Patriotic Concert Uplifts Veterans

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - On Saturday, November 12, 2022, the Citrus Heights Veterans Community Center welcomed 35 members of the Citrus Heights Community Marching Band (CHCMB) and director Kody Tickner, for their first joint venture, a patriotic concert honoring all veterans.

Despite the cool weather, the concert was held in the Center's outdoor multipurpose horseshoe pit area. Band members lined the wooden fence between them and a townhome community, with brass

horns of all shapes and sizes, along with flutes and piccolos and drums. Sitting higher, level with the parking lot were several versions of standing xylophones and even giant windchimes.

Dozens of Center veterans, their families, staff, friends and community members experienced the thrill of hearing the CHCMB up close and personal for over an hour. Neighbors and those walking and driving by were treated to the concert as well. Many honked!

The audience enjoyed thirteen patriotic tunes beginning with the 'Star Spangled Banner' and 'God Bless America' to Lee

Greenwood's 'God Bless the USA' and of course the 'Armed Forces Medley' which includes the anthem for all six military branches, and now includes the Space Force anthem, completed the concert.

This performance is just one way the band has served the community since 2005, when it was created to fill the need for a marching band in Citrus Height's annual July parade. When the parade dissolved the Cooks took their show to venues throughout the county and beyond.

This new partnership fits perfectly into the purpose of both organizations, to serve their

Funding for Vietnam Veteran Memorial Replica Announced

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - At the November 10 Citrus Heights City Council meeting, there were public comments for Item 13 of the Consent Calendar—the second reading of the proposed Sunrise MarketPlace Overlay District, which will prohibit certain types of new vehicle-centric businesses within the overlay area.

Phil Jarrett, owner of the site of the former China Buffet restaurant, spoke to oppose the passage of the overlay, since its adoption will derail his plan to renovate the property into a new car wash location for Waterfly Car Wash: "If the overlay passes, it will affect my family's lives. Preventing us from building a car wash will cause my family financial hardship because we do not know when we'll be able to lease the property."

"I'm not even sure if this is legal," Jarrett said. "How can the City take away rights of one property owner and not all the property owners? Does this violate uniformity requirements under the fifth amendment when it talks about property? 'Taking' can also occur when the government restricts the economic use of a property. This is a civil rights violation."

Jarrett suggested that a car wash would be a good fit for the location since most car washes in Citrus Heights are built mid-block and near residential, retail, or restaurants as this would be. Jarrett said, "We're not a gas station. I don't believe we fit into what the overlay is trying to accomplish." He asked Council to make "the fair choice" and either oppose the overlay, grant his business an exemption, or remove car washes from the overlay's list of prohibited businesses.

Local resident Rick Hodgkins also commented on this item, stating that he would like to see the location remain a restaurant: "We need more restaurants."

Councilmember Bret Daniels said, "It's still heavy in my heart. ... I hope that our City can do everything possible to make this property whole. ... Whatever we can do needs to be done, because we are preventing somebody from doing something with their property that is legal to do but does not fit within what we want as our view of how we want this area to be." He strongly suggested the

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - It was a cool morning on November 11, as members of Citrus Heights American Legion Post 637 (AL), other veterans and family members, and dignitaries from the city and county, along with members of the community arrived to honor the brave men and women past and present who have served our country in the military since the

days of the Civil War. Members of the Citrus Heights Police Department honor guard presented arms for the service and the Folsom Harmony Express Men's Chorus comprised of military veterans performed their traditional patriotic songs during the service.

AL 637 past commander Paul Reyes emceed the program. The service included prayers by AL Post 637 Chaplain James Miranda.

Sacramento County Supervisor Sue Frost, a Citrus Heights resident and former mayor, noted how appropriate it is for Veterans Day to be so close to election day. "For it is our veterans who preserved our constitutional rights for 246 years."

She added, "Military Service is not for the faint of heart." No other occupation requires you to risk life or limb or threatens harsh discipline if [you] disobey the boss.

Many veterans continue to serve as police and first responders."

In conclusion, Frost quoted General Douglas MacArthur who said, "The soldier, above all people prays for peace."

On behalf of the Citrus Heights City Council, Vice Mayor Tim Schaefer, also a veteran, spoke, acknowledging he had no idea what he was signing up for when he enlisted, but still has a sense of duty to his country

Using Lived Experience for a Positive Change

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Nita Webb prints out an application for a housing voucher through Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency (SHRA). She has a client that qualifies for housing but has no way to fill out the application needed to get the process started. Providing these simple services for her clients is just part of the job Nita does as a Peer Counselor to help out people experiencing homelessness in Sacramento County.

Nita understands that every small bit of help can lead to big changes in someone's life. She has been there – desperately in need of a helping hand to better her situation. Nita grew up in Sacramento with her father and sister. They were poor, but always had a roof over their head and enough food to eat. Nita remembers how her father always did what he could to give back to people who were less fortunate than them. "Never look down on anyone – never treat people like they are less than you, because they aren't," she recalls him saying. Perhaps that is where her love of helping others came from.

After having a baby at a young age and dropping out of high school, Nita found work at a group home for girls that both paid her bills and satisfied her deep desire to help others in need. In 2009, when the recession hit, she was laid off from her job. Unemployment benefits were delayed for months and the money Nita received from welfare was not enough money to pay her rent. As her eviction loomed closer, she desperately searched for accommodations that would

be safe for her and her five-year-old daughter.

She was offered a space in a congregate shelter, but she was worried about her safety. However, she knew that if she was in a shelter with her daughter, they'd be prioritized for help faster than if she looked on her own. As she was being locked out of her apartment for the last time, she received a call from St. John's Shelter for Women and Children – they had a space for Nita and her daughter.

Living in a shelter with other homeless women and children provided her with a fresh view of her situation – all the women there had stories. Stories about domestic violence or a job loss or a major medical emergency that drained their savings. They were all alike, all struggling. St. John's set her up with classes on parenting, women empowerment and job training. She earned her GED and started working at St. John's non-profit, Plates, which not only provided her with critical job training, but earned her a housing subsidy in a transitional living program for her and her daughter.

Having that rental subsidy allowed Nita to start taking college courses, while still working at Plates. But the pull to help others in her situation was strong. She got a job working for Volunteers of America (VOA) – a job that allowed her to work directly with persons experiencing homelessness. While with VOA, she worked with clients that were sheltering at the Capitol Motel on L Street. Mixed in among those that lived there, her clients had drastically different needs and barriers to exiting homelessness, but one thing remained the same – whether

people were sheltering or paying rent, homeless or housed – everyone had a story, everyone had a life before they found themselves in their current circumstance. Everyone deserved love and respect and a helping hand.

Nita got a job as a Housing Specialist with Next Move at Mather Community Campus, yet another connection directly to persons experiencing homelessness that allowed her to make a tangible difference. She saw herself in every client – she was just one blessing in front of literal homelessness. Even as she connected clients to housing, she knew that housing doesn't equal final security when people need continued help and services to remain stabilized.

Today, Nita works for the Sacramento County Department of Health Services as a Peer Counselor, a person with lived experience that can identify with clients. She is part of the new Homeless Encampment And Response Team (HEART) - teams that go directly into encampments and connect people living unsheltered with benefits, shelter connections, clinical evaluations and referrals. She carries prepaid phones with her to provide to clients to remain in direct contact with them. She knows that she cannot personally help people with everything they need – but she can help them with one thing at a time, one thing that might be exactly what they need to alter their life course, stabilize and exit homelessness for good. She explains to her clients the work that she can do, and the work they need to do to help themselves – a vital piece of the puzzle to ending their homelessness.

Nita and her daughter still go to therapy together to work through the trauma of their unhoused experience. Though stabilized now, the ease of slipping into homelessness is always on her mind. As is her father – who instilled in her the heart to help the homeless – a job he never got to see her do, but one she honors him through every day. Her clients are blessings to her, as she is to them – a reminder that you can change your circumstances, you can accept help, and together – they can end one person's homelessness at a time. ★

Grant Bolsters CHP's Focus on Sideshows and Street Racing

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Illegal sideshows, takeovers, and street racing remain a major cause of death and injury on California roadways.

The California Highway Patrol (CHP) recently received a federal grant that will support the state's redoubled efforts to crack down on reckless driving behaviors that continue to wreak havoc throughout the state.

Building on the \$5.5 million in the 2022-23 state budget for the CHP to implement the Campaign to Eliminate Street Racing and Sideshows (C.E.S.R.S.), the \$1.5 million Sideshow, Takeover, Racing, Education, and Enforcement Taskforce (STREET) grant will help efforts to decrease the number of fatal and injury traffic crashes attributed to illegal sideshows, takeovers, and street racing.

In 2019-2020, speed was a factor in

approximately 40 percent of all fatal and injury crashes in California. In years 2020-2021, preliminary data reflects the number of people killed in crashes caused by reckless driving increased 21 percent from the previous period. The CHP continues to receive a high number of reports on sideshows and street racing and the negative consequences associated with such careless exploits.

"Reckless driving behaviors are a significant threat to all who use California's roadways," said CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray. "The STREET grant will provide for a focused education and enforcement campaign, targeting aggressive driving behaviors, street racing, and sideshow activities."

During the past two years, California has seen significant increases in the number of incidents from unsafe driving behaviors, including motorists exceeding 100 mph on state highways,

illicit street racing and sideshow activities, and speed-related crashes.

To address the issue, from January 1, 2021, to September 30, 2022, the CHP conducted enhanced speed enforcement operations on state routes that have seen an increase in speed-related issues. During this period, the CHP issued 40,593 citations to motorists exceeding 100 mph. CHP also collaborated with allied law enforcement agencies, leading to the creation of street racing and sideshow task forces and social media campaigns posting the dangers associated with high speed, aggressive driving behaviors, and street racing.

The STREET grant allows for a comparable campaign starting this month through September 30, 2023. Funding for the STREET program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

As an added deterrent, Governor Gavin Newsom recently signed Assembly Bill 2000 (Gabriel), making it illegal for a person to participate and/or engage in a motor vehicle speed contest or in an exhibition of speed in an off-street parking facility. The measure goes into effect on January 1, 2023.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★

community: the Veterans Center being there for its veterans and the band being there to entertain and help preserve the love of music for future generations.

Six band members are veterans, Bob Martinez, age 92 and the oldest member of the band served in the US Army in Korea. One word is used to describe Bob: Energy! Steve Iwata, Bill Hartley and Joe Isaacs served in the U.S. Army. Larry Breckinridge served in the U.S. Navy and Dave Newberry US Air Force. Executive Director Bill Cook served in the U.S. Army from 1970-1972.

Jim Rounsavell co-founder with his wife, Jeanne, served for six years in the U.S. Army Air Corps and U.S. Air Force, serving in WWII and Korea until 1952.

The band now rehearses at the Bill and Kathy Cook Performing Arts Center, a 3,500 square foot rehearsal hall and recording studio at 8436 Jewel Way, built by Bill Cook. Kathy Cook, co-founder of the band passed away in August of 2021, just weeks prior to the building's completion.

Following the concert, the Center formally 'retired' dozens of retired flags in a ceremony where they were respectfully burned. Some attendees brought their children to learn about the practice and safely participate in it.

even today. He thanked the veterans for their service.

Police Chief Alex Turcotte reminded all that police officers share a kindred spirit with the military, always being ready to sacrifice themselves if necessary.

A representative from Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) explained that members of DAR are direct descendants of American patriots of the Civil War. These patriots also sacrificed for the freedoms we have today. She urged all to "support our freedoms by voting and helping

organization[s] that serve veterans."

A surprise for the day came at the end of the service when Reyes revealed to his audience the beginning of the fruition of a dream he had, and the project he began working on last July.

After much hard work and barriers overcome, Reyes announced with profound sentiment and gratitude the good news that Citrus Heights was approved to host the replica of the 'Wall that Heals,' Vietnam Memorial Wall in Washington DC.

He said a presentation was made about the

memorial on his behalf at the City Council meeting on November 15. The council voted unanimously to approve \$10,000 to help pay for the display of the 'Wall that Heals' replica. Citrus Heights will be the second city in California to have the travelling structure of the memorial.

He said Operations Manager Kathy Miller informed him via zoom meeting that Citrus Heights survived a national lottery, and the wall should arrive next spring.

This was a momentous occasion for the City of Citrus Heights, said Reyes. ★

City find ways to financially support this property owner.

Councilmember Jeannie Bruins agreed, stating that she believes the City has "actions in progress" regarding that assistance.

The Consent Calendar passed unanimously, including the Overlay District.

The Council also considered a History and Arts Grant Program application for 'The Wall That Heals,' which honors veterans who lost their lives in service to our country in the Vietnam War.

The History and Arts Grant Program was established by Council in 2017 to provide funding opportunities for historical preservation and arts promotion. Applications are accepted throughout the fiscal year, and eligible applicants include Citrus Heights residents, business owners, schools, and nonprofits. There is an annual allocation of \$20,000, and funds do not roll over year to year. Requests under \$5,000 are approved by the city manager, and any larger requests come before Council. There is a maximum allocation of \$10,000 per project.

The 'Wall That Heals' is a replica of the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial in Washington D.C. and an accompanying education center, which has been displayed in nearly 700 communities across the country. Paul Reyes of American Legion Post 637 applied for \$10,000 to bring the traveling memorial to Citrus Heights. It would be set up in Rusch Park in March 2023 for one week and would be free for community members to view. The total cost to bring this to Citrus Heights is \$18,600, and the remaining funds will be gathered from donations from the public, local military associations, and the Citrus Heights Rotary.

Ray Riehle spoke of the importance of bringing the traveling memorial to Citrus Heights, stating that it has been 40 years since the memorial in Washington DC was dedicated to those soldiers who lost their lives in the Vietnam War. He said that the military has always been a big part of the community in Citrus Heights, with military planes frequently flying overhead from the

nearby McClellan Air Force Base.

"Bringing 'The Wall That Heals' to Citrus Heights this spring will show our support for our veterans," said Riehle, especially as the wall has the names of eight soldiers who were Citrus Heights residents: Jerry Bobbitt, Daniel Fowler, Stephen Fry, Donald Glass, Larrie Gotcher, Charles James, and Richard Willett.

Riehle said, "I think it will bring healing and offer something very special to members of our community."

Kermit Schayltz gave his perspective on what the wall means to Vietnam vets: He visited 'The Wall That Heals' when it was set up in Mather, and he said that experience gave him the courage to finally visit the real one in Washington DC decades after his service in Vietnam. He said that "war is hell" is the "perfect description. ... I know what these men have gone through. ... The real heroes are the ones on the wall." He said those who survived carry that guilt, and the wall helped relieve that guilt and "bury a lot of ghosts." So, it would mean a lot to him and other veterans in the community to have this memorial come here.

Although Vice Mayor Tim Schaefer was absent from the meeting, he submitted a comment in support of this project, stating that without those veterans who served "in defense of our great nation, it would not be the great nation that it is today."

Councilmember Daniels supported the project and said it would be "a privilege" to have this memorial come to Citrus Heights.

Councilmember Steve Miller said when you see that wall, "it just hits you like a ton of bricks."

Councilmember Bruins said that her brother served in Vietnam, and she was so thankful that he came home, but she knows his name could have ended up on the wall. She said that seeing the wall is a very emotional experience, and she expressed her gratitude to all who have served.

The Council voted unanimously to approve the grant of \$10,000 to bring 'The Wall That Heals' to Citrus Heights next year. ★

State Violated Environmental Laws in \$1.2 Billion Capitol Annex Project

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Save Our Capitol! issued on October 31, 2022, the following statement regarding the matter of Save Our Capitol! vs. California Department of General Services (DGS) and Joint Committee on Rules of the California State Senate and Assembly (JRC):

“By failing to recirculate the Capitol Annex Project's Environmental Impact Report (EIR) after making substantive changes, DGS and JRC violated the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), a statute which implements a statewide policy of environmental protection. The substantive changes included:

Relocating the underground parking garage from the south side of the Capitol to the east side; Destroying approximately twice as many trees as were initially identified; Expanding the project's boundary; and, Designing the new Annex with a wholly incompatible and dangerous glass exterior.

“Recirculation was required due to the Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) expanding the Project's boundary beyond 12th Street and more than doubling the 20-30 trees that the Recirculated Draft Environmental Impact Report (RDEIR) represented would be removed, revealing that the project would affect an estimated 133 trees. DGS and JRC failed

to prove how expanding the Project's boundary and doubling the number of trees to be removed from the historic Capitol Park would not exacerbate a significant environmental impact, in violation of CEQA.

“Because the changes to the project scope include new and/or exacerbating impacts and a new unstudied alternative that would reduce impacts to historic resources, additional review by the decisionmakers and the public of the EIR was required. Yet, DGS and JRC did not recirculate the EIR, instead choosing to deprive the public and responsible agencies of their right to review and comment on the Project's true impacts to the Capitol Complex.

“As stated in our appeal, there is no urgency to proceed with the unvetted Capitol Annex Project which disregards CEQA's requirement of transparency and its protections for the public interest.”

A hearing on the case before the Third Appellate District is scheduled for November 14, 2022.

The purpose of Save our Capitol! is to preserve the site of the historic Capitol and its surrounding Park as the center and symbol of Californians' right to truth, transparency, and trust in self-governance. SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On November 1, the USL Championship announced the 2022 All-League teams, honoring the best players across the league for the season. Republic FC midfielder Rodrigo Lopez was named to the All-League First Team alongside ten other top performers from seven other clubs.

“RoRo played the best soccer of his career last season as club captain,” said Republic FC President and General Manager Todd Dunivant. “He was an integral part of our collective success in league, cup and post-season play helping us reach new heights this season.”

Lopez appeared in 25 of 34 regular season matches for Sacramento, while starting each contest in the club's run to the U.S. Open Cup Final. He finished 2022 with 1,894 minutes in league play, and captained Sacramento in each of his 21 starts on the season. In regular season play, he finished tied for the team lead in goals with seven – and added another in the playoffs.

He led in team assists with eight during the regular season – his second-highest total for a season in his professional career. He finished the regular season with 59 chances created, good for 10th in the league and 3rd in the Western Conference.

He delivered for his club in critical moments all season long. On opening night against El Paso Locomotive FC, he scored the club's first goal of the year from the penalty spot, then a critical equalizer just before halftime. On June 25, just four days after

netting the opening score against LA Galaxy in the U.S. Open Cup, he came off the bench and assisted the first of two goals from Maalique Foster in a come-from behind win over Monterey Bay F.C. He helped the club to results in two home rivalry matches against Oakland Roots, assisting a last-second equalizer on July 9 to secure a 3-3 draw and the winner in the club's match with the Bay Area side on August 27. In the regular season finale against San Diego Loyal SC, he netted the winning score just two minutes in, threading a shot from the left just inside the post.

Lopez's play was also recognized league-wide throughout the campaign. He was named the league's Player of the Month for August after netting one goal and tallying a league-leading four assists in four contests and earning Player of the Week Honors in Week 22. He was named to the USL Championship Team of the Week six times, earning a spot on the league's Best XI four times and tallying two selections to Team of the Week Bench.

This is Lopez's second career All-League First Team selection, and his third All-League selection in USL Championship. He previously earned First Team distinction following the club's inaugural 2014 season. In 2015, he was honored on the USL All-League Second team. He is one of three Republic FC players all-time to earn the honor; defender Nemanja Vukovic was named to the All-League First Team alongside Lopez in 2014 and midfielder Danny Barrera was named to the league's top squad in 2016.

California Invests Nearly \$3 Billion for Transportation Improvements

Caltrans News Release

SANTA BARBARA, CA (MPG) - The California Transportation Commission (CTC) has allocated nearly \$3 billion for projects to repair and improve transportation infrastructure throughout the state. The allocation includes more than \$452 million in funding from the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 (IIJA) and more than \$123 million in funding from Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.

"This allocation - which includes a significant federal investment - allows Caltrans and our local partners to continue building the equitable, sustainable, and safe transportation system on which future generations will depend," said Caltrans Director Tony Tavares.

Projects approved include:

\$3.5 million in federal IIJA funding for a City of Rancho Cordova project for roadway, sidewalk, curb ramp, bike lane and traffic signal improvements on Mather Field Road between Folsom Boulevard International Drive;

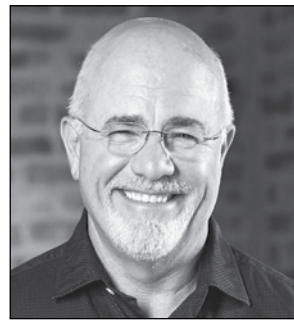
\$2 million in State Highway Operational and Protection Program (SHOPP) funds for project development and right of way costs for intersection

and safety improvements at Live Oak Boulevard/Encinal Road and State Route 99 in the Lomo Crossing area in Sutter County;

\$520,000 in SHOPP funds to develop a safety project for a new traffic signal at the intersection of State Route 32 and County Road P near Orland, Glenn County.

The CTC allocated more than \$2.1 billion to Caltrans' Division of Local Assistance in its annual federal fiscal year investment. These local assistance funds are used by more than 600 cities, counties and regional agencies throughout California to build and improve roads, bridges, tunnels and other transportation infrastructure, and for projects that enhance safety and help protect the environment. Annually, more than 1,200 new projects are authorized through the Local Assistance Program.

SB 1 provides \$5 billion in transportation funding annually that is shared equally between the state and local agencies. Road projects progress through construction phases more quickly based on the availability of SB 1 funds, including projects that are partially funded by SB 1. every house that's up for sale. Now, are the buyers and the market as active and frenzied as they were several months ago? No. But you have to remember, the last couple of years have been crazy-strange times for the housing market.

I've been in the real estate business since 1978, and I've never seen anything like it. Usually, it takes about 90 days to sell a house. You'll get some offers, and none of them will be at full price, but everyone will have time to think about things. That's normal, and it's probably a lot closer to how things will work themselves out for you now in Greenville.

But in any economy, my advice to you would be don't buy another house until yours has sold. If you end up with two house payments and your old house is sitting empty while you're having to pay for the

mortgage, taxes, utilities and all the upkeep to make sure it's ready to show, you're going to become what's known as a motivated seller. I don't want you to just give it away, but you'll need to be very careful to make sure the timing on this deal makes sense.

Personally, I wouldn't buy another house until the first one sells.

Sac State blows past Portland State, 45-17, to improve to 10-0

Hornets close the regular season at home against UC Davis in the Causeway Classic

HILLSBORO, OR (MPG) - The No. 2 ranked Sacramento State football team remained unbeaten, earned its school-record 10th regular season victory and dominated Portland State in a 45-17 win at Hillsboro Stadium on a cold Friday night.

The Hornets are now 10-0 overall and 7-0 in the Big Sky Conference. The 10 wins breaks the school regular season record of nine which came in 2019 and 2021. It also equals the best win total for any season, matching the effort of the 1988 team which ended the year 10-3 with the help of two NCAA Div. II playoff wins.

Sacramento State has now won 18 consecutive Big Sky games which is the second longest streak in league history. The team has also won 14 straight road games against FCS teams, and 10 road games against all opponents

— the longest streak in FBS or FCS.

The game had a wild start with three combined fumbles, two plays of at least 30 yards, and a touchdown in the first six minutes. The Vikings took the opening kickoff and picked up 33 yards on their first play of the game. The team then

coughed it up on the next play and the ball was recovered by Brock Mather.

Sacramento State quickly gained 44 yards on a pass from Asher O'Hara to Pierre Williams to get inside the 10-yard line. Facing 3rd-and-goal, Asher O'Hara tried to spin his way into the end zone but

had the ball knocked loose and recovered by PSU for a touchback.

Two plays later, Portland State attempted a trick play with a double reverse which was bobbled on the toss and recovered by Killian Rosko inside the 20. Sacramento State finally broke through with

a 5-yard pass from O'Hara to Williams to give the Hornets a 7-0 lead.

The Hornets added to their lead early in the second quarter with a 41-yard field goal from Kyle Sentkowski. The Hornets brought the ball to the 11-yard line during the drive but were driven back to the 23 following a sack on third down. A strong headwind was no challenge for Sentkowski who made his 12th consecutive field goal this year.

Sacramento State needed just three plays to score on the first series of the second half. The drive was setup by a 38-yard kickoff return from Elijah Tao-Tolliver. Jake Dunningway then found Williams for a 51-yard gain which pushed the receiver over the century mark. Marcus Fulcher then cut back to his left for a 4-yard score just 70 seconds into the half.

Portland State started the fourth quarter had another wild stretch. The Hornets first stopped

Portland State inside the 1-yard line on fourth down. The offense moved the ball out of the shadow of its own goalpost but fumbled. That turnover set up a 36-yard touchdown rush from Quincy Craig for Portland State's first touchdown.

The Viks then attempted an onside kick which was picked cleanly by Martin who returned it 45 yards for a touchdown.

Sacramento State finished the game with 451 yards on just 56 plays for an average of 8.1 yards per play. The team rushed for 237 yards and threw for 214.

The quarterback tandem of Dunningway and O'Hara combined to complete 15-of-21 passes with each throwing a touchdown without an interception.

Sacramento State's final regular season game will come on Nov. 19 in the Causeway Classic against UC Davis at 2 p.m. The Hornets can clinch at least a share of the Big Sky title with a win. ★

Could the Ocean Slake California's Thirst?

“Water, water, every where, And all the boards did shrink; Water, water, every where, Nor any drop to drink.”

Poet Samuel Taylor Coleridge penned those words in his 1798 poem, “The Rime of the Ancient Mariner,” to describe the plight of becalmed sailors who could die of thirst while surrounded by limitless expanses of undrinkable seawater.

In a way, it also describes California's plight. Despite its 3,427 miles of Pacific Ocean coastline, including bays, inlets and tidal marshes, the state has an ever-widening gap between its demand for water and its supply.

Naturally, there has been a decades-long debate over whether the state should tap into that endless supply of seawater to bridge the gap, emulating other arid and semi-arid societies, particularly in Australia and the Mideast.

From a technical standpoint, it's a no-brainer. Desalination plants, including a few already operating in California, do exactly what they are supposed to do — strip the salt from seawater, converting it into freshwater suitable for drinking or any other purpose. The barriers to

building dozens of desalination plants along the coast are economic, environmental and political.

Such plants require oodles of electrical power to pump in the seawater, push it through filters that remove the salt and then return the uber-salty brine waste either to the sea or into another process.

A massive desal program would place a new burden on a power grid that already struggles to keep up with demand on very hot days as it evolves from natural gas-fired power plants to renewable sources such as wind and solar. Desal's power demand also contributes heavily to the bottom line costs of producing water, making it more expensive, at least so far, than water from other sources.

Finally, environmental groups have generally opposed desal projects on assertions that pumping seawater into the plants and returning brine to the sea run the risk of damaging delicate marine ecosystems. But the groups have another, unspoken reason for opposition. Restricted water supplies have been used as a tool to oppose new residential development and increasing water supply undercuts that political tool.

In combination, all of those points were cited in the California Coastal Commission's rejection of a much-debated desal project at Huntington Beach in Orange County earlier this year. The plant would have been a near-clone of a desal facility in Carlsbad, further south along the coast.

At the time, it appeared

to be a death knell for the expansion of desalination in California — something that Gov. Gavin Newsom's administration envisions in its overall plan for closing the demand/supply gap as climate change and semi-perpetual drought diminish traditional supplies from winter rains and snowfall.

However, last month the Coastal Commission approved another Orange County desal project, one that would use somewhat different technology to pump in seawater and dilute the leftover brine before returning it to the sea.

Environmental groups gave their blessing to the Dana Point project, which made a big difference in the Coastal Commission's attitude, as is the fact that it's only one-tenth the size of the Huntington Beach project and would serve purely local customers of the South Coast Water District.

The approval was an indication that desalination could, as the state's water plan envisions, play a significant role in California's water future, which will be much different than its abundant past.

That said, desal probably wouldn't be the silver bullet of limitless supply that some have hoped it would be. It would be more of a reliability factor, something that Californians could depend on working when traditional supplies fall short.

The sacred ceremony ended with the retiring of the flag and everyone joining in and singing God

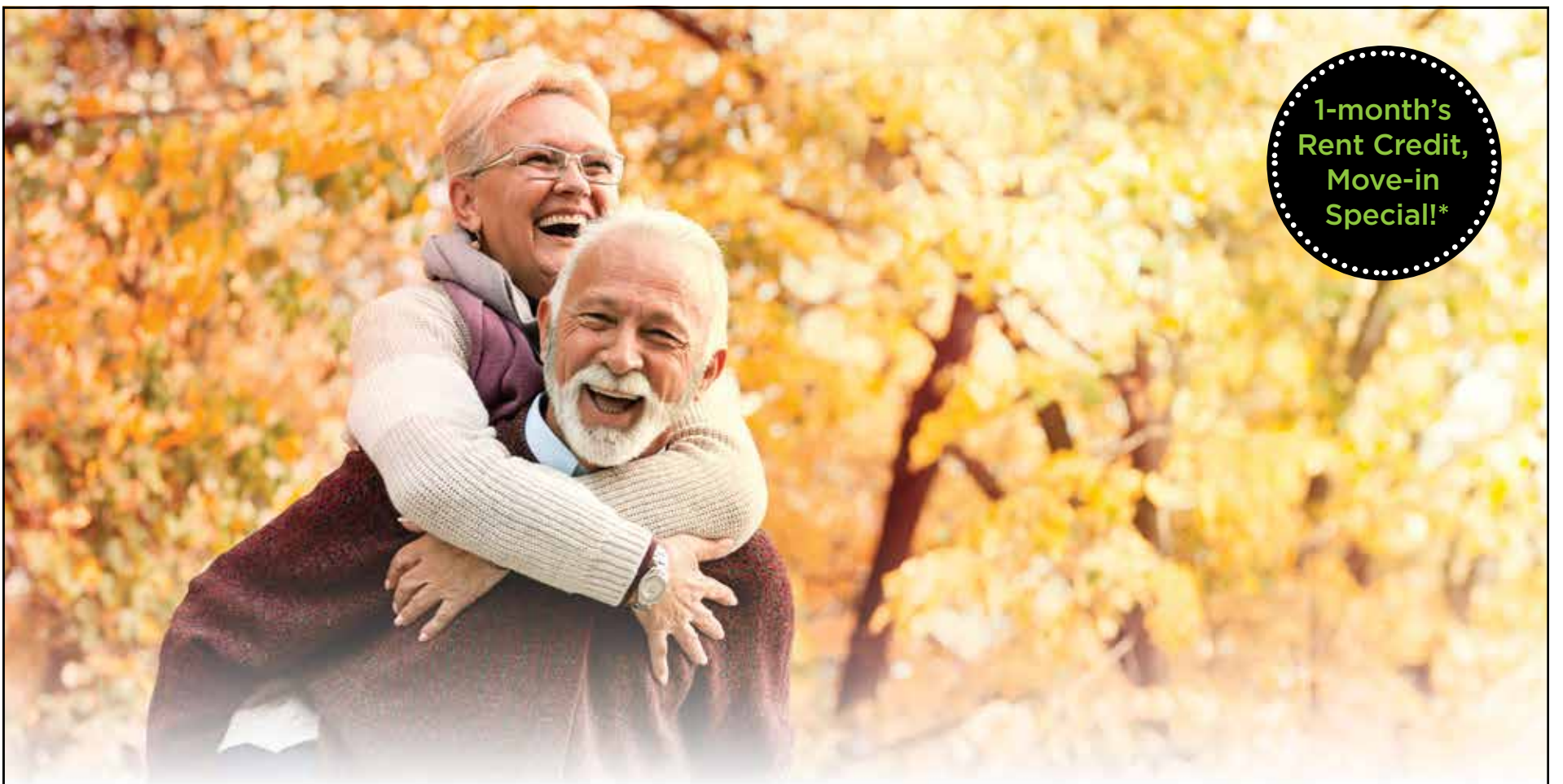
Bless America.
