amounts of sugar helps hydration. Think hydration balanced sports drinks.
- 9. DON'T USE SUNSCREEN.** Many people may not realize sunscreen is not a heatstroke preventer. Sunscreen is very very necessary for UV ray protection but it doesn't protect from heatstroke.
- 10. DON'T WEAR TIGHT SKIMPY CLOTHES.** Fewer clothes help you lose more heat! Sweating is very important to cool down so tight synthetic fiber, polyester-type fabric lock in heat and raise body temperature. Wear light colors and loose fitting natural clothes.

County Announces Watershed Stewardship and Education Grant

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Stormwater Quality Program is accepting applications for the 2021-22 Watershed Stewardship and Education Grant. Each year the Stormwater Quality Program offers schools, non-profit and community organizations up to \$2,500 for projects to help students understand the importance of keeping local creeks and rivers clean and healthy.

This is the 16th year the County is offering grants to help raise awareness about the need for protecting creeks and rivers. By collaborating with schools and non-profits over the years, the County has seen positive results from the community as they develop a better understanding of stormwater pollution. Along with helping the environment, many participants find completing a project like this can be a great team-building effort.

Thirty-five schools

have participated in the program over the years. Will Rogers Middle School is one of the original participants and has taken part in the program every year since it launched in 2005.

Past grant winners have completed 115 projects like creek clean ups; hands on education about Sacramento's watershed, creeks, or rivers; creating eco-friendly gardens; water quality experiments to assess the health of a creek/river; and creating school-wide campaigns to increase awareness about stormwater pollution. Each year grant winners submit a report to the County on their projects; each showing many students in the program gain a better understanding of stormwater pollution and the environment.

To be eligible for this grant, projects must in some way protect or enhance local creeks, rivers, or watersheds. Projects will generally fall into one or more of the following categories:

Educational Projects - Projects that inform or instruct about the aquatic

ecosystem, watersheds, or stormwater pollution prevention; **School/Club Projects** - Projects that can be organized by teachers, classrooms, or clubs; **Community Outreach Projects** - Projects that involve and inspire the community; **Monitoring Project** - Projects that measure water quality, species, or habitat; **Restoration Projects** - Projects that restore or enhance riparian habitats, wetlands, creeks, or rivers

Eligible projects must be implemented within the Stormwater Utility boundaries of Sacramento County or directly affect the residents of these areas. The application for the 2021-22 Watershed Stewardship and Education Grant is available on the Stormwater Quality Program webpage.

The application deadline is Sep. 30, 2021, and the grants will be awarded in October.

Newsom, Facing Recall, Worries About Blackouts

Several factors propelled the 2003 recall of then-Gov. Gray Davis, but one of the most powerful was his clumsy handling of an electric power crisis that had resulted in rolling blackouts.

The crisis resulted from the ill-conceived and misnamed "deregulation" of power supplies that the Legislature and Davis' predecessor, Pete Wilson, had enacted seven years earlier. It virtually invited power suppliers such as Enron to game the system.

When the system failed, Davis was governor and failed to deal with it quickly and effectively. As Davis dithered and power supplies dwindled, one major utility, Pacific Gas and Electric, declared bankruptcy and a second, Southern California Edison, came very close to insolvency.

The state finally stepped into the dysfunctional market and began buying power itself to prevent further blackouts, but the political damage to Davis had been done and the recall campaign was rolling.

This bit of history frames the emergency decree that Gov. Gavin Newsom, who also faces a recall election, issued last Friday.

With high temperatures driving power demand upwards, with drought curtailing hydroelectric generation and with the state more dependent on less reliable solar and wind power, California faces a looming supply shortfall that could force power blackouts.

The state might be 3,500 megawatts short on hot afternoons this summer and as much as 5,000 megawatts short next summer if the drought continues.

Newsom wants the state's energy regulators, the independent agency that operates the electric grid and the utilities themselves to go all-out in tapping whatever sources they can to avoid blackouts. That would include the natural gas-fired plants that the state wants to phase out and auxiliary diesel- and natural gas-powered standby plants in industrial plants.

Newsom suspends environmental clearances and other regulatory procedures to accelerate new power sources, including battery banks to back up solar and wind projects. He also directs utilities to pay up to \$2 per kilowatt-hour – many times the standard rate – to industrial customers for reducing their draw from the grid and shifting to backup generators, promising that the state will reimburse their outlays.

Newsom's order declares that "conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property exist due to rapid, unforeseen, sudden, and severe energy shortages throughout California caused by these climate events..."

The key word is "unforeseen," a not-so-subtle disclaimer of political

responsibility if blackouts occur. But in reality, he had plenty of warning that California was short of electric energy.

Last summer, the state experienced brief blackouts during late afternoon and early evening hours as solar power production began its daily decline and the state could not procure enough backup power from the regional grid to cover the deficit.

It was a wakeup call about the state's growing dependence on solar, wind and other emission-free sources that lack the dependability of more traditional generation – unless the state has sufficient battery banks or other ways to store and supply power when needed the most.

"These blackouts, which occurred without prior warning or enough time for preparation, are unacceptable and unbefitting of the nation's largest and most innovative state. This cannot stand," Newsom said at the time.

If Newsom had heeded the 2020 warning and done then what he wants to do now to improve resiliency, the state would have been better equipped to deal with the current shortfall. He has to hope that California will avoid blackouts in the six weeks between now and the close of voting on September 14, or that if the lights do go out, voters won't punish him as they did Gray Davis 18 years ago.

NOTICE OF ADOPTED ORDINANCE

The following is an Ordinance adopted by the City Council of the City of Rancho Cordova at its meeting of August 2, 2021:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA ADOPTING A SECOND AMENDMENT OF AMENDED AND RESTATED DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA AND ALTA VISTA, LLC RELATIVE TO THE RIO DEL ORO PROJECT

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals.

A. In order to strengthen the public planning process, encourage private participation in comprehensive planning and reduce the economic risk of development, the Legislature of the State of California adopted Section 65864, *et seq.*, of the Government Code (the "Development Agreement Statute"), authorizing the City, and any person having a legal or equitable interest in the real property, to enter into a development agreement and establish certain development rights in the property, which is the subject of the development project application. Pursuant to Government Code section 65868, development agreements may be amended by mutual assent of the parties.

B. The City and Alta Vista, LLC. ("Landowner") entered into an Amended and Restated Development Agreement (the "ARDA") which was approved by the City Council on November 4, 2019 and recorded on June 10, 2020.

C. The City and Landowner entered into the ARDA relative to development within a 1,516-acre portion of the Rio Del Oro Specific Plan Area as defined in the ARDA (the "Property").

D. The City and Landowner entered into a First Amendment of the ARDA ("First Amendment") that was approved by the City Council on November 4, 2019 and recorded on April 7, 2020.

E. The City and Landowner entered into the First Amendment relative to development within a 169.7-acre portion of the Property as defined in the First Amendment ("First Amendment Property").

F. Pursuant to Government Code section 65868, the City and Landowner now wish to enter into a Second Amendment affecting the same Property that was the subject of the ARDA to revise the Parties' obligations with respect to drainage improvements along Sunrise Boulevard and White Rock Road improvements.

G. The adoption of this Second Amendment is exempt from CEQA under CEQA Guideline 15061(b)(3).

N. On July 19, 2021, the City Council, as the legislative body for purposes of Development Agreement approval, held a properly noticed public hearing pursuant to Government Code section 65867 and considered all comments received in writing and all testimony received at the public hearing.

Section 2: Findings.

Therefore, on the basis of: (a) the foregoing recitals, which are hereby incorporated herein; (b) the City of Rancho Cordova's General Plan and General Plan EIR; (c) the Amended RDO Specific Plan; (d) the entitlements and CEQA approvals for Rio Del Oro; and (on the basis of the specific conclusions set forth below, the City Council finds and determines that:

A. The Second Amendment is consistent with the objectives, policies, general land uses and programs specified and contained in the City's General Plan in that: (a) The ARDA and the Second Amendment do not amend or revise the development standards in the Amended RDO Specific Plan; (b) The General Plan consistency findings made by the City Council in Ordinance No. 11-2019, 9-2016, 16-2010 and 33-2010, including the General Plan consistency analysis matrix are still accurate and relevant, and are incorporated herein by this reference as if set forth in full herein.

B. The Second Amendment will not be detrimental to the public interest, health, safety, convenience or welfare of the City in that the Project will proceed in accordance with all the programs and policies of the General Plan and the Amended RDO Specific Plan.

C. The City Council finds that the adoption of this Second Amendment is exempt from CEQA under CEQA Guideline 15061(b)(3).

D. The Second Amendment is consistent with and includes the substantive elements of Government Code sections 65864 through 65869.5, and has been processed consistent with all the procedural requirements thereof.

Section 3: Approval of Second Amendment of the Amended and Restated Development Agreement.

The City Council hereby approves the Second Amendment of the Amended and Restated Development Agreement, attached to this Ordinance and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A, and authorizes the City Manager to sign the amended Development Agreement after the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section 4: Recordation

Within ten (10) days after the Second Amendment to the Amended and Restated Development Agreement is executed by the City Manager, the City Clerk shall submit the amendment to the County Recorder for recordation.

Section 5: Severability.

If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision and, to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are severable. This City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance irrespective of the invalidity of any particular portion thereof and intends that the invalid portions should be severed, and the balance of the Ordinance be enforced.

Section 6: Publication and Effective Date.

Within fifteen (15) days after adoption, a summary of this Ordinance shall be published once in the Grapevine Independent or the Sacramento Bee, a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in Sacramento County and circulated in the City of Rancho Cordova, in accordance with Government Code section 36933. This Ordinance shall take effect and be enforced thirty (30) days after its adoption.

CDPH Launches New Campaign to Combat Teen Vaping

I had on my health and my family, after I got out of the hospital, I knew I had to focus on living a healthier lifestyle, and that started with quitting vaping," said Blake Grey, a 20-year-old content creator and "Tell Your Story" campaign ambassador from Los Angeles. Grey underwent emergency surgery in 2019 when he was diagnosed with pneumomediastinum, caused by a vaping injury that burned a hole in his esophagus. "I'd tried quitting before, and it was easy to fall back into old habits. But with the support of friends and family, I was able to get into the best shape of my life and found myself in a much better place mentally as well without needing to vape."

The "Tell Your Story" campaign promotes the "I Can Quit" text message program, an evidenced-based quit vaping effort that helps support the quitting process and emphasizes how to develop and successfully practice coping strategies. The program is centered on a desired quit date and then adjusts the content and timing of the texts, so they are relevant to the users' phase of quitting. The text program covers topics including motivation, planning, goal setting, seeking support, self-talk, withdrawal management, recovering from slips and much more.

The annual student tobacco survey conducted by CDPH, in partnership with University of California, San Diego, assessed the use of and attitudes toward tobacco products among middle and high school students along with social and environmental exposure to various tobacco products and advertisements. Additional key findings from the report include:

Overall tobacco use (9.7%) among high school students was mainly driven by the rate of vape use (8.2%). Vape products were the most used tobacco product among students across gender, race/ethnicity, and grade; In 2020, 11.6% of LGBTQ+ identifying high school students in California vaped, compared to the overall California high school vaping rate of 8.2 percent; High school students who rated their mental health as poor had higher current tobacco use prevalence (16.1%) compared to those who rated their mental health as good to excellent (7.9%); The vast majority of teens who vape use flavored vapes (96.2%).

Other California statutes and legal authority may affect your rights as a creditor. You may want to consult with an attorney knowledgeable in California law. YOU MAY EXAMINE the file kept by the court. If you are interested in the estate, you may file with the court a Request for Special Notice (form DE-154) of the filing of an inventory and appraisal of estate

CDC Recommends Face Covering for Indoors

California Department of Public Health

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The COVID-19 vaccines are effective in preventing serious disease. Unvaccinated persons are more likely to get infected and spread the virus which is transmitted through the air and concentrates indoors. About 15% of our population remains without the option for vaccination (children under 12 years old are not yet eligible) and risk for COVID-19 exposure and infection will remain until we reach full community immunity.

The purpose of this guidance is to provide information about higher risk settings where masks are required or recommended to prevent transmission to persons with higher risk of infection (e.g., unvaccinated or immunocompromised persons), to persons with prolonged, cumulative exposures (e.g., workers), or to persons whose vaccination status is unknown. When people who are not fully vaccinated wear a mask correctly, they protect others as well as themselves. Consistent and correct mask use by people who are not fully vaccinated is especially important indoors.

With the emergence of the more contagious Delta variant in California which now accounts for over 80% of cases sequenced, cases and hospitalizations of COVID-19

are rising throughout the state, especially amongst those that remain unvaccinated.

Despite ongoing outreach and improving COVID-19 vaccine access, as of July 27, 2021, a significant proportion of Californians throughout the state are not yet fully vaccinated. The Delta variant is two times as contagious than early COVID-19 variants, leading to increasing infections.

In California, unvaccinated persons continue to be required to wear masks in all indoor public settings. This guidance is an update, in light of review of the most recent CDC recommendations. To achieve universal masking in indoor public settings, we are recommending that fully vaccinated people also mask in indoor public settings across California. This adds an extra precautionary measure for all to reduce the transmission of COVID-19, especially in communities currently seeing the highest transmission rates. Local health jurisdictions may be more restrictive than this guidance.

In California, fully vaccinated people might choose to wear a mask in indoor non-public settings, particularly if they are immunocompromised or at increased risk for severe disease from COVID-19, or if they have someone in their household who is immunocompromised, at increased risk of severe

disease, not fully vaccinated, or not yet eligible for vaccination.

In workplaces, employers are subject to the Cal/OSHA COVID-19 Emergency Temporary Standards (ETS) or in some workplaces the Cal/OSHA Aerosol Transmissible Diseases (ATD) Standard and should consult those regulations for additional applicable requirements.

Masking Requirements
Masks are required for all individuals in the following indoor settings, regardless of vaccination status:

On public transit (examples: airplanes, ships, ferries, trains, subways, buses, taxis, and ride-shares) and in transportation hubs (examples: airport, bus terminal, marina, train station, seaport or other port, subway station, or any other area that provides transportation); **Indoors** in K-12 schools, childcare; **Emergency shelters** and cooling centers

Masks are required for all individuals, in the following indoor settings, regardless of vaccination status (and surgical masks are recommended):

Healthcare settings[6]; State and local correctional facilities and detention centers[7]; Homeless shelters[8]; Long Term Care Settings[9] & Adult and Senior Care Facilities[10].

Additionally, masks are required

for unvaccinated individuals in indoor public settings and businesses (examples: retail, restaurants, theaters, family entertainment centers, meetings, state and local government offices serving the public).

See State Health Officer Order, issued on July 26, 2021, for a full list of high-risk congregate and other healthcare settings where surgical masks are required for unvaccinated workers, and recommendations for respirator use for unvaccinated workers in healthcare and long-term care facilities in situations or settings not covered by Cal OSHA ETS or ATD.

For additional information on types of masks, the most effective masks, and ensuring a well-fitted mask, individuals should refer to CDPH Get the Most out of Masking and see CDPH Masking Guidance Frequently Asked Questions for more information.

Guidance for Businesses, Venue Operators or Hosts

In settings where masks are required only for unvaccinated individuals, businesses, venue operators or hosts may choose to:

Provide information to all patrons, guests and attendees regarding vaccination requirements and allow vaccinated individuals to self-attest that they are in compliance prior to entry; Implement vaccine verification to determine

whether individuals are required to wear a mask; Require all patrons to wear masks; No person can be prevented from wearing a mask as a condition of participation in an activity or entry into a business.

Exemptions to Masks Requirements

The following individuals are exempt from wearing masks at all times:

Persons younger than two years old. Very young children must not wear a mask because of the risk of suffocation; Persons with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents wearing a mask. This includes persons with a medical condition for whom wearing a mask could obstruct breathing or who are unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a mask without assistance; Persons who are hearing impaired, or communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication; Persons for whom wearing a mask would create a risk to the person related to their work, as determined by local, state, or federal regulators or workplace safety guidelines.

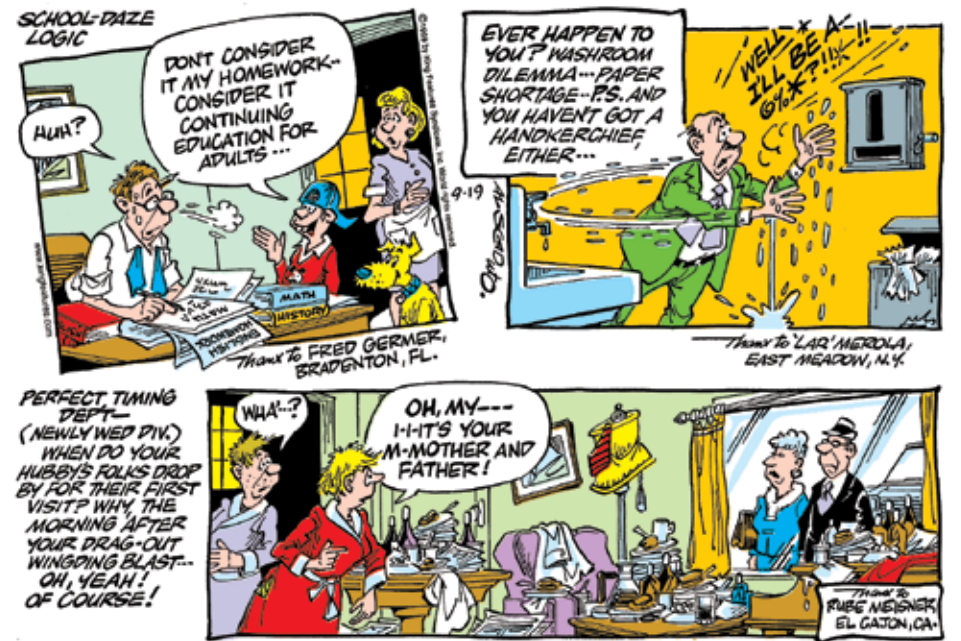

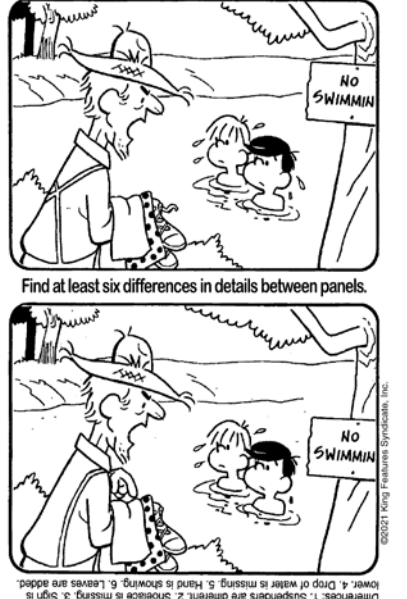

those locations are on abandoned properties, private properties, and the like.”

Without photographing a culprit in the act, water theft is hard to catch and often more complex than blatantly stealing from a hydrant.

A court ruling limits how much groundwater Helendale residents can pump. Groundwater pumping is already causing California’s valley floors to sink. But when black market buyers show up with their tanks and their cash, landowners cut deals.

“Wells in many cases are now abandoned, or the people that are living in those houses with the wells will sell their water to these haulers, in some cases, not knowing that it is an inappropriate use,” said Kimberly Cox, general manager of the Helendale Community Services District.

Local authorities are responsible for enforcing well restrictions. The state can step in for other “aqua crimes”. It can fine bandits up to \$1,000 a day – but that’s a pittance for players in a multi-billion dollar pot industry. And state’s 80-person team hasn’t been able to keep up as the crimes increase.

“We accept those complaints, we review them, we triage them, and then we prioritize them,” West said. “And in situations where we have authority, we will investigate and prosecute aggressively any water theft.”

Meanwhile, Johnson Valley resident Jo Hansen says she stays home more often to

keep an eye out for poachers. “I don’t know who breaks my water lines and does all this chaotic crap they do, but I mean, they steal constantly up here,” she said.

“Is there a mechanism to cut off the water these farms without having the response be very negative and forceful?” asked the local water manager who wanted to remain anonymous. “No one, no one’s tried this. We’re not enforcement officers, we don’t carry guns.”

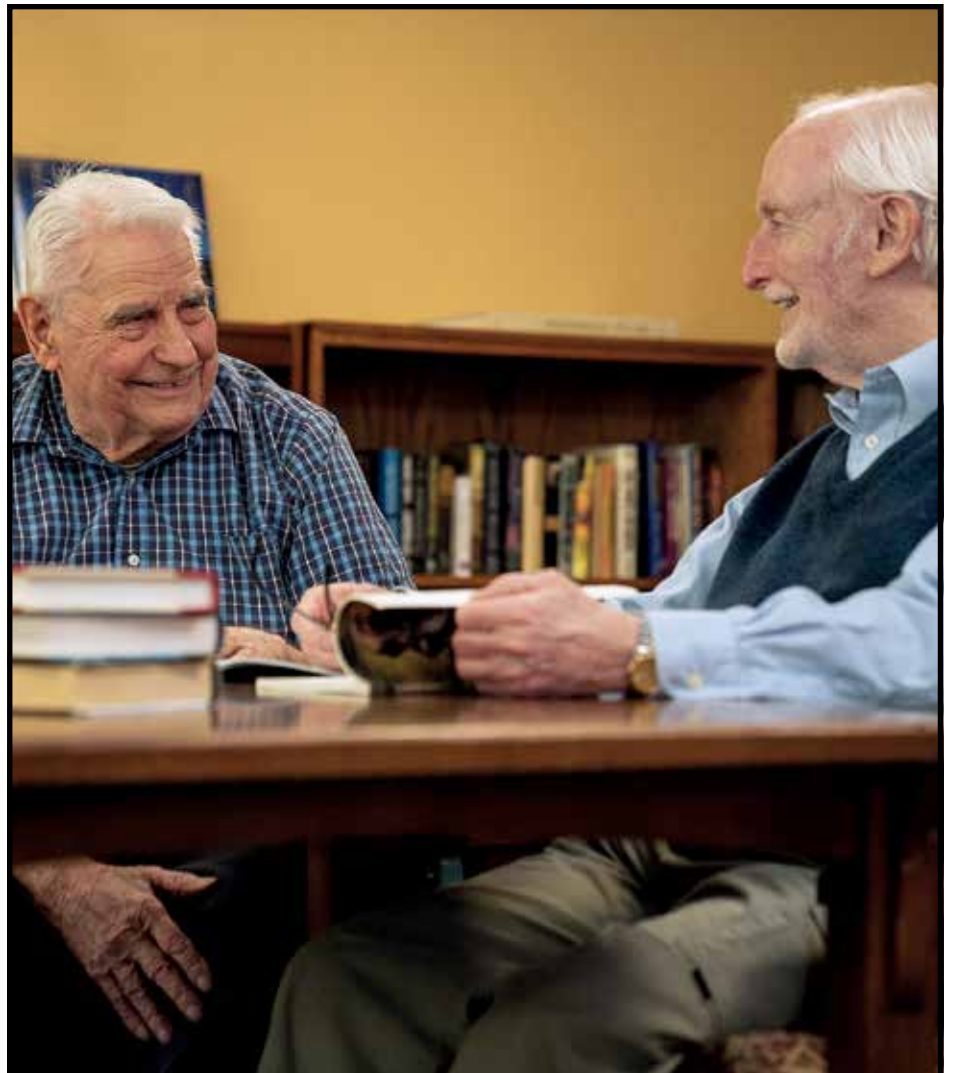
Some are taking a more confrontational approach.

“Because the sheriffs aren’t able to get on things fast enough, and we’re out here, kind of a desolate desert, most of the residents are starting to take matters into their own hands and starting to take care of it themselves scaring off the guys that are bleeding the grounds out before they can erect the greenhouses, so it doesn’t get built,” said county resident Greg Bruning.

When Gov. Gavin Newsom asked Californians to cut their water use by 15%, many braced for the possibility of more restrictions to come.

“There is a reluctance to ask our customers to cut back when there are when there is this kind of customer seems to be taking the water without regard for the drought,” the water manager said. “It’s not legal. It’s just not legal. And so you’re dealing with a lawless situation, and you’re trying to come after it with a lawful approach.”

Catalytic Converter Thefts Increase Losses

for the theft," Hernandez explains.

In insurance terms, the theft of a catalytic converter is considered "an act of God" which is outside the rental customer's immediate control," he said.

Hernandez said his facility typically books 20-30 truck rentals per day. When multiple trucks are unavailable due to punctured fuel tanks, catalytic converter theft or other damage, it's a significant loss of rental revenue, he said.

A crew of 25 fleet mechanics, all with different specialties, try to get vehicles back on the road within 24-48 hours, Hernandez said. The mechanics at U-Haul's fleet maintenance center serialize replacement catalytic converters to help in their identification and recovery.

"It's becoming increasingly difficult to meet the demand for rental truck reservations given the number of people who are now simply choosing to leave California," he said.

Some truck thefts have taken place where trucks on long-term U-Haul rental contracts have been parked overnight in hotel parking lots or left unattended for prolonged periods of time.

While the added financial burden for truck or catalytic converter theft doesn't directly fall on the local consumer, the increasing cost of truck repairs and catalytic converter replacements are likely to be passed on to

the customer in the form of higher truck rental rates, as companies such as U-Haul will have to recover their own insurance premium costs, he said.

It's not uncommon for three to four U-Haul trucks under local rental contracts to simply not return, Hernandez said.

In situations of suspected rental truck theft, a demand letter by certified mail is sent to the address of the U-Haul contract rental holder. If, or when the truck is found in-state, the California Highway Patrol (CHP) is called to clear the vehicle for recovery, he said.

"If the public sees an unattended U-Haul parked for a prolonged period of time, I encourage them to take the license plate number down and call us," he said.

Hernandez said he hopes other commercial truck rental companies and commercial fleet owners will come together to address what he describes as a collective security problem.

His local Rancho Cordova U-Haul center has taken internal measures to beef up overall physical security. The installation of a Ring camera system with motion sensors at his facility has been a deterrent, he said.

"We've detected people outside the gates of the facility late at night trying to get in," he said. "They've taken off when the speaker system is activated. We let them know we're watching." ★

fall under the jurisdiction of the Rancho Cordova Police Department. The U-Haul facility on 11351 Pyrites Way falls under the jurisdiction of the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department.

Hernandez said he wants to bring increased public attention to the growing problem of commercial catalytic converter theft occurring in U-Haul's Sacramento service area. He also wants to enlist the public's help in reporting suspected stolen U-Haul vehicles when they see them abandoned in the area.

"A commercial U-Haul customer who reports the theft of a catalytic converter during the period of a rental contract isn't considered directly liable
