

Fury on the River



DA's Office Secures \$480,000 in Restitution for the **Sacramento Library** SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

District Attorney (DA) Jan Scully announced that due to the success of its Office in seizing assets Sacramento Public Library Authority will receive \$480,000 in restitution it is due.

Former library employees Dennis Nilsson and James Mayle, as well as Mayle's wife, Janie Rankins-Mayle, were convicted in December 2011 of theft, bribery, and conflict of interest related to their fraudulent billing scheme for maintenance services. They were ordered to pay \$768,130 in restitution. Nilsson was ordered to pay an additional \$55.967.

Using white collar crime laws, the District Attorney's Office froze assets belonging to the defendants. After sentencing, the court appointed J. Benjamin McGrew of Managewest, Inc. to levy those assets. McGrew generated \$480,000 for restitution from the sale of a Folsom residence, several vehicles, and the liquidation of bank accounts. Supervising Deputy District Attorney Michael Blazina, who prosecuted the case, stated, "In many embezzlement cases victims do not get their money back. Fortunately in this case, not all of the stolen money was squandered and several properties still existed with sufficient value. Although the library is not yet made whole for its loss, a significant part of the taxpayers' money is being returned to the agency from which it was wrongfully taken." SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) For millennia, the American River has been a passage for animal and human migration. This fall, salmon migration has turned the waterway into a freeway of love.

In what is shaping up to be the best run for six years (2008 to 2009 numbers were so low that river and ocean salmon fishing were outlawed) adult Chinook are now heading up-river to complete their lifecycle. For the past two weeks, many thousands of spawners per day have surged through Sacramento, Carmichael, Fair Oaks and Gold River.

Leaping, knifing river surfaces like jet skis, climbing over gravel banks – or just swimming doggedly to their destiny – the fish have no focus other than to reach the waters where they spawned. Whether they mate in gravel beds or are perfunctorily relieved of eggs and milt at the Nimbus hatchery, they will all be dead within weeks.

Fish that hatched four years ago now measure up to four feet and can weigh 50 pounds. All bear scars of a long trek from the Pacific. The krill diet that colored their flesh is hundreds miles behind; they have not eaten for weeks. By the time they reach San Juan Rapids, degenerating flesh has absorbed much of their scales. Decay mottles their sides. Some fish have turned vivid magenta in color. Hooked jaws and dog-like teeth transform male profiles. But to Chinook hens, such cruising gargoyles are



princes. Though the act will kill them, these fish mean to mate.

In full fury during November, the salmon run continues through December and – in dwindling numbers -- until after Christmas. Experts predict up to 50,000 salmon may run this season. "It's a good number," observes California Fish and Wildlife scientist Bob Titus. "The department will count carcasses for weeks to make a population estimate, but it looks like stock is continuing to rebuild."

With runs of less than 6000 fish recorded six years ago, Chinook extinction in the American River seemed possible. The species' changing fortune reflects ocean and river changes over the past several years. Tons of gravel were poured in Carmichael and Gold River shallows to create new spawning beds; angling was curbed. In mitigation for Folsom Dam, six million salmon juveniles are bred and released annually by the Nimbus Hatchery. Pacific Ocean conditions may also have changed

City Permit Technician Wins Scholarship

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - For the second year in a row, Denise Reese, a building permit technician with the City of Rancho Cordova, has been awarded the \$500 Bob Stoddard Scholarship by the Sacramento Valley Association of Building Officials (SVABO).

Reese is currently enrolled in the Building Inspection Technology (BIT) certification program at Consumnes River College. She will complete requirements for the BIT program at the end of December but will continue her education to earn an Associate in Science degree. Her long-term goal is to become a plan reviewer.

Reese started at the City in 2006, working as an administrative secretary in the City Manager's Office. After serving as a customer service specialist for that office and the Building and Safety Division, she began training as a permit technician in 2009.

She currently helps customers with permitting questions and issues, processes residential and commercial application and permits, and coordinates building plan reviews and inspections, in addition to other Building and Safety Division tasks.

"Being awarded the scholarship is an accomplishment that makes me feel great; plus it helps with school expenses," she said

The scholarship is named for Stoddard, a long-time SVABO member who was devoted to the work of quality codes and uniform enforcement and a strong supporter of building code enforcement education. Although there can be more than one scholarship awarded, Reese is on the only 2013 winner.



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Ygrene Energy Fund announced the expansion of its successful PACE financing programs to Sacramento and Yolo counties. A lot of crappie lakes help provide cooling water for nearby power plants. In winter, look for crappie in the warm

water near discharge outlets. If you want to catch them, vou might have to move around some to find them. Sometimes power plant current tends to hug the shore or it may curve offshore. A temperature gauge can help you find the right temperature where crappie are liable to be.

If there is no power plant, then the headwaters tend to be the best for winter crappie fishing. Crappie tend to hang around these headwaters in the winter because it is usually the first place to warm up in early spring.

Some people are lucky enough to have enclosed heated fishing docks located over crappie beds on lakes in the area where you can fish in warmth and comfort.

Court Rules to Halt California High Speed Rail

Doug LaMalfa today commented on a state court ruling which found the California High Speed Rail Authority's plan violated voter-approved law and effectively halted the project. LaMalfa, who authored legislation to place the project back on the ballot while a member of the state Senate, said the ruling would finally force the state government to recognize that the project bore no resemblance to the plan voters were promised.

"It's been clear for years that the California High Speed Rail Authority has little regard for the promises made to voters in 2008. After spending \$600 million the





WASHINGTON, **DC** - Representative Authority has nothing to show for it but a plan that violates the written bond measure that was passed," said LaMalfa. "This ruling is a victory for voters and a reminder that California's governent must abide by its own laws, regardless of what some politicians think."

While voters were promised a system connecting Sacramento, San Francisco, Los Angeles and San Diego for about \$34 billion, the Authority's plan costs over twice as much and would reach from near San Francisco to near Los Angeles. Despite being promised a one-seat ride, Californians would need to transfer to local mass transit to actually reach

those cities.

"The ruling halts state spending and most federal funds can't be spent without matching funds from the state, meaning the project is dead in the water," LaMalfa added. "I'll be working in Washington to ensure that the unspent federal funding is redirected to more useful purposes, which at this point would be literally almost anything else."
