CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) -

If absence makes the heart grow fonder of what is missing, the City of Citrus Heights, staff and members of the Citrus Heights community hit the proverbial ball out of Van Maren Park with their inaugural Stars and Stripes Celebration Saturday, July 1.

Following many years without a large city patriotic event since the Red, White and Blue Parade which ended in 2018, and

the final Fourth of July fireworks show in 2011, city leaders knew there was a need, along with the community's wishes, for a fresh, re-invented annual event to bring families and all residents together during this season with the simple goal of fun, relaxation and camaraderie.

The first Stars and Stripes event met and exceeded all expectations. It was the result of the concentrated efforts of City Manager Ash Feeney,

Construction Continues in Sunrise Village

- Multiple construction projects are ongoing at Sunrise Village in Citrus

A new gateway arch to the plaza from Sunrise Boulevard is now installed, prominent signage announces a new Visionworks store to be located next door to Rite Aid that is coming soon, and finishing exterior touches including exterior lighting and colorful awnings are up on a new See's Candies superstore facing Sunrise Boulevard to be opening soon.

Sunrise Village Plaza, at the corner of Madison Avenue and Sunrise Boulevard in Citrus Heights is owned by the San Francisco-based Merlone-Geier investment company. The center has undergone a \$15-20 million remodeling and expansion project which also includes new

landscaping and upgraded signage.

Two additional businesses, Local Kitchens and the Milano Nail Salon have also signed leases to open in Sunrise Village but have not yet started construction. Milano Nail Salon, directly behind the new See's superstore, was reconstructed from the shell of a former restaurant which was located there.

Moorefield Construction, a family-owned general contractor, with offices in Sacramento and Santa Ana, completed the gutting and reconstruction of all the existing commercial spaces within the Sunrise Village Shopping Center and building new spaces for two major anchor tenants, City Sports, and a 38,000-square-foot retail grocery store which has yet to be named.

Overall project construction work included phased rebuilding of all the exterior walls of multiple free-standing commercial spaces within the plaza.

CHP Distributes Over \$19 Million To **Fight Impaired Driving**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -The California Highway Patrol (CHP) announced on June 26, 2023, more than \$19 million in grant funding to 71 California law enforcement agencies, crime laboratories, and nonprofit organizations to help address the dangers of driving under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs. Law enforcement recipients receiving the education and toxicology grants include Sacramento County District Attorney Laboratory of Forensic Services, Arrive Alive and Sacramento County District Attorney Crime Lab.

The grants are the result of Proposition 64. the Control, Regulate and Tax Adult Use of Marijuana Act, which tasked the CHP with administering grants for education, prevention, and enforcement programs to help communities combat impaired driving. Money is also available to crime laboratories conducting forensic toxicology testing. Funding for the grants comes from a tax on the cultivation and sale of cannabis and cannabis products sold in California.

"Communities throughout California will benefit greatly from the disbursement of these grant funds intended to help make California's roadways safer for all who use them," said **CHP Commissioner Sean** Duryee. "The money will be used to help enhance traffic safety by educating the public on the dangers of impaired driving, removing impaired drivers from the roadway through enforcement operations, and advancing research on the issue."

Fifty-four recipients of law enforcement grants will use funds to address impaired driving within their communities. In addition to traditional impaired driving enforcement, funds will also be used for drug recognition evaluator training to enhance their respective agency's ability to detect drug-impaired drivers. Additionally, funding will allow for public outreach campaigns, including educational presentations and community events.

Completion of new exterior façade work on the retail locations of Habit Burger, Sourdough & Company and Teriyaki to Go along Sunrise Boulevard is done, according to Larry Moorefield, principal of Moorfield Construction.

Other retail stores within the plaza that faces Madison Avenue, including a Little Caesar's take-out pizza, a coin-op laundry and a liquor store have also received an exterior refresh during the project.

The main parking lot of Sunrise Village has been repaved and landscaping work throughout the plaza is refreshed. Multiple electrical vehicle charging stations were also installed in the plaza.

A call for bids for the construction of a new 36,152-square-foot City Sports Club to open in Sunrise Village opened on February 2nd with an expected construction

start date of March 2023, according to Construction Journal, but work hasn't started yet.

City Sports Club is operated by Irvine-based Fitness International LLC, the same entity that operates the LA Fitness chain of health clubs.

The overall sports club construction project is valued at \$2 million in overall interior tenant improvements including construction of pool and spa spaces. When

open, it is expected to be double the size of its current Carmichael location. A representative of the Carmichael club could not provide any detail on a likely opening date for the Citrus Heights location or the status of construction.

New Citrus Town Center Banquet Facility Proposed

- A new multi-purpose

banquet hall is planned to open in the Citrus Town Shopping Center in Citrus Heights.


Application permits have been filed by owner Sam Hameed with the City of Citrus Heights and are pending approval to open at 7942 Arcadia Drive just across from the Mitchell Village residential subdivision.

The 6,000-square foot brick façade building, which features a prominent round glass-block turret, was built in 1975 and formerly operated as The Sand Bar, a bar and night-club featuring live music and entertainment before its closure years ago.

Hameed said he's signed a lease agreement to occupy the building, and he hopes to begin interior demolition and new construction soon.

The building's general interior is largely gutted inside. Hameed said he's early in the city's permit review process and is still finalizing interior architectural designs. He visualizes the new banquet hall filling an important need in the greater Citrus Heights community.

"I'm hoping to make the hall available and

affordable for a wide range of celebratory personal and public events, including business gatherings and corporate functions," Hameed said.

Hameed said he's been in the banquet hall business for the past 11 years and has been involved in the operations of his uncle's Fleur de Lis Banquet Hall in Modesto where he helped him turn his venue there into one of the most successful ones in Stanislaus County.

With his family's help and support, and seeking to build on their ongoing success, Hameed said he looks forward to going out on his own with his new banquet hall in Citrus Heights.

Once open, Hameed said he hopes to host multiple events at the banquet hall each month with a typical capacity per event of 200 guests. Most events would likely end by 10 to 11 pm. The planned facility has a parking capacity of 100 spaces under a shared parking agreement with Citrus Town Shopping Center, Hameed said.

The general branding and marketing of the banquet hall remain on his mind as he sees the new banquet hall in the Citrus Town Center an important facility where all can "celebrate special occasions and make lasting memories." *

Citrus Heights City Council, city staff and other community volunteers. City council approved it in January and every aspect of the event was carefully planned and worked out to ensure the safety and comfort of participants.

Music was a key to the success of the evening. CC Seger, a tribute band to Bob Seger and Creedence Clearwater Revival, entertained an audience of all ages right up to the music accompanying the fireworks.

General Services Director Regina Cave spearheaded the event and was Master of Ceremonies. Mayor Tim Schaefer, and city council members Bret Daniels, Jayna Karpinski-Costa, MariJane Lopez-Taff, and Porsche Middleton welcomed the audience. The event, officially advertised to begin at 7:00 p.m. had children and their parents lined up at the Kids Zone bicycle decoration table and other booths much earlier. Prior to the fireworks a drone flying over the crowd was greeted


with waves and cheers.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - It has been less than a year since the County Department of Transportation (SacDOT) finished work on the final portion of the Hazel Avenue Improvement Project. It was a project designed to reduce congestion along Hazel Avenue and improve mobility for bicyclists and pedestrians, and that work recently earned SacDOT a statewide transportation award.

The \$60 million project caught the eye of the California Transportation Foundation, which presented SacDOT with its 2023 Local Street Project of the Year award on June 6. For more than 30 years, the non-profit organization has recognized transportation achievements, innovations, and excellence throughout

This year's award-winning project was the final phase of a fifteen-year effort to beautify Hazel Avenue from Highway 50 to Madison Avenue. The project widened Hazel Avenue from 4 to 6 lanes to reduce congestion while increasing safety and mobility for all modes of transportation.

Other significant improvements along Hazel Avenue included:

trian facilities. These new bicycle and pedestrian facilities provide safe connections to the American River Parkway and the trail system adjacent to the Hazel Avenue Bridge and Lake Natoma; Public transit enhancements with new turn-out lanes for buses so the traffic can keep moving; The turn-out lanes also allow bus riders to board safely.

SacDOT Chief Civil Engineer, Steve White, accepted the award on behalf of the County. White praised Principal Civil Engineer, Melissa Wright, and her in-house design team, led by Project Manager, Tim Stevens and Project Engineer, James Eslabon, for designing and developing the final phase of the Hazel Avenue Improvement Project. Teichert Construction, Pacific Excavation, RNR Construction Inc., TRC Companies Inc., County Construction Management Inspection Division, and County Real Estate Division were also acknowledged as integral members for helping build the project.

White also pointed out that completion of the Hazel Avenue work would not have been possible without the continuing support of the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors and our partnerships with local funding partners Fair Oaks Water District and Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD). SMUD removed overhead powerlines and placed them underground, while the water district used





Pull From Stocks and Put Toward Mortgage?

Dear Dave,

I bought a house about a year ago. Currently, I have \$45,000 sitting in an account with a money manager. I've had this account for a little over three years, and the investment hasn't grown much, if at all. Under the circumstances, and being single, too, would it be better to pull the money out of that investment and put it toward my mortgage?

- Johnny

Dear Johnny,

I recommend putting 100% of any non-retirement savings, above your emergency fund, toward paying off your mortgage

until the mortgage is paid off. I'd still tell you to pay down the house, even if you were making 20% on your money. Just make sure you're following the Baby Steps, and you're already putting 15% of your income into good retirement investments before attacking the house. Paying down your mortgage is not an expenditure that's just lost money. The cash is sitting there, you're just banking it in your home and land. And on a side note, with all the craziness in the market over the last three years, you might come to realize breaking even over that time wasn't so bad after all.

Johnny, the shortest distance between where you are and your first \$1 million to \$5 million in net worth is getting your house paid off. After that, load 15% to 20% of your income into a serious retirement plan. And by that, I don't mean playing financial footsie with some little brokerage account. Investing in good, growth stock mutual funds with a proven track record of at least 10 years is a proven way to build wealth the right way.

I'm sure you can find someone on TikTok telling you to do the exact opposite of what I'm suggesting. But you won't find that kind of advice coming from real millionaires.

How Friction Between Two Major California Social Security Matters **Laws Impedes Housing Construction**

When California Gov. Gavin Newsom made an unusual appearance on Fox News, it was inevitable that conservative commentator Sean Hannity would bore in on California's chronic housing shortage and homelessness crisis.

Why, Hannity asked, did California have such problems?

"Because housing costs are too high," Newsom replied. "Our regulatory thickets are too problematic. Localism has been too impactful, meaning people locally are pushing back against new housing starts and construction."

Newsom's synopsis of the issue is quite accurate. The state's housing shortage stems from the over-regulation of development, largely driven by local opposition. It drives up costs to tenants and would-be homebuyers and pushes some into the streets.

That cause-and-effect relationship was confirmed in a recent in-depth study of homelessness by a UC San Francisco research team.

Having pinpointed the underlying causes of the crisis, one might think that Newsom would energetically attempt to address them.

Last week, as part of a broader budget agreement, the governor persuaded the Legislature to modify the California Environmental

Quality Act, which is com- needed more information monly misused to thwart before giving the development housing developments, but he didn't do it for housing. Rather, he wants to streamline CEQA's effect on public works projects, particularly those involving renewable energy and water supply.

Indirectly, therefore, Newsom told Californians that while he says it should be done, he's not willing to take on the heavy lifting to lessen CEQA misuse on housing. His posture continues predecessor Jerry Brown's position of of the two statutes creates a declaring CEQA reform to be "the Lord's work," but being unwilling to do it.

By happenstance, the Capitol's wrangling over CEQA – albeit while ignoring its effect on housing - coincided with the publication of a very lengthy, deeply researched and well-sourced article on how the 53-yearold law thwarts much-needed housing construction.

Christopher Elmendorf, a law professor at UC Davis who specializes in housing issues, and Timothy Duncheon, a San Francisco attorney, focus on "the slow-motion collision" between two overarching "super-statutes," CEQA and the Housing Accountability Act, or HAA.

They demonstrate through case studies that, while the having nothing to do with the latter attempts to streamline housing construction, the former is used to slow or even kill housing projects by local interests and labor unions.

They focus on a notoriously torturous case in San Francisco, whose Board of Supervisors used CEQA to block a much-needed apartment project on a vacant journalist for more than 60 downtown parking lot due to years, spending all but a few special interest pressure, simply by decreeing that they California newspapers.

CEQA clearance. But they also cite other cases in which the contradictory priorities of the two laws collide.

Their conflict, Elmendorf and Duncheon say, ties the courts up in knots as judges must, in effect, choose which law is dominant. Sometimes they opt for CEQA and sometimes the HAA, leaving the overall legal atmosphere

"The ostensible 'super-ness' predicament for courts and other actors because CEQA and the HAA could not be more different in their basic institutional and normative principles," the authors write.

"CEQA's working premise is that 'new construction' is bad for the environment," they point out. "By contrast, the HAA regards housing construction in urbanized areas as presumptively good for the environment."

Carefully drafted legislation and/or CEQA implementation guidelines issued by Newsom's administration could, Elmendorf and Duncheon say, reconcile the two. They could limit CEQA to cases in which there are genuine environmental issues, rather than allowing it to be misused for motives that environment, such as forcing developers to use unionized

Their paper lays out the roadmap for the CEQA reform that's needed to truly address California's housing crisis. It should be required reading in the Capitol.

About Income Tax on Social Security Benefits

Dear Rusty: I just started receiving my Social Security in February of 2023. I am also working part time at a company 24 hours a week. My question is... I feel like I missed something when I signed up for Social Security because they are not taking any taxes out. What did I miss? How do I go about fixing it so I don't get hit at the end of the year? They are taking taxes out of my paycheck now, do they still take it out of my Social Security because I am working? Please help if I am not doing something right. Signed: Conscientious Senior

Dear Conscientious: Unfortunately, when the Social Security Administration processes your application for benefits, they don't usually inform you that your Social Security benefits may become part of your taxable income. I expect that's because your benefits only "may" become taxable - they do not definitely become taxable, because Social Security benefits are taxed only if you exceed a certain income threshold.

The thresholds at which Social Security benefits become part of your taxable income are different depending on your income tax filing status - those who file as

an individual have a different threshold from those who file as "married – filing jointly." And to further complicate matters there is more than one threshold for both individuals and joint filers. Here's how it works:

If you file your income tax as an individual and your "combined income" from all sources is more than \$25,000, then 50% of the Social Security benefits you received during the tax year becomes part of your overall taxable income at your particular IRS tax rate. But if your combined income as an individual tax filer is more than \$34,000 then up to 85% of the SS benefits you received during the tax becomes part of your overall taxable income.

If your income tax filing status is "married – filing jointly" the thresholds are higher - if your combined income from all sources as a married couple exceeds \$32,000 then 50% of the Social Security benefits you received during the tax year becomes part of your taxable income. But if your combined income as a married couple exceeds \$44,000 then up to 85% of your SS benefits received during the tax year are taxable.

"Combined income" is also known as your "Modified Adjusted Gross Income" or "MAGI." Your MAGI is your Adjusted Gross Income on your tax return, plus 50% of the Social Security benefits you received during the tax year, plus any non-taxable interest or untaxed foreign income you had (note that withdrawals from a Roth IRA are not included). If your "MAGI" exceeds the above thresholds, some of your Social Security benefits are taxable; if you are under the first threshold for your IRS

filing status they are not.

Social Security doesn't automatically withhold taxes from your monthly benefits, and the FICA tax being withheld from your earnings are not used for that purpose. Everyone who works and earns must pay SS tax on their earnings, which are mandatory contributions supporting the federal Social Security program. But that FICA payroll tax has nothing to do with income tax on your Social Security benefits. If you are working 24 hours per week and also collecting Social Security benefits, you will likely exceed the threshold for your tax filing status, which means that at least some of your 2023 benefits will become taxable. That could, as you suspect, result in a surprise "hit" when you file next year's income tax return. Nevertheless, fixing this is quite easy:

Download IRS form W-4V from the IRS website here: www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/ fw4v.pdf. You will be able to choose the percentage of your Social Security benefits you wish to have withheld for income tax purposes. Complete the form and mail it to your local Social Security office (get the mailing address here: www.ssa.gov/locator). Social Security will then start withholding income tax from your monthly Social Security benefit payment, which will mitigate any additional tax due when you file your 2023 tax return next year.






























Citrus Heights Pet Hospital Moving to New Location

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The Citrus Heights Pet Hospital located at 7404 Auburn Boulevard in Citrus Heights will be moving in August to its new location in the Greenfaire Village Center at the corner of Greenback Lane and Fair Oaks Boulevard.

With over 63 years in business, Citrus Heights Pet Hospital, founded in 1962, is one of the city's oldest full-service animal hospitals. The practice thoughtfully cares for dogs and cats which require emergency care, as well as providing basic wellness checks, and attending to their general medical, surgical and dental needs.

"Like many local private vet practices, we found ourselves struggling to meet the demand from our growing community, and part of our struggle was due to the limits of our current facility," said veterinarian-owner Dr. Averi Brickson, who earned her Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) from Iowa State University.

"My husband and I purchased the practice in 2010 from Dr. Dean Hendricks and now care for some 15,000 active patients," she said.


Citrus Heights Pet Hospital was opened by Dr. Frost, (no relation to the family of Sacramento County Supervisor Sue Frost). Dr. Frost then sold the practice to Dr. Dean Henricks in 1997 who grew it further.

"We actually still have clients who started with the practice in 1962 and who through the generations of pet families have continued with us ever since," Brickson said.

"I'm proud of the great team of veterinarians and supporting staff we have at Citrus Heights Pet Hospital," Brickson said. The practice has three full-time doctors, herself as owner/veterinarian, Dr. Zoe Wichmann, associate veterinarian; and Dr.

Tami Rosich, associate veterinarian. Dr. Dean Henricks, an associate veterinarian who originally sold the practice to the Bricksons, continues to work part-time.

In its Auburn Boulevard facility, situated across from Sylvan Cemetery, veterinary staff work in approximately 2,500 squarefeet of space that wasn't designed for a modern style of practice and workload, Brickson explained.

"We'd been exploring opportunities to expand for years and when this property at Greenfaire Village came up for sale, we decided it was an ideal location to meet the needs of our rapidly expanding clientele," she said.

"As general practitioners, we are family doctors, focusing on preventive care, wellness and public health," she said. When patients require the next level of specialty care, Brickson said referrals are then placed to a robust community of boarded veterinary specialists in the greater Sacramento area.

Brickson provided a tour of the facility's multiple special treatment rooms which are nearing completion. Interior demolition of the building started in March and was decidedly a "family affair."

The new space in Greenfaire Village Center is almost double the size of the Auburn Boulevard facility.

"Having the opportunity to design and build it to our specifications will allow us to fully maximize the use of this new space," she said.

The commercial building, now under construction, had been home to three separate tenants, including a former Beach Hut Deli

"We love how much natural light comes into the new facility from windows on all four sides," she said. "We also have advanced air handling to minimize stress for our pet patients, to minimize the chance of infectious disease transmission, and to maximize the movement of fresh, clean, temperature-controlled air throughout the building," she said.

The finished interior will also feature an intentionally chosen color palate with patients in mind. Natural, calming colors on the floors, cabinets, counters and walls, and art from local artists have been chosen for their non-stressful content.

The practice in its new location will have the physical capacity to add three to four doctors and between nine to 12 support staff in the future, Brickson said. "It's one of the most exciting aspects of our upcoming expansion," she said.

"We hope to start seeing patients in our new facility in early August. We will continue serving patients out of our Auburn Boulevard location, but at a limited capacity," Brickson said.
