Rancho Cordova Hosts International Fellow

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)-The City of Rancho Cordova is hosting two fellows through the U.S. Department of State-sponsored Professional Fellows Program. Ms. Aphakorn Trairekpan from Songkhla, Thailand and Ms. Wang Jingbo from Beijing, China arrived on Friday, October 18th for a two-week stay in Rancho Cordova.

Rancho Cordova was chosen as one of five cities in the nation to host 10 international fellows. The City jumped at the opportunity to share cultures and learn about differing governance structures, all with a focus on engaging citizens.

The exchange was arranged by the International City/County Management Association (ICMA), the organization that develops and advances professional local government management worldwide. Both fellows will benefit from professional development opportunities in Rancho Cordova while working on a community challenge project that supports their local cities.

Trairekpan is a community

developer in the Songkhla Municipality in Thailand. She has worked for 16 years in local

government, and her project focuses on engaging citizens to bring community forestry in

urban sustainability efforts.

"I have two motivations for the fellows program. The first is to improve my professional skills and knowledge," said Trairekpan. "The second is to gather ideas to bring back to our Mayor to implement a green city in Thailand."

Wang is a professor at the China University of Political Science and Law majoring in administrative law. Wang first learned about the exchange program at last year's ICMA Conference, and she felt the program could support her research into Beijing's administrative process.

"Through my teaching, I am always asked how to improve the level of government in Beijing," said Wang. "I want to learn about the public decision-making process and implementation of administrative law in the United States."

As part of the 2013 Professional Fellows Program, more than 400 foreign fellows, including legislators, journalists, entrepreneurs, non-profit managers, community activists,

and government officials, will come to the United States. In return, more than 300 American participants – including a City of Rancho Cordova employee – will take part in reciprocal fellowship programs overseas under the program.

But while our fellows are getting professional information and experiences, they are also learning about the American lifestyle. Since they have been here, City staff took them to a pizza party and Monday night football.

A Case in Point

Wronged at Work!

THEY SAID I'M TOO OLD, SO THEY DUMPED ME

"I'm too young to retire...but I'm too old to get a job."

A dilemma confronts millions of talented Americans. They are smart, experienced and ready to work. Yet they are jobless and unable to get hired due to their age. Many of them worry that they are not only unemployed, but unemployable in a job market that has a fetish for youth.

Age discrimination is a widespread and destructive prejudice in today's workplace. Job descriptions use code words such as "fun-loving," "high energy," or "recent college graduate." Young, unmarried employees without children are more likely to work weekends, evenings and holidays at lower rates of pay. Employers believe that younger employees will lower the costs of health insurance. Years of experience, maturity and responsibility are perceived not as valuable assets but as excess baggage.

Here's a comment from Mark Zuckerman, the 28-year-old founder of Facebook: "I want to stress the importance of being young and technical. Young people are just smarter." A senior executive at Twitter, Melissa Daimler, told the Commonwealth Club in San Francisco that said she couldn't comment on what older-generation workers want at their jobs because they don't work at Twitter, nor does Twitter target them for hire. The average age of a Twitter employee, Ms. Daimler said, is 30.

A partner at a prominent venture capital firm in Palo Alto told a conference audience, "People over 45 basically die in terms of new ideas."

I found similar comments from employers in the court records of

recent age discrimination lawsuits:

- A director of sales said that the company needed "race horses, not plow horses," and that the plaintiff's sales techniques were unacceptable because they were "old school" and resulted from "a graying of the sales force."

- The plaintiff was described as an "old geezer" who "didn't fit the mold of a young, aggressive type manager."

- The plaintiff was told that management "was looking for younger, single people" and that "you wouldn't be happy here in the future."

Statistics suggest the scope of the prejudice. The state's Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) tracks discrimination filings by categories. In 2002, DFEH recorded 3,282 complaints of age discrimination. In 2012, DFEH logged 5,605 age discrimination complaints, an increase of 71%.

One discharged employee who fought back in court was Brian Reid, a 52-year-old manager at Google who was fired nine days before Google announced plans to go public. According to his lawsuit, Reid's supervisors called Reid a "poor cultural fit," an "old guy" and a "fuddy-duddy" with ideas "too old to matter."

Mr. Reid sued Google for age discrimination and asserted that his unvested stock options would have been worth at least \$45 million if he had stayed there. The case ultimately settled out of court for an undisclosed amount.

Another case that I'm following closely is being argued in Alameda County. In May 2008, Lawrence Livermore Laboratories fired hundreds of experienced employees, including nuclear weapons scientists, researchers, assistants, and

others with long years of service. Earlier this year, a jury awarded a \$2.7 million verdict in favor of five ex-employees. The litigation is continuing with about 125 former employees, most aged 40 and over, as plaintiffs.

Both federal and California laws protect employees from age discrimination. The regulations apply to anyone over the age of 40 at the time of the discriminatory conduct, and apply to employers with five or more employees.

The federal law is called the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967 (ADEA). California's age discrimination laws are codified in Government Code sections 12940, 12945 and 12945.2. Remember that complaints of discrimination must be filed with DFEH within one year from the date of the discriminatory act. You can file your complaint yourself, or you can retain an attorney to file on your behalf. After filing with DFEH, you can also choose to pursue a private lawsuit against the employer on the basis of age discrimination. ★

Quick Action by Citizens and by Metro Firefighters Spares Rancho Cordova Neighborhood Homes



RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - At 9:25 a.m. on October 17th, firefighters from Sacramento Metro Fire were dispatched to a reported house fire on the 2800 block of Hyannis Way in Rancho Cordova. The report stated that a large column of black smoke was emanating from the area. Arriving crews found a two-story home well involved with fire on both the first and second floors. Recognizing the potential risk to adjacent homes, firefighters immediately began to protect those houses. Other crews extended hose lines into the interior of the burning home to begin a search for potential victims and begin extinguishing the fire.

It took quick and coordinated efforts by the 30 personnel on the scene to limit this incident to only the structure of origin. Neighboring homes were only a few feet from the involved structure and so protecting them was a priority for Metro Crews. When firefighters arrived, there were no occupants in the home.

No citizens or firefighters were injured at this incident. While the entire interior and contents of the home were consumed prior to the arrival of firefighters, the structure still stands and neighboring homes were spared from damage.

The cause of the fire has yet to be determined. Then at 4:04 pm on October 22nd, firefighters from Metro Fire were dispatched for a report of smoke coming from the backyard and eaves of a two story home in the 9100 block of La Riviera Drive. Arriving crews immediately began a primary search of the involved unit, which turned out to be clear of occupants. Remaining fire crews were able to stretch hose lines and prevent the spread of the fire throughout the home.

Awareness by community members resulted in the fire being reported early, and quick action by arriving firefighters limited the damage to the \$275,000 home to approximately \$40,000.

Two adult residents will be displaced while repairs are made to the property. Unfortunately a family dog perished, likely due to smoke inhalation. The origin of the fire was the kitchen stove top. Further investigation is in process to determine the cause.

More fires start in the kitchen than in any other part of the home. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) maintains the following link for safe cooking guidelines: <http://www.nfpa.org/safety-information/for-consumers/causes/cooking>. ★

Kelly Family Requests Information about Oct. 15th Hit and Run Bicycle Accident

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - In the letter below, Amanda Kelly asks for help information regarding a hit and accident, which I injured her father.

To whom this may concern,
Just a few days ago, my father was involved in a hit and run accident and left severely injured. Our hands are tied, since he remembers nothing of the car that hit him. My hope is that with this note, someone somewhere will come forth with information.

On the morning of Tuesday, October 15th at roughly 6:15 a.m., my father was riding his bicycle to work (in the bike lane) and was struck by a car on the corner of Zinfandel and McGregor in Rancho Cordova. The car's driver immediately left the scene, not taking into account the condition

of the individual he or she hit. My father was thrown from his bike and suffered a major concussion; remember nothing of the accident, except for hearing a car quickly approaching from behind.

After lying unconscious for a few moments, he came to with his baby blue work shirt covered in blood. He staggered to the middle of the street to try to wave down passersby for help. Unfortunately, he was too disoriented to maintain his position and fell to the ground. While lying there; he remembers hearing cars passing but not being able to stop anyone. It took much of the strength he had remaining, but he was able to crawl to his backpack to grab his cell phone to call for help.

This note is a plea to find anyone with any information relating

to his accident and to come forward and, hopefully, bring justice where it's desperately due. Also, as a result of this accident, our faith in the community we once loved and volunteered much of our time to is tarnished and skewed. To think that this very man – who has always stopped for anyone in despair whether or not it was in a hurry – in his moment of need, no one came to help.

Please help provide us closure to this accident and help piece together more of what happened the morning of Tuesday, October 15th. If you have any information, please contact the Rancho Cordova Police Department [(916) 875-9600]. ★

For Greater Sacramento Real Estate, Advantage Seller is Still True

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Considering four to six months of inventory is largely recognized as a seller's market, it certainly appears that sellers still hold the upper hand in the greater Sacramento area. Resale housing supply finished September with 2.1 months available based upon the current rate of sales. This number marked the highest level of inventory since 2.4 months were on hand in December 2011.

Sales, however, remain very strong according to data provided by TrendGraphix and reported by Lyon Real Estate. During the month of September, 2,394 pending sales were posted in Sacramento, Placer, Yolo and

El Dorado counties combined. That number is a mere 4.5 percent below the average of 2,505 sales over the past six months and demonstrates some resistance to a seasonal slowdown.

Prices show signs of stability after a nationally recognized and voracious 30 percent year-over-year escalation. The median has drifted between \$280,000 and \$285,000 over the past four months. The average sales price rested at \$317,000 last month after hovering in the mid \$320s for the prior three months.

The \$900,000 and over market is showing the strongest signs of softening, with 25 sales posted for the region in September after

experiencing sales numbers in the 40s earlier this year for three consecutive months.

"Buyer activity remains strong with sustained, downward pressure on interest rates," said President and Chief Operating Officer Pat Shea of Lyon Real Estate. "The major key for sellers is to avoid over confidence. Properties in all price points should still attract multiple offers when they are priced, conditioned and marketed effectively. Resist the temptation of overpricing as you will enjoy a more profitable, swifter and smoother sales experience by making good decisions from the start."

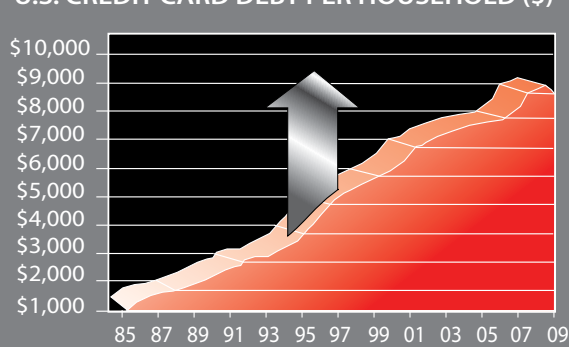

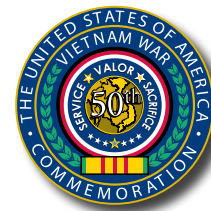

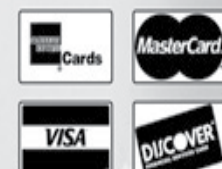

He completed five of 10 passes for 144 yards. On the ground, Tapia had 12 carries for 54 yards. He accounted for 198 of the Lancers' 243 total yards.

Demitre Jones, Brandon Buck and Ventrell Dyson also had receptions in the game for the Lancers.

On defense, Terion Guichard

had a sack and Grant Johnson returned an interception 20 yards.

As for the injuries, Mueller is hoping the six players out -- including one who was injured during last week's practices -- can suit up for Cordova's next CAL game, also at home, against Antelope Friday, Oct. 25.

"We're going to be using band aids to put our best group out there," Mueller said.

But the coach is keeping his options open. "I think there's a chance we might have to pull up some kids from the junior varsity squad," Mueller added.

In the JV game, Cordova (2-0 CAL, 5-2) edged El Camino in a wild game, 32-31.

"We have had a great group of kids down there playing their tails off," said Mueller of the JV squad. ★
