\$647 Million to Cover **Overdue Utility Bills**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

Gov. Gavin Newsom on November 22 announced the release of \$647 million in funding to help over 1.4 million California households struggling to pay their overdue energy bills.

The awarded funding will eliminate all past due energy debt accrued by residential customers between March 4, 2020 and December 31, 2021, providing real relief to households that have suffered the economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and increased energy debt.

Over the last year, California has distributed over \$1.6 billion in financial assistance for bill credits through the California Arrearage Payment Program (CAPP) to reduce or eliminate overdue electric and gas bills.

"California has made unprecedented commitments to help vulnerable households stay afloat as the cost-of-living increases," said Governor Newsom. "By providing utility relief that will eliminate over 1.4 million Californians' overdue energy bills, we're helping families who continue to struggle with higher costs."

Governor Newsom and the California Legislature established the 2022 California Arrearage Payment Program (2022 CAPP) to address 100 percent of past due energy bill balances incurred by residential customers during the program's COVID-19 pandemic bill relief period covering March 4, 2020 to December 31, 2021. Thirty-three energy utilities applied for 2022 CAPP funding on behalf of over 1.4 million eligible residential customers.

Participating state energy utilities are required to apply a 2022 CAPP bill credit to their customer accounts within 60 days of receiving funds.

"Once again, we are leading with our values by working to ensure that our neighbors economically impacted by the pandemic can keep their lights on," said California Health and Human Services Agency Secretary Dr. Mark Ghaly. "Many of us fell behind as the pandemic continued, and our commitment to further address energy debts is another way we are lifting up all Californians."

Fish are a Jumpin'

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The 2022 Chinook run is in full swim.

Now cooled sufficiently for spawning, the American River is teeming with migrating salmon. Nimbus Fish Hatchery recently opened ladder gates and is harvesting eggs and milt for artificial fertilization.

The Chinook giants climb to the facility via a \$9.7 million ladder that replaced an antiquated weir system last year. "We've been pleased with its operation," notes hatchery education specialist Laura Drath, "The new ladder works for the fish. Its location opens up more spawning habitat in Nimbus Basin. It also eliminates danger to staff who had to work on the old weir."

Thirty-pound fish were already leaping as Nimbus technician Ryan Reed winched up ladder gates. Irresistibly drawn



to water that courses down ladder steps at 25 cubic feet per second, 100 Chinooks completed the passage in the first hour.

Their weeks-long migration runs the swimmers ragged. Ending a three-year life cycle, reproduction is now a final goal. Many spawn naturally and die in river shallows before reaching the ladder. But more than a century of river alteration means insufficient gravel beds remain to accommodate salmon and steelhead nests.

Much gravel restoration has been recently achieved; salmonids can be now seen breeding in augmented beds near Ancil Hoffman Park and Sailor Bar. The hatchery is nevertheless tasked to artificially

fertilize about nine million eggs in mitigation for Nimbus Dam's impassable barrier. Salvageable fish meat is processed in Oregon for distribution at California food closets.

Eggs hatch in about six weeks. In spring, fry are released to begin their journey to the Pacific.



Sunrise Christian Food Ministry Director Retires after 13 Years

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - On November 10, recently retired Sunrise Christian Food Ministry (SCFM) President and Director of Operations Rocky Peterson received recognition from the Citrus Heights City Council for his hard work and dedication to our community since 2009.

While Peterson has been enjoying retirement with his wife Judy since August 31, the official announcement took place at the Citrus Heights City Council meeting on November 10, 2022. Councilman Steve Miller read the official proclamation to the audience of community members, supporters, family and friends.

Councilwoman Jeannie Bruins said, "It's hard to imagine the SCFM without you." To which someone quipped, "but they still have to eat." All agreed!

Councilman Bret Daniels, estimated from a Power Point presentation that over Peterson's 13 years, the ministry has provided 10 million pounds of food and 20 million meals to the residents from Citrus Heights and throughout the county.

At Peterson's recognition, Rosie Cerna, Engagement Manager for the Food Bank of Sacramento County, from which many of the food staples are provided, spoke about how under his leadership, innovation and vision, she has seen it grow from a small food pantry 13 years ago, to "one of our top five of their 122 agencies that serve the public."

She added, "the operation always amazes me, he set the bar for pantries to where it has not been before." She added he has taught her compassion and how to see and treat others with dignity.

New Director of Operations April Jacek has worked with Peterson the last three 3 years. She also shared that she has learned much from working with

him including "see[ing] our clients for who they are and not for what their needs are. No judgment. Just greet them with a smile"

The next day at the annual Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon, the accolades and appreciation for Peterson continued as his staff and volunteers had the chance to thank Peterson for his steadfast dedication and devotion to the ministry that has helped to meet the needs of the food insecure. Words heard by many during their testimonies included, "dignity, integrity and compassion.

Originally known as "the little house on the hill" at Advent Lutheran Church, the Sunrise Christian Food Ministry (SCFM) on San Juan Avenue in Citrus Heights first began serving residents of Citrus Heights, Fair Oaks and Orangevale in 1982.

Peterson took over as Director of Operations near Thanksgiving in 2009. He said they had been serving 20-25 families per day. By 2016 that number was 50 families per day. By 2020 just as Covid-19 began they were serving 20,000 families a year.

Forty years since its inception the pantry has overcome a myriad of obstacles to become what it is today under the leadership of Rocky Peterson. Pre-Covid, Peterson and his team were serving 70 families daily, working with a single line walk up set up. With Covid forcing customers into their vehicles, they now serve up to 130 families daily, five days a week, with a drive-through model.

Despite the loss of many of their senior volunteers due to initial Covid regulations, SCFM was one of only 25 of the 250 Sacramento County food closets allowed to remain open. As these volunteers were the sustaining force behind the pantry's growth, the younger professionals were left to pick up the pieces and carry on.

County food banks are back up to 100, but only four operate five days a week, thus the influx of new customers.

Before retirement Peterson left a plan to help the team continue their success. More improvements are in the works. Through a City Community Support Fund, the City provided a grant to the SCFM to assist in equipment replacement and improvement. Further updates are to come as SCFM will start to raise funds to build a new road, recently approved by the City, to help with traffic congestion and the growing need for food assistance

in our community.
With the addition of 600 new

families registering for services during the Thanksgiving distribution on December 17 and 18, along with over 2,000 meals served that week, SCFM workers are sure their numbers will continue to grow.

It is the general consensus that Peterson left the SCFM bigger and stronger after it survived Covid. Still, Jacek left a plea for churches and other organizations to consider sending teams back to volunteer as soon as they can.







A Church Car? You've Got to Be Kidding!

Dear Dave,

My mom took out a Parent PLUS loan in 2009 to help pay for my college education. I also took out \$70,000 in student loans myself. My mom never made a payment on the loan she took out for me, and now the amount due on the Parent PLUS loan has ballooned to \$100,000. She recently told me

in her mind it was my loan in her name, and I should be the one to make the payments after I became financially stable. Thankfully I just got a new job making \$140,000 a year. With this I can finally make a dent in my own loans, but she asks me every week if I'm going to pay the Parent PLUS loan. My mom is a nurse practitioner, so she makes good money, but she recently financed two new luxury cars within 24 hours of each other—one for work and one for church. She also has loans out from borrowing on her 401(k) and credit card debt. Should I take over the Parent PLUS loan under my name?

mom has a church car? I've never heard of such a thing. But hey, I'm going to talk to my wife about this. I knew I needed another car, I just didn't know I needed a church car. Oh, my goodness!

Ok, here's the deal. If you had an agreement with your mom, or promised at any time to pay back the Parent PLUS Loan when you were able, you should cover it. But that's not what you told me. It sounds like your mom has a good heart and was just trying to help, but she did it in a dumb way. From what you told me, she's done a lot of dumb things with money.

Under no circumstances do you take the loan back under your name. In fact, I'm not certain you can even do that with a Parent PLUS Loan. You need to get your debt cleaned up first before trying to help her. If you choose to be a bigger help after that, you need to start things by having a serious conversation with your mom. She needs to hear that she's being absolutely silly with her money. Let her know you're willing to help because the loan was for your benefit. But make sure she understands you won't pay it all, and you won't do it while she's making two luxury car payments-including one on a church car. That's ridiculous.

Offer to be her biggest cheerleader, and help her find a good financial coach—someone with the heart of a teacher. You might want to let her know you'll match whatever





Development (CSD). SMF Named WSJ's Top Airport

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento International Airport (SMF) was named the top airport in the nation according to the Wall Street Journal's 2022 Airport rankings. Compared to the 50 other airports surveyed, SMF received the highest score overall.

The top 50 busiest airports were surveyed and then divided into two sizes - 20 large and 30 midsize. The airports were then measured on 19 categories including experience from on-time performance and security waits to customer-satisfaction scores and ticket prices. The categories ranked were further grouped into three broad categories - reliability, convenience, and value.

SMF ranked highest among all airports surveyed in the reliability category and also ranked high in arrival and departure times, low flight cancellations, quick taxi and security clearance times, and a max walking distance of only 1,213 feet.

"The SMF team consistently provides our customers with a safe, comfortable and enjoyable travel experience," said Cindy Nichol, Director of the Sacramento County Department of Airports. "Living our values every day clearly makes a difference, as we make our customers our top priority. We see each day as an opportunity to improve and accomplish more together by collaborating; communicating and taking pride in what we do."

In 2019, SMF similarly won the top midsized airport award - the award was not issued in 2020 or 2021 due to the pandemic.

The Sacramento County Department of Airports is responsible for planning, developing, operating and maintaining the county's four airports: Sacramento International Airport, Executive Airport, Mather Airport and Franklin Field. For more information, visit sacramento.aero.



Feeding a Country During War

We all see on TV news about the war in the Ukraine. Most of us feel compassion towards what the citizens in that country are going through, but we really have very little idea of what it's really like. One local man, who is a baker by trade (specializing in making bread) decided that

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

he wanted to do something to help them. For safety purposes, we will use only his first name - Shawn. "Sometimes charity takes more than writing a check or waving a flag," said Shawn. He joined a group out of

Washington DC called World Central Kitchen. This organization is strictly a humanitarian organization with no political influence or agenda. They simply go where they are needed to help get food to those who need it. In fact, neither the organization nor the government supplied any support, of any kind, in the mission.

Shawn explained that even though the Ukraine usually has a good wheat production, other countries are sending them wheat now, but they didn't really know what to do with it. Businesses like bakeries are shut down or bombed. Those that aren't cannot follow their regular baking schedule because they are under martial law. No one is allowed outside from 10pm to 6am, except for military. Shawn knew he could help.

Shawn and three others went to the war-ravaged Ukraine this summer to do what they could to feed the Ukrainian people. Told ahead of time to bring a flak jacket and a Kevlar helmet, Shawn wasn't sure what he was getting into. He just knew that they needed help and this was something he could do. He

because he thought it would raise questions in both our airports and theirs. Once he was there, he wished he would have.

'You can't go into a war zone armed unless you are part of the local militant system," Shawn said, "I just went in looking like a normal American tourist." Shawn and his friends arrived in the Ukraine with only their carry-on luggage. They were questioned why they were there. Any electronic devices were gone through thoroughly, including all text messages, photos, etc. Burner phones were purchased for the minimal communication that would be used. Russian spies and Pro-Russian Ukrainians had devices that lifted cell phone numbers when they crossed into the country. Those numbers were closely monitored while they were there. Photos were not permitted.

modes while there, but no matter how they were traveling, they were regularly stopped (about every kilometer) and questioned by Ukrainian Security about why they were there and what they were doing. They especially focused on Americans. Men would board trains, buses, etc. armed with machine guns and AK47's to question passengers on their purpose of travel. Every time they focused a lot of attention on Shawn, often being the only American.

Ukrainian soldiers don't have many supplies on the frontline, so it was standard practice for people to take an SUV or some other vehicle and fill it with gasoline, food, socks and other supplies. They would then take these vehicles to the frontline and just leave them there. One of these vehicles was one of the modes of transportation that Shawn's group used to get to

Shawn and his group would arrive in a city and pull together whatever they could to set up. They would gather supplies from grocery stores that had been bombed, or restaurants that had been destroyed and occasionally they might get some food from suppliers. They would use whatever they could, often an oil drum to cook on. In one city they even used a burnt out tank to turn into a stove. They would gather big pots and set them on their make shift stoves to make soup or stew. Sometimes they

When the air raid sirens go off, they go off across the country so you never know where the missiles were headed. Many people began to ignore them. Others would run for cover, taking safety in the underground bunkers that are

they had bags of groceries to

under most public buildings there (left over from WWII). There were missile strikes all around them, the closest being just a few blocks away. It was so close they could feel the rumble of the ground as the bomb exploded. In one town there was a missile that had hit the ground and was sticking out of the ground but had not detonated.

In the more rural areas, such as villages, people hid in their root cellars (a cellar that is designed for storage of potatoes and other produce). They would come out sheepishly at first, until they got to know them, then more people would come out. Sometimes the same people would make multiple trips to the same bunker. This was especially true in areas that were under heavy bombardment.

As people got to know the group, more people would come out to help. There was even a 15-year-old girl in a flak jacket and Kevlar helmet delivering bread. The group would come across schools being taught in bunkers because their school had been bombed. Shawn and his friends did what they could to get these kids school supplies.

"The hardest thing was the language barrier," Shawn said, "But we brought a bunch of little hot wheels cars and John Deer tractors and handed those out. It was a great ice breaker, as many of them were farmers." Shawn and his group spent three and a half weeks there and he spent around \$5000 out of his own pocket to fund the trip and supplies. They fed roughly 1500 people a day from their mobile kitchens, mostly women and children.

"It was an amazing experience. They were very grateful that we were there, and I would love to go back" Shawn said.





Giving Machine: the Spirit of Christmas

ROSEVILLE, CA (MPG) - The Giving Machines, which are vending machines that disperse donations instead of snacks, have come to Westfield Galleria Mall in Roseville, the only place in California to have them.

Santa Claus was one of the first to donate, aided by Denise Hoffman, supervisor of the Tuesday volunteers.

"The Giving Machine is the same spirit of Christmas that Santa has," Santa said. "We give and not receive. That's what Christmas is all about. Always give and think of the love we share. Merry Christmas!"

Hoffman didn't say what Santa's choice was, but she said that her family's favorite donation is chickens.

"We've already bought some chickens, but I think (my husband) wants to buy a family toilet," she said. "You can get a family toilet for \$60."

Minimum purchase begins at \$10 and goes to a maximum of \$1,500. Volunteers are there every day to help patrons operate the vending machines.

Sponsored by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, the Giving Machines originated in 2017 and this year are in place during the holidays in 22 locations in the United States, and 6 international locations. At the Galleria, the machines offer donations to four local and three international nonprofit organizations. They will be in place from November 22 through January 2.

How does it work? Choose a machine – each machine offers a selection of items on behalf of global and local organizations that help those suffering from hardship and privation. Make your selection - you may add several items you'd like to donate using the touch screen "shopping cart," up to a total of \$1,500. Swipe your card - Giving Machines accept credit card and

mobile payments (Apple Pay, Google Pay, etc.). Collect your receipt – a card will drop down showing what you have donated.

"One of the things I've learned is," said Hoffman, "we're buying chickens for a family in an underdeveloped country - that will provide both food for them and income from selling eggs to others in the village. The charities must use that money donated for buying chickens, they can't use it for anything else. The organizers have oversights in place to assure that what is donated is what is given."

Anyone can donate, and often entire families come and let the children help choose what the family donates. Nancy Pinney of Granite Bay came with her grandchildren Luke, Jake, Chase,

"They were very excited about it," Pinney said. "They each picked something that they wanted to purchase . . . I think that the Giving Machine is just an inspired program. So many people are looking for ways to help other people. They don't know how to. They don't know where to turn, they don't know who to ask. And this Giving Machine is so easy to use and it's so available, it's right there in the middle of the Mall, and it gives you such a selection of things to choose from. I think it's just an amazing, amazing program."

While international donations may provide more exotic purchases, like chickens or outhouses, than donations for local charities, contributions to local concerns are needed to provide help to the people who live right around you. The local groups that are represented in this year's Sacramento area machines are Placer Food Bank, HART, Al-Misbaah, and Catholic Charities: Diocese of Sacramento.


Placer Food Bank covers Placer, El Dorado and Nevada Counties, an area of about 4,700 square miles. During the last fiscal year, the food bank distributed about 8.2 million pounds of food in the three counties.

"When we started learning about the concept of the Giving Machines, we thought it was really, really quite brilliant," said Lisa Heinrich, director of development and communications for Placer Food Bank, "and quite an interesting way to allow the community to come together in a gathering place and make a donation . . . What better way to continue our mission, to help feed people."

In the meantime, it's good to remember the real meaning of the Giving Machine.

"While we make a trip to the mall and choose what we'd like to donate," said Bruce Anderson, the director of the local effort. "we can't forget that while we have fun and go back to a warm home and a good meal, there are others out there doing without the very basics of life – clean water, a bed to sleep in, enough food to keep them alive. What's important is that we do what we
