SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Nov. 15, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the historic purchase of a \$23 million piece of real estate that will ultimately serve as the county's third and largest, to date, Safe Stay Community. California Faces \$25 **Billion Budget** Shortfall

When I last wrote about California's state budget picture, Gov. Newsom was warning in his September veto messages about the state facing lower-than-expected tax revenues in the first months of the new fiscal year, and urging lawmakers to "remain discipline when it comes to spending."

With ongoing inflation and economic problems, the state's budget problem is growing worse by the day. The Department of Finance's most recent Finance Bulletin, released in October, pegged the current deficit at \$6.967 billion through September.

Personal income tax cash receipts in September came in 22.9 percent lower than projected for the month, while estimated tax payments for the month were 42.3 percent lower. The Department notes that "September is a significant month of personal income tax receipts as many taxpayers pay their third quarter estimated payments." While the Governor's budget won't be released until January 10, we get a sneak preview of the budget debate every November when the nonpartisan Legislative Analyst's office releases their annual fiscal outlook for the year ahead. This year's outlook, which was released on Wednesday, is pretty dire. According to the LAO report, the state faces a \$25 billion budget shortfall in the 2023-24 fiscal year, which is primarily the result of lower revenue estimates than projected in the 2022-23 state budget. Over the three year budget period (2021-22 through 2023-24), the LAO estimates \$41 billion in lower revenue than projected in the enacted state budget. If the state enters a recession, which many economists believe is nearly upon us, the LAO says "revenues could be \$30 billion to \$50 billion below" their current estimates. The LAO also forecasts multi-billion-dollar deficits each year through the 2026-27 fiscal year. Rising inflation makes the state's budget problem even worse. The LAO estimates that the Legislature can meet the requirements of the voter-approved Proposition 98 minimum funding guarantee for education and provide an 8.38 percent Continued on page 6

Former Sears at Sunrise Mall Sold to Ethan Conrad

- The shuttered Sears property and accompanying parking space on the south end of Sunrise Mall has been sold for just under \$7 million to Ethan Conrad Properties of Sacramento.

The commercial real estate investment company closed the transaction paying just under \$7 million for the Sunrise Mall site, which includes 21.3 acres, with over 281,000 square feet of building space. Included in the purchase was the three-story former Sears store, a twostory automotive service building and a separate, 9,500-square-foot service building.

Ethan Conrad is looking to develop the site in accordance with the "Sunrise Tomorrow" plan, which lays out a vision for redeveloping the 100-acre site.

"Based on my communication with the City of Citrus Heights, they will be reasonable and flexible relative to desirable retail

uses for the property, based on the fact that their goal is to expand the desired services for the City of Citrus Heights residents," Conrad said in an email, of the former Sears at Sunrise Mall.

According to Conrad, three retail pads along Sunrise Boulevard, currently mall parking, are in the works, along with remodeling and slight upgrades to the existing buildings.

Conrad said what he's envisioning should fit with the City's proposed redevelopment plan for Sunrise Mall, called Sunrise Tomorrow. The plan would turn the 100-acre site into

a combination of retail, residential and other uses. The City already received a preliminary request for a potential hotel on the site, not far from where the new retail pads would be located.

City Advances Strategic Work Plan and Launches Comprehensive Toolbox to Combat Blight

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - At the City Council meeting on Thursday, November 10 Citrus Heights City Council unanimously adopted fresh strategic planning objectives that will continue the advancement of City goals in community priority areas. City Council set the objectives at the most recent strategic planning retreat held on October 25, 2022.

During the strategic planning retreat, city staff presented updates on goals achieved in the six months since adopting a two-year Focus Area Work Plan in May of this year. The work plan lays out 48

recommendations to advance community priorities in four categories: Community Image, Economic Development, Community Connection, and Infrastructure. Staff reported significant advancements in the Community Image category of the work plan, where a toolbox has been built to advance community priorities to decrease blight and beautify public areas. The toolbox includes four new critical programs that will increase community beautification. These tools include:

The launch of a Beautification Crew: a two-person, full-time crew and fully stocked truck patrolling and proactively maintaining public areas, including removing abandoned carts and debris, unlawful camp abatement, illegal dumps, trash and litter removal, graffiti removal, weed abatement, and more.

Increased collaboration with neighbor jurisdictions: Many blight issues occur outside our borders. We are partnering with adjacent government agencies that share borders with the city to increase clean-up and enforcement. Recent success includes collaborations with Cal Trans on extensive clean-up and beautification of the I-80 and Antelope on-ramps and offramps, as well as new iron rod fencing installed at I-80 and Auburn.

Shopping Cart Ordinance:

This ordinance should help keep shopping carts in the commercial areas where they belong, thereby reducing the number of unsightly obstacles left in the public right of way or creek corridors. This ordinance will also allow quicker City clean-up response by reducing the timeframe necessary for the beautification crew or Police Department to impound stray shopping carts.

Chronic Nuisance Offender Program: Citrus Heights Police Department has implemented this program to prosecute chronic offenders of codes and individual/property ordinances. Additionally, working with the City Attorney's office, severe cases can now be referred for community prosecution.

Other successes and new programs reported during the strategic planning retreat included the creation of a Community Block Party Trailer launching in December, the creation of a Community Projects Grant program launching in February, infrastructure financing analysis for the Sunrise Tomorrow project, planning for sound wall repair and beautification, finalizing funding for the Arcade Cripple Creek Trail, and more. Through the generosity of the Citrus Heights Messenger, this column serves to provide an update about matters affecting the community of Citrus Heights.

Since the election on November 8th, I have seen a tremendous amount of analysis from people about how it will impact things on a national level with regards to the United States House of Representatives and the United States Senate. But on the state and local level, there were some issues that were voted on that will have major importance to us on the local level that I have seen very little coverage on even by local papers. For my monthly article, I want to highlight the three most impactful ones so that you can know what to expect. And even though the votes are still being counted, each of these three I am going to describe below have enough votes counted for us to know with high confidence how they are going to wind up.

First is Measure A, which was a local vote in would have raised the sales

County (including Citrus ing, likely in the first part Heights), raising around of 2023, to talk about what \$212,500,000 annually until 2063 to spend on various transportation purposes like roads, public transit, vehicle emission reduction. Normally when local taxes are voted on, if the measure discloses exactly where the money will be spent (which was the case here) it needs to get 66% or more votes in favor in order to pass. But a quirk in the law allowed this one to only need to get above 50% in order to pass, which made it seem like a foregone conclusion that it would easily get enough votes in order to pass. But in a huge surprise, even though the "yes" campaign spent well over \$2,000,000 the measure appears to have failed - which will likely put a stop in the near future to more local transportation taxes showing up on the ballot.

Second is Measure B, which was a local vote in Sacramento County to allow the County to tax cannabis. This appears to have passed by well over the 50% needed, which will very likely result in cannabis dispensaries soon being allowed in unincorporated Sacramento County. So while these stores won't be coming to Citrus Heights, they could be popping up Folsom, Orangevale, just outside Citrus Heights Antelope, Sacramento County that in Antelope, Fair Oaks, and Highlands, Rio Linda, Orangevale. spent everywhere in the now need to have a meetsort of tax to place on cannabis operations, as well as what sort of restrictions to put on cannabis dispensaries (such as how many to allow, where they can be located, what hours they can operate, etc.). I will be sure to alert you before this meeting will take place with details so you can make your voice heard.

Lastly is Proposition 31, which was a statewide vote that would ban the sale of most flavored tobacco products across California. This passed overwhelmingly, which means these products will soon be banned. Sacramento County earlier this year put a ban in place in the unincorporated county, but these products could still be bought in Citrus Heights. With the ban in place, Citrus Heights will not be allowed to sell these products anymore.

City of Citrus Heights involves developing unused parking areas on the perimeter of the Sunrise Mall site, with demolition of the existing mall slated for the end of the two-decade timeline.

Last month, the City announced an application was submitted last week that "lays out a footprint" for a potential hotel near the corner of Sunrise Boulevard and Greenback Lane.

Ethan Conrad, founded in 1995, has a commercial real estate portfolio which has grown to over 8.6 million square feet and comprises over 150 properties.

Buying the former Sears site at Sunrise Mall came a few weeks after Ethan Conrad made a similar deal for a closed

store in Florin Town Centre, in unincorporated Sacramento County. Conrad also paid \$5.6 million for another closed Sears location in Salinas, an anchor location for that city's Northridge Mall.

In Citrus Heights, Conrad's holdings include a portion of SummerHills Plaza, a 108,081 square-foot shopping center located at the intersection directly off I-80 and Antelope Drive, Suncreek Corporate Center at 7777 Greenback Lane and Sunray Plaza at 7700 Sunrise Boulevard, a prominent neighborhood retail center, home to California Family Fitness and Leatherby's Family Creamery.

Seritage Growth Properties, an entity formed to deal with real estate holdings after Sears' bankruptcy, was the seller. \star

cost-of-living adjustment. However, inflation adjustment isn't built into the rest of the budget. As a result the LAO notes that, "our estimate of a \$25 billion budget problem understates the actual budget problem in inflation-adjusted terms."

In one bit of good news, the state has amassed a significant rainy day fund reserve in recent year. The rainy day fund reserve, which became law in 2014 thanks to the efforts of then-Assembly Republican Leader Connie Conway, has required the state to save money in good times to blunt the impact of a massive budget shortfall like the state is facing this year. But the amount saved in the reserve – about \$22 billion – is roughly the same as the state's current shortfall.

Now that incoming lawmakers and the Governor have received the bad news, it's up to them to figure out how to respond. You can expect Newsom will propose a January budget that sounds fiscally conservative - suspending new programs, making cuts where they won't conflict with liberal priorities, and focusing on addressing the state's unfunded obligations, and cautioning lawmakers to focus on one-time spending.

What is unclear is how the Legislature will respond. Keep in mind that one-third of the Legislature is newly elected, and the new Democratic members are generally more liberal than the members they are replacing by any objective measure.

How will they respond if Newsom wants to suspend or repeal some of the new ongoing spending they have enacted in recent years? The LAO notes that recently enacted ongoing spending will grow to \$12 billion in new annual spending by the 2025-26 budget year and is a prime target for being suspended or cut.

Signaling a potential budget fight with Newsom, Senate President Pro Tem Toni Atkins, D-San Diego, said in a statement that, "we are prepared to hold onto the gains we've made and continue where we left off once our economy and revenues rebound.'

Consider that the opening salvo in what will surely be one of the most challenging budget debates in Sacramento in more than a decade.



followed that up with career-highs in home runs and RBIs in 2022 en route to winning the River Cats' team MVP award in his debut Triple-A season.

Let's take a look at some of the stories we hear about the Pilgrims, like who they were and how they lived. First of all, they didn't call themselves Pilgrims. They called

themselves "Saints" and "First Comers." Of the

102 people on the Mayflower, only 50 were so-called Pilgrims. The others were members of the Church of England who had signed on simply as laborers, soldiers, or those

who were looking to gain property in the "New World."

MYTH In pictures and pageants we see them in black and white clothing with buckled shoes and top hats. FACT. They didn't wear buckled shoes. The myth that they dressed like this stems from the popular clothing style of the day in England. They didn't wear buckled hats either. They simply wore much cheaper leather laces to tie up their shoes and hold up their pants. They also didn't wear only black and white. Their common garb was quite colorful. They only wore black and gray on Sundays. The rest of the time they wore heavily dyed clothing in many colors that could be achieved with natural dyes. Here's an example, a Pilgrim by the name of Brewster left his clothing in his will to someone. Here's what he left... "one blew clothe suit, green drawers, a violete clothe coat, black silk stockings, skyblew garters, red grograin suit, red waistcoat, tawny colored suit with silver buttons." > Same goes for the Native Americans. Corn was likely on the menu, but mushy, turned into a thick porridge that you can slurp down with a spoon. **MYTH**. It was all turkey and corn. **FACT**. Turkey, venison,

lots of lobsters and other seafood even eels and mussels, and all the vegetables that they had planted from onions, beans, spinach, lettuce and other greens was on the menu. **MYTH**. Had to have pumpkin pies. **FACT**. Pilgrims liked pumpkins. But they hollowed them out, filled them with milk and honey to make a custard, and then roasted the orange orbs in hot ashes. No pies! They were out of luck because you need butter and wheat flour. They didn't have much of either.

MYTH. They loved cranberry sauce. FACT. By fall of 1621, Pilgrims were essentially out of sugar. So no cranberry sauce. It was a new little berry to them. Native Americans made dyes out of cranberries. MYTH. It was called Thanksgiving. FACT. That first get together was in fact a harvest festival celebrated in October not November. They were just grateful to be alive as half of their company died during the first bleak winter.

Sacramento-area Giving Machines Are the Only Ones in California



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - This holiday season, Sacramento-area residents can go to vending machines and purchase clothing for a local refugee family, meals for a needy family, a blanket for a homeless person, essentials for a battered woman, and even chickens for a family in Africa.

These giving-focused vending machines offer a unique and memorable way to light the world with love by serving and caring for others both locally and globally."

Since the first Giving Machine appeared in 2017, total contributions have reached \$15 million. As part of its ongoing global humanitarian efforts, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints covers all operational costs, ensuring at the Roseville location to assist individuals and families with their donations and to answer questions. Due to the influx in the past couple of years of refugees from Afghanistan and Ukraine, several of the items from the charities will benefit these families.

"The gifts that the public can purchase from these charitable vending machines will help refugees from Afghanistan and the Ukraine get settled here in their new hometown," said Helena Madera-Silmi, resource director at Al-Misbaah, a local Islamic nonprofit organization that assists refugees and others in need of all faiths. Other Giving Machine charities also are assisting refugee families, as well as those experiencing hunger and homelessness.

HART has 10 groups throughout the Sacramento region that provide services to those experiencing homelessness and assist them in their efforts to become self-sufficient.





square foot industrial building and parking lot. This site is recommended as the third Safe Stay Community site due to its size, access to infrastructure, and proximity to existing unsanctioned encampments - as well as the current owner's willingness to sell the property to the County.

The total purchase price of \$22,825,679, which reflects the property cost of \$22,800,000, plus \$25,679 in closing costs, will be funded from the county's available ARPA allocation. Of the total \$22,825,679, \$18,825,679 will be funded from the Housing and Homelessness Strategic Investment and the remaining \$4,000,000 will be funded from the District Allocations. Supervisors Serna, Kennedy, Frost and Desmond have each allocated \$1,000,000 from their district APRA funds toward the purchase.


Safe Stay Communities are low-barrier, full-service shelters located proximate to where unsheltered

encampments exist in the community. Stay Safe Communities provide spaces where people living unsheltered can safely stay while engaging in necessary supportive services to aid them in exiting homelessness.

Safe Stay Communities intentionally offer non-congregate sheltering, which has emerged as best practice after the Covid-19 pandemic and allow access to diverse populations that may not be able to be successful in a congregate setting. As with all Safe Stav Communities. there will be accommodations for pets, places to store possessions and the ability to shelter with partners.

In developing Safe Stay Communities, the county is providing solutions, not only to address the health and safety of those living unsheltered, but the safety and rights of small business owners and residents to have clean and sanitary
