Celebrate a Star-Spangled Bash

Fourth of July Parade and Activities to Resume this Year

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A parade, road run and two evenings of food, music and fireworks kick off Tuesday, July 3 as the Rancho Cordova Fourth of July Celebration makes a post-pandemic return.

It won't look like it usually does, but the parade will be featuring at least seven marching bands on July 3 and two great nights of high-flying entertainment, making Fourth of July 2021 feel closer to normal, organizers said.

"It's been a long haul and we need to celebrate," said David Sander, president of the Cordova Community Council, which organizes the event. "It's time to laugh with friends, march down Coloma Road and watch

some great fireworks honoring our great country."

One change for 2021 is a switch to Saturday, July 3 for the Rancho Cordova parade, normally held on July 4. The change occurs every seven years when the Fourth of July falls on a Sunday. When that happens, the parade is switched to July 3 to avoid interference with church services which are held Sunday mornings in the many houses of worship located along the parade route.

Coloma Road between Chase Drive and McGregor Drive will be closed to all traffic beginning at approximately 8:30 a.m. until the parade is over, around noon.

For 2021, activities kick off at 9 a.m. Saturday, July 3 for the inaugural All-America Mile, a road race

which will fly in waves down the traditional parade route on Coloma Road. The event is organized by the Rancho Cordova Track Club and will follow a one-mile straight shot from Maywood Drive to Mills Middle School. To sign up, click the "Register to Run" button at www.ranhocordovajuly4th.com.

With the run complete, the Rancho Cordova July 3rd Parade will begin at McGregor Drive and continue down Coloma, making a left turn on Rinda Drive before ending at Cordova Gardens Elementary School. Parade registrations are also open at www.ranhocordovajuly4th.com.

Another change for 2021 is a reduced schedule of events in Hagan Park, required to meet COVID 19 restrictions in place for the so-called

15 Indicted in Cocaine and Heroin Trafficking Conspiracies

U.S. Attorney's Office Eastern District of California

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A federal grand jury returned a 45-count indictment today against 15 defendants for a conspiracy to traffic cocaine, cocaine base, and heroin in the Sacramento area, Acting U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

The indictment charges the following defendants: Tyrone Anderson, 40, of Sacramento; Maurice Bryant, 51, of Antelope; Yovanny Ontiveros, 41, of Sacramento; Alex White, 61, of North Highlands; Jason Tolbert, 44, of Sacramento; Andre Hellams, 38, of North Highlands; Michael Hampton, 57, of Vallejo; Steven Hampton, 61, of Sacramento; Wilmer Harden, 52, of Elk Grove; Charles Sidney Carter, 34, of Sacramento; Bobby Conner, 50, of Sacramento; Jerome Adams, 54, of North Highlands; Dwight Haney, 49, of Sacramento; Arlington Caine, 47, of Rio Linda; and Mark Martin, 62, of Sacramento.

The indictment charges Bryant, Harden, Anderson, Carter, Conner, Adams, Haney, Caine, Martin, White, Hellams, Tolbert, Steven Hampton, and Michael Hampton with conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute at least 5 kilograms of cocaine and 280 grams of cocaine base. The indictment also charges Anderson and Ontiveros with conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute heroin. During and in furtherance of these conspiracies, the indictment charges certain defendants with distributing cocaine and cocaine base, possessing with intent to distribute cocaine and cocaine base, possessing with intent to distribute heroin, possessing firearms as felons, and using communication facilities to facilitate drug trafficking offenses. According to court documents, between March 1, 2018, and May 19, 2021, law enforcement seized over 5 kilograms of cocaine, a kilogram of heroin, a half kilogram of cocaine base, and multiple firearms.

"This investigation and indictment results in the dismantling of a network of long-time leaders and organizers in a regional

Elder Abuse on the Rise in Sacramento County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - In the past year, Sacramento County officials received more than 18,000 reports of elder abuse, up 81% compared to just five years earlier.

According to Irene Chu, program planner for Sacramento County Adult Protective Services, elder self-neglect, financial abuse, psychological abuse and neglect by others make up the bulk of APS cases.

The 2020-21 abuse reports generated nearly 5,500 formal investigations. Of these, 41% involved self-neglect, followed by financial abuse, at 22%.

Chu said financial abuse can include internet or telephone scams involving identity theft, investment swindles, computer virus schemes and charity or family-member-in-need scams. Even worse may be swindles and theft by caregivers, which may leave the victims destitute.

Self-neglect cases can range from elderly people failing to take their medication to not being able to maintain healthful conditions in their homes or suffering from physical or mental disabilities that make it difficult for them to care for themselves. Homeless individuals are particularly vulnerable to self-neglect and abuse by others, she said.

Chu stressed that in nearly all cases of elder abuse and neglect, isolation is the key risk factor.

"It's not just for those people living by

themselves. Even if an elder is living with family members or friends, he or she can be isolated. In some extreme situations, caregivers may take away their Social Security checks, block their contact with outsiders or keep them confined to the house because they don't want people to know what they are doing."

Chu said it is critical that people maintain constant contact with their elder loved ones. "Keep calling them," she said. "Make sure when you talk to your loved ones that you don't sense

any hesitation when they are talking to you. Without communication, you won't be able to see the signs of possible abuse."

She urged people to learn and watch for the signs of elder abuse in their loved ones. She noted that APS social workers can link clients to services to help them live safely in their own homes.

How to report suspected cases of elder abuse

If you believe an elderly person is in immediate danger, call 911. Otherwise, Sacramento County Adult Protective Services

(APS) has a 24-hour hotline for reporting abuse of older adults and disabled adults who may be physically or financially abused, neglected or exploited. Call (916) 874-9377.

To report suspected abuse of an elder in a nursing home, residential care facility for the elderly, or assisted living facility, contact California's CRISISline at (800) 231-4024. During business hours call the local Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program of Agency on Aging Area 4 at (916) 376-8910. ★

 “mega event.” The carnival and other Kids Zone activities will be missing this year, but beer and food will be available for purchase, concerts will be held at 8 p.m. and Rancho Cordova’s famed fireworks spectaculars will be held on at approximately 9:30 p.m. both July 3 and July 4.

Parking opens at 5 p.m. and admissions gates open at 6 p.m. on July 3 and July 4. Tickets are \$5 each and must be purchased online at www.ranhocordovajuly4th.com. Parking

is \$10 per car, cash only. The July 3 and 4 concerts and fireworks shows will be identical, making either night a great experience in Hagan Park.

Featured concert performers each night will be CCsegerR, a traditional rock ‘n roll band playing tribute to the hits of Credence Clearwater Revival and Bob Seger and the Silver Bullet Band.

The Rancho Cordova Fourth of July Celebration, now in its 36th year, normally attracts more than 20,000 visitors to Hagan

cocaine, heroin, and crack cocaine distribution chain that stretches beyond the Eastern District of California, through Southern California, and into Mexico,” said Acting U.S. Attorney Talbert.

“This criminal organization utilized an interstate drug pipeline that reached far beyond the Sacramento region,” said DEA Special Agent in Charge Wade R. Shannon. “These arrests underscore our commitment to rid communities of drug trafficking networks and the poison they peddle.”

“The FBI is proud to partner with its local, state, and federal Strike Force partners to disrupt and dismantle violent criminal organizations that threaten the safety of the communities we serve,” said Special Agent in Charge Sean Ragan of the FBI Sacramento Field Office. “Together, we are stronger, leveraging seamless communication and our individual strengths to identify and disrupt illegal drug distribution networks.”

“The success of this indictment highlights the importance and necessity of law enforcement partnerships across the spectrum,” said Special Agent in Charge Tatum King, who oversees HSI operations in Northern California. “Strong partnerships among federal, state and local law enforcement agencies are critical to apprehending those that profit from the purveyance of dangerous drugs to our communities.”

This case is the product of an investigation by the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Homeland Security Investigations, the U.S. Marshals Service, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, the U.S. Forest Service, the U.S. Postal Inspection Service, the Bureau of Land Management, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, the California Department of Justice, the California Highway Patrol, the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Office, and the Sacramento Police Department. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Cameron L. Desmond and Aaron D. Pennekamp are prosecuting the case.

If convicted of the conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute cocaine and cocaine base charge, Bryant, Harden, Anderson, Carter, Conner, Adams, Haney, Caine, Martin, White, Hellams, Tolbert, Steven Hampton, and Michael Hampton face a maximum statutory penalty of life in prison and a \$10 million fine. If convicted of the conspiracy to distribute and possess with intent to distribute heroin charge, Bryant and Ontiveros face a maximum statutory penalty of 20 years in prison and a \$1 million fine. Any sentence, however, would be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables. The charges are only allegations; the defendants are presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

This prosecution is part of the Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) Strike Force Initiative, which provides for the establishment of permanent multi-agency task force teams that work side-by-side in the same location. The Sacramento Strike Force is a co-located model enables agents from different agencies to collaborate on intelligence-driven, multi-jurisdictional operations to disrupt and dismantle the most significant drug traffickers, money launderers, gangs, and transnational criminal organizations. The specific mission of the Sacramento Strike Force is to identify, investigate, disrupt, and dismantle the most significant drug trafficking organizations (DTOs) and transnational criminal organizations (TCOs) shipping narcotics, firearms, and money through the Eastern District of California, thereby reducing the flow of these criminal resources in California and the rest of the United States. The Sacramento Strike Force leads intelligence-driven investigations targeting the leadership and support elements of these DTOs and TCOs operating within the Eastern District of California, regardless of their geographic base of operations. ★

Suspect Arrested: Lewd Acts with Child

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Sheriff’s Office/Sacramento Valley Hi Tech Crimes Task Force arrested Steven Richard Kester (75), of Orangevale, for multiple counts of felony Lewd and Lascivious Acts with a Child Under 14. Kester is a retired teacher and former substitute teacher for the Folsom Cordova Unified School

District (FCUSD) and other schools in the Sacramento area. This arrest is the result of a collaborative investigation by the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Office and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Kester is currently being held in the Sacramento County Main Jail without bail.

All Adults Should Get Tested for Hepatitis C

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - An estimated 2.4 million people are living with hepatitis C in the United States. However, many don't know they are infected because chronic hepatitis C does not have symptoms for 20 years or more. By that time, serious damage can occur to your liver and can lead to death. The good news is that life-saving treatments can cure hepatitis C in 8 to 12 weeks to prevent further liver damage, cirrhosis and liver cancer. Getting tested for hepatitis C is the first step.

"We want to educate the community that lives can be saved just by getting tested for hepatitis C. This virus is the leading cause of liver cancer and liver transplants," said Sacramento County Health Officer Dr. Olivia Kasirye.

The liver is a vital organ that processes nutrients, filters the blood and fights infections. Hepatitis causes inflammation of the liver that can affect its function. Although hepatitis is caused by a virus and exposure to the blood of an infected person most often, toxins, some medications, certain medical conditions and heavy alcohol use can also cause hepatitis. The most common types of viral hepatitis in the U.S. are hepatitis A, hepatitis B and hepatitis C. Although all types of viral hepatitis can cause similar symptoms, they are spread in different ways, have different treatments, and some types of hepatitis are more serious than others.

Hepatitis C is caused by the hepatitis C virus. When someone is first infected with the hepatitis C virus, they can have

a very mild illness with few symptoms or could require hospitalization. Less than half of people who get hepatitis C are able to get rid of the virus without treatment. Those who get infected will likely develop a chronic lifelong infection, which left untreated can cause serious health problems including liver disease, liver failure, liver cancer and death.

CDC recommends you get tested for hepatitis C if you: Are 18 years old and older; Are pregnant (get tested during each pregnancy); Currently inject drugs (get tested regularly); Have ever injected drugs, even if it was just once or many years ago; Have HIV; Have abnormal liver tests or liver disease; Are on hemodialysis; Received donated blood or organs before July 1992; Received clotting factor concentrates before 1987; Have been exposed to blood from a person who has hepatitis C; Were born to a mother with hepatitis C.

The hepatitis C test is a blood test that looks for HCV antibodies to find out if someone has ever been infected with the hepatitis C virus. Test results can take anywhere from a few days to a few weeks to come back. Rapid anti-HCV tests are available in some health clinics and the results of these tests are available in 20 to 30 minutes. If you are positive for the HCV antibodies, a follow-up test called NAT/PCR test will be done.

Learn more about hepatitis C and talk to your doctor about getting tested for hepatitis C – it could save your life. You can also contact the Sacramento County Sexual Health Clinic for testing, call 916-875-1551 or go to www.SacSexualHealth.org for more information. ★

Newsom Owes Apology for EDD's Failings?

Were Gov. Gavin Newsom as humble as he often proclaims to be, he would interrupt his "California Comeback" campaign long enough to issue a personal apology to hundreds of thousands of Californians who remain mired in the managerial meltdown at the Employment Development Department.

Yes, as Newsom constantly reminds us, the threat from COVID-19 has diminished and the state's battered economy is slowly recovering. Nevertheless, California has the nation's second highest unemployment rate and well over a million California workers are still jobless, many of whom qualify for unemployment insurance benefits — if they can ever get their applications resolved.

Journalists who write about economic issues, including yours truly, receive steady streams of emails from frustrated claimants who can't get their calls answered and/or have their benefits frozen for reasons that are never explained.

A lengthy message from "Lindsay" typifies the sad syndrome. She worked for a travel agency before

being laid off last year and has been dealing with the EDD bureaucracy, or trying to deal, ever since, even after returning to parttime work. One passage:

"It wasn't until April 22nd that I got my back pay for the previous 6 1/2 weeks I went without a dime. Mind you during this time I had lost my car insurance 2x, missed being able to celebrate Christmas or buy gifts, couldn't pay rent or really eat. I barely take home \$600 twice a month from work too."

"After the last back pay I received it wasn't even a full week before realizing I had not received any money from EDD. I guess because I had this \$1,500 in back pay that was deposited. I hadn't really calculated the fact that I was missing 2 of my weeks that I just certified for and logged in to my (unemployment insurance) account to see that EDD had randomly disqualified me for 2 weeks of pay without any reasoning, no information sent to me or emailed, and this occurred without notifying my employer."

The problems with EDD first surfaced 14 months ago, when the economy was shutting down due to Newsom's emergency orders, and Newsom promised to fix them. "We have to meet the moment," he told reporters then. "We have to provide more support."

In fact, however, the glitches continued and became steadily worse. The most recent EDD bulletin says it has a backlog of nearly 230,000 unresolved claims, a number that has

been growing lately, not shrinking.

When Newsom launched his California Comeback campaign with a lavishly choreographed State of the State speech in March, he obviously meant it to blunt a recall campaign aimed at short-circuiting his political career.

He touted progress on dampening the pandemic and rebuilding the economy and closed with "Our hopeful vision of our brighter future is the basis for the decisions we make today. We place faith over fear — optimism over pessimism. The power is in our hands."

Newsom did not, however, even mention the never-resolved crisis at EDD that he had promised to repair nearly a year earlier. The revised state budget he unveiled in May does mention it, saying blandly, "The pandemic has exposed many of EDD's antiquated processes and outdated infrastructure, resulting in a delay or inability for many Californians to access (unemployment) benefits."

Duh. Everybody, including Newsom, knew that more than a year ago. Subsequently, EDD managed to hand out billions of dollars to fraudsters while jobless workers like Lindsay have suffered economic stress because he didn't make good on his promise, which is why he owes them a humble apology.

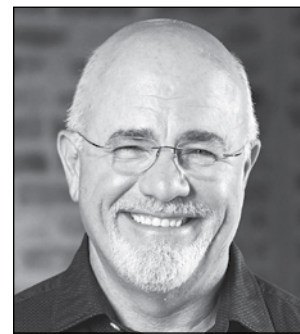

North, Central, East Patrol and Rancho Cordova Police Department, as well as the specialty teams of North POP, North HOT, Major Crimes, Special Enforcement Detail (SED) Gang Suppression Unit and Community Service Officers are utilizing body worn cameras during the duration of their shift. Additional Sacramento County Sheriff's Office personnel will be outfitted with body cams pending Board of Supervisor budgetary approval.

The Sacramento County Sheriff's

Office is proud of how our deputies provide service to the community they serve. We look forward to our new ability to showcase our deputy's professionalism and are confident recording their everyday activities and interactions with the community. The Sacramento Sheriff's Office is a leader in our profession, innovation and best practices. Body worn cameras will allow the Office of the Sheriff to remain on the cutting edge of technology while providing quality "Service with Concern" to the citizens of Sacramento County.

The Sacramento County Sheriff's Office is cognizant of the privacy concerns of our community. Our Deputies have been trained regarding the recording of victims of crimes. Victims can request the camera be turned off and the investigating deputy will in most instances honor that request. All body worn camera videos will be in compliance with the Public Records Act. ★

Sacramento County Recommended Budget Approved

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously on June 10 to approve the \$6.5 billion recommended budget for Fiscal Year 2021-22.

“We are fortunate that in spite of the pandemic, the County is in relatively good fiscal shape for the upcoming fiscal year,” said Board Chair Sue Frost, District 4 Supervisor. “This budget avoided significant reductions in programs and included new investments in a number of important areas.”

The \$6.5 billion budget consists of \$2.437 billion in Enterprise and Special Revenue Fund expenditures (funded through utility rates, fees and other dedicated revenue), \$3.147 billion in General Fund, and \$947 million in Restricted Funds (funded with federal, State revenue dedicated for a particular purpose).

“We have been faced with many profound challenges both locally and nationally this past year,” said Interim County Executive Ann Edwards. “The County was able to weather fiscal challenges last year and as we look forward to the next fiscal year, I am excited to implement initiatives, plans and processes to accomplish real change and advancement in the County.”

“In this next fiscal year, we will sharpen the County’s focus on diversity, equity and inclusion across County departments and in the community. Additionally, we will have a more robust community engagement element to our budget processes for FY 2022-23.”

In addition to maintaining existing services, the budget reflects a commitment to:

Address equity and inclusion issues; **Address the needs of homelessness** on our community; **Provide an alternative to police response** to people experiencing mental illness; Address critical needs for **capital improvements in the Parks system** and at the Mather Community Campus; and, **improve the condition of County roads.**

The budget recognized new areas of growth, including annual commitments of:

\$12 million to fund a non-law enforcement Alternative Emergency Response to people experiencing mental health issues in the unincorporated County and all cities except for the City of Sacramento;

\$5.9 million to fund a Homeless Encampment Initiative designed to get people without housing in the unincorporated County off the streets and into temporary and eventually permanent housing;

\$5 million to fund the Probation Department’s Monitored Pre-trial Release Program;

\$6.8 million to fund continued efforts to meet the County’s obligations under the Mays Consent decree regarding conditions of confinement in the County’s jails;

\$6.4 million in grant funding for the epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity (ELC) Enhancing Detection Expansion Program in Public Health that supports epidemiology and laboratory services for COVID-19 and to prepare and address other emerging infectious diseases;

\$2.5 million to fund an additional Foster

Care Unit, two additional Emergency Response Units and two additional Public Health Nurses in Child Protection Services, which will reduce caseloads per social worker;

\$2.2 million for increased processing costs related to organic solid waste;

\$1.2 million to fund the Public Defender’s Pre-Trial Release and Expungement programs, which assists offenders who have served their term expunge their records in order to get housing and jobs.

One-time growth included:

Transfer of \$22.5 million from the General Fund and the Roads Fund to spend on County road pavement rehabilitation projects where the road is on the verge of needing much more costly full reconstruction;

\$4.4 million to cover the cost of the special gubernatorial recall election that is likely to occur in FY2021-22;

Transfer of \$4.4 million from the General Fund to the Parks Construction Fund to begin addressing the \$72 million backlog in Regional Parks capital needs;

Transfer of \$1 million from the General Fund to the Capital Construction Fund to start addressing the \$11 million backlog in Mather Community Campus capital needs. If resources are available, the plan is to transfer an additional \$4 million in the September Final Budget.

The recommended budget included approximately \$5.3 million in program expenditure reductions. The reductions were primarily categorical reductions, meaning the reductions are due to a reduction in State or federal

revenue. There are also non-categorical reductions, which are reductions that departments have indicated that the reduction will improve efficiency or not have a negative impact on services provided by the department. The departments with the largest reductions include:

Probation, with a \$4.4 million reduction due to completion of the Monitored Pre-trial Release Pilot Program, which had been funded for two years with State grant and Realignment revenue. However, funding for this program, which is no longer a pilot, is restored by a recommended growth request funded by \$3 million in County costs and \$2 million in remaining State grant funds.

Sheriff, with a \$428,000 reduction in expenditures due to the end of the Department of Justice Tobacco Grant funding. This will eliminate the Tobacco Abatement Team, which worked to mitigate juvenile tobacco use through education and proactive enforcement.

The numbers on the Recommended Budget will change between now and September, when the County receives new information, including the impact of the State Budget and updated revenue totals. The Final Budget will come back to the Board of Supervisors in September for review and adoption.

Multiple EDD Bills Get Senate's Nod of Approval

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senate Republicans announce the passage of Senate Bill 39, Senate Bill 58, and Senate Bill 390 by the Senate. These bills address some of the critical lapses in security at California's Employment Development Department that have contributed to the rampant fraud in unemployment insurance claims this last year. Senate Republicans have made it a priority to correct some of the glaring issues at the agency that resulted in billions of dollars in fraud and ensure the agency is better prepared for the next economic downturn.

These include: **SB 39**, authored by Republican Senator Shannon Grove, would require the EDD to cross check prison inmate records with unemployment claims to prevent benefits from going to prisoners. **SB 390** would require the EDD to establish and routinely revise a recession plan to increase the department's efficiency during an economic downturn. Republican Leader Scott Wilk, Senator Rosilie Ochoa Bogh,

Senator Brian Jones, Senator Melissa Melendez, and Senator Jim Nielsen are co-authors of SB 390. **Senate Bill 58**, authored by Republican Leader Wilk, would require the EDD to immediately end the practice of including full social security numbers on its most frequently mailed documents. SB 58 passed the Senate earlier this month and is in the California State Assembly awaiting consideration. **SB 232**, authored by Republican Senator Nielsen, would implement all of the State Auditor's recommendations from the previous three audits of EDD. It is scheduled for a floor vote in early June.

"Government completely failed its unemployed citizens this past year and now the governor has failed to prioritize fixing the problems in his budget. It is just heartbreaking to hear from families teetering on the edge simply because their claims are lost in some bureaucratic black hole. These issues need to be addressed and corrected as soon as possible to ensure they do not happen again," said Senate Republican Leader Scott Wilk (R-Santa Clarita).

Dahle Opposes Tax Increases and Costly Regulation on Businesses

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On June 3, 2021, Assemblywoman Megan Dahle (R-Bieber) and other Assembly Republicans were successful in stopping legislation advanced by the majority party in Sacramento that would have imposed a costly excise tax on firearms,

and several bills proposing more burdensome environmental regulation and red tape on businesses.

"Despite the fact that California is ranked one of the worst states to do business in the nation and we have one of the highest costs of living, the super majority in Sacramento continues to push forward legislation that would make matters worse." I have, and will continue, to oppose legislation that makes it harder for businesses

to survive in our state, and tax increases on our already over-taxed constituents. For now we have stopped these bills, but we must remain vigilant to stave off further attempts by the majority party that will only make life more expensive for Californians."

The following bills were successfully stopped on the Assembly floor: AB 1395 would have imposed more misguided environmental regulations that are unachievable. AB 1223 would impose an excise tax on firearms and ammunition. AB 1371 would ban the use of certain packaging materials by small and large online retailers, dramatically increasing the cost to businesses and consumer prices.

Is the Donut Hole Getting You!!

Jennifer:

Your husband's prescription drug problem is a typical problem since the cost of brand name prescriptions such as Xarelto have risen dramatically. You can afford his \$180 co pays, BUT... have no idea that the true cost of his prescription drugs is now \$1250 each month.

Once his Medicare Part D prescription drug plan and the co pays he pays totals \$4130 for 2021 for his covered drugs, then your husband has entered the famous "Donut Hole" or coverage gap.

He must pay to \$6550 to get out of the "Donut hole". He will pay 25% cost for a brand name drug and the brand name drug manufacturer will pay 70% of that covered brand name drug cost with the remaining 5% cost paid by the prescription drug plan which he enrolled in.

What happens if your brand name drug is not a "covered" brand name drug on your specific Part D plan? Your husband will have to pay 100% of that brand name drug.

Generics cost a considerable amount less and for 2021, the cost is a 25% co pay of the generic cost instead of 25% co pay for the cost of an expensive brand name prescription drug when in the "Donut hole".

That is why it is important when choosing a Medicare Part D prescription drug plan whether beginning Medicare for the first time or during Fall's Medicare's annual enrollment period to be sure all prescriptions are covered on one's Medicare Part D plan.

Do research prior to enrolling in a Part D because one cannot change if the wrong choice for a Part D plan is made until Medicare's next annual enrollment period which is from October 15th to December 7th every year.

January 1 of each year, the process starts all over again, with a new Medicare Prescription Drug plan and different costs, deductibles, and a new Donut hole.

Toni's Tips to help you stay out of the Donut Hole or not get in it as soon!

1. Visit www.medicare.gov when selecting a Medicare Part D plan whether it is your first time or changing during Medicare's Annual Enrollment Period in the fall. This is an accurate way to view the cost of drugs and which plan and pharmacy is most cost effective.
2. Talk to your doctor or doctors about which brand name drugs can be changed to generics.
3. Get samples from your doctor.
4. See what generics are on GoodRX.com website or in a \$4 or \$5 generic prescription drug programs at HEB, Wal-Mart, and Costco etc.... Pay for the generics out of your pocket.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova, RCPD and Sacramento Metro Fire District encourage residents to be safe when using fireworks this Fourth of July season.

The unsafe use of fireworks can have devastating effects, including fire-related property damage and severe injuries. And, with news of the drought, the risk of fire is extremely high. Keep your loved ones and community safe by following key safety tips and know how to report illegal fireworks use.

Plus, when you put your fireworks safety knowledge to the test, you could win four tickets to Rancho Cordova's 4th of July Celebration! Enter for the chance to win at CityofRanchoCordova.org/fireworks by Wednesday, June 30, 2021, at 5 PM.

Fireworks 101:

All legal fireworks in California are called **Safe and Sane Fireworks and must bear the State Fire Marshal's seal**; Safe and Sane Fireworks may be sold only at licensed and permitted businesses from noon on June 28, 2021 through 10 PM on July 4, 2021; In Rancho Cordova, use of fireworks is allowed only between noon on **June 28, 2021 through 10 PM on July 4, 2021**, and only **between 8 AM and 10 PM** daily during this period; Say "no" to illegal fireworks. **Fireworks that explode or leave the ground are illegal** in California and prohibited by law, punishable by up to

a year in county jail and up to a \$1,000 fine; It is **illegal for anyone under 18 years of age to use fireworks, and it is also illegal to sell, give or deliver fireworks** to anyone under 18; It is **illegal to point or throw** a firework into a crowd or at people; Fireworks are **not allowed in any public park**.

Safety Tips:

Always have a **bucket of water** nearby to dispose of fireworks; Always have a **hose connected** to water available in case of fire; **Do not use fireworks near dry grass** or other flammable materials. Mow your lawn more frequently to reduce fire hazards; **Do not use fireworks while under** a canopy, covered balcony, covered patio or under a tree or bushes; **Never attempt to relight or "fix"** fireworks; Pets can become frightened by the loud sounds and of fireworks. **Keep your pets indoors**, or if you take a pet with you, keep him or her leashed and under your direct control at all times; Leave the fireworks to the pros!
